Albany's nine conference wins this season is tied for a program best... Senior Kristin Higley leads the Great Danes in scoring with 11.3 ppg and has reached double digits in four of the last five games... Hawks post players Danielle Hood and Diana Delva account for over 25 ppg... Hartford took the first game of the series this season, 63-55.

* Binghamton at Stony Brook

7 p.m.

The Bearcats defeated the Seawolves earlier this season at the Events Center, 35-59... Stony Brook senior Dana Ferraro has finished with 10 or more rebounds in 11 games this season, more than any other player in the conference... Binghamton junior Laura Franceski, the conference leader in blocks, swatted away five shots and added eight points last game against Stony Brook.

* New Hampshire at Boston University

7 p.m.

Boston U. sophomore Aly Hinton took her own offensive rebound and put it in for the game-winning lay-up last time between the Terriers and Wildcats... UNH senior Ashley Cerniglia posted a career-high 22 points and six three-pointers in that game... Cerniglia leads the Wildcats with 12.0 ppg, while junior Jesyka Burks-Wiley averages a Terrier team-high 13.6 ppg.

* Vermont at Maine

7:30 p.m.

The Catamounts, winners of five straight, secured a 20 point victory over the Black Bears earlier this season... Three Catamounts are averaging in double-figures and are in the top six among the conference's scorers... Maine has kept opponents off the glass better than any other team in the league, holding them to 33.8 rpg, and has the second-best rebounding margin of +2.3.

Senior Kristin Drabyn shot 6-for-16 from the field, 5-for-13 from beyond the arc and a perfect 7-for-7 from the free throw line for a game-best 24 points... Sophomore Carlee Cassidy added 15 points and swooped in for five steals... Wildcat freshman Denise Beliveau scored a team-high 16 points and hit four three-pointers... Beliveau, junior Danielle Flowers and sophomore Candace Williams each finished with seven rebounds a piece.

* Albany 65, at Stony Brook 58

The Great Danes completed the season sweep of the Seawolves for the first time since both New York teams joined America East... Senior Kristin Higley netted 17 points, while classmate Gia Sanders recorded four rebounds, six points and three swatted shots... Rookie Janea Aiken also finished with a solid stat line of 13 points, eight boards and two assists... Three Seawolves broke double-digit points, including senior Dana Ferraro who posted 10 points and 11 rebounds.

* at Binghamton 64, Maine 57

Bearcat senior Laine Kurpniace posted a 21-point performance to lead four teammates in double figures... Fellow senior Laura Sario chipped in 12 points and four assists... Binghamton finished with 11 thefts and forced the Black Bears into 27 turnovers... Junior Colleen Kilmurray led the Black Bears with 16 points... Christina Mosher tied the game high with eight rebounds... Maine outrebounded Binghamton, 34-30.

Sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis finished one assist shy of her second triple-double this season, recording 17 points, a conference-best 17 rebounds and nine assists... Junior Kelli Poles also added a double-double of 10 points and 10 rebounds, and classmate Amy Rosenkrantz contributed 17 points of her own... Boston U. senior Cheri Raffo matched the Catamounts with her team-high 17 points... The Terriers went 16-for-18 from the charity stripe.

PILYPAITIS PICKS UP FIFTH AWARD

Vermont sophomore guard Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) earned her fifth America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week honor for the week ending February 24 by averaging a double-double and nearly capturing her second triple-double in four games. In a 2-0 week, Pilypaitis averaged 18 points and 11.5 rebounds per game. She also averaged 7.0 assists and three steals while shooting 87% from the foul line (20-for-23). The sophomore scored a team-high 19 points in a come-from-behind win at UNH and added six rebounds and five assists. In a win over Boston U., Pilypaitis just missed a triple double with 17 points, a career and conference-high 17 rebounds and nine assists. During the Catamounts' five-game win streak, she is averaging 17.0 ppg, 10.4 rpg and shooting 90% from the stripe. This is Pilypaitis' second straight weekly award.

