



BOSTON COLLEGE EAGLES

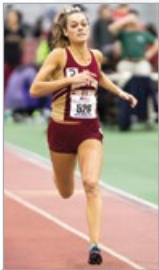


MEN'S

- Junior Matthew Morano broke the school record in the 600 meter run, crossing the line in 1:19.54 to earn second place overall at the BU Open. Morano also earned a third place finish in the 500 meter dash at the BU Four Way Meet with a time of 1:04.25.
- Sophomore Avery McKenzie finished in the top 10 in the long jump (6.40 m) and triple jump (13.96) at the BU Season Opener. His jump of 14.27 meters in the triple jump at the Dartmouth Relays to win first place.
- Junior Oliver Boucher earned a second place finish in the 400 meter dash at the BU Four Way Meet with a time of 50.90.

WOMEN'S

- Junior Paige Duca has been a standout performer in the distance events throughout the indoor season. At the Beantown Challenge, Duca won the one mile run with a time of 4:53.83 and was the only woman to break five minutes on the day. Duca also won the 3000 meter run at BU Multi Team Meet with a time of 9:53.01.
- Sophomore Emma Taylor moved to fourth place in the BC record books in the 60 meter hurdles with a time of 9.06 to win the event and qualify for the New England Championships.
- Senior Julia Barron ran 58.44 in the 400 for a second place finish at BU.



CLEMSON TIGERS



MEN'S

- The Tigers claim nine top-3 marks in the ACC entering the conference championship, including senior Jeffrey Green (45.87) in the 400m dash as well as the men's 4x400m relay (3:07.36), both of which are good for No. 1 in the ACC.
- Green set the Clemson record in the 400m dash, crossing the finish line in 45.87 seconds at the Tiger Paw Invite on Feb. 9, shattering the previous program record which was set in 1993.
- Senior hurdler Kirk Lewis (7.76) holds the No. 9 time in the NCAA in the 60m hurdles. Lewis's personal best of 7.76 seconds is also good for the third-fastest time in the conference this season.

WOMEN'S

- Sophomore Rebekah Smith (7.26) and senior Torie Robinson (7.27) hold the top-2 60m dash times in the ACC. The duo rank 13th (tied) and 15th, respectively, in the NCAA.
- Fellani Ferguson (2:06.42), a seven-time NCAA Division II All-American and senior transfer from Johnson C. Smith, holds the ACC's second-best time in the 800m run. Ferguson ran her career-best indoor time of 2:06.42 at the Tiger Paw Invite on Feb. 9.
- Senior Olivia James (53.72) ranks third in the conference this season in the 400m dash. James also holds the program's No. 2 time in the event (53.24), dating back to 2015.



DUKE BLUE DEVILS



MEN'S

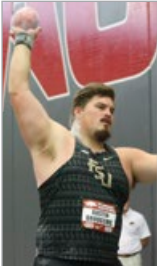
- Steven Solomon joins Duke as a graduate transfer after running for Stanford as an undergrad. He has already broken the school record in the 600m as well as helping the DMR to the fifth best time in the ACC.
- Matt Wisner is the school record holder in the 800m. He has two top-10 finishes this season.
- Jacob Sobota debuted with a score of 5,204 in his first collegiate heptathlon. He is second in the ACC this season in the event.
- Rivers Ridout has a season-best mark of 7-0.25 (2.14) in the high jump, fifth in the ACC.

WOMEN'S

- The women's pole vault squad has five members qualified for the ACC Championships. Defending champion Madison Heath has a clearance of 14-1.75 (4.31), second in the ACC.
- Maddy Price set the school record in the 200m with a time of 23.73, fourth in the conference.
- In her freshman season, Kethlin Campbell is in the top-five all-time at Duke in the 200m, 60m and long jump. She is third in the ACC in the long jump.
- Brittany Aveni has run a season-best 2:08.27 in the 800m.



FLORIDA STATE SEMINOLES

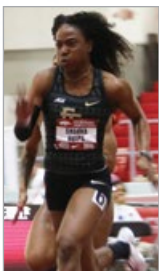


MEN'S

- Austin Droogsma, one of four Noles with ACC-leading marks, is vying for his first ACC title in the shot put. The silver medalist last year, he currently ranks fourth nationally with a personal-best of 20.10 meters (65-11.5).
- Andre Ewers won in the 60-meter dash in a nation-leading time of 6.52 back on Jan. 20 and is one of six Noles qualified for the ACC 60.
- Junior Armani Wallace and senior Corion Knight lead the conference in the triple jump (16.19m/53-1.5) and long jump (8.02m/26-3.75), respectively.
- Junior Michael Hall became just the third FSU runner to break four minutes in the mile with his 3:59.37 at the David Hemery Valentine Invitational.

