# #14/17 WOFFORD (7-3, 6-1) AT THE CITADEL (6-5, 4-3)

### THE CITADEL GAME

Wofford will travel to The Citadel on Saturday at noon in the final regular season game of the season ... Wofford enters the game with a 7-3 overall record and a 6-1 record in the Southern Conference after a 24-7 home win over Furman on Saturday to clinch a share of the league title ... With a win, Wofford could claim the SoCon title outright ... The Citadel is 6-5 on the season and 4-3 in the league after a 33-32 loss at Chattanooga on Saturday ... Last season in Spartanburg the teams played in the season opener and the Terriers won 28-21 after a defensive stand in the final seconds ... Wofford is returning to the FCS Playoffs after reaching the second round last season with a 9-4 overall record and a 6-2 mark as Southern Conference Champions ... Wofford is ranked 14th in the STATS FCS poll and 17th in the FCS Coaches poll, while The Citadel is receiving votes in the STATS FCS poll.

### TERRIER TOP NOTES

Here are the top notes of interest heading into the game against The Citadel:

- Wofford won the 2019 Southern Conference Championship, the seventh overall and first time winning back-to-back-to-back.
- This season will be the tenth playoff appearance for Wofford, with a 9-9 mark in the postseason.
- The coaches and media selected Wofford as the 2019 preseason favorite to win the SoCon
- The Terriers are second in the nation with 335.6 rushing yards per game, 14 yards per game more than in 2018.
- Wofford is 21st in the nation in total defense and 20th in the nation in total offense.
- Players received a total of nine preseason All-Southern Conference honors, with three on the first team
- OL Justus Basinger was named to several preseason All-America teams
- All five offensive linemen return in 2019 and rank first in the nation in fewest sacks allowed this year.
- The Terriers black shirts are 29th in the nation in scoring defense and 41st in rushing defense in 2019.
- The Wofford defense has allowed just eight 100+ yard rushers in the last 75 games.

# THIS WEEK'S OPPONENT ...

## THE CITADEL'S LAST GAME

The Citadel jumped out to a third-quarter lead, but it was a late touchdown that gave Chattanooga a 34-33 victory Saturday afternoon at Finley Stadium.

The Citadel got on the board first with a safety. UTC bounced back and scored on a 75-yard pass to Tyrin Summers. After a Bulldog turnover, UTC scored on their next play to take a 12-2 lead after the first quarter. The Bulldogs put together a 77-yard drive to get into the end zone as Brandon Rainey hit Ryan McCarthy for a 53-yard touchdown on a 3rd-and-10 play to make it 12-9 at the half.

The Citadel came out in the second half and let their defense take over. An interception and a fumble both led to touchdowns and a 23-12 lead. Dante Smith broke loose on a 73-yard run. The Bulldogs would get into the red zone, but settle for a 21-yard Jacob Godek field goal and a 26-12 advantage. The Mocs raced for a 45-yard touchdown. The two-point conversion made it a six-point game at 26-20. The Citadel ended the next drive with a seven-yard touchdown run.

A big pass play would set up Ibotuken's second touchdown run to make it a six-point game. After the Bulldogs were forced to punt, a pair of penalties helped the Mocs move down the field. Nick Tiano would eventually end the drive with a 12-yard touchdown run and a 34-33 win.

The Citadel rushed for 351 yards on 63 attempts. It was the sixth game this season with more than 300 yards rushing. Remus Bulmer led the way with 130 yards on just 12 carries. It was his first 100-yard game as a Bulldog. Brandon Rainey ran for 67 yards and a touchdown. He also went 6-of-14 for 148 yards and two touchdowns.

## LAST MEETING

THE CITADEL 21, #10 WOFFORD 28  
SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 1, 2018

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – Wofford stopped The Citadel on fourth-and-goal as time expired to earn a 28-21 win on Saturday at Gibbs Stadium. The Terriers jumped out to a 21-0 lead before the Bulldogs tied it in the third quarter. A touchdown with 7:48 remaining in the game by Blake Morgan and a defensive stand gave the Terriers the victory.

Wofford opens the season 1-0 overall and in the Southern Conference, while the Bulldogs are 0-1 to begin the year. The Terriers were led by Lennox McAfee with 85 rushing yards and two touchdowns, while Ryan Lovelace added a 70-yard touchdown run. The Bulldogs were led by Lorenzo Ward with 124 rushing yards on 22 carries along with a touchdown. Noah Dawkins had two interceptions for The Citadel, with one returned for a touchdown.

The Bulldogs had the ball first and gained two first downs before coming up short on a fourth-and-four on a tackle by John Beckley. Both teams then traded three-and-outs. With the ball back, Wofford had a 70-yard touchdown run by Ryan Lovelace to make it a 7-0 game at the 7:00 mark. After the Bulldogs went three-and-out, Wofford had another big play as Lennox McAfee went 62-yards for a touchdown. With 3:35 left in the first quarter, the Terriers had a 14-0 lead.

An eight-play drive by Wofford that covered 80 yards was capped by a two-yard touchdown run by Lennox McAfee for a 21-0 advantage at the 11:06 mark of the second quarter. The Citadel picked up a fourth-and-one on their next drive, but ultimately were forced to punt. Both teams then traded three-and-outs. With the ball back, Joe Newman was intercepted by Noah Dawkins at the 21-yard line. It took the Bulldogs just three plays to score on a 10-yard run which cut the lead to 21-7 with 1:14 left in the first half. Wofford went three-and-out and punted. The Bulldogs had a run for 43 yards on the final play of the half.

Wofford had the ball first to begin the second half. After a first down, Noah Dawkins picked off a pass by Joe Newman and returned it 47 yards for a touchdown to make it a 21-14 game. The Terriers had a first down on the next drive but were forced to punt. The teams then traded punts. The Bulldogs went three-and-out and punted, but the ball hit a Wofford player and the punt was recovered by The Citadel. On the next drive, the Bulldogs converted and fourth-and-one and then were faced with fourth-and-goal from the one. Rod Johnson took the ball in for the touchdown and the game was tied at 21 with 15 seconds left in the third quarter.

