**TODAY'S MATCHUP**

Stony Brook (18-10, 14-2) faces the UMBC Retrievers (13-16, 6-10) in the first quarterfinal of the America East Tournament. The game can be heard of 90.1 WUSB and streamed live at AmericaEast.com. Stony Brook comes into the 2007 conference tournament with its second seven-game winning streak of the season. Stony Brook beat UMBC in both meetings this season. On January 7 in Baltimore, the Seawolves topped UMBC, 72-60, behind 29 points from Mykeema Ford. Leah Getz recorded her first career double-double with 17 points and 12 rebounds. Jessica Smith and Dana Ferraro each had 10 rebounds as Stony Brook outrebounded UMBC, 44-28. On February 7 in Stony Brook, Kelly Watson scored a career-high 29 points as the Seawolves won 68-53. Smith had 12 points and Ford and Getz each had 10. Getz added 13 rebounds. Stony Brook shot a season-high 54 percent from the floor.

Sharri Rohde leads three players in double figures with 13.7 points per game and is fifth in the conference with 6.6 rpg. Brittne Hughes and Kristin Drabyn each average over 10 points per game. Stony Brook is 7-1 all time vs. UMBC.

**IF STONY BROOK ADVANCES....**

If Stony Brook beats UMBC, it would face the winner of Maine and Vermont on Saturday at 5 pm. The game will be shown on the New England Sports Network (NESN) and Time Warner 3.

**STONY BROOK VS. VERMONT**

Mykeema Ford drilled a three-pointer with two seconds left in the game to help Stony Brook beat Vermont, 72-71 in Burlington on January 24. Ford led the Seawolves with 21 points and seven assists. Leah Getz had 18 points on 7-of-8 shooting and Dana Ferraro had 12 points. Jessica Smith had 10 rebounds.

In the February 24 matchup, Stony Brook outscored Vermont 19-10 in the third frame to beat the Catamounts, 96-87 in overtime. The Seawolves' 96 points represents the largest point total in their Division I history and most since the 2002-2003 season when they beat New Hampshire, 90-72. Smith tied her career-high with 30 points previously set against Vermont in 2005 and was named America East co-player of the game. Smith went 14-24 from the field and added nine re-

bounds. Ford had 22 points and eight assists, Ferraro had 15 points and eight rebounds and Cheri Davis recorded a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

**STONY BROOK VS. MAINE**

Jessica Smith and Mykeema Ford combined for 52 points as the Seawolves won their fourth straight with a 79-66 win over Maine.

Smith, the America East Player of the Game, netted 25 and grabbed 10 rebounds for the double-double, Ford had a game-high 27 and Orion added nine off the bench for Stony Brook

Stony Brook came back from a double-digit deficit in the first half to beat Maine 67-56 on March 3. Stony Brook outscored Maine 40-19 in the second half, limiting its leading scorer Underwood to just three points on 1-of-8 shooting in the second half. Stony Brook forced Maine into 29 turnovers. Prior to the game the Seawolves recognized the seven seniors, Sabrina Thompson, Inbar Orion, Farah Vasquez-Jacobo, Leah Getz, Kelly Watson, Mykeema Ford and Jessica Smith, on the Stony Brook women's basketball team. Ferraro added 10 rebounds.

**STONY BROOK IN THE AMERICA EAST TOURNAMENT**

Stony Brook enters this year's tournament with a 3-5 record all-time in tournament play.

Stony Brook made the conference final in 2001-2002 after beating Boston University and New Hampshire before falling to Hartford.

**A RECORD WIN**

The Seawolves 67-56 over Maine gave them 14 America East conference wins, setting a new record. Stony Brook won 12 last year.

**FORD AND SMITH COMBINE FOR SWEET SIXTEEN**

Mykeema Ford and Jessica Smith have combined to win America East player of the week honors 16 times. Smith had won nines times in her career and four this year and Ford too has won it four times this year and seven in her career.

**REBOUNDING IN CONFERENCE PLAY**

Stony Brook is a +5.3 in the rebound column in conference play this season. Four times this season, the Seawolves have outrebounded their opponents by more than 10. They are 4-0 in those games.

