The Bearcats and Retrievers split last year's regular season games with the home teams winning each time... UMBC is playing their second consecutive home game... Binghamton junior Laura Franceski is averaging a conference-best 11 rebounds per league game.

* Albany at Vermont

7 p.m.

After two road games to open the conference schedule, the Catamounts begin a four-game homestand against Albany... Both teams have sophomores producing the most points per game: Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (14.2) and Albany's Britney McGee (11.3).

* Hartford at New Hampshire

7 p.m.

The Hawks won both contests last year by just a combined 10 points... The Wildcats are the top three-point shooting team in the conference at 36.1% and will be matched-up with the Hawks who allow an average three-point shooting percentage of 31.6.

* Maine at Stony Brook

Two first year head coaches, Cindy Blodgett and Michele Cherry, play each other for the first time this season... Aly Young is averaging a team-best 10.8 ppg for the Seawolves, while the Black Bears rely on freshman Tanna Ross (9.9 ppg) and sophomore Brittany Boser (9.7 ppg).

Maine's high scorer was freshman Tanna Ross who scored a game-high 22 points... Sophomore Black Bear Sandra Vaitkute brought down 11 rebounds to lead the team on the glass.

The Hawks held on to a 13-point halftime lead to pick up their first league win... Sophomore Diana Delva led Hartford in scoring, 19 points, for the second straight game... Sophomore Erica Beverly recorded a double-double with 16 points and 12 rebounds... Sophomore guard Courtney Pilypaitis hit a team-high 17 points for the Catamounts... Vermont won the battle on the boards, 42-38, led by Alissa Shectic's eight rebounds.

* at Binghamton 59, Boston University 55

Junior Laura Franceski recorded a double double with 12 points and 11 rebounds, and also added four blocks, three steals and an assist for Binghamton... Bearcat Erica Carter posted a game-high 14 points... For the Terriers, junior Jesika Burks-Wiley was held to 11 points and seven rebounds, while junior Christine Kinneary scored 11 points to go along with five helpers.

* at UMBC 61, Stony Brook 56

Sophomore Carlee Cassidy and senior Kristin Drabyn combined for 36 points for the Retrievers in their first conference win since capturing the league championship in 2007... UMBC hit 14 of 15 free throws, including five in the final 1:04 to hang on for the win... Dana Ferraro, Kirsten Jeter and Kairsten Nunn each reached double-digit points for the Seawolves, and both Ferraro and Jeter also finished with nine boards.

DELVA LEADS HAWKS OVER CATAMOUNTS

The America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week Diana Delva (Stamford, Conn./Westhill) led the Hawks with a season-high 19 points to lead all players in a win over Vermont on Sunday. Delva finished the game shooting 8-of-10 from the field to extend her hot hand in conference play to 12-of-16 from the floor. Delva also finished the game with a 3-of-5 effort at the free throw line while adding six rebounds, a block and a steal to her credit. Delva is averaging 10.2 points per game on the season, and 16.5 points per game in conference play, the best mark for the Hawks and third in the conference. She also leads the team in rebounding for the season at 6.8 boards per game. This is the second weekly honor for Delva this year, as she received co-honors for the week of December 9.

COLABELLA DOES EVERYTHING RIGHT IN START

UMBC's Meghan Colabella (Montclair, N.J./Montclair) is the recipient of the Rookie of the Week after she scored eight points, one shy of her career high, and posted a career-best nine rebounds in the Retrievers' 61-58 victory over Stony Brook. Colabella made her second career start against the Seawolves and played a career-high 35 minutes. She made the best of that start, sinking all four of her free throw attempts, dishing out two assists and also posting a block and a steal. It is Colabella's first rookie honor.

HONOR ROLL

Others around the conference also put in solid performances last week. UMBC's Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) notched 19 points, including two three-pointers, to go along with four rebounds in the Retrievers' victory over Stony Brook at home... Also on Saturday, Boston University's Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) scored nine points in the final five points against Binghamton to finish with 11 points. Kinneary, the conference leader in assists, added five assists to her boxscore... Earlier in the week against Dartmouth, New Hampshire's Candace Williams (Norfolk, Mass./St. Raphael's) earned her third double-double of the season with 14 rebounds and 14 points... Senior Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) led the way in Albany's first victory over Maine since joining the conference in 2001, recording 10 points, eight rebounds, four blocks, three steals and two assists... From the other bench, Maine's Tanna Ross (Newburgh, Maine/Hampden Academy) scored 22 points for her second 20-plus point performance this season.

