The Terriers finished the game on a 16-0 run, including a 9-0 streak in overtime... Seven of Boston U.'s nine points in the extra session came from the foul line... Senior Kasey Devine and junior Amarachi Umez-Eronini each finished with a double-double, while junior Christine Kinneary recorded 11 points and seven assists... For the Great Danes, senior Gia Sanders posted 16 points, 10 rebounds, two blocks and two steals before fouling out... With the win, the Terriers claim the #3 seed, while the Great Danes will play as the #4 seed.

* at Vermont 63, Binghamton 49

The Catamounts forced 20 Bearcat turnovers to move to 13-1 at Patrick Gymnasium... Sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis scored a team-high 20 points and broke the school record with 27 straight free-throws made spanning four games... Classmate May Kotsopoulos also finished in double-digits, 12 points and recorded three steals... Binghamton outrebounded the hosts, 38-35... Senior Laine Kurpniece netted a game-high 21 points. Sophomore Erica Carter and junior Laura Franceski each brought down seven boards.

* at Stony Brook 77, New Hampshire 37

The victory marked the highest margin of victory for the Seawolves this season... Five Seawolves reached double figures in points, led by senior Aly Young and freshman Jodie Plikus, each with 13 points... Stony Brook also won the battle on the glass, picking up 47 rebounds to New Hampshire's 37... The Wildcats shot 15% for the game, with sophomore Amy Simpson representing the team's highest scorer with eight points.

* Hartford 78, at UMBC 68

The Hawks captured their third straight regular season crown outright with the victory... Senior Danielle Hood matched her season-high of 28 points which she set the previous game, fueled by 18 points in the second half... Junior MaryLynne Schaefer hit four three-pointers and four free-throws for 16 points... The Retrievers, who led by two points at the intermission, played just seven student-athletes, including four who played the entire 40 minutes on the court... Junior Chantay Frazier drained a team-high 26 points.

HOOD CLAIMS FINAL AWARD OF THE YEAR

Hartford senior forward Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor/Walter Panas) earned the final America East Women's Basketball Player of the Week for the 2007-08 season by leading Hartford to the regular season crown. Hood began the week scoring 28 points, a season high, against Stony Brook, making the most of Senior Night at Chase Arena. Hood then matched that point total in the regular season finale at UMBC on Saturday night, with another 28-point performance. Against the Seawolves, Hood scored 20 first half points, just about half of the Hawks' total first frame output. She finished the game with a 10-for-15 effort from the field and a perfect 8-for-8 at the free throw line. The senior added five rebounds and an assist. Against the Retrievers, Hood capitalized in the second half where she scored 18 points. She finished the game connecting on 13-of-19 shots and made both of her foul shots. Hood also added five rebounds and a block to her credit. For the week, Hood shot 68% from the field (23-for-34) and never missed a free throw in 10 attempts.

COLABELLA STEPS UP

UMBC forward Meghan Colabella (Upper Montclair, N.J./Montclair) received the Rookie of the Week honors after another outstanding week while also seeing her playing time increase due to a short bench. The freshman averaged 14 ppg, 5 rpg and 2 spg in two games last week. Colabella scored a career-high 19 points on a perfect 6-for-6 shooting effort against Boston University, including 3-for-3 from three-point range and 4-for-4 from the charity stripe. She added a career-best four steals to go along with six rebounds and two assists in 31 minutes. Colabella played all 40 minutes against Hartford for the first time in her career, contributing nine points and four rebounds while making 5-of-6 free throw attempts. She is averaging 11.5 ppg and shooting 57.5% in her last six games. This is the second straight week Colabella has received the award and the third time this season.

HONOR ROLL

The last week of the regular season brought some great action, and some great, noteworthy performances. UMBC junior guard Chantay Frazier (Carthage, Miss./Choctaw Central/Seminole State) averaged 22 ppg and 7.5 rpg while playing the full 40 minutes in both of the Retrievers' games last week... Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) scored 20 points and brought down seven rebounds in last week's game against Binghamton. The sophomore guard set a new school record for consecutive free throws made, connecting on 27 straight spanning four games.... Albany senior forward Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) finished a week that saw Albany go 1-1 with 15 ppg and 7.5 rpg. she recorded her sixth double-double of the season against Boston University... Boston U. junior guard Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) played 42.5 mpg last week, recording 15 ppg, 3.0 rpg and 7.0 apg.