HIGH FIVE FOR ROOKIE BELIVEAU

New Hampshire freshman forward Denise Beliveau (Framingham, Mass./Framingham) also picked up her fifth award of the season by snagging the Rookie of the Week award in a very competitive week amongst the freshmen. The rookie averaged 15.5 ppg, 7.0 rpg and 3.0 spg last week in two games, while shooting 48% from the field and 5-for-12 from beyond the three-point arc. Earlier in the week, Beliveau went 5-for-7 from the field for 13 first-half points against Vermont en route to a 15-point effort. The forward also swiped away four steals and pulled down seven boards in 39 minutes of action. Beliveau delivered 11 second-half points against UMBC and was the only Wildcat to post in double-figures, totaling 16 points in the game. She also pulled down a game-high seven rebounds in the game.

HONOR ROLL

Other players from around the league to put up impressive numbers include Stony Brook's Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) who averaged a 10-point, 11-rebound double-double and became the second player in Seawolf history to top 1,000 career rebounds. Stony Brook rookie Kirsten Jeter (Elmont, N.Y./Elmont) averaged 10 ppg and 7.0 rpg for the week... Albany senior Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) became the school's career blocks leader on Saturday with 147 career rejections, as well as fifth in conference history. She also averaged 12.0 ppg and six boards on the week... Also making school history was UMBC's Kristin Drabyn (Avon, Ind./Avon). Drabyn broke the all-time school record for three-pointers with her 153rd. She tied her career-high 24 points later in the week against New Hampshire, including five more three-pointers and a perfect 7-for-7 from the free-throw line... For the Terriers, senior Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterdon) netted 17.5 ppg while shooting 44.4% from the field and 55.6% from three-point land. The guard turned the ball over just once all week playing 30.5 minutes per game.

THE REPORT IS IN

In the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com released on Monday, February 25, just one team made a significant move. Vermont used wins over Boston U. and New Hampshire to move up 12 points to the 115th spot. The Report also highlighted top-50 RPI teams over the last 10 years that were not invited to the NCAA Tournament. The 2006 Stony Brook Seawolves and 2007 Hartford Hawks both fit into that category, and were told they had too

many top-50 losses. Both teams went on to the WNIT Tournament. Hartford, the only America East team in the top-50 this season, owns a 2-1 record against its RPI peers.

CRUNCH TIME

The season is entering its last two weeks before the 2008 America East Championship in West Hartford and teams have 3-4 games remaining on their schedules. The number one seed is still up for grabs, along with several other seeds, including the important four and five slots. The Catamounts (10-3), winners of five in a row, are just 1/2 a game behind the Hawks (10-2) having played one extra contest. The Great Danes are then just one game behind Vermont and 1 1/2 games out of first-place. Tie-breakers for championship seeding include (in this order) head-to-head competition, record against teams in descending order of standings, and conference road record.

TRIPLE THAT

Vermont sophomore guard Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) recorded the first triple-double in UVM women's basketball history, and the sixth in Division I this season, on February 13 against Hartford. In the 69-66 win over the Hawks, Pilypaitis posted 18 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists. It was the first triple-double in America East women's basketball since Boston U.'s Adrienne Norris pulled the trick against New Hampshire on February 4, 2004.

WILDCARD PACKCASTS ANNOUNCED

As part of the America East Conference's first-ever enhanced streaming package, two women's basketball games have been added to the lineup as wildcard games determined by the conference standings. Those games include the match-up Saturday, February 9 between the Boston University Terriers and the Hartford Hawks, and the Binghamton Bearcats' trip to Durham, N.H. on March 1st to face the New Hampshire Wildcats.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Hartford's home-court win streak is now at 21 games after defeating New Hampshire at Chase Arena last Saturday. That streak is tied with Old Dominion's home-court win streak for longest active in the nation. The Hawks will have to wait until Saturday, March 1 against Maine to try to extend it.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE PART 2

As one would expect, winning at home is a must to be successful during conference play. The top five teams in the conference standings as of Monday combine for just three home losses in league games. Home teams, despite going 3-5 last week, have the 38-18 (.679) winning advantage in conference play.

