Weekly Awards

The BIG EAST names a Player and Freshman of the Week, as well as five Honor Roll selections, each Monday during the regular season. Winners are chosen from nominations provided by the BIG EAST sports information directors. The information will be released from the BIG EAST office and will be listed in the conference release and on the league web site.

Annual Awards

The All-BIG EAST First, Second, Honorable Mention and Freshman Teams, Player of the Year, Freshman of the Year, Defensive Player of the Year and Coach of the Year are chosen from a vote of the league's 16 head coaches at the conclusion of the regular season. A Most Improved Player, a Sixth-Man Award, a Women's Basketball Scholar-Athlete and a Sportsmanship Award winner are also selected. Coaches are not allowed to vote for themselves or their own players. The awards will be announced prior to the BIG EAST Championship start on March 2 through an email release from the Conference office.



CINCINNATI BEARCATS

12-18 OVERALL (9-6 HOME; 2-10 AWAY; 1-2 NEUTRAL)
4-12 BIG EAST (3-5 HOME; 1-7 AWAY)

Last game: Cincinnati finished the 2012-13 season with a 60-55 loss to Seton Hall in the first round of the BIG EAST Championship on March 8.

Notes

- The Bearcats were the No. 13 seed for the first time in the BIG EAST Championship.
- Cincinnati has lost its first round contest in each of the last three years, with its last win in the tournament coming in 2010 against USF.
- The Bearcats were led by redshirt-junior Dayeesha Hollins, the only player to average double-figures in scoring (15.4 ppg).

CONNECTICUT HUSKIES

35-4 OVERALL (17-3 HOME; 11-1 AWAY; 7-0 NEUTRAL)
14-2 BIG EAST (7-1 HOME; 7-1 AWAY)

Last game: The Huskies defeated No. 5 seed Louisville 93-60 in the NCAA Championship final to win the title for the eighth time in school history on April 9 on ESPN.

Notes

- UConn defeated Notre Dame 83-65 on April 7 in the NCAA Championship semifinal. Connecticut defeated No. 2 seed Kentucky 83-53 in the Bridgeport Regional Final on April 1. UConn defeated No. 4 seed Maryland 76-50 on March 30 in Bridgeport, Conn., in the NCAA Championship Sweet 16. Connecticut defeated No. 8 seed Vanderbilt 77-44 on March 25 in Storrs, Conn. The Huskies advanced to the regional semifinals for the 20th consecutive season.
- Connecticut is made a record sixth-straight trip to the Final Four. The Huskies are 8-0 in the NCAA title game.
- The Huskies won their opening round game vs. No. 16 seed and Western Athletic Conference champion Idaho 105-37 in Storrs, Conn., advancing to the second round for the 20th straight time in their 25th consecutive tournament appearance.
- The Huskies, who have claimed six of the last 12 NCAA titles, made their 25th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance and are 91-17 all-time in NCAA play.
- Connecticut, a top seed for the seventh straight season, has won 30 games for an NCAA-record eighth straight time.

DEPAUL BLUE DEMONS

21-12 OVERALL (15-2 HOME; 3-8 AWAY; 3-2 NEUTRAL)
9-7 BIG EAST (7-1 HOME; 2-6 AWAY)

Last game: No. 10 seed DePaul lost to No. 7 Oklahoma State 73-56 on March 24 at Cameron Indoor Stadium in Durham, N.C.

Notes

- DePaul made its 18th NCAA Championship, and 11th straight, with its first appearance coming in 1990.
- DePaul is 10-18 in NCAA games and reached the Sweet 16 in 2011 and in 2006.
- The Blue Demons reached the second round eight times, including the last two seasons, before falling in the first round in 2013
- DePaul reached the 20-win plateau for the 21st time in the program's 38-year history.
- Senior Anna Martin had 12 points and finished her career with 1,756 career points, which ranks sixth all-time at DePaul.
- Senior Katherine Harry had 17 rebounds. She tallied 1,158 rebounds to finish third all-time at DePaul.

GEORGETOWN HOYAS

15-16 OVERALL (8-6 HOME; 5-9 AWAY; 2-1 NEUTRAL)
5-11 BIG EAST (3-5 HOME; 2-6 AWAY)

Last game: Georgetown defeated Providence in the first round of the BIG EAST Championship 81-61 on March 8. The Hoyas lost to Villanova 89-58 in the second round on March 9.

