### #BEWB Notes

#### FINAL FOUR BOUND

UConn will play in its 25th Final Four on Friday, April 3 against No. 1 seed South Carolina, in a rematch of the 2025 National Championship game, in which the Huskies posted an 82-59 victory. Tipoff is set for 7 p.m. ET on ESPN. Blanca Quiñonez recently scored 20 points in the 70-52 win over No. 6 Notre Dame to become the first player in UConn history with 20 points off the bench in the Elite Eight or later. The Huskies are 146-24 all-time in the Tournament. UConn has won 12 national titles, with nine under the BIG EAST banner.

#### THE AWARDS KEEP COMING

UConn sophomore Sarah Strong has been received multiple awards the past two weeks, most recently the 2026 Jersey Mike's Naismith Trophy. Strong is the 11th woman in the history of the Naismith Trophy to win the award at the collegiate and high school levels. She is the eighth player in program history to win the Naismith Trophy. She was named the 2026 Wade Trophy award winner, announced by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association. Strong and teammate Azzi Fudd headline the WBCA's 10-member WBCA All-America team. She was also selected as the 2026 USBWA Ann Meyers Drysdale National Player of the Year, announced by the U.S. Basketball Writers Association. She is the eighth Husky to earn USBWA National Player of the Year.

#### FUDD, STRONG NAMED AP FIRST TEAM ALL-AMERICANS

UConn's duo of Azzi Fudd and Sarah Strong earned AP All-America First Team honors, announced Wednesday. They were also named USBWA First Team All-Americans earlier in the week. Strong was also named National Player of the Year by ESPN and The Athletic. She is a finalist for the 2026 Wade Trophy and the McClain Award, along with being listed on the Wooden Award National Ballot. Fudd is an AAU Sullivan Award finalist, a Drysdale Award finalist, and is on the Wooden Award Ballot.

#### HECKEL EARNS NCAA ELITE SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

UConn sophomore Kayleigh Heckel selected as the recipient of the 2026 NCAA Elite Scholar-Athlete Award for women's basketball. Heckel holds a 3.967 cumulative grade-point average and is an analytics and information management major. She is UConn's second Elite Scholar-Athlete Award winner after Maya Moore (2011).

#### VILLANOVA FALLS TO TEXAS TECH IN NCAA TOURNAMENT FIRST ROUND GAME

On Friday night in the first round of the 2026 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament, the No. seed 10 Villanova Wildcats fell to the No. seed 7 Texas Tech Lady Raiders by a score of 57-52. With the loss, the Wildcats finish the season with a 25-8 overall record. Jasmine Bascoe led the way in the loss with 21 points, while Kelsey Joens had 14 points. Brynna McCurry finished with 13 points and a game-high nine rebounds.

#### WBIT UPDATE

Seton Hall graduate student Mariana Valenzuela had a double-double with team-highs of 17 points and 10 rebounds, but the team went cold in the fourth quarter and fell to Missouri, 67-57, in the opening round of the WBIT. Joining Valenzuela in double-figures in scoring, sophomore Ja'kahla Craft returned after missing five games with an injury and had 15 points, six rebounds and a career-high six steals. St. John's fell to Columbia, 74-26, in the WBIT First Round. The Red Storm closed out the 2025-26 campaign with a tough loss to Columbia in its second WBIT appearance. The Red Storm were led by Daniela Abies with 10 points and eight rebounds.

#### UCONN CAPTURES THE 2026 BIG EAST WOMEN'S BASKETBALL CROWN

When the final whistle blew at Mohegan Sun Arena, the trophy returned to Storrs, as the top-ranked UConn Huskies captured the 2026 BIG EAST Women's Basketball Tournament Presented by Jeep. Paced by Azzi Fudd and Sarah Strong, UConn topped No. 2 seed Villanova, 90-51, to win the program's 24th BIG EAST Championship. Fudd finished the outing with 19 points on 8-of-13 shooting, while Strong posted 18 points, eight rebounds, and two steals in just 22 minutes of action. Villanova was led once again by Jasmine Bascoe, who scored 14 points, while collecting five rebounds and four steals.

