Rhode Island 56, Stony Brook 55 ³

A Rams layup with 20 seconds left in the game gave Rhode Island the victory... Rookie Kirsten Jeter led the Seawolves with 14 points and four rebounds.

St. Bonaventure 71, at Binghamton 65

Senior center Laine Kurpniece, the America East Player of the Game scored a team-high 20 points and pulled down seven rebounds... Junior Laura Franceski canned a career-high 19 points while blocking five shots, tied for a league game high.

Maine 55, at Miami (Fla.) 54 ⁴

It is the second time in two years that Maine has defeated an ACC team in a regular season tournament... Freshmen Emily Rousseau posted a team-high 12 points, two assists and a block.

Connecticut 70, Hartford 24 (CPTV)

The 24 points is the lowest scoring output in the history of the Hawks program... Senior Jamie McCabe finished with a team-high nine points... The Huskies have only been held to 70 or fewer points one other time this season.

CASSIDY NOTCHES THIRD PLAYER OF THE WEEK

UMBC sophomore guard Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) received her third America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week award for games played through December 30. Cassidy averaged 22.5 points per game to raise her season average to a conference-best 16.7 ppg. She also shot 48.6% (17-of-35) from the floor, including 42.1% (8-of-19) from long distance, in two contests last week, and was named to the Terrapin Classic All-Tournament Team. Cassidy scored a team-high 21 points against Richmond with 14 coming in the second half. Then against #5 Maryland, Cassidy led all scorers with 24 points, one shy of tying her career high. She finished with five trifectas in the game to go along with a career-best nine field goals. In the last six games, Cassidy is averaging 20.0 ppg.

ROUSSEAU STELLAR IN MIAMI

Emily Rousseau (Biddeford, Maine/Biddeford), a freshman guard at Maine, earned Rookie of the Week honors. Rousseau was named to the Miami Hurricane Holiday Classic All-Tournament Team after averaging 14.0 ppg through two games. The rookie poured in a game-high 16 points versus Toledo in the tournament championship, and had a team-high 12 points in the win over ACC-foe Miami. For the Tournament, Rousseau shot 40% from beyond the three-point arc and 39.3% from the field. This is her first career weekly award.

THE REPORT IS IN

In the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com, Hartford and Boston University are the top two teams from the conference at 17 and 114. Vermont (128), UMBC (240), and Stony Brook (243) all follow in the top-250. UMBC was the biggest mover this week, up 28 spots, primarily due to a tough schedule against Richmond (73) and Maryland (6).

LET THE CONFERENCE SEASON BEGIN

If the season were actually broken up into two different seasons, the second season would begin this week with conference play. The conference slate begins Saturday, January 5 with Albany at New Hampshire and Hartford at Boston University, each at 1 p.m. Vermont at Stony Brook and UMBC at Maine will follow later in the day at 2 p.m. and 7 p.m., respectively. The game at Alford Arena will be broadcast regionally on WABI, while the Hawks-Terriers match-up will be streamed live at AmericaEast.com.

ALL IN THE STATS

The NCAA will release national Division I statistical rankings each Monday and Friday throughout the rest of the season beginning on January 4. In the most up to date report posted on December 17, America East teams are making their mark. Boston U. ranks fourth in free-throw percentage, sixth in turnovers per game, and 13th in assist-to-turnover ratio. Stony Brook ranks 12th in the country with 6.0 blocks per game, and Hartford is 10th-best in turnovers per game. Meanwhile in the individual ranks, Boston U.'s Christine Kinneary is 10th in assists per game and 21st in assist-to-turnover ratio. Stony Brook's Morgan Patrick is 17th in blocks per game, and Terrier Aly Hinton is fourth with a near-perfect free-throw percentage of 96.6%.

NEW LEADER OF THE PACK

Earlier this week, UMBC's Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) became the leading scorer in the conference for the first time this season with

21 and 24 point performances against Richmond and #5 University of Maryland. The sophomore guard is averaging 16.7 points per game, nearly a whole point more than Hartford's Danielle Hood.