THE REPORT IS IN

In the most recent Ratings Percentage Index (RPI) report on rpiratings.com released on Monday, March 10, the only significant move was a 17 step drop by Maine. The last full report will be released next Monday, March 17 and the NCAA Selection show will air on ESPN later that night from 7-8 p.m.

THE CHAMPS ARE BACK

The Hartford Hawks (14-2 in America East) clinched a share of the regular season crown with a win over Stony Brook last Wednesday, and then sealed the deal on their third straight regular season title with a victory at UMBC Saturday night. It is the first time since Vermont in 2001-02 that the regular season champion and No. 1 seed for the conference tournament finished with more than one loss in league play.

PLANTING THE SEEDS

The bracket for the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship presented by Friendship Cottage Cheese in West Hartford, Conn. March 13-16 is set. The only seeds still up in the air entering the last day of competition were the three and four seeds, which was decided by Boston University's come-from-behind overtime victory over Albany at Case Gym on Saturday afternoon. The University of Maine (7-22 overall, 4-12 in America East) and Stony Brook University (7-22, 2-14) will meet in Thursday night's first round game as the eight and nine seeds, respectively. The winner will take on first-seeded Hartford (24-5, 14-2) on Friday at 6 p.m. in the first game of session three. The second quarterfinal in the session will pit No. 5 Binghamton (11-18, 9-7) and No. 4 Albany (12-17, 10-6) together in a series the Great Danes swept this season.

Earlier on Friday, the first two quarterfinals will be played. At 12 p.m., No. 7 New Hampshire (7-21, 4-12) and No. 2 Vermont (22-7, 13-3) will play, while No. 6 UMBC (9-20, 5-11) and No. 3 Boston U. (18-11, 11-5) will compete half an hour after the first game ends.

PACKCASTS RETURN TO TOURNEY

For the second consecutive season, Pack Network will produce the first round and quarterfinals of the America East Women's Basketball Championship on March 13-14 at the University of Hartford's Chase Arena. The America East PackCasts will be streamed live on AmericaEast.com where archived enhanced streamed games from the regular season can also be found. All five PackCasts will feature multiple camera angles, on-screen scoreboard, graphics, notes and more.

SEMIFINAL SATURDAY ON NESN

The semifinal games on Saturday evening beginning at 5 p.m. will be televised live on NESN. Eric Frede will have the play-by-play, while Leah Secondo will provide the color analysis.

CHAMPIONSHIP TILT ON CSN

The title game on Sunday at 5 p.m. will be featured live on Comcast SportsNet, available in more than 3.7 million households throughout New England as well as in the Baltimore-Washington D.C. region. Frede and Secondo will once again have the call.

TRIPLE THAT

Vermont sophomore guard Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) recorded the first triple-double in UVM women's basketball history, and the sixth in Division I this season, on February 13 against Hartford. In the 69-66 win over the Hawks, Pilypaitis posted 18 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists. It was the first triple-double in America East women's basketball since Boston U.'s Adrienne Norris pulled the trick against New Hampshire on February 4, 2004.

WILDCARD PACKCASTS ANNOUNCED

As part of the America East Conference's first-ever enhanced streaming package, two women's basketball games have been added to the lineup as wildcard games determined by the conference standings. Those games include the match-up Saturday, February 9 between the Boston University Terriers and the Hartford Hawks, and the Binghamton Bearcats' trip to Durham, N.H. on March 1st to face the New Hampshire Wildcats.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Hartford's home-court win streak is now at 23 games with a win over Stony Brook on its March 5 Senior Day. That streak is one game behind Old Dominion's home-court win streak for longest active in the nation. The Hawks will try to extend that streak when they host the America East Championship March 13-16.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE PART 2

As one would expect, winning at home is a must to be successful during conference play. The top three teams in the conference standings each finished the season with perfect 8-0 records in league action. Home teams, despite going 4-4 last week, have the 44-28 (.611) winning advantage in conference play.

