BURKS-WILEY AVERAGES DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Boston University junior forward Jesyka Burks-Wiley (Kansas City, Mo./Lincoln College Prep) averaged a double-double last week (20.5 ppg, 11.0 rpg) to capture this week's America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week. In two games last week against Massachusetts and St. John's, Burks-Wiley played 30.5 minutes per game. She drained 20 points against UMass at home before following that up with a career-best 21 points on the road against the Red Storm. Burks-Wiley also brought down 10 and 12 boards, respectively, to notch two consecutive double-doubles, the only such performances by a Terrier this season. The weekly award is the junior's first of her career and the first for a Terrier since Katie Meinhardt on December 10, 2006.

BELIVEAU TAKES HOME SECOND ROOKIE HONOR

University of New Hampshire freshman forward Denise Beliveau (Framingham, Mass./Framingham) received the America East Women's Basketball Rookie of the Week award for the second time this season. Beliveau led the team in rebounding in both games last week, pulling down seven against Boston College and then six in the win over Colgate. She averaged 13.0 points per game last week, netting eight against the Eagles and a career-high 18 against the Raiders. Beliveau improved her season averages to 10.3 ppg and 5.7 rpg, placing her among the conference leaders in both categories. In addition, the rookie snatched away a career-high five steals against Colgate to now lead America East with over 2.50 steals per game.

DOUBLE-DOUBLES

America East saw a season-high five double-doubles last week, led by Player of the Week Jesyka Burks-Wiley's two. Hartford's Erica Beverly, Binghamton's Laura Franceski and Maine's Colleen Kilmurray also posted double-doubles of the point-rebound variety. All four players who notched double-doubles did so for the first time this season last week.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION

The schedule includes two television games to watch for this week. On Tuesday, December 4, Stony Brook visits Colonial foe Hofstra for a 7 p.m. game broadcast live on Fox Sports New York. In a Friday match-up, conference-leading Hartford hosts St. John's on NESN. Game time is 7 p.m.

ROAD TRIP

This week, 10 of 16 games will be road games for America East teams. Four of the nine teams will not play a home game at all this week, including the Maine Black Bears who just began an eight-game road trip last Thursday. Both Binghamton and Boston University embark on three-game road trips this week, while Stony Brook will complete a four-game span on the road with two more away games this week against Hofstra and Yale.

HOUSEWARMING PARTY

Several America East teams will be hosting opponents at home after extended road trips. Hartford will return home to Chase Arena for the first time since November 16 to host St. John's and Hofstra. Albany is anxious to return to SEFCU Arena on Wednesday night after going 0-5 on the road since their home opener on November 15. Vermont will also play at home for the first time in three weeks when they welcome Louisville to

Patrick Gymnasium on Saturday. During their road trip, the Catamounts traveled 5,166 miles across the country to Flagstaff, Ariz. and Kent, Ohio.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

A LOT OF THIS, A LOT OF THAT

It would be hard to deny that Vermont sophomore guard Courtney Pilypaitis is a well-rounded player. Pilypaitis is in the conference's top five in nine of 13 statistical categories, and is in the top ten in a 10th and 11th category. She leads the league in free-throw percentage, missing just one shot out of 28 attempts. Pilypaitis is also ranked second in assists (5.0 apg), three-point field goal percentage (.500), and defensive rebounds (6.43 drpg).

TERRIER THREAT

The Terriers have a conference-best six players in the America East top-30 scorers this season, and four players in the top 20. The Boston University scoring threat is producing 71.6 points per game for tops in the league.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters will be played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiving 16 votes in the most recent poll released on November 27.

TV TIME

ESPN will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will

include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East. The event, which is now known as the America East Women's Basketball Championship Presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese, will be held at the 3,977-seat Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. It is the sixth time in the last seven years that Friendship Cottage Cheese has served as the title sponsor. Friendship Cottage Cheese has sponsored each of the championships played in Hartford since

2002.

