 Binghamton junior Laura Franceski is leading her team in scoring (11.6 ppg) and rebounding (6.2 rpg) during conference play... Albany junior TaNika Thrower leads the conference in both steals (2.40 spg) and three-point field goal percentage (.571) in five league games this season.

*** Maine at New Hampshire 7 p.m.**
 Two first-year head coaches go head-to-head when Cindy Blodgett's squad visits Lundholm to play Kristin Cole's Wildcats... Two of the top rookies in the conference will be on the same court in the form of UNH freshman Denise Beliveau (11.8 ppg) and Black Bear rookie Tanna Ross (10.1 ppg).

*** UMBC at Boston University 7 p.m.**
 UMBC sophomore Carlee Cassidy leads the Retrievers and the league in scoring with 17.5 ppg... Boston University junior Jesyka Burks-Wiley ranks third in the conference in scoring (15.2 ppg) and fourth on the glass (7.0 rpg)... The Terriers have averaged 78.7 ppg in their last three games.... The Retrievers return to the court after a week of rest.

 Sophomore Aly Hinton picked up her own rebound and then shot the game-winning lay-up with 1.5 seconds left... Junior Jesyka Burks-Wiley fouled out, but scored a Terrier-high 19 points, and classmate Kristi Dini netted four three-pointers en route to 14 points... Senior Ashley Cerniglia buried six three-pointers and finished with a game-high 22 points and 12 rebounds for the Wildcats... UNH sophomore Candace Williams also notched a double-double with 14 points and 11 boards... Until the final score, the Terriers never led in the second half.

*** at Vermont 82, Maine 62**
 Sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis went 9-for-19 from the field and shot 50% from three-point range to score 22 points while also finishing with four assists, six rebounds and two blocks... Kelli Poles finished just one rebound shy of her second double-double in three games (nine rebounds, 10 points)... Sophomores Amanda Tewksbury and Brittany Boser, and junior Colleen Kilmurray finished with a team-high 12 points for the Black Bears, and rookie Emily Rousseau chipped in 11 points.

*** at Hartford 63, Albany 55**
 Senior Danielle Hood scored a game-high 20 points for the Hawks to go along with eight rebounds, two assists and two blocks in 31 minutes... Sophomore Diana Delva finished with 12 boards, nine points and two boards.... The Great Danes forced the Hawks into 18 turnovers, four more than the hosts had averaged coming into the game... Albany junior TaNika Thrower paced the visitors with 17 points, six boards, two assists and two steals.

 The Bearcats got 11 points and six rebounds from senior Juta Jahilo and 10 points, four boards and four assists from sophomore Erica Carter... Junior Laura Franceski blocked five shots on the afternoon while also chipping in nine points and five rebounds... The Seawolves shot under 22% (.197) from the field for the second straight game... Kairsten Nunn led Stony Brook offensively with 11 points from off the bench.

PILYPAITIS SCORES PLAYER OF THE WEEK

University of Vermont sophomore guard Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) earned America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week after averaging 20.5 points per game in the Catamounts' 2-0 week. Pilypaitis also averaged 5.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists, and collected three blocks and three steals. The sophomore shot 45.2% from the field, 45.5% from three-point range (5-for-11) and went 8-for-9 from the foul line. In the win over New Hampshire, Pilypaitis scored 19 points and added five rebounds and four assists. Later in the week, she added 22 points (17 in the second half), six rebounds and four assists in the win over Maine. Pilypaitis is second in scoring during league play this season with 18.7 points per game to go along with 6.7 rebounds and 5.3 assists per game.

BELIVEAU NETS 18 POINTS TWICE LAST WEEK

New Hampshire rookie forward Denise Beliveau (Framingham, Mass./Framingham) captured the America East Rookie of the Week for the fourth time this season and first since December 17. The freshman led the Wildcats in scoring with 18 points at Vermont, then posted 18 again against Boston University at home. Beliveau went 13-for-19 from the floor on the week and nailed all eight free-throw shots. She pulled down seven boards to go along with three assists and two steals at Vermont. On Saturday against the Terriers, Beliveau had 11 points in the second half, going 2-for-2 from three-point land, which allowed for an 11-point Wildcat lead. She added six boards and dished out three assists in the game. Beliveau is the top-scoring freshman in the conference and is the only player to have hit all her free-throws (16-of-16) in America East play.

