*** Albany 62, at New Hampshire 52**

The Great Danes won back-to-back games for the first time this season... Senior Kristin Higy scored a game-high 16 points for Albany and also posted eight rebounds, two blocks and four steals... Rookie Denise Beliveau was the leading scorer for UNH with 10 points.

*** at Boston University 62, Hartford 60 (AE Zone)**

Junior Kristi Dini scored all 19 of her points against Hartford in the second half, including her last second half-court buzzer-beater to lead the Terriers to their first win over the Hawks in three years... Sophomore Diana Delva notched 14 points and eight boards off the Hartford bench.

*** Vermont 61, at Stony Brook 49**

Sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis netted 23 points and went 11-for-15 from the free-throw line. She also brought down eight boards and dished out five assists... Stony Brook senior Dana Ferraro completed a double-double with 12 rebounds and 10 points.

*** at Maine 67, UMBC 55 (WABI)**

The Black Bears outrebounded the Retrievers, 35-27... Three Maine players hit double-digit points, while UMBC's Carlee Cassidy scored a game-high 27 points... Maine shot 46.5% from the field for the game.

Wednesday, January 2

at Vermont 78, Colgate 41

The Catamounts closed out its non-league schedule with their largest margin of victory this season, 37 points... Sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis put together a 10 points-11 assists double-double, while junior Amy Rosenkrantz scored a game-high 20 points.

DINI AND PILYPAITIS SHARE AWARD

Boston University's Kristi Dini (Putnam Valley, N.Y./Putnam Valley) and Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) received Co-Player of the Week honors from America East for the week ending January 6.

Dini, a junior guard, lit up in the second half against Hartford for 19 points, including the game-winning half-court buzzer-beater. Dini filled in with both of the Terriers' leading scorers on the bench, posting nine of the Terriers' last 12 points and shooting the ball with .08 seconds left on the clock to give Boston the victory over the defending regular season champions. The junior went 6-for-13 from the field and 4-for-9 from behind the arc.

In two games last week, sophomore guard Pilypaitis averaged 17.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, 8.0 assists and 3.0 steals. She scored 23 points, 18 in the second half and one shy of her career high, to lead Vermont past Stony Brook in the America East opener. The sophomore also handed out five assists and grabbed eight rebounds. Pilypaitis posted her third double-double of the season with 12 points and 11 assists in a win over Colgate. She added five rebounds and four steals against the Raiders.

ROUSSEAU DUBLES UP ON ROOKIE HONOR

For the second consecutive week, University of Maine's Emily Rousseau (Biddeford, Maine/Biddeford) nabbed the Rookie of the Week. In the only game of the week for the Black Bears, Rousseau scored nine points, pulled down five rebounds and handed out a team-high four assists in Saturday's win over defending America East champion UMBC. The rookie guard also hit all four of her free-throw attempts.

HONOR ROLL

The first week of conference play provided some other great performances. In Maine's win over UMBC Saturday night, junior forward Colleen Kilmurray netted 23 points, brought down five boards and dished out three assists. Her performance, including 73% field goal shooting, earned her the America East Player of the Game. On the other bench, the conference's leading scorer, sophomore Carlee Cassidy, put up a game-high 27 points for one of the top individual offensive outputs this season (tied for second). Earlier in the day, senior Kristin Higy led the Great Danes to a victory over UNH with 16 points, eight rebounds, four steals and two blocks. In Stony Brook's loss to Vermont, senior Dana Ferraro notched her fourth double-double of the season with 10 points and 12 rebounds. It was also her 24th career double-double.

THE REPORT IS IN

In the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com released on Monday, January 7, two America East teams are in the top-100. Hartford, despite slipping 11 spots, still stands at 28, while Boston University improved 23 spots to soar to 91. Stony Brook (240), Maine (243), Binghamton (264), and Albany (303) all improved on last week's rankings. Five of nine teams moved up on the list.

COMING TO A CLOSE

The non-conference schedule officially comes to a close after two match-ups early this week. The conference is 45-69 against other leagues, with games against two Ivy League squads this week

(Cornell and Dartmouth). America East stands at 7-4 this season against the Ivies.