OVER THE HILL - 40 POINTS

On Saturday, February 2 at Case Gymnasium, Vermont sophomore Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) put up a career-high 40 points against Boston University that also tied the school record. It was the first 40-point performance in the conference since Boston U.'s Katie Meinhardt netted 43 points against Stony Brook during the 2005 America East Championship.

MILESTONE WATCH

Stony Brook senior Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) became just the second Seawolf player in program history to record 1,000 rebounds on Saturday, February 23 against Albany. She now sits with 1,016 boards, just 24 away from cracking the America East record book for most career rebounds. Albany's Gia Sanders (Bowie, Md./The Bullis School) and UMBC's Kristin Drabyn (Avon, Ind./Avond) both became their school leaders in career blocks and career three-pointers, respectively, over the same weekend. Binghamton senior Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolankylä) became the third America East player to reach 1,000 career points this season, and the second Bearcat to do so. Sario, who hit the milestone at Boston University on Wednesday, February 13, joins teammate Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47) who notched her 1,000th career point earlier in the year on Tuesday, January 22 at Hartford. Kurpniece and Sario became just the third and fourth Bearcats to score 1,000 points while playing all four years at the NCAA Division I level. Boston University senior Cheri Raffo (Morristown, N.J./North Hunterdon) also exceeded the 1,000 career point mark on Wednesday, February 6 at Albany on her second of three treys on the afternoon.

PACK THE HOUSE

The 2008 "Pack the House" Challenge is an NCAA initiative to increase attendance at women's basketball games all across the Division I level. Seven America East schools participated this year and will vie for both the conference and national award. The challenge was to choose one game between January 1-February 17 with the goal of setting an attendance record while competing

against schools in their own conference as well as all Division I schools for a chance to be the 2008 NCAA Women's Basketball Pack the House Challenge Champion and win great prizes.

CATS CLIMBING THE CHARTS

The Catamounts have three players among the top-ten scorers in the conference right now. Only the Retrievers also have multiple players in that elite group (two players). For Vermont, Courtney Pilypaitis (17.1 ppg), Amy Rosenkrantz (13.0) and May Kotsopoulos (12.6) are cruising in double-digits.

WHAT SOPHOMORE SLUMP?

Taking a look back at the 2006-07 America East All-Rookie team, great rookie campaigns are making the smooth transition to successful sophomore seasons. Below is a chart of the five sophomores' numbers this year, along with those of Erica Beverly, the 2006 Rookie of the Year in her first full year back on the court.

BALL THIEVES

Teams better be careful to hang on to the ball tight while playing Albany, the team with a conference-best 10.62 steals per game to their name, including 10.25 in conference games. In 29 games this season, the Great Danes have stolen the ball away from opponents 308 times. Four different players rank among the conference's best in steals, including senior Gia Sanders at fifth averaging 1.93 steals per game. Junior TaNika Thrower (1.62) ranks eighth, sophomore Charity Iromuanya sits at 11th averaging 1.55 steals per game, and senior Kristin Higy is 12th with 1.48 spg.

TWICE AS NICE

Hartford became the first America East team to knock off a ranked opponent this season with its 54-51 victory at home against #24 Michigan State on Saturday, December 22. MSU's arrival in West Hartford marked the second game in two years that a ranked opponent has played Hartford at the Reich Family Pavilion. The first team to do so was 22nd-ranked Brigham Young on December 2, 2006, who the Hawks defeated, 60-43. Hartford is now 2-0 against ranked opponents at home. Not only did the Hawks crack the Spartans, but they also got to 6'9" Wade Trophy Watch List candidate Allyssa DeHaan who they held to 13 points and 3 rebounds, both under the sophomore's averages. The victory doubled the votes the Hawks received in the national coaches' poll the following week where they had the 26th most votes.

200 CLUB

Vermont Head Coach Sharon Dawley picked up her 200th career coaching win on Sunday, December 16 when the Catamounts defeated Harvard at Patrick Gymnasium. Dawley reached 200 wins through 13+ seasons, including four+ seasons with Vermont and nine seasons as the head at Tufts. In between those stints, Dawley spent time as the Assistant Coach and then the Associate Head Coach under Chris Wiegus at Dartmouth of the Ivy League. Ironically, her 200th win came against another Ivy squad, the Crimson of Harvard.

