at Hartford 73, Hofstra 42

The Hawks shot 47% for the game from the field and held the Pride to just 27%... Hartford received 33 points from off the bench, including Katie Kelley's 10 points... Senior Danielle Hood's 11 points led the team in scoring for the seventh time this season.

Saturday, December 8

at Massachusetts 74, Maine 55

Rookie Tanna Ross recorded a career-high 20 points... Emily Rousseau and Sandra Vaitkute also scored in double-digits with 13 and 12 points, respectively.

at Liberty 76, Binghamton 40

The Bearcats shot 34.0 percent, while Liberty shot 63 percent from the field... Sophomore Muffy Sadler netted a team-high eight points, including a pair of treys.

at Vermont 46, Lafayette 45

Amy Rosenkrantz made a lay-up with 38 seconds remaining to lift the Catamounts... Vermont snapped the Leopards' five-game winning streak with the victory.

Harvard 59, at New Hampshire 53

Candace Williams notched her second double-double of the season with 10 points and 12 rebounds... Amy Simpson scored all of her 10 points in the first half.

at Detroit-Mercy 51, Albany 49

Three Great Danes reached double-digit points, including Kristin Higy with 12 points, Britney McGee with 11 points, and Charity Iromuanya with 11 points... Albany forced 24 Detroit turnovers.

Friday, December 7

at Yale 81, Stony Brook 64

The Seawolves used 13 different players on the court, all of whom posted points on the scoresheet... Senior Aly Young paced the offense with 11 points, while senior Dana Ferraro and freshman Jodie Plikus each tallied 10 points.

at Hartford 64, St. John's 62

Despite the victory for the Hawks, leading scorer Danielle Hood did not hit a field goal until the second half... Hood finished with 16 points and five rebounds... Sophomore Diana Delva registered a team-high nine rebounds.

CASSIDY CAPTURES HER SECOND AWARD

UMBC sophomore guard Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) received her second weekly honor of the season with the America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week. Cassidy led the Retrievers to a 2-1 week with 19.0 points per game and 4.7 rebounds per game. She shot 46.5 percent (20-for-43) from the floor and 40.0 percent (8-for-20) from three-point range. Cassidy scored 17 points at Loyola to go along with a team-high six rebounds and four assists. Two days later in UMBC's win at Navy, the sophomore led the Retrievers' second-half charged with nine straight points and finished with 15 for the game. Finally, she posted a career-high 25 points in UM-BC's 74-72 victory over Northern Iowa, making a career-high eight field goals (8-for-13), including a career-best five from three-point range. She again took over the game for the Retrievers in the second half, leading a rally with 11 straight points in a three-minute span late in the game in the come-from-behind win. Cassidy increased her team-best scoring average to 15.4 ppg.

ROSS NETS CAREER-HIGH AGAINST UMASS

Freshman guard Tanna Ross (Newburgh, Maine/ Hampden Academy) from Maine was named the America East Rookie of the Week for the second time this year after also doing so the first week of the season. Ross poured in a career-high 20 points against Massachusetts, and led Maine in scoring for the third game of the season. The rookie shot 6-for-8 from behind the arc and 7-for-13 overall from the field. Ross ranks 20th in the conference in scoring (9.0 ppg), sixth in three-pointers made (1.88 pg) and 11th in three-point field goal percentage (.333).

THE REPORT IS IN

The first RPI (Ratings Percentage Index) report of the 2007-08 season was released earlier today, and the likely suspects are the top America East teams on the list. Hartford (8-2) is ranked 31st and has played opponents whose average RPI is 42. Boston University (6-3) is the next conference representative at the 105th spot. Vermont (6-2) follows 30 steps behind at 135 with a top-100 winning percentage (.750-55th).

HIGH-FLYING

All week long, new conference highs were set or tied in several catergories. UMBC senior Kristin Drabyn started the week by hitting six three-point field goals against Loyola on Monday. On Saturday, Maine rookie phenom Tanna Ross matched that high, hitting six of her own long balls against Massachusetts. Also of note, UMBC sunk a newhigh of 12 team three-pointers at home against Northern Iowa on Sunday. Earlier in the week, Albany junior Kirsten Peterson recorded five rejections against Buffalo on Wednesday and teammate Kirstin Higy earned six takeaways at Detroit-Mercy on Saturday.

