BIG SKY PLAYOFF FACTS

- ✓ The Big Sky Conference has advanced at least two teams to the play-offs in 27 of the last 29 years. The Big Sky has sent multiple teams to the postseason in 14 straight seasons.
- ✓ This marks the fifth straight season the Big Sky has advanced a team to the semifinals. Montana made the semifinals in 2008, 2009 and 2011. Eastern Washington has made the semifinals in 2010 and 2012. The only previous time the Big Sky advanced a team to the semifinals in five straight seasons occurred from 1993-97. Idaho made the 1993 semifinals. Montana and Boise State both made the semifinals in 1994. Montana was again a semifinalist in 1995 and 1996, and Eastern Washington made the semis in 1997.
- ✓ Saturday will mark the 17th time a Big Sky team has played host to a national semifinal. Big Sky teams are 12-4 in home semifinal games. EWU is 1-1 in those contests. The loss came at Joe Albi Stadium in Spokane in 1997. The win came at Roos Field in Cheney in 2010.
- ✓ The Big Sky Conference is 77-62 (.554) all-time in the playoffs. Seven wins and seven losses came against fellow Big Sky teams. Against outside opponents, the Big Sky is 70-55 (.560).
- ✓ Big Sky teams have won six national championships, starting with Boise State in 1980. Idaho State followed in 1981 and Montana State in 1984. Montana captured titles in 1995 and 2001. Eastern Washington claimed the title in 2010.
- ✓ Big Sky teams have lost in the national championship game seven times. Nevada was a runner-up in 1990, and Boise State finished second in 1994. Montana has been second five times: 1996, 2000, 2004, 2008 and 2009.
- ✓ Four times since 2003, a Big Sky team has knocked out the No. 1 or No. 2 seed from the playoffs. In 2003, NAU upset No. 1 McNeese State 35-3 on the road. In 2004, EWU upset No. 1 Southern Illinois 34-31 on the road. In 2007, Eastern Washington beat No. 2 seed McNeese State 44-14 on the road. All three of those were first-round games. In 2008, Montana upset No. 1 James Madison 35-27 in a semifinal game on the road.

PLAYOFF NOTES



- ✓ Three of the four semifinalists have returned from 2011. Georgia Southern, North Dakota State, and Sam Houston State are all back in the semifinals. Eastern Washington is the only new team in the semifinals, replacing fellow Big Sky member Montana.
- ✓ Georgia Southern and North Dakota State will battle for the second straight season in the semifinals. North Dakota State beat Georgia Southern 35-7 in last year's semifinals in Fargo, N.D. This year's semifinal is also being played in Fargo, N.D.
- ✓ Of the four remaining teams, only Sam Houston State has not won a national championship. Georgia Southern leads all FCS teams with six national titles. Eastern Washington won the championship in 2010, while North Dakota State won the title last season over Sam Houston State. Georgia Southern's last title came in 2000.
- ✓ Georgia Southern has appeared in a record eight national championship games, but hasn't made the final since 2000. EWU, NDSU and Sam Houston State are all looking for their second championship appearance.
- ✓ If Eastern Washington wins on Saturday against Sam Houston State, the Big Sky will advance a team to the championship for the fourth time in five seasons. Montana made the championship game in 2008 and 2009, followed by Eastern Washington in 2010.
- ✓ Eastern Washington wide receiver Brandon Kaufman has caught 19 passes for 385 yards with three touchdowns in his two playoff games this season. He has had at least 120 receiving yards in four consecutive playoff games dating back to 2010. In his seven-game playoff career, Kaufman has caught 46 passes for 747 yards with seven TDs.
- ✓ EWU coach Beau Baldwin has led his team to six consecutive playoff victories dating back to 2010. During the run, the Eagles have beaten two teams from the CAA (Villanova, Delaware), two from the Missouri Valley (North Dakota State, Illinois State) one from the Ohio Valley (Southeast Missouri) and Wagner from the Northeast Conference.
- ✓ In all six of Eastern Washington's playoff victories since 2010, the Eagles have trailed at some point in the game.
- ✓ In all six of the playoff games, a transfer from SMU has started at quarterback. Bo Levi Mitchell, who lost his starting job to Kyle Padron at SMU and transferred to Eastern Washington in 2010, led the Eagles to four playoff wins in 2010. Padron, who left SMU for EWU this past summer, has guided EWU to the last two wins.
- ✓ In two playoff wins, Kyle Padron has completed 65 percent of his passes for 658 yards with seven touchdowns and two interceptions.
- ✓ In two playoff games this season, NDSU's defense has surrendered just a field goal. Wofford scored a touchdown last week on an interception return.
- ✓ Sam Houston State's defense has allowed just three touchdowns in two games - both against Big Sky teams. Cal Poly scored one TD against the Bearkats, while MSU managed two. EWU's defense has allowed five touchdowns in two playoff games.

