HOOD SCORES BIG, IS PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Hartford's senior forward Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) received America East Player of the Week accolades after averaging 26.5 points per game last week. Against BIG EAST-foe Providence on Tuesday night, Hood put up a season-high 27 points. The senior followed that performance with 26 points against Columbia in the Hawks' home-opener Friday night. Those are the top two individual scoring outputs in the conference this season. Hood also registered 11 boards in the two games, and shot 17-for-31 from the floor and 12-for-22 from the free-throw line. This is the first weekly honor for Hood, a preseason all-conference team member.

BELIVEAU NOTCHES ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

New Hampshire's freshman forward Denise Beliveau (Framingham, Mass./Framingham) averaged solid numbers over the Wildcats' first week of play to receive Rookie of the Week recognition. Beliveau averaged 10.7 points and 5.7 rebounds, including a 17-point, eight-rebound performance on Sunday in a win over Tennessee-Martin. In her first collegiate game on Tuesday, the rookie took away three steals, and is tied for third in the conference averaging 2.0 steals per game through three contests. Beliveau shot .444 for the week along with .429 behind the arc (6-for-14).

BIG WINS OVER BIG EAST

America East teams notched two wins this week over BIG EAST opponents in regional non-conference play. Early in the week, Hartford pounded Providence, 77-60, in Rhode Island. The victory signified the first win over the Friars for the lady Hawks and bumped Hartford's record against the conference to 4-15 with all four wins coming in Jen Rizzotti's tenure as head coach.

Vermont also had a shot at a BIG EAST squad this week, facing St. John's in the championship game of the TD Banknorth Classic on Sunday. The Catamounts came away with a 66-48 win to secure the tournament title and its first victory over a BIG EAST team since 2002.

TOURNAMENT FRENZY

Holiday time means tournament time, and America East had a couple of tune-ups last week before several more tournaments this week. New Hampshire traveled to Tampa for the South Florida Shootout and came away with a 1-1 record. Sophomore Amy Simpson was named to the All-Tournament Team. Vermont held its 14th annual TD Banknorth Classic in Burlington and won its first-ever back-to-back tournament title. Sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis received the tournament MVP nod after she led her team to wins over Brown and St. John's. Albany, Hartford, Boston U. and Vermont will all travel to play in tournaments over the holiday, while Maine will hold their annual Dead River Company Classic.

SCORING MACHINES

The conference averaged over 63 points per game in non-conference action last week, and 62 percent on the season. The 70-plus point mark has been hit by conference schools five times last week alone and seven times all season.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier,

signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters will be played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, are one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll. The first poll of the regular season will be released the afternoon of Tuesday, November 13.

TV TIME

ESPN2 will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford. It was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East. The event, which is now known as the America East Women's Basketball Championship Presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese, will be held at the 3,977-seat Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. It is the sixth time in the last seven years that Friendship Cottage Cheese has served as the title sponsor. Friendship Cottage Cheese has sponsored each of the championships played in Hartford since

2002.

ALBANY GREAT DANES (1-2)

UAlbany split a pair of non-conference games last week... The Great Danes dropped a nail-biter to St. Bonaventure, falling 64-62 on the road... Senior forward Kristin Higby (Akron, Ohio) led UAlbany in scoring with 20 points and added four rebounds, two assists, a block and a steal in 37 minutes of action... Sophomore guard TaNika Thrower (Houston, Texas) came off the bench to give the Great Danes 16 points and three steals... Senior Sherri Mikus (Duncannon, Pa.) and sophomore Charity Iromuanya (Lincoln, Neb.) each had a team-high five boards for UAlbany... The Great Danes won their home-opener on Thursday, Nov. 15 against Colgate, 86-62... Freshman guard Janea Aiken (St. Albans, N.Y.) came off the bench and scored a career and game-high 21 points to accompany five assists and two steals in 20 minutes for UAlbany... Higby scored in double digits for the third straight game, tallying 19 points, and posted a team-high seven boards to accompany three assists, two steals and a blocked shot... The Great Danes will play at La Salle Monday, Nov. 19 at 7 p.m. before heading to Long Island for the Turkey Classic over Nov. 23-24.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (0-2)

Senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 47) moved into 16th place all time in school history with 835 career points. She moved past Leala Wegwerth (2000-04), who finished with 828 points ... senior guard Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Tapiolalanen) is in 19th place all time with 808 career points. She needs two more points to tie Melissa DiPaola (1989-93) for 18th place ... junior forward Laura Franceski (Moscow, Pa./North Pocono) is averaging a career-best 13.5 points through two games. She is shooting .615 from the field (8-for-13)... The Bearcats will now visit Canisius on Tuesday at 7 p.m. for their third-straight road game to open their season.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS (2-1)

Hosting its second game in three days, the Boston University women's basketball team welcomes cross-town rival Northeastern on Monday, Nov. 17 for a 5:30 p.m. tip-off... The contest is the first in a doubleheader with the men's team, which faces off with the Huskies at 8:00 p.m... BU leads the all-time series, 35-30, including last year's 93-79 victory at Matthews Arena... BU is coming off a strong showing against No. 16 Ohio State on Saturday evening. Senior Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterdon) posted a career-high 23 points on 7-for-15 shooting - five field goals from 3-point range... Also posting double figures were junior Jesyka Burks-Wiley (Kansas City, Mo./Lincoln College Prep) with 16 points, senior Kasey Devine (North Kingstown, R.I./North Kingstown) with 11 points and junior Amarachi Umez-Eronini (Washington, D.C./Woodrow Wilson) with 10 points... Four Terriers are currently averaging double digits for the season, as Burks-Wiley leads with 14.7 ppg, followed closely by Devine (14.3 ppg) and junior Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) and Raffo with 11.3 ppg each... BU continues to be solid from the free-throw line, shooting 86.4 percent (51-for-59), with three athletes perfect from the charity stripe... Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) is 10-for-10, Burks-Wiley is 6-for-6 and Raffo is 4-for-4... The Terriers have shot .462 from the field (73-for-158).

