POSTSEASON BREAKDOWN

ORANGE YOU STUNNED?

BATON ROUGE, La.-- For the second time in as many NCAA Championship appearances, the Hartford women's basketball team won its first round game. The No. 10 Hawks defeated No. 7 Syracuse, 59-55 at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center on the LSU campus on Saturday, March 22 in front of an announced crowd of 3,658.

Junior MaryLynne Schaefer scored the last eight points for the Hawks, and the final five points of the game for either team. Schaefer scored a game-high 19 points, going 4-for-9 from beyond the arc despite shooting just 1-for-6 from three-point range in the first half.

No shot was bigger than Schaefer's three-pointer with 13 seconds left to give Hartford the 57-55 lead right after Syracuse's Tasha Harris put up a jumper on the other end of the floor to give the Orange the advantage.

"It was a play already drawn up, that we practiced," said Schaefer on the go-ahead three-pointer. "I was supposed to see the post players, but it looked like they were guarded. I didn't think about it and just shot it. It's a good thing it went in."

Hartford scored the first seven points of the game with a Lisa Etienne three-pointer sandwiched between field goals by Danielle Hood and Erica Beverly. Syracuse did not score their first two points of the game until the 17:05 mark on a Chandra Jones field goal.

Schaefer extended the Hawks lead to 10-2 with her only three-pointer of the first frame at 16:45. Schaefer's next shot at 16 minutes marked the first Hartford miss of the game.

Syracuse made up the differential, and more, with a 10-0 run of their own lasting about five minutes. The Orange run was capped off by a Fantasia Goodwin layup plus a free-throw with the foul. Junior Katie Kelley snapped the run with a jumper at 10:33.

The Hawks converted three of their four foul shots to end the first stanza with a 25-23 advantage. A Jonyce Hollins outside shot from the baseline that banked in just missed the buzzer indicating the end of the first half. Despite the quick start, Hartford only shot 29% from the floor in the half. Syracuse did not fare any better, shooting 27.3% in the first half.

Hartford struggled in the second half and Hood only played eight minutes in the second stanza due to fouling out at 5:33. On Hood's final foul, Syracuse took its first lead since 18:56 of the second when Vionca Murray hit the back end of a two-and-two free-throw line appearance. The Hawks were also in the mist of a four-minute field goal drought, allowing the Orange to make up ground on the scoreboard.

A technical at 3:15 on the Syracuse bench ended up making an impact in the final as Schaefer made both foul shots to give the Hawks a 50-49 advantage.

Syracuse's Goodwin tied the score at 51 with a layup at 2:31, and then pushed the Orange ahead at 1:42 with two free-throws. The Hawks responded with a steal by Etienne setting up Schaefer fast break layup plus the foul, to begin her eight-point run to finish out the game.

Beverly finished with a solid statline of eight rebounds (six offensive), six points, six assists, three blocks and four steals. Etienne also finished in double digits with 10 points.

Erica Morrow was the high scorer for Syracuse with 17 points, Jones posted 12 points and 12 boards.

In the earlier game, Texas A&M, a two seed, easily handled No. 15 Texas-San Antonio, 91-52. The largest lead of the game for the Aggies was 42 points with 4:01 remaining. Four Aggies finished in double-figures led by Mornike Atunrase with 19. Hartford will play the Aggies in second round action Monday night at 8:30 p.m.

A RECORD 28TH

Hartford eclipsed the program's record for wins in a season with its 28th victory on Saturday, March 22. The 59-55 win over Syracuse in the NCAA first round set the record after the Hawks matched the previous record 27 wins, set in 2005-06, by way of the America East Championship title the previous weekend.

TITLE RECLAIMED

After being upset in last year's title game by the six seed, junior guard Lisa Etienne lifted the University of Hartford women's basketball team to its third America East Women's Basketball Championship title in four years with a career-high 19 points against Boston University at Chase Family Arena on Sunday, March 16. With the 61-45 victory over the Terriers, the Hawks received an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament.

