## AMERICA EAST NEED TO KNOW

- Stony Brook (3-0) and Maine (2-0) are the lone remaining unbeaten teams through the first week of league play. Finishing among the league's top two is crucial for teams with championship aspirations. Only twice in America East's 32 year history has a team finished outside the top two and gone on to win the league title (Delaware '99, Holy Cross '80).
- America East is the only Division I conference with three players ranked among the nation's top-20 scoring leaders. Albany's Gerardo Suero (22.5 ppg) is fourth in the country, while Maine's Gerald McLemore is tied for 11th (20.5 ppg) and Boston University's Darryl Partin is tied for 20th (19.8 ppg).
- There is a youth movement in America East. No teams regularly start more than two seniors while Albany and Binghamton are two of nine Division I programs without a senior on its roster. Additionally, four of the league's top 20 scorers are freshmen, led by Maine's Justin Edwards, who ranks fourth (15.6 ppg), and who is also seventh in rebounding (6.2 rpg). Binghamton's Ben Dickinson is 13th in scoring (12.1 ppg) and ninth in rebounding (6.1 rpg).

## WEEKLY HONOREES



### PLAYER OF THE WEEK Gerardo Suero, Jr., Guard, Albany

Suero continued his elite play averaging 24.7 points, 6.7 rebounds and 4.3 assists in helping Albany go 2-1 last week en route to earning his second straight America East Player of the Week award and fourth overall. The junior transfer, who ranks fourth nationally averaging 22.5 points per game, started his week by contributing 24 points, nine rebounds and five assists in a win over Hartford on Monday. He followed that showing by scoring 22 points to go with seven boards in the Great Danes' win over UMBC on Thursday. Suero wrapped up his week by tallying a game-high 28 points at Stony Brook Sunday.



### ROOKIE OF THE WEEK Four McGlynn, Fr., G, Vermont

McGlynn led UVM to a 2-1 week by averaging 14.3 points and 3.3 rebounds and picked up his second Rookie of the Week honor of the season as a result. The freshman guard's best game of the week came in a win over Boston U. on Wednesday. McGlynn scored a 20 points and canned 4-of-7 three-point attempts. He then had 14 points and a career-high six rebounds in a win over Hartford on Sunday.

• The Great Danes, winners of five of their last seven, host UNH Wednesday at SEFCU Arena, where they are 5-0 at home this year and have won eight straight overall.

• Albany allowed Stony Brook to shoot 56 percent from the floor and dropped its first league contest Sunday.

• Gerardo Suero went over the 20-point mark for the ninth straight game, finishing with 28. He ranks fourth nationally averaging 22.5 points per game.

• Albany boasts the league's top scoring trio in Suero, Logan Aronhalt (15.7 ppg) and Mike Black (12.8 ppg), who combine for 51 points per game.



## BINGHAMTON BEARCATS

• The Bearcats shot 37 percent at Boston U. Sunday and dropped their 15th straight game. The loss dropped Binghamton to 0-3 in the league standings for the first time in its America East history.

• Robert Mansell scored a game-high 21 points. The sophomore ranks eighth among the league's scoring leaders (14.3 ppg).

• Ben Dickinson had 12 points and eight rebounds and ranks 13th among America East scoring leaders (12.1 ppg) and eighth in rebounding (6.2 rpg).

• The Terriers held Binghamton to 49 points, an opponent season low, en route to their first league win Saturday. The victory also snapped Boston U.'s seven-game losing streak.

• Boston U. has won 13 straight games against America East foes on its home court.

• Darryl Partin scored 17 points and ranks third among league leaders and is tied for 20th nationally averaging 19.8 ppg. He is seven points shy of 1,000 for his career (819 at Boston U., 174 at La Salle).



## HARTFORD HAWKS

• Torres ranks 14th among league leaders averaging 11.6 points per game. He's upped his scoring in conference play, averaging 17.0 ppg in three conference games.

• Five of Hartford's top seven scorers are freshmen, who account for 64 percent of the team's scoring.

• The Hawks, who lead America East in steals (7.1 spg) have a week off before heading to Binghamton Sunday.



