

Catamount Head Coach Sharon Dawley captured her 200th career coaching victory with the win... Junior Amy Rosenkrantz netted a career-high 22 points and tallied five steals... Sophomore Courtnay Pilypaitis' 11 points and 11 assists is the first points-assists double-double in the conference this season.

at Binghamton 74, Colgate 26

The Bearcats allowed just seven points to the Red Raiders in the first half... The 48-point margin of victory was the largest of Binghamton's Division I era... Junior forward Laura Franceski blocked four shots to run up her career total to 100 blocks.

Maine 58, at St. Francis N.Y. 47

The Black Bears shot 50% from the field (23 of 46) and freshman guard Emily Rousseau netted a team-high 15 points... The victory snapped Maine's seven-game losing streak and marks the first road win of the season for the Blacks Bears.

Saturday, December 15

at Northeastern 78, New Hampshire 71

Rookie Denise Beliveau notched her first career double-double with a team-high 22 points and 10 rebounds... Classmate Jacinda Williams dished out the ball for a team-high four assists.

Friday, December 14

at St. John's 80, Maine 50

Sophomore Brittany Boser posted her third double-double of the season with 15 points and 10 rebounds... Rookies Tanna Ross and Christina Mosher each chipped in 10 points.

at Stony Brook 65, Dartmouth 48

Senior Aly Young had a near triple-double with 20 points, nine rebounds and seven steals for a career night... Senior Dana Ferraro pulled down 12 rebounds and posted 12 points for a double-double.

DELVA AND YOUNG SHARE ACCOLADES

University of Hartford sophomore forward Diana Delva (Stamford, Conn./Westhill) and Stony Brook University senior foward Aly Young (Lodi, Calif./Salt Lake CC) share America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week honors for the week ending December 16. Young averaged 16.0 ppg, 5.5 rpg and 5.0 spg, including a near triple-double against Dartmouth on December 14. Against the Big Green, Young notched 20 points, nine rebounds, seven steals and three assists in a career night. The senior also added three blocks last week while shooting .462 from the floor, .571 from long range and a perfect 4-for-4 from the charity stripe.

Delva helped lead the Hawks to arguably the most important win of the season thus far against Marist on Wednesday night in Poughkeepsie. The sophomore finished one point shy of her second double-double of the season with nine points and a career-high 16 rebounds. Eight of her rebounds were offensive, helping Hartford to its 19-2 advantage in second chance points. She finished the game shooting 50% from the field on 3-of-6 overall, while she didn't miss at the free throw line, connecting on all three of her attmempts. Delva also added two blocks and an assist to the night.

BELIVEAU TOP ROOKIE FOR A THIRD TIME

For the third time already this season, University of New Hampshire's Denise Beliveau (Framingham, Mass./Framingham) takes home the America East Rookie of the Week. The rookie forward tallied career highs in points (22) and rebounds (10) for her first career double-double against Northeastern on Saturday. Earlier in the week against Iona, Beliveau notched 12 points and four steals. She has cracked the top-ten in scoring with 11.2 ppg this season, and leads the conference in three-point field goal percentage (.448).

THE REPORT IS IN

In this week's Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com, Hartford moved up 11 spots despite playing just one game last week. With their 49-32 win over Marist on Wednesday, the Hawks swooped up to the 20th spot from 31 last week. The biggest movers from America East were Vermont and Maine, each moving up 23 spots. The Catamounts stepped up into the 112th spot with a game against Louisville and a win over Harvard, while the Black Bears improved to 259 after picking up their second win of the season over St. Francis (N.Y.) on Sunday, 58-47.

200 CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday when the Catamounts defeated Harvard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley is now 200-124 through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Associate Head Coach under Chris Wieglus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

STUDY BREAK

Many teams are in the midst of their break period to take fall semester final exams. UMBC has not played a game since December 9 and Albany has been idle since December 8. Only three games are scheduled for this week until Saturday, when five schools are back in action. All squads are then off again until Boston University kicks off the

post-holiday schedule with the VCU Tournament beginning on Thursday, December 27 against Georgia Southern.

