UMBC Coach Aki Thomas's opening statement:

Tough way to end our season. I'm still extremely proud of the guys that came up here to fight against a very good and coached Albany team. We knew that it would be a challenge for us, undermanned, undersized but we definitely showed courage too out here and played as hard as we could. UMBC's Quentin Jones on his UMBC basketball career:

UMBC's Coach Aki Thomas on preparing for the game with fewer players:

Albany's Peter Hooley on his career high game:

It's a good feeling. I just started getting in a groove and my teammates were finding me, which allowed me to take some open shots. I was feeling good and they kept pressing our lead which makes you more comfortable when you shoot.

Albany's Sam Rowley on how the team took care of business:

Just to get a great team win, we were flying on all cylinders as they say. Everybody played. Those aspects of bringing the team together will help us going forward.

Albany's Coach Will Brown on how he feels about playing Vermont:

We would jump on the bus and go to Burlington now if we had to. Nobody says I was smart so maybe that is why I coach. They (Vermont) are really good. We are going to fight, scrape and claw. We want this game. There will be a ton of Vermont fans in the building; it is going to be a great atmosphere. I would hate to be an official during this game because it is going to be a battle.