## MAINE BLACK BEARS

• Maine goes for just its third 3-0 America East start (1995-96, 1999-2000) and first in 12 years against Boston U. Wednesday.

• The Black Bears, who average a league-best 76.2 points per game, shot 51 percent en route to a win over UMBC Saturday, which snapped their four-game losing skid against the Retrievers in Orono.

• Maine has won five of its last six overall and is a perfect 5-0 at home this season. The Black Bears' 2-0 league start is their first since 2004-05.

• Gerald McLemore went over the 20-point mark for the seventh time this year and scored a season-high 29 points on 9-of-15 shooting. He's tied for 11th nationally averaging 20.5 points per game.



## UMBC RETRIEVERS

• UMBC tries to move to .500 in league play when Stony Brook visits RAC Arena on Wednesday.

• UMBC allowed Maine to shoot 51 percent and dropped its second straight league game Saturday.

• Chase Plummer tallied 15 of his 17 points in the first half and is averaging 21.7 points and 6.0 rebounds through three league contests. Overall, he is one of just three players to rank in the league's top 10 in both scoring (6th - 14.6 ppg) and rebounding (5th - 7.8 rpg).

• UMBC outrebounded Maine 34-31 and has held the edge on glass in 11 of its 15 games this year. The Retrievers are second in America East with a 1.4 rebound margin.

• Brian Benson pulled down a game-high 14 rebounds, including the 500th of his career. He leads the league with 9.6 boards per game.

• UNH again ranks near the top of the league defensively, holding foes to 63.5 ppg, which ranks third, and is limiting them to 43 percent shooting.

• Bryan Dougher scored 16 of his team-high 19 points in the second half and ranks ninth among league leaders with 13.6 ppg this year.

• The Seawolves, who are a perfect 7-0 at home this season, rank second in America East, holding opponents to 62.7 points per game.

# CONFERENCE NOTEBOOK

## PLAYER OF THE WEEK

*Gerardo Suero, Jr., Guard, Albany  
Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic*

Suero continued his elite play averaging 24.7 points, 6.7 rebounds and 4.3 assists in helping Albany go 2-1 last week en route to earning his second straight America East Player of the Week award and fourth overall.

The junior transfer, who ranks fourth nationally averaging 22.5 points per game, started his week by contributing 24 points, nine rebounds and five assists in a win over Hartford on Monday. He followed that showing by scoring 22 points to go with seven boards in the Great Danes' win over UMBC on Thursday. Suero wrapped up his week by tallying a game-high 28 points at Stony Brook Sunday and added four rebounds and five assists. For the week, Suero shot 54.9 percent from the field from his guard position.

## SOME MORE SUERO

In just two months at Albany, Suero has established himself as one of the top players in America East, if not the country. The junior transfer leads the league and ranks fourth nationally averaging 22.5 points per game. He has gone over the 20-point mark in nine straight games and 13 times overall this season. Suero also ranks 12th in rebounding, pulling down 5.6 boards per game, and is fifth in field goal percentage (.504) overall, which is tops among guards. The Dominican Republic native has gotten to the free throw line a whopping 146 times, and ranks fifth among league leaders sinking 81.5 percent of his attempts.

## ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

*Four McGlynn, Fr., G, Vermont  
York, Pa./Dallastown*

McGlynn led Vermont to a 2-1 week by averaging 14.3 points and 3.3 rebounds and picked up his second Rookie of the Week honor of the season as a result.

The freshman guard's best game of the week came in a win over Boston University on Wednesday. McGlynn scored a game-high 20 points and canned 4-of-7 three-point attempts. He then had 14 points and a career-high six rebounds in a win over Hartford on Sunday. McGlynn ranks 17th among league leaders and is second on Vermont averaging 11.5 points per game and is fourth in three-point percentage (.392).

