AMERICA EAST NEED TO KNOW

- Protecting home court has been an important ingredient to having success in conference play. The top four teams in the league standings: Stony Brook (8-1), Boston U. (7-2), Vermont (7-2) and Albany (6-3) are a combined 18-0 at home against America East opponents.
- America East has two of the nation's top scorers in Albany's Gerardo Suero and Boston University's Darryl Partin. Suero (21.1 ppg) ranks eighth in the country while Boston University's Darryl Partin is 15th (19.9 ppg).
- There is a youth movement in America East. No teams regularly start more than two seniors while Albany and Binghamton are two of nine Division I programs without a senior on its roster and Hartford gets over 60 percent of its scoring from freshmen. Additionally, eight of the league's top 20 scorers are freshmen or sophomores, led by Maine's Justin Edwards, who ranks fifth (15.2 ppg), and who is also sixth in rebounding (6.4 rpg).

- Logan Aronhalt led the Great Danes with 17 points. He combines with teammates Mike Black and Gerardo Suero to form the top scoring trio in the league (50.1 ppg).
- The Great Danes, who have won seven of their last 10 games, lead the league 73.5 ppg.
- Gerardo Suero ranks eighth nationally averaging 21.1 points per game.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

*Bryan Dougher, Sr., Guard, Stony Brook

Dougher propelled his team into first place in the America East standings by averaging 21.5 points in two Stony Brook wins last week. The Player of the Week award is his first of the year and second of his career.

The senior, who ranks seventh among league leaders averaging 14.1 points per game, began his week by tabulating 23 points, three rebounds and three assists in a 60-37 win over Hartford Wednesday. He then had 20 points and four rebounds in a 66-57 comeback win over Boston U. Friday in which he hit a key three-pointer to give the Seawolves a four-point lead with under three minutes to go. For the week, the two-time all-conference selection shot 57 percent from the field (13-of-23), 50 percent from three-point land (8-of-16) and 90 percent from the free throw line (9-of-10).

CO-ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

*Justin Edwards, Fr., Guard, Maine

Edwards averaged 16.0 points and 7.5 rebounds in a pair of Black Bear wins to claim his sixth Rookie of the Week honor of the season. His six awards are tied for the fourth-most any rookie has won in America East history.

The freshman guard tallied his second double-double of the year, contributing 14 points and 10 rebounds in Maine's 80-69 win Wednesday. The league's fifth-leading scorer (15.2 ppg) then poured in a team-high 17 points while five rebounds in a 67-59 win over Binghamton on Saturday.

CO-ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

*Four McGlynn, Fr., Guard, Vermont

McGlynn earned his second Rookie of the Week honor in as many weeks and fourth of the season by leading Vermont to a 77-60 win over New Hampshire on Sunday.

McGlynn, the league's only freshman to currently lead his team in scoring (12.0 ppg), 14 of his 20 points in the first half Sunday to help UVM to survive 69 percent shooting by UNH and take a 43-40 lead into the locker room. McGlynn, whose 20 points were just two off his career high, made 5-of-10 field goals on the day and was 9-of-11 from the free throw line. The win was important for Vermont, which moved into a second-place tie with Boston University in the league standings and sits just one game behind Stony Brook for first.

THE HONOR ROLL

Several other America East players had top performances last week:

- Albany's Gerardo Suero tallied his 15th 20-point game of the season, scoring 25 points in a win over Binghamton Wednesday. He averaged 19.5 points and 5.5 rebounds for the week.
- Robert Mansell averaged 18.5 points and 5.5 rebounds in a pair of games for Binghamton and had a team-high 22 against Albany Wednesday.
- Boston University's Darryl Partin averaged 19.0 points in two games last week.
- Gerald McLemore scored 25 points in a win over UNH on Wednesday and averaged 20.0 ppg for the week.

LEAGUE STANDINGS RESET

The second of the league schedule began last week and saw Stony Brook leap to the top of the conference standings. The Seawolves (8-1), who have won 10 of their last 11 games, beat Boston U., 66-57, on Friday to take over sole possession of first place. The Terriers (7-2), who had a seven game win streak snapped by the Seawolves, are tied for second with Vermont (7-2), which has won seven of its last eight games. Albany (6-3) won twice last week to assume fourth place, while Maine (4-5) and Hartford (4-5) are tied for fifth. UMBC (2-7), UNH (2-7) and Binghamton (0-9) round out the league standings.

