STORY LINES

- Head Coach Terry Sims holds a record of 17-1 all-time when the Wildcats out-gain its opponent offensively.
- The Bethune-Cookman offensive line has produced four (4) games on the year in which it has not allowed a quarterback sack of signal callers Jabari Dunham, David Israel or Akevious Williams.
- In true road games during the Terry Sims era, Bethune-Cookman is just 9-11 overall, while five (5) of those games have been against Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) opponents.
- Injuries continue to plague the Wildcats as Que'shaun Byrd (RB) and Sam Marc (CB) have been ruled out for the remainder of the season.
- Bethune-Cookman makes its first-ever trip to Nebraska for a game, and faces its first-ever opponent from the Big Ten. On the year, the Huskers serve as the second FBS opponent for the Cats with BCU dropping a 49-28 decision to FAU on Sept. 15.
- Against opponents from the FBS, BCU holds an all-time record of 2-9 with both wins coming against FIU, respectfully.

- Defensive back Trevor Merritt has returned two interceptions for touchdowns this year.
- The BCU defense has blocked three kicks this season, including returning a blocked PAT for a safety two weeks ago at South Carolina State.
- The Wildcats rank eighth nationally in kickoff return yards, averaging 26.7 yards per return.
- With Keavon Mitchell recovering a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown last weekend, the Bethune-Cookman offense has now rushed for a score in all but one game this year (at Tennessee State in the season opener).

#LightningStrike

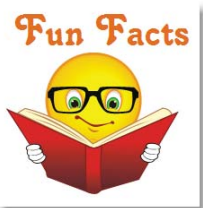
- Bethune-Cookman Head Coach Terry Sims and Offensive Coordinator Allen Suber have put in a place a speedy offense that has been in production for almost two years.
- Drives that consist of three minutes (3:00) or less are called “Lightning Strikes”, with the quick pace of the offense striking fast like lightning.
- Second year Offensive Coordinator Allen Suber projects this season’s offense to be even faster than last season.

Seniors –

- A total of just 19 seniors are listed to Bethune-Cookman’s roster in 2018, which is the second-fewest in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC), according to preseason rosters.
- In looking around the league, an average of 22 seniors sits on most rosters while Delaware State has the fewest on its current roster with just 18.

Celebration Bowl...

- The Celebration Bowl will once again be televised live on ABC and open the bowl season. The postseason college football bowl game will kick off at noon ET on Saturday, Dec. 15, at the state of the art Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.
- The Celebration Bowl, which showcases the heritage, legacy, pageantry and tradition of Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs), pits the conference champion from the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) against the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC). Last season, North Carolina A&T became the first team in the bowl’s three-year history to repeat as champion, defeating 2016 title holder Grambling State in an epic contest.
- The MEAC leads the bowl series, 2-1 overall.



FUN FACT I

- Bethune-Cookman has never played a team from the Big Ten in football, but the Cats have played several teams from the power five league in men’s basketball, baseball and softball.

#CaliCats –

Last Time Out for the Cats –

Hall of Fall Weekend 2018 was diminished with Bethune-Cookman’s 35-10 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) setback to North Carolina A&T in front of a Daytona Stadium crowd of 6,225 on Saturday afternoon.

Redshirt junior quarterback Akevious Williams left the game in the third quarter after he sustained an injury on the Aggies 1-yard line. He fumbled, but senior receiver Keavon Mitchell recovered the ball in the end zone for a touchdown to help the Wildcats close to within 26-10.

North Carolina A&T registered a safety late in the third quarter, then used an eight-play, 85-yard drive in the fourth quarter to seal the victory.

Lamar Raynard threw for 189 yards and two touchdowns, while Jah-Maine Martin rushed for 107 yards and a score as the Aggies (6-2 overall, 3-1 MEAC) scored on their first three possessions and four of their first five.

The Aggies set the tone early-on when Terrence Patterson blocked a Wildcats (4-4, 2-2 MEAC) punt to start their first possession at the BCU 14. The visitors from Greensboro, North Carolina would score six plays later.

Bethune-Cookman closed to within 13-3 following a Uriel Hernandez 40-yard field goal with 1:33 remaining in the first quarter, but would go into halftime trailing, 26-3.

Williams was 14 of 21 for 108 yards passing before exiting. Steffon Francois caught five passes for 47 yards, and Malique Jackson hauled in four receptions for 31 yards.

Jimmie Robinson led the Wildcats rushing attack with 50 yards on five carries.

Defensively, Marques Ford and Gerome Howard registered sacks. Tydarius Peters had 12 tackles.