SECOND-ROUND RECAPS

EWU, MSU Advance

No. 2 seed Eastern Washington and No. 3 seed Montana State won Division I Championship home playoff games Saturday (Dec. 1), while Cal Poly fell just short on the road.

Eastern Washington moved to 10-2 with a 29-19 home win over a tough Wagner team from the Northeast Conference. Eastern Washington, the 2010 national champion, has won five straight postseason games.

Montana State hiked its record to 11-1 with a 16-10 victory over Stony Brook of the Big South Conference.

Cal Poly finished its first season in the Big Sky with an 18-16 loss to Sam Houston State, the national runner-up from last season. Tim Walsh's Mustangs finished 9-3.

Eastern Washington 29, Wagner 19: Junior Kyle Padron completed 26-of-36 passes for 327 yards and one touchdown as the Eagles rallied from a second-half deficit for the win.

Wagner took a 19-14 lead in the third quarter, but the Eagles responded. Quincy Forte scored on a 3-yard run on the final play of the third quarter. Demetrius Bronson capped a 15-play, 73-yard drive with a 2-yard run with 4:02 to play. The drive ate 7:27 off the clock.

Wagner, which won its first postseason game last week, won the turnover battle 3-0. The Seahawks scored 10 points in the third quarter off of EWU turnovers to take the lead. David Lopez kicked field goals of 46, 21, 29 and 32 yards, and had a 41-yard attempt blocked in the first quarter.

Eastern Washington's first-half touchdowns came from Ryan Seto, who hauled in a 21-yard pass from Padron, and Bronson, who scored on a 1-yard run.

EWU had 411 yards of total offense and converted 8-of-11 on third downs. EWU junior wide receiver Brandon Kaufman caught 10 passes for 174 yards. Bronson rushed for 76 yards and two touchdowns.

Montana State 16, Stony Brook 10: Rory Perez kicked three field goals, Tanner Bleskin caught a 69-yard touchdown pass, and the Bobcat defense played outstanding in the win.

Caleb Schreibeis forced the last of three Stony Brook fumbles on the game's final play to secure the win. Stony Brook, of the Big South Conference, came into the game averaging 282.2 rushing yards per game. The Bobcats held the Seawolves to 123 rushing yards on 37 carries.

Miguel Maysonet, one of three finalists for the Walter Payton Award, had 83 yards on 19 carries. He entered the game averaging 156 yards per game.

Montana State QB DeNarius McGhee completed 12-of-22 passes for 208 yards and a touchdown. He also rushed for a team-high 75 yards.

Sam Houston State 18, Cal Poly 16: Bobby Zalud kicked three field goals, and the Mustang defense played a solid game, but it wasn't enough against the Bearkats.

Sam Houston State forced three Cal Poly turnovers, and Tim Flanders rushed for 101 yards to lead the Bearkats, who beat a Big Sky team in a playoff game for the third straight time over two years.

Cal Poly trailed 8-0 at the half. Sam Houston's points came on two field goals, and a safety off a blocked punt.

The Mustangs closed within 8-6 on Zalud field goals of 23 and 27 yards. Sam Houston, which entered the game averaging a national-best 44.8 points per game, scored just one offense touchdown.