Notes

- Senior guard Sugar Rodgers surpassed 2,500 career points and broke the BIG EAST Championship scoring record with 42 points in the game against the Wildcats.
- Rodgers finishes her career at GU as both the career and season leader in points with 2,518 total points as well as scoring 711 points in 2012-13 to rank first. She ranks second (653), fifth (580) and sixth (574) as well. Additionally, Rodgers is the career leader in 3-pointers with 346 and holds the top four spots in single-season 3-pointers.
- Rodgers is the first player to lead the BIG EAST in scoring in back-to-back years since Angel McCoughtry accomplished the feat three times from 2007-2009.
- Georgetown is 13-28 all-time in the BIG EAST Championship.

LOUISVILLE CARDINALS

29-9 OVERALL (16-2 HOME; 6-5 AWAY; 7-2 NEUTRAL)
11-5 BIG EAST (7-1 HOME; 4-4 AWAY)

Last game: The Cardinals lost 93-60 to No. 1 seed Connecticut in the NCAA Championship final on April 9 on ESPN.

Notes

- No. 5 seed Louisville advanced to the NCAA Championship final after defeating Cal 64-57 in the semifinal on April 7. The Cards were looking for their first NCAA title in women's basketball.
- The Cardinals won 29 games, the second-most in school history. (Louisville won 35 games in 2008-09.)
- Louisville reached the Final Four for the second time in five years (2009). Louisville beat No. 2 seed Tennessee 86-78 to win the Oklahoma City Regional. Two nights after taking down defending national champion and No. 1 seed Baylor, the Cardinals built a 20-point lead and then withstood a second-half comeback by the Lady Vols.
- The No. 5 seeded Cardinals defeated No. 12 seed Middle Tennessee State 74-49 at the KFC Yum! Center in the first round and No. 4 seed Purdue, 76-63 on in the second round.
- Louisville made its 16th NCAA Tournament appearance and seventh in the last eight years. The Cardinals have reached the NCAA Sweet 16 in four of the past six seasons.
- Louisville joined the school's men's team in the Final Four, marking the 10th time that a program had both teams make it that far. Both teams were in the final. Only one school has won both titles in the same year (Connecticut, 2004).

MARQUETTE GOLDEN EAGLES

16-16 OVERALL (7-9 HOME; 7-6 AWAY; 2-1 NEUTRAL)
7-9 BIG EAST (2-6 HOME; 5-3 AWAY)

Last game: Marquette earned an at-large bid to the WNIT, hosting Northern Iowa. The Golden Eagles lost 61-59 on March 22 to end their season.

Notes

- The Golden Eagles' at-large selection to the WNIT marked the 17th postseason appearance in program history. It was the 14th postseason appearance since head coach Terri Mitchell began her tenure at Marquette in 1996 and the first for MU since the 2010-11 season.
- The selection into the WNIT field was the program's eighth all-time. The Golden Eagles are 13-8 all-time in WNIT/NWIT play.
- MU overcame a 12-point second-half deficit, but it wasn't enough for the first-round win.
- Marquette was led by senior Sarina Simmons and sophomore Arlesia Morse, who each tallied 16 points in the contest.
- Junior Katherine Plouffe chipped in 10 points and nine rebounds, while sophomore Apiew Ojulu came off the bench to add 10 points and five boards.

NOTRE DAME FIGHTING IRISH

35-2 OVERALL (14-1 HOME; 12-0 AWAY; 9-1 NEUTRAL)
16-0 BIG EAST (8-0 HOME; 8-0 AWAY)

Last game: The Fighting Irish lost to No. 1 seed Connecticut 83-65 in the NCAA Championship semifinal on April 7. Notre Dame had won the first three meetings this season.

Notes

- It was Notre Dame's fifth Final Four appearance (2013, 2012, 2011, 2001, 1997).

- ND posted a 93-63 win against Kansas and an 87-76 win against No. 2 seed Duke to win the Norfolk Region.

- The Fighting Irish earned a No. 1 seed for the second consecutive year and third time in program history. Notre Dame made an NCAA Championship appearance for the 18th consecutive season, and the 20th time in school history.

- Notre Dame defeated No. 16 seed Tennessee-Martin (the Ohio Valley Conference tournament champion) 97-64 in first-round action. Notre Dame has won its NCAA first-round game in 16 of the past 18 seasons. Notre Dame defeated No. 9 seed Iowa 74-57 in the second round as junior Kayla McBride registered a career-high 28 points.

