Junior guard Chantay Frazier drilled two three-pointers against the Broncs, including one with 53 seconds left to seal the victory... The Retrievers held Rider to just 30.9 percent shooting from the floor.

Vermont 54, at Holy Cross 44

Sophomore Courtnay Pilypaitis scored a game-high 18 points from off the bench... The Catamounts notched eight fast-break points to Holy Cross' none.

at Connecticut 98, Stony Brook 35

Senior Dana Ferraro led the Seawolves with 15 points... This is Stony Brook's only road game until November 24 at Manhattan... Televised live on CPTV.

at Kansas 76, Hartford 72

Junior MaryLynne Schaefer went 5-for-9 behind the three-point arc, including back-to-back three's in the last 34 seconds... Sophomore Diana Delva put up 18 points and an excellent defensive display of three blocks and a steal.

Saturday, November 10

Boston University 70, at Siena 66

The Saints gave the Terriers a scare with a 16-2 run in the second half, but 18-point performances by senior Kasey Devine and junior Jesyka Burks-Wiley lifted Boston U. to the season-opening victory.

at Portland State 62, Binghamton

In a late, West Coast start time, Binghamton's Laine Kurpnience netted 22 points, the most by a Bearcat in a season opener since the program went Division I in 2001... The Bearcats overcame an 11-point deficit faced in the first half, but eventually fell in the waning seconds of the game.

Friday, November 9

at Stony Brook 66, Iona 57

The Seawolves gave Michele Cherry a win in her head coaching debut... senior Aly Young led all scorers with 13 points, while preseason all-conference honoree Dana Ferraro brought down a game-high 16 rebounds.... Jodie Pikus contributed 11 points off the bench.

at Indiana 67, Albany 59

The Great Danes had a 45-37 lead in the second half, but couldn't hold on against Indiana... seniors Gia Sanders and Kristin Higy each put up a team-highs of 14 points and 10 rebounds.

at Clemson 72, Maine 59

A second win in as many years over the Tigers wasn't in the stars for the Black Bears this season... Freshman Tanna Ross notched a game-high 14 points and sophomore forward Brittany Boser earned her first career double-double (10 pts, 10 reb).

at Massachusetts 69, Vermont 68

A pair of free throws by UMass' Sakera Young with four seconds left was the difference between the win and the loss for the Catamounts... Four Catamounts hit double-digit points.

George Washington 79, at UMBC 59

Sophomore guard Carlee Cassidy drained a game-high 24 points for the Retrievers, but 24 team turnovers plagued the home team... The 2007 America East Champions raised the championship banner prior to the game.

CASSIDY CAPTURES PLAYER OF THE WEEK

UMBC's sophomore guard Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) put up career numbers en route to capturing the season's first conference player of the week. Against 13th-ranked George Washington on Friday night, Cassidy put up personal bests of 24 points, six rebounds, three assists, and 9-for-9 free throw shooting to become the America East Player of the Game. She bested her previous career high in the second half alone with 18 points, including 15 of the Retrievers' final 19 points of the game. Against Rider two days later, the sophomore scored 12 points in her limited time on the court (28 minutes) due to having four fouls. She hit all four of her free throws to bring her season total to a perfect 13-for-13. On the weekend, Cassidy averaged 18.0 ppg, 3.5 rpg, 43.5% shooting, and two steals.

TANNA ROSS POSTS AWARD-WINNING DEBUT

Maine's freshman guard Tanna Ross (Newburgh, Maine/Hampden Academy) received this week's Rookie of the Week Award. Ross scored a gamehigh 14 points in her collegiate debut in a 72-59 loss at ACC-foe Clemson on Friday night. In addition, the rookie recorded seven rebounds and three assists. Ross was an first-team all-conference and all-state selection as a senior in Maine last year, and was her conference's player of the year as a sophomore.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

TRANSFER CREDIT

Albany's Amira Ford, Tiffanie Johnson, and UM-BC's Chantay Frazier--all junior college transfers--made an immediate impact in the first weekend of college basketball. Both Ford and Johnson started for the Great Danes at the Big Ten's Indiana, with Johnson putting up solid numbers (5 points, 2 rebounds, 1 assist, 1 steal, 2 blocks) in her 13 minutes on the court. Frazier scored a team-high 14 points from off the bench against Rider on Sunday for the Retrievers. In two games on the weekend, Frazier registered 19 points, 4 steals, 6 rebounds, 2 assists and 1 blocked shot.

