PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Boston University's Corey Lowe (Newton, Mass./Newton North) took home Player of the Week honors for the second straight week after pouring in a career-high 35 points in the Terriers' 76-67 win over Yale on Tuesday.

Lowe, a sophomore guard, hit seven 3-pointers, the second-most made in a game team history. He hit five of those treys in the first half and shot 6-of-8 in the frame overall. For the game, Lowe shot 13-of-20 from the field and also grabbed four rebounds.

ROOKIE HONOR

Albany's Tim Ambrose (Brentwood, N.Y./Our Savior New American School) earned Rookie of the Week accolades leading Albany to come-from-behind victory on Saturday.

Ambrose, a redshirt-freshman, scored 17 points, all in the second half and triggered a 15-0 run to lead the Great Danes to a 68-53 victory over St. Francis (N.Y.) on Saturday. Ambrose, who played just 16 minutes off the bench, shot 4-of-6 from the field and got to the free throw line nine times, making eight of those attempts. He also tallied three steals.

NOTABLES

Several America East student-athletes had stand-out performances last week. Stony Brook senior Ricky Lucas averaged 18.7 points and 6.3 rebounds to lead the Seawolves to a pair of wins last week. Lucas scored 18 points on a perfect 6-of-6 shooting performance from the floor in a win over Hofstra on Wednesday. He also has 12 points in a win over New Jersey Tech on Monday and scored a career-high 25 points including 20 in the second half as the Seawolves rallied from a 13-point second half but fell late to FDU 74-71 on Saturday... Maine's Junior Bernal single handedly gave the Black Bears a chance against Mount St. Mary's on Saturday. He had 17 points, seven rebound and seven assists in a losing effort... Vermont's Mike Trimboli, a unanimous All-America East Preseason choice, scored 23 points and dished out five assists to help the Catamounts defeat Harvard, 73-68, on Saturday.

WHERE THEY RANK

The second Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) ratings were released on Monday by RPIratings.com. UMBC is the highest rated America East team (93) after getting off to a 7-2 start and posting a combined 4-1 mark against teams rated 51-200. The next highest team is Hartford at 196, followed by Vermont (199), Albany (216), Boston University (258), New Hampshire (269), Maine (297), Stony Brook (304) and Binghamton (311).

DYNAMIC DUOS

America East teams present difficult matchups for opposing defenses as several teams have multiple scoring threats. Vermont's tandem of Mike Trimboli and Marqus Blakely combine for 40.0 points per game and rank one and two in the league, respectively. Trimboli averages a league-best 20.6 points, while Blakely adds 19.4 per contest... UMBC's Brian Hodges ranks fourth in the league with 18.2 points per game. Teammate Ray Barbosa contributes 16.0 per outing, good for sixth best in the league. Additionally, the Retriever's have two others in the top 13 scoring leaders. Darryl Proctor is 12th (14.0 ppg) and Cavell Johnson is tied for 13th (14.3.8)... Boston University's Corey Lowe and Carlos Strong rank third among teammates, averaging 34.4 points per contest.

1,000-POINT CLUB

Vermont's Mike Trimboli became the second player in America East to score his 1,000th point this season, when he surpassed the milestone on November 20. Stony Brook's Mitchell Beauford scored his 1,000th career point just last week, while UMBC's Brian Hodges hit the mark on February 15, 2007. Albany's Brent Wilson is just 23 points shy of the milestone and would become the 28th player in school history to reach the mark, while teammate Jon Iati is within 45 points of the milestone.

SCHEDULING TOUGH

As a result of the scheduling standards that were passed prior to last season, America East teams have continued to schedule quality non-conference opponent to prepare them for league play. This season, America East teams will play 22 combined non-league games against teams that made the NCAA Tournament a year ago, including Vermont taking on two-time defending national champion Florida and UMBC traveling to runner-up Ohio State. Additionally, America East teams will play seven combined games against teams ranked in the preseason AP Poll, including Hartford at No. 6 Louisville, Albany at No. 13 Duke and Stony Brook at No. 20 Kentucky.

TERRIERS TOP POLL

Boston University, winner of a conference-best five America East Championships, was the preseason choice of the coaches to win the league title in 2007-08. The Terriers received five of a possible eight first-place votes (coaches were not allowed to vote for their team) and 61 points to outdistance back-to-back champion Albany, which had four first-place votes and 55 points.

Vermont, which earned the America East regular-season title last year en route to its first NIT berth, was chosen third with 50 points. Binghamton, with rookie head coach Kevin Broadus, was picked fourth with 45 points. UMBC (33 points) edged Hartford (31) for fifth place. Stony Brook (19) was seventh while Maine and New Hampshire tied for eighth place with 15 points.