THE REPORT IS IN

In the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com released on Monday, January 14, both of the top two teams in the conference standings moved up big time. Binghamton (233), who defeated Boston University on Saturday, moved up 41 spots, while Albany (292), currently on a three-game win streak and is 2-0 in conference play, moved up 21 steps. Hartford (26) remains the highest ranked America East team RPI-wise.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

After Sunday night's victory over Vermont, Hartford extended its home-court win streak to 16 games. That streak ranks third in the NCAA only behind Duke (23 games) and Jacksonville (17). The Hawks will be tested again at Chase Arena on Tuesday, January 22 when Binghamton visits.

REPLAY IT AGAIN

Two of the four conference games last week were streamed live at AmericaEast.com and are now available in the on demand section of the America East Zone online. So far this season, two player of the week performances have been captured live on the America East web streams. At least 11 more women's basketball games will be streamed live at AmericaEast.com, including six more Pack-Casts produced by Pack Network and available exclusively at the conference's web site.

ALL IN THE STATS

In the latest national statistics generated by the NCAA on Friday, January 11, several America East teams and players are ranking in the nation's top 25. Boston University is fifth in free-throw percentage (80.3), 13th in turnovers per game (14.4), and 17th in assist turnover ratio (1.05). Hartford is 15th in the country at not turning the ball over to opponents, doing so just 14.5 times per game. UMBC averages 7.4 three-pointers per game for 18th-best. Individually, Boston U.'s Christine Kinneary (7.2 assists) and Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (5.4) rank fifth and 23rd, respectively, in assists, and Kinneary also ranks 16th with a 2.24 assist turnover ratio. Laura Sario's 89.5% free-throw shooting for Binghamton also ranks her 11th in the NCAA.

BALL THIEVES

Teams better be careful to hang on to the ball tight while playing Albany, the team with a conference-best 11.80 steals per game to their name. In fifteen games this season, the Great Danes have stolen the ball away from opponents 177 times. Five different players rank in the conference's top fifteen in steals, including senior Gia Sanders in a tie at fourth averaging 1.93 steals per game. Senior Kristin Higley (1.87), sophomores TaNika Thrower (1.80), Charity Iromuanya (1.40) and Britney McGee (1.40) also rank on that list.

TWICE AS NICE

Hartford became the first America East team to knock off a ranked opponent this season with its 54-51 victory at home against #24 Michigan State on Saturday, December 22. MSU's arrival in West Hartford marked the second game in two years that a ranked opponent has played Hartford at the Reich Family Pavilion. The first team to do so was 22nd-ranked Brigham Young on December 2, 2006, who the Hawks defeated, 60-43. Hartford is now 2-0 against ranked opponents at home. Not only did the Hawks crack the Spartans, but they also got to 6'9" Wade Trophy Watch List candidate Allyssa DeHaan who they held to 13 points and 3 rebounds, both under the sophomore's averages. The victory doubled the votes the Hawks received in the national coaches' poll the following week where they had the 26th most votes.

200 CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday, December 16 when the Catamounts defeated Harvard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley reached 200 wins through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Associate Head Coach under Chris Wiegus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

TERRIER THREAT

The Terriers have a conference-best five players in the America East top-30 scorers this season, including four in the top-25. The Boston University scoring threat is producing 66.9 points per game, tops in the league.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniace (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters were played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiving 7 votes in the most recent coaches' poll released on January 8, 2008. The next coaches' poll will be released on Tuesday, January 15.

TV TIME

ESPN will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports

New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on

Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East. The event, which is now known as the America East Women's Basketball Championship Presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese, will be held at the 3,977-seat Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. It is the sixth time in the last seven years that Friendship Cottage Cheese has served as the title sponsor. Friendship Cottage Cheese has sponsored each of the championships played in Hartford since 2002.