**SEAWOLVES DOWN, COMEBACK UP**

Stony Brook has won five games this season in which it was down by at least 10 points this season. Stony Brook's best comeback was at Boston University when it was down 55-43 with 15:03 left to go in the game and won 83-77.

**GREAT FORD**

Dating back to last season, Ford has scored in double figures in 38 consecutive games. The streak is the third-longest active streak in the nation next to Jessica

### **DOUBLED UP**

Leah Getz has recorded all three of her double-doubles this season. Getz had a 17 point-12 rebound outing in a win over UMBC on January 10 and a 10 point-13 rebound performance in the win over UMBC on Wednesday. In the Seawolves' 69-48 win over Boston U. earlier this season, Getz had 10 points and a career high 14 rebounds.

The two-some of Jessica Smith and Mykeema Ford are averaging 35.7 points per game this season. Compared to the Associated Press Top 25 poll, Smith and Ford's average ranks fourth ahead of teams like Duke, North Carolina, Maryland and Tennessee.

### **SEAWOLVES IN THE NCAA'S STATS**

Ford is tied for 25th in scoring at 19.2 ppg and Smith is 88th with 16.5 ppg. Smith's .505 field goal percentage is good for 70th.

As a team, the Seawolves are shooting .728 from the free throw line which is good for 73rd, nationally. The 70.3 points per game are ranked 52th in the nation.

### **LAST TIME OUT**

For the third consecutive game, Stony Brook came back from a double-digit deficit in the first half to beat Maine 67-56, at the Stony Brook University Arena on Saturday afternoon. Stony Brook concludes the regular season 18-10 and sets a new school record for America East wins with 14. The Seawolves finished second in the conference at 14-2. Maine drops to 13-14, 7-9.

Maine shot the lights out in the opening frame, connecting on 5-of-7 from three point range and shooting 60 percent (12-20) from the floor en route to a ten point halftime lead at 37-27. Ashley Underwood led all scorers with 18 points, including a perfect 4-of-4 from behind the arc and 6-of-6 from the charity stripe. Jessica Smith led the Seawolves with eight first half points.

Down 37-27 at the half, the Seawolves came out of the break on an 18-7 run capped by a Jessica Smith jumper to gain their first lead of the game at 45-44 with 10:49 remaining in the game. Maine went cold, going over four minutes without a point and made just six shots in the second half. The Seawolves stretched their lead to 17 in the second half and won 67-56.

Stony Brook outscored Maine 40-19 in the second half, limiting its leading scorer Underwood to just three points on 1-of-8 shooting in the second half. Stony Brook forced Maine into 29 turnovers.

Prior to the game the Seawolves recognized the seven seniors, Sabrina Thompson, Inbar Orion, Farah Vasquez-Jacobo, Leah Getz, Kelly Watson, Mykeema Ford and Jessica Smith, on the Stony Brook women's basketball team.

Smith scored 16 points and had seven steals and was named America East co-player of the game. Ford had 15 points and 11 in the second half. Dana Ferraro and Getz each had 13 points. Ferraro added 10 rebounds.

Underwood finished with 21 points and was named America East co-player of the game. Bracey Barker recorded a double-double with 14 points and 12 rebounds. Underwood and Barker each went 6-of-6 from the line and Maine finished a perfect 13-of-13 from the stripe.

### **SEAWOLVES BEST ALBANY, 67-61**

Jessica Smith scored 11 points in the second half as she led the Stony Brook women's basketball to a 67-61 win over Albany on Wednesday evening. Smith was one of three Seawolves who scored double-digits as Stony Brook improves to 17-10 overall and 13-2 in America East play. Albany falls to 8-20, 4-11.

Albany opened the game with a 16-7 run, capped by a Kristin Higgy jumper with 12:15 to play, and forced the Seawolves to call an early timeout. A three-pointer from Charity Iromuanya with 8:07 left in the half extended the Great Dane lead to 10 at 21-11.