A Win Over Nebraska Would –

- Give Head Coach Terry Sims his 25th win overall...
- Be the 498th win all-time in school history...
- Allow Terry Sims his first-ever win against an FBS opponent...
- Give BCU its first-ever win against an opponent from the Big Ten...

Series Notes –

- The game will be the first for Bethune-Cookman against the Nebraska Cornhuskers...
- This will also be Bethune-Cookman’s first-ever game against a member of the Big Ten Conference...

Out For The Season –

- Sophomore running back Que’shaun Byrd and sophomore cornerback Sam Marc have each been ruled out the rest of the season with lower extremity injuries.
- Byrd sustained his injury in the second quarter of the game against Howard in Indianapolis, while Marc’s injury came in the second quarter at South Carolina State in Orangeburg.

We’re Not Buying That –

- For the first time in more than a 20 seasons, Bethune-Cookman will NOT have a traditional bye week, with BCU instead accepting the game against the Nebraska Cornhuskers of the Big Ten on October 27 in Lincoln.
- During Terry Sims’ first season at the helm in Daytona Beach, BCU went the first 10 games of the year consecutively with a contest, before having a bye week prior to the Florida Blue Florida Classic against Florida A&M in the season finale.

#OctoberFest –

- The month of October has been a scary month for the opposition throughout the last 18 years of BCU Football.
- Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman owns a record of 49-19 in the Halloween month, including perfect marks in 2002 (3-0), 2010 (5-0), 2012 (3-0) and 2013 (4-0).
- Only seven of the 18 losses have occurred away from Daytona Beach.

A Road To Remember –

- For the eighth consecutive season, Bethune-Cookman opened the year on the road, so to speak. Two times (2011, '12), the Cats opened up in the *MEAC/SWAC Challenge* presented by Walt Disney World in nearby Orlando.
- This is the third time during the span that BCU stepped out of the state of Florida for a season opener. BCU played at Tennessee State (2013) and North Texas (2016) in the stretch.
- Technically, BCU opened up the 2016 campaign in Denton, Texas while the “original” season opener was canceled due to weather as part of the *MEAC/SWAC Challenge* that was held at Municipal Stadium and presented by ESPN.

#OneDestruction –

- The hashtag and theme for Bethune-Cookman Athletics across the 2018-19 athletic term is #OneDestruction.
- A destruction, in essence, is a group of wild cats together. With Bethune-Cookman being the Wildcats, it seemed only natural that BCU become ONE DESTRUCTION to prey on the opposition.

ESPN+ And The Wildcats –

- It was announced two weeks ago that Bethune-Cookman and the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) has partnered together to produce four (4) home games at Daytona Stadium for the Wildcats.
 - Bethune-Cookman is one of several schools around the league that are introducing ESPN+ as a platform to watch their contests.

returning starter along the offensive line for Head Coach Terry Sims and the second place team from a season ago, Brown was selected to the First Team on offense.

- Joining Brown on the All-MEAC Preseason First Team for the special teams unit was senior **K Uriel Hernandez**. A season ago, Hernandez led the Wildcats in scoring with 60 points, connecting on 12-of-18 field goals, in addition to 24-of-26 point-after attempts.
- Redshirt senior **DE Todney Evans** was named to the preseason second team on defense.
- On the third team for offense was **RB Tupac Isme**, while redshirt senior **DL Kevin Thompson** landed on the third team defensive unit.

Instant Replay –

- The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) has expanded its pilot program aiming at enhancing the game for all of its member institutions with instant replay at all conference football games in 2018. There are a number of schools beginning the program with their first home game, while the complete instant replay monitoring system will go into effect midway at the beginning of the 2019 season.
- The MEAC already has instant replay and monitors for all women's and men's basketball games throughout the league, with that rule going into effect fulltime in 2016-17.

Transitioning From The Hardwood –

- Redshirt junior Ulmer Manzie will be transitioning from the hardwood under Men's Basketball Head Coach Ryan Ridder, taking the "Jimmy Graham" approach and playing tight end for Head Coach Terry Sims and the football team.
- Manzie has not played football since high school where he attended Columbus Africentric High in his hometown of Columbus, Ohio.
- Manzie will be the first two-sport athlete for the Wildcats aside from track & field since redshirt junior quarterback Akevious Williams played baseball for the Maroon and Gold in 2015.