## THE HONOR ROLL

Several other America East players had top performances last week:

- Boston University's Darryl Partin averaged 18 points in two games last week, scoring 19 against Vermont and adding 17 in a win over Binghamton on Sunday
- Hartford's Andres Torres averaged 17 points per game in three contests last week, including a career-best 27 points in a win over UNH Thursday.
- Maine's Alasdair Fraser averaged 20.5 points and 9.5 rebounds in two wins last week.
- UMBC's Chase Plummer averaged 21.7 points and 6.0 rebounds in three games last week. He twice eclipsed his career high, scoring 21 in a win over UNH Monday and 25 against Albany Thursday.

- Tommy Brenton nearly averaged a double-double last week, contributing 10.3 points, 9.3 rebounds, 4.7 assists and 2.0 steals to help Stony Brook get off to a 3-0 conference start.

## LEAGUE PLAY UNDERWAY

League play began last week with the 16-game round-robin schedule getting underway. If the first week in any indicator, it will be competitive year as only two teams remain unbeaten and only two are winless just a few games into the slate. Stony Brook (3-0) and Maine (2-0) got through the first week unscathed with the Seawolves posting wins over Albany, Binghamton and Vermont and Maine beating Binghamton and UMBC. The Seawolves' 3-0 start is just their second (2009-10) in their 11-year America East history, while the Black Bears' 2-0 start is their first since the 2004-05 campaign. Albany (2-1) and Vermont (2-1) each won a pair of games last week, while Boston U. (1-1), Hartford (1-2), UMBC (1-2), UNH (0-2) and Binghamton (0-3) round out the first week of action.

## SURGING SEAWOLVES

Since starting its season 2-6, Stony Brook has turned things around, reeling off five straight wins with an average margin of victory of 10.8 points per game during that span. The Seawolves are playing their ever-steady defense again this season and rank second in America East in scoring defense, holding opponents to 62.7 points per game. Stony Brook is also much improved on the offense end and is averaging 67.7 points per game, which ranks third in the conference, a +6.7 ppg difference from last year.

## BLAZING BLACK BEARS

Stony Brook is not the lone America East team to catch fire as Maine has also been hot of late. The Black Bears have won back-to-back games and five of their last six overall. The top offensive team in America East, Maine is averaging 76.2 points per game and shooting 47.7 percent from the field, both league bests. The Black Bears have also been stingy defensively and are holding foes to a league-best 41.9 percent shooting.

## CONFERENCE POSITION CRUCIAL

Finishing among the league's top two is paramount for teams with championship aspirations. Only twice in America East's 32 year history has a team finished outside the top two and gone on to win the league title. Delaware captured the crown as the No. 3 seed in 1999 while Holy Cross finished third in the league's inaugural year (1979-80) and went on to win the championship.

## HOME SWEET HOME

Taking care of business at home has been a consistent theme for America East's top three teams. Stony Brook, Maine and Albany are a combined 17-0 at home this year. The Seawolves, who are 6-0, have won seven straight at Pritchard Gym dating back to last season. The Great Danes are 5-0 and are riding an eight-game home court winning streak. The Black Bears are 5-0 in Orono and are scoring 83 points per game while at home. A fourth team, Boston U., knows the importance of home court. The Terriers may be only 2-3 there this year but have won 13 straight at home against America East foes. Their last loss to a league opponent in Boston came to Vermont on Feb. 9, 2010.

## IT'S TV TIME

America East's broadcast package, which will feature 15 of the league's men's basketball games on ESPN networks or CBS Sports Network, begins this week. Stony Brook will visit Boston U. in a rematch of last year's epic America East Championship game on ESPN3 at 12 p.m. On Monday, CBS Sports Network will air its first-ever America East regular-season game when Boston U. hosts Albany at 7 p.m. Overall this season nine men's games will appear on ESPN3, including the America East Championship semifinals, four will be on CBS Sports Network, one will be on ESPNU and the league title game will be on ESPN2.

## OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

America East boasts three of nation's top offensive threats. In fact, the league is the only Division I conference to have three players ranked among the nation's top 20 scorers. Albany's Gerardo Suero, who has scored 20-plus points in nine straight games, leads the league and ranks fourth nationally averaging 22.5 ppg. Maine's Gerald McLemore is 11th averaging 20.5 ppg, while Boston University's Darryl Partin ranks 20th in the country scoring 19.8 ppg. All together the group has combined for 28 20-plus point performances.