HOME AGAIN

Hartford, who has the fourth-longest home winning streak in the NCAA at 15 games, will return home on Sunday hoping to expand that streak. The previous home game for the Hawks was the upset win over #23 Michigan State on December 22. Hartford will take on Vermont at Chase Arena on January 13.

SCREEN PLAY

This week's America East women's basketball schedule includes one live televised game and another live online-streamed game. On Sunday, January 13, Maine's trip to Albany will be produced by Pack Network and can be seen live for free at the America East Zone on AmericaEast.com. The call begins at 2 p.m. Later that day, Vermont and Hartford tip-off in Chase Arena at 6 p.m. live on Comcast Sports Net in New England. Eric Frede has the play-by-play and Leah Seconde will have the color analysis.

ALL IN THE STATS

In the latest national statistics generated by the NCAA on Friday, January 4, several America East teams and players are making a mark. Boston University's Christine Kinneary is ninth in the country with 6.9 assists per game, while teammate Aly Hinton is second in free-throw percentage (94.3%). Kinneary's 2.2 assists-to-turnover ratio is 17th-best in Division I. As a team, led by Hinton, the Terriers are fifth in free-throw percentage at 80.2%. Both the Terriers and the Hawks are stingy with the ball, committing the 10th and 13th fewest turnovers. Also of note, UMBC is making 7.3 three-pointers per game for the 16th-most in the country.

NEW LEADER OF THE PACK

Last week, UMBC's Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) became the leading scorer in the conference for the first time this season with 21 and 24 point performances against Richmond and #5 University of Maryland. Along with her game-high 27 points against Maine on January 5, the sophomore guard is averaging 17.4 points per game, nearly two points more than Hartford's Danielle Hood.

TWICE AS NICE

Hartford became the first America East team to knock off a ranked opponent this season with its 54-51 victory at home against #24 Michigan State on Saturday, December 22. MSU's arrival in West Hartford marked the second game in two years that a ranked opponent has played Hartford at the Reich Family Pavilion. The first team to do so was 22nd-ranked Brigham Young on December 2, 2006, who the Hawks defeated, 60-43. Hartford is now 2-0 against ranked opponents at home. Not only did the Hawks crack the Spartans, but they also got to 6'9" Wade Trophy Watch List candidate Allyssa DeHaan who they held to 13 points and 3 rebounds, both under the sophomore's averages. The victory doubled the votes the Hawks received in the national coaches' poll the following week where they had the 26th most votes.

200 CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday, December 16 when the Catamounts defeated Harvard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley reached 200 wins through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head

at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Associate Head Coach under Chris Wiegus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

TERRIER THREAT

The Terriers have a conference-best five players in the America East top-30 scorers this season, including four in the top-25. The Boston University scoring threat is producing 67.7 points per game, tops in the league.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference

Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniace (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters were played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiving 8 votes in the most recent coaches' poll released on January 2, 2008. The next poll will be released on Monday, January 7.

TV TIME

ESPN will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games, which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East. The event, which is now known as the America East Women's Basketball Championship Presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese, will be held at the 3,977-seat Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. It is the sixth time in the last seven years that Friendship Cottage Cheese has served as the title sponsor. ALBANY GREAT DANES (3-11, 1-0 AE)

UAlbany won its second straight game with a 62-52 win over New Hampshire in the America East Conference opener for both teams on Saturday afternoon... It was the second consecutive win in conference openers for the Great Danes, but broke a 14-game road losing streak, dating back to last season... It was the first win for UAlbany in Lundholm Gymnasium in seven tries... Senior forward Kristin Higy (Akron, Ohio/North Canton Hoover) led the Great Danes with 16 points, including 11 in the second half, eight rebounds, four steals and two blocks... She went 5-for-9 from the floor, including 2-of-4 from 3-point range, and 4-of-5 from the free throw line... Higy continues to pace the team, averaging a team-best 11.2 points and 6.2 boards per game... Sophomore guard Britney McGee (Bakersfield, Calif./West) scored 15 points, reaching double figures for the sixth consecutive game... Senior forward Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) was one point and one rebound away from her fourth double-double, scoring nine points and grabbing a team-best nine rebounds to go along with two blocks... Senior guard/forward Sherri Mikus (Duncannon, Pa./Susquenita) also scored nine points on 5-of-6 shooting from the charity stripe, adding six caroms, four steals and two assists... The Great Danes will look to keep their conference record perfect on Sunday, Jan. 13, hosting Maine at 2 p.m. in a game to be streamed live by Pack Network at AmericaEast.com.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (2-10, 0-0 AE)

