



**America East Quarterfinals
No. 4 Albany 67, No. 1 Vermont 58
Postgame Notes**

- Albany improves to 18-15 overall and advances to the championship game for the second-straight year and fourth time since 2006.
- The Catamounts fall to 22-10 with the loss, their first in 11 games and second in 21, and will receive an automatic bid to the NIT.
- Albany improves to 13-9 all time in championship play while Vermont falls to 31-27.
- The Great Danes are now 5-1 against Vermont in tournament play and have eliminated the Catamounts five times since 2006.
- Will Brown improved to 13-9 all time in tournament play and tied Jim Calhoun for fifth place in America East Championship wins.
- A #4 seed will play for the league title for the second-straight year and fifth time overall.
- No. 1 seeds have now failed to reach the championship game in three-straight years, the longest such stretch in league history.
- The drought for No. 1's winning the title will stretch to five years, the longest in league history.
- The Great Danes jumped out to a 13-2 lead and grew their lead to 19 early in the second half.
- Albany outrebounded Vermont, 45-30.
- Peter Hooley scored 20 of his game-high 26 points in the first half.
- Luke Apfeld and Clancy Rugg each scored 13 points to lead Vermont.