WOMEN'S

- Shauna Helps is the ACC leader in the 200 after setting the FSU record (23.20) at the Razorback Invitational and the two-time conference 100-meter champion also owns a personal best for 60 meters (7.33).
- Militsa Mircheva is one of four ACC runners with qualifying marks in the mile, 3000 and 5000. The 2016 Olympic marathoner from Bulgaria ranks among the top 10 in the ACC in all three events.
- The Noles return defending high jump champion Eleonora Omoregie and 2017 bronze medalists Glenève Grange in the shot put and Courtney Jones in the 60-meter hurdles. Grange leads the ACC in the shot put (17.24m/56-6.75), while Jones sits third in the 60-meter hurdles (8.16).



GEORGIA TECH YELLOW JACKETS



MEN'S

- Georgia Tech men's indoor continues to impress, posting nine top-10 finishes in the ACC this season.
- Junior Avery Bartlett holds the second-fastest time in the conference in the 800m, while senior Nahom Solomon recorded the third-fastest time in the 3000m.
- The distance medley relay team of Bartlett, Lionel Jones, Andres Littig and Solomon currently hold the ninth-fastest time in the country after winning the race at the Charlie Thomas Invitational.

WOMEN'S

- Jeanine Williams has led the pack with three first-place finishes in four 60m-hurdle events, including a blistering 8.02 mark at the Clemson Invitational that ranks first in the ACC, third in the country and sixth in the world.
- Senior Marinice Bauman also turned in the 10th-best score in the league in the pentathlon, finishing with 3,332 points and tallying two first-place finishes (60m hurdles and 800m).
- The distance medley relay team of Amy Ruiz, Denise Woode, Haley Anderson and Nicole Fegans took first place at the Charlie Thomas Invitational and hold the second-best time in the ACC.



LOUISVILLE CARDINALS



MEN'S

- Javen Reeves set a new school record at the Illini Classic with a high jump of 2.23m/7' 3.75". Reeves has won the event twice this season. His personal best mark is currently tied for seventh in the nation. Jerin Allen jumped a personal best of 2.20m/7' 2.5" at the Vanderbilt Opener for one of his two wins. His season best mark is currently tied at 14th in the nation.
- Joe Delgado won the heptathlon at the Michigan Power Five Invitational with 5,627 points. Delgado set a new school record with the total. He currently ranks 12th in the nation in the heptathlon.
- Marlice Moore has finished in the top three in two of his three meets in the 60m hurdles. He finished with a season best time of 8.12 twice this season.

WOMEN'S

- Emmonnie Henderson won the shot put in four of her five meets, including a season best mark of 17.05m/55'11.25" at the Illini Classic. Her mark at the Illini Classic ranks her 11th in the nation. Henderson also threw a personal best of 20.24m/66' 5" in the weight throw to win the event at the Hoosier Hills Invitational. She has won three times in the weight throw this season. Her season best mark ranks 23rd in the nation.
- Alexis Gibbons jumped a personal best mark of 6.27m/20' 7" to win long jump event at the Hoosier Hills Invitational on Feb. 9. She has won the long jump four times this season. Her school record mark of 6.27m/20' 7" currently ranks 14th in the nation.



MIAMI HURRICANES



MEN'S

- The Hurricanes have two men in the top 10 in the ACC in the 60 meters: Myles Valentine ranks fourth with a time of 6.71 seconds and Isaiah Taylor is eighth at 6.79 seconds.
- Hasani Knight is eighth in the ACC in the men's triple jump with a mark of 15.26m. He is also 20th in the conference in long jump at 6.98m.
- Gian Piero Ragonesi is second in the ACC in the shot put with a season-best of 18.56m. He is also eighth in the ACC in the weight throw at 17.77m.
- Freshman Kevin Arreaga ranks third in the ACC in the hammer throw with a mark of 19.31m that rates second all-time in UM history.

WOMEN'S

- Freshman Alfreda Steele is ranked second in the ACC in the 200m with a time of 23.55 seconds and sixth in the 60m with a time of 7.33 seconds.
- Miami has three women ranked in the top 15 in the ACC in the 60 meters: Alfreda Steele, Kristina Knott and Symone Mason. Steele and Mason are also in the top 15 in the 200m.
- Kayla Johnson is third in the ACC in the 800 meters with a time of 2:06.54. The freshman, who is sixth in the ACC in the 400 meters with a time of 54.20 seconds, is joined by Samantha Gonzalez and Anna Runia ranked among the top 15 in the 400 meters.