CONFERENCE POSITION CRUCIAL

While the team that wins the conference tournament gets crowned league champion and received the league's automatic birth, where teams finish in the regular season goes a long way in determining the league champions. Only twice in America East's 32 year history has a team finished outside the top two and gone on to win the league title. In addition, with the conference championship game being played at the highest remaining seed, hosting that game is crucial as the home team has won 24 of the previous 27 matchups.

HOME SWEET HOME

Taking care of business at home has been a consistent theme for America East's top teams. Stony Brook and Albany are a combined 18-0 overall at home this year while the top four teams in the league standings (Stony Brook, Vermont, Boston U., Albany) are a combined 18-0 at home in conference play. The Seawolves, who are 10-0 at home this year, have won 11 straight at Pritchard Gym dating back to last season. The Great Danes are 8-0 at SEFCU Arena this year and are riding an 11-game home court winning streak. The Terriers have won 15 straight at home against America East foes. Their last loss to a league opponent in Boston came to Vermont on Feb. 9, 2010.

SEAWOLVES STREAKING WITH D

Stony Brook has won 10 of its last 11 games on the heels of its top-ranked defense. The Seawolves, who lead America East and rank 21st nationally allowing just 59.3 points per game, and have allowed just 54.9 points per game in their most recent eight wins. Stony Brook is also holding opponents to just 42 percent shooting. The Seawolves have also improved their offensive efficiency during this stretch, averaging 68.7 points per game compared with 65.0 ppg in their other 10 games.

CATAMOUNTS CLIMBING

Vermont has reeled off seven wins in its last eight games to move into a second-place tie with Boston University in the league standings. The Catamounts, who have won those seven games by an average margin of 15.9 points, have excelled offensively in wins this season, averaging 73.9 points per game in its 12 wins against just 58.1 points per game in its 10 losses. UVM's defense has been consistent all season and ranks second in America East, allowing just 62.7 points per game.

OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER

America East boasts two of nation's top offensive threats in Albany's Gerardo Suero, who has scored 20-plus points 15 times leads the league and ranks seventh nationally averaging 21.1 ppg. Boston University's Darryl Partin is second in the conference and ranks 15th nationally (19.9) ppg.

YOUTH IS SERVED

There is a youth movement in America East. No teams regularly start more than two seniors while Albany and Binghamton are two of nine Division I programs without a senior on its roster and Hartford gets over 60 percent of its scoring from freshmen. Additionally, eight of the league's top 20 scorers are freshmen or sophomores, led by Maine's Justin Edwards, who ranks fifth (15.3 ppg), and who is also sixth in rebounding (6.2 rpg).

MILESTONES ACHIEVED

A few America East standouts surpassed milestones recently. Albany's Logan Aronhalt became the league's sixth active player with 1,000 points by scoring 12 points against Vermont on Jan. 1. Higher up the leaderboard, Gerald McLemore became just the 41st player in league history to score 1,500 points. Three weeks ago, Darryl Partin reached the 1,000-point mark by scoring 27 points at Maine on Jan. 11. Partin has scored 959 points in 55 career games at Boston U. and had 144 while at La Salle. With just 33 more points Stony Brook's Bryan Dougher will become the league's 42nd 1,500-point scorer in league history. He also moved into a tie for fifth place on America East's career three-point field goal list Friday and sits at 311 for his career.

CONFERENCE NOTEBOOK

BEATING THE BIG BOYS

Boston University's win over ACC member Boston College on Dec. 3 was America East's eighth over a Bowl Championship Series (BCS) conference school since 2008. Maine beat Penn State out of the Big Ten last season and also knocked off BC in 2010. Boston U. downed Indiana in 2009 and also knocked off Oregon St. of the Pac 12 in the College Basketball Invitational that season. Vermont beat both Colorado, which was then in the Big XII, and Rutgers of the Big East during the 2008-09 campaign while UMBC beat Nebraska (Big XII) that season.

COACHES' CONFERENCE

America East has been the starting point for several of the game's top coaches. Mike Brey (Notre Dame), Jim Calhoun (UConn), Mike Jarvis (Florida Atlantic), Rick Pitino (Louisville) and Jay Wright (Villanova) are part of a fraternity of former America East coaches who have excelled at other institutions. The group has combined to win 2,500 games, make 10 Final Four appearances and win four national championships. First-year head coaches Pat Chambers (Penn State) and Mike Lonergan (George Washington) who won the last two America East titles at Boston U. and Vermont, respectively, recently joined the group.