- Notre Dame registered 16 wins against teams that qualified for this year's NCAA Championship. ND finished the 2012-13 season undefeated on the road at 12-0, a first in program history.

- Notre Dame is 41-19 all-time in NCAA Championship appearances.

PITTSBURGH PANTHERS

9-21 OVERALL (7-10 HOME; 2-10 AWAY; 0-1 NEUTRAL)
0-16 BIG EAST (0-8 HOME; 0-8 AWAY)

Last game: Pittsburgh, the No. 16 seed in the BIG EAST Championship, lost its first-round game to No. 10 seed Marquette 66-43 on March 8.

Notes

- Pitt is 15-28 all-time in the BIG EAST Championship and posted its most recent win in 2011. The Panthers topped USF 63-60 on March 4, 2011 at the XL Center.

- Sophomore Brianna Kiesel was named All-BIG EAST Honorable Mention.

PROVIDENCE FRIARS

7-23 OVERALL (4-10 HOME; 1-11 AWAY; 2-2 NEUTRAL)
2-14 BIG EAST (1-7 HOME; 1-7 AWAY)

Last game: Providence was the No. 14 seed in the BIG EAST Championship. The Friars lost their opening-round game to No. 11 seed Georgetown 81-61 on March 8.

Notes

- PC is 19-25 all-time in the BIG EAST Championship and has not been able to record a win in the tournament since 2001.

- Sophomore guard Tori Rule led the way against Georgetown for the Friars with a career high 35 points. Rule set a BIG EAST Championship record after sinking 10 3-pointers.

- Rule finished the game 11-of-24 from the field, including 10-of-20 (50 percent) from 3-point range. Her record of 10 3-pointers breaks the previous record of eight held by Sheila McMillen of Notre Dame (vs. St. John's on 2/28/98) and Jazmine Sepulveda of USF (vs. Cincinnati on 3/7/09).

- Rule was two 3-pointers shy of tying the NCAA record for 3-pointers in a game (12), set by Brittany Rayburn (Purdue) on January 12, 2012 vs. Minnesota. Cornelia Gayden (LSU) also hit 12 3-point buckets in 1995.

RUTGERS SCARLET KNIGHTS

16-14 OVERALL (13-2 HOME; 2-11 AWAY; 1-1 NEUTRAL)
7-9 BIG EAST (6-2 HOME; 1-7 AWAY)

- Rutgers dropped to 23-17 all-time in the BIG EAST Tournament. The Scarlet Knights' loss to USF was their first loss in second round action.

Last game: No. 10 seed St. John's lost in double-overtime 96-90 to No. 7 seed Dayton, the Atlantic 10 regular-season champion, on March 24 at Carnesecca Arena.

Notes

- St. John's rallied back from a 13-point deficit with 5:20 left in the second half to tie the game at 75 at the end of regulation. But after 10 more minutes of play, No. 18/15 Dayton came away with victory to advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

- Senior guard Nadirah Mckenith, who led St. John's with a near-triple double with 22 points, 10 assists and nine rebounds before fouling out, hit a layup with one-tenth of a second left in regulation to force OT.

- St. John's earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament for the fourth-straight season.

- It was first-year head coach Joe Tartamella's first bid to the NCAA Tournament, but his fifth trip with the program, as he was associate head coach for the last three years and assistant coach in 2006.

- The 2012-13 season marked St. John's eighth appearance in the NCAA Tournament with its first in 1983. Overall St. John's has a record of 6-8 in the tournament and has made it to the second round four times (1988, 2006, 2010, 2011 and 2012).

- The Pirates defeated Cincinnati 60-55 in first round action on Friday evening to advance to the second round of the BIG EAST Tournament for the first time since 2009.

- With five wins in the BIG EAST, SHU won the most conference games since it was 9-7 in the BIG EAST during the 2006-07 season.

- The 11 overall victories are the most for the Pirates since 2008-09.

- Senior Brittany Morris wrapped up her career as the program's all-time leading 3-point shooter with 178 triples and the single-season record holder with 74 threes this year. Earning Second-Team All-BIG EAST accolades for the first time in her career, Morris scored 426 points this season to tally 997 over the last four years. With 13 points against St. John's moved past Ashley Bush (2001-05) for 20th place on the Seton Hall all-time scoring list.