The Terriers responded with a drive that took eight minutes off the clock and gained six first downs. Blake Morgan capped the drive with a one-yard touchdown run to give Wofford a 28-21 lead with 7:48 remaining in the fourth quarter. After trading three-and-outs, the Bulldogs took over with 4:40 left on the clock. They gained a first down, then converted a fourth-and-four with a pass. The Bulldogs then had a fourth-and-one from the seven with 29 seconds left and picked up the first down. Four incomplete passes from the five-yard line ended the game.

## ABOUT WOFFORD

At quarterback, Joe Newman and Miller Mosley both see action ... Newman has started all ten games and is 59-of-108 passing with seven touchdowns and he has 845 rushing yards, along with 13 rushing touchdowns ... Mosley is 6-of-11 passing and has 117 rushing yards and two touchdowns ... Blake Morgan has 650 rushing yards and six touchdowns ... Jacquez Allen has 486 rushing yards and three touchdowns, while Nathan Walker has 353 rushing yards and four touchdowns ... The offensive line returns all five starters from last season ... D'mauriae VanCleave has 21 catches for 346 yards, while T.J. Luther has added 12 catches for 297 yards and two touchdowns ... Jireh Wilson leads the team with 43 tackles, followed by Mason Alstatt with 40 and John Beckley with 38 ... Michael Mason has a team-high 9.0 tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks ... George Gbese, Mason Alstatt, Jireh Wilson, Keyvaun Cobb, Brandon Brown and DT Wilson have one interception each, while Gbese has a team-best ten pass break-ups ... Luke Carter is 9-of-11 on field goals, made all 44 PATs and has a 40.4 average on punts.

## INJURY REPORT

DB Omari Johnson (knee), DL Thad Mangum (knee) and DL Mikel Horton (shoulder) will miss the season due to injury. RB Andy Riazzi (hand) will miss the remainder of the season.

## FIRST IN FOOTBALL

Contrary to popular belief, the first football game in the state of South Carolina was not between Clemson and South Carolina. Wofford and Furman played the first game on December 14, 1889, which was won 5-1 by the Terriers. This season marks the 130th anniversary of that contest. Clemson played their first game 1896 and South Carolina played their first game in 1892 against Furman.



## SENIOR'S LAST LAP

The Furman victory marked the final regular season home contest for 20 Wofford seniors. The group includes: Mason Alstatt, Robbie Armstrong, Justus Basinger, Ronnie Brooks, Luke Carter, Zach Epting, George Gbese, Jason Hill, Nick Karas, Dorian Lindsey, Blake Morgan, Miller Mosley, Joe Newman, Michael Ralph, Andy Riazzi, Dimitri Redwood, Liam Ronan, Ulysses Strawter, DT Wilson and Jireh Wilson. In the past four years they had a 35-14 overall record and won the 2017 and 2018 Southern Conference Championships, along with NCAA FCS Playoff appearances in 2016, 2017 and 2018.

## SOCON CHAMPIONSHIP BREAKDOWN

With one week left in the regular season, three teams have a chance to share the Southern Conference title - Wofford (6-1), Furman (6-2), and Chattanooga (5-2). With Wofford's win over Furman on Saturday, the Terriers claimed a share of the title. If Wofford wins in Charleston, they will win the title outright. If Chattanooga wins over VMI and Wofford loses, there would be a three-way shared title with Furman. The Terriers have already claimed the automatic bid to the playoffs by defeating both the Mocs and the Paladins.

## BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK TITLES

Wofford has a 6-1 record in the SoCon and has captured a share of the 2019 Southern Conference title. Wofford won the title for the seventh time (2003, 2007, 2010, 2012, 2017, 2018 and 2019) and for the first time has won three straight championships. The Terriers posted a 6-2 record in conference play in 2018, tied with ETSU and Furman. This secured a share of the Southern Conference Championship. The automatic bid to the NCAA FCS Playoffs went to Wofford on a tiebreaker of defensive points allowed as Wofford allowed only 175, while Furman (189) and ETSU (217) gave up more. Wofford won the outright title in 2017 with a 7-1 record.

## WINNING SEASONS

With a 7-3 mark in 2019, Wofford has secured a winning record for the fourth straight season and the 17th time in the last twenty years. The Terriers were 5-6 in 2013, one game under the .500

mark, but rebounded with a 6-5 record in 2014. Wofford was 5-6 in 2015, but were 10-4 in 2016 and then 10-3 in 2017. Last season they were 9-4.

## WOFFORD'S LAST GAME

Wofford College defeated Furman 24-7 on Saturday afternoon at Gibbs Stadium. The Paladins scored first, but the rest of the game belong to the Terriers as they scored 24 unanswered points. Wofford, ranked #20 in the nation, is 7-3 overall and 6-1 in the Southern Conference. Furman, ranked #7, falls to 6-4 on the season and 6-2 in league play. The Terriers were led by Blake Morgan with a career-high 147 rushing yards and a touchdown. Joe Newman added two rushing touchdowns. The Paladins were led by Wayne Anderson with 68 rushing yards and a touchdown.

Wofford had 336 total yards, with 288 rushing yards. Furman had 265 total yards, 167 of which were rushing. Wofford had 18 first downs, while Furman had 15. Wofford was 5-of-12 on third down and 2-of-2 on fourth down. Furman was 6-of-14 on third down and 1-of-4 on fourth down. Wofford was called for seven penalties to three for the Paladins. Wofford had a 34:17 to 25:43 time of possession advantage.