FROM DOWNTOWN

The three-pointer was significant in many ways during opening weekend. UMBC's Chantay Frazier hit two during a game against Rider on Sunday, including one with 53 seconds remaining to seal the 58-53 Retrievers win. Also on Sunday, Hartford's MaryLynne Schaefer went 5-for-9 from behind the three-point line, including three in the final minute and back-to-back long balls in the last 34 seconds in a close, four-point loss to Kansas. UMBC senior guard Kristin Drabyn became just the sixth Retriever ever with 100 or more three-

pointers when she drilled one against #13 George Washington on Friday night. Drabyn currently has 101 three-point field goals under her belt. Vermont as a team went 10-for-24 on the long shot with sophomore Courtnay Pilypaitis hitting five of those shots.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtnay Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) will participate in the TD Banknorth Classic and is a possible opponent for Vermont. More than half (six of 11) of the definite match-ups against preseason poll vote-getters will be played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, are one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ ESPN Division I preseason poll. The first poll of the regular season will be released the afternoon of Tuesday, November 13.

TV TIME

ESPNU will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East. The event, which is now known as the America East Women's Basketball Championship Presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese, will be held at the 3,977-seat Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. It is the sixth time in the last seven years that Friendship Cottage Cheese has served as the title sponsor. Friendship Cottage Cheese has sponsored each of the championships played in Hartford since

2002.

ALBANY GREAT DANES (0-1)

UAlbany started off the 2007-08 season with a 67-59 loss to Big Ten opponent Indiana on Friday... The Great Danes were led by senior forwards Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) and Kristin Higy (Akron, Ohio/North Canton Hoover) who both finished with 14 points and 10 rebounds... Sanders, who recorded her second career doubledouble in the game, also added four blocks, three steals and one assist, while shooting .411 from the floor... Higy played a team-high 30 minutes for the Great Danes, while recording one assist and one steal... Freshman Janea Aiken (St. Albans, N.Y./St. Dominic) started her first collegiate contest, finishing with five points, three rebounds. one block and one steal... Junior transfer Tiffanie Johnson (Richmond, Texas/Crockett) also added five points to go along with two rebounds, two blocks, one steal and one assist in her first appearance for the Great Danes... Sophomore guard Britney McGee (Bakersfield, Calif./West) finished with eight points, five boards and three assists in 17 minutes off the bench for UAlbany... The Great Danes visit St. Bonaventure on Tuesday at 7 p.m. and host Colgate on Thursday in the 07-08 home opener at 7 p.m. at SEFCU Arena.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (0-1)

Binghamton's Nov. 17 game against St. Bonaventure at the Elmira BC Arena will now start at 4 p.m. ... senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 47) poured in a game-high 22 points in Binghamton's game against Portland State on Nov. 10 ... it represents the most points scored by a Binghamton player in a season opener since the program moved up to the Division I level in 2001. The old record was 20 points by Rachel Laws against Kansas on Nov. 20, 2005. Kurpniece also made a career-high 12 free throws. She has now reached the 20-point mark eight times during her career and moves into 17th place all time in school history with 826 career points ... Binghamton's game against Portland State represents the first time it has traveled to the Pacific Time Zone in its 35-year program history ... junior forward Laura Franceski (Moscow, Pa./North Pocono) scored a career-high 15 points in the game against Portland State.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS (1-0)

Backed by a career-high 18 points from senior Kasey Devine and another 18-point performance from junior Jesyka Burks-Wiley, the Boston University women's basketball team staved off a late rally from Siena to earn the 70-66 victory in Loudonville, N.Y., in the season opener on Saturday, Nov. 10... Burks-Wiley (Kansas City, Mo./Lincoln College Prep) was 5-14 from the field and a perfect 6-6 from the free-throw line... She also brought down a game-high eight rebounds... Devine (North Kingstown, R.I./North Kingstown) was 7-10 from the field, 4-4 from the charity stripe and collected four rebounds... As a team, the Terriers were 20-23 from the free-throw line and shot 43.7 percent for the game... BU returns to action on Tuesday, Nov. 13 when it hosts URI in the home opener at 7 p.m.