ALBANY GREAT DANES (4-11, 2-0 AE)

UALbany won its third straight game with a 78-46 win over Maine at home on Sunday afternoon... The victory marks the first for the Great Danes over the Black Bears in 15 tries... It was the first

time UAlbany has won consecutive America East contests since the 2004-05 season, and gave the Great Danes a three game win streak for the first time since 04-05... The win also gives the Great Danes a 2-0 conference record for the first time since joining the America East in 2001... The 32-point victory was the largest America East win margin for UAlbany since an 81-60 win over Stony Brook in 2005... Sophomore guard TaNika Thrower (Houston, Texas/Northbrook) led the Great Danes with 17 points on 6-of-9 shooting from the floor, including going 3-of-4 from behind the 3-point arc... Thrower added four steals and three assists... Sophomore guard Britney McGee (Bakersfield, Calif./West) added 15 points and a game-high five assists... Sophomore Charity Iromuanya (Lincoln, Neb./Lincoln Northeast) added 11 points while senior forwards Kristin Higy (Akron, Ohio/North Canton Hoover) and Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) added 10 points apiece... Sanders produced the most complete game for the Great Danes, recording a team-high eight rebounds, four blocks, three steals and two assists in 29 minutes of action... UAlbany shot 45.6-percent (26-57) from the floor, while holding Maine to 28.3-percent (13-46), a season low for a Great Dane opponent this season... The Great Danes will look to keep their conference record perfect on Wednesday, Jan. 16, visiting Vermont at 7 p.m.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (3-11, 1-0 AE)

Senior guard Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Tapiola/Lonko) and senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 47) continue to climb up the all time Binghamton scoring charts. Kurpniece ranks 10th all time with 970 career points. She needs 30 points to become the 10th player in school history, and third on the Division I level, to reach the 1,000-point mark. Sario, meanwhile currently ranks 12th with 932 career points. She needs 22 points to tie Alicia Koppenhoefer for 11th place all time ... For the third consecutive season, Binghamton is ranked first in the America East Conference in both rebounding defense and rebounding margin. The Bearcats have allowed a conference-low 34.6 rebounds per game and have a rebounding margin of +1.5 ... Binghamton has three players currently averaging double figures in scoring. Senior center Kurpniece leads the squad with 11.9 points while junior forward Laura Franceski (Moscow, Pa./North Pocono) is averaging 11.2 points and Sario has 10.5 point per game. The last time three Binghamton players finished the season averaging double figures in scoring came during the 2005-06. There have been five other instances (twice at the Division III level and three times at the Division II level) where three players have averaged double figures in scoring.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS (8-7, 1-1 AE)

Junior Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) scored nine points in the final five minutes and classmate Kristi Dini (Putnam Valley, N.Y./Putnam Valley) nailed a long trey with two minutes remaining to give the Boston University women's basketball team a one-point lead, however, it was not enough as Binghamton came back to win, 59-55, at the Events Center on Saturday afternoon... The Terriers fell to 8-7 overall and 1-1 in AE play... BU featured three players in double figures, with sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) leading with 12 points and six rebounds... She was followed by junior Jesyka Burks-Wiley (Kansas City, Mo./Lincoln College Prep) and Kinneary with 11 apiece... Kinneary earned America

East Player of the Game honors for her efforts down the stretch... She dished out five assists, collected five rebounds and scored nine of the Terriers final 14 points... In a game that saw 12 lead changes - including four in the final 2:22 - BU was out-rebounded, 46-33, and Binghamton held the 20-14 advantage in second-chance points... The Terriers did capitalize on 16 Bearcat miscues, posting 17 points off turnovers. BU shot 33.3 percent for the game.

HARTFORD HAWKS (11-4, 1-1 AE)

Hartford had eight days between conference games but came out hot in the first half against Vermont, using a 13-point advantage to win, 67-58, over Vermont on Sunday at Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. The Hawks were led by America East Player of the Week forward/center Diana Delva (Stratford, Conn./Westhill) who finished with a season-high 19 points on 8-of-10 from the field and 3-of-5 at the free throw line. Delva has led the Hawks in scoring in both conference games and is averaging 16.5 points in the first two conference outings. She is also shooting 12-of-16 (.750) in conference play. Joining Delva in double figures against Vermont was Erica Beverly (Bridgeport, Conn./Kolbe Cathedral) who finished with her second double double of the season and first double digit scoring game since December 1. Beverly finished with 16 points and 12 rebounds. She is averaging a double double in conference play at 10.5 points and 10 boards.