HOTSHOT HINTON

Boston University's sophomore Aly Hinton (Richboro, Pa./Council Rock) put up a personal career-best and then-conference season-high 35 points against Northeastern on Monday, November 19 at The Roof. Hinton led the way in a 94-84 win over the Huskies. The sophomore forward hit 13 of her 16 shots from the field, good for a fiery 81.2% accuracy rate. Hinton also drained all seven of her free-throws and went 2-for-3 from long-range.

THREE FRESH FACES AT THE TOP

America East welcomes three new head coaches this season. Leading the group is all-time conference scoring record-holder Cindy Blodgett heading up the Black Bears at her alma mater ('98). Kristin Cole, previously an assistant at Xavier, signed a contract with New Hampshire this summer, and Michele Cherry stepped up from assistant at Stony Brook to replace the retired Maura McHugh.

FOR YEARS TO COME

Three coaches signed contract extensions during the offseason-- Hartford's Jennifer Rizzotti, UMBC's Phil Stern, and Vermont's Sharon Dawley-- confirming that each of these coaches will be with their respective teams for a minimum of four more years.

HARTFORD PREDICTED TO RECLAIM CROWN

University of Hartford is the unanimous favorite to win the 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship according to a vote of the conference's head coaches. After winning their second-straight regular season crown and playing in the Championship title game in 2007, the Hawks received all eight possible first-place votes, tallying 64 points (coaches are not permitted to vote for their own team).

University of Vermont garnered the final first-place vote and 56 points to finish second in the poll. Binghamton University received 45 points for third-place. Boston University placed fourth with 43 points, and Stony Brook University rounded out the top-five with 32 points. Defending America East Tournament Champion UMBC earned 28 points for sixth-place.

University of Maine, University at Albany and University of New Hampshire filled out the nine-team poll, finishing with 25, 16 and 15 points, respectively.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM NAMED

University of Hartford's Danielle Hood (Cortland Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas), Binghamton University's Laura Sario (Espoo, Finland/Etela-Tapiolanlukio) and University of Vermont's Courtney Pilypaitis (Ottawa, Ontario/St. Peter) were each unanimous selections to the 2007-08 America East Women's Basketball Preseason All-Conference Team. All three players received the maxi-

mum of eight votes from coaches around the conference (coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players) and were all-conference selections from a year ago.

Rounding out the five-player team is Stony Brook University's senior forward Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) and Binghamton's senior center Laine Kurpniece (Riga, Latvia/Riga Secondary School 47). Both were third-team all-conference honorees last season.

STEEL COMPETITION

The 2007-08 composite schedule features eight teams in the USA Today/ESPN Division I pre-season poll, including Connecticut (2nd), Maryland (4th), George Washington (13th), Ohio State (16th), Michigan State (18th), Louisville (23rd), Brigham Young (receiving votes) and Marist (receiving votes). Of those eight teams, two will face multiple America East squads this season when Connecticut plays host to Stony Brook and Hartford, and Marist faces off against Stony Brook, Albany and Hartford. A ninth team (NC State, 25th) participated in Vermont's TD Banknorth Classic. More than half (six of 11) of the definite matchups against preseason poll vote-getters were played at America East home courts.

TV TIME

ESPN2 will broadcast the first nationally-televised regular-season conference game in America East history when Boston University plays host to Vermont at Agganis Arena on Friday, January 25 at 9 p.m. The game is the marquee match-up in the America East Television schedule, which will include more than 50 games on national or regional sports networks in 2007-08.

The America East Men's Basketball Championship game will be shown live on March 15 at 12 noon on ESPN2. It marks the 21st straight year the conference championship has been nationally televised.

America East and ESPN Regional Television will produce 20 games for distribution among regional sports networks and local carriers. The conference television package begins with Vermont at Albany on January 6 in a game which will air on Comcast Sports Net in New England and Fox Sports New York. The game is a re-match of the last two America East Men's Basketball Championships.