ALL NINE IN BRACKETBUSTERS

For the first time in league history, all nine teams will participate in Sears BracketBusters, ESPN's three-day men's college basketball event pitting potential NCAA Championship hopefuls against each other. The event, which will feature 13 televised contests on ESPN, ESPN2, ESPNU or ESPN3, will take place Feb. 17-19 with the matchups being announced Jan. 30. Albany, Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont will serve as home teams for the event, while Binghamton, Boston University, Hartford, UMBC and Stony Brook will be on the road. America East teams have appeared on national television as part of the event in five of the last seven years, including Vermont last year.

POSTSEASON PLURALITY

America East will look to keep up its recent track record of sending multiple teams to the postseason in 2011-12. Last year, the conference had multiple teams playing into the middle of March (Boston U. - NCAA, Vermont - NIT) for the third straight year and seventh in the last nine. In total, 17 teams have reached the postseason since 2003, including three in both 2005 (Boston U., Northeastern, Vermont) and 2010 (Boston U., Stony Brook, Vermont).

AMERICA EAST, ESPN DO DEAL

The America East Conference and ESPN announced a new five-year broadcast deal that will significantly increase the league's number of national appearances on the ESPN family of networks on Nov. 28. The agreement will run through the 2015-16 season. The 2011-12 package will include a minimum of 48 national appearances on ESPN platforms, the most in league history. The deal also includes flexibility that could increase that total in future years. As part of the agreement, the conference's men's basketball championship game will air on ESPN2, the 25th straight year the America East title game will air on ESPN or ESPN2. The women's championship game will be distributed to regional sports networks via ESPN Regional Television and also be broadcast on ESPN3, ESPN's multi-screen broadcast channel available through an affiliated internet or video provider online via WatchESPN.com. For the fifth straight year, ESPNU will broadcast a men's regular-season conference game when Stony Brook hosts Boston U. on Jan. 27 in a rematch of last year's America East Championship game. Additionally 11 regular-season basketball games, four postseason contests and the men's lacrosse championship game will be broadcast exclusively on ESPN3, which also includes availability on smartphones and tablets via the WatchESPN app and on ESPN on Xbox LIVE.

CBS SPORTS NETWORK TO AIR FIVE GAMES

America East's CBS Sports Network package kicks off Monday, Jan. 16 when Albany visits Boston U. It will be the first time that multiple conference regular-season games will be televised nationally in one season. CBS Sports Network will broadcast five league contests featuring eight America East schools starting in January. America East previously partnered with the Network to televise two men's lacrosse games in 2010, including the conference championship game. The package kicks off with a Martin Luther King, Jr. Day men's matchup between defending league champion Boston University and University at Albany on Jan. 14 at 7 p.m. The two teams were picked first and fourth, respectively, in the conference's preseason poll. Old rivals University of New Hampshire and University of Vermont will meet for the 132nd time in men's action on Jan. 29 at 12 p.m. The Catamounts will then face Stony Brook University in a get together of the league's last two men's regular-season champions on February 12. The preseason favorite on the women's side, UMBC, and 2011 league champion, Hartford, will square off on Feb. 19 at Chase Arena in the first-ever nationally televised conference women's game. The final game of the package will feature University of Maine at Stony Brook in men's action on the final day of the regular season, February 26.

NEW COMMISSIONER ON BOARD

Amy Huchthausen was named the league's fourth commissioner on September 29. A former assistant commissioner at America East, Huchthausen returns after spending four years as Director of Academic and Membership Services at the NCAA working primarily with Division III's strategic branding team. She's also worked in three other Division I conference offices, including the Big East, Ivy League and Missouri Valley Conference.

BACK TO HARTFORD

For the third straight season, University of Hartford will be the host of the America East Men's and Women's Basketball Championships. The tournament, which will be combined for the third straight season, will be held on March 1-4, 2012 at Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion on University of Hartford's campus. The first, quarterfinal and semifinal rounds for both the men and women will be held at the combined tournament, while the title games will again both be held the following weekend at the site of the highest seeds remaining.

WILL SOMEONE BE THE SIXTH?

Dynasties have been an important part of the history of America East basketball, just not lately. Parity has hit the league as five different teams have won the last five America East titles, the only such stretch in the league's 32 year history. The last five league champions are Albany (2007), UMBC (2008), Binghamton (2009), Vermont (2010) and Boston U. (2011). Eight teams, including six different schools, have won consecutive league titles and of those, three (Drexel, Northeastern and Vermont) have won three in a row.


