In a rematch of the 2007 America East Championship, the Retrievers visit Chase Arena... The Hawks hope to defend an 18 game home winning streak... Two of the league's top scorers will be on the floor in UMBC's Carlee Cassidy (17.6 ppg) and Hartford's Danielle Hood (15.8).

Sophomore Catamount Courtney Pilypaitis became the first player in the conference to hit 40 points in a game since the 2004-05 season... Pilypaitis scored 40 points on 11-of-22 shooting from the field and 13-of-16 from the free-throw line... Terrier senior Cheri Raffo scored a personal and team-high 27 points to come within five points of reaching 1,000 for her career.

*** at Albany 77, Stony Brook 65**

Junior TaNika Thrower led four Great Danes in double-digits with 19 points on the day... Senior Gia Sanders notched eight points and a game-high 15 boards... Albany outrebounded the visitors, 45-35, and drew 26 fouls... For the Seawolves, sophomore Kairsten Nunn scored a team-high 23 points, while rookie Kirsten Jeter netted 15 points.

*** New Hampshire 77, at UMBC 67**

Sophomore Candace Williams scored 19 points to lead the Wildcats to their second straight victory... Classmate Amy Simpson handed out 11 assists... UNH outscored the Retrievers in the second half, 47-35, after trailing by two points going into halftime... UMBC sophomore Carlee Cassidy scored 20 points and played all 40 minutes.

PILYPAITIS, HINTON NAMED CO-WINNERS

A pair of sophomores--Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ont./St. Peter) and Boston University's Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock)--shared the America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week award for the week ending February 3.

In the only game of the week for the Catamounts, Pilypaitis tied the Vermont single game scoring record, pouring in a career-high 40 points against Boston University, including 24 points in the second half alone. She also grabbed seven rebounds and handed out four assists in 40 minutes. Despite a Catamount loss, the sophomore guard went 11-for-22 from the field, 5-for-7 from three-point range and 13-for-16 from the foul line. Pilypaitis scored 22 of the final 34 points for Vermont in the final 14 minutes of the game. This is her third weekly award of the season and second consecutive.

Hinton averaged a double-double in a two-win week for the Terriers. The sophomore forward posted 18.0 points per game and 10.5 rebounds per game while shooting 68.8% from the field. She also had a hot hand from the charity stripe, converting 14-of-16 attempts for 87.5%. Against UMBC on Wednesday, Hinton poured in 23 points and a career-high 14 rebounds, including eight on the offensive end, to help the Terriers overcome a 19-point first-half deficit. Fifteen of her points came in the second half during Boston U.'s rally. This is Hinton's first player of the week award. She won the rookie award once last season.

STONY BROOK'S JETER TALLIES FIRST AWARD

Stony Brook freshman forward Kirsten Jeter (Elmont, N.Y./Elmont) earned the first Rookie of the Week award for February by setting a new career-high in points. On Tuesday night, she scored a personal best 17 points against league-leading Hartford. In addition, she tallied two steals and one assist. At Albany on Saturday, the rookie netted 15 points, and snagged six boards and four thefts. For the week Jeter shot 53.8% from the floor and 4-for-5 from the free-throw line. The award is Jeter's first this season.

HONOR ROLL

Among others under consideration for the weekly awards, Albany's TaNika Thrower and New Hampshire's Amy Simpson both led their teams to perfect 2-0 weeks. Thrower (Houston, Texas, Northbrook) averaged 17.0 ppg, 3.5 rpg, 3.5 apg, and 3.0 spg last week in wins over Binghamton and Stony Brook. Simpson (Waterford, Conn./Waterford) averaged 8.0 assists per game, including an 11 assist night at UMBC. She also added 14.0 ppg and 5.5 rpg. Also last week, Stony Brook's Kairsten Nunn (Bowie, Md./Coastal Carolina) hit a game and career-high 23 points at Albany and Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) drained 24 points on 11-for-16 field goal shooting against the Seawolves.

THE REPORT IS IN

In the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com released on Monday, February 4, all but two teams moved up in the rankings, including three teams taking 12 steps upward. Boston University, Albany and New Hampshire, each going 2-0 last week, made the largest improvements in the conference. Hartford and Vermont each stepped up two spots and continued to be the top two America East teams at 44

and 129, respectively.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Hartford's home-court win streak is 18 games, only second in the NCAA behind Old Dominion who extended its streak to 19 over the weekend. The Hawks will try to tie it up for best record in the nation on Tuesday night when they host UMBC at 7 p.m. in a rematch of last year's America East Championship final.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE PART 2

As one would expect, winning at home is a must to be successful during conference play. The top three teams in the league standings as of Monday, February 4 (Hartford, Boston U., Vermont) are a combined 11-0 on their home courts vs. league foes. Home teams, who went 6-2 last week, have the 22-10 (.688) winning advantage in conference play.