## YOUTH IS SERVED

There is a youth movement in America East. No teams regularly start more than two seniors while Albany and Binghamton are two of nine Division I programs without a senior on its roster. In fact, five of the conference's top 20 scorers, including four freshmen, are newcomers. Albany's Gerardo Suero leads the league and ranks fourth nationally (22.5 ppg). Four-time America East Rookie of the Week Justin Edwards ranks fifth among America East leaders averaging 15.6 points per game and is also 10th in rebounding (6.2 rpg). Binghamton's Ben Dickinson (12.1 ppg), Vermont's Four McGlynn (11.5 ppg) and Hartford's Wes Cole (10.5 ppg) rank 13th, 17th and 19th, respectively.

## WILL SOMEONE BE THE SIXTH?

Dynasties have been an important part of the history of America East basketball, just not lately. Parity has hit the league as five different teams have won the last five America East titles, the only such stretch in the league's 32 year history. The last five league champions are Albany (2007), UMBC (2008), Binghamton (2009), Vermont (2010) and Boston U. (2011). Eight teams, including six different schools, have won consecutive league titles and of those, three (Drexel, Northeastern and Vermont) have won three in a row.

# CONFERENCE NOTEBOOK

## BEATING THE BIG BOYS

Boston University's win over ACC member Boston College on Dec. 3 was America East's eighth over a Bowl Championship Series (BCS) conference school since 2008. Maine beat Penn State out of the Big Ten last season and also knocked off BC in 2010. Boston U. downed Indiana in 2009 and also knocked off Oregon St. of the Pac 12 in the College Basketball Invitational that season. Vermont beat both Colorado, which was then in the Big XII, and Rutgers of the Big East during the 2008-09 campaign while UMBC beat Nebraska (Big XII) that season.

## COACHES' CONFERENCE

America East has been the starting point for several of the game's top coaches. Mike Brey (Notre Dame), Jim Calhoun (UConn), Mike Jarvis (Florida Atlantic), Rick Pitino (Louisville) and Jay Wright (Villanova) are part of a fraternity of former America East coaches who have excelled at other institutions. The group has combined to win 2,500 games, make 10 Final Four appearances and win four national championships. First-year head coaches Pat Chambers (Penn State) and Mike Lonergan (George Washington) who won the last two America East titles at Boston U. and Vermont, respectively, recently joined the group.

## ALL NINE IN BRACKETBUSTERS

For the first time in league history, all nine teams will participate in Sears BracketBusters, ESPN's three-day men's college basketball event pitting potential NCAA Championship hopefuls against each other. The event, which will feature 13 televised contests on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU or ESPN3, will take place Feb. 17-19 with the matchups being announced Jan. 30. Albany, Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont will serve as home teams for the event, while Binghamton, Boston University, Hartford, UMBC and Stony Brook will be on the road. America East teams have appeared on national television as part of the event in five of the last seven years, including Vermont last year.

## AMERICA EAST, ESPN DO DEAL

The America East Conference and ESPN announced a new five-year broadcast deal that will significantly increase the league's number of national appearances on the ESPN family of networks on Nov. 28. The agreement will run through the 2015-16 season. The 2011-12 package will include a minimum of 48 national appearances on ESPN platforms, the most in league history. The deal also includes flexibility that could increase that total in future years. As part of the agreement, the conference's men's basketball championship game will air on ESPN2, the 25th straight year the America East title game will air on ESPN or ESPN2. The women's championship game will be distributed to regional sports networks via ESPN Regional Television and also be broadcast on ESPN3, ESPN's multi-screen broadcast channel available through an affiliated internet or video provider online via WatchESPN.com. For the fifth straight year, ESPNU will broadcast a men's regular-season conference game when Stony Brook hosts Boston U. on Jan. 27 in a rematch of last year's America East Championship game. Additionally 11 regular-season basketball games, four postseason contests and the men's lacrosse championship game will be broadcast exclusively on ESPN3, which also includes availability on smartphones and tablets via the WatchESPN app and on ESPN on Xbox LIVE.