#### BIG EAST EXTENDS DEAL WITH MOHEGAN SUN ARENA

The BIG EAST Conference has announced a three-year extension with Mohegan Sun Arena to serve as host of the BIG EAST Women's Basketball Tournament presented by JEEP. The Conference and Mohegan Sun are in the last year of their second three-year deal, and the extension guarantees the event will remain in Uncasville, Conn., through 2029.

## NEWS & NOTES

### AROUND THE BIG EAST

#### Butler

- They forced their opponents to commit double-digit turnovers in 26 of 31 games this season.
- The Bulldogs had six players score in double figures against Dayton on Nov. 28 to mark the first time Butler has had six players in double figures in the last 15 seasons.

#### UConn

- Sarah Strong leads the Huskies, averaging 18.6 points, 7.6 rebounds, 3.4 steals, and 1.6 blocks per game.
- In her 59th career game, Strong eclipsed the 1,000-career points mark in the win vs. Notre Dame, becoming the third fastest player in program history to do so, after Maya Moore and Paige Bueckers, who accomplished the feat in 55 career games.
- Azzi Fudd has a .489/.455/.955 shooting split this season. Her three-point percentage is good for fourth in the nation.

#### Creighton

- The Bluejays recorded 13 games of 10+ made treys this season.
- Kiani Lockett delivered a career-high 25 points to lift Creighton to the road W at Drake.

#### DePaul

- Kate Novik reached double figures in 22 of 31 games played this season while Michelle Ojo scored double figures 12 times.
- Novik recorded her first career triple-double with 12 points, 11 rebounds and 10 assists, for the eighth triple-double in program history in win vs. UMass Lowell.
- The win over Grambling State marked the first time since 2023 that DePaul held an opponent to under 40 points in a game.

#### Georgetown

- Victoria Rivera led GU this season with 9.4 ppg.
- The Hoyas defeated Marquette in January for the first time since the 2017-18 season.
- Against Towson, they set a new program record with 14 3-pointers in the contest.
- Head coach Darnell Haney recorded his 100th career victory against Sacred Heart.

#### Marquette

- Halle Vice recorded a league-leading 11 double-doubles this season.
- Marquette held five teams under 60 points in seven league road games.
- Marquette made 11 3-pointers against Winthrop for the most treys made in a game since 2023.
- Cara Consuegra recorded her 250th career victory against Milwaukee.

#### Providence

- Sabou Gueye led the team in scoring, averaging 15.6 points and shoots a team-best 49-percent from the field.
- As a team, PC grabbed 55 rebounds against CCSU, the most since 2013.
- One of five teams in NCAA Division I that face the Huskies and Gamecocks this season.

#### St. John's

- The Johnnies defeated Villanova for the first time since 2023.
- With 13 assists vs. Georgia Tech, Shaulana Wagner became the first St. John's player to record double-digit assists since Tiana England (10) against Seton Hall on Feb. 22, 2020.
- The win over #18 Oklahoma State marked the team's highest-ranked victory since 2023. The last-ranked non-conference victory was in 2015 when they beat South Florida.

#### Seton Hall

- SHU has pulled down at least 40 rebounds in a single-game 12 times this season.
- Savannah Catalon recorded at least three steals in 21 games this season. She had a season-high seven steals in the 81-36 win at Georgetown on New Years Eve.

#### Villanova

- Jasmine Bascoe led the Wildcats and the league with 18.9 points per game. She recorded 15 20 or more point performances this season.
- Bascoe and Brynn McCurry totaled 45 of Villanova's 81 points in the team's upset win at #25 West Virginia.
- Named 2025 Big 5 Women's Classic Champions after defeating St. Joseph's in December.

#### Xavier

- Mariyah Noel averaged 14.9 points per game this year, ranking sixth in the BIG EAST. She is second on the team in rebounding (6.3).
- Noel scored 30 points to become the first Xavier player to score 30 or more points in a game since Raeshaun Gaffney scored 33 points in 2017.
- Had a season-high 13 steals vs. Marquette, the 12th time the Musketeers have posted 10 or more steals in a game over the last two seasons.
- They defeated Cincinnati 77-70 to be named Skyline Chili Crosstown Shootout Champions.

