AMERICA EAST NEED TO KNOW

• Six America East teams begin their seasons Friday, including defending champion Boston University, the preseason favorite. The Terriers will raise their 2010-11 America East banner prior to their game against Northeastern.

• Nine All-Conference players return in 2011-12, including Boston University's Darryl Partin, the lone first team selection who is back. Stony Brook's Tommy Brenton and New Hampshire's Alvin Abreu, who both earned second-team honors in 2009-10, return after missing last year with injuries.

• New head coaches take over at Boston U. and Vermont, respectively. Joe Jones, the former Columbia head coach, will lead the Terriers while John Becker, a UVM assistant for the last five years, assumes reins of the 'Cats.

• Amy Huchthausen was named America East commissioner Sept. 29. She has worked in four conference offices and spent the last five years at the NCAA.

FAST BREAK AROUND THE LEAGUE

ALBANY GREAT DANES

- The Great Danes open their 2011-12 season at #10/11 Pittsburgh, the third time in the last four years they have started their campaign with a nationally-ranked Big East opponent.

- Albany returns four starters from a squad that had a nine-win improvement from 2009-10 last season and won more league games (9) than the previous two seasons combined (8).

- The Great Danes are the only America East team to return multiple 2010-11 all-conference honorees in Juniors Logan Aronhalt (14.6 ppg) and Mike Black (12.3 ppg), both third-team choices a year ago.

BINGHAMTON BEARCATS

- The Bearcats look to begin 2011-12 as they did 2010-11, with a win over the Red Raiders. Sophomore Alex Ogundadegbe had nine points off the bench in the 62-60 win last Nov. 13.

- Binghamton brings back six letterwinners from last year's team, including Jimmy Gray, the team's top returning scorer. He averaged 6.5 points and 1.8 assists last season and upped those averages to 8.1 points and 2.3 assists in conference play.

- The Bearcats are 23-11 at its Events Center over the last three seasons and led the league in attendance for the eighth straight year, averaging 3,478 fans per game in 2010-11.

BOSTON UNIVERSITY TERRIERS

- The 2010-11 America East Championship banner will be raised to the Case Gym rafters before the Terriers' season opener against Northeastern Friday.

- New head coach Joe Jones takes over a program that returns 10 letterwinners and four starters from last year's team that won its sixth America East title and made its first NCAA appearance since 2002.

- Senior guard Darryl Partin is the league's lone first-team all-conference selection returning this season. Partin ranked seventh among league leaders averaging 14.6 points per game last year.

HARTFORD HAWKS

- For the third straight season, the Hawks will begin play at the Connecticut 6 Classic and will face Sacred Heart, with which they hold a 5-2 edge in the all-time series.

- Hartford will need to replace 81.8 percent of its scoring output from a year ago after losing four of their top five scorers from a team that reached the semifinals of the America East Championship.

- Senior forward Genesis Maciel will be looked to fill the offensive void. The team's top returning scorer (8.0 ppg), Maciel averaged 16.0 points in two America East tournament games to earn All-Championship honors.

MAINE BLACK BEARS

- Maine is seeking its fourth straight win in a season opener when Maine Presque-Isle visits Alford Arena Monday.

- The Black Bears went 2-0 in exhibition play, posting wins over Fisher College and University of Ottawa. Sophomore forward Alasdair Fraser averaged 14.5 points and eight rebounds in the two games.

- Maine returns eight letterwinners from last season, including the league's active leading scorer, Gerald McLemore, a two-time all-conference selection, who ranked 10th among league leaders last year (13.3 ppg) and has 1,199 career points.

UMBC RETRIEVERS

- UMBC, which returns six letterwinners from its 2010-11 squad, is looking for its first win over Penn in three tries when it opens its season Friday.

- The Retrievers beat The College of New Jersey, 73-51, on Nov. 4. Freshman Joe Getz led the way with 15 points and six rebounds.

- Leading UMBC will be the league's top returning scorer, senior guard Chris De La Rosa, a second-team all-conference selection who averaged 15.5 points per game last season and led the league in assists (6.0 apg) for the second straight year.

NEW HAMPSHIRE WILDCATS

- UNH, which has won three straight season openers, hosts Suffolk in its first game of 2011-12 Friday.

- The Wildcats welcome back eight letterwinners from a team that was decimated by injuries last season but still managed to rank 18th nationally in scoring defense by holding opponents to 60.9 points per game.

- Among the returnees are senior guard Alvin Abreu, a second-team all-conference selection in 2009-10 after averaging 14.4 points, who missed all but four games last season due to a knee injury.

STONY BROOK SEAWOLVES

- The Seawolves, who reached their first conference championship game last season, travel to Indiana for its season opener.

- Stony Brook returns more letterwinners (12) than any other America East squad, including all-conference guard Bryan Dougher and forward Tommy Brenton, the league's leading rebounder in 2009-10, who missed all of last season due to injury.

- The Seawolves were one of the best defensive teams nationally last season, holding opponents to a 39 percent shooting clip and 60.4 points per game, which ranked ninth and 15th in the country, respectively.

VERMONT CATAMOUNTS

- Coming off a season in which they won their fifth regular-season title in 10 years, the Catamounts open 2011-12 at South Florida Saturday. UVM had exhibition wins over St. Michael's and Concordia.

- After spending five seasons as an assistant at UVM, John Becker takes over as head coach. Becker, who has also been an assistant at Catholic University and head coach at Gallaudet, inherits a team that returns 10 letterwinners and four starters.

- Junior guard Brendan Bald had a breakout season in 2010-11, averaging 11.3 points per game and earning third-team all-conference recognition as well as Defensive Player of the Year honors.