OVER THE HILL - 40 POINTS

On Saturday, February 2 at Case Gymnasium, Vermont sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) put up a career-high 40 points against Boston University that also tied the school record. It was the first 40-point performance in the conference since Boston U.'s Katie Meinhardt netted 43 points against Stony Brook during the 2005 America East Championship.

MILESTONE WATCH

Boston University senior Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterdon) scored a career-high 27 points on Saturday against Vermont to come within five points of breaking the 1,000 point plateau. Raffo will next get a chance to reach the mark on Wednesday at Albany. Tipoff is at noon to be televised on Time Warner-Albany. Binghamton senior Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47) notched her 1,000th career point earlier in the year on Tuesday, January 22 at Hartford. Kurpniece became just the third Bearcat to score 1,000 points while playing all four years at the NCAA Division I level. Another senior Bearcat, Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio), sits at 983 and is averaging 9.9 points per game. Kurpniece and Hartford's Danielle Hood are currently the only America East players in four digit points.

PACK THE HOUSE

The 2008 "Pack the House" Challenge is an NCAA initiative to increase attendance at women's basketball games all across the Division I level. Seven America East schools will participate this year, and two of them are slated for this week. Binghamton will hold their event when it hosts Vermont on Tuesday night at 7 p.m. Albany hopes to Pack the House on Wednesday for a noon time game against Boston University to be broadcast live on Time Warner in Albany. The challenge is to choose one game between January 1-February 17 with the goal of setting an attendance record while competing against schools in their own conference as well as all Division I schools for a chance to be the 2008 NCAA Women's Basketball Pack the House Challenge Champion and win great prizes.

CATS CLIMBING THE CHARTS

The Catamounts and the Wildcats each have three players among the top-ten scorers in the conference right now, while no other team has multiple players in that elite group. For Vermont, Courtney Pilypaitis (16.3 ppg), Amy Rosenkrantz (13.5) and May Kotsopoulos (11.5) are cruising,

while New Hampshire's Ashley Cerniglia (12.2), Amy Simpson (11.7) and Denise Beliveau (11.3) are draining double-digit points per game. Of those six, Cerniglia is the only senior, while four others are sophomores or freshmen.

WHAT SOPHOMORE SLUMP?

Taking a look back at the 2006-07 America East All-Rookie team, great rookie campaigns are making the smooth transition to successful sophomore seasons. Below is a chart of the five sophomores' numbers this year, along with those of Erica Beverly, the 2006 Rookie of the Year in her first full year back on the court.

BALL THIEVES

Teams better be careful to hang on to the ball tight while playing Albany, the team with a conference-best 11.35 steals per game to their name. In twenty games this season, the Great Danes have stolen the ball away from opponents 227 times. In conference games, that mark jumps to 11.86 steals per game. Four different players rank in the conference's top 11 in steals, including senior Gia Sanders at fourth averaging 1.94 steals per game. Junior TaNika Thrower (1.90) ranks third, senior Kristin Higy is tied at eighth with 1.70 spg, and sophomore Charity Iromuanya rounds the Great Danes out at 11th with 1.50 spg.

TWICE AS NICE

Hartford became the first America East team to knock off a ranked opponent this season with its 54-51 victory at home against #24 Michigan State on Saturday, December 22. MSU's arrival in West Hartford marked the second game in two years that a ranked opponent has played Hartford at the Reich Family Pavilion. The first team to do so was 22nd-ranked Brigham Young on December 2, 2006, who the Hawks defeated, 60-43. Hartford is now 2-0 against ranked opponents at home. Not only did the Hawks crack the Spartans, but they also got to 6'9" Wade Trophy Watch List candidate Allyssa DeHaan who they held to 13 points and 3 rebounds, both under the sophomore's averages. The victory doubled the votes the Hawks received in the national coaches' poll the following week where they had the 26th most votes.

200 CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday, December 16 when the Catamounts defeated Harvard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley reached 200 wins through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Associate Head Coach under Chris Wiegus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-

best and then-conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Orleans, Ontario/St. Peter's) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maximum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEL COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters were played at America East home courts.

ONE OF OUR OWN

For the second consecutive season, Hartford is one of those teams receiving preseason credit. The Hawks, finishing 25-9 last year, were one of 33 teams also receiving votes in the USA Today/ESPN Division I preseason poll. Hartford is receiving 14 votes in the most recent coaches' poll released on January 29, 2008. The next coaches' poll will be released on Tuesday, February 5.