The Seawolves, with their frantic defense, cut the lead in half when Mykeema Ford hit a jumper with 4:26 to play as Stony Brook trailed, 26-21. Stony Brook maintained its defensive intensity and closed out the half on a 6-1 run, capped by a Morgan Patrick jumper in the lane, as the Seawolves went into the locker room leading 28-27.

Both teams traded baskets early on in the second half and Stony Brook extended its lead to 39-37 on a Dana Ferraro layup with 14:47 left in the game. On the next possession, following a Great Dane timeout, Sherri Mikus knotted the game at 39-39 with 14:35 left in the game. In a close fought second half, the Seawolves opened up a four point lead at 58-54 with 4:43 to play on a Ferraro bucket. The Seawolves extended the lead to seven when Ford hit a pull-up jumper with 2:59 to play as Stony Brook held on for the 67-61 victory.

Smith, America East co-player of the game, scored a game-high 21 points and added 13 rebounds for the double-double. Ford scored 16 and Leah Getz added 13 points in the win.

Iromuanya scored a team-high 17 and was named America East co-player of the game for Albany.

### **STONY BROOK BEATS VERMONT, 96-87, OT**

Stony Brook outscored Vermont 19-10 in the third frame to beat the Catamounts, 96-87 in overtime at the Stony Brook University Arena on Saturday afternoon. The Seawolves' 96 points represents the largest point total in their Division I history and most since the 2002-2003 season when they beat New Hampshire, 90-72. Stony Brook moves to 16-10, 12-2 in conference play. Vermont is 16-11, 6-8 and has lost three in a row.

After Dana Ferraro hit a layup with 23 seconds left in regulation, Stony Brook did not allow Vermont a look at the basket and sent the game into overtime. Following May Kotsopoulos' layup early in the overtime, Jessica Smith and Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis traded baskets until Smith converted on a three-point play, giving the Seawolves an 86-83 lead with 2:19 remaining. Stony Brook stretched the lead to nine, 94-85 and won 96-87. Stony Brook shot 7-10 from the field and 5-7 from the line in overtime.

Vermont opened up the game making 12 of its first 18 shots to grab a 30-11 lead midway through the first half. Stony Brook chipped away and cut the lead to three, 48-

45, after Leah Getz hit a jumper in the paint. Vermont took a 50-45 lead into the break when Andrea Cihal connected for her 10th point of the half. Smith had 19 first half points for the Seawolves who shot 46 to Vermont's 64 percent.

After Vermont stretched the lead to six on a three pointer from Brittney Cross, Stony Brook tied the score at 57 when Leah Getz had a three-point play and took the lead off a fast break layup from Mykeema Ford. The Catamounts didn't go quietly tying the game, 68-68, off a jumper from Alison Brown. Vermont took a five point lead utilizing a 6-1 run to make the score, 74-69. Ferraro and Ford each had four points down the stretch to help the Seawolves send the game into overtime.

Smith tied her career-high with 30 points previously set against Vermont in 2005 and was named America East co-player of the game. Smith went 14-24 from the field and added nine rebounds. Ford had 22 points and eight assists, Ferraro had 15 points and eight rebounds and Cheri Davis recorded a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

Binghamton was held to just 37 percent shooting as the Stony Brook University women's basketball team topped the Bearcats, 71-62, at Binghamton University's Events Center on Wednesday night. The Seawolves win their 11th game out of 12 and moves to 15-10, 11-2 in America East play. Binghamton is 10-16, 6-7. The win is Stony Brook's first win at Binghamton in its last nine tries and is the Seawolves first win at the Events Center.

Stony Brook opened up the game with a 10-0 run and forced the Bearcats into three early turnovers. Binghamton responded with a 9-0 run of its own to cut the Stony Brook lead to 12-9 with just under 12 minutes to play. Binghamton got within one twice and took its first lead of the half, 23-21, after Rebecka Lindgren hit a three-pointer from the left side with 3:47 left until halftime.