Sam Houston led 18-9 when Cal Poly got its only touchdown when Ryan Taylor threw a 50-yard touchdown pass to Willie Tucker on a trick play with 1:34 to play. Cal Poly converted the 2-point conversion, but could not recover an on-side kick.

QUARTERFINAL RECAPS

Eastern Washington 51, Illinois State 35

CHENEY, Wash. - Fortunately, the Eastern Washington University football team had a dab more ebb and flow.

The Eagles had scoring runs of 28 and 14 unanswered points - and withstood an 18-point Redbird onslaught -- to defeat Illinois State 51-35 in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs Saturday (Dec. 8) at Roos Field in Cheney, Wash.

Junior QB Kyle Padron passed for 358 yards and a school-record six touchdown passes, including three to junior wide receiver Brandon Kaufman, who finished with nine receptions for a 191 yards. In the process, Kaufman broke the EWU and Big Sky single-season records for reception yards with a current total of 1,635 yards.

"Their talent is obvious," said EWU coach Beau Baldwin. "You can see the talent in both these two guys. More than anything, they have guts and heart. That's what means the most."

Eastern trailed in the second quarter 17-10, but was able to take a 24-17 lead at halftime with a touchdown with 10 seconds left. Taking advantage of a Redbird interception in the third quarter by Eastern junior Ronnie Hamlin, Kaufman then caught TD passes of 47 and 17 yards within 15 seconds of each other to give EWU a 38-17 lead.

But after Illinois State scored 18 unanswered points to pull within 38-35, Kaufman struck again with a 76-yard TD reception. Padron added a 10-yard TD pass to Ashton Clark with 7:42 left to close out the scoring.

"I am just so proud of the guys for how hard they fought and how they kept responding. When you get down to the final eight in the country, you know there are going to be some highs and lows in a football game. That game had a lot of emotion, momentum swings and things that happened. Our guys found ways to make plays whenever it felt like we were losing the momentum. No one panicked on the sideline."

Kaufman had just three catches for 20 yards in the first half, then exploded with six grabs for 171 yards in the second half. His 191 yards ranks as the 12th most in school history. Averaging 19.5 yards per catch with 13 TDs this season, he broke the previous EWU season school record of 1,453 yards held by Eric Kimble in 2004, and the previous Big Sky record of 1,525 yards set by Tim Toone in 2008.

It was Kaufman's 18th career game with 100 yards or more receiving, including his 10th this season.

Padron completed 19-of-33 passes, and his six touchdowns tied the EWU single-game previous record held by Matt Nichols (8/31/07 vs. Montana-Western) and Rob James (11/1/86 vs. Weber State).

Sophomore running back Quincy Forte added 116 yards on just seven carries (16.6 per carry), including a 57-yarder. Senior Greg Herd added four catches for 74 yards, and Clark, tight end Zack Gehring and Daniel Johnson also had touchdown catches from Padron.

Hamlin finished with 10 tackles to go along with his interception, and junior safety Allen Brown had nine stops. Junior cornerback T.J. Lee III had eight tackles, a forced fumble and two passes broken up.

Sam Houston State 34, Montana State 16

BOZEMAN, Mont. -- Brian Bell threw for 254 yards and three touchdowns, leading Sam Houston State to a 34-16 win over Montana State in the quarterfinals of the 2012 FCS Playoffs in Bozeman on Friday.

Bell and the balanced Bearkats rolled up 458 total yards, including 204 on the ground. Tim Flanders gained 106 yards, helping SHSU possess the ball for 36 minutes. Sam Houston's pressure-oriented defense produced five sacks, two turnovers, and limited the Bobcats to just 292 total yard

The net effect was not lost on Bobcat defensive end Caleb Schreibeis. "They're just a good team," the MSU senior said.

Sam Houston State jumped on the board early, driving 42 yards on its second possession to set up a 24-yard Miguel Antonio field goal. The Bobcats answered, driving 62 yards on its next possession with Rory Perez converting a 27-yard field goal. The drive could have produced more, though, as a lateral from DeNarius McGhee to offensive tackle Steven Foster was ruled a forward pass, negating the ensuing touchdown.

