



**America East Championship Game
No. 1 Albany 70, No. 2 Stony Brook 46
Postgame Notes**

- Albany is just the fourth program in America East history to win three-straight titles and the first since Maine won four-straight from 1995-1998. Vermont (1992-94) and Northeastern (1985-87) also accomplished the feat.
- Albany will play in its third-straight NCAA tournament, earning the conference's automatic berth. The NCAA selection show is Monday, March 17, at 7 p.m. on ESPNU.
- Stony Brook will earn the conference's automatic berth to the WNIT and make its second postseason appearance in program history. The Seawolves also played in the 2006 WNIT.
- Katie Abrahamson-Henderson is only the third coach in league history to win three-straight titles, joining Joanne P. McCallie (Maine, 1995-98) and Joy Machodi (Northeastern, 1985-87).
- No. 1 seeds improve to 10-3 against the No. 2 seed in the America East title game.
- The No. 1 seed has won 18 overall America East titles.
- Royals tallied 24 assists in the tournament, tying the all-time record set by Maine's Amy Vachon in 1999.
- Stony Brook shot 24.5% in the game, the lowest in a tournament final.