Binghamton did not play last week, and will return to action at home against Cornell on Monday, January 7 at 7 p.m... Senior center Laine Kurpniess (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 47) has scored 22 and 20 points in her last two games. She is the first Binghamton player to reach the 20-point mark in back-to-back games since Rachel Laws had four consecutive games from Dec. 7-30, 2004. Kurpniess continues to rank 11th all-time in program history with 948 career points. She is six points away from tying Alicia Koppehhofer (1994-98) for 10th place all time with 954 career points. Kurpniess has reached 20 points four times this season and 11 times during her career ... Senior guard Laura Sario currently has 921 career points and is in 13th place all time. She needs two points to tie Reagan Stevens (1993-97) for 12th place all time ... Junior forward Laura Franceski (Moscow, Pa./North Pocono) scored a career-high 19 points and blocked five shots against St. Bonaventure on Dec. 30. She has now blocked at least five shots five times in her career ... Binghamton has three players averaging double figures in scoring (Kurpniess with 12.0, Sario with 11.3 and Franceski with 10.9). The last time Binghamton finished a season with three players in double figures was during the 2005-06 season (Kurpniess with 12.3 points, Laws with 11.6 points and Jen Blues with 10.1 points).

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS (8-6, 1-0 AE)

America East Co-Player of the Week junior Kristi Dini's (Putnam Valley, N.Y./Putnam Valley) half-court buzzer-beater lifted the Boston University women's basketball team past Hartford, 62-60, in the conference opener on Saturday afternoon at Case Gym... The Terriers erased a 16-point deficit in the second half to earn the come-from-behind

victory... BU improves to 8-6 overall and 1-0 in America East action, while the Hawks fall to 10-4 overall and 0-1 in league play... After going down by as many as 16 points in the second half, the Terriers made a furious comeback late in the contest... Backed by strong performances off the bench, the Terriers' bench outscored the Hawks, 28-15... Dini's game-high 19 points all came in the second half, and sophomore Kristen Folk (Moosic, Pa./Scranton Prep) came in to score crucial points in the waning seconds of the game... Her jumper with 37 seconds remaining gave BU the four-point advantage - its largest lead of the game - however, the Hawks returned the favor with a three-pointer and a jumper to reclaim the lead with three seconds left... With three seconds remaining in regulation, junior Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) rushed the ball up court and dished it off to Dini, who unloaded the game-winning half-court shot with two Hawks guarding her, giving BU its first victory over Hartford since Feb. 7, 2004... Also contributing on the offensive front were junior Jesyka Burks-Wiley (Kansas City, Mo./Lincoln College Prep) and sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) with 12 points apiece... Hinton finished with a team-high seven rebounds, and Kinneary handed out a game-high 11 assists.

HARTFORD HAWKS (10-4, 0-1 AE)

Hartford opened conference play with a shocking loss at Boston University. The Hawks allowed the Terriers to pull within reach after leading by as much as 16 points. A last second half court attempt was good, handing Hartford its first defeat in conference play... The Hawks were led by Diana Delva (Stamford, Conn./Westhill) who finished with 14 points, all off the bench. She also added a team-high eight rebounds. Joining Delva in double figures was Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) who finished with 13 points... The Hawks shot just 36.8 from the field (21-of-57), while the Terriers finished the game shooting 42.2 percent (25-of-59). The Hawks did fairly well from the line, where they finished 14-of-18 for 77.8 percent... Hartford held a 22-11 advantage in the rebounding category at the half, but the Terriers outrebounded the Hawks 24-13 in the second half to end in a 35 all tie. Delva's eight rebounds tied with Erica Beverly (Bridgeport, Conn./Kolbe Cathedral) for the game high...