STRAIGHT A'S

During halftime of the Vermont vs. Louisville contest at Patrick Gymnasium Wednesday night, America East commissioner Patrick Nero will present the Catamounts with the 2006-07 Academic Cup. For the first time in conference history two member institutions shared the America East Academic Cup. Maine and Vermont saw their student-athletes maintain a 3.07 grade-point average. Vermont, which also won the Academic Cup in 1996, 2005 and 2006, is the first institution to win it four times.

A LOT OF THIS, A LOT OF THAT

It would be hard to deny that Vermont sophomore guard Courtnay Pilypaitis is a well-rounded player. Pilypaitis is in the conference's top five in nine of 13 statistical categories, and is in the top ten in a 10th and 11th category. She leads the league in three-point field goal percentage (.459) and defensive rebounds (6.25 drpg). Pilypaitis is also ranked second in assists (4.50 apg), free-throw percentage (.931), and three-point field goals made (2.13 pg)

TERRIER THREAT

The Terriers have a conference-best five players in the America East top-30 scorers this season, and four players in the top 20. The Boston University scoring threat is producing 70.2 points per game, tied for tops in the league.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtnay Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters will be played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiving four votes in the most recent poll released on December 4. The next poll will be released the afternoon of Tuesday, December 11.

TV TIME

ESPNU will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV

Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East. ALBANY GREAT DANES (1-9)

UAlbany dropped two games last week in nonconference play... The Great Danes fell to Buffalo, 70-69, in overtime at home before dropping a 51-49 decision to Detroit Mercy on the road... Sophomore Charity Iromuanya (Lincoln, Neb./ Lincoln Northeast) averaged a team-high 15.5 points in the two games... Iromuanya scored a career-high 20 points against Buffalo and finished with 11 points at Detroit... She went 7-of-8 from the free-throw line against the Bulls, adding five rebounds, three assists and three steals... She grabbed another five boards to go along with two assists, one block and one steal versus the Titans... Sophomore Britney McGee (Bakersfield, Calif./West) averaged 15.0 points last week, netting 11 on 7-of-9 shooting from the free throw line against Detroit and finishing with 19 points against Buffalo... McGee also led the team with 6.5 rebounds per game... Senior Kristin Higy (Akron, Ohio/North Canton Hoover) also averaged double-figure scoring with 12.0 points per game... Junior center Kirsten Peterson (Owego, N.Y./Newark Valley) set a career high with five blocks against Buffalo... The Great Danes are averaging 11.3 steals and 3.5 blocks per game, led by senior Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) who has recorded 11 blocks and 20 steals this season... Sanders is fourth on the UAlbany career chart with 120 blocks... UAlbany does not have another game until Dec. 19 when they travel to Richmond for a non-conference tilt.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (1-7)

The Bearcats dropped consecutive road games this week at Duquesne and Liberty... Senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 47) and senior guard Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Tapiololonken) continue to climb up the all-time Binghamton career scoring lists. Sario is now in 14th place all time in school history with 864 points. This last week, she passed Robyn LeBel (857 points from 1991-93) and Sonny Mehring (860 points from 1978-82). Kurpniece is in 13th place with 890 career points ... Junior forward Laura Franceski blocked three shots in three consecutive games (ending with the Bearcats' game against Duquesne last Tuesday) She now has 96 rejections and moves into second place all time, surpassing Alicia Brennan (1986-90), who had 95 career blocks ... Freshman Jaki Goldner (Katonah, N.Y./Somers) had a career-high eight points against Liberty on Saturday... Binghamton travels to Villanova on December 13 and will return home to host Colgate on December 16.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS (6-3)

It was a tale of two halves as the Boston University women's basketball team overcame a 10-point deficit to defeat Brown, 59-38, on Wednesday evening, backed by senior Kasey Devine's (North

Kingstown, R.I./North Kingstown) first doubledouble of the season... Devine netted 16 points and grabbed 10 boards... The Terriers improve to 6-3 overall, while the Bears drop to 1-9 on the season... A game-changing 21-4 run midway through the second half gave the Terriers a commanding 21-point advantage with three minutes remaining in regulation... Boston U. was a sterling 20-for-23 from the charity stripe, while out-rebounding the Bears, 45-40... Boston U. took advantage of its 17 offensive boards and converted on 17 second-chance points... The Terriers' bench posted 23 points to Brown's six... Sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) chipped in 12 points, while senior Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterdon) earned three steals.... The Terriers return to action Tuesday night at Harvard after having the weekend off.