- Redshirt sophomore Ka-Deidre Simmons ended the season with 122 assists, the ninth most in a single season in school history and 63 steals, the 10th-highest single season total at SHU.

Notes

- No. 10 seed USF upset No. 7 seed Texas Tech 71-70 in front its home crowd in Lubbock, Texas in the Spokane Regional on March 23.

- It was the second NCAA appearance for the Bulls in school history and their first since 2006. USF's win against Texas Tech was the Bulls' first NCAA tournament win in program history.

- Against, Cal senior Andrea Smith finished with a team-high 24 points, junior Inga Orekhova scored 22 points and senior Andrell Smith added 12 points in USF's first trip to the NCAA tournament's second round.

- USF erased a 14-point deficit late in the second half. Orekhova capped the comeback by making three free throw attempts with 0.7 seconds remaining in regulation to tie the game and send it into extra time.

- Cal averaged 12 more rebounds than its opponents prior to Monday night. USF tied the Golden Bears at 47 on the boards.

- Syracuse's four seniors close out their careers as the winningest class in program history with 96 wins and were the first to have three 1,000-point scorers.

- SU received its first NCAA Tournament berth since 2008 and fifth all-time. It was SU's second NCAA appearance under Hillsman.

- Under seventh-year head coach Quentin Hillsman, Syracuse finishes 24-8 overall, its best record its fourth-highest win total in program history. Its 11-5 record in BIG EAST play and No. 3 seed in the BIG EAST Tournament were both 25-year highs.

- Senior Kayla Alexander led SU with 23 points and eight rebounds. Freshman Brittney Sykes led the Orange on the boards, grabbing a career-high 12 rebounds while scoring five points.

- The Orange concludes the 2012-13 season with a 24-8 record, the program's best winning percentage (.750) in the NCAA era and second-best overall (26-8, .765 in 1980-81).

- Villanova's seven turnovers marked the 13th game this year with single-digit miscues. The Wildcats committed a total of 26 turnovers in the last four games of the season.

- This season marked Villanova's first 20-win season since 2005-06 (21-11). Under head coach Harry Perretta, Villanova has posted 15 20-win seasons.

- The 2013 appearance was Villanova's 11th in the last 14 years. The stretch includes five berths in the NCAA Tournament and six appearances in the WNIT.

- Despite playing with foul trouble throughout the game, senior forward Laura Sweeney led Villanova with 16 points in 16 minutes. Sweeney was 7-of-10 from the field.

- Junior Devon Kane came off the bench to score 12 points on 6-of-10 shooting.

All BIG EAST Final

Louisville played Connecticut in the NCAA Championship title game on April 9. The BIG EAST won its ninth women's basketball national championship, with UConn defeating the Cardinals 93-60 on Tuesday night. The nine national titles for the league surpassed the SEC, which has eight, for the most all time.

Elite 89

Louisville sophomore Jude Schimmel won the Elite 89 Award for the 2013 NCAA Women's Basketball Championship. The Elite 89 Award is presented to the student-athlete with the highest cumulative grade-point average participating at the finals site for each of the NCAA's championships. Schimmel has a 3.737 GPA in sociology.

Cutting the Deficit

Louisville overcame a 10-point halftime deficit in its semifinal game against California. It was the 10th-largest deficit overcome in a women's Final Four game.

Taking the High Road as a Low Seed

Louisville was the lowest seed to reach the championship game. Louisville was the seventh team since the NCAA expanded to 64 teams in 1994 to reach the national championship game as a seed other than No. 1 or No. 2. The lowest seed to reach the championship game since then is a No. 4 (Louisiana Tech in 1994 and Rutgers in 2007).

Nancy Lieberman Award Winner

Notre Dame senior Skylar Diggins was selected for the second consecutive season as the recipient of the Nancy Lieberman Award, which is presented annually to the nation's top NCAA Division I point guard by the Rotary Club of Detroit.

Making History

Connecticut, Louisville and Notre Dame reached the Final Four, marking the first time in BIG EAST history to have three women's teams reach the national semifinals. In 1985, there were three BIG EAST men's teams that reached the Final Four (Georgetown, St. John's and Villanova). The BIG EAST is the only league to have accomplished this feat twice. On the women's side, the ACC has previously had three teams reach the Final Four (Duke, Maryland and North Carolina in 2006).

BIG EAST in the Final Four

The BIG EAST has had a team in the Final Four 16 times and has had at least one team in each of the last seven years. The league has had four schools (Connecticut, Louisville, Notre Dame, Rutgers) make 22 appearances in 21 years.

