Tuesday, January 22

*** UMBC at Albany 7 p.m.**

The Great Danes won last year's contest at SEFCU Arena, 70-51... Sophomore Britney McGee paces the Albany offense with 11.4 points per game, while UMBC sophomore Carlee Cassidy continues to lead the league with 17.4 points per game and six 20-point performances this season.... Albany senior Gia Sanders has averaged 11.8 points and 5.8 rebounds in the last six games.

*** Binghamton at Hartford (CSN/WIVT) 7:30 p.m.**

Binghamton senior Laine Kurpniece has 998 career points, and will likely score the two points needed to reach the 1,000 milestone... Hartford's Danielle Hood entered the season with 1,145 points and is the only active America East player in four figure scoring... Both teams have a three-game winning streak to their name.

Wednesday, January 23

*** New Hampshire at Vermont 7 p.m.**

The Catamounts swept the season series last year... Both teams have sophomores leading the offense; Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis is fourth in the league with 14.4 ppg, while New Hampshire's Amy Simpson is sixth with 12.6 ppg.... Pilypaitis is averaging 8.0 assists in the last two games.

*** Boston University at Maine 7:30 p.m.**

The Black Bears came out victorious by five points the last time the Terriers made the trek to Orono... Freshman Tanna Ross and sophomore Brittany Boser are Maine's 1-2 punch with 9.6 and 9.4 ppg, respectively... Boston U. junior Christine Kinneary leads the conference in minutes per game (38.06), assists (7.25), and assist to turnover ratio (2.47).

*** Hartford 56, at Maine 38**

Senior Danielle Hood led the Hawks with 15 points and also added four assists and three steals... Hartford forced 27 Black Bear turnovers while robbing the ball 11 times... Sophomore Amanda Tewksbury scored Maine's team-high 11 points and brought down 10 rebounds... The Black Bears could only muster 21.4% shooting in the second half.

*** at Binghamton 82, New Hampshire 74**

Binghamton senior Laura Sario broke out for 20 points and six assists, including 5-for-5 three-point shooting... Classmate Laine Kurpniece shot 5-for-6 from the field and 6-for-6 at the charity stripe for 16 points... For the Wildcats, sophomore Amy Simpson, freshman Denise Beliveau and senior Ashley Cerniglia notched 19, 18, and 17 points, respectively.

FRANCESKI TOPS LEAGUE LAST WEEK

Binghamton junior forward Laura Franceski (Moscow, Pa./North Pocono 15) earned the America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week for the week ending January 20. Franceski was the top Binghamton scorer during the week as Binghamton gained a pair of wins to move to 3-0 in conference play. She poured in a career-high 27 points in the Bearcats' 65-58 road win at UMBC. Franceski also added four rebounds, a season-high six blocks and three steals. For the week, Franceski finished with 10 blocks, 1.5 steals per game, and shot a blazing 75% from the field on 12-of-16 shooting. Currently, the junior ranks eighth in America East with 12.0 ppg, and first with 2.5 blocks per game. Franceski is the first Bearcat honored with a weekly award this season.

ROOKIE YOUNG GIVES CATAMOUNTS A HAND

Vermont forward Tonya Young (Canaan, N.H./Mascoma Valley Regional) received the conference's Rookie of the Week for her part in the Catamounts' 2-0 record last week. Young scored 14 points, one shy of her career high, on 6-for-9 shooting and added four rebounds in the win over Albany. She also added five points and five rebounds in 13 minutes versus UMBC. For the week, Young averaged 9.5 ppg, 4.5 rpg and shot 50% from the floor. This is the second time Young has been honored by the conference.

HONOR ROLL

Also putting in an excellent performance last week was Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter). The sophomore guard averaged 15.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and 8.0 assists per game in two wins against Albany and UMBC... Albany's Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) (11 points, 11 rebounds) and Boston U.'s Jesyka Burks-Wiley (Kansas City, Mo./Lincoln College Prep) (17 points, 12 rebounds) both notched double-doubles in their teams' only games last week. Sanders also added seven blocks, two assists and two steals... Hartford forward Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) led the Hawks to a pair of conference road wins last week with 16.0 ppg on 63.6% shooting.

THE REPORT IS IN

In the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com released on Monday, January 21, last week's winners moved up as a general rule. Vermont, Binghamton and Boston University each went undefeated last week in conference play and moved up nine, seven and four steps, respectively. Hartford, who continues to have the highest RPI rank in the conference (38), went 2-0 last week, but still dipped 12 points in the rankings.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

After last Sunday night's victory over Vermont, Hartford extended its home-court win streak to 16 games. That streak ranks fourth in the NCAA only behind Duke (23 games), Old Dominion (18) and Jacksonville (17). The Hawks will be tested again at Chase Arena this Tuesday, January 22 when Binghamton visits for a televised match-up.

MILESTONE WATCH

Binghamton senior Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47) is just two points shy of her 1,000th career point and will look to reach it on the road against Hartford Tuesday night. Kurpniece would be just the third Bearcat to score

1,000 points while playing all four years at the NCAA Division I level. Another senior Bearcat, Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio), is on pace to break the mark by season-end. Sario sits at 958 and is averaging 10.8 points per game. Boston University senior Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterdon) has 948 points and is averaging 9.6 points per game this season. Only one active America East player is currently over 1,000 career points--Hartford's Danielle Hood entered the season with 1,145 points.

THIS WEEK'S BROADCASTS

This week's slate of games features two live broadcasts. Fans can catch Binghamton at Hartford Tuesday night live at 7:30 p.m. on Comcast Sports Net in New England and WIVT in New York. For audiences outside those regions, the America East broadcast will be streamed live at AmericaEast.com. Eric Frede and Leah Secondo will have the call. Later in the week, Boston University's trip up to Durham, New Hampshire to face the Wildcats will be featured in a live Pack-Cast streamed at the America East Zone on the conference web site. Frede will call the game from Lundholm Gymnasium with tip-off at 12 noon.