## FURMAN GAME NOTES

Blake Morgan had his first 100-yard rushing game of the season with a career-high 147 yards and it was the second 100+ rushing game of his career ... The interception by Brandon Brown in the fourth quarter was the first of his career ... Luke Carter had one field goal and moved to a tie in all-time field goals made at 32 (David Marvin). He is also now first all-time in kicking points with 230, passing Christian Reed (228) ... Joe Beckett led the team with six tackles ... Game captains were Joe Newman, Justus Basinger, Mason Alstatt, Jireh Wilson and Blake Morgan ... Attendance was 6,457 at Gibbs Stadium.

## PRESEASON SOUTHERN CONFERENCE POLL

In the 2019 Southern Conference Preseason Poll, the conference's nine head coaches and the media picked Wofford to win the league. The coaches and media had Furman coming in second, while ETSU was the pick for third.

## PRESEASON ALL-SOCON

The Terriers had a league-high nine players recognized by the coaches on the 2019 Preseason All-SoCon team, with three on the first team and six on the second team. Leading the Terriers on the first team were offensive linemen Justus Basinger and Michael Ralph, along with defensive lineman Thad Mangum. Second team selections included safety Mason Alstatt, offensive lineman Justus Basinger, punter Luke Carter, cornerback George Gbese, defensive lineman Mikel Horton and linebacker Jireh Wilson.

## PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA

Wofford offensive lineman Justus Basinger was named to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America second team. Basinger, a senior from Longwood, Florida, started all 13 games last season at right guard. He was named first team All-Southern Conference by the media and coaches. He was part of a line that blocked for the nation's fifth-ranked rushing offense. Basinger has also received preseason All-America honors from HERO Sports and preseason first team All-Southern Conference recognition.

## PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

Luke Carter has been named to the FCS Punter of the Year Preseason Watch List. This season will mark the inaugural season for the FCS Punter of the Year Award. The Augusta Sports Council, based in Augusta, Georgia is also home to the Ray Guy Award which honors the nation's best FBS collegiate punter each year. Carter was second in the Southern Conference last season in punting average at 43.6 yards.

## DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Wofford linebacker Jireh Wilson was named the Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Week presented by GEICO on September 23. Wilson recorded a team-best eight tackles that included three sacks for 24 lost yards in the Terriers' 49-10 win over Gardner-Webb on Saturday, September 21. The senior from Calhoun, Georgia, led a Wofford defense that held the Runnin' Bulldogs to just 246 yards of total offense, including just 9 rushing yards on the day on 34 attempts. It is the first Player of the Week honor in his career.

## OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Wofford quarterback Joe Newman was named the Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Week presented by GEICO on Monday, for games Oct. 17-19. Playing just three quarters in Wofford's 59-7 win over Western Carolina on Saturday, Terrier quarterback Joe Newman ran for 104 yards and two touchdowns and threw for 162 yards and two scores, completing seven of his 11 attempts. It is the first Player of the Week honor for the senior from Riverdale, Georgia.

## OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK II

Wofford quarterback Joe Newman repeated as Southern Conference Offensive Player of the Week presented by GEICO for games played on Oct. 26. He ran for 66 yards and three touchdowns and threw for 134 yards in the Terriers' 35-34, overtime win over Chattanooga. The senior had a 3-yard TD run in the second quarter and a 10-yard scoring run in the third to give Wofford a 21-14 lead. After the Mocs took a 28-21 lead with 2:08 left in regulation, Newman led Wofford on a 13-play, 65-yard scoring drive in just 1:49 to force overtime. There, Newman ran for a 25-yard touchdown on the first play.

## OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE MONTH

Wofford quarterback Joe Newman was named the Southern Conference football offensive player of the month for October. Newman led the Terriers to a 3-0 record in October, running for 355 yards and nine touchdowns and throwing for 345 yards and two scores. He averaged 233.3 yards of total offense per game and 7.7 yards per carry. Newman becomes the first Terrier to earn player of the month honors since safety Jaleel Green (defense) in November of 2016. It is only the seventh player of the month honor ever for a Wofford football player.

## THE 2018 SEASON

Wofford was 9-4 overall and was 6-2 in the Southern Conference ... Wofford shared the SoCon Championship and earned the automatic bid, marking the sixth league title in school history ... It was the first time the Terriers have won back-to-back league championships ... Wofford reached the NCAA FCS Playoffs for the third-straight season ... The Terriers were one of seven teams to make the last three playoff fields ... In the opening round, the Terriers defeated Elon 19-7 at Gibbs Stadium to advance to the second round ... At #4 seed Kennesaw State on December 1, the Terriers were defeated 13-10 to end the season ... In the finals polls, Wofford was ranked 13th by STATS FCS and 12th by the FCS Coaches.

Earning first team honors from the Southern Conference Coaches were OL Justus Basinger, DL Miles Brown, and RB Andre Stoddard. Second team honors went to P Luke Carter, RB Lennox McAfee, DL Thad Mangum and DB JoJo Tillery.

In the Southern Conference Sports Media Association voting, first team honors went to OL Justus Basinger, DL Miles Brown, DB George Gbese, OL Michael Ralph and RB Andre Stoddard. Second team recognition went to OL Josh Burger, OL Blake Jeresaty and P Luke Carter.

## 2018 ALL-AMERICANS

Justus Basinger was named third team FCS All-America by the Associated Press, while Andre Stoddard and Miles Brown were named STATS FCS All-Americans. Stoddard picked up HERO Sports third team All-America honors as well. This is the third straight season multiple Terriers have been named All-American, as three players were honored last season.

## THE 2019 RETURNERS

Wofford returns 14 starters for the 2019 season. On offense, the nine players include offensive linemen Michael Ralph, Liam Ronan, Blake Jeresaty, Justus Basinger and Josh Burger, along with quarterback Joe Newman, wide receivers Jason Hill and Dorian Lindsey, and halfback Blake Morgan. On defense, the five returners are defensive lineman Thad Mangum (injured), linebackers John Beckley, DT Wilson and Jireh Wilson, and safety Mason Alstatt. An additional nine players who started at least one game also return.

