## PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Boston University junior guard **Chantell Alford** (West Haven, Conn./Wilbur Cross) picks up her third weekly honor of the season. She led the Terriers to two more wins last week to extend the team's winning streak to 10 games. Alford averaged 20 points, 5.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.5 steals per game, shot 44.8 percent (13-of-29) from the field and 70 percent (7-of-10) from three-point distance. In front of a national audience on ESPN3, Alford scored 19 of her season-high 28 points in the second half Wednesday against Vermont after the Terriers found themselves down by five at halftime. The junior guard also collected four rebounds, four steals and three assists, and drained 5-of-6 three-pointers to tie her career high of five made three-point field goals. Alford finished Saturday's win at Binghamton with 12 points, six rebounds, three assists, one steal and two more treys. Alford ranks among America East leaders in 10 of the 13 statistical categories, including scoring (13.0 ppg), assists (2.7 apg), steals (2.1 spg) and three-point shooting percentage (38.7 percent). She has scored in double-digits in 16 of 23 games.

## ROOKIE OF THE WEEK

University of Vermont freshman forward **Niki Taylor** (York, Maine/York) is now a three-time Rookie of the Week recipient after another impressive week. The freshman averaged a double-double of 10.5 points and 12.5 rebounds per game while adding 2.0 steals and 1.0 blocks per game. On Sunday against Hartford, Taylor recorded her third double-double of the season with 13 points and 13 rebounds. She added three steals and two blocks while going 4-of-9 from the field. Taylor put together an eight-point, 12-rebound performance earlier in the week on the road at Boston U. The rookie chipped in an assist and a steal against the Terriers. In America East games, Taylor is averaging 8.0 points and 8.2 rebounds per game. She is the top freshman rebounder in the league with 6.8 boards per game overall.

## PROGRESS REPORT

The conference finished off the non-conference schedule with a 53-64 (.453) mark. The latest RPI Report from RPIratings.com ranks America East 15th out of 33 conferences. The top three America East teams all made positive movement this week after each recorded two wins last week. Boston U. improved eight spots for the second-straight week to 70, while Hartford climbed 12 spots to 88. Albany move up six spots to 114.

## LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION!

The third nationally-broadcasted America East women's basketball game is slated for this week when Binghamton travels to Hartford for a 2 p.m. contest on Saturday, Feb. 11. The game will be shown live on ESPN3 and will feature Eric Frede on play-by-play and Leah Secondo on the color analysis. In the first meeting of the year between the Bearcats and Hawks, Hartford picked up the 63-41 win.

## TV GUIDE

Aside from the America East television game in Hartford on Saturday, three more women's hoops games will be televised this week. The UMBC at Stony Brook matchup Wednesday at 7 p.m. will be on local Long Island Cablevision 118, while Vermont at Binghamton the same night will be live on Time Warner Cable Sports. Fans can tune into Vermont at New Hampshire Saturday at 3 p.m. on WBIN-TV in greater Manchester.

## GOING NATIONAL

The America East announced a national broadcast package earlier this season that made league history. First, a five-year deal with ESPN includes a minimum of 47 national appearances for the league's men's and women's basketball programs on ESPN platforms, the most in conference history. The package includes seven women's hoops games on ESPN3, including the America East Championship semifinals and final. The league also signed a contract with CBS Sports Network, putting five America East basketball games on national television. A February 19 matchup between UMBC and Hartford at Chase Family Arena will mark the first-ever nationally-televised conference women's basketball game.

## RIZZOTTI'S MILESTONE

With a win over New Hampshire on Feb. 1, Hartford head coach Jennifer Rizzotti picked up her 250th career coaching victory. All of her wins have come during her 12-plus years at Hartford. Rizzotti is the longest active tenured head coach in the league and holds the America East all-time record for most overall coaching wins. Northeastern's Joy Malchodi is second with 217 wins over 16 seasons (1984-2000).

## ANYONE'S GAME

Home courts tend to lend an advantage to teams, but America East road teams have really bucked the trend. Visitors have gone 24-24 (.500) during conference play thus far, eliminating that home court advantage. Each of the nine teams have at least one win on the road, while the top two teams Boston U. (5-0) and Albany (6-0) have combined to go 11-0 on the road in conference play.

## STREAKING

Boston U. is atop the standings thanks to a ten-game win streak which began on the first day of the conference season, Jan. 2. Not dropping a contest since a New Year's Eve matchup at St. John's, the Terriers own the longest win streak by an America East team this year and are tied for

the 11th for the longest active winning streak in Division I going into the week. During this streak, Boston U. leads the league with 64.8 points per game, a +16.7 scoring margin and 40.5 field-goal percentage.