HARTFORD HAWKS (2-1)

The University of Hartford women's basketball team picked up a pair of wins last week. The first was a 77-60 road victory against BIG EAST foe Providence College. Hartford then defeated Columbia, 57-33, in the home opener at Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. The Hawks were led in both games by America East Player of the Week Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) who finished with 27 points at Providence and 26 against Columbia. She finished 10-of-15 from the field at Providence, while adding a 7-of-9 effort at the free throw line. She then finished 7-of-16 against the Lions. She also finished 12-of-13 from the free throw line against Columbia. Also leading the Hawks at Providence was Diana Delva (Stamford, Conn./Westhill) who finished with 15 points on 5-of-7 shooting and 5-of-8 at the free throw line. Five players led the Hawks in rebounding, with five each, at Providence, while MaryLynne Schaefer (Centreville, Va./Westfield) and Erica Beverly (Bridgeport, Conn./Kolbe Cathedral) led the team against Columbia with eight rebounds each. The Hawks begin a nine-day trip with a Tuesday meeting at Brigham Young in a rematch of last season's home victory for Hartford. The Hawks then travel to Honolulu, Hawaii for their second appearance in the Jack in the Box Rainbow Wahine Classic beginning on Friday.

MAINE BLACK BEARS (1-2)

Maine split its pair of games this past week ... the Black Bears picked up their first win of the season on Thursday with a 67-53 win over Dartmouth ... However, Maine dropped a 79-50 decision to Holy Cross on Sunday ... Freshman guard Tanna Ross (Newburgh, Maine/Hampden Academy) led Maine with 16 points versus Dartmouth ... It marked the second time this season she has led the team in scoring ... Junior forward Colleen Kilmurray (Wall, N.J./Wall H.S.) paced the Black Bears with 15 points on Sunday against the Crusaders ... She also led the team with seven rebounds ... It marked the first time in her career she led the team in scoring as the 15 points also marked a career-high ... Sophomore forward Brittany Boser (Palmer, Mass./Palmer H.S.) had 12 points versus Holy Cross, marking the second time in three games this season she logged double-figures in scoring ... Sophomore guard Kristin Baker (Bingham, Maine/Upper Kennebec Valley H.S.) had a career-high 12 points versus Holy Cross as well ... Maine returns to action this weekend when the Black Bears play host to the 2007 Dead River Company Classic in Orono ... Maine will take on defending Ivy League champion Harvard on Friday at 7 p.m., and then take on either Hofstra or Quinnipiac on Saturday at either 3:30 or 6 p.m.

UMBC RETRIEVERS (1-3)

UMBC dropped a pair of games last week, falling at local rival Coppin State, 75-43, on Nov. 14, and to James Madison, 74-61... Sophomore guard Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) scored a team-high 18 points and added a career-best seven rebounds against the Eagles... The Retrievers shot just 23.3 percent and committed 25 turnovers in the game... Junior guard Melissa Book (Raleigh, N.C./Millbrook) scored a career-high 14 points and was 4-for-4 from 3-point range in UMBC's loss to the Dukes... Junior guard Chantay Frazier (Carthage, Miss./Choctaw Central/Seminole State) also scored 14 points and added six rebounds... The Retrievers drastically improved their shooting percentage and turnover mark from the previous game, as they shot 39.7 percent from the floor and committed just seven miscues... Junior center MacKenzie Butler (Reno, Nev./Reno) scored a career-high 12 points and added four assists and two blocks... Senior guard Kristin Drabyn ranks sixth all-time at UMBC with 102 career 3-point field goals... Drabyn scored her 500th career point against James Madison... Cassidy leads the Retrievers with 14.0 ppg, while senior guard Morgan Hatten (Potomac, Md./Watkins Mill) is tops with 6.8 rpg... The Retrievers take on their second straight Colonial Athletic Association opponent when they head to George Mason on Nov. 21... UMBC will then return home to host in-state rival Mount St. Mary's on Nov. 24.

NEW HAMPSHIRE WILDCATS (2-1)

The University of New Hampshire women's basketball team is 2-1 after the first week of action ... Senior guard Ashley Cerniglia (Pittsford, N.Y./Sutherland) registered a team-high 18 points, leading the Wildcats in a total team effort, past Central Connecticut, 71-59, in the season opener Tuesday evening at Lundholm Gymnasium ... Eleven players recorded points in the game for Kristin Cole's first career victory as a head coach ... Courtney Larsen (Carteret, N.J./Carteret) tallied 13 points in her first collegiate game ... On Saturday, sophomore Amy Simpson (Waterford, Conn./Waterford) posted a career-high 23 points to lead the Wildcats in a 72-56 loss to the Univer-

sity of South Florida as part of the South Florida Shootout at the Sun Dome ... Simpson, who was selected to the USF Shootout All-Tournament Team, had 13 points in the Wildcats 71-59 victory over Tennessee-Martin in the second game of the Shootout on Sunday afternoon ... Four players on the team post in double-figures in the win ... America East Rookie of the Week Denise Beliveau (Framingham, Mass./Framingham) posted a career-high 17 points. She also led the Wildcats in offensive rebounds with five for a career-best eight boards in the game ...