After a first quarter played on nearly even terms, SHSU established itself in the second quarter. The Bearkats drove 79 yards on its first drive, with Richard Sincere scoring on a 12-yard run. After forcing a three-and-out, the Bearkats capitalized on the first several big plays. Bell found Trey Diller behind the Bobcat secondary for a 56-yard scoring strike, the Sam Houston State owned a 17-3 lead.

While the Bearkat offense was piecing together drives, SHSU's defense stifled the Bobcats in the second quarter. The Bobcats ran only nine plays in the period, gaining just 13 yards.

"It was the perfect storm of not getting things done," Ash said of his team's second quarter. But, the MSU defense gave the team a boost late in the half. Sam Houston marched to the MSU one-yard line, and appeared ready to blow the game open. But the Bobcat defense stiffened, and the Bearkats settled for a field goal.

Montana State turned that boost into an actual rally after halftime. The Bobcats forced a three-and-out on the SHSU initial drive, the marched 75 yards for a touchdown. DeNarius McGhee scampered in from eight yards out to get MSU within 20-9 after the missed PAT.

Sam Houston State punted to MSU on the next drive, pinning the Bobcats at the three. On a third-and-six from its own seven, McGhee found Jon Ellis for a first down, but Ellis fumbled and the Bearkats recovered. SHSU scored on the next play, and the game was essentially over.

McGhee finished the day 16-for-29 passing, but was under pressure most of the day and his one interception set up an SHSU field goal. MSU gained just 72 net yards on the ground, with McGhee's 36 leading the way. Tanner Bleskin's 76 receiving yards led the Bobcats, while Ellis had 67.

The Records: Eastern Washington brings a five-game winning streak and an 11-2 overall record into the quarterfinals. EWU's losses came to Washington State of the Pac-12 and Southern Utah. The Eagles finished 7-1 in Big Sky play, tying Montana State and Cal Poly for the regular-season title. The Eagles received the Big Sky's automatic bid to the playoffs...Sam Houston State brings a 10-3 record to Cheney. The Bearkats earned an at-large bid out of the Southland Conference. Sam Houston State went 6-1 in conference play, losing 24-20 at Central Arkansas on Sept. 22. Sam Houston State also lost to FCS teams Baylor and Texas A&M.

The Series: Sam Houston State leads 1-0.

Last Meeting: Sam Houston State rallied from a 34-14 fourth-quarter deficit to beat Eastern Washington 35-34 in a 2004 quarterfinal game on Dec. 5 in Cheney. Jason Mathenia caught the game-tying touchdown in the final offensive play of the game. Lance Garner won the game with the extra point. Dustin Long threw for 478 yards and three touchdowns in the win. Darius Washington rushed for 156 yards and three touchdowns for the Eagles.

The Coaches: Eastern Washington's Beau Baldwin is 44-18 in his fifth season with the Eagles. Baldwin was named Co-Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year along with Tim Walsh of Cal Poly. Baldwin has an overall head coaching record of 54-21. He led Central Washington to a 10-3 season in 2007 prior to returning to EWU, where he previously served as the offensive coordinator. Baldwin is 6-1 in playoff games...Willie Fritz 30-9 in his third season. He is 5-1 in the playoffs. Fritz compiled a 97-47 record as the head coach at Central Missouri from 1997-2009. He went 39-5-1 in four seasons at Blinn College, winning JC national championships in 1995 and 1996.

Big Sky vs. the Southland: The Big Sky is 25-14 against the Southland in the playoffs. Sam Houston is 6-2 all-time vs. Big Sky teams in the playoffs. Big Sky teams hold a 21-4 edge against Southland teams in playoff games played in Big Sky stadiums. EWU is 2-2 all-time against Southland teams in the playoffs. EWU beat Northwestern State 40-14 at Joe Albi Stadium in Spokane in 1997 in a first-round game. The Eagles lost to Sam Houston State in the 2004 quarterfinals. EWU upset McNeese State 44-15 on the road in 2007. The Eagles lost in 2009 at Stephen F. Austin in a first-round game. This will mark the fifth time the Big Sky has gone head-to-head against the Southland in a semifinal game. The Big Sky leads 3-1 with all three wins coming by Montana in Missoula. The lone loss was UM's 31-28 defeat last season at Sam Houston State. Sam Houston's two playoff losses to Big Sky teams came in 2001 in a quarterfinal game in Missoula 49-24, and at Montana in a 2004 semifinal 34-13. Sam Houston State has won four straight playoff games the last two seasons over Big Sky teams, downing Montana State twice, Montana once and Cal Poly. The Big Sky is 1-3 against Southland teams this season. Montana State beat Stephen F. Austin. Weber State lost to McNeese State. Cal Poly and MSU have lost in the playoffs to Sam Houston State.

