SETTING THE SCENE

The Vermont Catamounts, picked to finish eighth in the America East Preseason Coaches' Poll, placed third overall and face #6-seeded Maine in the America East Quarterfinals on Friday afternoon. Vermont closed out the regular season with wins at New Hampshire and over Albany to finish with an 18-11 record and 8-8 mark in league play. The Black Bears, picked to finish just above the Catamounts at seventh in the pre-season poll finished in a tie for fourth, but by virtue of a tie-breaker dropped to the #6 seed. Maine enters the tournament with a record of 13-14 overall and finished conference play with a 7-9 mark.

KOTSPOULOS NAMED ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

Kotsopoulos led Vermont to a 2-0 week and helped the Catamounts clinch third place in America East with wins over New Hampshire and Albany. Kotsopoulos led all Vermont scorers in both games, netting 16 points (6-8 FG) and grabbing five rebounds in a win at New Hampshire. She led all scorers with 19 points (16 in the first half), two shy of her career high, in the win over Albany. She finished the week averaging 17.5 points, 4.5 rebounds and totaled six steals. She shot 58.3 percent from the floor and 55.6 percent from long range. Kotsopoulos earns the honor for the second time this season and a Catamount has won the award 10 out of 17 weeks.

FANS CHOICE FOR PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Vermont freshman Courtney Pilypaitis was one of three finalists, along with Danielle Hood (Hartford) and Katie Meinhardt (Boston U) for the America East Fans' Choice Player of the Year. The announcement of the winner selected by America East fans will be made at the tournament banquet prior to the start of action in Binghamton.

TERRIFIC TURNAROUND

Vermont, picked to finish eighth in the America East Preseason Coaches' Poll, started off the year at 13-3, surpassing the team's win total from last year (9-18) and posting the best start since the 1992-93 season which was the second of Vermont's back-to-back undefeated regular seasons (28-0). It was also the best start during the Dawley era at UVM. Between 1991-92 and 1992-93, Vermont rattled off a then NCAA record 53 straight regular season victories and posted back-to-back undefeated seasons of 29-0 and 28-0. This season UVM has more home wins (9) than last season (5) and more road wins (7) than last season (2). However, Vermont is 5-8 since starting the season 13-3, but won back-to-back games to close out the regular season.

IRON CROSS

Senior Brittney Cross played in her 100th career game in a Vermont uniform on March 3 versus Albany in the regular season finale. Cross is the 23rd Catamount to reach the century mark. She has made 64 career starts (55 straight) and has been on the court 83 percent of the time in the last two years combined, playing 1820 of a possible 2200 minutes in the last two seasons.

CIHAL SHINES

Sophomore Andrea Cihal is shooting 71 percent from the field in the last five games for Vermont. She has been Vermont's top post player down the stretch. She had a breakout game in the loss to Binghamton scoring a career-high 16 points and grabbing nine rebounds to lead four Catamounts in double-figures. She grabbed 11 rebounds and chipped in seven points in the loss to UMBC. In an overtime loss at Stony Brook, Cihal posted career numbers of 20 points and 11 rebounds for her first career double-double. Cihal dominated the boards in Vermont's win over New Hampshire, hauling on a career-high 17 rebounds.

A CASE OF PILYPAITIS

Freshman guard Courtney Pilypaitis has stormed onto the scene for the Catamounts. She has been named the America East Rookie of the Week seven times this season, including five straight weeks from Dec. 18-Jan. 22. Pilypaitis leads Vermont in scoring (13.2 ppg) and has made the most three-pointers on the team (52). She ranks second on the team in rebounding (5.3 rpg) and assists (4.10). She ranks among the America East leaders in several categories: 8th in scoring; 16th in rebounding; 3rd in assists; 6th in steals; 9th in three-point field goal percentage; T-3rd in three-pointers made; 9th in assist-to-turnover ratio.

LAST TIME OUT - Vermont 65, Albany 61

Freshman May Kotsopoulos and senior Brittney Cross combined to score 31 points as the Vermont Catamounts outlasted Albany, 65-61, in the final regular season game in women's basketball action on Saturday afternoon. In a game that featured 18 lead changes and 12 ties, it was the last tie and lead change at the 4:07 mark of the second half that led to Vermont's victory. Cross sank two free throws to give Vermont a 60-59 lead. Rosenkrantz followed with a three pointer to push Vermont's lead to three with 2:47 left. The Great Danes trimmed the lead to one on a layup by Britney McGee, 62-61, with 56 seconds left, but the Catamounts made three of four free throws in the final 33 seconds, including a key pair by Sara Fenton with five seconds left to seal the victory. Kotsopoulos finished the game with 19 points, two shy of her career-high. She netted 16 of those points in the first half to keep Vermont in the contest. Cross added 12 points, nine in the second stanza, and added five assists and four steals. Rosenkrantz chipped in nine points and three rebounds for the Catamounts.

SALUTE TO THE SENIORS

Alison Brown is a co-captain for the Catamounts this season. She has provided the young team with great leadership and has played an important role in the program since arriving on campus four years ago. During her career she has come off the bench to provide an instant spark, whether with a basket on the offensive end or a steal on the defensive end. Alison has always played with a competitive fire, heart and determination that is unmatched. An outstanding student, Alison has been named to the America East Academic Honor Roll three straight years and will graduate in May with a degree in business administration. Brittney Cross the other co-captain this season, has been a regular starter for the past two years for the Catamounts. She played in her 100th career game in a Vermont uniform versus Albany. This season she became the seventh player in the program's history to record over 500 points, 200 rebounds, 200 assists and 150 steals, joining some of Vermont's all-time greats on the list. She will finish her career ranked among the top-10 career leaders in steals and free throw percentage. Another standout student for Vermont, Brittney was named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District I Team earlier this season and has been named to the America East Academic Honor Roll three straight years. She will graduate in May with a degree in psychology.

CATAMOUNT FRESHMEN LEAD THE WAY

Vermont is the only team in the country at the Division I level (324 schools) to have two freshmen as the top two scorers on the team. Courtney Pilypaitis leads the team in scoring at 13.2 points per game and May Kotsopoulos is second, averaging 10.9 points per game this season. Pilypaitis is one of four freshmen to lead their team in scoring this season at the Division I level.

DUO RANKS AMONG ALL-TIME FRESHMEN SCORERS

May Kotsopoulos and Courtney Pilypaitis also have two of the top two scoring averages for freshmen in the history of the Vermont program.

YOUNG GUNS

With 10 America East Rookie of the Week awards, its no surprise the Catamount rookies lead the team offensively. The Vermont freshmen account for 41.1 percent of the team's offense, while sophomores account for 37.3 percent. Overall, UVM's underclassmen account for 78.3 percent of its offense. Courtney Pilypaitis (13.2 ppg) and May Kotsopoulos (10.9 ppg) rank 1-2 among the top freshmen scorers in America East and Amy Rosenkrantz leads all sophomores in scoring (8.4 ppg).

OH CANADA!

Vermont is tied with Canisius and Utah for having the most Canadians on an NCAA Division I team in 2006-07 with four - Andrea Cihal (Mississauga, Ontario), May Kotsopoulos (Waterloo, Ontario), Courtney Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario), Nicole Trott (Wasaga Beach, Ontario). The Catamounts have a rich tradition of attracting the top talent from north of the border to the program. UVM's all-time leading scorer (Karalyn Church - Guelph, Ontario), all-time leading rebounder (Sheri Turnbull - Windsor, Ontario) and all-time assists leader (Lori Taylor - Markham, Ontario) are all Canadian natives. The University of Vermont is located 90 minutes from Montreal, Quebec.

NON-CONFERENCE NUMBERS

Vermont posted 10 non-conference wins which is the most since the 1991-92 and 1992-93 seasons when the Catamounts won 10 games each versus non-league opponents. The Catamounts are 29-9 versus non-conference opponents at Patrick Gymnasium since the 1998-99 season.

CROSS JOINS ELITE COMPANY

Senior guard Brittney Cross grabbed two steals in the win over Siena to become the seventh Catamount to register 500 points, 200 rebounds, 200 assists and 150 steals. She joins a list of top players that spans Vermont's history: Karalyn Church '00, Jen Niebling '93, Missy Kelsen '92, Kari Greenbaum '95, Lori Taylor '98, Libby Smith '02.

100 HELPINGS

Freshman Courtney Pilypaitis had three assists in the win over Maine to give her 100 on the season and senior Brittney Cross reached the century mark with a career-high tying eight helpers versus Binghamton. Pilypaitis is the first freshman

since Libby Smith to have 100 assists in a season. This season marks the first since the 2003-03 campaign that the Catamounts have had two players with 100+ assists. Five players in America East have 100+ assists this season, including Pilypaitis and Cross.

