HOOD NOTCHES PLAYER OF THE WEEK AGAIN

For the second straight week, University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) is the America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week. Hood earned tournament MVP honors as she led her Hawks to the 29th Annual Jack in the Box Rainbow Wahine Classic title in Honolulu, Hawaii. She averaged 17.0 points, including a season-high-tying 27 points against Alabama-Birmingham, 17 points against the host Hawaii Rainbow, and 19 points in the title game against Virginia. Hood averaged 5.0 rebounds per game, and totaled four assists, two blocks and three steals over four games last week. The senior forward shot .491 from the field (28-of-57) and sank 12 of 14 free-throw attempts.

ROOKIE YOUNG HAS CAREER GAMES

Tonya Young (Canaan, N.H./Mascoma Valley Regional) of the University of Vermont posted two of her best games of the season thus far to capture the America East Rookie of the Week. In two games at the La Quinta Inn & Suites Thanksgiving Tournament hosted by Northern Arizona, Young averaged 8.5 points and 2.0 rebounds in just 19 minutes per game. She also shot 58.3% from the field and was 3-for-4 from the foul line. Young posted eight points in the loss to Ball State and added nine points and three rebounds in the win over Fairleigh Dickinson.

HARTFORD TAKES TITLE

The Hartford Hawks flew home with the tournament trophy at the 29th Annual Jack in the Box Rainbow Wahine Classic hosted by the University of Hawaii in Honolulu, Hawaii. The Hawks cut through three solid teams to earn the title over six other squads. Hartford defeated Alabama-Birmingham, 83-74, in the first round, and then routed the host Rainbow, 76-63, in the semifinals on Saturday. The Hawks came out on top on Sunday against the ACC's Virginia, 70-53. After all was said and done, senior Danielle Hood captured MVP honors, averaging 21 points per game for the tournament. Joining Hood on the All-Tournament team was sophomore Diana Delva and junior MaryLynn Schaefer.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

A LOT OF THIS, A LOT OF THAT

It would be hard to deny that Vermont sophomore guard Courtney Pilypaitis is a well-rounded player. Pilypaitis is in the conference's top five in nine of 12 statistical categories, and is in the top ten in a 10th category. She leads the league in free-throw percentage, missing just one shot out of 24 attempts. Pilypaitis is also ranked second in assists (4.83 apg), three-point field goal percentage (.500), three-point field goals made (2.17 pg) and defensive rebounds (6.33 drpg).

TERRIER THREAT

It's nearly impossible to shut down the Boston University offense (72.0 ppg) since it's nearly impossible to shut down four different scoring threats at once. Four Terriers are averaging double-digit points: senior Kasey Devine (13.7

ppg), junior Jesyka Burks-Wiley (13.3), senior Cheri Raffo (10.5), and junior Christine Kinneary (8.2). Not only are those four players putting up numbers, but sophomore Aly Hinton's 35 points against Northeastern on November 19 proves that a threat can come out of nowhere if opposing teams ignore the rest of the team to cover the big four.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of

eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters will be played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiving two votes in the most recent poll released on November 20.

TV TIME

ESPN will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick

Nero, Commissioner of America East. The event, which is now known as the America East Women's Basketball Championship Presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese, will be held at the 3,977-seat Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. It is the sixth time in the last seven years that Friendship Cottage Cheese has served as the title sponsor. Friendship Cottage Cheese has sponsored each of the championships played in Hartford since 2002.

"We are excited to again partner with Friendship Cottage Cheese for the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at Hartford," said Nero. ALBANY GREAT DANES (1-5)

UAlbany dropped three games last week in non-conference play... The Great Danes fell to La Salle, 70-59, on the road before dropping a 61-54 decision to Holy Cross in the first round of the LIU Turkey Classic... UAlbany then lost a 54-52 contest to Youngstown State in the consolation game of the tournament... Sophomore TaNika Thrower (Houston, Texas/Northbrook) led the team, averaging 11.3 points in the three games last week... Thrower added 4.7 rebounds, 2.0 assists, 2.0 steals and a .444 shooting percentage... She reached double-figure scoring totals in all three games, totaling 13 points at La Salle, 11 points versus Holy Cross and 10 points against Youngstown State... Freshman Janea Aiken (St. Albans, N.Y./St. Dominic) averaged 7.7 points

per game last week... Senior Kristin Higy (Akron, Ohio/North Canton Hoover) averaged 8.0 points and 5.0 rebounds in three games... After scoring just two points versus La Salle, Higy scored a team-high 12 points against Holy Cross and added 10 points on 6-for-6 shooting from the free throw line against Youngstown State... Higy is leading the team on the season, averaging 12.8 points and 6.0 rebounds... The Great Danes travel to Sacred Heart on Wednesday, Nov. 28 before visiting crosstown-rival Siena on Saturday, Dec. 1.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (0-4)

Binghamton dropped two games this week... The Bearcats fell, 56-65, to Canisius and 52-70 to Sacred Heart... Senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 47) led the Bearcats with 12 points and seven rebounds against Sacred Heart on Sunday. In the process, she moved into 15th place all time in school history with 851 career points, passing Katrina Roggenbaum (who scored 850 points from 1990-94) ... Binghamton's game against Sacred Heart marks the end of its four-game road stretch to start the season. The last time the program opened its season with four straight road games was from Nov. 21-Dec. 2, 1997. The Bearcats will play seven of their next 10 games at home, including the home opener on Wednesday, November 28 against Bucknell at 7 p.m.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS (4-2)