## NUMBER CHANGES

Numerous players changed numbers during the offseason, including #3 D'mauria VanCleave, #5 Robbie Armstrong, #8 Zy Abercrombie, #9 Mikel Horton, #27 George Gbese, #35 Jaxen Rogers, #36 Rett Russell, #47 Ryan Titus, #63 Josh Scruggs, #39 Nyle Grove, #81 Corey Cooper, and #83 Anthony Craig.

## DOUBLE NUMBERS

The Terriers have several double numbers to note this season. QB Miller Mosley and DB Keyvaun Cobb share #4; QB Jimmy Weirick and DL Robbie Armstrong are #5; QB Joe Newman and LB Zy Abercrombie are #8; CB Miles Richardson and RB Blake Morgan are #11; WR Malik Stanback and CB Darron Paschal share #12; QB Peyton Derrick and S Dimitri Redwood are #18; CB Tahir Anoor and RB Nathan Walker share #21; CB John Harrington and TE Andy Riazzi are #25; RB Irvin Mulligan and S Jaxen Rogers are #35.

## POSITION CHANGES

A few players also switched positions from the 2018 season, including Nyle Grove (WR to CB), Corey Cooper (QB to WR), Landon Parker (WR to TE), and Anthony Craig (OL to TE).

## COSIDA ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT

Blake Jeresaty was named to the 2019 Academic All-District Football Team, selected by CoSIDA, which recognizes the nation's top student-athletes for their combined performances on the field and in the classroom. Jeresaty is a junior offensive lineman from Charleston, South Carolina. He has started all nine games this season at center and has made 26 career starts in 32 games played. He is part of an offensive line that is second in the nation in rushing yards per game at 340.6 and is also first in the nation in fewest sacks allowed. He is majoring in finance and economics. It marked the 20th straight season at least one Wofford football student-athlete has been named Academic All-District.

## REACHING NINE WINS

Wofford had a 9-4 record last season and was 10-3 in 2017. The 2018 season was only the 14th time in school history the Terriers reached nine or more wins. Nine of those seasons have been since 2002 (2002, 2003, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2012, 2016, 2017 and 2018). Wofford also had ten wins in 2010 and 2016, with eleven victories in 1949 and 1970 and a school record 12 wins in 2003.

## 2019 FIRST CAREER STARTS

In the season opener at South Carolina State, five players made first career starts: TE Garrison Moore, DL Elijah Ball, DL Tanner Barnes, LB Joe Beckett and CB Jay Hazel. CB Darron Paschal made his first career start against Samford and DL Corey Prince earned his first start against Gardner-Webb. WRs Jim Welsh and KeiAndre Sanders made their first career starts at ETSU. LB Ryan Titus started his first game against Chattanooga and DB Keyvaun Cobb started at Clemson.

## VETERAN CAREER GAMES PLAYED/STARTS

The most veteran players on the team this year are Mason Alstatt and Jireh Wilson, who have

played in all 50 games of their careers. Nick Karas (46), Justus Basinger (49), Jason Hill (49), George Gbese (48), DT Wilson (48), and Dorian Lindsey (42) have also played in over 40 games. Jason Hill leads the team with 46 career starts, followed by DT Wilson (44), George Gbese (38), Mason Alstatt (35) and Michael Ralph (34).

### **TRUE FRESHMEN ON THE FIELD**

With the new redshirt rules, players can see action in up to four games and keep the redshirt. Those freshmen who played in more than four games last season were WRT.J. Luther, LB T.J. Neal, RB D'mauria VanCleave and RB Nathan Walker. All other freshmen played in four or less games.

### **2019 RECRUITING CLASS**

Wofford welcomed a total of 21 student-athletes in the 2019 recruiting class. The class includes ten players on defense and eleven players on offense. The student-athletes are from nine different states, including seven from South Carolina and three each from Georgia and Alabama. On defense, the seven players include four linebackers, two linemen and five defensive backs. On offense, the ten players include three offensive linemen, two running backs, four wide receivers, and one tight end. They are joined by seven walk-ons for a total of 28 freshman.

### **THE 2019 TRANSFERS**

In addition to the freshmen, the Terriers also have several transfers join the roster. TE Josh Lifson spent the fall of 2018 at Air Force Prep. QB Peyton Derrick redshirted in 2017 at Appalachian State and played in six games in 2018 for the Mountaineers. CB Cagan Campbell played in four games as a freshman in 2018 at Jacksonville State. He will sit out 2019 due to transfer rules. K Walker Gliarmis also transferred from Appalachian State.

### **DEEP THOUGHTS...**

By quarter, the Terriers have outscored opponents in all four quarters and overtime, with the biggest margin of 53 points in the second quarter ... Of the 53 scoring drives this season, 13 were for 10 or more plays, while 23 covered 70 yards or more and 14 took over five minutes off the clock ... Of the 113 carries by Joe Newman, 49 were for a first down or touchdown ... Of the 68 receptions this season, 44 were for a first down or a touchdown ... Wofford had 12 rushes on fourth down and converted eleven of them into first downs or touchdowns ... The Terriers have an average start of the 30.7 yard line, while opponents have a 28.5 yard line average start ... On opening drives in a game, Wofford has four touchdowns, four punts, one field goal and a missed field goal for a 50% scoring rate. On second half drives, the Terriers have three touchdowns, five punts, a field goal and a missed field goal for a 40% scoring rate ... Jason Hill completed a pass at Gardner-Webb (and at Samford) in 2018, joining his father, Jason (1986-88), as Terriers to complete passes. The only other known father/son duo to complete passes at Wofford were Charlie Bradshaw (1956-58) and Charlie Bradshaw, Jr. (1979-82).