Men and Women Join Forces

Louisville joined the school's men's team in the Final Four, marking the 10th time (eight different schools) that a program had both teams make it that far. Both teams also reached the title game. Only Connecticut has won both titles in the same season, in 2004 - the last time the women's champion was crowned in New Orleans.

Lucky Number Five

The Cardinals became only the second No. 5 seed to reach the national semifinals, joining Southwest Missouri State's 2001 team that featured guard Jackie Stiles, the all-time leading scorer in NCAA history. Only seven teams outside of the top four seeds have ever made it to the Final Four since the NCAA tournament started in 1982. No team seeded higher than fourth has ever won a game at the Final Four.

BIG EAST Presence in the Title Game

The BIG EAST will have a team playing for the NCAA title on April 9 for the fourth time in the last five years. The league is 10-5 all-time in the title game, including both 2009 and 2013, when Louisville lost to Connecticut.

A Winning Percentage in 2013

BIG EAST women's basketball teams have recorded a 16-7 record in the NCAA Championship this season for a .696 winning percentage, which is highest among all conferences. With two teams facing each other in one of the semifinals, the league will pick up at least 14 wins in the tournament.

Series History

The rivalry between Notre Dame and Connecticut has been well documented, as the two teams have met four times in each of the last two years. In each of the last three years, the Irish and Huskies have battled twice in the regular season, met in the BIG EAST Championship title game and the NCAA national semifinal game. In those 12 meetings over the last three years, Notre Dame holds a 7-5 record.

The Fighting Irish were 3-0 against UConn this season, winning by an average of four points, prior to the semifinal loss. The first meeting this season was in Storrs, Conn., which ND won 73-72. The second meeting, in South Bend, Ind., was the regular season finale for both teams and went into triple overtime (Notre Dame won 96-87). In the BIG EAST Championship game, Notre Dame again won by two points (61-59).

AP All-America Team

Notre Dame's Skylar Diggins was selected to The Associated Press' All-America Team. Connecticut sophomore Kaleena Mosqueda-Lewis earned a spot on the Second Team and while teammate Stefanie Dolson and Notre Dame's Kayla McBride were named to the Third Team. Diggins received 200 points and were unanimous choices by the 40-member national media panel that votes in the weekly Top 25. Voting was done before the NCAA Championship. Notre Dame coach Muffett McGraw was named the AP Coach of the Year.

BIG EAST NEWS & NOTES

McGraw Collecting Honors

Notre Dame head coach Muffet McGraw was selected as the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Coach of the Year. As this year's Region 1 selection (the fourth in her career), McGraw earned the honor for the second time after she took home in 2001 when the Fighting Irish won their first NCAA national championship.

McGraw, who already has been named the Sports Illustrated National Coach of the Year and the BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year as well the Naismith National Coach of the Year award, guided Notre Dame through a seamless transition this season after losing four seniors (including three key starters) who accounted for 40 percent of her team's scoring and rebounding on last year's NCAA national finalist squad.

Three of the Sweet 16

The BIG EAST had three teams as Connecticut, Louisville and Notre Dame all advanced to the third round. BIG EAST teams went 3-1 in the second round to advance.

Eight BIG EAST Teams in the NCAA Championship

Eight BIG EAST women's basketball teams were selected to compete in the 64-team 2013 Division I Women's Basketball Championship, announced during the ESPN selection show on March 18. It is the fifth time the BIG EAST has had eight teams chosen to the tournament and the second-straight occurrence. The eight teams selected were the most of any conference.

A Pair of No. 1's

The 2013 tournament marks the third time in league history that a pair of No. 1 seeds will come from the BIG EAST. Notre Dame and Connecticut both earned No. 1 seeds in 2012, facing each other in the Final Four for the second-straight year with Notre Dame advancing to the title game. Prior to that, the last time the BIG EAST had two top seeds was 2001, also when Notre Dame and Connecticut were both No. 1 seeds. The two met in the national semifinal in St. Louis, Mo., and the Irish won, eventually winning the title.

Remembering Newtown

As a unified show of support for the Newtown, Conn., community, BIG EAST men's and women's basketball teams wore green ribbons during the first 26 games of conference play. Student-athletes wore the ribbons on their shooting shirts during warmups, while coaches and administrative personnel wore the ribbons throughout their respective games.