The Boston University women's basketball team erased a 16-point deficit and came to within three points, but North Carolina A&T hit 10 free throws in the last three minutes to pull off a 62-54 victory on Saturday evening at Fleming Gym... The Terriers were led by Kasey Devine (North Kingstown, R.I./North Kingstown) with 14 points... Boston U. falls to 4-2 on the season, while the Aggies improve to 4-1 overall... Also scoring in double figures were senior Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterton) (13 points), and juniors Jesyka Burks-Wiley (Kansas City, Mo./Lincoln College Prep) (10 points) and Amarachi Umez-Eronini (Washington, D.C./Woodrow Wilson) (10 points). Burks-Wiley and Devine led the Terriers with seven rebounds apiece... The Terriers out-scored the Aggies, 37-33, in the second half and shot 42.9 percent in the stanza... Boston U. drew to within four points with 11:16 remaining on a layup by Umez-Eronini... The Terriers remained within arms reach, however, the Aggies hit 10 free throws in the final 2:44 to hold off the Terriers' rally... The night before Burks-Wiley led all scorers with a season-high 19 points - 15 in the second half, as Boston U. cruised to a commanding 69-42 victory over UNC Greensboro on the first day of the UNCG tournament... On Monday, sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) hit a career-high 35 points and junior Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) tied a single-game school record for assists with 14 as Boston U. rallied from a 10-point deficit to defeat cross-town rival Northeastern, 94-84, at Case Gym... Hinton is the first Terrier since March 11, 2005 to score 30 or more points in a single game... The Terriers got 53.2 percent of their points off the bench as Hinton and senior Corinne Jean (Victoriaville, Quebec/College Montemorency) combined for 50 points - 33 in the second half... Boston U. out-rebounded the Huskies by a 33-26 margin, dished out 25 assists and earned seven steals.

HARTFORD HAWKS (6-1)

The University of Hartford women's basketball team will return to West Hartford, Conn. with a championship trophy, having knocked off Virginia for the 29th Annual Jack in the Box Rainbow Wahine Classic on Sunday by a score of 70-53. The Hawks were 4-0 last week following a week opening win over perennial Mountain West champion Brigham Young, 70-59, on Wednesday and three wins in Honolulu, Hawaii. The Hawks opened the tournament with an 83-74 win over UAB and then defeated the host Rainbow Wahine, 76-63, in the semifinals. Hartford, behind the play of All-Tournament players MaryLynne Schaefer, Diana Delva and America East Player of the Week Danielle Hood defeated Virginia, 70-53, for the championship. Hood was named the tournament Most Valuable Player, averaging 21 points over the three day event. She opened with 27 points in the win over UAB, then added 17 against Hawaii and 19 against the Cavaliers. Schaefer scored 16 in the tournament opener and then added 17 in the win over Virginia, including four three-pointers with her last one breaking the all-time career record for three pointers made at Hartford. The Hawks will play at the University of Massachusetts on Saturday, December 1 in their only action next week.

MAINE BLACK BEARS (1-4)

Maine dropped a pair of games this past weekend in the Dead River Company Classic played at Alford Arena in Orono ... The Black Bears opened its tournament schedule on Friday with an 82-78 loss to defending Ivy League champion Harvard, and then dropped a 70-49 decision to Quinnipiac on Saturday ... Sophomore forward Brittany Boser (Palmer, Mass./Palmer H.S.) was named to the All-Tournament team after she averaged 14.5 points per game during the tournament ... Versus Harvard, Boser tallied her second double-double of the season with 10 points and 13 rebounds ... Against Quinnipiac, she poured in a career-high 19 points ... Junior forward Colleen Kilmurray (Wall, N.J./Wall H.S.) led Maine in scoring with a career-high 20 points ... Kilmurray and Boser were two of four Black Bears to score in double-figures versus the Crimson ... In addition to those two, freshman guard Emily Rousseau (Biddeford, Maine/Biddeford H.S.) and senior guard Kris Younan (Chicago, Ill./East Leyden H.S.) scored 18 and 12 points, respectively ... The DRCC capped a four-game homestand for the Black Bears ... Maine now hits the road for all eight of its games during the month of December ... The Black Bears will face William & Mary on Thursday (7 p.m.), and then take on Fairfield on Sunday (2 p.m.).

UMBC RETRIEVERS (2-4)

UMBC split a pair of games last week, dropping a heartbreaker at George Mason, 58-57, on Nov. 21, before routing in-state rival Mount St. Mary's, 68-40, at home on Nov. 24... Sophomore guard Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) scored a team-high 17 points against the Patriots, including nine in the final 5:40 of play, despite spending most of the second half on the bench in foul trouble... The Retrievers snapped their three-game losing streak with the win over the Mount... Mount St. Mary's 40 points were the fewest UMBC has allowed since Feb. 1, 2006, when Binghamton scored 37, and the 28-point margin of victory was the biggest since an 87-52 win over Morgan State on Nov. 23, 2004... UMBC's 68 points in the game are a season high... The Retrievers hit a season-high 10 three-point-

ers, the most since they drained the same number against George Washington on Nov. 10, 2006... Cassidy scored 11 of the Retrievers' first 14 points of the game, while junior center MacKenzie Butler (Reno, Nev./Reno) scored eight of the team's first 11 points of the second half... UMBC used scoring runs of 17-0 in the first half and 18-2 in the second to break the game open... Senior guard Kristin Drabyn (Avon, Ind./Avon) came off the bench for the first time since March 10, 2006, ending a streak of 38 straight starts, but finished with a season-high 15 points... The Mountaineers' 11 field goals and .200 shooting percentage are the lowest allowed by UMBC in at least 10 years... Drabyn ranks sixth all-time at UMBC with 105 career 3-point field goals... The Retrievers play just one game this week, traveling to NJIT on Nov. 28.