### **PLAYER INTEREST NOTES**

CB George Gbese (Ghana) is the lone foreign born player on the roster ... K Luke Carter's father is the president of Francis Marion University ... WR TJ Luther's high school coach was Wofford alum Jordan Ingman who played football from 2007-10 for the Terriers ... DL Elijah Ball's brother played at Alabama from 2012-16 ... WR Landon Parker's brother is currently the punter at Duke and his father punted for the Denver Broncos ... CB Nyle Grove was ranked second in the nation in the all-around for gymnastics in the 14-15 age group ... QB Peyton Derrick's dad played at Wofford from 1978-82 and his brother, Dakota, played at Furman from 2007-12 ... DL Jacob Drag's father played on the defensive line at Clemson (1984-89) ... LS Forrest Alvarez parents both graduated from Wofford and his brother, Carew, also played football for the Terriers ... CB Tahir Annoor's brother, Aaquil, played at Furman.

### **WOFFORD 100-YARD RUSHERS**

Wofford began 2016 with a 100-yard game from Will Gay against Tennessee Tech and had a 100-yard rusher in eleven of the 14 games. Wofford had a 100-yard rusher in four of 13 games in 2017 with Blake Morgan, Andre Stoddard (2) and Joe Newman reaching the mark. In 2018, Wofford had a pair of 100-yard rushers (Andre Stoddard and Lennox McAfee) at Gardner-Webb and then added a pair of 100-yard rushers at Chattanooga (Andre Stoddard and Joe Newman). Lennox McAfee had over 100 yards against ETSU, while Andre Stoddard added 119 yards against Mercer. Joe Newman had the first 100+ game of 2019 against Gardner-Webb, with Newman (104), Jacquez Allen (105) and Irvin Mulligan (106) reaching the mark against Western Carolina. Blake Morgan added 147 yards against Furman.

### **THREE 100-YARD RUSHERS**

On October 16, 2010 against Western Carolina, the Terriers had three players reach 100 rushing

yards in the game. Mitch Allen had a career-high 178 rushing yards. Eric Breitenstein added 149 rushing yards and Donovan Johnson recorded his first career 100-yard rushing game with 123 yards. It was the first time in Wofford history with three rushers over 100 yards in the same game. Wofford repeated the feat on September 24, 2011 against Samford (Johnson 173, Breitenstein 126, Allen 110) and on September 15, 2012 against Western Carolina (Breitenstein 160, Weimer 141, Johnson 126). Against Western Carolina on October 19, 2019, the Terriers again had three go over the 100 mark (Irvin Mulligan 106, Jacquez Allen 105, Joe Newman 104).

### **400 RUSHING YARDS**

In four straight games, Wofford went over the 400-yard rushing mark. This includes Gardner-Webb (489), VMI (439), East Tennessee State (409) and Western Carolina (428). In 2018 the Terriers had three games of 400+ rushing, but none in 2016 and 2017. Wofford had four in 2015 (including three straight games) and none in 2014. There was one in 2013. During the 2012 season, there were five games over 400 yards which included a four-game stretch against Gardner-Webb (402), Lincoln (449), Western Carolina (590), and Elon (500). There were also four games in 2011.

### **OPPONENT 100-YARD RUSHERS**

A big part of the defense is not allowing an opponent to have a 100+ yard rusher. The Terriers went 17 games without allowing a 100+ rusher (last 2 games in 2013, 11 games in 2014, first four games in 2015). They then went an additional 19 games without a 100+ rusher. The 200+ rushing yards by Jody Webb were the most allowed since 2009. Wofford didn't allow a 100+ rusher in 2017. Twice in 2018 there were 100+ yard rushers against the Terriers and there have been four in 2019.

### **UNDER 100 YARDS RUSHING**

In nine of the 14 games in 2016, the Terriers held opponents to under 100 rushing yards. Wofford started 2016 by holding Tennessee Tech to 41 rushing yards and then Ole Miss ran for 174 yards. Youngstown State had 240 in the playoffs, the most by an opponent that season. Wofford held 2017 opponents to under 100 yards rushing six times (Gardner-Webb 99, Samford 10, ETSU 15, Chattanooga 99, VMI 80, and Furman 52). In 2018, VMI, Wyoming, Gardner-Webb, Chattanooga, ETSU, Samford and Elon were held to under 100 rushing yards. The 2019 season began with Wofford allowing just 75 yards to SC State and then just nine yards by Gardner-Webb. ETSU was held to 95 rushing yards, Western Carolina had only 64 and Mercer had only 89.

### **PUTTING UP SOME YARDS**

Twice last season the Wofford offense put up more than 600 yards of total offense in a game and the Terriers added one game in 2019. There have only been nine games with more than 600 yards in school history.

### **ACADEMIC SUCCESS**

Wofford's football program has ranked among the top 10 percent of FCS teams in the Academic Performance Review (APR) in eight of the last eleven seasons to earn public recognition. In 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018, Wofford had the highest APR in the SoCon. The Terriers lead the SoCon with 154 Academic All-Southern Conference selections since the program started in 2003.

Among all NCAA Division I (FBS and FCS) football teams, Wofford's APR score of 983 is 41st in the nation. The Terriers are ahead of schools such as Harvard (981), Georgia Tech (980), Samford (980), Baylor (879), Rice (977), and Wake Forest (979).

Wofford has had at least one player named CoSIDA/Capital One First Team All-District in each of the last 19 seasons. In 2018 Blake Jeresaty was named Academic All-District. In addition, safety James Zotto was named an Academic All-American in 2014.

## ABOUT THAT CLEMSON GAME

Despite a 59-14 loss at Clemson on November 2, there was one bright spot against the nation's third-ranked scoring defense (10.7 ppg). The Wofford offense scored 14 points, tied for the second-most allowed by the Tigers all season. North Carolina scored 20, while Wofford, Florida State and Georgia Tech scored 14. Wofford scored more than Texas A&M (10), Syracuse (6), Charlotte (10), Louisville (10), Boston College (7), North Carolina State (10) and Wake Forest (3).

## REACHING 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

Blake Morgan reached the 1,000 career rushing yard mark with a 14-yard run at Gardner-Webb and has 1,785 after ten games in 2019. Joe Newman went over the mark against Samford and has 1,793 career rushing yards. Nathan Walker is nearing the mark at 900 yards.