HONOR ROLL

As we do every week during conference play, the conference would like to recognize the other players also having impressive weeks on the court. New Hampshire's Ashley Cerniglia (Pittsford, N.Y./Sutherland) posted career highs in points (22), rebounds (12), three-pointers (6) and assists (5) against Boston University on Saturday and notched her first career double-double... Also at Lundholm Gymnasium Saturday, Boston University's Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put in the game-winning lay-up with just 1.5 seconds left on the clock. That capped off a week where the sophomore averaged 11.5 points per game and committed no turnovers in two games... Earlier in the week, UMBC's Kristin Drabyn (Avon, Ind./Avon) scored a game-best 20 points in a thrilling 56-55 victory at Albany on Tuesday... The Great Danes' Sherri Mikus (Duncannon, Pa./Susquenita) posted her first career double-double against the Retrievers with 16 points and a game-high 12 rebounds... Hartford's Erica Beverly (Bridgeport, Conn./Kolbe Cathedral) also notched a double-double, her third in conference play this season against Binghamton Tuesday night. Beverly scored six of her 16 points and both of her steals against the Bearcats in the opening five minutes of the second half where the Hawks opened up on a 19-0 run.

THE REPORT IS IN

In the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com released on Monday, January 28, Binghamton was the biggest upward mover in America East, up 12 spots. The Bearcats went 1-1 last week with their loss coming against first-place Hartford. Maine capitalized

with a win over Boston University Wednesday night and stepped up 11 spots in the RPI ranking. There are still nine more RPI reports to come this season from rpiratings.com.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Hartford extended its home-court win streak to 18 games last week going 2-0. That streak ranks second in the NCAA only behind Duke (24 games) who plays next at home against Tennessee on Monday, January 28. The Hawks will return home to Chase Arena for a repeat of the 2007 America East Championship final against UMBC on February 5.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE PART 2

As one would expect, winning at home is a must to be successful during conference play. The top four teams in the league standings as of Monday, January 28 (Hartford, Vermont, Binghamton, Boston U.) are a combined 12-0 on their home courts. Home teams have the 16-8 (.667) winning advantage in conference play.

MILESTONE WATCH

Binghamton senior Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47) notched her 1,000th career point on Tuesday, January 22 at Hartford. Kurpniece became just the third Bearcat to score 1,000 points while playing all four years at the NCAA Division I level. Another senior Bearcat, Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio), is on pace to break the mark by season-end. Sario sits at 972 and is averaging 10.4 points per game. Boston University senior Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterdon) has 963 points and is averaging 9.4 points per game this season. Kurpniece and Hartford's Danielle Hood are the only active America East players over the 1,000-point milestone.

PACK THE HOUSE

The 2008 "Pack the House" Challenge is an NCAA initiative to increase attendance at women's basketball games all across the Division I level. Seven America East schools will participate this year, and two of them are slated for this week. Boston University will try to pack Case Gym on Saturday against Vermont, and Maine will attempt the same at Alford Arena Saturday afternoon when the Black Bears welcome Binghamton. The challenge is to choose one game between January 1-February 17 with the goal of setting an attendance record while competing against schools in their own conference as well as all Division I schools for a chance to be the 2008 NCAA Women's Basketball Pack the House Challenge Champion and win great prizes.

WHAT SOPHOMORE SLUMP?

Taking a look back at the 2006-07 America East All-Rookie team, great rookie campaigns are making the smooth transition to successful sophomore seasons. Below is a chart of the five sophomores' numbers this year, along with those of Erica Beverly, the 2006 Rookie of the Year in her first full year back on the court.