ALL-ACADEMIC FOR CROSS

Senior Brittney Cross was one of two UVM basketball players named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District First Team. She was joined by Martin Klimes, a member of the men's basketball team, as an honoree. Both players are now eligible for the national ballot and ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America honors. Cross, a co-captain for the second straight year, has played in 93 career games and made 49 consecutive starts for the Catamounts. She is the seventh player at Vermont to record over 500 points, 200 rebounds, 200 assists and 150 steals all-time. The 5-9 guard leads America East in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.59), ranks second in steals (2.36 pg) and is fifth overall in steals (3.91 pg). Cross, a psychology major with a minor in sociology owns a 3.75 cumulative GPA. She is the third student-athlete to earn academic all-district honors this season at Vermont and the first women's basketball player since Lani Boardman earned the honor in 2004-05. As a team, the Catamounts posted a 3.03 GPA for the fall semester of 2006.

QUICK LIKE A CAT

Vermont collected 31 steals in two games of the TD Banknorth Classic. Freshman Courtney Pilypaitis registered seven herself in a win over Holy Cross, two shy of tying the Vermont single-game record. As a team, UVM totaled 17 steals in the win over the Crusaders, tying the TD Banknorth single-game tournament record. Vermont has recorded double-digits in the steals column in 19 games this season.

SWEET 70

Vermont enters the 2006-07 season with a record of 57-12 when it scores 70 points or more dating back to the 2001-02 season. UVM has reached the 70-point plateau 13 times this season (10-3).

GREEN TEAM

Vermont has one of the youngest teams in America East this season as 10 of the 14 players are freshmen or sophomores. The Catamounts boast a pair of juniors and a pair of seniors

ASSISTING A WIN

Vermont handed out 20 assists on 23 field goals in the win over New Hampshire on Jan. 27. It was the fourth time this year UVM has recorded 20 or more assists in a game and UVM is 4-0 when it reaches 20 helpers. The season high for Vermont is 24 assists on 31 field goals in a victory over Kent State.

FREE THROWS

Vermont has struggled at the free throw line this season, shooting 64.9 percent, last in the league, which is uncharacteristic for the Catamounts. For the past four seasons, including 2005-06, Vermont has shot better than 70% from the line as a team. Brittney Cross finished the 2005-06 season ranked 29th in the country in free throw shooting, hitting 85.9 percent of her shots from the stripe.

FOR STARTERS

Freshman Courtney Pilypaitis became the first Vermont rookie to start a season opener for head coach Sharon Dawley during her tenure. She is also the first freshman to start a season opener at Vermont since the 1998-99 season (Libby Smith).

PATRICK POWER

Vermont went 9-5 at home, surpassing last season's home win total (5) and it's the most wins for the Catamounts at Patrick Gym since the 2004-05 season (9).

TOP CATS

The Vermont men's and women's basketball programs have combined to win 226 games since the 2001-02 season, the most by a current America East school. The men's team has totaled 127 victories, tops among men's and women's teams and the UVM women's program ranks fourth with 99 victories.

TOURNEY TIME

Vermont played in three in-season tournaments for the second straight year in 2006-07 and won two titles (TD Banknorth Classic and the URI Invitational). The Catamounts are 50-48 all-time in regular season tournaments and 11-7 under head coach Sharon Dawley during her tenure. UVM has advanced to the championship game in eight of the nine tournaments the Catamounts have played in during Dawley's four years at Vermont, including this season (TD Banknorth Classic & URI

Invitational).

QUALITY OPPONENTS

During head coach Sharon Dawley's three-year stint the Catamounts have played several quality opponents and always has a tough schedule to start the season. Some of the teams Vermont has faced: Boston College, Iowa, Louisville, Michigan State, Mississippi, Pittsburgh, UW-Green Bay, Vanderbilt, South Florida

TAKING CHARGE

Courtney Pilypaitis leads the teams in charges drawn this season (12).

THE STREAK

Vermont's longest win streak of the year was five games, the most since winning 12 in a row in 2001-02. During the five-game win streak the Catamounts out scored opponents by 11.2 points per game and out rebounded them by a +3.6 margin. Vermont put together four-game win streaks at two different times during the 2006-07 season.

EAGLES GROUNDED

In a rare occurrence, both Vermont basketball teams beat a ranked Boston College team this season. The men's team upset then-#14 ranked Boston College, 77-63 at Conte Forum on Nov. 13. The women followed suit with a 56-48 victory over then-#22 Boston College on Nov. 25 in the championship game of the URI Invitational.

PILYPAITIS PILES UP ACCOLADES

Freshman Courtney Pilypaitis earned the America East Rookie of the Week honor seven times this season setting a new school record for earning the conference's weekly rookie honor breaking the mark formerly held by Morgan Hall '03 during the 1999-00 season. Hall won it five times that season and classmate Dawn Cressman '03 picked up the honor four times as well, giving UVM the honor nine times in 15 weeks. Both went on to be named to the America East All-Rookie Team. Ironically, Pilypaitis wears the same number Hall did when she played for the Catamounts (33).

FLASH TO THE PAST

Courtney Pilypaitis handed out 11 assists in the win over Boston U. The last Catamount to hand out 11 assists in a game was UVM's all-time leader in assists Lori Taylor '98. She achieved the feat twice during the 1996-97 season (vs. Canisius - 11/23/96 & vs. Towson - 2/7/97). Taylor is also the last Catamount, until Pilypaitis versus the Terriers, to post a double-double with double-figures in points and assists. Taylor, also a Canadian native (Markham, Ontario), scored 10 points to go along with her 11 assists in the season opening game versus Canisius.

FINE AT 40

The Catamounts are 11-1 this season when shooting 40% or better from the field. The lone loss was at Stony Brook in overtime. UVM shot 50.7 percent from the floor in that game.

CAT NIPS

Interesting facts about the Catamounts

Andrea Cihal: Has only been playing basketball for five years. She was a standout volleyball player in Canada. She earned America East All-Rookie honors last year. Cihal's family moved from Mississauga, Ontario to Calgary, Alberta during the summer prior to her freshman year at Vermont.

Brittney Cross: Father played collegiate tennis at Minnesota. Cross turned down a scholarship offer at the University of New Hampshire, her hometown school, she is a native of Durham, N.H., to play at Vermont. Was named MVP of the URI Invitational earlier this season.

Sofia Iwobi: Moved from Plovdiv, Bulgaria to Fairfield, Iowa with her mother at the age of seven. Was featured in Sports Illustrated's Faces In The Crowd (March 27, 2006) after scoring 49 points, grabbing 14 rebounds collecting six steals and five blocks to lead the Maharishi School to a two-point triple-overtime win over Highland High School in the Class 1A Regional Finals to propel Maharishi to the state tournament for the first time in school history. Is the first native of Iowa to play at Vermont.

Sy Janousek: Given name is Sayuri (pronounced sigh-u-di) which is Japanese and means "little lilly". She goes by the nickname Sy. Came to UVM with high school teammate Amy Rosenkrantz.

Sarah Madey: Earned a spot on the team as a walk-on last year. When Coach Dawley asked here to send a tape to evaluate her over the summer, she showed up at the door the next day with the tape in hand, making a great first impression. Her hometown of Derby Line, Vt. has a population of 776 and is on the U.S./Canadian border

Courtney Pilypaitis: Is the first Vermont freshman to start the season opener under Sharon Dawley and the first since the 1998-99 season (Libby Smith). Was named MVP of Vermont's own TD Banknorth Classic earlier this season.

Kelli Poles: Brother Ryan is a starting junior offensive tackle for the Boston College football team. Father also played football at Boston College and went on to play in the NFL with the Seattle Seahawks.

Jill Rademacher: Is just the second Minnesota native to play for Vermont and the first since 1984. Is the youngest of six children. Is the first student-athlete from Holdingford High School to earn an athletic scholarship to a Division I school.

Alissa Sheftic: Older brother Matt (Class of 2003) played for the Catamount men's basketball team. He helped the Catamounts win their first-ever America East Championship and earn a berth to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history (2003). He is now a first lieutenant in the army and stationed with the 4th Brigade 25th Infantry Division at Fort Richardson (Alaska). Is the seventh Essex Junction native to play at Vermont.

CATS SINK PIRATES TO WIN TD BANKNORTH TITLE

Vermont defeated East Carolina 57-43 to win its fifth TD Banknorth Classic Championship and first since 2002. Sophomore Amy Rosenkrantz scored a team-high 14 points in her second straight start to lead the Catamounts. Classmate Andrea Cihal grabbed 10 rebounds. Freshman Courtney Pilypaitis was named the tournament MVP and fellow newcomer May Kotsopoulos earned a spot on the all-tournament team. East Carolina went on to win the Conference USA Championship and earned an automatic bid to the NCAA Tourney.