## A LITTLE MORE PASSING

In 2012, Wofford ran the ball almost 90% of the time. Since then, the Terriers have relied a little less on the run in the option offense. Of the 854 plays in 2018, 663 were rushes with 191 passes for an 77.6% run offense.

## LESS PASSING, MORE WINS

Since the start of the 2010 season, the Terriers have been most successful when they throw the ball ten times or less in a game. With ten or fewer attempts, Wofford is 47-21 overall. With eleven or more passes per game, Wofford is 32-20 overall.

## JOE NEWMAN MOVING UP THE CHARTS

This season quarterback Joe Newman has moved across the 2,000 yard career passing mark to rank seventh in school history in the category. He only played in five games with 27 passing yards as a freshman, then added 167 passing yards in 2017. Last year he threw for 1,070 yards and this season he is at 984 yards. If he can get to 1,000 yards this season he will be the first quarterback with back-to-back 1,000 passing seasons since Travis Wilson (1999-2001).

## CARTER WITH THE KICK

Senior kicker/punter Luke Carter is making his mark on the record books at Wofford. In 2018 he was 12-of-16 on field goal attempts and 48-of-48 on extra points. Against Elon (11/24) in the playoffs he tied the school record for field goals in a game with four. With his 48 made PATs in 2018, he set a new school mark for consecutive made PATs in a season. He has also made all 134 career PAT attempts, shattering the previous school mark of 54 straight. The FCS record for consecutive PATs made is 141 by Adrian Mora of Georgia Southern (2008-11).

## THE BIG PLAY IS BACK

In 2017, the big play (20+ rushing and receiving; 30+ return) was a key part of the Wofford offense, with 67 total big plays. In 2018, the Terriers had 67 big plays which included eleven each against VMI and Gardner-Webb. So far in 2019, after just two big plays against S.C. State and one against Samford, the Terriers have 52 big plays which includes 11 against VMI and nine against Western Carolina. D'mauria VanCleave leads the team with 13 big plays, while T.J. Luther has added ten. Fifteen different players have made big plays.

## KEEPING THE CLOCK

One of the best defenses is keeping the ball away from the opponent. The Terriers have used this strategy for decades, annually one of the national leaders in time of possession. This year is no exception as Wofford is second in the nation in the category. The longest drive this season lasted 8:21 (against Samford) and eight drives have gone six minutes or more.

## SEEING RED

The Wofford red zone offense is 37-of-40 overall with 29 touchdowns and 8 field goals for a 92.5% success rate which is fifth in the nation. This is a big improvement over 2018 when the Terriers were 39-of-48 (81.0%). The red zone defense is another story, allowing 81.5% (22-of-27) with 19 touchdowns and three field goals.

## COACHING CHANGES

The lone change to the coaching staff this season was the promotion of Bryan Whitehead to assistant secondary/safeties coach after spending the 2018 season as defensive quality control. The Terriers also welcome Chandler Burks (defensive quality control), Paul Holmes (offensive quality control) and Rob O'Connell (defensive quality control) to the staff. Meghan Reider is the new director of football operations and on-campus recruiting.

## POLL POSITIONS

In the 2016 preseason polls, Wofford received votes in both polls. Following the win over Chattanooga, Wofford returned to the top 25 on November 14, sitting at #19 in the FCS Coaches poll and #20 in the STATS FCS poll. In the final poll, Wofford was #11 in the Coaches Poll and #9 in the STATS poll. The Terriers began the 2017 season ranked #11 in both polls and finished 6th (STATS) and 7th (Coaches). During 2018, the team started the year at 10th (STATS) and 11th (Coaches) and were as high as fourth before finishing 13th (STATS) and 12th (Coaches). The highest ranking ever for the

Terriers was second (2003 and 2004).

### DEFENSE BY COMMITTEE

The Terrier defense is a true team effort with contributions from numerous players this season. Overall, 14 players recorded 20 or more tackles. Seventeen players have at least a share of a tackle for loss, while nine recorded sacks. Six players have interceptions. In the first ten games, there were ten different players with a share of being the leading tackler.

### PREVENTING THE SACK

In 2015, the offensive line gave up only eight sacks all season which ranked third in the nation (0.73 per game). In 2016 they allowed just one sack each against Johnson C. Smith, ETSU and Samford to lead the nation. During 2017 they were ranked seventh with only ten sacks allowed and in 2018 allowed only nine sacks (Wyoming, Western Carolina and Presbyterian, with two each at Furman, Samford and Kennesaw State) to rank fifth. This year they have allowed just one - at South Carolina State - to rank first in the nation.

### HOLD ONTO THE BALL

One common denominator over the seasons has been turnovers. After being +7 in turnovers during the 2012 SoCon Championship season, the Terriers were in the negative for the 2013, 2014 and 2015 seasons. In the 2016 title season, Wofford only had 14 turnovers (ten fumbles and four interceptions) and had 25 take-aways (18 interceptions, seven fumble recoveries) to be +11 (+0.79 pg). In 2017, Wofford was + 0.46 with 14 turnovers (eleven fumbles, three interceptions) and 20 take-aways (eleven interceptions, nine fumbles) to repeat as SoCon Champions. This season after throwing four interceptions in the season opener at South Carolina State, there have only been four turnovers since (two fumbles, two interceptions). Wofford has only eight take-aways (two fumbles, six interceptions) which is next-to-last in the nation.

### RUSHING LEGACY

Wofford has finished among the top ten schools in the nation in rushing in each of the past 20 years. The Terriers' wingbone offense puts a premium on ball control and keeping the opponent's offense on the boundary. Eight times the Terriers have been second in the nation in rushing yards per game, while in 2010 and 2011 they finished first.

