Freshman Kirsten Jeter became the Seawolves' player of the game by posting 12 points, four rebounds, two assists and four steals.

For the second straight game, the Catamounts snapped the longest winning streak in the conference... Vermont denied the Great Danes their sixth straight win, while snapping the Hawk's eight game streak earlier in the week... Junior Amy Rosenkrantz and sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis each scored 17 points for the Cataamounts... Albany senior Gia Sanders came off the bench to notch five points and 11 rebounds.

The Bearcats swept the season series with the Retrievers... Sophomore Erica Carter put up a team-high 16 points to pace Binghamton on the offensive end... Binghamton shot 59.3% in the first half to open up a 42-25 lead at the intermission... Sophomore Carlee Cassidy scored 18 points, 15 in the second half, and also added seven assists.

* at Hartford 74, New Hampshire 44

Four Hawks scored in double digits, led by sophomore Diana Delva's 15 points... Delva also had a team-high seven rebounds along with freshman Jonyce Hollins... Hartford went to the line 27 times, hitting 20 of those attempts... The Wildcats were held to 20.7% shooting from the field in the first half... Sophomore Candace Williams put up a 12-point, eight-rebound performance for New Hampshire.

PILYPAITIS MAKES HISTORY

Vermont sophomore guard Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) notched a triple-double and a double-double in two games last week to receive her fourth America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week award this season. In a 2-0 week, she averaged 17.5 points, 12.5 rebounds, 7.0 assists, and shot 41.7% from three-point range (5-for-12) and 92.3% from the foul line (12-for-13). Pilypaitis recorded the first triple-double in Vermont women's basketball history with 18 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists in UVM's 69-66 win over first-place Hartford. The sophomore added a double-double performance of 17 points and 14 rebounds in a 68-48 victory at Albany. It was her fifth double-double of the year and seventh of her career.

JETER SNAGS SECOND ROOKIE AWARD

Stony Brook freshman Kirsten Jeter (Elmont, N.Y./Elmont) was tabbed the conference's Rookie of the Week after leading the Seawolves last week. Jeter had a team-high 15 points Wednesday against UMBC and scored 12 points against Maine on Saturday to hit double figures for the fourth straight game. At Maine, the rookie also added four rebounds, four steals and two assists. For the week, Jeter averaged 13.5 points and 4.5 rebounds in a starting role. This is the second such award for the freshman this season.

HONOR ROLL

The league saw several other outstanding performances last week. Boston University junior guard Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) notched a career-best 23 points at home against Binghamton for her second straight 20+ point performance... UMBC junior guard Chantay Frazier (Carthage, Miss./Choctaw Central/Seminole State) averaged 20.5 points and 7.0 rebounds in two games last week, shooting 55.2% from the field and 50% from three-point range. She also tallied three assists and five steals... Albany senior forward Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) contributed 12 ppg and 8.5 rpg all from off the bench last week, including a career-high 19 points at Maine on Wednesday night... Hartford senior forward/center Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) scored in double-digits in both games and shot 50% from the field. Hood also added two blocks and 4.0 rpg.

THE REPORT IS IN

In the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com released on Monday, February 18, big moves continue to happen. Four America East schools made double-digit moves up or down. Vermont, fueled by its victory over Hartford on Wednesday, moved a conference-best 21 spots up the list to 127. It was the Catamounts' second win over a top-100 program this season.

TRIPLE THAT

Vermont sophomore guard Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) recorded the first triple-double in UVM women's basketball history, and the sixth in Division I this season, on February 13 against Hartford. In the 69-66 win over the Hawks, Pilypaitis posted 18 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists. It was the first triple-double in America East women's basketball since Boston U.'s Adrienne Norris pulled the trick against New Hampshire on February 4, 2004.

SCREEN TIME SLATED THIS WEEK

The last televised regular season women's basketball game is scheduled to air live this Saturday on CN8. The Terriers visit Burlington to take on the Catamounts in a rematch of a game Boston University won at home. Last time against these teams, Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis posted 40 points, while Boston U.'s Cheri Raffo recorded 27 points. Eric Frede will have the play-by-play, and Leah Seconde will take on the color analyst duties.

WILDCARD PACKCASTS ANNOUNCED

As part of the America East Conference's first-ever enhanced streaming package, two women's basketball games have been added to the lineup as wildcard games determined by the conference standings. Those games include the match-up Saturday, February 9 between the Boston University Terriers and the Hartford Hawks, and the Binghamton Bearcats' trip to Durham, N.H. on March 1st to face the New Hampshire Wildcats.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Hartford's home-court win streak is now at 21 games after defeating New Hampshire at Chase Arena on Saturday. That streak is tied with Old Dominion's home-court win streak for longest active in the nation. The Hawks will have to wait until Saturday, March 1 against Maine to try to extend it.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE PART 2

As one would expect, winning at home is a must to be successful during conference play. Four of the top five teams in the league standings are perfect on their home courts against league foes this season. Home teams, who went 5-3 last week, have the 35-13 (.729) winning advantage in conference play.

OVER THE HILL - 40 POINTS

On Saturday, February 2 at Case Gymnasium, Vermont sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) put up a career-high 40 points against Boston University that also tied the school record. It was the first 40-point performance in the conference since Boston U.'s Katie Meinhardt netted 43 points against Stony Brook during the 2005 America East Championship.