The Bearkats also beat Montana and Montana State in the 2011 playoffs...Eastern Washington is seeking its seventh straight playoff victory...EWU is 7-0 at home this season. Sam Houston is 4-3 on the road...EWU is 13-0 in games played after Nov. 1 since 2010...Sam Houston RB Tim Flanders has rushed for 1,358 yards and 17 touchdowns...Sam Houston QB Brian Bell has completed 61.2 percent of his passes for 2,375 yards with 23 touchdowns and seven interceptions...EWU's WR trio of Brandon Kaufman, Nicholas Edwards and Greg Herd enter Saturday's semifinal with 586 career catches for 8,374 yards and 78 touchdowns...Kaufman has set a single-season Big Sky record with 1,635 receiving yards...Sam Houston State safety Darnell Taylor, Flanders and offensive lineman Kaleb Hopson were named to the Sports Network All-American Team. EWU was represented on the team by Kaufman, kicker Jimmy Pavel, and cornerback T.J. Lee III...Pavel has made an EWU single-season record 17 field goals...With 11 wins, EWU has now won more than 10 games in a season three times in school history. The school record is 13 in 2010...Sam Houston State LB Darius Taylor has 15 tackles for loss...Sam Houston will play its second game this season on a non-green surface. The Bearkats lost at Central Arkansas 24-20 earlier this season. Central Arkansas plays on a purple and grey surface...Kaufman enters Saturday with 84 catches this season. That is tied for 13th most in Big Sky single-season history. With just six catches he would move into seventh place...EWU DE Jerry Ceja ranks fourth in single-season school history with 12.5 sacks...LB Ronnie Hamlin leads EWU with 127 total tackles...The teams are slated to meet on Sept. 28, 2013, in Huntsville, Texas, in the first game of a home-and-home series...EWU QB Kyle Padron tied a school record with six TD passes in last week's win over Illinois State. In his last three games, Padron has thrown for 1,066 yards with nine touchdowns and two interceptions. He's also rushed for two touchdowns...In the last two years, Big Sky teams are 6-0 against teams other than Sam Houston State, and 0-4 against the Bearkats...Sam Houston State has outscored opponents 189-60 in the second quarter of games this season, including 17-0 in the quarterfinal win over Montana State...Four times this season, Sam Houston State has allowed more than 300 passing yards. Stephen F. Austin threw for 545 and six touchdowns in a 51-43 loss. Central Arkansas threw for 318 in a 24-20 win. Baylor and Texas A&M also threw for more than 300 and beat the Bearkats.

OGDEN, Utah (Nov. 21, 2012) - For the first time since 2005, the Big Sky Conference has co-football Coaches of the Year. Eastern Washington's Beau Baldwin and Cal Poly's Tim Walsh shared the honor.

The selection was made by the league coaches Monday and announced on Wednesday (Nov. 21). It's the first Big Sky Coach of the Year honor for both coaches.

Baldwin guided the Eagles to a 9-2 regular-season and a share of the conference title with a 7-1 record. EWU's regular season included a win over FBS Idaho, and a road win at Montana State.

Baldwin, in his fifth season with the Eagles, has compiled a 44-18 overall record. He is 30-10 in conference games. Walsh has an overall coaching record of 54-21, including his one season at Central Washington.

"It means a lot to be honored by your peers," Baldwin said. "The level of coaching in this conference is outstanding. It's a challenge each and every week for each of us. It is humbling to be honored along with Coach Walsh, who is also very deserving."

