HOOD PLAYS BIG

Hartford senior forward Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) received her third America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week award this season for the week ending December 23. Hood led the Hawks to the first upset of a ranked opponent in America East this season, a 54-51 win over #23/24 Michigan State University at Chase Arena on Saturday afternoon. Hood was the only Hawk player in double figures, with 19 points on 9-of-19 from the field. She also grabbed eight rebounds, including four offensive boards, and added two assists and a steal to her credit. In addition the senior Hawk had the tough job of guarding and shooting against the 6'9" Allyssa DeHaan who leads the NCAA in blocks.

ROSS SCORES AND REBOUNDS AGAINST BC

Maine rookie guard Tanna Ross (Newburgh, Maine/Hampden Academy) turned in a superb performance against Boston College for this week's Rookie of the Week award. Ross scored in double-figures for the fourth-straight game and led Maine in scoring for the fourth time this season. She made five three-pointers in the game, marking the second time in the last four games that she made at least five treys in a contest. Ross also pulled down a team-best seven rebounds. This is the third weekly honor this year for Ross.

TWICE AS NICE

Hartford became the first America East team to knock off a ranked opponent this season with its 54-51 victory at home against #24 Michigan State on Saturday, December 22. MSU's arrival in West Hartford marked the second game in two years that a ranked opponent has played Hartford at the Reich Family Pavilion. The first team to do so was 22nd-ranked Brigham Young on December 2, 2006, who the Hawks defeated, 60-43. Hartford is now 2-0 against ranked opponents at home. Not only did the Hawks crack the Spartans, but they also got to 6'9" Wade Trophy Watch List candidate Allyssa DeHaan who they held to 13 points and 3 rebounds, both under the sophomore's averages. The victory doubled the votes the Hawks are receiving in the national coaches' poll where they have the 26th most votes in Division I.

THE REPORT IS IN

In the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com, Hartford moved up 11 spots despite playing just one game last week. With their 49-32 win over Marist, the Hawks swooped up to the 20th spot from 31 last week. The biggest movers from America East were Vermont and Maine, each moving up 23 spots. The Catamounts stepped up into the 112th spot with a game against Louisville and a win over Harvard, while the Black Bears improved to 259 after picking up their second win of the season over St. Francis (N.Y.), 58-47.

ALL IN THE STATS

The NCAA will release national Division I statistical rankings each Monday and Friday throughout the rest of the season beginning on January 4. In the most up to date report posted on December 17, America East teams are making their mark. Boston U. ranks fourth in free-throw percentage, sixth in turnovers per game, and 13th in assist-to-turnover ratio, Stony Brook ranks 12th in the country with 6.0 blocks per game, and Hartford is 10th-best in turnovers per game. Meanwhile in the individual ranks, Boston U.'s Christine Kinneary is 10th in assists per game and 21st in as-

sist-to-turnover ratio, Stony Brook's Morgan Patrick is 17th in blocks per game, and Terrier Aly Hinton is fourth with a near-perfect free-throw percentage of 96.6%.

YOUNG SHOOTERS

The conference's top-three in both three-point field goal percentage and three-pointers made belong to the underclassmen. New Hampshire freshman Denise Beliveau (.448), Maine freshman Emily Rousseau (.444) and Vermont sophomore Courtnay Pilypaitis (.408) rank 1-2-3 in percentage. New Hampshire sophomore Amy Simpson (2.40), Maine rookie Tanna Ross (2.20) and UMBC sophomore Carlee Cassidy (2.00) drain the most three-pointers in the league, along with New Hampshire senior Ashely Cerniglia (2.00). Simpson and Ross own league single-game highs as Ross made six three-pointers and shot .750 from long-range in one game, while Simpson attempted 12 three-pointers on two separate occasions.

200 CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday, December 16 when the Catamounts defeated Harvard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley reached 200 wins through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Associate Head Coach under Chris Wiegus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

CHECK YOUR LOCAL LISTINGS

One week after their match-up with nationally-ranked Michigan State aired live on Comcast Sports Net, the Hartford Hawks will again take on another formidable opponent on live television. The Hawks will travel cross town to the Hartford Civic Center on Saturday, December 29 to play the top-ranked Connecticut Huskies. Game time is 7 p.m. on Connecticut Public Television (CPTV). The CPTV web stream is also available by clicking the link at AmericaEast.com.

A LOT OF THIS, A LOT OF THAT

It would be hard to deny that Vermont sophomore guard Courtnay Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter's) is a well-rounded player. Pilypaitis is in the conference's top five in five of 13 statistical categories, and is in the top ten in 11 of the 13 categories.

TERRIER THREAT

Despite being idle last week, the Terriers have a conference-best five players in the America East top-30 scorers this season, all also in the top-25. The Boston University scoring threat is producing 69.4 points per game, tops in the league.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtnay Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference

(coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters will be played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiving 46 votes in the most recent poll released on December 26, the 26th most votes in the nation. The next poll will be released the afternoon of Tuesday, January 1.

TV TIME

ESPNU will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its

partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East. The event, which is now known as the America East Women's Basketball Championship Presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese, will be held at the 3,977-seat Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. It is the sixth time in the last seven years that Friendship Cottage Cheese has served as the title sponsor. Friendship Cottage Cheese has sponsored each of the championships played in Hartford since 2002.