## OVERACHIEVERS

With five or six games left in the regular season, three America East teams have already surpassed last year's win totals. New Hampshire under second-year head coach Maureen Magarity is 12-10 after finishing the 2010-11 season with nine wins.

Vermont, also under a second-year head coach in Lori Gear McBride, surpassed last year's five-win total in just the first seven games of the season and is now 9-15. Led by first-year head coach Richard Barron, Maine picked up its fifth and sixth wins of the season over the last couple of weeks to guarantee a better finish than last year's 4-25 mark.

## TOP OF THEIR C.L.A.S.S.

On Jan. 25, New Hampshire senior **Denise Beliveau** (3.51 GPA in Exercise Science) and UMBC senior **Michelle Kurowski** (3.82 in Psychology) were selected as top-10 finalists for the 2012 Lowe's Senior C.L.A.S.S. Award for women's basketball from a group of 30 candidates. America East and the Pac-12 are the only conferences with multiple finalists on the ballot. Fan voting, conducted on Facebook and at <http://www.seniorclassaward.com/vote/> through March 18, counts towards one-third of the selection process. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence – community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. Lowe's, an official Corporate Partner of the NCAA, will announce the women's Senior CLASS Award® winner during the NCAA Women's Final Four®, which will be held April 1 and 3 in Denver.

## IT TAKES TWO

Look around the league and you'll find a lot of veteran duos, upperclassmen who carry a lot of the load for their teams. The highest-scoring tandem belongs to New Hampshire as senior **Denise Beliveau** and junior **Morgan Frame** together average 30.3 points per game, more than half of the team's average output. UMBC seniors **Erin Brown** and **Michelle Kurowski** also combine to score the majority of the Retrievers' points, checking in at 28.3 ppg. ## D-D-DEFENSE!

Through all games of Feb. 5, five America East teams rank among the top 60 teams in Division I for scoring defense. Albany's league-leading 53.0 points allowed per game ranks 21st and Boston U.'s 54.4 sits 30th. Hartford (55.7; 48th), Stony Brook (56.1; 55th) and Binghamton (56.3; 56th) also rank in that group.

## BOARD GAMES

Seven America East players are averaging at least 8.0 rebounds per game led by Albany junior **Julie Forster** with 9.6 rpg which ranks 34th in the country. The conference hasn't had six players finish with season averages of 8.0 rpg or higher since the 1999-2000 season.

## ON TOP AT THE END

The America East Women's Basketball Champion has been either the one or two seed in the conference tournament 20 times in 27 years. Additionally, in 24 out of the 27 years of the tournament,

the champion has been one of the top three seeds, making regular-season play crucial for championship hopes. Providing even further motivation, the highest seeded team remaining will host the America East Championship final in 2012 for the third straight year.

## YOU'VE BEEN 'FRAME'D

One of America East's highest scorers and rebounders won't show up in the league's overall stats since she hasn't played in 75 percent of her team's games yet, but she is somebody that other teams will need to plan for. New Hampshire junior **Morgan Frame**, a 6-foot-1 forward, was a mid-season transfer last winter from St. Anselm College and was not eligible for the Wildcats until their Dec. 18 game against Rhode Island. She recorded double-doubles in each of her first two games in uniform, and scored 35 points in a win over Wagner on Dec. 21. In her 13 games with the Wildcats, Frame has become UNH's leading scorer with 16.4 ppg and second-leading rebounder with 7.9 rpg. The Wildcats are 8-6 since Frame has become eligible after going 4-4 in the first eight games without Frame.

## REED'S HOT HAND

University of New Hampshire junior **Cari Reed** found her shooter's touch Dec. 6 against Harvard. The guard exploded for a then-league-high 32 points including a school-record eight three-pointers. The eight treys marks the highest number of

made shots from downtown by an America East player since Binghamton's Erica Carter's conference-record nine on Dec. 7, 2009. Reed tied three others for the second-highest single-game three-point field goals made in America East history.

## AGAINST THE BEST

Among the league's 117 non-conference games, 41 were against teams that advanced to a 2011 postseason tournament. America East was 17-24 against those teams with most of the wins coming against WNIT participants (10-7). America East was 4-16 against NCAA teams, with victories coming at Central Florida (Hartford), against Marist (Boston U.) and Navy (UMBC, Boston U.). The league was also 3-1 against the WBI field.