CHECK YOUR LOCAL LISTINGS

The Hartford Hawks continue their tough non-conference schedule with a televised game on Comcast Sports Network (CSN) on Saturday, December 22 against the 21st-ranked Michigan State Spartans. The match-up pits the 9-2 Hawks against the 7-3 Spartans at Chase Arena in West Hartford at 2 p.m. Comcast SportsNet reaches more than 3.7 million households in Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Vermont.

A LOT OF THIS, A LOT OF THAT

It would be hard to deny that Vermont sophomore guard Courtnay Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter's) is a well-rounded player. Pilypaitis is in the conference's top five in five of 13 statistical categories, and is in the top ten in 11 of the 13 categories.

TERRIER THREAT

The Terriers have a conference-best five players in the America East top-30 scorers this season, all also in the top-25. The Boston University scoring threat is producing 69.4 points per game, tops in the league.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final firstplace vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtnay Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters will be played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiv-

ing eight votes in the most recent poll released on December 11. The next poll will be released the afternoon of Tuesday, December 18.

TV TIME

ESPNU will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

ALBANY GREAT DANES (1-9)

UAlbany did not play last week... The Great Danes will return to action on Wednesday, Dec. 19 as they travel to Richmond for a 4:30 p.m. contest... UAlbany will host just the third home game of the season on Saturday, Dec. 22, taking on St. Francis (N.Y.) at 2 p.m. as part of a doubleheader with the men's team... The Great Danes continue to be led by senior forward Kristin Higy (Akron, Ohio/North Canton Hoover), who is scoring a team-best 11.6 points per game and grabbing a team-best 5.5 rebounds per contest... Sophomore TaNika Thrower (Houston, Texas/Northbrook) adds 8.8 points per game... Senior forward Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./ The Bullis School) paces the team defensively with 11 blocks and 20 steals... Sanders, who also adds 4.5 points and 4.9 rebounds per game, is fourth on UAlbany's career blocks chart with 120.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (2-8)

The Bearcats dropped a game to Villanova on the road and defeated Colgate at home this week... Binghamton set three Division I program records in its 74-26 win over Colgate on Sunday, December 16. The 48-point margin of victory eclipsed the Bearcats' 35-point win at Vermont on March 4, 2006 (84-49). The 26 points allowed surpassed the 29 points allowed against Northeastern on Jan. 13, 2004, and the seven points allowed in the first half beat the old record of 13 points allowed in the first half against Maine on Jan. 10, 2007 ... Junior forward Laura Franceski (Moscow. Pa./North Pocono) had four blocks against Colgate, giving her an even 100 blocks for her career ... Senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 41) and senior guard Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Tapiolalonken) continue to climb up the Binghamton career scoring charts. Kurpniece ranks 13th all time with 906 points while Sario is 14th with 891 points.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS (6-4)

The Boston University women's basketball team dropped a 72-62 decision to Harvard on Wednesday evening at the Crimson's Lavietes Pavilion... The Crimson hit 18-of-19 free throws in the second half to earn the come-from-behind victory... The Terriers were paced by juniors Jesyka Burks-Wiley (Kansas City, Mo./Lincoln College Prep) and Amarachi Umez-Eronini (Washington, D.C./Woodrow Wilson) with 19 and 14 points, respectively... Boston U. falls to 6-4 overall, while Harvard improves to 6-4... Boston U. shot 32.9 percent from the field and 76.5 percent from the charity stripe...

Junior Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) chipped in with 12 points and six assists... Senior Kasey Devine (North Kingstown, R.I./North Kingstown) swatted three shots to go along with her eight points and two steals, while Burks-Wiley brought down eight boards.

HARTFORD HAWKS (9-2)

The University of Hartford women's basketball team played just one game last week, a 49-32 win at Marist, breaking a 26-game home win streak, and a 10 game win streak this season for the Red Foxes. The Hawks finished with just one player in double figures, Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) with 10 points, all coming in the final eight minutes of the game. Hood was held without a basket until 8:17 remaining in the second half. America East Co-Player of the Week Diana Delva (Stamford, Conn./Westhill) finished one point shy of her second double-double of the season with nine points, while tying her career high with 16 rebounds. Eight of her rebounds were offensive boards, helping the Hawks to their 19-2 advantage in second chance points. Neither team shot impressive from the field, with the Hawks shooting 32 percent and holding Marist to 27 percent. Also leading the Hawks was Mary-Lynne Schaefer (Centreville, Va./Westfield) with nine points and Jamie McCabe (Aptos, Calif./Aptos) with eight points. The two combined for five three pointers for Hartford... The Hawks will play just one game again this week, welcoming nationally ranked Michigan State to Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion on Saturday, December 22. The Hawks and Spartans are set for a 2 p.m. tipoff on Comcast Sports Network. Michigan State is just the second ranked women's team to play at Chase Arena, the first was BYU which Hartford beat, 60-43, last season.

