SETTING THE STAGE

UAlbany won its first America East Tournament game since 2004, defeating New Hampshire, 64-61, in the first round on Thursday, March 8.

Senior guard Amanda Ward led the team with 17 points, including the go-ahead three pointer with 32 seconds left to play. Ward, who went 4-of-4 from the free throw line, added seven rebounds and three steals. She also hit three treys in the game. All-defensive team member Gia Sanders added 10 points to go along with seven boards, two steals and a block. Charity Iromuanya, Kristin Higgy and Britney McGee added eight points apiece for the Great Danes.

Hartford claimed its second-straight regular season title, finishing up a 15-1 America East campaign with a 60-56 win over UMBC. The Hawks have posted a 13-game winning streak, with its lone defeat in conference play coming to Vermont, 66-64, in overtime. Hartford is ranked fourth nationally in defense, allowing just 52.8 points per game. The Hawks are led by senior Danielle Hood, who is fourth in the conference standings averaging 15.8 points per game. Freshman Diana Delva ranks second in the conference in rebounding, grabbing a team-best 7.9 boards per game.

THE SERIES

Hartford took both games in the regular season - a 60-42 win in Albany and a 60-54 victory in West Hartford. UAlbany was the last team to defeat Hartford in the conference tournament - the Great Danes were victorious over the Hawks in the 2004-05 season, before falling to eventual champion Maine in the quarterfinals.

ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Freshman guard Charity Iromuanya earned her first America East Conference Rookie of the Week award on Monday, Feb. 26. Iromuanya gained the accolades after scoring a career-high 17 points in the Great Danes' 75-68 win over New Hampshire on Feb. 21. Iromuanya, a 5-8 guard from Lincoln, Neb., became the second player to earn the league's top rookie honors, as classmate Britney McGee won the award during the first week of the season.

THURSDAY LUCK

UAlbany is undefeated on Thursdays this season. The Great Danes defeated Sam Houston State on Dec. 28 and were victorious in America East Conference action in an overtime win against Binghamton on January 4. UAlbany continued its Thursday streak with an America East Tournament win over New Hampshire on March 8. However, UAlbany has not won a game on Friday, when they will face league-leading Hartford.

BACK ON TRACK

The Great Danes ended an eight-game losing skid with a 75-68 win over New Hampshire on Wednesday, Feb. 21. It was UAlbany's first win since Wednesday, Jan. 17, when the Great Danes defeated then league-leading Vermont, 62-59 in the SEFCU Arena.

RETURNING TO THE SIDELINE

UAlbany head coach Trina Patterson, who, along with her husband Carl, welcomed her third son on Monday, Jan. 29, returned to the sidelines on Wednesday, Feb. 14 against Boston U. Joshua Odell Patterson, who arrived on his scheduled due date, joined brothers Carl, Jr. (10) and Matthew (5).

SCORING MACHINES

Senior guard Amanda Ward and junior guard/forward Sherri Mikus both have impressive scoring streaks on their resumes. Ward, who joined the Great Danes last season after playing two years at the Community College of Rhode Island, has scored in every game she has played in a UAlbany uniform, a stretch of 57 straight contests. This season, she has reached double-figures scoring in 18 of 29 games, including 8 of the last 10 contests. After recording a season-high 22 points in the conference-opening win at Binghamton, a total that was just one off her career-high, Mikus scored in all but one game this season, and recorded a stretch of 34 straight contests recording at least one point.

MOVIN' ON UP

Junior guard/forward Sherri Mikus recorded her 200th career rebound against Maine on Jan. 7. She also recorded her 100th career steal against Wisconsin on Dec. 10. Mikus had a season-high four steals in UAlbany's win over Holy Cross on Nov. 26. She became just the second Great Dane in the program's Division I history to reach 100 career assists in her sophomore season last year.

OPENING NIGHT

UAlbany won its first-ever America East Conference opener with a 63-59 overtime win at Binghamton on Thursday, Jan. 4. Since joining the conference in 2001-02, UAlbany had lost five previous season openers, with four of those games being on the road.

CENTURY MARK

Senior guard Tanya James played in her 100th game in a UAlbany uniform in the Great Danes' matchup against Boston U. on January 14th. In her fourth season, second as a captain, James is averaging 1.9 points, 1.1 rebounds, has 16 assists, 11 steals and is playing 13.0 minutes in reserve action off the bench. By the end of the season, James will become the school's all-time leader in games played.

INJURY UPDATE

Freshman forward Ashley Lindsay will miss the remainder of the season due to a stress fracture in her right tibia.

Sophomore forward Joy Sterling will miss the remainder of the season after being diagnosed with compartment syndrome. Sterling will require surgery, as confirmed by Dr. Max Alley of Capital Region Orthopaedic Group, and will apply for a medical redshirt.