TV TIME

ESPN2 will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships. On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games--officially called PackCasts--which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network

and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. The semifinals are slated for Saturday, March 15 at 5 and 7:30 p.m., and the champions will be crowned in the title game on Sunday, March 16 at 5 p.m. Both Saturday's and Sunday's games will be broadcast live on NESN and Time Warner Cable.

FRIENDSHIP INKS SPONSORSHIP DEAL

Friendship Cottage Cheese will again be the title sponsor of the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship at the University of Hartford, it was announced on October 25 by Patrick Nero, Commissioner of America East. The event, which is now known as the America East Women's Basketball Championship Presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese, will be held at the 3,977-seat Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. It is the sixth time in the last seven years that Friendship Cottage Cheese has served as the title sponsor. Friendship Cottage Cheese has sponsored each of the championships played in Hartford since 2002.

ALBANY GREAT DANES (6-14, 4-3 AE)

UAlbany went undefeated in two games last week... The Great Danes recorded an 80-60 win over Binghamton on Wednesday and a 77-65 victory over Stony Brook at the annual Big Purple Growl... Sophomore guard TaNika Thrower (Houston, Texas/Northbrook) led the team in both wins... Thrower scored 15 points to go along with five assists, three steals and three rebounds against the Seawolves and followed with a 19-point performance, along with four boards, three steals and two assists against the Bearcats... Senior forward Kristin Higgy (Akron, Ohio/North Canton Hoover) scored 12 points in the win over Binghamton and 15 points against Stony Brook... Senior forward Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bulis School) returned to the court for the Great Danes against Binghamton, after missing two games with a hand injury... After recording just three points and two rebounds in 20 minutes

against the Bearcats, Sanders returned to her defensive form against Stony Brook, grabbing a career-high 15 rebounds and recording two blocks... She also finished with eight points, going 6-of-8 from the free throw line... Senior forward Sherri Mikus (Duncannon, Pa./Susquehanna) continued her offensive output for the Great Danes, scoring 15 points to go along with three steals, two assists and a block against Binghamton, and following with 12 points and five rebounds against Stony Brook... UAlbany will continue its four-game homestand with games against Boston U. on Wednesday at 12 p.m. for the annual Commitment to Education Day and hosting New Hampshire on Sunday at 2 p.m.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (6-14, 4-3 AE)

Senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia) moved into eight place all time in program history with 1,035 career points. She surpassed Helene Thomas (1981-85), who scored 1,018 points and Jen Blues (2002-06), who netted 1,019 points... senior guard Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Tapiolalonen) enters the week with 983 career points. She is 17 points away from becoming the 11th player in school history to reach the 1,000-point mark and fourth since the program moved up to the Division I level prior to the 2001-02 campaign. The Terriers went 2-0 last week, overcoming a 19-point deficit to UMBC, 72-62, and claiming an 83-73 victory over Vermont on Saturday... A few days earlier, Hinton and junior Amarachi Umez-Eronini (Washington, D.C./Woodrow Wilson) each recorded double-doubles, as BU defeated UMBC, 72-62, on Wednesday. Umez-Eronini brought down a career-high 16 rebounds and tallied 13 points, while Hinton poured in a game-high 23 points to go along with a career-high 14 boards. BU dominated on the glass, out-rebounding UMBC, 50-29, and collected 27 offensive boards. The Terriers scored 24 second-chance points, while holding the Retrievers to six. BU also took advantage of 16 UMBC miscues to score 23 points off turnovers.

Versus Binghamton, a trio of Black Bears tossed in a game-high 15 points, including Amanda Tewksbury (Clinton, N.J./North Hunterdon H.S.), Brittany Boser (Palmer, Mass./Palmer H.S.) and Emily Rousseau (Biddeford, Maine/Biddeford H.S.) ... It marked the fifth time in the last six games Tewksbury notched double-figures in scoring ... Maine also pulled down 40 rebounds in the contest versus Binghamton, and out-rebounded the Bearcats by a 40-37 margin ... Maine has not allowed the opposition to out-rebound it in any of the eight America East games this season ... Boser and Tewksbury each pulled down seven boards against Binghamton, while Kris Younan (Chicago, Ill./East Leyden H.S.) recorded a game-best eight rebounds ... Maine has a mid-week bye and returns to the hardwood Saturday at 12 p.m., when it travels to Baltimore to face UMBC at the RAC ... The Black Bears defeated the Retrievers earlier this season, 67-55.