YOU'RE ON TELEVISION

ESPNU will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. A total of 14 games involving America East teams will appear on NESN, seven games on Comcast Sports Net, seven games on MASN, four games on CN8, three games on Fox Sports New York, and two games on MSG network.

The America East men's basketball semifinals will appear on Comcast Sports Net and Time Warner cable while the women's semifinals and championship are slated for NESN and Time Warner. Eric Frede returns as the play-by-play announcer for America East basketball. Leah Secundo, a veteran of America East television productions, is the color analyst for women's basketball games. Former Harvard head coach Frank Sullivan will be the men's basketball color analyst.

Among the out-of-conference highlights are Albany at Duke (ESPN2) on December 17 and Vermont at two-time defending national champion Florida (CN8) on November 30.

STREAMING ON THE WEB

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

ON CAMPUS

America East will also produce five episodes of America East On Campus, a 30-minute magazine show devoted to the conference's student-athletes. The third-year show, which will air on regional sports networks including NESN beginning in January, is hosted by Frede, who produces the show along with his Cod Rock Media Productions partner, Dan Hannigan.

ALBANY GREAT DANES

Albany (5-4, America East 0-0) ended a three-game skid with a 66-53 victory over St. Francis on Dec. 15 ... The Great Danes reversed a 31-24 deficit with 15:47 remaining by running off 15 unanswered ... Tim Ambrose (Brentwood, N.Y./Our Savior New American School) ignited that stretch with six of his career-high 17 points ... Ambrose, a redshirt freshman, did all of his scoring in the final period ... The Great Danes, who changed their starting lineup for the first time this year, held an opponent under 60 points for the fifth time this season ... Albany ranks nationally among NCAA Division I teams in scoring defense (59.2 ppg) and field goal percentage defense (.391) ... The Great Danes, who had not played at home in 20 days, have won 20 of their last 22 at SEFCU Arena ... Brent Wilson (Cedar Rapids, Iowa/Prairie) needs 23 points to become the 28th player in school history to reach the 1,000-career mark... Brian Lillis (Urbandale, Iowa/West Des Moines Dowling) has scored in double figures in eight of nine games this season following a 14-point, 8-rebound effort against St. Francis ... Brian Connelly (Audubon, N.J./Camden Catholic) totaled 15 points and nine rebounds in his last start ... Connelly is averaging 11.9 points and shooting 52.2 percent from the field over his last seven games ... The Great Danes, who were also 5-4 at this point last season, meet No. 6 Duke on Monday, Dec. 17 in an ESPN2 broadcast from Cameron Indoor Stadium... UAlbany is playing a nationally-ranked squad for the fifth consecutive season ... Duke is the second-highest ranked opponent in the UA program's history, as the Great Danes faced No. 2 Connecticut in the 2006 NCAA Tournament ... The Blue Devils have won 56 consecutive non-conference home games and has played before 263 straight sellouts at home since 1990.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS

Binghamton (2-7, America East 0-0) snapped a six-game losing streak in its lone game of the week. The Bearcats led from start to finish in a 71-59 victory over visiting George Washington. The win was the program's first-ever against an Atlantic 10 member. Head coach Kevin Broadus served as an assistant coach under GW coach Karl Hobbs for three seasons... Sophomore forward Lazar Trifunovic (Belgrade, Serbia/Secondary Railway Tech) hit 7-of-9 from the floor and 9-of-11 free throws en route to a game-high 23 points... Junior guard Dwayne Jackson (Akron, Ohio/Walsh Jesuit) chipped in 10 points, six rebounds and a pair of steals... Binghamton sealed the win by converting 11-of-12 free throws in the final 2:13 ... The Bearcats now host Chicago State in a rematch of the November 17 affair in Chicago that saw the Cougars roll to an 81-60 win.

BOSTON U. TERRIERS

Boston University (3-6, America East 0-0) sophomore guard Corey Lowe (Newton, Mass./Newton North) tallied a career-best 35 points as the Boston University men's basketball team (3-6) earned its second-straight win with a 76-67 decision over Yale on Tuesday, Dec. 11 in New Haven, Conn. ... Sophomore guard Carlos Strong (Portland, Maine/Deering) added 16 points and was a perfect 6-for-6 from the free throw line ... junior guard Marques Johnson (Hazlet, N.J./Raritan) continued to shine at the point, with five points and four assists with no turnovers. In the last two games, Johnson has posted 11 assists with no errors ... The Bulldogs went ahead 5-0 early in the first half, but the Terriers went on a 17-4 run, keyed by the first of Lowe's seven threes, to take the lead for good ... Yale came out strong in the second half and cut the lead to eight, 38-30, at 17:47. However, Lowe and Strong combined to score BU's first 14 points as the Terriers continued to force Yale turnovers and maintain their double-digit lead ... Boston U earned its first win in the series, a rivalry that had lain dormant for 71 years ... The Terriers also claimed its second-straight win over an Ivy opponent after handing Harvard a 79-72 loss on Dec. 4 ... Head coach Dennis Wolff is one win shy of 250 for his career after the Yale victory ... The Terriers have a break for exams before heading to Delaware on Dec. 22 to play the Blue Hens at 7 p.m.