## CBS SPORTS NETWORK TO AIR FIVE GAMES

The America East Conference and CBS Sports Network announced today a national television package including both men's and women's basketball games, the first such deal in league history. It will be the first time that multiple conference regular-season games will be televised nationally in one season. CBS Sports Network will broadcast five league contests featuring eight America East schools starting in January. America East previously partnered with the Network to televise two men's lacrosse games in 2010, including the conference championship game. The package kicks off with a Martin Luther King, Jr. Day men's matchup between defending league champion Boston University and University at Albany on Jan. 14 at 7 p.m. The two teams were picked first and fourth, respectively, in the conference's preseason poll. Old rivals University of New Hampshire and University of Vermont will meet for the 132nd time in men's action on Jan. 29 at 12 p.m. The Catamounts will then face Stony Brook University in a get together of the league's last two men's regular-season champions on February 12. The preseason favorite on the women's side, UMBC, and 2011 league champion, Hartford, will square off on Feb. 19 at Chase Arena in the first-ever nationally televised conference women's game. The final game of the package will feature University of Maine at Stony Brook in men's action on the final day of the regular season, February 26.

## POSTSEASON PLURALITY

America East will look to keep up its recent track record of sending multiple teams to the postseason in 2011-12. Last year, the conference had multiple teams playing into the middle of March (Boston U. - NCAA, Vermont - NIT) for the third straight year and seventh in the last nine. In total, 17 teams have reached the postseason since 2003, including three in both 2005 (Boston U., Northeastern, Vermont) and 2010 (Boston U., Stony Brook, Vermont).

## BACK TO HARTFORD

For the third straight season, University of Hartford will be the host of the America East Men's and Women's Basketball Championships. The tournament, which will be combined for the third straight season, will be held on March 1-4, 2012 at Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion on University of Hartford's campus. The first, quarterfinal and semifinal rounds for both the men and women will be held at the combined tournament, while the title games will again both be held the following weekend at the site of the highest seeds remaining.

## TOURNEY TITLE SPONSOR

At the America East Basketball Tip-Off Luncheon on Oct. 13, Newman's Own, Inc. announced its commitment to the America East Conference as title sponsor of the men's and women's basketball championship, March 1-4, 2012, at the University of Hartford. For the third consecutive year, the Westport, Conn.-based company will promote the popular Newman's Own Thin & Crispy frozen pizza in the Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion. Newman's Own participation in the title sponsorship will include arena signage for Newman's Own Thin & Crispy frozen pizzas; product awareness and trial; AEC website presence; social media engagement; and a continued growth in the awareness of the company's philanthropic mission.

## NEW COMMISSIONER ON BOARD

Amy Huchthausen was named the league's fourth commissioner on September 29. A former assistant commissioner at America East, Huchthausen returns after spending four years as Director of Academic and Membership Services at the NCAA working primarily with Division III's strategic branding team. She's also worked in three other Division I conference offices, including the Big East, Ivy League and Missouri Valley Conference.

## ALBANY GREAT DANES (10-7, 2-1 AE)

Albany went 2-1 to begin conference play this past week ... The Great Danes started out with a bang with two lopsided wins against Hartford, 88-63, and UMBC, 89-72, then recently fell to Stony Brook, 81-68 ... Gerardo Suero (Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic/Our Savior New American) scored 74 points and grabbed 20 rebounds last week ... Suero bumped his average up to 22.5 points per game and is fourth in the nation in scoring ... The junior guard has now scored 20-plus points in nine consecutive games in which Albany is 6-3 ... Logan Aronhalt (Zanesville, Ohio/ Zanesville) was close behind Suero, scoring 57 points and tallying 14 rebounds ... Aronhalt has now started in 63 consecutive games ... Luke Devlin (Sydney, Australia/ Newington College) picked up right where he left off last season in conference play averaging 10 points and 7.5 rebounds in the first two contests this past week but went scoreless and grabbed four rebounds against Stony Brook ... UAlbany with two home slates this week looks to stay undefeated at home with games against New Hampshire on Jan. 11 then against Maine on Jan. 14 ... The UNH game on Wednesday will be televised on Time Warner Cable Sports.