HARTFORD HAWKS (8-2)

The University of Hartford women's basketball team continued its home court dominance with a pair of wins over St. John's (64-62) and Hofstra (73-42). The Hawks opened the week using clutch free-throw shooting in the final minutes to walk away with a two-point win over the Red Storm. The Hawks were led by Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) who finished with 16 points, 13 of which came in the second half. Hood scored eight of her 16 points at the free-throw line (8-of-10) while grabbing five boards and passing for three assists. Hood again scored the bulk of her points in the second half, including her first collegiate three-pointer, to finish with 11 points in the Hawks' 31-point win over Hofstra. The Hofstra win is the largest margin of victory this season, and the biggest since November of 2006 when Hartford posted a 39 points rout of Columbia. Against the Pride, the Hawks again relied on its free-throw shooting, connecting on 28-of-34 attempts (82.4 percent). Three players finished 4-of-4 at the free throw-line, while Lisa Etienne (Norwalk, Conn./Brien McMahon) finished 6-of-7. Etienne posted back-to-back double-digit outings this week, finishing with 12 on Friday and 10 on Sunday. For the season, the Hawks are led by Hood, who averages 17.2 points, while Diana Delva (Stamford, Conn./Westhill) leads the team at 6.3 rebounds-per-game. The Hawks play one game before breaking for finals, a match-up with the 2007 Cinderella team, Marist College, on Wednesday at 7 p.m. Marist advanced to the Sweet 16 last year before falling to eventual national champion Tennessee.

MAINE BLACK BEARS (1-7)

Maine dropped a 74-55 decision at Massachusetts on Saturday at the Mullins Center in Amherst, Mass. ... The Black Bears were led in scoring by America East Rookie of the Week guard Tanna Ross (Newburgh, Maine/Hampden Academy), who poured in a game and career-high 20 points ... It marked the third time this season Ross led the team in scoring ... She also shot an impressive 6-of-8 from behind the arc ... Classmate Emily Rousseau (Biddeford, Maine/Biddeford H.S.) chipped in with 13 points, while sophomore center Sandra Vaitkute (Silute, Lithuania/The Miller School) poured in a career-high 12 points ... Vaitkute also added eight rebounds in the contest ... The Black Bears travel to the Big Apple next weekend for a pair of games in New York City ... Maine will face Big East-foe St. John's on Friday at 7 p.m., and then take on St. Francis (NY) on Sunday at 2 p.m.

UMBC RETRIEVERS (4-6)

UMBC won two of three games last week, dropping a 58-56 heartbreaker at cross-town rival Loyola on Dec. 3 before defeating Navy, 59-51, on Dec. 5, and Northern Iowa, 74-72, on Dec. 9... The Retrievers won back-to-back games for the first time all season... Senior guard Kristin Drabyn (Avon, Ind./Avon) scored a career-high 24 points with six 3-pointers against the Greyhounds... Drabyn scored UMBC's first 12 points of the game on four 3-pointers ... The Retrievers drilled 10 three-pointers in the game... Drabyn, America East Player of the Week sophomore quard Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) and senior guard Morgan Hatten (Potomac, Md./Winston Churchill) each tallied 15 points in UMBC's victory at Navy, the Retrievers' first road win of the season... Hatten also added a team-best eight rebounds and six assists... The Retrievers drained a seasonhigh 12 three-pointers in the home win over Northern Iowa, the most since January 2005... Cassidy posted career highs with 25 points and five 3-pointers... The Retrievers' 74 points were a season high... UMBC shot 44.4 percent from the floor and from long distance, both season bests...