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK

The Hartford Hawks have won a postseason game in three consecutive years after the victory over Syracuse in this year's NCAA first round. With its win over Bucknell in the Postseason WNIT last year and an upset win over Temple in the 2006 NCAA Tournament, Hartford became the first America East team to win postseason games in consecutive seasons.

TEN'S THE SEED

Hartford's ten seed in the 2008 NCAA Tournament matches the best seeding in the tournament by an America East team since the bracket expanded to 64 teams. Maine earned a ten seed in 1999 and defeated No. 7 Stanford before falling to No. 2 Old Dominion. When the bracket still included 48 teams, Vermont captured a ninth-seeded spot in 1992 and an eight seed in 1993.

CROWNED AT THE TOP

Traditionally, gaining a top seed in the America East Championship has proven important, as 22 of the 24 championships have now been won by one of the top-three seeds, with the No. 1 seed winning 15. The No. 1 seed has posted a 51-7 (.879) record in championship play, advancing to the championship game 20 of 23 times (note: there was no No. 1 seed in 1994). Hartford continued that trend by winning the 2008 America East Championship as the top seed.

HAWKS VS. TERRIERS X 3

Hartford and Boston University have now met in the title game of the America East Championship three out of the last four years, with 2007 being the only exception. The Hawks won all three match-ups.

DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS

Part of Hartford's success over the past few seasons can be attributed to their overall team defense. Last year, the Hawks finished the season with the fourth-stingiest defense in the nation allowing just 53.2 ppg. In 2007-08, Hartford is ninth in all of Division I with a 53.5 ppg scoring defense. Hartford has also kept its opponents to a 36.4% field goal percentage this season, 23rd-best in the country.

AT A LOSS VS. THE BIG XII

Hartford and Boston University were the only America East teams to face Big XII opponents this year. Both faced Kansas in Lawrence, and both the Hawks and Terriers fell to the Jayhawks. Hartford has never defeated a Big XII team, while having never faced Texas A&M.

HOW THEY GOT HERE

Vermont defeated Dartmouth, 69-50, in Burlington to advance past the first round of the WNIT. Sophomore guard Courtney Pilypaitis finished with 16 points, six rebounds and seven assists, while junior forward Kelli Poles recorded 16 points and seven rebounds. Down 13-11 midway through the first half, the Catamounts used a 27-7 run to end the first 20 minutes and run away with the game.

BACK ON THEIR FEET

Vermont received the America East automatic bid to the Postseason WNIT by virtue of its second-place finish in the regular season standings. The Catamounts were the highest-finishing squad in the league to not receive an invitation to the NCAA Championship. This is the Catamounts' first postseason appearance since 2002, also a WNIT bid.

NIT SWEETHEARTS

Vermont has had more success (3-1) in the Postseason NIT than any other America East team. The Catamounts have made just one previous appearance, in 2002, but advanced all the way through to the Quarterfinals. On the way, Vermont defeated Holy Cross and St. Joseph's (Pa.) before falling to Virginia Tech in Blacksburg, Va. Hartford's first round win last season is the only other team from the conference to record a victory in the postseason tournament.

TRADING BENCHES

Boston College head coach Cathy Inglesse was once upon a time a Catamount. From 1986-93, Inglesse served as head coach of Vermont women's basketball, leading the Catamounts to a 120-74 overall record through seven years, included 87-35 in conference play. UVM won three conference championships under Inglesse's guidance.

BREAKING RANKS

The Catamounts and Eagles last met in December, 2006 at the Rhode Island Invitational where Vermont upset then-No. 22 Boston College, 56-48, and went on to win the tournament. The Eagles lead the all-time series, 4-1.