On January 13, Hartford plays host to Vermont in a women's game which will air on Comcast Sports Net. The Hawks and Catamounts are the Nos. 1 and 2 selections in the preseason poll. NESN

and Time Warner Cable in Albany will carry the January 16 meeting between Boston University at Albany, the top two choices in the men's preseason poll.

AN "ENHANCED" EXPERIENCE

For the first time in conference history, America East will produce "enhanced streaming" games--officially called PackCasts--which will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone at AmericaEast.com. Through its partnerships with Pack Network and JumpTV Sports, America East will produce eight women's basketball games beginning when Hartford visits Boston University on January 5. The package will include two "wildcard" games to be determined by the conference standings in February.

Each of the conference-produced games will be available for free at the AmericaEastZone on AmericaEast.com. Those games and the enhanced streaming games will be archived at the AmericaEastZone for "on demand" viewing at any time following the broadcast.

A RETURN TO FAMILIAR GROUND

The 2008 America East Women's Basketball Championship returns to Hartford's Chase Family Arena after the 2007 tournament traveled to Binghamton. West Hartford was the home of the tournament each season between 2002-2005. This year's championship will take place March 13-16. The first round game will take place on Thursday, March 13, and the quarterfinals will be played on Friday, March 14. Five Terriers reached double figures, as they improve to 18-11 overall and 11-5 in the America East conference... Devine earned America East's Player of the Game honors after posting 11 points and 10 rebounds with five blocks and three steals, while Umez-Eronini contributed 12 points and 10 rebounds... The win marked head coach Kelly Greenberg's 150th victory as a head coach... BU finishes the regular season with a perfect 11-0 record at Case Gym, with its lone home loss coming at Agganis Arena on Nov. 17 to then-No. 16 Ohio State... Two days earlier, BU drained a program-record 16 three-pointers and was led by junior Christine Kinneary (Plainedge, N.Y./Holy Trinity) with 19 points, as it defeated league foe UMBC, 79-60, at the RAC Arena... Raffo became the Terriers' all-time minutes leader during the game and has now played in 3,638 minutes in the scarlet and white.

It marked the third double-double of the season for Tewksbury, which is tied for most on the team ... Tewksbury scored in double-figures in 12-of-16 America East games this season, while averaging 11.8 points per game in conference play – the eighth highest in the league ... Maine out-rebounded UNH, 37-33 ... The Black Bears were out-rebounded just once in conference play this season ... Maine earned the No. 8-seed in the upcoming America East Tournament and will face ninth-seed Stony Brook on Thursday night at 7 p.m., at Chase Arena in West Hartford, Conn.

UMBC RETRIEVERS (9-20, 5-11 AE)

UMBC finished the season with two home losses, 79-60 to Boston University on March 5, and 78-68 to Hartford on March 8... America East Rookie of the Week forward Meghan Colabella (Upper Montclair, N.J./Montclair) was a perfect 6-for-6 from the floor, including 3-for-3 from three-point range and 4-for-4 from the foul line en route to a career-high 16 points against the Terriers... It was the best perfect night for a Retriever since Sharri Rohde went 7-for-7 against Hartford on Jan. 14, 2006... Junior guard Chantay Frazier (Carthage, Miss./Choctaw Central/Seminole State) was one rebound shy of her first career double-double with 18 points and a career-best nine boards... The Retrievers pushed league-leading Hartford to the limit in the regular-season finale, leading midway through the second half and trailing by only five points late in the game... Frazier equaled her career high with 26 points on a scorching 10-of-13 from the floor... Senior center Amanda Robinson (Lusby, Md./Patuxent) scored a season-high 15 points on a career-best four three-pointers... STONY BROOK SEAWOLVES (7-22, 2-14 AE)

Stony Brook split its two games this week to finish the 2007-08 regular season with a 7-22 overall record, 2-14 in America East play... Stony Brook fell to Hartford, 81-46, on Wednesday evening... Sophomore Kairsten Nunn (Bowie, Md./Coastal Carolina) led the Seawolves with 10 points and senior Dana Ferraro (Middlesex, N.J./Middlesex) had 10 rebounds. The Seawolves came back in style, routing New Hampshire, 77-37, on Senior Day on Saturday afternoon...