HISTORIC VICTORY

Vermont upset #22-ranked Boston College on Nov. 25 in the championship game of the URI Invitational to win its second straight in-season tournament. Senior Brittney Cross scored a game-high 17 points and handed out six assists to earn tournament MVP honors and lead Vermont to the win. UVM led 24-14 at the break, but BC battled back to take a lead with 10:11 left in the game. Freshman May Kotsopoulos answered back, hitting two layups and a three-pointer in a span of 1:30 to put UVM back in front by three. The Eagles would only get as close as one the rest of the way. Cross' steal at 1:05 sealed the victory for Vermont. The win was the first-ever for Vermont over a ranked opponent (now 1-13), the first win over Boston College (now 1-5) and the first win over an ACC opponent. Boston College is coached by former Vermont head coach Cathy Inglesse who was at the helm of the UVM program for seven seasons.

GIVING THE GOPHERS A GAME

The Catamounts traveled to Minnesota after upsetting Boston College and faced the second straight former Catamount coach in Gophers' mentor Pam Borton. Borton was an assistant under Inglesse at Vermont and took over the head coaching duties following Inglesse's departure to BC. Minnesota posted a 74-59 victory behind a 16-6 run over the final three minutes of the game. Freshman May Kotsopoulos finished with a game-high and career-high 21 points to lead the Catamounts.

RUNNING PAST THE FLASHES

Vermont used a balanced attack as five Catamounts netted double figures to lead the Catamounts past the Kent State Golden Flashes, 91-73, at Patrick Gym. The Catamounts made four of its first five field goals to start the game and held a 51-34 lead at the break. Freshman Courtney Pilypaitis and sophomore Amy Rosenkrantz netted 15 points each to lead Vermont.

FORMER FOE

The Catamounts defeated former America East rival Northeastern, 55-47, in the consolation game of the Hawk Classic at St. Joseph's University. UVM held the Huskies to one field goal during an seven minute stretch of the second half and opened up an 11-point lead and go on to earn the victory. Freshman Courtney Pilypaitis led three players in double-figures with 12 points. She added 12 rebounds for her first career double-double. May Kotsopoulos and Amy Rosenkrantz also added 12 points. Pilypaitis was named to the all-tournament team.

RINGING IN THE NEW YEAR

Vermont sophomores Kelli Poles and Sy Janousek came off the bench to spark the Catamounts to a 75-56 victory over Siena on New Year's Day. Poles finished the game with 10 points in 10 minutes and Janousek added 11 points in 21 minutes. Freshman Courtney Pilypaitis led all scorers with 22 points and six assists. UVM outscored Siena 32-16 over the final 15 minutes of the game.

CATAMOUNTS TACKLE TERRIERS IN LEAGUE OPENER

Sophomore Kelli Poles and freshman Courtney Pilypaitis posted double-doubles to lead Vermont to an 87-74 victory over Boston U in the America East opener. Poles poured in a career-high 22 points and grabbed 10 rebounds in 25 minutes off the bench. Pilypaitis added 15 points and 11 assists. UVM used a 10-3 run to open up an 18-point lead and didn't look back.

SUPER SUBS SPARK VERMONT PAST HARTFORD

With Vermont down by six in the opening minutes of the second half versus Hartford in Burlington, head coach Sharon Dawley leaned on her bench, replacing all five starters with five subs, to provide the Catamounts with a spark. The bench unit scored five straight points and brought UVM back within one, 43-42 with 13:20 remaining. It was a key stretch and role the subs played to keep Vermont in the game and give life to the team and spurred the team to a 66-64 overtime victory. Sophomore Sy Janousek drained four of five three-pointers to lift the Catamounts past the Hawks.

ROOKIE RESCUE

Freshmen Courtney Pilypaitis and May Kotsopoulos combined for 19 points (Pilypaitis - 13; Kotsopoulos - 6) in Vermont's 21-0 run that helped the Catamounts erase a nine-point deficit with nine minutes to go versus Maine and lead Vermont to a 71-57 win in Burlington.

BATTLE WITH THE BROOK

Vermont's two games against Stony Brook came down to a last second three-pointer in Burlington and an overtime contest in Stony Brook. Mykeema Ford hit a three-pointer with 2.3 seconds left to lift the Seawolves past Vermont at Patrick Gym, 72-71. At Stony Brook, Vermont led 77-73 with 1:28 to go, but the Seawolves scored the final four points in regulation to send the game into overtime. With 23 seconds left Dana Ferraro tied the game at 77-77 off a put-back. The two teams would trade buckets through the first half of the five-minute overtime period, with Smith supplying the offense for the Seawolves by scoring their first nine. With 2:19 to go in the extra session Smith gave Stony Brook the lead for good as she completed a three-point play that made it 86-83. Jessica Smith led all scorers with 30 points for the Seawolves.

HAPPY HOMECOMING

Vermont senior Brittney Cross is a native of Durham, N.H. She played her high school basketball at Oyster River High School and was named the state's "Miss Basketball" as a senior in 2002-03. Cross sank three free throws in the final 23 seconds of the game at UNH to lift Vermont past the Wildcats. It was UVM's first victory at New Hampshire in Cross' career.

Head coach Sharon Dawley begins her fourth season at the helm of the Vermont women's basketball program. She was introduced as the sixth head coach at the University of Vermont since 1979 on June 11, 2003.

In Dawley's first season on the Vermont sidelines, she posted the best start by a first-year head coach at Vermont, guiding the Catamounts to a 6-2 mark to

begin the 2003-04 season. She earned her first career victory as a Catamount in UVM's 72-51 season opening win over St. Francis (N.Y.) in the first round of the TD Banknorth Classic. Dawley recorded her first America East victory with a 92-76 win over Stony Brook (Jan. 13, 2004) at Patrick Gym and posted her 150th career victory on March 3, 2004 as Vermont defeated UMBC in the final regular season home game.

Dawley also guided Vermont to a five-game win streak to close out the regular season, which included victories over #1-seeded Maine, #2-seed Binghamton and #4-seeded Albany on the road. Vermont's victory over Maine in Alford Arena snapped the Black Bear's 31-game conference win streak. At the end of the year, senior Aaron Yantzi was named to the America East All-Conference First Team.

In 2004-05, the Catamounts were picked to finish seventh in the America East Preseason Coaches Poll, but surpassed the coaches expectations and earned the #4 seed in the America East Women's Basketball Championship with an overall record of 14-15 and a 9-9 mark in the league. The Catamounts defeated #5 Binghamton in the quarterfinals, marking Dawley's first America East Tournament victory, and advanced to the America East Semifinals for the 14th time in the history of the program.

During the season, the Catamounts advanced to the championship game of two regular season tournaments. UVM opened the 2004-05 campaign with a victory over Louisville in the TD Banknorth Classic at Patrick Gym. Vermont also traveled to San Diego to compete in the Surf-n-Slam Classic, earning a first round win over the hosts San Diego before falling to Mississippi in the title game.

Dawley led Vermont to a record of 9-4 on its home court at Patrick Gym in 2004-05, the most home wins since 2002-03. Senior Lani Boardman was named to the America East All-Conference Second Team, while teammate Alexis Castro earned America East All-Rookie honors. Boardman, an ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District First Team selection on 2004-05, was also named to the America East All-Championship Team after an impressive performance in the tournament.

The Catamounts posted a record of 9-18 overall in 2005-06. Two Vermont players earned America East All-Conference honors. During the season UVM advanced to the championship game of two in-season tournaments, the Catamounts own TD Banknorth Classic and the Oneida Holiday Classic hosted by UW-Green Bay.

Under Dawley's guidance, the Vermont women's basketball team has also earned success in the classroom. In 2003-04, the Catamounts ranked 10th out of the 25 Division I teams selected to the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll for Division I. The award recognizes the nation's highest team grade point averages (GPA) for the 2003-04 season. The Catamounts posted a 3.35 overall GPA and was the top team among the women's basketball programs in the America East this season.

In 2004-05 and 2005-06, nine student-athletes were named to the America East Academic Honor Roll, including seven that earned a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll for earning a grade-point average of 3.5 or higher. Vermont posted a team GPA of 3.20 in 2004-05 to lead all America East schools in women's basketball and the Catamounts have won the America East Academic Cup in back-to-back seasons (2004-05, 2005-06).

Dawley owns a career record of 192-120 in 12 seasons as a head coach. Her record at Vermont after three years is 55-53 overall.

Prior to arriving at Vermont, Dawley spent 10 years as a member of the women's basketball staff at nearby Dartmouth College. She served as an assistant coach from 1993-1997 and was promoted to associate head women's basketball coach under head coach Chris Wielgus in July of 1997.