2011-12 PRESEASON NOTEBOOK

TERRIERS AGAIN THE TOP CHOICE

For the fifth straight year, Boston University, the reigning America East champion, is the coaches' preseason choice to repeat as champion in 2011-12. The Terriers, who return four starters from last season, including first-team All-America East guard Darryl Partin, garnered six of eight possible first-place votes (coaches were not allowed to vote for their team) and 62 points, followed by last year's runner-up Stony Brook University, which received three first-place votes and 56 points. University of Vermont, the reigning America East regular-season champion, was picked third, tallying 46 points, and was followed closely in fourth by University at Albany, which received 42 points. University of New Hampshire was next in fifth place with 39 points while University of Maine followed in sixth with 32 points. University of Hartford and UMBC were tied for seventh place with 18 points and Binghamton University rounded out the nine-team poll with 11 points.

FOUR ALL-LEAGUERS ON PRESEASON TEAM

Four returning All-America East selections from last season and the league's reigning Rookie of the Year highlight the 2011-12 America East Preseason All-Conference Team. Boston University's Darryl Partin (Seattle, Wash.), a first-team all-conference selection last year, headlines the group. He is joined by a trio of 2010-11 second-team all-league honorees in University of Maine's Gerald McLemore (San Diego, Calif.), UMBC's Chris De La Rosa (Washington Heights, N.Y.) and Stony Brook University's Bryan Dougher (Scotch Plains, N.J.). University of Vermont's Brian Voelkel (Pleasantville, N.Y.), last year's America East Rookie of the Year, rounds out the five-man squad.

POSTSEASON PLURALITY

America East will look to keep up its recent track record of sending multiple teams to the postseason in 2011-12. Last year, the conference had multiple teams playing into the middle of March (Boston U. - NCAA, Vermont - NIT) for the third straight year and seventh in the last nine. In total, 17 teams have reached the postseason since 2003, including three in both 2005 (Boston U., Northeastern, Vermont) and 2010 (Boston U., Stony Brook, Vermont).

FIVE OF A KIND

Dynasties have been an important part of the history of America East basketball. Eight teams, including six different schools, have won consecutive league titles and of those, three (Drexel, Northeastern and Vermont) have won three in a row. However, parity has hit the league of late as five different teams have won the last five America East titles, the only such stretch in the league's 32 year history.

ALL-CONFERENCE RETURNEES

Seven of the 15 players who earned all-conference recognition last season return for 2011-12, including four of the league's top 10 scorers. Additionally, two others who earned second-team recognition in 2009-10, New Hampshire's **Alvin Abreu** and Stony Brook's **Tommy Brenton** return after missing last season with injuries. Senior **Darryl Partin**, who helped Boston U. win its first conference title since 2002 last year, is the lone first-team all-league returnee. He ranked seventh among league leaders averaging 14.6 points per game last season. UMBC's **Chris De La Rosa** is the conference's top returning scorer. He averaged 15.5 points per game last season and also handed out a league-best 6.0 assists per game.

MAKING A MARK ON DEFENSE

Several America East teams hope to pick up where they left off last year on the defensive end of the court. Six teams held opponents under 65 points per game last season and ranked in the top-70 nationally in scoring defense. Stony Brook led the charge, ranking 15th by holding foes to just 60.4 points per game, while New Hampshire followed closely behind in 18th (60.9 papg). The Seawolves were even better in field goal percentage defense, holding opponents to 39 percent shooting, which ranked ninth nationally. Four other schools ranked in the top-65, including Vermont (10th - 39.2 percent) and Boston U. (23rd 0 39.9 percent), which both held foes under 40 percent.

NEW FACES ON THE BENCH

America East will welcome two new head coaches to the fold in 2011-12. Former Columbia head coach Joe Jones was named Pat Chambers' successor after he went to Penn State and John Becker was promoted at Vermont after Mike Lonergan took the George Washington position. Jones, who got his coaching start in America East as an assistant at Hofstra was most recently Associate head coach at Boston College, while Becker has spent the last five years as an assistant for the Catamounts.

BACK FROM INJURY

A trio of players who played important roles on their teams in 2009-10 return this season after missing all or most of last season. Stony Brook's **Tommy Brenton**, a second-team all-conference performer and all-defensive choice two years ago, is back after missing all of last year with a knee injury. Brenton, the league's active leading rebounder (577) despite having played just two seasons, led America East with 9.7 boards per game to go with 7.6 points, 2.7 assists and 1.8 steals two years ago. New Hampshire's **Alvin Abreu** is back for a fifth season. The former second-team all-league choice (2009-10) played in just four games last season before going down with a knee injury. He ranked eighth among scoring leaders as junior, averaging 14.4 points per game. Abreu's teammate **Ferg Myrick** averaged 12.1 points and 4.1 rebounds per game, before missing the last 16 games of the year with a knee injury. Hartford will get senior point guard **Andres Torres** back. Torres, who redshirted last season with an injury, averaged 6.7 points and 4.4 assists in 2009-10.

ALPHABET SOUP: AE AND THE BCS

America East has had eight wins over a Bowl Championship Series (BCS) conference school since 2008. Maine beat Penn State last season, which was the league's second against a Big Ten program in as many seasons. Boston U. downed Indiana in 2009 and also knocked off Oregon St. of the Pac 10 in the College Basketball Invitational that season.

MARK YOUR CALENDARS

The season officially gets underway November 11 with eight of the nine teams opening their seasons this weekend, including Boston University which will raise its 2010-11 America East championship banner prior to its game against Northeastern. Conference play will begin just after the new year on January 2 and the conference tournament will return to the University of Hartford on March 1-4 with the league title game taking place on March 10 at 11 a.m. on ESPN 2.