### TERRIERS AT HOME

Wofford has won 78 of its last 98 games played in Gibbs Stadium, including going 5-0 in 2014 and 2018 ... Since Gibbs Stadium opened on Oct. 5, 1996, Wofford has posted a record of 99-34 (.757) ... The Terriers have won 59 of 86 home SoCon games at Gibbs Stadium.

### GOING OVERTIME

Wofford picked up a 35-34 win in overtime against Chattanooga in 2019. The Terriers lost the first two overtime games played, then won the next two. In 2012, a 24-17 double overtime loss at Samford was followed by a win over Chattanooga. There was a win over Mercer in 2015 and losses to The Citadel and Youngstown State (double overtime) in 2016. The Terriers had overtime wins against Western Carolina and Chattanooga in 2017. Wofford is now 7-5 all-time in overtime games.

### WOFFORD VS. NON-CONFERENCE FCS OPPONENTS

Since 2000, Wofford is 26-4 in non-conference regular season FCS games ... Wofford's loss to Coastal Carolina in 2006 snapped a streak of 10 straight regular season non-conference wins against FCS opponents ... The Terriers had not lost a non-conference regular season game to a FCS opponent since dropping the 2000 season opener to Lehigh 34-14 ... The loss to Gardner-Webb in 2013 ended a nine-game streak and Wofford lost again to Gardner-Webb in 2014, along with a loss to SC State in 2019.

### TERRIERS AGAINST FBS TEAMS

The 2019 season marked the 22nd time in the last 23 seasons the Terriers have played against a member of the FBS (NCAA Division I-A). Overall, Wofford is 1-22 in those games. In 2011, Wofford had a lead at Clemson in the third quarter. At South Carolina in 2012, the game was tied at 7-7 at the start of the fourth quarter. Wofford was down five points to Georgia Tech in 2014 with ten minutes to go in the game. In 2017, Wofford trailed South Carolina 14-10 in the third quarter. Wyoming scored with 17 seconds left in the game in 2018 and #3 Clemson defeated the Terriers in 2019. Wofford heads to South Carolina in 2020, North Carolina in 2021 and Virginia Tech in 2022. Clemson returns to the schedule in 2023 and 2027.

### TERRIERS IN THE NFL

Three Terriers were on NFL rosters at the beginning of training camp in 2019. Defensive lineman **Miles Brown '19** signed as a rookie free agent with the Arizona Cardinals and was on the 53-man roster on opening weekend and played in weeks two and three before moving to the practice squad. Safety **JoJo Tillery '19** signed as a rookie free agent with the Tennessee Titans and was waived after training camp. Punter **Kasey Redfern '14** signed as a free agent with the Dallas Cowboys in 2019 and was waived after training camp. He was signed by the Atlanta Falcons on October 11 and

has played in the last three games. Redfern made the 53-man roster for the Detroit Lions in 2017 and kicked in the season opener against Arizona before an injury landed him on injured reserve. He spent time on the Chargers practice squad in 2015 before joining the Carolina Panthers during the 2016 preseason and was traded to the Browns. He entered the NFL as a rookie free agent with the Jaguars in 2014.

### MR. RICHARDSON

Jerry Richardson came to Wofford in the mid-1950s as an unheralded pass receiver from Fayetteville, N.C. By the time he left to begin his pro career with the Baltimore Colts, the passing combination of Charlie Bradshaw to Jerry Richardson had received nationwide fame. Richardson was an Associated Press Little All-America selection in 1957 and '58. He still holds Wofford's single-game record with 241 receiving yards vs. Newberry in 1956 and is the record holder for touchdown receptions in a season (9 in 1958) and in a career (21). As a senior at Wofford, he scored 72 points on nine touchdowns, 12 extra points and two field goals. Drafted by the defending world champion Colts, Richardson played two seasons in the NFL, earning Colt Rookie of the Year honors in 1959 and finishing third in the balloting for top NFL rookie. He was the founder of the Carolina Panthers. In 2015, Wofford announced the construction of two new facilities on campus donated by Richardson. The Rosalind S. Richardson Center for the Arts opened in the spring of 2017 and is the home to academic programs in theatre arts, visual arts and art history. The Jerry Richardson Indoor Stadium is a 123,000-square-foot facility opened in September of 2017 and includes a 3,400-seat basketball arena and a 400-seat volleyball competition venue. Jerome Johnson Richardson Hall, a residence hall for approximately 150 students with athletic facilities for baseball, softball and golf, will open in the fall of 2020.

### CAROLINA PANTHER TRAINING CAMP

The Carolina Panthers have held summer training camp at Wofford since their inaugural season in 1995. The camp provides Wofford tremendous national exposure and visibility. In 2019 the camp drew almost 70,000 visitors to campus.



### SOCON SUCCESS

Wofford has finished among the top four teams in the Southern Conference race in 15 of the last 16 years, winning seven SoCon Championships. In the last 15+ years, the Terriers have won 81 of 121 SoCon games played. Over that time, Wofford is the winningest program in the Southern Conference with a .669 win percentage.

# JOSH CONKLIN

Head Coach • Second Season

Josh Conklin is entering his second season as head coach of the Wofford College football team. In his first season at the helm, the Terriers won the Southern Conference Championship and reached the second round of the NCAA FCS Playoffs.

Wofford announced on Tuesday, January 2, 2018, the hiring of Josh Conklin as head football coach. Conklin, who spent the previous three seasons as the defensive coordinator at the University of Pittsburgh, was an assistant coach at Wofford from 2007-09 working with the secondary. Conklin has additional experience at Florida International, Tennessee, The Citadel and South Dakota State University, serving as the defensive coordinator at Pitt, Florida International and The Citadel.

The 2018 season began with SoCon wins over The Citadel and VMI and the team was 6-2 heading into November. A win over Western Carolina on November 10 secured a 6-2 mark in league play, which was good for a share of the Southern Conference Championship.