MILESTONE WATCH

Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) became the third America East player to reach 1,000 career points this season, and the second Bearcat to do so. Sario, who hit the milestone at Boston University on Wednesday, February 13, joins teammate Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47) who notched her 1,000th career point earlier in the year on Tuesday, January 22 at Hartford. Kurpniece and Sario became just the third and fourth Bearcats to score 1,000 points while playing all four years at the NCAA Division I level. Boston University senior Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterdon) also exceeded the 1,000 career point mark on Wednesday, February 6 at Albany on her second of three treys on the afternoon.

PACK THE HOUSE

The 2008 "Pack the House" Challenge is an NCAA initiative to increase attendance at women's basketball games all across the Division I level. Seven America East schools participated this year and will vie for both the conference and national award. The challenge was to choose one game between January 1-February 17 with the goal of

setting an attendance record while competing against schools in their own conference as well as all Division I schools for a chance to be the 2008 NCAA Women's Basketball Pack the House Challenge Champion and win great prizes.

CATS CLIMBING THE CHARTS

The Catamounts have three players among the top-ten scorers in the conference right now. Only the Wildcats and the Retrievers also have multiple players in that elite group (2 each). For Vermont, Courtney Pilypaitis (16.3 ppg), Amy Rosenkrantz (13.5) and May Kotsopoulos (12.3) are cruising in double-digits.

WHAT SOPHOMORE SLUMP?

Taking a look back at the 2006-07 America East All-Rookie team, great rookie campaigns are making the smooth transition to successful sophomore seasons. Below is a chart of the five sophomores' numbers this year, along with those of Erica Beverly, the 2006 Rookie of the Year in her first full year back on the court.

BALL THIEVES

Teams better be careful to hang on to the ball tight while playing Albany, the team with a conference-best 11.08 steals per game to their name, including 11.09 in conference games. In 24 games this season, the Great Danes have stolen the ball away from opponents 266 times. Three different players rank in the conference's top 10 in steals, including senior Gia Sanders at fifth averaging 1.91 steals per game. Junior TaNika Thrower (1.79) ranks sixth, and sophomore Charity Iromuanya sits at ninth averaging 1.67 steals per game.

TWICE AS NICE

Hartford became the first America East team to knock off a ranked opponent this season with its 54-51 victory at home against #24 Michigan State on Saturday, December 22. MSU's arrival in West Hartford marked the second game in two years that a ranked opponent has played Hartford at the Reich Family Pavilion. The first team to do so was 22nd-ranked Brigham Young on December 2, 2006, who the Hawks defeated, 60-43. Hartford is now 2-0 against ranked opponents at home. Not only did the Hawks crack the Spartans, but they also got to 6'9" Wade Trophy Watch List candidate Allyssa DeHaan who they held to 13 points and 3 rebounds, both under the sophomore's averages. The victory doubled the votes the Hawks received in the national coaches' poll the following week where they had the 26th most votes.

200 CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday, December 16 when the Catamounts defeated Harvard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley reached 200 wins through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Asso-

ciate Head Coach under Chris Wiegus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and then-conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I pre-season poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against pre-season poll vote-getters were played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving pre-season credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I pre-season poll. Hartford is receiving 19 votes in the most recent coaches' poll released on February 12, 2008. The next coaches' poll will be released on Tuesday, February 19.

TV TIME

ESPN will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney

Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games-- officially called PackCasts--which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East. The event, which is now known as the America East Women's Basketball Championship Presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese, will be held at the 3,977-seat Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. It is the sixth time in the last seven years that Friendship Cottage Cheese has served as the title sponsor. ALBANY GREAT DANES (9-15, 7-4 AE)

UAlbany increased its win streak to five games, the longest in the school's Division I history, with a 69-54 win over Maine on the road on Wednesday... The Great Danes then dropped a 68-48 decision to Vermont at home on Saturday... Senior forward Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bulles School) led UAlbany for the week, averaging 12.0 points and 8.5 rebounds... At Maine, Sand-

ers recorded a career-high 19 points on 8-of-10 shooting from the floor, including 3-of-4 from 3-point range... She also added six rebounds, one steal and one block against the Black Bears... Versus Vermont, Sanders finished with a team-high 11 boards, five points and one block... Freshman guard Janea Aiken (St. Albans, N.Y./St. Dominic) averaged 10.0 points last week, scoring eight points at Maine and finishing with a team-high 12 points versus Vermont... Sophomore guard Britney McGee (Bakersfield, Calif./West) was unable to get much scoring done at Maine, but instead handed out a career-high 10 assists to help the Great Danes... Senior forward Kristin Higy (Akron, Ohio/North Canton Hoover) averaged 9.5 points and 4.0 rebounds on the week... She scored 15 points and grabbed five boards at Maine... The Great Danes will visit UMBC on Wednesday at 7 p.m., looking to avenge an earlier-season loss at home, before traveling to Stony Brook for a 2 p.m. contest on Saturday.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (7-15, 5-4 AE)

Senior center Laine Kurpniace (Riga, Latvia/Secondary School 47) enters week with 1,088 career points. She is 12 points away from becoming just the eighth player in school history to score 1,100 points... Senior guard Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Tapiolalonten) currently ranks 11th place all time in school history with 1,008 career points.
