Clemson's entire 1955-56 basketball schedule, excepting tournaments, will be broadcast by Radio Station WSPA, Spartanburg. The play-by-play will be done by Bill Goodrich, sports director of the station. Goodrich, who was born in Pennsylvania, attended the University of Wisconsin. He played amateur, semi-pro, and pro basketball for many years. He is well-qualified as a sports announ-

cer, having 10 years of play-by-play experience in high school and college sports in Wisconsin, Michigan, Mississippi, and the Carolinas. Bill is probably the most-traveled sports announcer in the Southeast, averaging 225 play-by-play events per year since 1951, including the complete schedule of the Spartanburg Peaches (Class B professional baseball). For the past three years, he has broadcast the Wofford College football and basketball games.