HARTFORD HAWKS (0-1)

The University of Hartford women's basketball team opened the 2007-08 season with a fourpoint (76-72) loss at Kansas. Hartford was led by Diana Delva (Stamford, Conn./Westhill) who finished with 18 points and seven rebounds, tops in both categories. MaryLynne Schaefer (Centreville, Va./Westfield) added 15 points, all on three pointers, including three long range baskets in the final 34 seconds of the game. Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, NY/Walter Panas) rounded out the leading scorers with 13 points. She also added six rebounds, second most on the team. Delva also added three blocks. As a team, the Hawks shot 41 percent for the game (25-of-61) and were led by Delva, who finished 8-of-10 from the field. The Hawks will play two games this week. They begin the week at Providence on Tuesday at 7 p.m. before hosting Columbia in the home opener at Chase Arena on Friday, November 16 at 7 p.m.

MAINE BLACK BEARS (0-1)

Maine dropped a 72-59 decision to Clemson on Friday night in the Black Bears' season opener in Clemson, S.C. ... America East Rookie of the Week guard Tanna Ross (Newburgh, Maine/Hampden Academy) scored a game-high 14 points, while pulling down seven rebounds and dishing out three assists ... senior guard Kris Younan (Chicago, III./East Leyden H.S.) had 13 points, eight rebounds, two assists and two steals ... sophomore forward Brittany Boser (Palmer, Mass./Palmer H.S.) logged her first career double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds ... the Black Bears return to action with a pair of games this week ... Maine will play host to Dartmouth on Thursday

at 7 p.m., where the Academic Cup will be presented to the Black Bears Athletics Department, and then host defending Patriot League champion Holy Cross on Sunday at 1 p.m.

UMBC RETRIEVERS (1-1)

UMBC split two home games on opening weekend, falling to No. 13 George Washington, 79-59, on Nov. 9, before defeating Rider, 58-53, on Nov. 11... America East Player of the Week guard Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) led the Retrievers with 18.0 ppg on the week... She led all scorers with a career-high 24 points and also added personal bests in rebounds (6), assists (3) and free throws (9-for-9) in the season opener against the Colonials... She bested her previous career high in the second half alone with 18 points, including 15 of UMBC's final 19 points of the game... Cassidy also hit all nine of her free throw attempts, marking the best perfect game for a Retriever since Brittnie Hughes whent 9-for-9 on Dec. 1, 2005... UMBC went 17-for-18 (.944) from the foul line and hit the first 16 free throw attempts... In her first collegiate game, freshman guard Michele Brokans (Lansdale, Pa./Lansdale Catholic) led the Retrievers with seven rebounds... Senior guard Morgan Hatten (Potomac, Md./Winston Churchill) posted 15 rebounds against the Broncs, the most by a Retriever since February 1999... Junior guard Chantay Frazier (Carthage, Miss./Choctaw Central/Seminole State) scored 14 points, leading three Retrievers in double figures... Frazier hit a 3-pointer with 53 seconds left to seal the victory... Junior center MacKenzie Butler (Reno, Nev./Reno) scored a career-high 10 points and added six assists against Rider... Senior guard Kristin Drabyn (Avon, Ind./Avon) became just the sixth Retriever ever with 100 or more 3-pointers when she drilled one against the Colonials... She currently ranks sixth all-time with 101 trifectas in her career... The Retrievers conclude a busy first week, in which they play four games in eight days, with their first road game of the season at Coppin State on Nov. 14 before hosting James Madison on Nov. 16.

NEW HAMPSHIRE WILDCATS (0-0)

The Wildcats do not start the season until Tuesday, November 13 when they host Central Connecticut State at 7 p.m. in Lundholm Gymnasium before traveling to Tampa on Saturday for the South Florida Classic hosted by USF... UNH named Kristin Cole (Notre Dame '94) the program's fifth head coach on June 12, 2007. Previously, Cole served as the assistant coache at Xavier from 2002-07... Lundholm Gym has undergone significant renovations over the summer, including new bleachers and baskets... Senior Ashley Cerniglia (7.3 ppg) and sophomore Amy Simpson (7.0 ppg) are the top two returning scorers for New Hampshire in 2007-08.

STONY BROOK SEAWOLVES (1-1)

Stony Brook opened the season at home for the first time in two seasons vs. Iona. In the 66-57 win over the Gaels, senior Aly Young (Lodi, Calif./ Salt Lake CC) led all scorers with 13 points. The Seawolves also got significant contributions from Jodie Plikus (Waterford, Conn./Waterford) and Joia Daniels (Silver Spring, Md.) who each had 11 and 10 points, respectively.