"We are excited to again partner with Friendship Cottage Cheese for the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at Hartford," said Nero. ALBANY GREAT DANES (1-7)

UAlbany dropped two games last week in non-conference play... The Great Danes fell to Sacred Heart, 64-48, on the road on Wednesday before losing to crosstown-rival Siena, 61-50, on Saturday evening... Sophomore TaNika Thrower (Houston, Texas/Northbrook) led the team, averaging 11.5 points in the two games last week... Thrower finished with five points, four rebounds, two assists and two steals at Sacred Heart... She led the Great Danes with 18 points to go along with five rebounds, two assists and a block versus Siena... Freshman Janea Aiken (St. Albans, N.Y./St. Dominic) averaged 8.0 points per game last week... Aiken scored 15 points in 22 minutes of action off the bench at Sacred Heart... Senior Kristin Higby (Akron, Ohio/North Canton Hoover) is leading the team on the season, averaging 11.5 points and 5.6 rebounds... The Great Danes host Buffalo on Wednesday, Dec. 5 at 7 p.m., ending a five-game road stretch, but will return to the road on Saturday, visiting Detroit-Mercy at 1:30 p.m.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (1-5)

Senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 47) and senior guard Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Tapiolalonen) continue to climb up the Binghamton career scoring list. Kurpniece heads into the game against Duquesne on Tuesday in 13th place with 877 career points. Sario is currently in 16th place all time with 851 career points. She needs six more points to tie Robyn LeBel (1991-93) and nine points to tie Sonny Mehring (1978-82) ... Junior forward Laura Franczeski (Moscow, Pa./North Pocono) has blocked three shots in each of the past two games. With 93 blocks, she needs two more rejections to tie Alicia Brennan (1986-90) for second place all time in school history ... This year's senior class of Kurpniece, Sario, and forwards Brianna Thompson (Chehalis, Wash.) and Jutta Jahilo (Helsinki, Finland/ Helsingin Kaupunki) has already been one of the most prolific in Binghamton history. Together, they have accounted for 2,505 career points and 1,463 career rebounds ... Sophomore guard Erica Carter (Naperville, Ill./Naperville Central) scored 17 points in Saturday's win over La Salle, marking the third time in the past four games she has reached double figures in scoring... The Bearcats begin another three-game road trip this week at Duquesne on Tuesday night.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS (5-3)

Despite a career-high 21 points from America East Player of the Week junior Jesyka Burks-Wiley (Kansas City, Mo./Lincoln College Prep), the Boston University women's basketball team was edged, 76-69, by Big East foe St. John's on Saturday afternoon at the Red Storm's Carnesecca Arena... Seniors Kasey Devine (North Kingstown, R.I./North Kingstown) and Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hurderton) chipped in 13 and 11 points, respectively... The Terriers fall to 5-3 overall... Burks-Wiley was 8-for-20 from the

field and collected a game-high 12 rebounds for her second consecutive double-double... Devine posted 13 points on 5-for-6 shooting, while swatting away three shots... Junior Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) continued with her unselfish play with eight assists, a game high, and four steals... Boston U. shot 35.6 percent from the field and posted 17 points off turnovers... The Terriers collected 19 offensive boards and capitalized on those rebounds with 23 second-chance points... Burks-Wiley recorded the first Terrier double-double of the season a few days earlier as BU picked up a win over Atlantic-10 foe UMass, 72-60, Wednesday evening in Case Gym... Burks-Wiley recorded 20 points and 10 rebounds in the victory... Junior guard Amarachi Umez-Eronini (Washington, D.C./Woodrow Wilson) earned America East Player of the Game honors with her 18 points on 8-for-12 shooting and nine rebounds... She also dished out three assists, and earned two steals and one block... Raffo contributed 16 points on 7-for-11 shooting.