POSTSEASON BREAKDOWN

AMERICA EAST VS. THE ACC

America East teams went 2-4 against the Atlantic Coast Conference this season. Hartford picked up a win over Virginia at the Hawaii Tournament during the non-conference season, while Maine defeated Miami down at the Hurricanes' own holiday tournament in December. Vermont did not face an ACC team during the 2007-08 season. Boston College went 2-0 against the America East, defeating New Hampshire and Maine.

TAKE ME HOME

This is the second straight year in that an America East team has hosted a Postseason WNIT game. Vermont hosted Dartmouth at Patrick Gym Thursday night, while Hartford hosted Bucknell at Chase Family Arena in 2007.

A CHAMPION AT EVERY LEVEL

Hartford's ninth-year head coach Jen Rizzotti is no stranger to success, having won championships at every level she has competed at. Most notably, Rizzotti was a member of University of Connecticut's 1994-95 35-0 National Championship team, where she earned first-team All-America honors. But her championships did not end there, as she was a member of the WNBA champion Houston Comets in 1999. As she has moved on to the coaching ranks, her knack for winning championships led her to Hartford, where she coached the team to the University's first-ever women's basketball conference title in 2002, back-to-back titles in 2005 and 2006, and now the 2008 crown. Rizzotti's championship pedigree did not begin in college, however, as she won two state championships while at New Fairfield (Conn.) High School. This season Rizzotti has guided the Hawks to their fourth straight 20-win season and third-consecutive regular-season crown.

DARLIN' DAWLEY

With a win over Harvard earlier this season, Vermont head coach Sharon Dawley earned her 200th career coaching win. Under fifth-year coach Dawley, the Catamounts have posted 14 or more wins in four of the last five years, including the first 20+ win season in 2007-08. The Catamounts, however, have gotten bounced from the tournament in the semifinals in each of the last two years.

YOU CAN FEEL GOOD ABOUT HOOD

The Hartford Hawks can feel pretty good in the postseason when senior forward Danielle Hood (Cortlandt Manor, N.Y./Walter Panas) is on the floor. The senior has averaged 13.1 ppg in 12 career conference tournament games, and in last year's final, she drained 17 points. In the process she has led the Hawks to three straight regular season crowns and three conference championships. In five career NCAA and NIT games, Hood has posted 11.8 ppg.

CASE OF THE PILYPAITIS

Vermont's sophomore guard from Ottawa, Ontario, Canada, Courtnay Pilypaitis (St. Peter) became just the fifth sophomore in league history to earn the top honor when she earned the 2008 Player of the Year award. Among the league's top-ten

leaders in 11 of 13 statistical categories, her all-around consistent play has not gone unnoticed.

ETIENNE'S MOMENT

Hartford junior guard Lisa Etienne (Norwalk, Conn./Brien McMahon/Penn State) earned the 2008 Championship's Most Outstanding Player for her part in leading the Hawks to their fourth title. For the tournament, she averaged 11.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 5.3 apg and 2.7 spg while shooting 41.9% from the field and 80% from the free-throw line. She also set a new career high in the championship final when she netted 19 points, including 10 in the first 13 minutes. This is the second straight year that a player unrecognized on the all-conference teams has gone on to garner MOP honors in the tournament (2007-Amanda Robinson, UMBC).

CHEERS FOR 20

For only the second time in league history, three America East women's teams recorded at least 20 wins. Hartford entering the postseason has 27 wins, while Vermont sits at 23 hoping to add more. Boston University, whose season ended in the conference championship final, finished with 20 victories. Three teams (Vermont, Maine, Delaware) also hit the 20-win watermark in 1999-2000.

TOP CATS

The Catamounts have three players among the top-ten scorers in the conference this season, the only team in the league able to boast that feat. Courtnay Pilypaitis (16.7 ppg), Amy Rosenkrantz (12.8) and May Kotsopoulos (12.8) are all cruising in double-digits.