Eastern Washington, which won the 2010 National Championship under Baldwin, will take the No. 2 seed to the playoffs. EWU beat Wagner 29-19 in a second-round playoff game last week.

Baldwin is the fourth EWU coach to win the Big Sky Coach of the Year. Dick Zornes claimed the honor in 1992, followed by Mike

Kramer in 1997. Paul Wulff was the Coach of the Year in 2001, 2004 and 2005.

Walsh guided Cal Poly to a 7-1 conference record and a 9-2 mark in the Mustangs first season in the Big Sky Conference. Cal Poly earned an at-large bid to the playoffs. The Mustangs lost 18-16 to Sam Houston State in a second-round game.

Walsh has compiled a 26-19 record in four seasons at Cal Poly. Walsh spent 14 seasons as a head coach at PortlandState, including 11 in the Big Sky Conference. He has an overall record of 143-101 in 22 seasons as a head coach, including four at Sonoma State.

Cal Poly started the season with seven consecutive victories, including a 24-22 road win over Wyoming of the Mountain West Conference.

"Anytime you get a Coach of the Year, it probably means you have a great team," Walsh said. "It's about the dedication of the player, and our players have been dedicated. This is really a credit to the players we have and the assistant coaches."

Cal Poly ranks third in the nation in rushing yards per game with an average of 334.3 per game. The Mustangs have set a single-season Big Sky rushing record with 3,343 yards.

Both Walsh and Baldwin are finalists for the Eddie Robinson Award, presented annually by The Sports Network to the top coach in the FCS.

ASH NAMED AFCA REGIONAL COY

Montana State Rob Ash was named the Region 5 Co-Coach of the Year for the Football Championship Subdivision by the American Football Coaches Association on Monday, Dec. 3.

Ash, now in his sixth season at Montana State, shared the honor with Sam Houston State coach Willie Fritz.

Ash guided Montana State to a 10-1 regular season, the first 10-win regular season in school history. He was named the 2010 Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year, and the 2011 Liberty Mutual FCS Coach of the Year.

MSU's season ended in the quarterfinals with a loss to Fritz and Sam Houston St.

New Hampshire's Sean McDonnell was named the Region 1 Coach of the Year. Bethune Cookman's Brian Jenkins and Stony Brook's Chuck Priore shared the Region 2 honor. Eastern Illinois' Dino Babers was the Region 3 honoree, and Indiana State's Trent

Miles was the Region 4 honoree.

Ash became Montana State's all-time leader in victories this season, surpassing the legendary Sonny Holland. Ash has an overall record of 50-21 with the Bobcats. He has guided his team to three straight co-Big Sky Conference titles. Montana State is 21-3 the last three seasons in Big Sky play, the top mark of any league squad.

Ash has been a head coach for 33 seasons. Ash has an overall coaching record of 226-121-5 in his 33rd season as a head coach. Ash spent 18 seasons as the head coach at Drake. He was also the head coach Juniata for nine seasons.

The 2012 Regional Coach of the Year winners will be recognized at the AFCA Coach of the Year Dinner at the 2013 AFCA Convention in Nashville, Tennessee. The dinner is scheduled for Tuesday, January 8.

Ash is a past president of the AFCA.

AROUND THE BIG SKY

TWO EARN ACADEMIC HONORS: Montana State wide receiver Tanner Bleskin and Eastern Washington safety Jeff Minnerly have been selected to the Capital One Academic All-America Division I Football Team. Bleskin, a junior from Great Falls, Mont., maintains a 3.90 grade point average in Microbiology. The Second Team All-Conference section from C.M. Russell High School leads the Bobcats with 66 catches for 928 yards and four touchdowns. Minnerly, a senior from Spokane, Wash., maintains a 3.78 GPA in Finance & Electrical Engineering. Minnerly has appeared in seven games with 27 tackles and an interception. In 2010, Minnerly was awarded the Prestigious "Elite 88" academic honor at the Division I National Championship Football game.