During Dawley's decade-long stint on the Dartmouth sideline, the Big Green won four Ivy League Championships and advanced to the NCAA Tournament three times, including back-to-back appearances in 1999 and 2000. Dawley has been instrumental in the Big Green's success over the last 10 years. During her tenure every four-year player at Dartmouth graduated with at least one Ivy League Championship ring.

Before joining the Dartmouth staff, Dawley served as head women's basketball coach at Tufts University for nine seasons. She compiled a record of 137-63 (.685) and still owns the record for most wins and best winning percentage in the program's history. She led the Jumbos to a Northeast Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Championship in just her third season (1986-87). Tufts reached the NIAC title game in her first five years. The Jumbos also reached the ECAC Championship semifinals in three of Dawley's final four seasons, the first post-season appearances in the program's history.

A native of Revere, Mass., Dawley earned a bachelor of arts degree in business from St. Anselm College (Manchester, New Hampshire) in 1983. She was a four-year member of the women's basketball team. During her senior season the Hawks posted a record of 22-6 overall, earned a #15 national ranking and won the ECAC Division II Championship.

PILYPAITIS NAMED AMERICA EAST ROOKIE OF THE YEAR KOTSOPOULOS EARNS ALL-DEFENSIVE TEAM AND ALL-ROOKIE HONORS

Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis was named the America East Rookie of the Year and teammate May Kotsopoulos joined Pilypaitis on the all-rookie team. The Catamounts were honored at the awards ceremony prior to the start of the 2007 America East Women's Basketball Championship at Binghamton on Thursday morning.

Pilypaitis, the third Vermont player to be named the America East Rookie of the Year in the program's history (Libby Smith, Morgan Hall), also earned a spot on the America East All-Conference Third Team and Kotsopoulos became the first Catamount to garner a spot on the America East All-Defensive Team in the program's history. Both freshmen were unanimous picks for the all-rookie team and Pilypaitis was a unanimous selection for the rookie of the year honor.

"This is a great honor for the program and shows that we are headed in the right direction and the future is bright. I'm extremely proud of both May and Courtney," said Vermont head coach Sharon Dawley.

"We knew both of them would be great, but both have exceeded our expectations in their first year at this level. Both are getting stronger every day and growing in confidence, it will be exciting to see what they do in the tournament," said Dawley.

Pilypaitis stormed onto the scene in America East this season winning seven America East Rookie of the Week honors, including five straight from Dec. 18-Jan. 22. Pilypaitis has led Vermont in scoring all year, averaging 13.2 points per game, and ranks second in rebounding (5.2 pg). The Orleans, Ontario native ranks among the America East leaders in scoring, rebounding, assist, steals, three-point field goal percentage, three-pointers made and assist-to-turnover ratio.

Pilypaitis is one of four rookies at the Division I level to lead their team in scoring this season and owns the fourth-best scoring average by a newcomer in the history of the program. She is also one of 10 freshmen to be the starting point guard for a Division I team in 2006-07 and is the first freshman to lead Vermont in scoring since the 1984-85 season when Joann McKay averaged 15.2 points per game.

"Courtney is a great point guard in that her court vision is exceptional and being 6-0 will really help her in her pursuit to be a great point guard. The thing that surprised us was that not only did Courtney become a go-to scorer for us, but is our leading scorer. That's something we didn't plan on," said Dawley.

Kotsopoulos made an impact for the Catamounts on the defensive end of the floor. The Waterloo, Ontario native ranks second on the team in scoring (10.9 ppg), which joins Pilypaitis' average as one of the best among freshmen all-time at Vermont. Kotsopoulos has also collected 50 steals on the year and is shooting 42.9 percent from the floor entering the tournament.

"May is clearly one of the best defensive players in the league, statistically she didn't stand out, but it is her on ball pressure and tenacity that makes her a player you really don't want to compete against. Offensively she has come into her own. She is now a threat from the three-point area and continues to be a great scorer going to the rim," said Dawley.

Vermont (18-11) is the #3 seed in the 2007 America East Women's Basketball Championship and will face #6 Maine at 2:30pm on Friday (March 9) at the Events Center on the campus of Binghamton University.

NO REGRETS FOR CROSS

Difficult decisions awaited Brittney Cross in the months proceeding her Oyster River High School girls basketball career, which was punctuated with a 25-0 season and a New Hampshire state championship.

The first one she made was choosing to bypass the school in her hometown of Durham, the University of New Hampshire, to play at the University of Vermont.

The second one was sticking with the choice after learning the coach who had lured her, Keith Cieplicki, was leaving UVM for a job at Syracuse.

"I knew there was going to be a new coach, but I wanted to give it a go," Cross said. "I realized it could have been a great story or a horror story."

Three years later, Cross, a senior guard heading into her final season as a Catamount, is reaching the end of the story.

"Thank goodness I stuck it out," the UVM co-captain said before a practice earlier in the week, "because it's been an amazing experience here. I've loved every second of it."

Reliable leader

Senior co-captain Alison Brown erased any doubt as to who leads the Cats on and off the court.

"Britt is the same age as me, but I still look up to her," said Brown, who has been Cross' roommate since a freshman. "I couldn't ask for a better teammate, a better co-captain, a better anything."

UVM head coach Sharon Dawley wasn't about to argue.

"She's one of the most amazing people I've gotten to coach in 23 years," Dawley said about Cross. "She will outwork everybody, will outthink everybody, and has really made herself into a terrific basketball player."

The Catamounts are a young bunch this season, which opens tonight against Massachusetts at Patrick Gymnasium. Of the 14 players on the roster, 10 are either freshmen or sophomores, making Cross' experience and leadership valuable commodities.

The 5-foot-9 Cross has checked into 71 games at UVM, more than twice the amount of any other player on the team. She was also a captain last season. "I had to jump into the leadership role as a junior," Cross said. "I'm a little less uncomfortable with it this year."

Freshman guard May Kotsopoulos has already taken notice.

"She works harder than anybody in practice, without a doubt," Kotsopoulos said about Cross. "Any day or any night she's there for you. She keeps us together."

Dawley said Cross will be a calming influence on the court when matters get chaotic in the Cats' rugged America East Conference schedule, and that she'll be the one directing traffic.

"We might have young players on the point, so Britt will be calling the plays from the 2," Dawley said. "She is also going to change our defenses when we feel it is necessary."

"Having Britt on the floor is like having a member of the coaching staff on the floor, which is very com-

forting."

Steady development

As a high school senior, Cross was New Hampshire's "Miss Basketball" and Oyster River's "Female Athlete of the Year," but she needed to elevate her play to fare well at the college level.

No problem.

"She came in as a great athlete and an average basketball player," Dawley said, "and will be leaving as one of the top defenders in the league. That's just from hard work."

Cross started in a combined nine games in her freshman and sophomore seasons before blossoming as a junior.

Last year, she was the only UVM player to start in all 27 games, leading the team in assists (90), steals (62), blocks and foul shooting (73 of 85). She was second to Alexis Castro -- who transferred to American International College in the offseason -- in scoring (9.3 points per game) and rebounding (4.1). She snared seven steals in a game vs. UMBC, two shy of the school record, and sank New Hampshire by scoring seven of her game-high 15 points in the final 2 minutes, 30 seconds of the game.

As a result, Cross was named the team's most valuable player.

"She's the most easygoing person you'll ever meet," Brown said. "She pretty much laidback about everything."

"Except basketball."

CATS GET PAST HOLY CROSS

The University of Vermont women's basketball team continuously misfired on shots in a season-opening defeat to Massachusetts last weekend.

Friday night was a different story.

The Catamounts' gave their fans more to cheer during the opening round of the TD Banknorth Classic, racing to a 67-53 victory over Holy Cross at Patrick Gymnasium. They will face East Carolina -- an 80-71 winner over Harvard in Friday's opening game -- for the championship at 8 tonight.

Seven days removed from a 60-48 loss to UMass on a 26.5-percent shooting display, the Cats were on the mark against Holy Cross (1-3), connecting on 43.4 percent of their shots, including 7 of 19 from 3-point range.

"Our goal was to come out and win the tournament in our own gym," UVM freshman May Kotsopoulos said. "Tonight we shot a lot better and we picked up our defense."

UVM freshman point guard Courtney Pilypaitis dazzled with 19 points, five assists and seven steals, knocking down 3 of 5 3-pointers. Kotsopoulos added 11 points, four rebounds and three steals and senior captain Brittney Cross had 10 points and six assists.

"I was pleased overall. ... " UVM coach Sharon Dawley said. "This will be a typical shooting game for us."

The Catamounts were equally impressive on the other end of the floor, snatching 17 steals to tie the tournament record. Dawley was even happier to watch Kotsopoulos and Sara Fenton clamp down on Holy Cross' dangerous guard, Laura Aloisi, who was limited to three points.