## PLAYING WITH THE BIG BOYS

Hartford and Boston U. each upended Boston College during a three-day span, Dec. 10 and Dec. 13. It was the Hawks' first win over the Eagles in program history, and the Terriers' first over their crosstown rivals since 1990. The wins marked the league's first over an ACC team this season, and the first since Vermont's two wins against the ACC (vs. Boston College, NC State) in 2009-10. The victories were also the second and third win for an America East team over a 'Big 6' Conference team this season. Boston U. defeated Providence out of the Big East on Nov. 11.

## JOIN THE CLUB

Six players have reached the 1,000 career point milestone this season and the league now has eight active 1,000-point scorers. Albany junior **Eb-one Henry** hit the mark on Jan. 11 against New

Hampshire, and Binghamton senior **Viive Rebane** reached the mark Dec. 29 at St. Peter's College. New Hampshire senior **Denise Beliveau**, UMBC senior **Erin Brown**, and Boston U. junior **Chantell Alford** all tallied their 1,000th career points within hours of each other on Sat. Dec. 3. Boston U. senior **Alex Young** accomplished the milestone in November and UMBC's **Michelle Kurowski** and Binghamton's **Andrea Holmes** each scored their 1,000th points last January. The league currently has the highest number of active 1,000-point club members since there were 10 during the 2009-10 season.

## INSTANT CLASSIC

The Catamounts made an instant turnaround this season opening with a 6-2 start after beginning 2010-11 with 15 straight losses. Vermont surpassed last season's win total in just the first

seven games of the season and captured two in-season tournaments. Vermont won its own annual TD Bank Classic, winning the tournament for the seventh time overall and first time since 2007. Also making a great first impression in 2011-12 are six newcomers who have all made an appearance this season, and several who have made impacts in the starting lineup.

## RAINING THREE'S

Boston University put up a three-point show on Tues., Nov. 22 against Northeastern, netting 15 three-point field goals. The 15 treys is the third-highest all-time single-game total for an America East team, and the most since the Terriers hit a school-record 16 during the 2008 America East tournament. Six different Terriers hit three-point shots against the Huskies, including **Chantell Alford's** five and **Alex Young's** four, while the team went 15-for-31.

## BUZZER BEATERS

There were several clutch game-winning and game-tying buckets during the week of Nov. 21. New Hampshire sophomore **Kelsey Hogan** tipped in a missed three-pointer with one-tenth of a second left on the clock to give the Wildcats a 63-62 win at Cornell on Tues., Nov. 22... Stony Brook junior **Dani Klupenger** nailed the game-winning three-pointer with 14 seconds left on the clock on Wed., Nov. 23 against Robert Morris. It gave the Seawolves their first win of the season and handed the Colonials their first loss... With 19 seconds left in regulation, Black Bear sophomore **Ashleigh Roberts** tied the Dead River Company Classic championship game against Brown on Nov. 26 at 56-56 with a layup and forced overtime.

## 20-20 VISION

Albany junior forward **Julie Forster's** 26-point, 20-rebound performance against La Salle on Nov. 13 wasn't only a career game, but it was one of the conference's top individual efforts of the decade. It was the first 20+ point, 20+ rebound game since two-time America East Player of the Year Heather Ernest (Maine '04) recorded 21 points and 21 rebounds at New Hampshire on Jan. 14, 2001.

## FAST START

America East teams went 11-3 in the first 14 games of the season for a .785 winning percentage. The league stood at 3-11 (.214) through the first 14 games of the 2010-11 season.

## PRESEASON WNIT

Hartford advanced to the Preseason WNIT semifinals, joining Top-25 foes #1 Baylor, #2 Notre Dame and #22 UCLA as the final four teams. The Hawks fell to the Fighting Irish in South Bend, however junior forward **Ruthanne Doherty** earned one of just six spots on the all-tournament team. Doherty averaged 15.5 points and 5.3 rebounds in the three games. Baylor defeated Notre Dame to win the Preseason WNIT Championship.

## COACHING DEBUTS

Opening weekend marked the debut of two head coaches at their current institutions. **Richard Barron** and the Black Bears opened up with a loss at Central Connecticut, but the team gave Coach Barron his first win as Maine head coach with a victory at Rhode Island on Nov. 13. The Nov. 11 season-opener at Fairfield was **Beth O'Boyle's** first at the helm of the Seawolves. O'Boyle earned her first win as Stony Brook head coach on Nov. 23 at home against Robert Morris.