UMBC RETRIEVERS (6-14, 2-5 AE)

UMBC dropped two America East Conference games last week, falling at Boston University, 72-62, on Jan. 30, before losing at home to New Hampshire, 77-67, on Feb. 2... The Retrievers led the Terriers by 16 at halftime but were outscored 50-24 in the second half... Sophomore guard Carlee Cassidy (Syracuse, N.Y./Westhill) scored all 17 of her points in the first half... Junior guard Chantay Frazier (Carthage, Miss./Choctaw Central/Seminole State) led the Retrievers with a career-high 21 points... Senior guard Kristin Drabyn (Avon, Ind./Avon) added 18 points on 6-of-9 shooting, including 3-of-4 from 3-point range... UMBC, which had been 4-0 when leading at halftime heading into the week, again lost after holding the halftime advantage against the Wildcats... Cassidy posted her seventh 20-point performance of the season... Frazier scored 14 points and added a career-high eight rebounds... Freshman guard Michele Brokans (Lansdale, Pa./Lansdale Catholic) scored a career-high nine points and tied a career best with six assists to go along with five boards... Drabyn ranks second all-time at UMBC with 143 career three-pointers, just eight shy of the school record... Cassidy is averaging a team- and conference-best 17.6 ppg this season... She has scored in double figures 18 times this season, including the last 13... The Retrievers take on Hartford on Feb. 5 in a rematch of the 2007 America East Championship game before returning home to face Maine on Feb. 9.

On Wednesday the Wildcats set a school record for 3-pointers in a single game with 12 in a 70-55 victory over the Black Bears ... Senior captain Ashley Cerniglia (Pittsford, N.Y./Sutherland) has now recorded back-to-back double-doubles with 19 points and 11 rebounds, while sophomore guard Amy Simpson (Waterford, Conn./Waterford) also provided an offensive spark with a team-high 21 points and five assists ... Simpson's 11 assists were just two shy of the school record and was the first 10-plus assist game for a Wildcat in exactly five years as Colleen Mullen dished out 10 at Stony Brook on Feb. 2, 2003. Beliveau and Candace Williams each pulled down eight boards in the games for the Wildcats.

STONY BROOK SEAWOLVES (6-14, 1-6 AE)

Stony Brook lost both of its games last week. The Seawolves were led by Rookie of the Week Kirsten Jeter (Elmont, N.Y./Elmont) in their 70-55 loss to Hartford. Up 25-23 at halftime, Hartford utilized a 15-2 run to start the second half. Stony Brook did not go quietly and jumped right back into the game with a run of its own, this time a 14-3 spurt helped by eight points from senior Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) over a span of 4:30 to cut the Hartford deficit to just four. Senior Aly Young (Lodi, Calif./Salt Lake CC) had 14 points and Ferraro had her 23rd double double of her career with 10 points, all in the second half, and 10 rebounds. Stony Brook traveled to Albany and fell 77-65, on Saturday evening. Sophomore Kairsten Nunn was the player of the game for Stony Brook scoring a game and career-high 23 points. A pair of freshmen, Misha Horsey (Wyncote, Pa./Cheltenham) and Jeter led the Seawolves in the early going, combining to score all eight of their points. On Albany's end, hot shooting and Britney McGee's three three-pointers sparked the home team early as it led 17-12. Nunn, starting her first game in more than a month, was key for the Seawolves with eight points in a three-minute stretch including two long threes as they held a 21-19 advantage. Albany answered back with a 15-2 run over the final six minutes of the first half aided by seven points from Kristin Higy. A Jeter bucket from the left side was the only points Stony Brook could manage as it went into the locker room down 35-29. Nunn's efficiency on the offensive end kept the Albany lead in single digits as she scored eight of the Seawolves' 10 points during a six-minute stretch. Back-to-back baskets from Ferraro and Jeter cut the Albany lead to just five with under 10 minutes to play. Stony Brook is on the road for both of its games this week. It travels to New Hampshire for a contest against the Wildcats on Wednesday

evening before hitting the road once again for a Sunday matinee at Vermont.

VERMONT CATAMOUNTS (14-6, 5-2 AE)

Vermont moved to 14-6 overall and 5-2 in America East with an 83-73 loss at Boston U. in the only game of the week for the Catamounts ... Sophomore Co-Player of the Week Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) tied the UVM single game scoring record, pouring in a career-high 40 points (24 in the second half alone) ... She also grabbed seven rebounds and handed out four assists in 40 minutes ... Pilypaitis went 11-for-22 from the field, 5-for-7 from three-point range and 13-for-16 from the foul line ...