BALL THIEVES

Teams better be careful to hang on to the ball tight while playing Albany, the team with a conference-best 11.17 steals per game to their name. In eighteen games this season, the Great Danes have stolen the ball away from opponents 201 times. In conference games, that mark jumps to 11.40 steals per game. Three different players rank in the conference's top ten in steals, including senior Gia Sanders at fourth averaging 1.94 steals per game. Junior TaNika Thrower (1.78) ranks seventh, and senior Kristin Higy is tied at eighth with 1.72 steals per game.

TWICE AS NICE

Hartford became the first America East team to knock off a ranked opponent this season with its 54-51 victory at home against #24 Michigan State on Saturday, December 22. MSU's arrival in West Hartford marked the second game in two years that a ranked opponent has played Hartford at the Reich Family Pavilion. The first team to do so was 22nd-ranked Brigham Young on December 2, 2006, who the Hawks defeated, 60-43. Hartford is now 2-0 against ranked opponents at home. Not only did the Hawks crack the Spartans, but they also got to 6'9" Wade Trophy Watch List candidate Allyssa DeHaan who they held to 13 points and 3 rebounds, both under the sophomore's averages. The victory doubled the votes the Hawks received in the national coaches' poll the following week where they had the 26th most votes.

200 CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday, December 16 when the Catamounts defeated Harvard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley reached 200 wins through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Associate Head Coach under Chris Wiegus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

TERRIER THREAT

The Terriers have a conference-best five players in the America East top-30 scorers this season, including four in the top-25. The Boston University scoring threat is producing 69.2 points per game, tops in the league.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters were played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiving 18 votes in the most recent coaches' poll released on January 22, 2008, good for the 29th-most in the country. The next coaches' poll will be released on Tuesday, January 29.

TV TIME

ESPNU will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games--officially called PackCasts--which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the en-

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East. The event, which is now known as the America East Women's Basketball Championship Presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese, will be held at the 3,977-seat Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. It is the sixth time in the last seven years that Friendship Cottage Cheese has served as the title sponsor. Friendship Cottage Cheese has sponsored each of the championships played in Hartford since 2002.

ALBANY GREAT DANES (4-14, 2-3 AE)

UAlbany lost two games in conference play last week... The Great Danes dropped a 56-55 decision to UMBC at home before falling to Hartford, 63-55, on the road... Senior forward Sherri Mikus (Duncannon, Pa./Susquenita) recorded her first career double-double against the Retrievers, finishing with 16 points and 12 rebounds... In her first start of the season, Mikus played 35 minutes, shooting 53.8-percent (7-of-13) from the floor... Freshman guard Janea Aiken (St. Albans, N.Y./St. Dominic) scored 12 points to go along with three rebounds, two assists, one steal and one block against UMBC... Sophomore guard TaNika Thrower (Houston, Texas/Northbrook) led the Great Danes against Hartford, scoring a team-high 17 points, going 3-of-4 from 3-point range... Thrower also grabbed six rebounds and finished with two assists and two steals... Sophomore guard Charity Iromuanya (Lincoln, Neb./Lincoln Northeast) scored seven points, handed out five assists and made three steals against UMBC... She followed with an eight-point performance against Hartford, while also recording three rebounds, two assists and a steal... The Great Danes play host to Binghamton on Wednesday, Jan. 30 at 7 p.m. and entertain Stony Brook on Saturday, Feb. 2 at 4:30 p.m., as the first game in the annual Big Purple Growl.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (6-12, 4-1 AE)

Senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 47) became the 10th player in school history to reach the 1,000-point mark for her career. She is just the third player to do it since the Bearcats moved up to the NCAA Division I level prior to the 2001-02 season. With 1,014 points, Kurpniece continues to rank 10th all time in school history. She needs four points to tie Helene Thomas (1981-85) for ninth place all time and five to tie Jen Blues (2002-06) for eight places ... Senior guard Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Tapiolalanken) currently ranks 11th all time with 972 career points. She needs 28 points to become the second Binghamton player this season to reach the 1,000-point mark ... Junior forward Laura Franceski blocked five shots against Stony Brook on Jan. 26. It marked the third time this season and seventh time in her career that she has rejected at least five shots in a game ...