OVER THE HILL - 40 POINTS

On Saturday, February 2 at Case Gymnasium, Vermont sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa,

Ontario/St. Peter) put up a career-high 40 points against Boston University that also tied the school record. It was the first 40-point performance in the conference since Boston U.'s Katie Meinhardt netted 43 points against Stony Brook during the 2005 America East Championship.

MILESTONE WATCH

Stony Brook senior Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) became just the second Seawolf player in program history to record 1,000 rebounds on Saturday, February 23 against Albany. At the end of the day, she sat with 1,003 boards, just 37 away from cracking the America East record book for most career rebounds. Albany's Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) and UMBC's Kristin Drabyn (Avon, Ind./Avond) both became their school leaders in career blocks and career three-pointers, respectively, over the weekend. Binghamton senior Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) became the third America East player to reach 1,000 career points this season, and the second Bearcat to do so. Sario, who hit the milestone at Boston University on Wednesday, February 13, joins teammate Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47) who notched her 1,000th career point earlier in the year on Tuesday, January 22 at Hartford. Kurpniece and Sario became just the third and fourth Bearcats to score 1,000 points while playing all four years at the NCAA Division I level. Boston University senior Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterdon) also exceeded the 1,000 career point mark on Wednesday, February 6 at Albany on her second of three treys on the afternoon.

PACK THE HOUSE

The 2008 "Pack the House" Challenge is an NCAA initiative to increase attendance at women's basketball games all across the Division I level. Seven America East schools participated this year and will vie for both the conference and national award. The challenge was to choose one game between January 1-February 17 with the goal of setting an attendance record while competing against schools in their own conference as well as all Division I schools for a chance to be the 2008 NCAA Women's Basketball Pack the House Challenge Champion and win great prizes.

CATS CLIMBING THE CHARTS

The Catamounts have three players among the top-ten scorers in the conference right now. Only the Wildcats also have multiple players in that elite group (two players). For Vermont, Courtney Pilypaitis (16.4 ppg), Amy Rosenkrantz (13.4) and May Kotsopoulos (12.4) are cruising in double-digits.

WHAT SOPHOMORE SLUMP?

Taking a look back at the 2006-07 America East All-Rookie team, great rookie campaigns are making the smooth transition to successful sophomore seasons. Below is a chart of the five sophomores' numbers this year, along with those of Erica Beverly, the 2006 Rookie of the Year in her first full year back on the court.

BALL THIEVES

Teams better be careful to hang on to the ball tight while playing Albany, the team with a conference-best 10.77 steals per game to their name, including 10.46 in conference games. In 26 games this season, the Great Danes have stolen the ball away from opponents 280 times. Three different players rank in the conference's top 10 in steals, including senior Gia Sanders at fifth averaging 1.92 steals per game. Junior TaNika Thrower (1.73) ranks seventh, and sophomore Charity Iromuanya sits at tenth averaging 1.58 steals per game.

TWICE AS NICE

Hartford became the first America East team to knock off a ranked opponent this season with its 54-51 victory at home against #24 Michigan State on Saturday, December 22. MSU's arrival in West Hartford marked the second game in two years that a ranked opponent has played Hartford at the Reich Family Pavilion. The first team to do so was 22nd-ranked Brigham Young on December 2, 2006, who the Hawks defeated, 60-43. Hartford is now 2-0 against ranked opponents at home. Not only did the Hawks crack the Spartans, but they also got to 6'9" Wade Trophy Watch List candidate Allyssa DeHaan who they held to 13 points and 3 rebounds, both under the sophomore's averages. The victory doubled the votes the Hawks received in the national coaches' poll the following week where they had the 26th most votes.

ZOO CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday, December 16 when the Catamounts defeated Harvard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley reached 200 wins through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Associate Head Coach under Chris Wiegus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and then-conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEP COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I pre-season poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when

Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters were played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving pre-season credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I pre-season poll. Hartford is receiving 17 votes in the most recent coaches' poll released on February 19, 2008. The next coaches' poll will be released on Tuesday, February 26.

TV TIME

ESPN will broadcast the first nationally-television regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports

On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games--officially called PackCasts--which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on

Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East.