MAINE BLACK BEARS (2-8)

Maine split its two games this past week in New York City ... The Black Bears dropped an 80-50 decision to St. John's on Friday, but responded by defeating St. Francis on Sunday, 58-47 ... It was the first road win for Maine this season ... Sophomore forward Brittany Boser (Palmer, Mass./Palmer H.S.) notched her third double-double of the season on Friday versus St. John's with 15 points and 10 rebounds ... Freshman guard Tanna Ross (Newburgh, Maine/Hampden Academy) scored in double-figures in both games by tallying 10 points on Friday and 14 on Sunday versus the Terriers ... Ross has now scored in double-figures in three-straight games and five overall this season ... Classmate and guard Emily Rousseau (Biddeford, Maine/Biddeford H.S.) poured in a gamehigh 15 points in Sunday's win ... It marked the third double-figure scoring game of the season for Rousseau and the first time in her career she led the Black Bears in scoring ... Junior forward Colleen Kilmurray (Wall, N.J./Wall H.S.) made it a happy homecoming on Sunday with 11 points and seven rebounds against St. Francis ... Maine returns to action on Saturday when it takes on ACC-foe Boston College at 12 p.m., at Conte Forum in Chestnut Hill, Mass.

UMBC RETRIEVERS (4-6)

UMBC did not play last week due to final exams...
The Retrievers return to action on Wednesday,
Dec. 19, when they hit the road to take on crosstown rival Towson... UMBC then closes out its nonconference schedule at the University of Maryland
Terrapin Classic, where the Retrievers will face
Richmond on Dec. 28 and the host Terps on Dec.
30... The Retrievers are riding a two-game win-

ning streak... Sophomore guard Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) leads UMBC with 15.4 ppg and has averaged 19.0 ppg over her last three games, when she shot 46.5 percent from the floor... Cassidy has scored in double figures in eight out of 10 games this season... Senior guard Kristin Drabyn (Avon, Ind./Avon) is averaging 17.7 ppg in the three games since she returned to the starting lineup and has raised her season average to 9.6 ppg, second-best on the team... She is shooting 45.7 percent during that stretch, including 45.5 percent from behind the arc... Drabyn ranks sixth all-time with 116 career 3-point field goals and third with a .340 career shooting percentage from long distance... Senior guard Morgan Hatten (Potomac, Md./Winston Churchill) leads UMBC with 6.9 rpg.

NEW HAMPSHIRE WILDCATS (3-7)

The University of New Hampshire women's basketball team dropped two games this week, falling to Iona and Northeastern ... On Dec. 12, Candace Williams (Norfolk, Mass./St. Rapheal's) notched a career-high 22 points and the Wildcats shot 50 percent (30-60) from the floor, but it was not enough as the team fell, 92-79 ... Candace scored 18 of her career-high 22 points in the second half of action, while Jacinda Williams (Poughkeepsie, N.Y./Lourdes) posted a career-best 12 points in the game for the Wildcats ... In the 78-71 loss at Northeastern, America East Rookie of the Week and forward Denise Beliveau (Framingham, Mass./ Framingham) posted a career high in both points (22) and rebounds (10) for her first career double-double ... The Wildcats had three additional players scoring in double figures in their fourth straight loss of the season ... New Hampshire leads the conference in three-point percentage, .377 (69-183) ... After the holiday break the Wildcats will travel to Providence to face the Friars on Dec. 28 ... The team returns home to open-up conference action against Albany on Jan. 5.

STONY BROOK SEAWOLVES (4-6)

Stony Brook split both of its games last week... In Wednesday's 61-59 heartbreaking loss to Central Connecticut, the Seawolves took a 53-42 lead after a Kairsten Nunn (Bowie, Md./ Coastal Carolina) jumper. Central Connecticut would go on a 15-0 run to take the lead and end the game on a 19-6 spurt.
