UPCOMING ACTION

Wednesday, February 13

*** Binghamton at Boston University 7 p.m.**

The Bearcats nipped the Terriers, 59-55, last time out in Vestal... Binghamton senior guard Laura Sario, averaging 9.9 ppg, has 993 career points and is seven shy of becoming the second Bearcat to reach the 1,000 point milestone this season... Previously averaging over 72 ppg in conference games, Boston U. has averaged just 52 ppg in the last two games, both losses.

*** Hartford at Vermont (PackCast) 7 p.m.**

The Catamounts have yet to lose at Patrick Gym this season in conference play, with just one loss at home overall... Vermont is the only team in the conference to have three players in the top-10 scorers... Hitting 43 of 61 attempts in conference play, Hartford sophomore Diana Delva is shooting 70.5% from the floor in nine league games... Sophomore Erica Beverly and senior Danielle Hood are shooting at 55% and 54% clips, respectively.

*** UMBC at Stony Brook 7 p.m.**

The Retrievers defeated the Seawolves in Baltimore, 61-56, earlier in the season... Senior Morgan Hatten returned for the first time since sustaining an injury and played nine minutes last time out against Maine... Stony Brook freshman Kirsten Jeter has led the team in scoring in seven games this season, including last time out against Vermont when she netted 16 points.

*** Albany at Maine 7:30 p.m.**

The Great Danes came away with their largest margin of victory of the season last time against Maine, 78-46... Albany is currently riding its longest win streak of the season at four games, defeating foes by an average of 18.75 ppg during that stretch... The Black Bears are averaging five more points a game at home vs. on the road and holding opponents to 15 points less at Alford Arena.

Vermont shot 60% in the second half to extend a seven-point lead at the intermission... Rookie Kristen Jeter scored a team-high 16 points for the Seawolves... *** at Albany 67, New Hampshire 50**

Albany caused 27 Wildcat turnovers, including 19 thefts... Senior Gia Sanders and sophomore Charity Iromuanya each contributed five steals... Four Great Danes finished with double-doubles, including Sanders (11 points, 10 rebounds) and senior Kristin Higy (11 points, 12 rebounds)... Sophomore Amy Simpson led UNH in scoring, with 19 points, for the third straight game... Classmate Candace Williams also finished with double-digit points with 10 points to go along with nine boards... With the win, Albany won a season series against a single conference opponent for the first time since the 2004-05 season.

*** at UMBC 69, Maine 59**

Sophomore Carlee Cassidy matched her season high of 27 points en route to being named the Retrievers' America East Player of the Game... Senior Kristin Drabyn netted five three-pointers and scored 21 points for the game... For the Black Bears, sophomore Amanda Tewksbury scored a team-high 23 points... Senior Kris Younan handed out five assists and added two thefts... UMBC and Maine split the season series.

*** at Hartford 61, Boston University 54 (PackCast)**

Senior Danielle Hood scored a game-high 23 points for her third 20+ performance in the last four games... Sophomore Erica Beverly pulled down 10 rebounds and blocked one shot... For the Terriers, junior Christine Kinneary notched a new career high, 20 points on 9-of-16 shooting... The Terriers shot just 3-for-11 from the charity stripe... By avenging the loss the Terriers handed the Hawks in January, Hartford extended its home winning streak to 20 games.

SANDERS LEADS ALBANY TO A 2-0 WEEK

Albany senior forward Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) led her team to an undefeated week on her way to becoming the America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week. For the week ending February 10, Sanders led the Great Danes to their third and fourth consecutive wins, as she averaged 13.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in two games. In the 76-50 win over Boston U., Sanders scored 15 points and grabbed six rebounds, going 6-of-10 from the floor, including 2-of-3 from three-point range. In a 67-50 win over New Hampshire, Sanders recorded her fifth double-double of the season with an 11-point, 10-rebound performance. She also recorded five steals against the Wildcats. Sanders, who completed the week without a single turnover, is averaging 7.7 points and a team-high 6.9 rebounds on the season, and continues to lead the team with 41 steals and 32 blocks. This is her first weekly award of the year and of her collegiate career.

AIKEN CAPTURES FIRST CAREER AWARD

Albany freshman guard Janea Aiken (St. Albans, N.Y./St. Dominic) completed a Great Dane sweep of the America East weekly awards capturing the rookie honor. Aiken helped lead the Great Danes to an undefeated week in conference play, averaging 11.5 points and 4.0 assists per game, shooting a team-high 76.9% from the floor. Aiken scored 12 points to go along with six assists and two rebounds against Boston U., shooting 6-of-8 from the floor. In a win over New Hampshire on Sunday, Aiken scored 11 points on 4-of-5 shooting from the floor, including 2-for-2 from three-point range. She added two assists and one steal in 21 minutes of action against the Wildcats. Aiken is scoring at a 7.5 clip for the Great Danes this season.

HONOR ROLL

Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) also led her team to consecutive wins last week, as the Hawks defeated the Retrievers and the Terriers. Hood led all scorers on Saturday with 23 points... Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) posted double figures for the Catamounts in both games last week and notched her fourth double-double of the year against Stony Brook on Sunday... New Hampshire guard Amy Simpson (Waterford, Conn./Waterford) was a sparkplug in the Wildcats' three-game win streak, posting 14 points, seven steals and five assists against Stony Brook on Wednesday... UMBC's Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) was stifled at Hartford on Tuesday, but then broke out for 27 points against Maine, matching a career best. Cassidy also added six assists in that game... Boston University junior Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) put together a career effort in a loss to Hartford on Saturday. Kinneary scored a career-high 20 points, eclipsing her previous career best of 17 points.