THREE HONORED BY AFCA: Two Montana State Bobcats and one Eastern Washington Eagle were named to the prestigious American Football Coaches Association FCS All-America Team. The AFCA has selected an All-America team since 1945 and currently selects teams in all five of its divisions. What makes these teams so special is that they are the only ones chosen exclusively by the men who know the players the best — the coaches themselves. Montana State junior quarterback DeNarius McGhee, Montana State senior linebacker Jody Owens, and Eastern Washington senior offensive tackle Will Post were named to the 25-player team. Eastern Washington senior offensive tackle Will Post was also chosen to the team. The 6-foot-6, 315-pound Post is from Portland, Ore., is the 17th AFCA honor won by 16 different players in Eastern history, but he is the first offensive lineman to be recognized since Michael Roos (now with the Tennessee Titans) in 2004.

STANDING-ROOM ONLY: Montana and Montana State both finished the regular season ranked in the top 10 in total and average attendance in the FCS. Montana had 151,417 fans in six home games for an average of 25,236. Those marks were second only to Appalachian State, which had 167,787 fans in six home games for an average of 27,964. Montana State was eighth in total attendance (109,342) and eighth in average attendance (18,224). In attendance by capacity, Montana State was fifth, filling Bobcat Stadium to 119.92 percent of its listed capacity. Montana was 14th at 100.08 percent, and Eastern Washington was 17th at 98.94 percent. Montana drew a Washington-Grizzly Stadium record crowd of 26,210 to Saturday's game against rival Montana State.

MUSTANGS RUSH TO RECORD: Cal Poly set a Big Sky single-season record for rushing yards in a season. Cal Poly finished with 3,890 rushing yards, eclipsing the previous record of 3,477 set by Montana in 1971. The Mustangs also set a single-season record for rush attempts with 753. Montana previously held the single-season record with 728 attempts in 1970. Cal Poly finished the season with 36 rushing touchdowns, three shy of Montana State's record of 39 set in 1966.

BENGALS SET PASSING RECORDS: Idaho State set Big Sky single-season records for pass attempts and pass completions in a season. The Bengals finished with 370 completions on 586 attempts for 3,872 yards. The 586 attempts broke Idaho State's record of 575 set in 2004. The 370 completions broke the mark of 344 set by Cal State Northridge in 1997. Idaho State averaged 33.6 completions per game, also a record. The previous mark was 30.7 completions per game set by the 2011 Bengals. Idaho State senior QB Kevin Yost set individual single-season Big Sky records for completions (349) and attempts (553) in a season. The previous record for completions was 318 set by EWU's Bo Levi Mitchell in 2011. Mitchell held the previous record for attempts with 505 in a 15-game season in 2010. Yost played 22 games at Idaho State. He completed 649 of 1,046 passes for 6,668 yards. He averaged a Big Sky record 29.5 completions per game, breaking the previous record of 23.9 set by Montana's Drew Miller (1999-2000). Yost averaged 303.09 passing yards per game, which ranks fourth in Big Sky history behind Miller, Dave Dickenson and John Friesz. Yost averages 297 yards of total offense per game, which ranks fifth in Big Sky history.

BAUMAN NEARS TOP 10: Northern Arizona junior running back Zach Bauman rushed for 1,182 yards this season, giving him 3,676 career rushing yards with one season to play. Bauman currently ranks 11th on the Big Sky's all-time career rushing list. He needs just 34 yards to crack the top 10. Bauman has rushed for at least 1,000 yards in three straight seasons.

AROUND THE BIG SKY

RUMBLE SIXTH IN CATCHES: Idaho State's Rodrick Rumble finished his career with 223 catches, ranking sixth on the Big Sky's all-time list for career catches. Rumble became ISU's all-time leader in catches in a 40-14 loss to Weber State on Saturday. Rumble caught a single-season Big Sky record 112 passes as a junior in 2011. Rumble finished with 2,863 career receiving yards, an ISU record. He caught 18 TD passes. Rumble finished the season with 74 catches for 1,006 yards despite playing in just nine games.