## BINGHAMTON BEARCATS (0-15, 0-3 AE)

Binghamton dropped three games during the week to start conference play. The Bearcats were within striking distance of visiting Maine with five minutes to play before trailing off in a 15-point loss. Three days later, Binghamton pushed Stony Brook to the final minute in a six-point setback. On the road Sunday afternoon at defending champion Boston, the Bearcats didn't have enough firepower in a 19-point defeat ... Sophomore guard Robert Mansell (Philadelphia, Pa./Cheltenham) averaged 18.3 points in the three games. Mansell, the team's leading scorer at 14.3 ppg., shot 49% from the field (47 percent from 3-point range) and logged an average of 38 minutes per game... Freshman forward Ben Dickinson (Alexandria, Va./Gonzaga) averaged 10.0 points and 8.0 rebounds. Dickinson notched his second double-double of the season with an 18-point, 10-rebound showing against the Seawolves ... Binghamton plays five of its next seven games on the road, beginning with a tough test at Vermont. ## BOSTON U. TERRIERS (5-11, 1-1 AE)

Boston University opened the America East schedule by splitting the first two games ... The Terriers lost at Vermont, 83-69, and then followed with a 68-49 victory over Binghamton ... The win against the Bearcats snapped a seven-game losing streak, which was the longest since the 1999-2000 season ... Boston U. led at Vermont, 13-8, on Thursday with 13:13 remaining in the first half before the Catamounts scored the next nine points to take the lead for good ... The Terriers pulled within six, 51-45, at 12:14 remaining in regulation, but the Catamounts went on a 13-4 run ... On Sunday against the Bearcats, the Terriers never trailed for their fifth straight victory in the series ... Leading 15-10 with 9:39 remaining in the first half, Boston U. went on a 14-5 run and would lead by as many as 27 in the second half ... Sophomore D.J. Irving (Chester, Pa./Archbishop Carroll) made his first appearance at home since Dec. 10 and tallied eight assists against zero turnovers, while senior Darryl Partin (Seattle, Wash./La Salle) recorded a team-high 17 points in the win ... Partin now has 993 career points with 174 coming at La Salle ... Freshman Justin Edwards (Whitby, Ontario/Anderson CVI) had a great overall game with 15 points, nine rebounds and a career-high six assists...Mike Allison (Lynden, Ontario/National Elite Development Academy) had five blocks ... Against UMBC in Orono, Gerald McLemore (San Diego, Calif./Worcester Academy) scored a season-high 29 points on 9-of-15 shooting to lead Maine to the win...Fraser notched his fourth double-double of the season with 16 points and 11 rebounds ... Acad.) 3-point field goal with 31 seconds remaining restored a UMBC lead and junior guard Ryan Cook (Laurel, Md./Pallotti) hit four consecutive free throws to ice the victory ... The 82 points scored is a season high ... The Retrievers hit eight of 12 shots from behind the arc for the game... Five Retrievers posted double figures- Neller finished with 17 points, Cook scored all 12 of his points in the second half and sophomore guard Jamar Wertz (Suffolk, Va./King's Fork) added 11 points, which tied his career best... 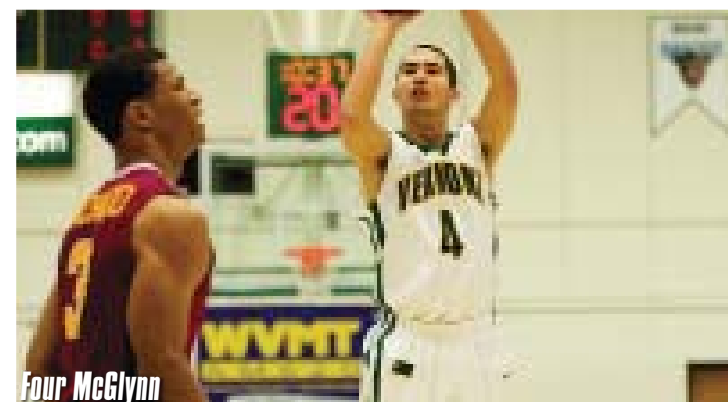