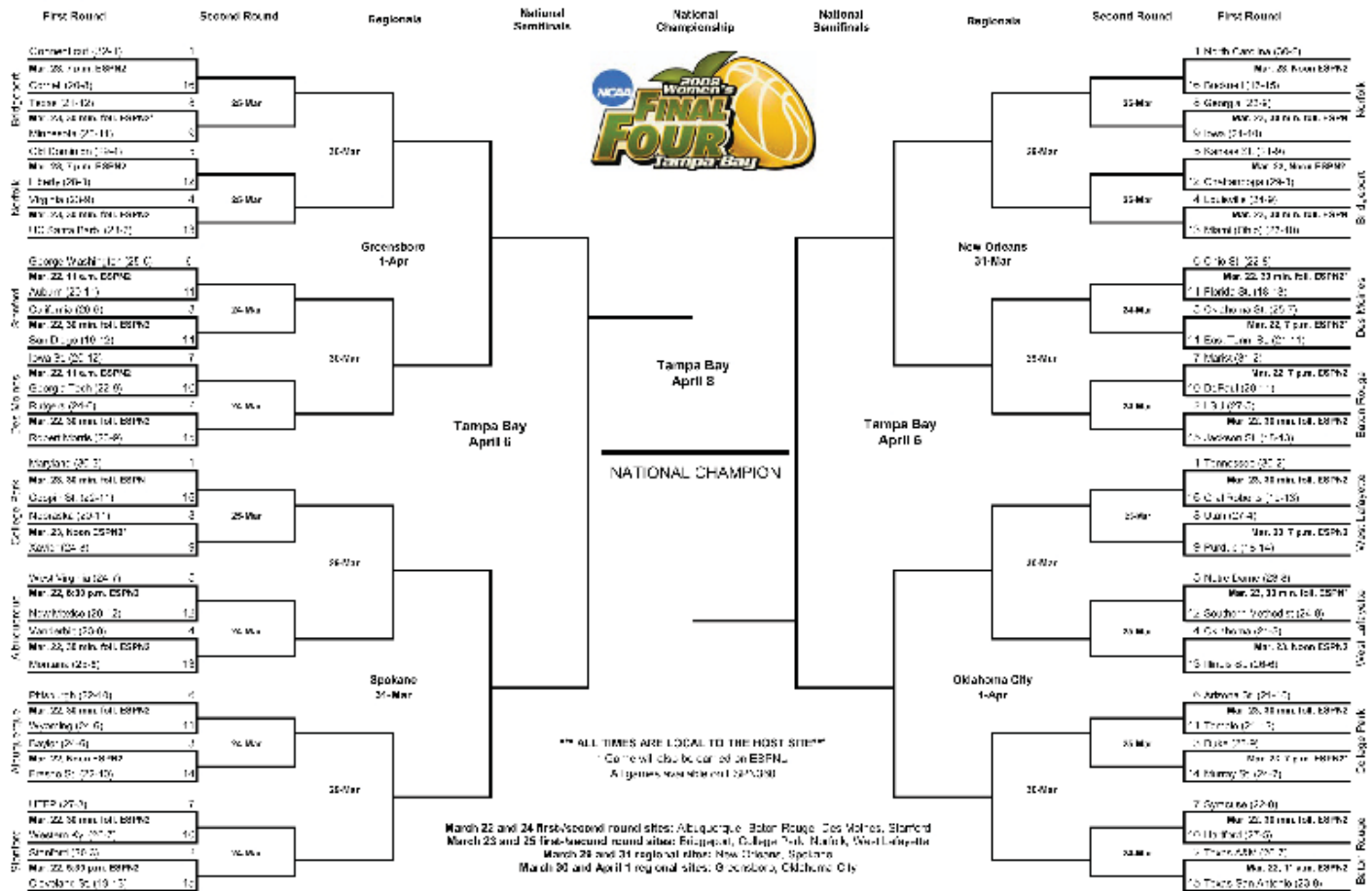