CAPITAL REGION'S TOP DOGS

UAlbany defeated crosstown-rival Siena, 72-53, on Wednesday, Nov. 15 at the Pepsi Arena to claim the TIAA-Cref Albany Cup. The win was the first for the Great Danes over the Saints since the two programs renewed the series in 2001 after a 25-year hiatus. UAlbany had not beaten its Capital Region counterpart since the 1977-78 season.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW

Freshman Britney McGee was named the season's first America East Conference Rookie of the Week on Monday, Nov. 13. McGee, a 5-8 guard from Bakersfield, Calif., made an immediate impact on the court, scoring 16 points in the Great Danes season-opening loss against LaSalle and another 16 in the win over Siena. McGee has started every game for UAlbany and is averaging a 29.2 minutes per contest and 1.6 assists per game.

BLOCK PARTY

Junior guard/forward Gia Sanders, who set UAlbany's single-season block record in 2005-06 with 52, has continued her swatting success so far this season. Sanders, who broke an 11-year-old record set by Erica Witham, finished last season ranked first in the conference with 1.8 blocks per game, and is currently leading the conference with 2.0 per contest. She has had at least one block in all but three games this season. With 45 blocks on the season, Sanders has moved into 4th place on UAlbany's career chart (106).

HOME COOKING

Junior guard Kelly Martinson returned to her hometown to face the Wisconsin Badgers. Martinson, a 2004 graduate of James Madison Memorial, was a two-time All-Big Eight Conference First Team selection and was named to the Division I All-Area First team as a senior. She was named the All-City Player of the Year as a senior, and holds James Madison's record for career three pointers with 90. The team enjoyed dinner with the Martinson family upon their arrival in Madison.

ON THE SIDELINE

Head Coach Trina Patterson returns for her fifth season at the helm of the UAlbany women's basketball program. Patterson revamped her entire coaching staff for the 2006-07 season. Melissa Patterson and Glenn Senecal bring head coaching experience from the Division II and Division III levels to UAlbany. Patterson was the head coach of D-III Mount St. Joseph for eight seasons, while Senecal joins the Great Danes' staff after a three-year stint at D-III Mitchell College. Assistant Jolene Johnston brings Division I and international playing experience to the staff, as she was a four-year letterwinner at Siena. Following graduation, Johnston played professionally in Luxembourg and Puerto Rico. Director of basketball operations Christine Roth was a two-year letterwinner at Saint Joseph's, where she finished fourth in the Atlantic 10 in three-point field goals and in field goal percentage as a senior.

JUMP-STARTING THE LINEUP

The Great Danes lost just one starter to graduation in three-point specialist Jen Schumacher. Schumacher was the only member of the 2005-06 squad to start all 28 games for the Great Danes. However, four returners - Sherri Mikus, Amanda Ward, Gia Sanders and Kirstin Peterson - saw action in every game. Those four, along with Joy Sterling, each started at least 14 contests last season, giving head coach Trina Patterson several options with starting experience.

PRESEASON PICKS

UAlbany was chosen ninth in the America East Conference preseason poll, as voted on by the conference head coaches. Two-time defending champion Hartford sits atop the poll after being chosen unanimously for the second straight season.

THE SCHEDULE

Trina Patterson has lined up arguably the toughest non-conference schedule in the program's history. The first half of the Great Danes' schedule features three NCAA participants from last season and another that was in the tournament field two years ago. UAlbany will face off against 2005-06 Patriot League Champion Army, Northeast Conference champion Sacred Heart and Mid-American Conference champion Bowling Green, all in the first month of the season. Holy Cross, winners of the 2004-05 Patriot League title, also graced the Great Danes' schedule in November.

UAlbany faced off against the first Big 10 school in UAlbany annals with a trip to Wisconsin in December. The Great Danes also took on Central Florida of Conference USA at the Golden Knights Tournament and Virginia Commonwealth (Colonial Athletic Association). UAlbany also took on in-state opponent Buffalo (Mid-American Conference) in the early going.

O CAPTAIN, MY CAPTAIN

Selected by the team and coaching staff, senior Tanya James and juniors Sherri Mikus and Kristin Higby will serve as captains for the 2006-07 team. James is in her second season of captaincy for the Great Danes, while Mikus and Higby were chosen for the first time.

PROGRAM HISTORY

The University at Albany women's basketball program began varsity play in 1965 and competed at the NCAA College Division, NCAA Division II and III levels prior to 1999. Entering their 42nd season, the Great Danes have a 418-435 (.490) record. UAlbany has made five ECAC playoff and two NCAA tournament appearances since 1985. The UAlbany program moved to Division II in 1995-96 and to Division I in 1999-00.

THE HOME COURT

The Great Danes play their home games at the 5,000-seat SEFCU Arena, located on campus. Entering the 2006-07 season, UAlbany holds a 95-74 (.562) record in 14 seasons at the SEFCU Arena. SEFCU, the largest credit union in the Capital Region, and the University at Albany announced on Nov. 1, 2006 a \$2.75 million commitment to name the university's Recreation & Convocation Center, in addition to promotional opportunities, for a 10-year period. The facility will continue to expand its role as a major venue for community and sporting events.