"Scouting Holy Cross we knew that ... (Aloisi) had to really get them into sync," Dawley said. "May and Sara's job was to never let that happen, and they didn't."

The up-tempo Cats wasted no time setting the tone, bolting to a 10-0 edge in the first four minutes and going up by 16 points after Kotsopoulos drained a pair of foul shots with 1:59 left in the first half.

They were ahead 37-25 at halftime, a margin that would have been greater had it not been for the hot hand of Holy Cross' Bethany O'Dell, who poured in 10 of her 12 points before intermission. Kaitlin Foley led the Crusaders with 19 points and nine rebounds.

Vermont built its lead to 20 in the opening seven minutes of the second half and maintained a comfortable cushion the rest of the way.

"I thought all the freshman played like upperclassmen," Dawley said. "I think we'll be the fresher team against East Carolina because we go a lot deeper."

CATAMOUNTS CLAIM TD BANKNORTH TITLE

University of Vermont women's basketball coach Sharon Dawley felt she had the fresher, deeper team heading into Saturday night's matchup with East Carolina in the championship game of the TD Banknorth Classic.

The Catamounts proved her right.

Sophomore guards Amy Rosenkrantz and Sy Janousek sparked a furious second-half rally as UVM surged to a 57-43 victory over the Pirates at Patrick Gymnasium, capturing their home invitational for the first time since 2002 and the fifth time overall.

Rosenkrantz knocked down 6 of 11 field goal attempts and finished with 14 points and seven rebounds, and Janousek drilled a trio of 3-pointers and tallied 11 points for the Catamounts, who trailed 27-26 early in the second half.

UVM took control with an 11-0 run midway through the second half and maintained a double-digit edge the rest of the way. The Catamounts, who cruised past Holy Cross in Friday night's opener, improved to 2-1.

Courtney Pilypaitis finished with seven points, seven rebounds and eight assists. That, combined with her 19 points against Holy Cross, earned her tournament MVP honors. Andrea Cihal pulled down 10 rebounds for the Catamounts. Freshman May Kotsopoulos scored 12 points and earned a spot on the all-tourney team.

Action in the opening 10 minutes of the game was fast and furious, including seven lead changes.

UVM took an 18-17 lead when Rosenkrantz converted a transition basket, two of her nine first-half points, but the Catamounts' offense went dry over the final seven minutes of the first half and East Carolina were up 23-20 at the intermission.

East Carolina had an 8-3 edge in offensive rebounds in the first half, scoring six points on putbacks.

"Rosenkrantz just ignited our offense," Vermont coach Sharon Dawley said in a postgame interview with UVM Basketball Radio Network, "and Sy hits some big shots for us."

Jasmine Young and Cherie Mills poured in 14 points apiece for East Carolina.

VERMONT WOMEN KNOCK OFF NO. 22 BC

NORTH KINGSTON, R.I. -- Anything the University of Vermont men's team can do, so can the Catamount women's hoop squad.

UVM women shocked the 22nd-ranked Boston College Eagles 56-48 on Saturday to capture the University of Rhode Island Invitational Tournament at the Ryan Center.

The win was the first in program history over a nationally ranked team, according to Lisa Champagne, director of athletic communications for Vermont.

The upset also comes 12 days after the UVM men knocked off Boston College, then ranked 14th in the nation, 77-63.

Brittney Cross, the tournament MVP, led the UVM women with 17 points, six assists, five steals and four rebounds as the Catamounts trailed only once in the final 34 minutes.

Freshman Courtney Pilypaitis, who was named to the all-tournament team, added 14 points, four assists and four rebounds. Freshman May Kotsopoulos added nine points, four rebounds and three steals.

UVM coach Sharon Dawley said the Catamount defense took the Eagles out of their game, especially in the first half.

"It validates to our players that hard work and great defense will allow them to play with anybody," said the fourth-year coach.

"They were not intimidated that it was BC or that they were ranked," said Dawley, who used six freshmen and sophomores among the eight players who saw game time.

Vermont, which had a 24-14 halftime lead, used an early 12-0 run to take a 16-7 edge. It mushroomed to 12 points, 24-12, when Cross hit a lay-up with 2:15 left before intermission.

In the first half the Eagles had 13 turnovers and hit only 24 percent (6-for-25) from the floor. Meanwhile, UVM was sinking 39 percent (10-for-26) of its attempts.

BC battled back into the game with a 15-7 run to close the lead to 31-29. The Eagles, under former UVM coach Cathy Inglesse, eventually took the lead 39-37 with 10:11 left in the game.

The Cats rallied for a 10-4 run as Kotsopoulos hit back-to-back lay-ups followed by a 3-pointer, while Cross hit three free throws.

The Eagles would draw to within one (47-46) with 3:31 left, but Pilypaitis drilled a 3-pointer for breathing room with 2:03 remaining. Cross added a lay-up with 1:06 left and UVM converted four free throws down the line before BC scored a hoop in the final seconds.

The win also gives the UVM women back-to-back in-season tournament championships. The Catamounts captured their own Banknorth Classic at Patrick Gym last weekend.

The four-game winning streak by UVM (4-1) is the longest since a five-game stretch to close the 2003-04 regular season.

Dawley said the depth of the UVM bench, along with the back-to-back games a week earlier, had prepared the Catamounts to battle Boston College. "I think it was our depth. They had a physical game

in their opener," Dawley said. "We had a lot of Brit Cross leadership. She was unbelievable. She broke BC's back with her leadership."

Dawley also credited Amy Rosenkrantz (seven points, eight rebounds) with her play at both ends of the court, while Pilypaitis and Kotsopoulos played like veterans, not freshmen, she said.

Dawley also noted that sophomore Andrea Cihal (six rebounds, one steal) and freshman Alissa Sheftic (five rebounds) played strong inside to create havoc with the BC offense.

"The kids played great defense. We really distracted Boston College. They could not get into their high-low offense," Dawley said.

"Our ladies did a great job with their composure. We had some young players really step up."

Elizabeth Engell led BC with 17 points and nine rebounds, while Katherin Ress added 14 points and 14 rebounds.

Former Vermont high school all-state player Corey Rusin of Wilmington was held scoreless in 13 minutes of action for Boston College.

ORLEANS BASKETBALL STAR SHINES IN VERMONT

As one of four Canadians playing for the University of Vermont Catamounts women's basketball team, Orleans native Courtney Pilypaitis said the spotlight should not be just on her achievements amassed so early in her freshman year, but on the whole team.

The former captain of the St. Peter Knights senior girls basketball team deflects praise for her two American East Woman's Basketball Rookie of the Week awards, pointing out she couldn't have done it without the support around her and firstly it is more important that the team keeps winning.

"She's playing really well for us, playing with a lot of confidence," Dawley said. "She is a very mature basketball player. She's not a true freshman. I feel like she's been playing like an upper classman for (these) five games."

"I knew she was this good," Dawley added. "You just never know if freshmen will be nervous at the beginning. You can't really know how they're going to take to college but obviously Courtney's taken to college very well and is not nervous about basketball at all."

Pilypaitis was scouted by the University of Vermont this past year as she guided St. Peter to their third-straight chit championship title, but Dawley said it was her star performance at the St. Mary's high school girls' basketball tournament last fall that proved she was the player the Catamounts were looking for.

"There is a lot of talent in that area and that tournament has been very good for us," she said.

Dawley added they will try to keep Pilypaitis "healthy" this year setting the stage for her to develop into one of the top players the Catamounts have ever come across.

"I think Courtney at this pace will be one of the great ones to graduate from Vermont and the other Canadians that have made an impact at Vermont she'll be right up there with (Vermont record holder for most points and rebounds in a season) Sheri Turnbull," she said.

At the end of a long day, Courtney Pilypaitis enjoys kicking back in her dorm room and watching sports on the tube, whether it be basketball, football or SportsCenter.

But if May Kotsopoulos, her roommate, gets to the remote control first, the viewing options might be "Sex in the City", "Laguna Beach" or the latest reality TV show.

Kotsopoulos likes to style her hair before games.

"I would never do that," Pilypaitis retorted.

Kotsopoulos' favorite color is pink.

"I hate pink," Pilypaitis fired back.

The University of Vermont freshmen, however, have at least two things in common. They both are from Ontario. And each is contributing heavily to the UVM women's basketball revival.

Yin and Yang off the court, on it the Canadian duo has been instrumental in the Catamounts' 6-2 record and their best start in three seasons.

Emerging as UVM's top two scorers, Kotsopoulos and Pilypaitis were key components of a victory over Boston College in November, the first time the Catamounts had ever toppled a nationally ranked opponent.