The Seawolves re-took the lead, 29-28, after Kelly Watson hit a jumper just outside the lane with 49 seconds left in half. The Seawolves utilized a balanced attack as seven different players netted points in the opening half led by 10 from Mykeema Ford.

Stony Brook came out of the locker room hot and connected on its first four field goals. Jessica Smith, who was in foul trouble early, had two layups to give the Seawolves a 38-34 lead. After Ford converted on a conventional three-point play, Brianna Thompson hit a jumper to cut the lead to 43-40. Thompson scored 10 of the first 14 points Binghamton scored in the second half.

Stony Brook opened up a 56-47 lead, its

biggest of the half, when Watson hit a jumper just inside the lane with just over eight minutes to go in the game.

Binghamton got within four points but Stony Brook held on for a 71-62 victory.

Stony Brook only scored two points in the remainder of the half and Ashley Cernigilia's half-court shot banked in as time expired to cap a 10-2 New Hampshire run as the Seawolves led 32-27 at the break.

After trailing by as many as 12 with 15:03 left in the game, Stony Brook outscored Boston University 40-22 the rest of the

game. The Seawolves rallied to grab their first lead of the second half with 5:02 to play when a Dana Ferraro jumper gave them a 70-68 lead. Following a three pointer from Katie Meinhardt, Leah Getz hit two clutch free throws to tie the game at 71 and give the Seawolves a 72-71 advantage. Cheri Davis came up huge off the bench in the second half, grabbing seven rebounds and scoring nine points as the Seawolves pulled off a come from behind victory, 83-77. The Stony Brook University women's basketball played its best half of basketball in the first half, en route to a 72-60, road win over UMBC at the RAC Arena on Sunday afternoon. The Seawolves snapped their three-game losing streak and improve to 5-9, 1-1 in America East play. UMBC is 8-7, 1-1.

The Seawolves opened the game on fire posting a 9-0 lead and extended the lead to 11 after Leah Getz' jumper at the 14:21 mark. After Brittanie Hughes hit a pair of free throws to cut the deficit to six, Stony Brook went on another run, this one a 16-4 spurt highlighted by four three-pointers. UMBC fought back, however, cutting the deficit, which was as much as 18, to seven at 35-28 after a jumper from Amanda Robinson. Stony Brook went 12-4 in the conference, losing just once at home in eight games. The Seawolves won eight of their last nine conference games last year and didn't lose back-to-back conference games.

### **STONY BROOK FALLS TO ST. JOHN'S**

Kelly Watson and Jessica Smith combined for 43 points but it was not enough as the Stony Brook women's basketball team fell to St. John's, 85-74, in its final non-conference game of the season at the Stony Brook University Arena on Saturday night. The loss drops Stony Brook to 4-8 while St. John's improves its record to 4-8.

St. John's jumped out to an early 23-13 lead after Monique McLean connected on a jumper in the paint with 8:58 remaining in the first half. The Seawolves fought back utilizing an 18-6 run to reclaim the lead at 31-29. Stony Brook's lead grew to as many as five and took a two-point advantage into the locker room at 34-32.

Both teams traded baskets early in the second half until the Red Storm started to pull away when Joy McCorvey connected on a layup with 4:46 left in the game, giving the Red Storm a seven-point advantage at 67-60.

Stony Brook pulled within four on a Mykeema Ford three-pointer with 2:24 remaining in the game but St. John's held off the Stony Brook attack hitting on 6-6 from the free throw line to seal the game, 85-74.

Watson, the America East player of the game, led the Seawolves with a season-high 22 points. Smith added 21 points and seven rebounds and Ford had 15 points in the loss.

For the Red Storm, McLean had a career-high 32 points, including 10-11 from the charity stripe. Kia Wright had 17 points and five rebounds off the bench in the win.

### **FORD NAMED STONY BROOK ATHLETE OF THE WEEK**

Mykeema Ford has been named Stony Brook Athlete of the Week. This is the second consecutive week the honor has gone to a women's basketball player.

### **BUILT FORD TOUGH**

Mykeema Ford has scored in double figures each game this season. In dating back to her freshman year at Stony Brook, Ford has scored in double figures in 96 of 111 games.