HARTFORD HAWKS

Hartford (5-7, America East 0-0) split a pair of games last week, beating Monmouth 67-53 before faltering late in a 103-75 loss at 23rd-ranked Villanova... The win over Monmouth kept the Hawks undefeated at home (3-0) and extended their home winning streak to five games. Senior Brian Glowiak (New Britain, Conn./New Britain) led the charge by tying a career high with 15 points and went 5-for-5 from three-point range. Hartford made 13 treys for the game, the second most in its Division I history... The Hawks hung tough against the Wildcats before finally running out of steam. Villanova led by only three with 9:57 to play before finally pulling away, outscoring Hartford 37-12 over the final 9:38. Sophomore Joe Zeglinski (Philadelphia, Pa./Archbishop Ryan) scored a team-high 20 points in his Philadelphia homecoming while junior Warren McLendon (Dublin, Ga./West Laurens/The Citadel) added 19 points and eight rebounds... Zeglinski leads the team in scoring at 14.7 points per game while McLendon checks in at 13.8 points per game. Junior Michael Turner (Novato, Calif./Marin Catholic/West Valley) leads the team in rebounding at 5.6 rebounds per game... Hartford will have a week off for exams before returning to action on Saturday, December 22 against Brown. Tip-off is scheduled for 11 a.m. The game will be the first part of a doubleheader with the Hartford women's team, which hosts nationally-ranked Michigan State at 2 p.m.

MAINE BLACK BEARS

Maine's (4-6, America East 0-0) game against the University of Connecticut next Saturday will be a reunion for Coach Woodward, as he was an assistant at Connecticut to head coach Jim Calhoun from 1986-1989, helping the Huskies to the 1988 NIT Championship...Maine's game at the University of Connecticut will also be its third game in less than a month against "major" conference teams, having previously played against Providence College and Florida State...Despite the loss, Maine has not been defeated at home two games in a

row against non-conference opponents since the 2002-03 season...Phil Tchekane Bofia (Yaounde, Cameroon) had his best overall game of the season against Mt. St. Mary's, with 12 points, six rebounds, a steal and a block...The Black Bears' next five official games are all on the road, and will not be home again until they play the Vermont Catamounts on Jan. 16...Of the next five road games, the first three are all in the state of New York...Maine hopes to soon get playing time out of Saint Peter's College transfer Kaimondre Ows (Brooklyn, New York), who can be eligible after the semester is over ... The Black Bears top three scorers are all averaging double-digit points per game, while each is also averaging over five rebounds a game as well.

UMBC RETRIEVERS

UMBC (7-4, America East 0-0) lost back-to-back games for the first time since Feb. 8 and 15 of last season... The Retrievers hit 46.3% from the floor (138/298) in winning four of five games, but managed to convert on only 39 of 114 attempts (34.2%) in the pair of losses at Central Connecticut State (58-54) and at West Virginia (86-62)... Senior forward Cavell Johnson (Fort Washington, Md./Notre Dame Acad./James Madison) missed his second straight game (illness) at Central, but did return and scored 10 points in 29 minutes at WVU... The loss at Central dropped UMBC to 1-3 on Tuesdays and it was the sixth straight loss in the series to the Blue Devils... UMBC has played Central Connecticut State 29 times since entering the Division I ranks, the most meetings vs. any team in that span... The Retrievers won 10 of the first 14 meetings, but Central has countered by winning 11 of the last 15... In the game, UMBC cut a 14-point early second half deficit to 53-52 with 2:18 remaining, but could not complete the rally... Junior forward Darryl Proctor (District Heights, Md./Paul IV/Coppin State) recorded his third double-double of the season with 13 points and 11 rebounds and made five of six first half field goals after an 0/8 first half... Senior guard Ray Barbosa (Allentown, Pa./Allen/James Madison) gutted out a 16-point effort, suffering from a first-half sprained ankle and cramping in the second half... Senior guard Brian Hodges (Upper Marlboro, Md./Bishop McNamara) moved into eighth place on UMBC's all-time scoring list, now with 1,280 points... he has scored in double figures in all 11 games, tying his personal best... Proctor's streak of ten straight in doubles fell short in an eight-point effort at WVU... UMBC entered the week 16th in the nation in three-point field goal percentage at 44.4%, but hit just nine of 38 attempts this week, including three of 18 at West Virginia... UMBC had a 16-14 lead midway through the first half, and trailed just 36-29 with two minutes remaining, but WVU scored the final seven points of the half and the Retrievers could not get inside of ten points in the final 20 minutes...The Mountaineers (8-1) were receiving the 29th most votes in last week's Associated Press poll... UMBC lost the services of both reserve post players, sophomore Justin Fry (New Bloomfield, Pa./West Perry) and junior Uwem Eshietedoho (Miramar, Fla./American) during the first and second halves respectively at WVU... Both players suffered leg injuries and will be re-evaluated early this week... UMBC finishes final exams this week and hosts Hampton, the MEAC favorite, on Saturday.