"Neither of them is afraid of anything," UVM head coach Sharon Dawley said. "Not an opponent. Not making a mistake, which is critical because a lot of mistakes are made because players are afraid to make them. They both do whatever is needed."

"It's great to have overachievers come in and make an immediate impact."

Kotsopoulos is from Waterloo, located west of Toronto. Pilypaitis hails from Orleans, near Ottawa. They crossed paths in the youth ranks and played together as high school underclassmen on an Ontario Provincial team that fared well in the Canada Summer Games.

"We didn't really like each other at first," said Kotsopoulos, chuckling, "because we were so different."

Those sentiments evaporated as they got to know each other and a close friendship blossomed. Dawley spotted them at the St. Mary's high school tournament in Hamilton, Ontario, and the talented

recruits were lured to a UVM program that wobbled to a 9-18 record last season.

"Even though they didn't have the greatest record, I saw that there was a lot of potential," Pilypaitis said. Kotsopoulos is averaging a team-high 12.8 points a game for the Cats, but the 5-foot-10 guard takes even more pride in her tenacity on the other end of the floor.

"I get mad if the person I'm on gets more than five points," she said. "Everyone was telling me about the player from Minnesota (Kelly Roysland) being an All-American candidate. She scored eight against me and I was mad.

"It's not because I'm cocky with my defense. It's the pride I have. It's my job, part of who I am on the team, and I don't want to let the team down by letting people score that much."

Pilypaitis sat back and digested her roommate's dissertation on defense. "Yeah, I definitely like the offensive side more," she said, laughing.

Figures.

Pilypaitis, a 6-foot guard, has been running the point for the Catamounts since arriving on campus. Her 11.8 scoring average is built on 17-for-41 3-point shooting (41.5 percent) and an ability to knife through the paint for buckets. In addition, she is pulling down a team-high 5.5 rebounds a game.

"There's not enough good things you can say about two freshmen coming in," UVM senior captain Brittney Cross said.

The roommates claim they're not immune to bickering with each other, on or off the court.

"If we want to say something we won't hold back," Kotsopoulos said. "If we yell at each other, we yell at each other, and then everything will be fine."

"People on our team are so surprised with how we act," Pilypaitis chimed in. No one, however, is surprised with how they produce.

ROSENKRANTZ LIFTS VERMONT WOMEN PAST MANHATTAN

University of Vermont women's basketball coach Sharon Dawley said the beauty of this season's team is that each game provides a different star. Sunday, it was Amy Rosenkrantz's turn.

The sophomore guard collected team highs of 19 points and 10 rebounds in UVM's first game at Patrick Gymnasium in 28 days and delivered myriad clutch plays down the stretch to key the Catamounts' 74-65 victory over Manhattan on Sunday afternoon.

Over the final eight minutes of the game -- with the outcome still in doubt -- the 5-foot-9 Rosenkrantz sank a fade-away jumper, a putback and a 3-pointer to go along with some big rebounds.

"Amy took a little time to warm up, then put the team on her back," Dawley said. "There was a five-minute stint where she said, 'we're not getting the job done; I'm going to get the job done.'"

Coming off a five-game road swing and a week's worth of final exams, the Cats improved to 7-2 after securing their third consecutive victory.

UVM freshman point guard Courtney Pilypaitis scored 17 points on 5-of-10 shooting and dished off four assists. Senior guard Brittney Cross chipped in with 12 points and four steals.

The Catamounts didn't have their best shooting performance (26-for-68, 38.2 percent) and watched a 12-point lead early in the second half wither to a 56-55 edge with 6 minutes, 40 seconds left on the clock.

But pivotal baskets from former high school teammates Rosenkrantz and Sy Janousek kept UVM in front and the Cats netted enough foul shots down the stretch to finish off the Jaspers (4-6).

"It seemed like everyone was playing a little out of character and I felt like we needed someone to step up," said Rosenkrantz, who was a point shy of matching her career high.

Picked to finish eighth out of nine teams in the America East Conference coaches' preseason poll, a Catamount squad loaded with freshmen and sophomores is off to its best start in Dawley's four seasons.

"There's definitely a big sigh of relief that we won, but this is going to be a great learning experience for us," said Dawley, whose team plays host to Kent on Tuesday night. "We blew a lead, but in terms of our building process, this was a good situation for us -- to win a close game."

Aubrie Dellinger piled up 19 points for Manhattan and Caitlin Flood finished with 16 points and 10 rebounds. Gabrielle Cottrell added 10 points for the Jaspers, who shot 46 percent in the contest but coughed the ball up 29 times against UVM's swarming defense.

Last year, the University of Vermont women's basketball team limped into the Christmas break with a 4-6 record.

This year, after swiping a 91-73 victory over Kent State on Tuesday night at Patrick Gymnasium, the Catamounts are sprinting into the holiday with a four-game winning streak.

The revved-up Cats head into a nine-day break with a gaudy 8-2 record and their best start since 2002, leaving Sy Janousek anxious to return to work.

"I'm excited to come back after Christmas break and see what we can do," the sophomore guard said.

Tuesday, UVM used a tried-and-true formula to make quick work of the Golden Flashes: balanced scoring and tenacious defending.

Sophomore Amy Rosenkrantz and freshman Courtney Pilypaitis each scored 15 points, and Janousek and senior captain Brittney Cross added 14 apiece. Freshman May Kotsopoulos tacked on a dozen points for a UVM team that produced its highest offensive output of the season and almost reached the 100-point plateau for the first time since 1992.

The Catamounts bolted to a 25-9 lead in the first eight minutes and had a 51-34 edge at intermission after playing what UVM coach Sharon Dawley called the team's best half of the season.

"I said at halftime that was the best effort that we've had as far as strength of rebounding, passing, and we executed defense close to perfect," Dawley said.

The Cats knocked down 16 of their first 20 shots and finished the first half at 69.6 percent from field. UVM bumped the lead to 20 before Kent inched back. The Golden Flashes, who were led by Sarah Burgess (15 points) and Kristin Peoples (13 points), cut the margin to 13 with 5:38 left on the clock,

prompting Dawley to call time out to refocus her players.

Mission accomplished. The Catamounts ripped off a 13-2 run to finish off the Flashes (3-5).

"We had some lapses in the second half, but I told the girls in the locker room that I'm proud of the way they finished," Dawley said. "We lost momentum and then got our composure back. We were able to do that twice in the second half and I think that was critical to our maturity. We're still a young team."

The Cats travel to The Hawk Classic in Philadelphia on Dec. 28, kicking off the tournament with a game against South Florida.

PHILADELPHIA -- South Florida's quickness and athletic ability proved to be a little too strong for the University of Vermont women's basketball team Thursday afternoon as the Bulls ended the Catamounts' four-game win streak, 77-62, in the opening round of the Hawk Classic at St. Joseph's University.

"They were pretty quick in all spots," UVM coach Sharon Dawley said after the Catamounts dipped to 8-3.

"They were very athletic and you could tell on the floor their seniors have played together for awhile." While South Florida surged at game's end to produce the final score, Dawley said, "The score was not indicative. It felt like a six-point spread. We were still in it; they got a lot of points at the end."

It started the same way with the Bulls ringing up the game's first nine points before the Catamounts rallied to a five-point lead.

"Our kids did a phenomenal job of fighting back all night," Dawley said.

South Florida finished the half with a 42-40 lead and then stretched the advantage to 10 early in the second half behind Jessica Dickson, Shantia Grace and Nalini Miller.

"We played very, very well toward the end of the first half, with a lot of confidence, and made some big shots," Dawley said. "The beginning of the second half looked very similar to the first half. South Florida went out and hit a couple of quick hoops, but midway through we had it down to two points. "Then we went through a series of possessions where we got some good shots off but unfortunately they didn't go.

"We had so many shots. After the game, we counted 12 shots that rolled in and out," she said, adding, "We've been on the other side of that. We've had a lot of fortune and beat East Carolina and Holy Cross that way, where down the stretch all our shots fell and the opponents' didn't."

Dickson tore up the Catamount defense for 26 points with Grace (16 points) contributing in a supporting role and Miller (five blocks; 16 rebounds) lurking as a defensive problem for UVM.

"That No. 25 (Dickson) ... they had pro scouts in the stands, she's that good. She's remarkable; she made some shots that just take your breath away," Dawley said. "Britt Cross did a good job defensively on her; she had to work.

"Grace was remarkable as well and (Miller) had an enormous amount of blocked shots when we thought we had some easy post shots."

Dawley pointed to Andrea Cihal as having "moments

of brilliance" in the second half and Cross for "giving us everything she had," while Sara Fenton, like Cross, turned in a solid defensive game.

Courtney Pilypaitis led the Catamounts with 12 points. Sy Janousek added 11 and Cihal and Amy Rosenkrantz netted 10 each.