### **SEAWOLVES DEFEATED BY SACRED HEART, 77-65**

Sacred Heart shot 50 percent from the field including 7-17 from behind the arc as the Stony Brook women's basketball team was defeated 77-65, at the William H. Pitt Center on Thursday afternoon. Stony Brook is 4-7 on the season while Sacred Heart is 6-5.

In the first half, the Seawolves converted 14 points off 11 Sacred Heart turnovers. Jessica Smith led Stony Brook with nine points at the break which trailed the Pioneers 35-28.

In the second half, the Seawolves came out on fire, going on a quick 12-5 run to tie the score at 40. Smith converted four straight layups to tie the score but Sacred Heart's Amanda Pape scored five consecutive points

and Kaitlin Sowinski had two layups to give the Pioneers a nine-point advantage at 49-40. After a Leah Getz free throw, Sacred Heart scored the next nine points, capping an 18-1 run before Mykeema Ford scored on two layups on back-to-back possessions.

Smith led the Seawolves with 19 points and 9 rebounds. Ford added 16 points, continuing her streak of 11 double-digit games this season. Kelly Watson had 9 points on 3-6 shooting from behind the arc and Dana Ferraro had six points and eight rebounds. For Sacred Heart, Pape led all four scorers in double figures with a game-high 26 points. Kaitlin Sowinski had 19, Lisa Moray had four threes for 12 points and Kerri Burke had 10.

### **SMITH NAMED AMERICA EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

For the second time this season, Stony Brook's Jessica Smith has been named America East Player of the Week, the conference announced today. Smith has also been named Stony Brook Athlete of the Week.

The senior, from Bloomingdale, N.J., scored 14 points and pulled down nine rebounds against Dartmouth. In a win at Central Connecticut State, Smith scored a game-high 25 points, shooting 12-16 from the field. She also added seven rebounds. Smith leads the conference in scoring at 15.8 per game.

### **FORD ASSISTS HERSELF INTO TOP SPOT**

Ford's assist to Kelly Watson in the first half of the game vs. Temple gave her 327 for her career which is good for first all-time in Stony Brook women's basketball. Ford broke Jill Cook's record which stood for 16 years.

### **STONY BROOK OUTLASTS QUINNIPIAC, 87-79**

Led by Mykeema Ford's 23 points, five rebounds and five assists, the Stony Brook University women's basketball team recorded a season high in points as it topped Quinnipiac, 87-79 at the Stony Brook University Arena on Saturday afternoon. Stony Brook has its second two-game winning streak of the season and goes to 4-6. Quinnipiac falls to 8-2.

Ford, who played all 40 minutes, and Delicia Jernigan scored the first 13 points for the Seawolves, who built an early eight point lead at 13-5. Jessica Smith, who scored 19 first half points in Stony Brook's last game, led the Seawolves with 10 first half points. Going into the break, Stony Brook and Quinnipiac were tied at 37.

In the second half, a jumper from Jernigan at the 17:10 mark gave Stony Brook an early second half lead and an advantage they would not relinquish. Quinnipiac got within one at 51-50 after two free throws from Charmaine Steele with 12:04 remaining. However, Dana Ferraro quickly answered with a layup. The Bobcats missed three consecutive front ends of a one and one over a 1:30 span that could have cut the lead to one.

Stony Brook went 10-14 from line over the last six minutes of the game and shot 26-35 on the afternoon.

Ford, who was named America East Player of the Game, scored in double-figures for the 10th consecutive game this season. Smith added 21 points including a perfect 9-9

from the free throw line and nine rebounds. Jernigan had 13 points including two three pointers and Dana Ferraro almost had her second double-double in a row with nine points and 11 rebounds.

Farah Vasquez-Jacobo and Leah Getz each had six points off the bench. Vasquez-Jacobo added five rebounds in 12 minutes of work.