In the first round of the playoffs, Wofford defeated Elon 19-7 at Gibbs Stadium. In the second round, the season came to an end with a 13-10 loss to #4 seed Kennesaw State. Conklin was one of only three first-year head coaches to lead his team to the playoffs and he was the only one to earn a victory.

The Terriers had eleven players earn All-Southern Conference honors following the season. In addition, Miles Brown, Justus Basinger and Andre Stoddard were recognized as All-Americans. Wofford ended the season ranked #12 by the FCS Coaches and #13 in the STATS FCS poll. The team was first in the Southern Conference in total defense, scoring defense, rushing defense, passing defense and rushing offense.

Conklin served as Pitt's defensive coordinator for three seasons. Under Conklin's watch, Pitt featured one of the most productive pass rushes in the country. The Panthers ranked sixth nationally in sacks in 2016, averaging 3.31 per contest. Pitt compiled 111 sacks during his three seasons.

In 2017, the Panthers ended the season with a 24-14 upset of undefeated and #2 ranked Miami. Pitt had four sacks in the game and held the Hurricanes to 45 rushing yards. Conklin's 2016 unit also boasted lofty national rankings in rush defense (16th, 119.6 yards per game) and defensive touchdowns (eighth, four TDs). The Panthers had a 43-42 win over eventual national champion Clemson in Death Valley to highlight an 8-5 season that culminated in the trip to the Pinstripe Bowl. In his first season as defensive coordinator, Pitt posted an 8-5 record and earned a berth in the Military Bowl.

Conklin joined Pitt after building an impressive resume as FIU's defensive coordinator for two years (2013-14). In his final season, he was nominated for the prestigious Broyles Award after overseeing a unit that ranked first nationally in fumble recoveries (19), second in defensive

touchdowns (six), fourth in turnovers gained (33), eighth in turnover margin (plus-11 overall; 0.92 margin per game) and 35th in total defense (363.8 yards per game).

Prior to FIU, Conklin was the safeties coach at the University of Tennessee (2012) and defensive coordinator and safeties coach at The Citadel (2010-11). While at The Citadel, Conklin coached cornerback Cortez Allen, a member of the Pittsburgh Steelers from 2011-15. The Bulldogs were especially stingy in scoring defense in 2011, holding their opponents under 20 points in seven of 11 contests (64%).

From 2007-09, Conklin coached the defensive backs at Wofford. He added special teams to his responsibilities in his final season working with the Terriers. In Conklin's initial two years, Wofford had 33 interceptions. The Terriers led the Southern Conference in 2007 with 20 interceptions and ranked second in 2008 with 13. Wofford advanced to the FCS Playoffs in each of those seasons. In 2007, the Terriers won the Southern Conference and led the league in scoring defense.

Conklin's coaching career was launched at South Dakota State, where he served as a graduate assistant in 2003 and 2004. He then was promoted to a full-time post with the Jackrabbits, coaching the secondary and special teams in 2005 and 2006.

Conklin is a 2003 graduate of Dakota State University. He was a starting linebacker and Academic All-American for the Trojans. A native of Gillette, Wyoming, Conklin was born June 19, 1979.

In addition to his bachelor's in physical education from DSU, Conklin also earned a master's in sport administration from South Dakota State. He and his wife, Molly, have two children - son Clark and daughter Millie. His brother-in-law, Al Clark III, was a four-year letterman at Wofford and graduated in 2002, while his father-in-law, Al Clark, Jr., was also a four-year football letterman at Wofford and graduated in 1976.

SPARTANBURG, S.C. – On Saturday afternoon, the Wofford College football team defeated Furman 24-7 at Gibbs Stadium. The Paladins scored first, but the rest of the game belonged to the Terriers as they scored 24 unanswered points.

Wofford, ranked #20 in the nation, is 7-3 overall and 6-1 in the Southern Conference. With the win, the Terriers clinched a share of the league title for the third straight season. Later in the day, Chattanooga defeated The Citadel 34-33, giving Wofford the automatic bid to the playoffs. Furman, ranked #7, falls to 6-4 on the season and 6-2 in league play.

The Terriers were led by Blake Morgan with a career-high 147 rushing yards and a touchdown. Joe Newman added two rushing touchdowns. The Paladins were led by Wayne Anderson with 68 rushing yards and a touchdown.

The Paladins had the ball first and had a first down. On third down, Wayne Anderson went 63-yards down the near sideline for a touchdown and a 7-0 lead at 3:06 in the first quarter. Wofford responded with a nine-play drive that covered 65-yards. After picking up a fourth-and-one at midfield by Joe Newman, Blake Morgan and D'maunae VanCleave had first downs. The Paladins had one first down before facing a fourth-and-four at the 36-yard line. The pass was completed, but a tackle by Jireh Wilson was made for no gain and the Terriers took over on downs. Wofford had one first down and then appeared to pick up another before a holding penalty brought up a punt. The Paladins went three-and-out and punted, followed by a three-and-out by Wofford. Furman took a knee to end the half.

Wofford opened the second half with the ball and picked up a first down. On fourth-and-one from midfield, Nathan Walker gained 16-yards for the first down. Blake Morgan then went 29-yards for the touchdown and Wofford had a 21-7 lead at the 10:03 mark of the third quarter. Furman had five first downs and then faced fourth-and-goal from the one. The run by Devin Wynn was stopped short and Wofford took over on downs at the two. Blake Morgan had a 21-yard run on the first play and Joe Newman added a first down run. After two more first downs, the drive stalled and Wofford punted.

Furman had a first down by penalty and then on third down Mason Alstatt broke up a pass, the ball hit his foot and bounced into the hands of Brandon Brown for the interception. Nathan Walker and Blake Morgan had first downs and a 20-yard field goal by Luke Carter pushed the lead to 24-7 with 4:05 left in the game. Furman had a first down and then ran for a first down on fourth-and-two. On fourth-and-goal from the one, the Wofford defense again stopped Furman and took over one downs. Joe Newman ran for two yards and ran out the clock on the win.