TWICE AS NICE

Hartford became the first America East team to knock off a ranked opponent this season with its 54-51 victory at home against #24 Michigan State on Saturday, December 22. MSU's arrival in West Hartford marked the second game in two years that a ranked opponent has played Hartford at the Reich Family Pavilion. The first team to do so was 22nd-ranked Brigham Young on December 2, 2006, who the Hawks defeated, 60-43. Hartford is now 2-0 against ranked opponents at home. Not only did the Hawks crack the Spartans, but they also got to 6'9" Wade Trophy Watch List candidate Allyssa DeHaan who they held to 13 points and 3 rebounds, both under the sophomore's averages. The victory doubled the votes the Hawks received in the national coaches' poll the following week where they had the 26th most votes.

200 CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday, December 16 when the Catamounts defeated Harvard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley reached 200 wins through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Associate Head Coach under Chris Wiegus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

TERRIER THREAT

The Terriers have a conference-best five players in the America East top-30 scorers this season, including four in the top-25. The Boston University scoring threat is producing 68.2 points per game, tops in the league.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite

to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Al-

bany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters were played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiving 46 votes in the most recent poll released on December 26, the 26th most votes in the nation.

TV TIME

ESPNU will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two

America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are

slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East. The event, which is now known as the America East Women's Basketball Championship Presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese, will be held at the 3,977-seat Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. It is the sixth time in the last seven years that Friendship Cottage Cheese has served as the title sponsor. Friendship Cottage Cheese has sponsored each of the championships played in Hartford since 2002.

"We are excited to again partner with Friendship Cottage Cheese for the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at Hartford," said Nero. "Friendship's support helps us continue to present our premier event in a fashion consistent with the high-quality of play on the court. ALBANY GREAT DANES (2-11)

UAlbany broke a nine-game skid on Saturday, Dec. 28, defeating St. Francis (NY), 70-63, in the final non-conference game of the season... Senior forward Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) led the Great Danes with her third double-double of the season, scoring 18 points and grabbing 11 rebounds... Sanders, who also finished with four steals, three blocks and two assists, recorded her 500th career rebound in the contest... Sophomore Britney McGee (Bakersfield, Calif./West) also scored 18 points in the game... McGee has reached double-figure scoring totals in the last five games, averaging 16.8 points per game in that stretch... The Great Danes also received 11 points, four steals and two assists from sophomore Charity Iromuanya (Lincoln, Neb./Lincoln Northeast)... Sanders and classmate Sherri Mikus (Duncannon, Pa./Susquehanna) played in their 100th career game for UAlbany against St. Francis... Both Sanders and Mikus have made impacts on the Great Dane program in their four seasons... Sanders is ranked fourth on UAlbany's career blocks chart with 122 and currently stands 13th on the career rebounds chart (506), while Mikus is tied for 14th on the career assists chart (199)... The Great Danes kick off the New Year and conference play on Saturday, traveling to New Hampshire for a 1 p.m. game.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (2-10)

Senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 47) has scored 22 and 20 points in her last two games. She is the first Binghamton player to reach the 20-point mark in back-to-back games since Rachel Laws had four consecutive games from Dec. 7-30, 2004. Kurpniece continues to rank 11th all-time in program history with 948 career points. She is six points away from tying Alicia Koppelhoef (1994-98) for 10th place all time with 954 career points. Kurpniece has reached 20 points four times this season and 11 times during her career... Senior guard Laura Sario currently has 921 career points and is in 13th place all time. She needs two points to



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tie Reagan Stevens (1993-97) for 12th place all time ... Junior forward Laura Franceski (Moscow, Pa./North Pocono) scored a career-high 19 points and blocked five shots against St. Bonaventure on Dec. 30. She has now blocked at least five shots five times in her career ... Binghamton has three players averaging double figures in scoring (Kurpniece with 12.0, Sario with 11.3 and Franceski with 10.9). The last time Binghamton finished a season with three players in double figures was during the 2005-06 season (Kurpniece with 12.3 points, Laws with 11.6 points and Jen Blues with 10.1 points).