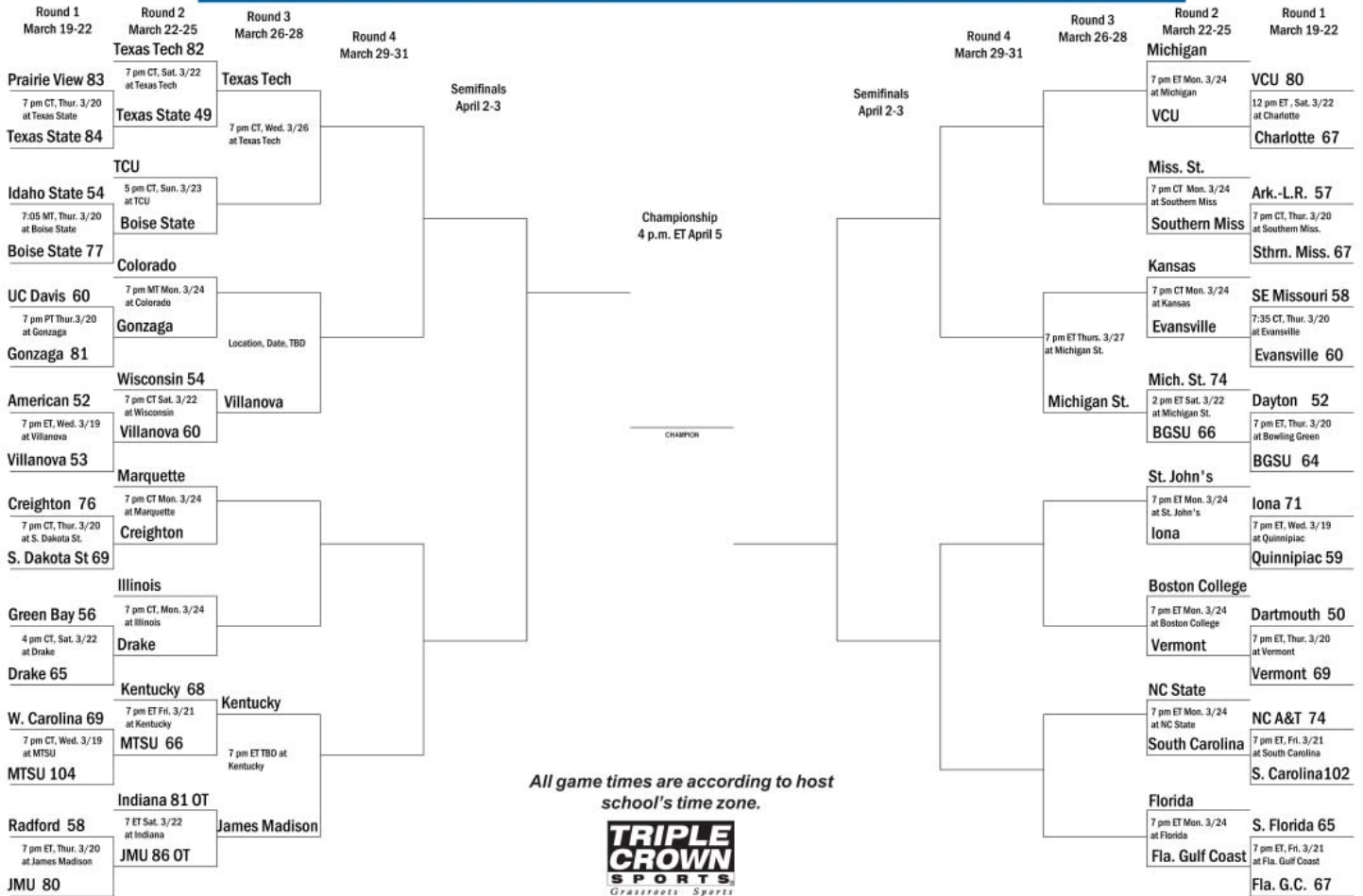