THE REPORT IS IN

In the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com released on Monday, February 11, big moves continue to happen. Six of the nine America East schools made double-digit moves up or down. Hartford sits at 45, Vermont at 148, and Boston U. at 150. Following is Binghamton (233), Albany (260), UMBC (262), Maine (264), Stony Brook (280) and New Hampshire (299).

TEAMS PLAY SECOND TIME AROUND

The first half of conference play is now behind us, as teams began playing through the conference schedule for the second time last week. Hartford and UMBC both avenged previous losses to Boston University and Maine, respectively, to split the home-and-home series. Vermont and Albany both swept series against Stony Brook and New Hampshire. The sweep by the Great Danes over the Wildcats represents their first over a single conference opponent since 2004-05.

WILDCARD PACKCASTS ANNOUNCED

As part of the America East Conference's first-ever enhanced streaming package, two women's basketball games have been added to the lineup as wildcard games determined by the conference standings. Those games include the match-up Saturday, February 9 between the Boston University Terriers and the Hartford Hawks, and the Binghamton Bearcats' trip to Durham, N.H. on March 1st to face the New Hampshire Wildcats.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Hartford's home-court win streak is now at 20 games after two wins last week. That streak is tied with Old Dominion's home-court win streak for longest active in the nation. The Hawks will have to wait until Saturday, Feb. 16 against New Hampshire to try to extend it.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE PART 2

As one would expect, winning at home is a must to be successful during conference play. Four of the top five teams in the league standings are perfect on their home courts against league foes this season. Home teams, who went a perfect 8-0 last week, have the 30-10 (.750) winning advantage in conference play.

OVER THE HILL - 40 POINTS

On Saturday, February 2 at Case Gymnasium, Vermont sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) put up a career-high 40 points against Boston University that also tied the school record. It was the first 40-point performance in the conference since Boston U.'s Katie Meinhardt netted 43 points against Stony Brook during the 2005 America East Championship.

MILESTONE WATCH

Boston University senior Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterdon) exceeded the 1,000 career point mark on Wednesday, February 6 at Albany on her second of three treys on the afternoon. She became the second America East player to do so this season. Binghamton senior Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47) notched her 1,000th career point earlier in the year on Tuesday, January 22 at Hartford. Kurpniece became just the third Bearcat to score 1,000 points while playing all four years at the NCAA Division I level. Another senior Bearcat, Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio), sits at 993 and is averaging 9.9 points per game. Sario could become the third to reach the milestone when she next takes to the court this Wednesday, February 13 at Boston University.

PACK THE HOUSE

The 2008 "Pack the House" Challenge is an NCAA initiative to increase attendance at women's basketball games all across the Division I level. Seven America East schools will participate this year, and two of them are slated for this week. Vermont will host its event on Wednesday night when league-leading Hartford travels to Burlington. The Hawks

return to Chase Arena on Saturday, February 16 against New Hampshire to hold the annual Hawk Fest and Rise of Hawk Country. The challenge is to choose one game between January 1-February 17 with the goal of setting an attendance record while competing against schools in their own conference as well as all Division I schools for a chance to be the 2008 NCAA Women's Basketball Pack the House Challenge Champion and win great prizes.

CATS CLIMBING THE CHARTS

The Catamounts have three players among the top-ten scorers in the conference right now. Only the Wildcats and the Retrievers also have multiple players in that elite group (2 each). For Vermont, Courtney Pilypaitis (16.2 ppg), Amy Rosenkrantz (13.3) and May Kotsopoulos (11.8) are cruising in double-digits.

WHAT SOPHOMORE SLUMP?

Taking a look back at the 2006-07 America East All-Rookie team, great rookie campaigns are making the smooth transition to successful sophomore seasons. Below is a chart of the five sophomores' numbers this year, along with those of Erica Beverly, the 2006 Rookie of the Year in her first full year back on the court.

BALL THIEVES

Teams better be careful to hang on to the ball tight while playing Albany, the team with a conference-best 11.41 steals per game to their name. In 22 games this season, the Great Danes have stolen the ball away from opponents 251 times. In conference games, that mark jumps to 11.89 steals per game. Four different players rank in the conference's top 10 in steals, including senior Gia Sanders at third averaging 2.05 steals per game. Junior TaNika Thrower (1.86) ranks fourth, while senior Kristin Higy and sophomore Charity Iromuanya are tied at 10th with 1.68 spg each.

TWICE AS NICE

Hartford became the first America East team to knock off a ranked opponent this season with its 54-51 victory at home against #24 Michigan State on Saturday, December 22. MSU's arrival in West Hartford marked the second game in two years that a ranked opponent has played Hartford at the Reich Family Pavilion. The first team to do so was 22nd-ranked Brigham Young on December 2, 2006, who the Hawks defeated, 60-43. Hartford is now 2-0 against ranked opponents at home. Not only did the Hawks crack the Spartans, but they also got to 6'9" Wade Trophy Watch List candidate Allyssa DeHaan who they held to 13 points and 3 rebounds, both under the sophomore's averages. The victory doubled the votes the Hawks received in the national coaches' poll the following week where they had the 26th most votes.

200 CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday, December 16 when the Catamounts defeated Har-

vard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley reached 200 wins through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Associate Head Coach under Chris Wiegus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and then-conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley - confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters were played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiving 17 votes in the most recent coaches' poll released on February 5, 2008. The next coaches' poll will be released on Tuesday, February 12.

TV TIME

ESPNU will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games--officially called PackCasts--which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East.