## 2026 BIG EAST ANNUAL AWARDS

### **BIG EAST Player and Defensive Player of the Year**

*Sarah Strong, UConn, So., F\**

Strong leads the Huskies, averaging 18.6 points, 7.6 rebounds, 3.2 steals and 1.6 blocks through 30 games played this season. She is first among BIG EAST players with a .595 field goal percentage. She has recorded 13 20-point performances and eight double-doubles this season. She ranks seventh in the nation in steals (97) and 12th in steals per game (3.23) as she leads the Huskies' top-ranked scoring defense (50.7). Strong was recently named to the 2026 Naismith Defensive Player of the Year Late-Season Team. She is also on the Naismith Trophy Late-Season Team, the Wooden Award Late Midseason Watch List and the Katrina McClain top-10 candidate list. UConn has taken home BIG EAST Player of the Year honors for the 21st time.

### **BIG EAST Freshman and Sixth Woman of the Year**

*Blanca Quiñonez, UConn, Fr., F*

Quiñonez is the 16th Husky to win BIG EAST Freshman of the Year honors and the third-straight following Strong's honors last year and Ashlynn Shade in 2024. She is also the fifth UConn player to earn sixth-woman of the year award. She concluded the regular season averaging 10.0 points on .549 shooting from the field. Quiñonez was named BIG EAST Freshman of the Week seven times this year.

### **BIG EAST Most Improved Player**

*Brynn McCurry, Villanova, Jr., F*

McCurry came back to the Villanova bench stronger after missing all of the 2024-25 season due to injury. The junior averaged 2.7 points per game and 1.8 rebounds per contest in 11.6 minutes per game in 2023-24. She is currently averaging 10.9 points per game and a team-leading 5.5 rebounds per contest, to go with four 20-or-more-point performances. McCurry has registered 17 double-figure scoring games after coming into the season with only two double-figure scoring contests in her career.

### **BIG EAST Sportsmanship Award**

*Meg Newman, DePaul, Gr., F*

Newman, the sportsmanship award winner, has demonstrated outstanding leadership, service and character as a veteran returner for the Blue Demons program. She has served her community with service projects, including assembling blankets for Marillac St. Vincent Family Services, taking part in community cleanup initiatives in partnership with Molson Coors "Cheers to the "Our Neighborhood" program, as well as led a youth clinic with the Girls in the Game organization. She graduated with a Political Science and Government degree in June and is currently pursuing a Legal Studies and International Law master's degree.

### **BIG EAST Coach of the Year**

*Geno Auriemma, UConn*

Auriemma was selected BIG EAST Coach of the Year presented by Invesco QQQ for the 14th time after guiding the Huskies to their 13th undefeated BIG EAST finish. He has led UConn to 47-straight wins, tying the fifth-longest winning streak ever in NCAA Division I Women's Basketball history. UConn heads into the BIG EAST Tournament with a 31-0 overall record, marking the 11th undefeated regular season in program history and the first since the 2017-18 season. Under his leadership, the Huskies lead the nation in scoring margin (37.8), assist/turnover ratio (1.85), assists per game (24.0), field goal percentage (52.5), scoring defense (50.7), steals per game (15.7), and three-point percentage (39.35). On Monday, the team was named the unanimous No. 1 in the AP Top 25 poll for an eighth straight week. Auriemma has led the Huskies to 656 appearances in the poll during his 41-year career, for most all-time, previously held by Tara VanDerveer, who retired from Stanford in 2024.

### **BIG EAST Scholar-Athlete of the Year**

*Azzi Fudd, UConn, Gr., G*

Fudd is currently pursuing a master's degree in business administration while maintaining a 3.57 GPA. She earned a bachelor's degree in communications at UConn. She has been named to the Director of Athletics' Honor Roll eight semesters at UConn. Her postgraduate plan includes continuing to work on various partnerships and playing professionally. This past summer, she hosted the ninth annual Azzi Fudd Basketball Camp, Hooping For A Cure. Fudd has historically donated funds to the Pat Summit Foundation to fund Alzheimer's disease, but this year she shifted to honoring Abby Zittoun by donating to the AZ Family Foundation. In May 2024 and 2025, Fudd volunteered at Hole in the Wall Gang Camp, supporting the camp's efforts to give sick kids a normal camp experience, spending afternoons getting to know campers, playing games, dancing and building relationships.