Notre Dame Wins Regular Season Title

No. 2/2 Notre Dame won the league's regular-season title for the second straight year following a 96-87 win over No. 3/3 UConn in 3OT at home on March 4. ND went undefeated in BIG EAST play (16-0) for the first time. ND tied a school record with its 23rd consecutive win, matching the winning streak set by the 2000-01 squad that won its first 23 games. The Fighting Irish also tied last year's school record with 28 regular-season wins.

WBCA Announces All-Region Nominees

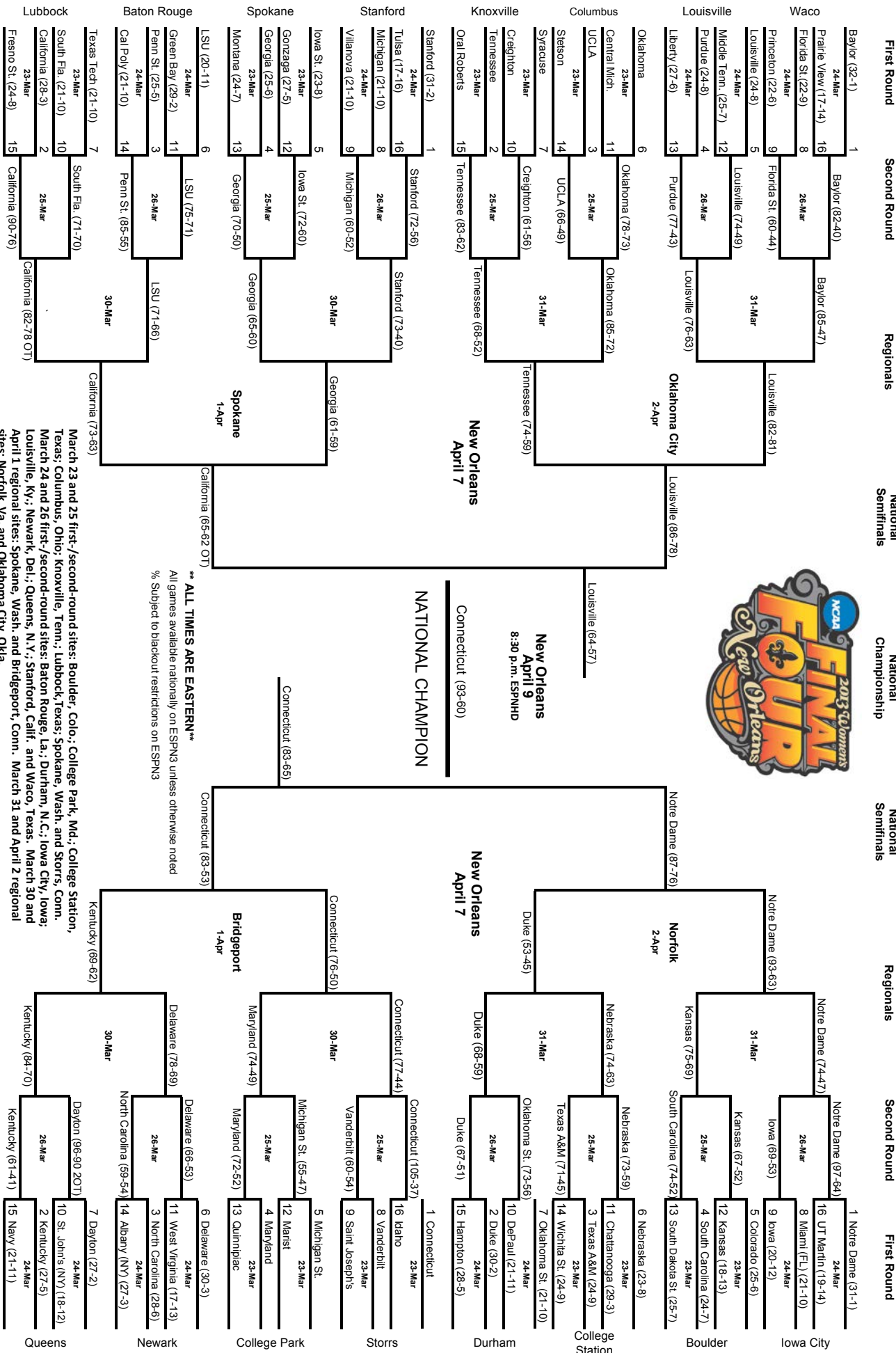