Six Quarters Equals A Back –

- It's been a staple of the Bethune-Cookman Football program to use a multiple quarterback system since the conclusion of the 2010 campaign. That will be no different in 2018 under Head Coach Terry Sims and Offensive Coordinator and Quarterbacks Coach Allen Suber.
- The Wildcats not only return Akevious Williams (R-Jr.) and Jabari Dunham under center (R-Sr.), but they welcome West Virginia transfer David Israel (R-Soph.), Terry Gilliam (Fr.), Kyle Smith (Fr.) and Devin Black (Fr.).

Playoffs? –

- Despite the introduction of the Celebration Bowl in February 2015, a member of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) still has the possibility of participating in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Playoffs. A member would have to accept an at-large bid to the playoffs, which last happened with North Carolina A&T accepting the at-large bid in 2016.

#IBackTheMEAC –

- The Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference begins its 49th year of intercollegiate competition heading into the 2018-19 academic year. Located in Norfolk, Virginia, the MEAC is made up of 12 outstanding historically black institutions across the Atlantic coastline.
- On June 8, 1980, the MEAC was classified as a Division I conference by the NCAA. Prior to that year, the conference operated as a Division II conference. The month after it achieved Division I status, the MEAC received an automatic qualification to the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship.

Next Up —

- Bethune-Cookman will step back into the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) waters when the Maroon and Gold travel to Baltimore, Maryland to face the Morgan State Bears on Saturday, Nov. 3.
- Bethune-Cookman owns a six-game winning streak against the Bears dating back to 2010.

Sims City —

- With nine (9) wins during his inaugural season at the helm of the Bethune-Cookman football program, head coach Terry Sims matched former head coach Wesley Moore with the second-most wins in a first season as head coach of the Maroon and Gold.
- Only head coaches Rudolph “Bunky” Matthews (1947) and Brian Jenkins (2010) had more wins, with each collecting 10 during their debut campaign. However, both of those seasons contained 12-game slates, as opposed to just 11 for Sims and Moore, respectfully.

30 Sacks, 30 Turnovers —

- The goal at the start of the season is for the Wildcats defense to make 30 sacks and force 30 turnovers. That would be a significant production hike from the two previous years of the current coaching regime that resulted in 26/14 in 2017, 13/17 in 2016 and 18/19 in 2015.
- North Carolina A&T came the closest to achieving 30 turnovers attained as a team in 2017, as the Aggies forced 29 altogether en route to an MEAC championship.
- North Carolina A&T led the MEAC with 38 sacks, while North Carolina Central picked up 31, respectfully.

Last Year —

- The 2017 Bethune-Cookman Football campaign saw a multitude of highs for the Wildcats. The Maroon and Gold opened its season with the first four (4) games on the road, including being displaced for four days in Louisiana as Hurricane Irma hit the Volusia County area with BCU on the road to Southeast Louisiana.
- Despite dropping a tough decision at No. 11 North Carolina A&T, the Maroon and Gold was the ONLY team to lead the undefeated Aggies in the fourth quarter.
- Bethune-Cookman capped its 2017 campaign with an unprecedented seventh consecutive win over MEAC and in-state rival Florida A&M in a come-from-behind thriller as part of the *Florida Blue Florida Classic* at Camping World Stadium in Orlando.

What's In A Number? —

- A handful of Bethune-Cookman players changed numbers prior to the season. They include:

Non-Conference Success —

- Since 2000, Bethune-Cookman is 38-15 in regular season, out-of-conference contests, earning notable victories against the likes of Alabama State, FIU (2x), Southeastern Louisiana and Tennessee State, respectfully.
- Of the 15 losses in non-conference play, nine (9) have come against teams from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), including Florida Atlantic (2x), Florida State, Miami (4x), North Texas and UCF.

NOTES FROM THE OPPONENT: NEBRASKA

Nebraska Set to Face FCS Opponent

• Nebraska last faced a Football Championship Subdivision opponent in 2014, when Nebraska defeated McNeese State 31-24 at Memorial Stadium. The Huskers are 11-0 all-time against FCS foes (at game time), with each of the games being played between 1992 and 2014.

Husker Passing Game Stressing Opposing Defenses

• Nebraska has featured a high-powered passing attack over the past four games. The Huskers threw for 323 yards against Purdue, had a season-high 407 passing yards at Wisconsin before also topping 250 yards at Northwestern and against Minnesota. Nebraska's consecutive 300-yard passing games were its first since doing so against Minnesota and Penn State in 2017.

Rushing Battle Often Holds the Key to Success

• The ability to win the running game battle has long been key to victory for the Huskers. Nebraska has four losses in 2018—Colorado, Troy, Purdue and Northwestern—while controlling the run game, a statistical anomaly. Before the Colorado loss, Nebraska had won 15 consecutive games when holding an advantage in rushing yards.

