UCONN REMAINS IN TOP 10 OF AP POLL

This week's Associated Press Top 25 Women's Basketball Poll didn't see much movement in the top 10 as UConn remains #7 in the country, announced on Monday. With this week's ranking, head coach Geno Auriemma is now tied with Stanford's Tara VanDerveer for the most appearances with a single team in the poll. Auriemma has led the Huskies to 627 appearances in the poll in his tenure at UConn, matching VanDerveer's mark at Stanford.

GOTTA HAVE FAITH

Faith Masonius hit a backwards buzzer beater surrounded by four defenders as Seton Hall stunned Villanova, 56-55, on Wednesday night. Masonius ended the game with a team-high 17 points, five boards and two steals. Reigning player and freshman of the week, Jada Eads had 11 points, five rebounds and five assists, while Yaya Lops had seven points, four rebounds and seven points. The Pirates are 3-0 in league play for the first time since the 2015-16 season.

CREIGHTON'S START LEAGUE PLAY 3-0

With a 68-64 win over Butler on Wednesday, Creighton is undefeated to start conference play for the program's first 3-0 start since the 2021-22 Elite Eight team. Lauren Jensen led Creighton to victory with 24 points to mark her 30th career game with 20 or more points. Morgan Maly finished with 17 points and 10 rebounds for her eighth career double-double.

#BIGEASTWBB FAST STATS

- Kilyn McGuff leads the BIG EAST and ranks 20th in the nation in double-doubles (6). McGuff leads DePaul and ranks fifth in the conference in rebounds per game (7.56).
- UConn's Sarah Strong is leading all freshman in the BIG EAST with 17.21 points per game through 13 games. The Huskies are shooting 49.55 percent from the field, good for fifth in the nation.
- Marquette's Skylar Forbes is leading the team at 15.6 points per game this season and has three 20-point games along with two double-doubles. Lee Volker has scored in double-figures in 10-of-13 games this season.
- Providence's Grace Efosa has eclipsed the 20-point mark this season a team-best five times. Efosa is one of seven players in the BIG EAST to record five-or-more 20-point games this season.
- Seton Hall has forced at least 20 turnovers in 10 of 14 games this year, and in all three of its BIG EAST contests.
- Villanova rookie Jasmine Bascoe currently leads the team and ranks ninth in the BIG EAST with 15.6 points per game. She has recorded double-digits in scoring in eight-straight contests this season.

IN THE PRESEASON POLLS

Two BIG EAST teams began the season either ranked or receiving votes in both national polls. Reigning BIG EAST champion Connecticut was slotted No. 2 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches' Poll, while Creighton joined the Huskies in the top 25 at No. 21 in the AP Poll and No. 20 in the Coaches Poll.

WADE WATCH LIST

UConn women's basketball redshirt senior Paige Bueckers was selected to the Wade Watch list of candidates for the 2025 Wade Trophy. In its 48th year, the Wade Trophy is the oldest player of the year award in college women's basketball.

OFFSEASON QUICK HITS

- Welcomed Marquette's new head coach Cara Consuegra this spring.
- The No. 1-ranked recruit in the Class of 2024, UConn freshman Sarah Strong led the United States U18 3x3 team to gold at the FIBA 3x3 U18 World Cup 2024 for her third-straight gold medal
- Creighton's Morgan Maly was part of the winning team at the 2024 FIBA 3x3 U23 Nations League in Mexico City
- Second year of an 18-game schedule from a double-round robin; highlights include 22 games on FOX Sports networks, including seven on FOX Broadcast Network. CBS Sports Network will air two matchups, while SNY will cover 18 regular-season games, including 14 during conference play. BIG EAST Digital Network on FloHoops will stream more than 120 games, including all conference games not designated for TV
- The second year of the Conference's weekly women's basketball feature series – In The Bonus – which includes insights and analysis hosted by Meghan Caffrey

2023-24 SEASON REVIEW

- UConn won its 23rd regular-season title and 22nd BIG EAST Tournament crown
- Coming off a season in which three teams earned NCAA Tournament berths – UConn, Creighton and Marquette
- UConn advanced to the Final Four of the NCAA Tournament on a miracle run with just six players in the regular rotation
- The BIG EAST saw four earn bids into the inaugural Women's Basketball invitation Tournament (WBIT), with Georgetown, St. John's, Seton Hall and Villanova all securing national postseason berths to the 32-team event. The four selections were the most by any conference in the WBIT. The Wildcats reached the championship of the event
- Two UConn players selected in the 2024 WNBA draft, including the No. 6 overall pick Aaliyah Edwards and Nika Muhl (No. 14)

AURIEMMA BECOMES WINNINGEST COACH IN NCAA DI BASKETBALL

With his 1,217th win on Wednesday, Dec. 20, UConn head coach Geno Auriemma now holds the record for most wins in Division I Basketball. The record was recently held by retired Stanford coach Tara VanDerveer (1,216). The 2006 Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame inductee has led the Huskies to 11 national titles and six undefeated seasons in 40 years at the helm. UConn won 111 straight games (2014–17) to own the record for D-I women's or men's basketball.

Halle Vice, Marquette - Vice finished with 17 points, a career-high tying 11 rebounds, a career-high five assists, two steals, and one block in the 79-58 win at DePaul.