Erin Kerner led Quinnipiac with 15 points. Mandy Pennewell had 14 and Monique Lee had 13. Courtney Kaminski had 11 points off the bench

### **SEAWOLVES SNAP FOUR-GAME LOSING STREAK WITH WIN OVER CCSU, 74-55**

Jessica Smith was red-hot in the first half, scoring 19 points en route to a 74-55 road victory over Central Connecticut State. The Seawolves snap their four-game losing streak and move to 3-6 on the season. The Blue Devils are 2-7.

The Seawolves opened the game on fire, scoring the first eight points of the game and enjoyed an early nine-point advantage at 16-7 with 14:42 to go in the half. Stony Brook held CCSU to 39 percent shooting in the first half and led 31-26 going into the locker room. Stony Brook forced 15 first half turnovers.

Stony Brook opened up the second half, once again, on fire, scoring the first seven points. The Seawolves held CCSU to just four points in the first seven minutes of the half and posted a 52-33 lead with under ten minutes to go in the game. Stony Brook pulled away in the second half, owning a 25-point lead at 72-47.

Smith led all scorers with 25 points. Mykeema Ford scored 15 points and Dana Ferraro had 10 points and 13 rebounds. Aly Young and Leah Getz chipped in with six points. Gabriella Guegbelet led CCSU with 21 points and 18 rebounds and Katherine Kelsey had 10.

Ford, who had a game high 9 assists, played in a homecoming of sorts. Ford played her prep basketball at nearby Chesire Academy in Cheshire, Conn.

Freshman Joia Daniels scored her first two collegiate points.

### **SEAWOLVES FALL TO DARTMOUTH, 71-59**

The Stony Brook women's basketball team lost its fourth consecutive game as the Seawolves fell on the road at Dartmouth, 71-59. Stony Brook shot only 30.8 percent from the field as the Seawolves fall to 2-6 on the season. With the win Dartmouth moves to 2-5 on the year.

The Seawolves opened the game with a 10-0 run and held the Big Green without a field goal for the first three minutes of play. Stony Brook expanded its lead to 13 at 19-6 as Delicia Jernigan and Jessica Smith combined for 12 of the Seawolves first 19 points. Dartmouth rallied and went on a 14-4 run behind the hot hand of Ashley Taylor to trim the lead to three at 23-20 with 8:33 to play. The Big Green grabbed its first lead of the game at 27-25 when Taylor drained a three from the corner with 5:21 remaining in the half. The Seawolves did not score in the final four minutes of the half as they entered the locker room trailing, 35-27.

The offensive woes for Stony Brook continued in the second half as the Seawolves only scored one point in the first four minutes of play and trailed the Big Green, 43-28, with 15:58 left in the game. The Seawolves,

behind six points from Cheri Davis, cut the lead to six at 53-47 when Mykeema Ford found Jernigan on the wing for a jumper to force the Big Green to call a timeout. Stony Brook was aggressive on offense and with 3:43 remaining in the game, Smith grabbed an offensive board and converted for the easy two to knot the game up at 57-57. The Big Green closed the game on a 14-2 run as Dartmouth won, 71-59.

Smith led four Seawolves in double-digits with 14 points and nine rebounds. Jernigan, Young and Ford each added 10 in the loss.

### **SEAWOLVES TOPPED BY HOFSTRA, 82-67**

Hofstra had five scorers in double-figures, led by 14 from Samantha Brigham and Cigi McCollin as the Stony Brook women's basketball team fell to the Pride, 82-67, at the Stony Brook University Arena on Saturday afternoon.

The Seawolves jumped out to an early 7-2 lead on Dana Ferraro's layup, just 1:30 into the game. Hofstra and Stony Brook played a frantic pace of basketball, trading baskets until Hofstra took a 19-18 lead with 11:53 to go in the half. Following two lead changes, a three pointer from Brigham gave the Pride a 29-25 advantage and never looked back. Hofstra led by as many as 19 in the first half and had a 55-38 lead going into the locker room.

The Seawolves got within 13 late in the ball game but were unable to get over the hump.

For the Seawolves, Ferraro had 17 and was named America East Player of the Game, Mykeema Ford added 12 and Jessica Smith, who's layup at the 16:19 mark in the first half gave her 1,301 points for her career, added 10.