• Nebraska has gained at least 475 yards in each of the past four games, including a season-high 659 yards against Minnesota. This marks the first time Nebraska has topped 475 total yards in four straight games since the final three games of the 2007 season and the 2008 opener...

• Nebraska freshman quarterback Adrian Martinez has accounted for 400 yards of total offense three times this season, including 401 yards against Minnesota. His three 400-yard total offense games ties Nebraska's career school record, also held by Joe Ganz...

• Nebraska will take on an FCS opponent this week for the first time since 2014. The Huskers are 11-0 all-time against opponents from the FCS ranks, and this is their first-ever game against a MEAC opponent...

• After setting a school record with 986 receiving yards in 2017, Stanley Morgan Jr. is challenging to become Nebraska's all-time leading receiver this fall; Morgan has 156 career receptions, which ranks fourth on NU's all-time list. He needs 25 receptions to tie Kenny Bell (181) atop the Husker chart. Morgan has 2,299 career receiving yards to rank fifth on Nebraska's all-time list. Morgan needs 390 yards to tie Bell (2,689) for the most receiving yards in program history...

• In 2017, Stanley Morgan Jr. and JD Spielman combined for 1,816 receiving yards, the highest two-player total in Husker history; Morgan set an NU record with 986 receiving yards in 2017. Spielman added 830 receiving yards, a total that ranked seventh in school history and was the most ever by a Husker freshman...

• Nebraska true freshman quarterback Adrian Martinez is averaging 240.5 passing yards and 69.2 rushing yards. His 309.7 yards of total offense ranks 12th nationally. He is second nationally among freshman quarterbacks in total offense; If Martinez were to finish the 2018 season averaging better than 200 passing yards and more than 50 rushing yards he would join elite college football company...

TERRY SIMS

**Head Coach, Fourth Season
Knoxville, 1994**

In just three seasons as the head ball coach of Bethune-Cookman University, Terry Sims has experienced very few things that his predecessors endured before him. Now entering his ninth year overall at the Daytona Beach based institution, it will be his fourth year at the helm of the Wildcats program.

In 2017, the Wildcats completed a “resurge” by winning their last four and six of their final seven games. BCU finished 6-2 in the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, and was just a combined six points away in two road setbacks from an undefeated conference record. The ‘Cats defeated rival Florida A&M for the seventh consecutive season, remained undefeated at North Carolina Central with a SportsCenter Top 10 win, and became the first MEAC program to win on the road against a Southland Conference opponent with a Sept. 11 victory at Southeastern Louisiana. The Wildcats put together a perfect 4-0 mark at home with victories over Savannah State, South Carolina State, Hampton, and Morgan State.

BCU saw eight different Wildcats earn postseason All-MEAC honors including three First Team spots with safety Diquan Richardson, offensive lineman Dwayne Brown, and placekicker Uriel Hernandez.

Following the season, wide receiver Jawill Davis signed as an undrafted free agent with the New York Giants, while quarterback Larry Brihm and offensive lineman Phillip Norman signed with Calgary and British Columbia, respectively, of the Canadian Football League.

The Wildcats also performed well in the classroom as tight end Demetrius Weaver was one of two MEAC student-athletes to receive the 2018 Nike Post-Graduate Scholarship

His sophomore season of 2016 saw the Jesup, Georgia native face difficulties that not even he could imagine. Injuries plagued the Wildcats, while weather forced three games to either be delayed significantly, cancelled or moved to another date altogether. Sims saw a total of 16 starters out of the rotation – all through the first five games of the campaign

Despite all of those setbacks, the Wildcats of Bethune-Cookman were able to bounce back to win four consecutive games down the stretch, including the Florida Blue Florida Classic contest in Orlando at newly-renovated Camping World Stadium. The win over rival Florida A&M was the sixth of its kind consecutively. BCU concluded the season with a 4-6 overall mark, but collected three of those wins away from Municipal Stadium for a 2-3 overall mark on the year – with one loss coming at FBS (Football Bowl Subdivision) opponent North Texas.

Following the campaign, junior safety Diquan Richardson would be named to the All-MEAC First Team on the defensive side of the ball under the guise of Sims, while Kevin Thompson would be selected to the third team on defense. Frank Brown would be named to the second team on offense. And it was running back Jamaruz Thompkins on the third team for offense, rounding out four total Maroon and Gold student-athletes named to the postseason all-conference team.

In the winter of 2017, Sims and his staff signed one of the best classes in school history, including a number of star-ranked performers by various recruiting outlets nationally.