HARTFORD HAWKS (6-2)

The University of Hartford women's basketball team played just one game last week, dropping a 72-60 decision to the University of Massachusetts Minutewomen on Saturday afternoon. The game was the first for Hartford after returning from a nine-day road trip. The Hawks struggled from the field, hitting just 33 percent of their shots. Overall, they were led by Erica Beverly (Bridgeport, CT/Kolbe Cathedral) who finished with her first double-double of the season. She had a team best 14 points and grabbed 10 rebounds. The double-double is just the second for Hartford this season... Also scoring in double figures for the Hawks was Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, NY/Walter Panas) with 11 points and Diana Delva (Stamford, CT/Westhill) who finished with 12 points, 11 of which came in the first half... Hartford did finish with a season best 13 steals, forcing the Minutewomen into 19 turnovers, converting those turnovers into 20 points... The Hawks will play a pair of games this week, a 7 p.m. Friday meeting with St. John's and a 2 p.m. Sunday match-up with Hofstra. The St. John's game is scheduled to air live on NESN.

MAINE BLACK BEARS (1-6)

Maine dropped a pair of games this past week, including a tough 63-62 setback at William & Mary on Thursday, and a 76-54 loss at Fairfield on Sunday ... The Black Bears are currently in a stretch of playing eight-straight road games ... Sophomore guard Amanda Tewksbury (Clinton, N.J./North Hunterdon H.S.) led Maine in scoring in both games, marking the first time in her career she has done so ... Tewksbury scored a career-high 15 points at W&M on Thursday, and followed with 12 at Fairfield ... She scored seven of her 12 points at Fairfield in the second half ... Junior forward Colleen Kilmurray (Wall, N.J./Wall H.S.) poured in 10 points versus the Stags on Sunday ... The Black Bears return to action this Saturday when they travel to Amherst, Mass., to face Massachusetts at 12 p.m., in the Mullins Center ... Despite being in the same region, Maine and UMass have not met since 1998 ... The Black Bears own a 10-5 advantage in the series.

UMBC RETRIEVERS (2-5)

UMBC dropped its only game last week, dropping a 58-44 decision at NJIT on Nov. 28... Junior guard Melissa Book (Raleigh, N.C./Millbrook) led the Retrievers with 10 points in the game... Senior guard Morgan Hatten (Potomac, Md./Winston Churchill)

posted a team-high eight rebounds... Freshman point guard Michele Brokans (Lansdale, Pa./Lansdale Catholic) added a career-best four steals... Sophomore guard Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) leads the Retrievers with 13.9 ppg, while Hatten is tops on the team with 6.7 rpg... Senior guard Kristin Drabyn ranks sixth all-time at UMBC with 106 career 3-point field goals and fourth with a .332 career shooting percentage from long distance... The Retrievers have a busy week ahead, as they take on cross-town rivals Loyola (Dec. 3) and Navy (Dec. 5) on the road before returning home to host Northern Iowa (Dec. 9).

NEW HAMPSHIRE WILDCATS (3-3)

The University of New Hampshire women's basketball team went 1-1 this week with a loss at Boston College, 77-52, and a home win against Colgate, 75-70 ... Senior Ashley Cerniglia (Pittsford, N.Y./Sutherland) posted 16 points in both contests, leading the team in scoring vs. the Eagles ... Sophomore forward Candace Williams (Norfolk, Mass./St. Raphael Academy (RI)) delivered 10 points in the game against Boston College, but Stefanie Murphy with 26 points and 11 rebounds, led the charge for the Eagles ... Sophomore center Racheal Fowler (Glassboro, N.J./Glassboro) stepped up against the aggressive BC post players, finishing the game with a career-high in steals (4) and blocks (2), while America East Rookie of the Week Denise Beliveau (Framingham, Mass./Framingham) chipped in with eight points and seven rebounds for the Wildcats in the losing cause ... On Saturday, sophomore Amy Simpson (Waterford, Conn./Waterford) matched her career high in points to lead the Wildcats past Colgate University, 75-70 ... Beliveau posted a career-high 18 points and pulled down a team-high six rebounds to go along with a career-best six steals in the game for the Wildcats, while Cerniglia drained four 3-pointers en route to her second straight 16-point effort for New Hampshire ...