Along with McCollin and Brigham's 14, Jeanell Hughes and Lizanne Murphy each had 11 and Vanessa Gidden had 10.

### **SEAWOLVES FALL TO TEMPLE, 72-58**

Despite 16 points from Mykeema Ford and Jessica Smith the Seawolves lost on the road to Temple, 72-58. With the loss Stony Brook falls to 2-4 on the season and the Owls improve to 4-3.

In the opening half the duo of Smith and Ford led the Seawolves as Smith dropped 10 points and Ford added seven. Turnovers plagued Stony Brook as the Seawolves committed 12 in the first half. Kamesha Hairston proved too much for Stony Brook as the senior forward scored 14 in the opening stanza to give the Owls a 33-27 edge heading into the locker room.

In the second half Temple came out of and hit its first three baskets as the Owls opened up the second half with a 6-2 run to increase their lead to 10 at 39-29 forcing the Seawolves into an early timeout. The Owls built their lead to as many as 15 but Ford brought Stony Brook to within six at 53-47 with a pull up jumper with 8:28 in the game. Stony Brook could not slow down Lady Comfort who led all scorers with 25 points, including 18 in the second half, as Temple held on for the 72-58 win.

Ford and Smith led the Seawolves with 16 points apiece. Dana Ferraro added 10 rebounds and Kelly Watson dropped eight points.

Comfort led the way for the Owls with a career high 25 points and Hairston added a double-double with 19 points and 14 re-

bounds.

### **#20/21 GEORGE WASHINGTON TOPS SEAWOLVES**

Jessica Smith tallied her second double-double of the season but the Seawolves committed 23 turnovers as they fell to No. 20/21 George Washington, 68-55, on Saturday afternoon at the SBU Sports Complex. With the loss Stony Brook falls to 2-3 on the year and the Colonials improve to 7-1.

Smith's layup with 7:57 to play in the opening half gave the Seawolves a nine point advantage at 27-18. On the next possession with 7:33 to play Smith picked up her second personal foul of the half and was forced to sit. Aly Young snapped an over four minute scoring drought for the Seawolves when she connected on a jumper but the Colonials closed out the first half with a 13-2 run to give them a two-point advantage at 31-29 heading into the locker room.

Stony Brook could not get any closer than two points and George Washington led by as many as 18 in the second half as they closed out the game 68-55.

Smith led the way for the Seawolves with 23 points and 12 rebounds en route to being named America East Player of the Game, Mykeema Ford scored 14 and was a perfect 7-for-7 from the charity stripe and Young had her best game in a Seawolf uniform as the transfer tallied nine points, nine rebounds and five steals.

Kenan Cole (13), Sarah-Jo Lawrence (13), Kimberly Beck (12) and Jessica Adair (12) led the balanced George Washington attack.

### **FORD LIFTS SEAWOLVES TO 76-55 WIN OVER IONA**

Mykeema Ford scored 27 points as Stony Brook rolled to a 76-55 win over Iona on Tuesday evening. With the win the Seawolves improve to 2-2 on the season and Iona falls to 2-4. The Stony Brook women's basketball team played solid defense as they held the Gaels to 38.6 percent shooting and forced 21 turnovers on the night.

In the opening half Ford scored eight of the Seawolves first 10 points as Stony Brook opened an early 10-2 lead. Iona fought back and grabbed a one-point lead at 19-18 off of a Lauren Huber bucket, but the Seawolves remained tenacious on defense as they tallied five steals, three blocks and forced Iona into 11 turnovers in the first half. **FORD NAMED TO ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM**

Senior guard Mykeema Ford was named to the DePaul Invitational All-Tournament Team on Tuesday. The New Jersey native scored 28 points in the two games including a 17-point outing against Illinois State. The Seawolves return to action on Tuesday, November 28 when they travel to take on Iona at 7:00 pm.

The Stony Brook women's basketball team could not overcome an 11-point half-time deficit as the Seawolves fell to the defending MAAC Champions Marist in their season opener, 82-72.