During his rookie season as a head coach in 2015, Sims continued the positive success enjoyed by Bethune-Cookman with the school’s fourth consecutive Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) title. He led the Wildcats to a 9-2 record in his first season and a 7-1 mark, including a share of the MEAC title.

While 2015 marked his first year as head coach of the Wildcats, it was his sixth season overall with the program.

Under his guise in 2015, Sims was named MEAC Coach of the Year after matching South Carolina State (1980-83) for the second-longest streak in MEAC history with the run of four MEAC crowns on the spin.

The Wildcats were victorious over in-state rival Florida A&M, 35-14 in Sims’ debut at the helm in the annual Florida Blue Florida Classic, securing their stake in the conference title. BCU led the MEAC in several statistical categories, including scoring offense (31.4 avg/g), total offense (445.0 avg/g), rushing offense (191.8 yds/g), pass offense (253.2 avg/g), and pass efficiency (164.1 efficiency). The Wildcats also held top 10 positions statistically in the FCS (Football Championship Subdivision) in passing yards per completion (6th) and team passing efficiency (3rd). BCU entered the STATS FCS Top 25 poll in the final ranking of the season (25th), slowly climbing the FCS Coaches Poll to reach 21st nationally following the last game of the regular season against FAMU.

Sims had a total of 10 student-athletes named to the All-MEAC first-, second- and third team, respectfully. The list included quarterback Quentin Williams, receiver Jawill Davis, offensive lineman Dariusz Bladek, linebacker Robert Way and defensive back Marquis Drayton – all named first team selections.

In his five years prior to accepting the head coaching position with BCU, Sims served as assistant head coach. He oversaw a variety of the day-to-day duties of the BCU program, as well as working extensively with the safeties, and serving as special teams coordinator. He helped to coach a number of Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) all-league performers, in addition to 2013 All-America safety Nick Addison.

In 2014, BCU once again captured no less than a share of the school’s seventh MEAC crown all-time, as well as the fourth title in the last five seasons. The defensive unit finished atop the FCS for total defense and rush defense. The Cats allowed just 237.5 yards per game to their opposition, while also allowing just 79.9 yards per game on the ground. The team would go on to finish second in the FCS for first downs defense, and seventh nationally in passing yards allowed (157.6 p/g).

During the 2013 campaign, safety Nick Addison would finish second in the league for interceptions, while going on to receive First Team Associated Press All-America honors following the year. He also collected First Team All-MEAC accolades.

Before arriving in Daytona Beach, Sims spent four seasons serving as recruiting coordinator, special teams coordinator and defensive backs coach at Howard University. Prior to that, Sims coached cornerbacks at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette for two seasons, working to improve passing coverage, and aiding the Ragin’ Cajuns in attaining top-25 national pass defense rankings.

Sims previously served in the secondary at Prairie View A&M. While working with the Panthers, Sims coached the defensive backs, in addition to kick returners. He was also in charge of breaking down film and preparing opponent scouting reports. Additionally, he was active in the planning of recruiting weekends, organizing on-and-off campus recruiting, while serving the role of academic and compliance liaison.

Prior to joining the PVAMU staff in 2004, Sims was the defensive backs coach at Texas Southern University in Houston.

During his four-year term with the Tigers, Sims coached some of the top defensive backs in the Southwestern Athletic Conference, including Santino Hall, who finished the 2001 season leading the conference in pass breakups with 20, and Oliver Celestine, who led TSU in interceptions and broke the school record for yards on an interception return. Both players went on to play professionally (Celestine: NY Jets, Hall: Saskatchewan Roughriders).

Before coaching at TSU, Sims worked with the running backs at Austin Peay for three seasons. He produced the 1997 Offensive MVP, Chris Black, and DeAunta McAfee, who tied the school touchdown record.

Sims began his coaching career as a student assistant in 1994, working with the linebackers at his alma mater, Knoxville College. His next stop was at the University of Louisville, where he assisted the defensive backs as a graduate assistant in 1995 and had the opportunity to work with Sam Madison, who set the school record for interceptions (16) and passes defended (44), going on to be a four-time Pro Bowl selection with the Miami Dolphins and tie the NFL interception record (21).

Sims is a 1994 graduate of Knoxville College, where he was a team captain as a defensive back on the gridiron, while also patrolling center field in baseball. He would go on to earn his Master’s Degree from Louisville in 1997. Sims is married to Joyce. The couple has two children: daughter Sierra (a freshman softball student-athlete at Bowie State University), and son Xavier.