The Catamounts will face Northeastern in today's consolation game.

"We are excited to gut out a win on the road," said UVM head coach Sharon Dawley, whose team fell to South Florida in Thursday's opener.

The teams struggled to score early. With 8:19 gone in the first half UVM led 6-4.

A Courtney Pilypaitis layup 8:11 before the intermission gave the Catamounts a 12-11 edge, but the Huskies' Lucia Pablos scored six straight points as Northeastern (1-11) went on a 13-4 run to take a 24-18 halftime lead.

"Both teams were playing really hard. They played better defense," Dawley said of the first half.

In the opening minutes of the second half, May Kotsopoulos drilled back-to-back 3-pointers for UVM to knot the game at 24.

"That kind of ignited our offensive effort in the second half," Dawley said.

The Cats took the lead, 31-30, when Sara Fenton converted a three-point play with 13 minutes to go. Northeastern came back to tie it at 35 before UVM took control.

UVM held the Huskies to one field goal over the next seven minutes and opened up an 11-point lead behind five points from Amy Rosenkrantz and six from Pilypaitis.

The Catamounts held Northeastern to 25 percent shooting (8-for-32) in the second half and 28.3 percent for the game.

Pilypaitis posted her first collegiate double-double with 12 points and 12 rebounds for the Catamounts. Kotsopoulos and Rosenkrantz also finished with 12 points.

Pablos (19 points) was the only Husky to score in double digits. Kim Carr added nine points and 12 rebounds.

The University of Vermont women's basketball team wanted momentum heading into its America East Conference schedule, which starts Sunday.

The second half of the Catamounts' 75-56 win over Siena at Patrick Gymnasium on Monday afternoon was a perfect generator.

UVM turned a two-point halftime edge against the pesky Saints into a rout, inflating its record to 10-3 and surpassing its win total from last season.

Smooth-shooting freshman Courtney Pilypaitis racked up a career-high 22 points and sophomore post player Kelli Poles came off the bench with a purpose, jamming 10 points and six rebounds into 10 minutes of work.

"Our kids really put it together in the second half and I'm really proud of them for another gritty performance," said UVM coach Sharon Dawley, whose team travels to Boston University on Sunday.

Siena (2-10) played much better than its record during the opening minutes, knocking down eight of its first 10 shots. The Saints were up by 11 points midway through the first half, but UVM marched into intermission with an 11-2 run and a 29-27 lead.

As the Catamounts accelerated the pace of play in the second half, Pilypaitis and Poles kept the scoreboard operator busy.

Pilypaitis dropped in 17 of her points in the second half. She finished 3-for-6 from 3-point range, 9-for-12 from the foul line and played stout defense against Siena's top gun Laura Menty (team-high 18 points).

Poles jumped off the bench early in the second half when the outcome was still in doubt, pumping adrenaline into the Catamounts by crashing the boards for putbacks.

"Any time there's a huge play or a huge rebound like that, it gets you going, and that momentum carries the team right on through," Poles said.

Her coach expanded on the sentiment.

"You could really see when she scored her first bucket and ripped down her first board that the energy level went through the roof for us," Dawley said. "In our wins we've had someone step up to do something big when the game was on the line. That's what Kelli did today, as well as Courtney."

While Siena had four players account for just about all its offense, UVM received 26 points from its bench. And the Catamounts' suffocating defense forced 28 turnovers.

"I think our depth played a big role in the outcome," Dawley said. "We expected (Siena) to play well, we expected them to shoot well. It was just a matter of hitting our shots and playing a fast-paced game."

"When we play a halfcourt game we just aren't as good as when we play the 90 feet, so we have to control the tempo."

Which is precisely what the Cats did in the second half.

BOSTON -- The youth movement continues for the University of Vermont women's basketball team.

Sophomore Kelli Poles dominated inside with a career-high 22 points and 10 rebounds while freshmen May Kotsopoulos (17 points) and Courtney Pilypaitis (15 points, 11 assists) continued their strong play to lead the Catamounts to an 87-74 win over Boston University to kick off the America East Conference schedule.

It was the Cats' first win over the Terriers in four tries and improved UVM's record to 11-3 overall, the team's best start since 1990-91.

"I am really proud of the team to come out with another gritty performance," UVM coach Sharon Dawley said in a news release.

That was especially true of Poles, who came into the game averaging 3.8 points, 2.1 rebounds in 7.4 minutes, controlled the lane against the Terriers. The 6-foot-1 Poles made 9 of 12 shots from the field and 4 of 5 from the foul line.

"Kelli Poles was unstoppable on the block; Boston U could not defend her," Dawley said. "She continues to give us a spark off the bench."

UVM needed a spark after falling behind by 10 with 12:18 left in the first half. Poles got the rally going with a layup and hit another bucket to cut the lead to one with 7:54 remaining, then sophomore Sy Janousek hit a jumper to give the Cats a lead they would never relinquish.

Vermont led 40-36 at halftime and didn't give BU a chance to recover in the second half. The Cats shot 64 percent from the field while building their margin to as many as 20 against a team that has played in the league tournament title game four straight years.

Pilypaitis controlled the game from the point as she has done all season, handing out 11 assists while committing just two turnovers.

"Courtney once again showed how well-rounded she is and displayed her outstanding passing ability," Dawley said.

Kotsopoulos hit 2 of 3 3-point attempts and 7 of 14 from the field overall, sophomore Amy Rosenkrantz added 10 points and Sara Fenton and Janousek each added eight. Senior captain Brittney Cross was battling the flu and had just four points in 16 minutes.

"Sara Fenton was the unsung hero for us off the bench," Dawley said.

Katie Meinhardt scored 17 points and Erica Kovach added 15 points and seven rebounds for the Terriers (8-7, 0-2 America East).

The Cats return to action Wednesday when they play host to defending league champion Hartford at 7 p.m.

The University of Vermont women's basketball team erased any lingering doubts Wednesday night to just how good it is this season.

Three days after throttling Boston University on the road, the Catamounts bumped off the two-time defending America East Conference champion, snatching a 66-64 overtime win over Hartford at Patrick Gym.

A UVM team featuring four freshman and six sophomores improved to 12-3 and 2-0 in the conference, making last season's 9-18 clunker a distant memory.

"We had so much confidence already, but this was such a big boost," said UVM sophomore guard Sy Janousek, who nailed 4 of 5 3-pointers and scored 13 points. "Now we know we can play with all the big dogs."

The Hawks, who defeated Temple in the first round

of the NCAA tournament last year, dipped to 9-7 and 2-1 in the America East.

Freshman guard Courtney Pilypaitis piled up team highs of 16 points, eight rebounds and four assists. She scored five of UVM's overtime points, carving a path to the bucket in the closing seconds for a layup that slammed the door on a Hartford team that had previously won six straight against the Cats.

Just as much credit deserves to be sprinkled across the Vermont bench players who combined for 24 points.

As Vermont went scoreless over the final 5 minutes, 21 seconds of the first half, a talented Hartford bunch led by dominating post player Danielle Hood (22 points) and ultra-quick guard Ikea Witt (12 points) grabbed a 40-32 advantage early in the second half -- and control of the game.

That's when UVM coach Sharon Dawley turned to her bench, inserting Alison Brown, Sofia Iwobi, Alissa Sheftic, Sara Fenton and Janousek with one fell swoop. The unit sliced the Hartford lead to one point and set the stage for a thrilling finish.

"We always knew we were deep and we were going to depend on the depth," Dawley said. "I can't say I ever planned to sub in five, but it just had to be done. The kids on the bench were waiting for their time, and their time was today."

"They did an awesome job and really gave us life," said Pilypaitis, who has been a starter in every game. "The starting five really wanted to go back in there and continue it; we didn't want all their work to go to waste."

It didn't.

UVM senior captain Brittney Cross leveled the score at 58 when she took a pass from Kelli Poles and drove strong to the hoop for a layup with 28.3 seconds left in regulation.

Hood, a first-team conference all-star last year, hoisted a shot from the baseline during Hartford's next possession, but it bounced off the rim.

Vermont's first overtime game of the season ensued.

"I knew as soon as we brought it to overtime we were in great shape," Dawley said. "We had momentum and we were just getting into sync."

"It's a great, great win and a great experience, especially having such a young ballclub."

A young club that is the lone undefeated team in the America East.

The University of Vermont women's basketball team was on the brink of its first America East Conference loss of the season Sunday afternoon at Patrick Gymnasium.

Then a pair of freshmen bailed out the Catamounts. Courtney Pilypaitis and May Kotsopoulos were the driving forces of Vermont's 21-0 run midway through the second half against Maine, which erased a nine-point deficit and propelled the Cats to a 71-57 win.