NORTH CAROLINA TAR HEELS



MEN'S

- In the 400 meters, freshman Isaiah Palmer (47.14) and senior Kenny Selmon (47.19) rank in the top four in the ACC and top 50 in the country.
- Redshirt-freshman Marcus Krah's time of 7.91 in the 60-meter hurdles is fifth in the ACC, 36th in the country and sixth in school history.
- Redshirt-sophomore Draven Crist cleared seven feet for the first time in his career this season. His jump of 7-0 ¼ is fifth in the ACC and top 50 in the country.
- The men's 4x400 has the second-fastest time in the ACC and is 19th nationally.

WOMEN'S

- Junior Nicole Greene holds the top mark in the ACC in the high jump by nearly five inches at 6-2. She has made the height twice this season, most recently to take third at the USAITF Indoor Championships. The 6-2 jump is also tied for the second-highest mark in school history.
- Sophomore Brianna Duncan broke a 20-year-old school record in the 60 meters on Jan. 13 when she ran 7.38 in the prelims and 7.29 in the final. The time is third in the ACC and 17th nationally.
- In the 3,000 meters, junior Morgan Ilse (9:07.49) ranks second in the ACC, 24th nationally and fourth in school history; senior Caroline Alcorn (9:07.92) ranks third in the ACC, 25th nationally and fifth in school history. Ilse also broke the UNC record for the indoor 5,000 meters this season.



NC STATE WOLFPACK



MEN'S

- Joshua Davis broke his own all-time NC State weight throw record in his first meet of the year. His 76'3" throw at the JDL College Kick-off Classic stands at second in the nation and first in the conference, and four of his other throws from the season would also be good for top-10 national marks.
- Three of NC State's sprinters hold top-five ACC 200m times, with Dylan Peebles (20.87) sitting atop the conference and 13th in the nation. Cravont Charleston (21.28) and Shannon Patterson (21.29) have the ACC's fourth and fifth-best marks. Charleston has also seen success in the 60m dash, with his 6.65 clocking in as second-fastest in the ACC.

WOMEN'S

- Ely Henes holds the ACC's top time in the 3,000m and in the 5,000m. Henes' 5K time at the UCS Invitational (15:36.67 converted) made history as the fastest in NC State history and the third-fastest in the country.
- Gabriele Cunningham's program record-breaking 8.05 time in the 60m hurdles is good for second in the ACC and puts her in national qualifying position. She also set the school record in the 60m dash with a 7.31 mark, which ranks fourth in the conference.
- Lauren Evans's ACC-best 67' 8" weight throw at the JDL College Kick-off Classic has yet to be bested by any other thrower in the conference, and she also holds a solid shot put mark, sitting at third in the conference.



NOTRE DAME FIGHTING IRISH



MEN'S

- Jacob Dumford, Elijah Silva, Edward Cheatham and Yard Nuguse broke the school record in the distance medley relay at the Alex Wilson Invitational. They ran a 9:28.79, including a sub four-minute split in the mile by Nuguse (3:57.39). Heading into the championships, they hold the top time in the ACC and fifth-best time in the country.
- Junior Matthew Birzer has won the high jump in all five meets he has competed at in 2018. He set a PR at the Meyo Invitational after clearing 2.19m (7' 2.25").
- Nuguse won the Meyo Mile in his first collegiate mile race. He won the premier event of the Meyo Invitational with a time of 4:02.44.

WOMEN'S

- Senior Jordan Shead won the invitational section of the 400m at the Meyo Invitational with a personal-best time of 53.45. That time ranks first in the ACC and 15th in the country.
- Senior Jessica Harris ran in her first 3000m race during the Meyo Invitational and placed first. She won the event with a time of 9:19.50, more than four seconds ahead of the second-place finisher.
- Graduate student Indi Jackson has led the Irish in the shot put. She had the longest throw of the season at the Meyo Invitational 15.51m (50-10.75) and has four top-five finishes this year.



PITTSBURGH PANTHERS

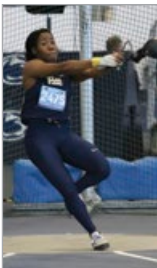


MEN'S

- Sophomore Nick Wolk took down a 27-year-old Pitt record with a time of 8:07.09 in the 3,000m at the Meyo Invitational Feb. 2. He topped Keith Dowling's mark of 8:09.52 set in 1991.
- Fellow sophomore Dante Watson broke the program's 600m record with a time of 1:18.17 at the Bob Pollock Invitational Jan. 26, besting a 1-year-old mark set by All-American Desmond Palmer.
- The Panthers return two All-ACC Indoor performers from last season in junior Ken Brosier (second team, 4x400m relay) and senior Jamaree Murray (second team, 4x400m relay).