PACK THE HOUSE

The 2008 "Pack the House" Challenge is an NCAA initiative to increase attendance at women's basketball games all across the Division I level. Six America East schools will participate this year, with the first event kicking-off this Saturday at the University of New Hampshire squaring off against Boston University at noon. The challenge is to choose one game between January 1-February 17 with the goal of setting an attendance record while competing against schools in their own conference as well as all Division I schools for a chance to be the 2008 NCAA Women's Basketball Pack the House Challenge Champion and win great prizes.

WHAT SOPHOMORE SLUMP?

Taking a look back at the 2006-07 America East All-Rookie team, great rookie campaigns are making the smooth transition to successful sophomore seasons. Below is a chart of the five sophomores' numbers this year, along with those of Erica Beverly, the 2006 Rookie of the Year in her first full year back on the court.

BALL THIEVES

Teams better be careful to hang on to the ball tight while playing Albany, the team with a conference-best 11.50 steals per game to their name. In sixteen games this season, the Great Danes have stolen the ball away from opponents 184 times. In conference games, that mark jumps to 13.33 steals per game. Three different players rank in the conference's top ten in steals, including senior Gia Sanders at fourth averaging 1.94 steals per game. Senior Kristin Higy (1.81) and junior TaNika Thrower (1.81) are tied for seventh.

TWICE AS NICE

Hartford became the first America East team to knock off a ranked opponent this season with its 54-51 victory at home against #24 Michigan State on Saturday, December 22. MSU's arrival in West Hartford marked the second game in two years that a ranked opponent has played Hartford at the Reich Family Pavilion. The first team to do so was 22nd-ranked Brigham Young on December 2, 2006, who the Hawks defeated, 60-43. Hartford is now 2-0 against ranked opponents at home. Not only did the Hawks crack the Spartans, but they also got to 6'9" Wade Trophy Watch List candidate Allyssa DeHaan who they held to 13 points and 3 rebounds, both under the sophomore's averages. The victory doubled the votes the Hawks received in the national coaches' poll the following week where they had the 26th most votes.

200 CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday, December 16 when the Catamounts defeated Harvard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley reached 200 wins through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Associate Head Coach under Chris Wiegus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

TERRIER THREAT

The Terriers have a conference-best five players in the America East top-30 scorers this season, including four in the top-25. The Boston University scoring threat is producing 68.2 points per game, tops in the league.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley - confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the

Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters were played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiving 14 votes in the most recent coaches' poll released on January 15, 2008. The next coaches' poll will be released on Tuesday, January 22.

TV TIME

ESPN2 will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships.

On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title

ALBANY GREAT DANES (4-12, 2-1 AE)

UAlbany dropped its first conference game with a 73-58 loss on the road to Vermont on Wednesday... Senior forward Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) recorded her fourth double-double of the season with an 11-point, 11-rebound performance... She also recorded a career-high seven blocks to go along with two steals and two assists... Sanders leads the team off the boards, grabbing 6.5 rebounds per game and is adding 7.3 points... She also has a team-high 31 steals and 29 blocks... Freshman guard Janea Aiken (St. Albans, N.Y./St. Dominic) also scored 11 points for UAlbany, going 6-of-7 from the free throw line... Sophomore Britney McGee (Bakersfield, Calif./West) scored a team-high 13 points and recorded three rebounds and three assists... McGee continues to lead the team, scoring at a 11.4 clip... She is also recording 2.06 assists per game and has hit a team-best 32 3-pointers... Senior forward Kristin Higy (Akron, Ohio/North Canton Hoover) scores 10.9 points per game and is also second on the team with 5.8 rebounds per contest... Higy is shooting a team-high 42.2 percent from the floor and is second on the squad with 29 steals on the season... The Great Danes host UMBC at 7 p.m. on Tuesday in America East Conference action and visit Hartford on Saturday at 2 p.m.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (5-11, 3-0 AE)

Binghamton has tied its best start (set by the 2005-06 squad) in conference play since joining the America East prior to the 2001-02 season ... Junior forward Laura Franceski (Moscow, Pa./North Pocono) was the top Binghamton scorer last week as Binghamton gained a pair of wins. She poured in a career-high 27 points in the Bearcats' 65-58 road win on Jan. 16. She also added four rebounds, a season-high six blocks and three steals. Currently, Franceski ranks eighth in the America East with 12.0 points per game and first with 2.5 blocks per game... Senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia) currently has 998 career points. She is only two points away from becoming the 10th player in school history to reach the 1,000-point mark. The last Bingham-

ton player to reach the 1,000-point milestone was Jen Blues on March 1, 2006 in a game at Albany. Kurpniece would become Binghamton third 1,000-point scorer to have played all four years at the NCAA Division level, joining Blues and Rachel Laws. Senior guard Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Tapiolalaken) is in 11th place all time with 958 career points and is also on pace to reach the 1,000-point mark by the end of the season.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS (9-7, 2-1 AE)

Juniors Jesyka Burks-Wiley (Kansas City, Mo./Lincoln College Prep) and Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) each recorded double-doubles, as the Boston University women's basketball team cruised to an 89-40 victory over Stony Brook on Saturday afternoon at Case Gym. Burks-Wiley led all scorers with 17 points and 12 rebounds, while Kinneary posted 11 points and dished out 10 assists. The Terriers featured six players in double figures and led by as many as 56 points in the contest... BU shot 48 percent (36-for-75) for the game, and 31.6 from the behind the arc.