Vermont improved to 13-3 and remains atop the America East standings at 3-0 after brushing off a sluggish start to surge past Maine (8-7 overall, 2-2 AE) in front of the largest Patrick Gym crowd of the season, 1,079.

"With this group, it's never over till it's over," said UVM head coach Sharon Dawley, whose team trailed 32-25 at halftime and 50-41 with 9 minutes, 4 seconds remaining in the game.

Especially with a pair of unflappable rookies.

Pilypaitis and Kotsopoulos combined for four 3-pointers and 19 points during the 21-0 blitz. When the smoke cleared the Cats had their fifth consecutive victory and ninth in 10 games.

Pilypaitis misfired on eight of her first nine shots and had only three points at halftime, but the 6-foot guard erupted in the second half, finishing with 20 points and six rebounds. Kotsopoulos contributed 15 points and non-stop hustle on the defensive end. "They definitely aren't scared of anything," Dawley said. "That's what's going to make them great. Great shooters don't worry about if they missed in the past; they just keep shooting."

"I'm impressed with these freshmen, I really am," Dawley added. "They just get tougher as we go." Maine senior forward Bracey Barker picked up 16 points on 6-of-8 shooting, but UVM contained sharp-shooting senior guard Ashley Underwood to 11 points.

Vermont was out of sync in the first half, connecting on just 9 of 29 shots while committing 10 turnovers. Dawley was more concerned about her team's inspired defense through the first 20 minutes.

"We were definitely missing a lot of easy shots, but we thought the defensive intensity wasn't there," Dawley said. "Win or lose we want to make sure we go down playing defense at 110 percent. That's what we did at the end of the game and it made a huge difference."

Kotsopoulos agreed.

"I think the reason that we won is that we just focussed on defense," she said. "We made our stops on defense and offense just comes with it."

Freshmen Courtney Pilypaitis (13.9 ppg, 5.4 rpg) and May Kotsopoulos (10.9 ppg) lead a team that also has two sophomore starters.

Pilypaitis is a 6-0 point guard who typically defends the opponents' best post player; Kotsopoulos is a 5-10 shooting guard who guards the opposing point. During their four years on the varsity basketball team at Corona del Sol High, the backcourt of Amy Rosenkrantz and Sy Janousek created fits for opponents.

Rosenkrantz and Janousek continue that as sophomores at the University of Vermont.

Rosenkrantz was averaging nine points and nearly five rebounds; Janousek almost eight points and shooting just over 45 percent from three-point range for Vermont (13-5 overall, 3-2 America East Conference).

"I know exactly where Sy is going to be on the court," said Rosenkrantz, who averaged 14.5 points, 6.8 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 3.0 steals as a Corona senior. "It's kind of second nature. We're just trying to form that same chemistry . . . with the rest of the team."

Rosenkrantz and Janousek are among 34 former Southeast Valley high school players on NCAA Division I basketball rosters. Eighteen are from Tempe/Ahwatukee Foothills. Of the 34, only Rosenkrantz and Janousek are on the same team.

They first played together at Kyrene Middle School. That bond only strengthened as freshmen at Corona on a team that lost to Central Region rival Mountain Pointe in the Class 5A state championship game.

"It was definitely an amazing time in our lives and we will always look back on it," said Janousek, who averaged 16.6 points, 5.9 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 2.9 steals during her senior season. "It will also be awesome to look back in 5, 10, 20 years and remember this time at Vermont."

Just how did two Arizona natives end up at a school across the country?

On a recruiting visit, Rosenkrantz said she told Vermont coach Sharon Dawley about Janousek after hearing Dawley mention the team's need for another guard.

"Things just unfolded from there," Rosenkrantz said. "I think if we would have tried to make it happen, it wouldn't have worked out. . . . Not many people get to play with their best friend."

CATS' CHARGE DEFEATS BEARS

ORONO, Maine -- The University of Vermont women's basketball team staggered into Tuesday night's game against Maine and got off to a slow start, trailing by as many as 11 points in the early minutes of the second half.

The Catamounts answered with what coach Sharon Dawley labeled as perhaps her team's best 15-minute stretch of basketball this season, powering to an 80-74 victory at chilly Alford Arena to halt a two-game losing streak and jump up to third place in the America East Conference.

Senior guard Brittney Cross uncorked one of the best games of her career, racking up 21 points, five assists and seven steals, two shy of the school record.

"Britt took this game over," Dawley said. "She was playing hard from start to finish and wanted the ball."

Sophomore Amy Rosenkrantz added 19 points and freshman May Kotsopoulos scored 16 for the

Catamounts (16-8, 6-5), who completed a season sweep of Maine (12-10, 6-5) and leapfrogged the Black Bears in the standings.

Vermont was coming off two of their worst shooting performances of the winter. The Cats shot 27 percent in a loss to Boston University at home last week and followed with a 25-percent effort in a defeat to two-time defending champion Hartford over the weekend. It looked like they were headed down the same path against Maine when they fell into a 45-39 halftime hole and trailed by 11 with 16:29 remaining in the game.

"Instead of caving this team fought back," Dawley said. "We had six huge defensive stops. We made some big, big buckets when we needed to. And everyone, especially the younger players, were showing so much confidence."

Freshman Courtney Pilypaitis scored 11 points and Andrea Cihal and Alissa Sheftic pulled down five rebounds apiece for the Catamounts, who controlled the boards by a 35-28 margin.

The Catamounts hit 29 of their 60 shots (48.3 percent), a sizeable improvement from their previous two outings.

"We really got back to the pace that we needed to play," said Dawley, whose team plays host to Binghamton on Saturday. "Lot of baseball passes to the other end of the floor, lots of layups; it was the open floor that got us the win."

DURHAM - As Durham's Brittney Cross went to the free-throw line at Lundholm Gymnasium Wednesday night with a chance to win the game for the University of Vermont women's basketball team, she found herself in a familiar place.

"It was a funny feeling," Cross said. "The first thing that went through my mind was, 'How many shots have you taken at this hoop?' Thousands. Growing up here, this is where I would shoot with my dad, at camps, everything. That popped up in my head, but I just cleared my mind and made them."

Cross's free throws gave UVM its first lead of the night, 56-54 with 23 seconds to play against the University of New Hampshire. With three seconds remaining, the former Oyster River High School standout found herself at the line again with a chance to make it a two-possession game. She hit the first and missed the second, but the Catamounts held on for the win. It was the first time Cross had beaten UNH in four trips to her hometown in a Vermont uniform.

"I was anxious to play in my last game here," said Cross, a Catamount co-captain. "But I always look forward to it. Not many college players get to come back to their home town every year. I like to see my friends and family, and for them to see me with my Vermont family."

Despite the storybook ending to Cross's career - at least as far as games in New Hampshire are concerned - her final homecoming did not get off to a great start. Cross, who came into the night averaging just under 10 points a game, went 0 for 7 shooting in the first half. When she finally got on the board - on a jumper with 11:19 to play in the game that cut UNH's lead to 45-42 - she made a noticeable fist-pump.

"It was a lot of relief," Cross said. "I've been getting into that funk, staying in the perimeter too long."

In high school, Cross led the Bobcats to a 25-0

record and a Class I championship in 2003, and was Foster's Daily Democrat's Dream Team Player of the Year. In college, she was team MVP last season and was named to the America East Academic Honor Roll three times. Coming into Wednesday's game, she is eighth all-time for career steals at UVM with 177, and fifth all-time in free-throw percentage with .784.

"Since her first game as a freshman, she's been a leader," UVM coach Sharon Dawley said. "She'll out-work and out-think everybody. And I think it was fitting that she made the free throws tonight to clinch it. We've struggled here in her career. There was a time we didn't have enough talent (around) Brittney, but she's been instrumental in (nurturing) the younger kids. Whatever Britt says, goes."

A large throng of Vermont fans sat behind the Catamounts' bench at Lundholm on Wednesday night, a large portion of them there to see Cross play in Durham one last time as a collegian. That crowd included Cross's mother Robin, sister Kelsey, former high school coach Dave Nichols, and former teammate Sam Brown.

"It's bittersweet knowing that this is her last game," Robin Cross said. "It means a lot to us for her to be playing at home. But it's still a game for her, one she wants to win."

Robin Cross said that the previous night was the first time she saw Brittney express sadness that the end of her college basketball career was rapidly approaching.

"I have lots of pride watching her play," Nichols said. "She plays such great defense, she's always in the right place. I think back to the steals she made for us, and her leadership. And we're seeing that tonight. It's sad to see it come to an end."

Kelsey Cross, who won a Class I title with Oyster River in 2006 and has spent her life watching her big sister play, was as excited as ever to watch the action unfold on Wednesday, with Brittney right in the middle of it.