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS (7-6)

Boston University played three games in four days after a 16-day layoff during the holidays... The Terriers returned to the court with a convincing 70-53 win over Georgia Southern on the first day of the VCU SportsCenter Holiday Classic in Richmond, Va... Boston U. was backed by junior Cheri Raffo's (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterdon) 16-point performance and sophomore Aly Hinton's (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) 14 points... Junior Jesyka Burks-Wiley (Kansas City, Mo./Lincoln College Prep) also scored in double figures with 10 points, while classmate Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) dished out a game-high 13 assists. The following day, Burks-Wiley paced the team with 20 points, however, the Terriers fell to host-school VCU, 76-65, in the championship game of the tourney... Burks-Wiley was 9-for-18 and pulled down nine boards to earn all-tournament team honors, while junior Kinneary was named to the team after dishing out 17 assists over two games. Kinneary put in another 40 minutes against VCU and posted seven points and five rebounds. Raffo and junior Amarachi Umez-Eronini (Washington, D.C./Woodrow Wilson) each posted 11 points, while Umez-Eronini handed out six assists... After a month spent entirely on the road, the Terriers closed out their non-conference schedule with a 71-57 loss to Kansas on Dec. 30 in Lawrence, Kan... Burks-Wiley posted 20 points for the second-consecutive game... Playing just 30 minutes from her hometown of Kansas City, Mo., Burks-Wiley posted her 10th double-figure scoring game and fourth consecutive on 9-for-17 shooting from the field... The junior forward was 2-for-3 from three-point range and brought down nine boards.

HARTFORD HAWKS (10-3)

Hartford will enter the conference portion of the season with the same amount of wins they had entering the conference season in 2005-06, the season the Hawks defeated Temple in the first round of the NCAA Tournament. However, this season the Hawks have one more loss, the latest coming against #1 Connecticut, 70-24, in the final non-conference game of the season... Despite that loss, the Hawks have decisive wins over Brigham Young, Virginia (at the Hawaii Tournament), St. John's and #23 Michigan State... So far this season, the Hawks are led by senior forward/center Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) who is averaging 15.8 points-per-game, second in the America East. Sophomore Diana Delva (Stamford, Conn./Westhill) is second on the team in scoring at 9.2 ppg, while leading the team with an average of 6.8 rebounds per game. She also leads the way with 11 blocks. Juniors MaryLynne Schaefer (Centreville, Va./Westfield) and Lisa Etienne (Norwalk, Conn./Brien McMahon) are leading the team in assists with 28 each. Schaefer also set a milestone during the non-conference season becoming the all-time leading three-point

shooter in school history with her fourth make in the first half against Virginia. She currently has 23 three pointers and is shooting 38 percent from long range. Delva leads the team and the conference in field goal percentage (55 percent, 46-of-84).

MAINE BLACK BEARS (3-10)

Maine split its two games this past weekend ... The Black Bears advanced to the final of the Hurricane Holiday Classic with a 54-53 win over host-school and ACC-foe Miami on Saturday night ... However, Maine dropped a tough 61-57 decision to Toledo in the title game on Sunday night ... Rookie of the Week Emily Rousseau (Biddeford, Maine/Biddeford) and sophomore backcourt mate Amanda Tewksbury (Clinton, N.J./North Hunterdon) were named to the all-tournament team ... Rousseau averaged 14.0 points per game in the tournament, including a game-high 16 points versus the Rockets ... She also tossed in a team-best 12 points in the win over the Hurricanes ... Tewksbury posted a 12.0 points per game average, including 13 versus Toledo ... Maine's win over Miami marked the second-straight season the Black Bears defeated a team from the ACC ... The Black Bears turned the trick last season with an 80-78 win over Clemson ... Maine was facing an ACC opponent for the third time this season and for the second-straight game ... Maine defeated an ACC team for just the third time in program history ...