ALBANY GREAT DANES (1-11)

UAlbany returned to action after an 11-day lay-off, and dropped two non-conference games last week... The Great Danes fell, 73-62, on the road at Richmond before losing to Marist at home, 75-71... Sophomore Britney McGee (Bakersfield, Calif./West) tied her career-high with 19 points against Richmond, going 5-of-7 from 3-point range... Senior forwards Kristin Higy (Akron, Ohio/North Canton Hoover) and Gia Sanders both recorded double-doubles versus the Spiders... Higy tallied 10 points and a game-high 15 rebounds while Sanders finished with 13 points and 12 boards... In just the third home game of the season, UAlbany stayed with defending MAAC Champion and Sweet 16 participant Marist, shooting a season-best 49.2-percent (30-61) from the floor... McGee led four Great Danes in double-digit scoring with 17 points... McGee added six rebounds, two assists and three steals... Sanders, TaNika

Thrower (Houston, Texas/Northbrook) and Sherri Mikus (Duncannon, Pa./Susquenita) all finished with 10 points apiece... UAlbany will return home after the holiday break and host St. Francis (N.Y.) on Friday, Dec. 28 before getting into conference play after the New Year.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (2-9)

Senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 47) and senior guard Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Tapiololonen) continue to climb up the Binghamton career scoring charts. Kurpniece ranks 11th all time with 928 points. She is 26 away from tying Alicia Koppenhoefer (1994-98) for 10th place all time with 954 points. Sario, meanwhile, ranks 13th with 909 points. She is nine points away from tying Jen Gaeta (1992-94) for 12th place ... Kurpniece netted a game-high 22 points against Lehigh on Friday, marking the third time this season and 10th time in her career that she has reached the 20-point mark in a game ... Junior forward Laura Franceski (Moscow, Pa./North Pocono) recorded a pair of blocks in the game against Lehigh. She now has 102 career rejections, which continues to rank second all time ... The Bearcats' double-overtime game against Lehigh is just the second they have played during their Division I history. Binghamton also went into two overtime periods against St. John's on Dec. 7, 2004.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS (6-4)

The Boston University women's basketball team was not in action last week. They return to the court for the VCU Tournament against Georgia Southern on Thursday, December 27 at 5 p.m.

HARTFORD HAWKS (10-2)

The University of Hartford women's basketball team picked up arguably its biggest win of the season with a 54-51 victory over 23rd ranked Michigan State University on Saturday afternoon at Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. The win is the first over a ranked opponent this season and the third in the history over the program (Temple in 2005-06, BYU in 2006-07). The win is also the second over a ranked team at Chase Arena, only two ranked teams have ever challenged the Hawks at home. The Hawks were led by Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) who finished with 19 points, the only player in double figures. She also tied for the team lead in rebounding along with Lisa Etienne (Norwalk, Conn./Brien McMahon) with eight each. Etienne and Katie Kelley (Syracuse, N.Y./Corcoran) finished second on the team in scoring with eight points each. The Hawks shot 38 percent for the game (22-of-58), while Michigan State won the battle of the boards with a 41-40 advantage. Hartford will close out the non-conference portion of its schedule with a 7:00 p.m. December 29 visit to #2 Connecticut at the XL Center in Hartford. The Hawks and Huskies will meet for the fourth-straight season.

MAINE BLACK BEARS (2-9)

Maine dropped a tough 68-56 decision at ACC-foe Boston College on Saturday at the Conte Forum in Chestnut Hill, Mass. ... the Black Bears overcame an early 12-0 deficit and outscored the Eagles 19-6 midway through the first half to take a 19-18 lead ... the Black Bears led by as many as seven in building a 36-33 lead at halftime ... the run was aided by a pair of threes from Tanna Ross (Newburgh, Maine/Hampden Academy), six points from Colleen Kilmurray (Wall, N.J./Wall H.S.) and five points from Emily Rousseau (Biddeford, Maine/

Biddeford H.S.) ... however, BC outscored Maine 15-7 over the initial six minutes of the second half and led the rest of the way in pulling out the win ... Ross scored a team-high 17 points, marking her fourth-straight double-figure scoring game ... she has led the team in scoring in four games this season ... Ross also knocked down five three-pointers, marking the second time in the last four games she has made at least five treys ... Rousseau added 11 points ... Sandra Vaitkute chipped in nine points for the Black Bears ... Maine returns to action this weekend with a pair of games in the 2007 Hurricane Holiday Classic in Coral Gables, Fla. ... Maine will face host-school Miami on Dec. 29 at 5 p.m., and then face either Toledo or Central Arkansas on Dec. 30 at 5/7 p.m.

UMBC RETRIEVERS (4-7)

UMBC played just one game last week and lost at cross-town rival Towson, 69-61, on Dec. 19... The Retrievers shot a season-best 54.3 percent from the floor and 46.7 percent from 3-point range but could not overcome a season-worst 27 turnovers... UMBC's shooting percentage was its best since Jan. 29, 2006, at Stony Brook, while its 3-point percentage was the best since Nov. 10, 2007 at George Washington... UMBC's defense in the second half was among the stingiest it has been all season, limiting the Tigers to just five field goals and 22.7 percent shooting... Sophomore guard Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) led UMBC with 18 points, with 15 coming in the second half, and she added a career-high eight rebounds... Senior guard Kristin Drabyn (Avon, Ind./Avon) and junior guard Chantay Frazier (Carthage, Miss./Choctaw Central/Seminole State) contributed 14 points apiece... Cassidy leads the Retrievers with 15.6 ppg and has averaged 18.8 ppg over UMBC's last four contests while shooting 49.1 percent from the floor... Cassidy has scored in double figures in nine out of 11 games this season... Drabyn is averaging 16.8 ppg in the four games since she returned to the starting lineup and has raised her season average to 10.0 ppg, second-best on the team...
