ECAC ANNOUNCES DIVISION I FIELD HOCKEY ALL-STARS

CAPE COD, Mass. -- Northeastern junior Mari Creatini (Newton, Mass.) has been tabbed the 2003 ECAC Division

I Player of the Year by a vote of the ECAC Division I coaches. She was recently named an STX/National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) First Team all-American after she led the nation in points (72) and goals (29). Creatini was a First Team America East all-Conference selection and named the 2003 America East Offensive Player of the Year. She was also just named a finalist for the Honda National Field Hockey Player of the Year. The three-time defending America East champion Huskies finished the season with a 17-6 record.