WOMEN'S

- Pitt's 4x400m relay team of seniors Morgan Harvey, QuadaiSha Newkirk, Laila Ismail and Desiree Garland broke a 6-year-old school record with a time of 3:35.73 at the Meyo Invitational Feb. 2. As of Feb. 7, the time leads the ACC and is ranked 11th in the nation.
- Senior Andin Fosam produced a personal record of 20.54m to win weight throw at the Meyo Invitational. As of Feb. 7, her mark ranks second in the ACC.
- Pitt returns three All-ACC Indoor performers from last season in Fosam (second team, weight throw), senior Joslin Sellers (second team, mile) and junior Gillian Schriever (second team, 5000m).



SYRACUSE ORANGE



MEN'S

- Justyn Knight is a member of the 10-man Watch List for The Bowerman Award. He is the first Syracuse athlete to be named to the watch list.
- Knight owns one of the nation's fastest times in three different events. As of Feb. 11, Knight has the second-fastest 5000-meter time, set at the Iowa State Classic, the fastest 3000-meter time from the Millrose Games and the fourth fastest mile time from the John Thomas Invitational.
- Angelo Goss has been the bright newcomer to the track and field team, setting the fourth-fastest time in the 60-meter hurdles at the Great Dane Classic (7.69 seconds).

WOMEN'S

- Paige Stoner shattered the Syracuse school record in the 5k earlier this season at the Iowa State Classic. Her time of 15:44.04 made her the first sub-16 minute 5k runner at 'Cuse.
- Kadejha Sellers is on the cusp of qualifying times for the NCAA Championship in the 400-meters. Her time of 53.24 seconds puts her 19th nationally heading into the ACC Championship.
- Tia Thevenin (8.37) and Danielle Delgado (8.43) enter the ACC Championships looking to better their 60-meter hurdles time to qualify for nationals. Thevenin was an Honorable Mention All-American last outdoor season in the 110-meter hurdles.



VIRGINIA CAVALIERS



MEN'S

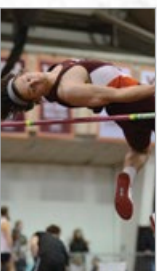
- Finished as runners-up at the 2017 ACC Championships and returned eight All-ACC honorees.
- Eleven performances rank in the top six of the ACC heading into the conference championship.
- Jordan Scott was named the ACC Field Performer of the Week twice this season for his effort in the triple jump. His performance currently ranks 10th in the NCAA and second in the ACC.
- Hilmar Jonsson ranks second in UVA history in the weight throw. His career-best performance at the Michigan Power Five Invitational ranks 20th in the nation and second in the ACC as of Feb. 19.

WOMEN'S

- In the ACC, Virginia holds five performances in the top six as of Feb. 19, with two performances in the top three of the triple jump.
- Kelly McKee ranks 19th in the nation and first in the ACC for the triple jump as of Feb. 19. Her career-best performance at the Clemson Tiger Paw Invitational ranks third in Virginia history.
- Holly Sullivan captured six personal-best performances in the pentathlon this season, including a personal-best overall score that ranks fourth in UVA history.



VIRGINIA TECH HOKIES



MEN'S

- Vincent Ciattei (3:59.57) and Patrick Joseph (3:59.59) turned in the second- and fourth-fastest times in school history in the mile on Feb. 3.
- Deakin Volz has won two event titles in the pole vault. His vault of 5.49 meters (18 feet, 0 inches) sits atop the ACC and top-10 nationally.
- Keishaun Limehouse owns the fifth-fastest 60-meter dash (6.80) and third-fastest 60-meter hurdles (7.91) times in Tech history.
- Mackenzie Muldoon and Matthew Manilli racked up 5,058 points and 4,814, respectively, at the Akron Invitational in the heptathlon. They are No. 5 and 6 in the ACC.

WOMEN'S

- Rachel Pocratsky ran the sixth-fastest time in NCAA history at the Liberty Kickoff in the 1,000-meter run, clocking a time of 2:41.98 to reset her own school record and take the top spot in the national rankings. Pocratsky earned ACC Performer of the Week following her top-notch performance.
- Lisa Gunnarsson owns three pole vault event titles. Gunnarsson broke the school record in just her third meet into the season with a mark of 4.46 meters (14 feet, 7.5 inches). The mark sits No. 5 in the country.
- Kennedy Dennis and Caitlan Tate have cracked into the top 10 in program history in the 60-meter dash. They own the sixth- and seventh-fastest times in school history. Both personal bests sit in the top 13 in the conference.