## SOPHOMORE COACHES

The 2011-12 season also marks the second season at the helm for three other America East head coaches. Albany's **Katie Abrahamson-Henderson**, New Hampshire's **Maureen Magarity** and Vermont's **Lori Gear McBride** enter their second campaign at their current schools.

## PRESEASON PREDICTIONS

A year after finishing one of the most successful seasons in the program's history, the UMBC women's basketball program tops the 2011-12 America East preseason poll as determined by the league's nine head coaches. The conference office unveiled the preseason poll on Oct. 13 at the 2011 America East Basketball Tip-Off Luncheon at the Connecticut State Capitol in Hartford, host city of the 2012 America East Men's and Women's Basketball Championship presented by Newman's Own.

The Retrievers, the 2011 America East regular-season champions, picked up five first-place votes and 60 total points. Boston University followed with 56 points and defending tournament champion University of Hartford earned the final two first-place votes and 54 points. Binghamton University (43 points), University at Albany (37), University of New Hampshire (25) and University of Vermont (22) finished fourth through seventh in the poll. Stony Brook University (15) and University of Maine (12), each with first-year head coaches, round out the nine-team poll. Head coaches were not permitted to vote for their own teams.

## CONFERENCE RETURNS TALENTED PLAYERS

All five women's basketball players who earned all-conference first-team recognition after the 2010-11 season return in 2011-12 as America East Preseason All-Conference Team members. The league's nine head coaches, who were not permitted to vote for their own players, determined the preseason all-conference team. The conference office announced the awards at the annual America East Basketball Tip-Off Luncheon on Thursday, October 13 at the Connecticut State Capitol Building. The reigning America East Player of the Year, Boston University junior guard **Chantell Alford**, headlines the preseason squad as a unanimous pick. The 2011 Defensive Player of the Year, University at Albany junior guard/forward **Ebone Henry**, and UMBC senior guard **Michelle Kurowski** also received all eight possible first-place votes. Binghamton University senior guard **Andrea Holmes** and UMBC senior forward **Erin Brown** round out the honorees. This season marks the first since 1996-97 that all five preseason all-conference team members had also received first-team all-conference honors the previous year. This year's five players represent five of 2010-11's top six scorers in the conference.

## HARTFORD HOSTS 2012 HOOPS TOURNEY

For the third straight year, the America East Conference has chosen the University of Hartford as host for its Men's and Women's Basketball Championships. The league's Athletic Directors made the decision to send the combined tournament back to West Hartford in 2012 during the conference's annual meetings in Portsmouth, N.H. this morning.

"We are thrilled that our Basketball Championship, the conference's signature event, will return to Hartford for a third straight year," said America East Interim Commissioner Shonna Brown. "Our last two tournaments have been great experiences for our teams and fans and this will give us the op-

portunity to build off the excitement that has been established in Hartford and make the experience even better in 2012."

The 2012 America East Men's and Women's Basketball Championships will be held on March 1-4, 2012 at Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion on University of Hartford's campus. The first, quarterfinal and semifinal rounds for both the men and women will be held at the combined tournament, while the title games will again both be held the following weekend at the site of the highest seeds remaining.

Following the same format as the last two years, both first round games will be held Thursday, March 1, while the women's quarterfinals will follow on Friday, March 2. The men's quarterfinals will be scheduled for Saturday, March 3 and both the men's and women's semifinal tilts will take place Sunday, March 4. The highest seeds remaining in both the men's and women's tournament will host the championship games with the men's title game on Saturday, March 10 and the women's final tentatively set for that same day.

The last two America East Championships, which were also presented by Newman's Own, drew nearly 30,000 fans to Chase Arena at the Reich Family Pavilion, the University's 3,508-seat facility.

The last two tournaments also featured the largest title sponsor in conference history in Newman's Own, whose Foundation also sponsored a Campus Community Challenge, which has contributed more than \$200,000 to organizations in America East communities over the last two years.

Prior to the combined format, which is in its third year, Hartford had hosted the America East Women's Championship seven times in the previous eight years. The women's championship had utilized a single-site format since 1998. Maine hosted the first single-site event, followed by University of Vermont in 1999, 2000 and 2001, and Hartford in 2002-06. The tournament traveled to Binghamton in 2007 before returning to Hartford in 2008 and 2009.

Hartford has attracted more than 78,000 fans to championship games at Chase Arena since 2002. The Hawks also led the conference last season, drawing an average of 1,327 fans for women's basketball games.

## TOURNEY TITLE SPONSOR