The upcoming season marks the first year of a six-year media agreement, which will span from 2025-26 through 2030-31, encompassing coverage on FOX Sports (FOX, FS1), NBC Sports (NBC, Peacock), and TNT Sports (TNT, TBS and truTV). The agreement will provide comprehensive national broadcast, cable, and direct-to-consumer streaming coverage of BIG EAST women's and men's basketball games. ESPN+ will also stream a minimum of 75 women's basketball games. Below is a breakdown by network:

**FOX /FS1**

• FOX will air four games while FS1 will show 13 games in 2025-26 to mark the fifth straight year BIG EAST women's basketball will be featured on the broadcast network.

**NBC SPORTS/PEACOCK**

• Peacock will stream 25 women's games, including all 10 of the conference's women's basketball tournament games. The 2026 BIG EAST Women's Basketball Tournament presented by JEEP will take place from Friday, March 6 to Monday, March 9 at Mohegan Sun.

**TNT SPORTS**

• TNT Sports will feature 15 regular season women's basketball games, including 14 league-play matchups, split across TNT and truTV throughout the 2025-26 season. All TNT Sports games will also stream on HBO Max.

**ESPN+**

• This past July, the BIG EAST and ESPN agreed upon a six-year digital media rights agreement, adding hundreds of live BIG EAST events to ESPN's robust college sports portfolio. For the 2025-26 season, 127 women's basketball games, including 73 conference games will appear on ESPN+.

## WEEKLY AWARD WINNERS

### BIG EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

#### Skylar Forbes, Marquette, Jr., F

Forbes averaged 21.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 1.5 blocks per game in leading the team to wins over Xavier (77-65) and Providence (69-65). She scored 19 points against the Musketeers, with 12 of the 19 coming in the first half, helping give MU a six-point lead at the half. She then totaled a team-high 24 in Marquette's road win at Providence. Her 24 points were her second-most in a game this season and were two shy of her career high.

### BIG EAST FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

#### Anna Wypych, Butler, Fr., G

Wypych was spectacular in a 2-0 week for the Dawgs, averaging 14.5 points, two rebounds and two assists. Against DePaul, Wypych poured in a career-high 21 points and added three assists, one rebound and one steal in 28 minutes of action to help lift Butler to the 71-64 victory. The freshman chipped in eight points, three rebounds and one assist as Butler took down Seton Hall, 62-55 on Sunday.

### BIG EAST WEEKLY HONOR ROLL

#### Saniya Jackson, Butler, R-So., G

In a 2-0 week for the Bulldogs, Jackson averaged a double-double, posting 12.0 points and 11.0 rebounds. Over the course of the week, Jackson pulled down 19 defensive rebounds to go with three offensive boards. Jackson was 10-for-11 from the floor during the week and was 3-for-4 from behind the arc.

#### Azzi Fudd, UConn, Gr., G

Fudd averaged 19.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists, and 3.0 steals per game in wins against Georgetown (84-52) and St. John's (85-49). She had 24 points with six three-pointers, five rebounds, four assists and four steals vs. Georgetown. She rounded out the week with 14 points at St. John's.

#### Grace Boffeli, Creighton, Gr., F

Boffeli posted 20 points and 10 rebounds in the 73-71 win at Xavier, scoring 13 points and to go with four offensive rebounds in the fourth quarter to aid in the Bluejays comeback victory. In the wins over Providence and at Xavier, Boffeli averaged 12 points, 8.0 rebounds, and dished out 3.5 assists. Her five assists against Providence equaled a career best.

#### Sabou Gueye, Providence, Gr., G

Gueye averaged 16.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists, 2.0 steals and 2.0 blocks per game, while shooting 45.2 percent from the field. In the game against Marquette, she became one of only three BIG EAST players in the last 15 years to record 20-or-more points, nine rebounds, five assists and three blocks during a BIG EAST game.

#### Jasmine Bascoe, Villanova, So., G

Bascoe led the Wildcats to an 82-52 win at Seton Hall with 28 points, five rebounds, seven assists and eight blocks.