WAKE FOREST DEMON DEACONS



MEN'S

- Robert Heppenstall returns for his junior indoor campaign after finishing fifth at the NCAA Indoor Championships last season. He finished fifth at the Iowa State Classic in the 800m with a time of 1:48.05, good for best in the ACC and 10th in the nation.
- Mitchell Day finished third at Vanderbilt's Music City Challenge in the 5000m. His time of 14:21.76 was just six seconds shy of the school record.
- Senior pole vaulter Luke Annichiarico is making his return this year after missing competition in 2016-17. Annichiarico finished 10th in the 2016 ACC Outdoor Championships and currently sits 15th in the ACC.

WOMEN'S

- Junior Alva Hicks has broken her own school record in the women's weight throw this season. She now holds the record at 20.16m (66-1.75) and has the fourth-best mark in the conference.
- The 4x400m relay team consisting of Cydney Delley, Jordan Banks, Grace Hofferber and Sarah Johnson ran 3:48.07 at the Vanderbilt Music City Challenge, the best time by a Wake Forest women's indoor relay since the school record of 3:43.66 was set during the 2009-2010 season.
- Senior captain Jordan Banks has increased her pentathlon score by 493 points since last year's ACC Championships to 3614. She currently sits fourth in the conference after finishing 15th last year.

DEAR ACC FANS, FRIENDS & ALUMNI:

Welcome to the 2018 Atlantic Coast Conference Indoor Track and Field Championships. Thank you for joining us to witness some of the nation's top student-athletes performing at the highest level.

Our conference is coming off a successful fall sports season in which ACC teams reached the semifinal round of national championship competition in four different sports, and one student-athlete claimed an individual NCAA title. Our conference has won 150 NCAA team championships over the course of its 65-year history, and ACC student-athletes have claimed more than 300 individual national titles.

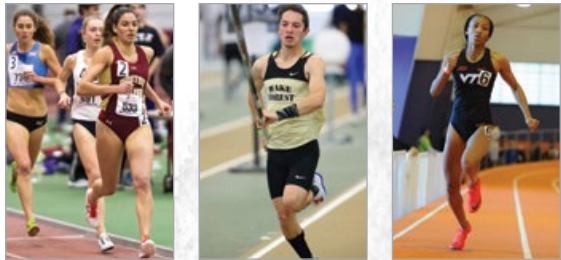
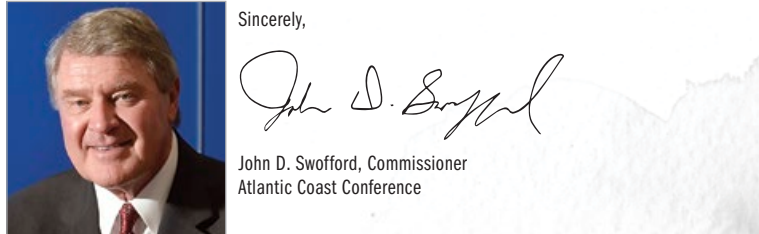
After a highly successful first year for ACC Network Extra, the conference's dedicated digital channel, fans have more opportunities to view ACC regular-season and championship contests than ever before during the current academic year. That coverage will only intensify with the launch of the ACC Network linear channel in August 2019.

Last season, ACC indoor track and field capped off an excellent year with the Virginia Tech men claiming their fourth conference title and going on to a best-ever seventh-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Syracuse tied for 10th place at the NAAs, also a program best.

In women's competition, Miami claimed its second consecutive ACC title under the watch of head coach Amy Deem, who was inducted into the USTFCCA Hall of Fame later in 2017. The Hurricanes, paced by national 400 meters gold medalist Shakima Wimbley, led all conference teams at the NCAA Championships with their eighth-place finish.

The ACC has long stood for excellence on the track and in the classroom. That commitment was demonstrated last year, when more than 700 track and field student-athletes were named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll, having earned a 3.0 GPA or better for the school year. This was one of many academic highlights in a year that saw 88 ACC teams receive Academic Progress Rate recognition awards from the NCAA, once again the most of any peer conference. The ACC's graduation success rate of 89.3 percent ranked more than five points above the national average.

Our congratulations and best wishes go out to all of our student-athletes, coaches and programs, and, again, my sincere thanks to each of you for your support of the Atlantic Coast Conference.