NEW HAMPSHIRE WILDCATS

New Hampshire (3-7, America East 0-0) went 0-2 last week, losing back-to-back games at home to Long Island University (84-78) Dec. 10, and Iona (87-81) Dec. 15 ... junior guard Eric Gilchrese (Springfield, Ill./Lewis & Clark) got back on track in a big way when he scored 16 points, while dishing out six assists and pulling down four rebounds against Long Island ... Gilchrese kept it going versus Iona, netting 20 points on 5-of-10 shooting from the floor and 8-of-8 shooting from the charity stripe, while adding eight assists, four rebounds and three steals ... fellow junior guard Tyrece Gibbs (Brockton, Mass./Thayer Academy) tallied 12 points, five rebounds and five assists versus LIU and followed up that performance by scoring 20 points against Iona ... freshman forward Rony Tchatchoua (Douala, Cameroon/Findlay Prep) submitted what may have been the best week of his young collegiate career, putting up a career-high 14 points and matching his career high in rebounds with seven versus LIU ... Tchatchoua followed that up with an 11-point performance against Iona in his first start of the year ... last week's America East Rookie of the Week freshman guard Alvin Abreu (Lynn, Mass./Boys to Men) had his best collegiate performance against Long Island, scoring a career-high 23 points on 7-of-12 shooting, including a career-high four 3-pointers in a career-best 38 minutes ... senior forward Mike Christensen (Reston, Va./Flint Hill) snapped his six-game double-digit scoring streak this week, but did tally eight points, eight rebounds and six assists versus Iona ... freshman guard Tyrone Conley (Burlington, Vt./Burlington) registered 10 points versus Iona ... the 'Cats have nearly two weeks off before returning to action Sunday, Dec. 30 when they host Colgate at 1 p.m.

STONY BROOK SEAWOLVES

Stony Brook (3-8, America East 0-0) won two of their three games this season. Senior Mitchell Beauford scored a game-high 16 points and senior Ricky Lucas added 12 points and eight rebounds as the Stony Brook men's basketball team held on late for a 62-53 victory over NJIT on Monday night at Stony Brook Arena. The Seawolves wore a black band on their uniforms in memory of senior Emanuel Neto's mother who passed away last Saturday after a long illness. Lucas scored a team-high 19 points to lead four Seawolves in double-figures as the Stony Brook men's basketball team built a 22-point lead and then hung on late for its second straight victory, an exciting 77-74 victory over the Hofstra Pride on Wednesday night at the Mack Sports Complex, the Seawolves first road victory of the year and first win over the Pride in four tries. Stony Brook set season-highs for points (77) and field goal percentage (51.9 percent) in the game. SBU's two-game winning streak came to an end on Saturday, as Lucas scored a career-high 25 points including 20 in the second half as the Seawolves rallied from a 13-point second half deficit but fell short against FDU, 74-71. Junior Demetrius Young recorded 14 points and 13 rebounds for his second double-double of the season. Young had eight points and 10 rebounds in the second half to help rally the Seawolves.

LEAGUE HISTORY

To see how far America East has progressed, consider the conference was established in 1979 as the ECAC North. The conference at that time consisted of 10 institutions and sponsored league competition only in men's basketball, with the champion receiving an automatic bid to the NCAA Championship.

Men's basketball remained the lone league sport until the 1988-89 academic year. At that time, the conference's Board of Directors made a new commitment to an all-sports association, creating the North Atlantic Conference by establishing an office, hiring a full-time commissioner, and embarking on a building program.

The North Atlantic Conference merged with the Seaboard Conference (the league in which Boston University, Hartford, Maine, New Hampshire, and Vermont, among others, competed in women's basketball) in 1989 and the NAC looked to establish conference championships in several men's and women's sports.

The conference changed its name to America East prior to the 1996-97 academic year and moved the conference headquarters to downtown Boston in 1997.

In 2005, America East hired Patrick Nero, most recently the Director of Athletics at Maine, as the conference's third commissioner.

In July of 2007, the conference office relocated to Cambridge, Mass. near Kendall Square.