EAGLES MOVE UP LIST: Eastern Washington senior WR Nicholas Edwards had one catch last week, giving him 214 for his career. Edwards ranks ninth in Big Sky history. Teammate Brandon Kaufman had nine catches last week, giving him 212 for his career, which ranks 10th in Big Sky history. Kaufman had 191 receiving yards last week, giving him 1,635 receiving yards this season. Kaufman now holds the single-season conference record. The previous record was 1,525 set by Weber State's Tim Toone in 2008. Kaufman enters Saturday's game with 84 catches this season, which is tied for 13th in Big Sky single-season history. He needs just three more catches to move into the top 10, and is just 13 catches away from second all-time.

MCGHEE NINTH IN PAYTON VOTING: Montana State junior quarterback DeNarius McGhee finished ninth in voting for the 2012 Walter Payton Award. McGhee, the Big Sky Offensive MVP, earned three first-place votes and 84 total points. Southern Utah quarterback Brad Sorensen was 15th with 24 total points. Cal Poly running back DeOnte Williams was 16th with 22 points, followed by NAU's Zach Bauman with 19 points. Old Dominion quarterback Taylor Heinicke, Wofford fullback Eric Breitenstein and Stony Brook running back Miguel Maysonet are the three finalists, who will be invited to the Awards Ceremony in Philadelphia on Dec. 17. Big Sky Conference players have won seven Walter Payton Awards, including Eastern Washington's Bo Levi Mitchell, who captured the honor in 2011. The Big Sky has several finalists for the Buck Buchanan, Jerry Rice and Eddie Robinson Awards, which will also be presented by The Sports Network on Dec. 17.

COWSER ADDED TO RICE LIST: Southern Utah freshman defensive end James Cowser was added to the Jerry Rice Award Watch List. He replaced teammate Miles Killebrew on the list. Linebacker Zak Browning of Southern Utah is also a candidate for the honor, which goes to the top freshman in the FCS. Cowser recorded 61 total tackles - 13.5 for loss - with 7.5 sacks, five QB hurries, a forced fumble and an interception. EWU QB Vernon Adams, UND WR Jamaar Jackson and Portland State QB Kieran McDonagh are also finalists for the honor.

NO HOMEFIELD ADVANTAGE: Four of the six road teams won on the final weekend of conference play, a fitting end to the 2012 season. Road teams wound up winning 28 of the 52 conference games. Cal Poly and Eastern Washington were the only two teams to finish 4-0 at home. Idaho State was the only team not to win a road conference game. Montana State and Northern Arizona both went 4-0 in road conference games. Cal Poly, Eastern Washington and Southern Utah all went 3-1 in conference road games. Montana went 1-3 in conference home games, marking the first time the Grizzlies have been under .500 in conference home games since the opening of Washington-Grizzly Stadium in 1986.

SEARS STAYING: Weber State announced that Jody Sears, who served as the interim coach this past season, has been named the Wildcats' permanent coach. Sears also announced that Timm Rosenbach will join his staff as the offensive coordinator. Rosenbach served as Montana's offensive coordinator this season. Sears took over for John L. Smith, who left in April to take the interim head coaching position at Arkansas. Smith was hired by Weber State last December.

Extra points: Idaho State allowed a Big Sky single-season record 592 points this season. The previous record was 494 set by the 2008 Bengals...Montana finished with a losing record for the first time since 1985...UC Davis coach Bob Biggs finished his career with an overall record of 144-85-1 in 20 seasons...Northern Colorado closed its season with three straight victories and wins in four of its last five. The Bears finished 4-4 in conference, its best mark since joining the Big Sky in 2006...NC's Dominic Gunn, 2,070 kick return yards, which ranks fifth in Big Sky history...Montana finished with 41 total sacks, second to Harvard's 42.

TIEBREAKER TO DETERMINE AUTOMATIC BID TO PLAYOFFS

When two or more Conference members are tied in the final Conference standings, the tie shall be broken for the purposes of determining the NCAA FCS automatic bid only, and shall be determined on the following basis:

1. Head-to-head competition.
2. Record against common SCHEDULED CONFERENCE opponents in descending order.
3. Record vs. common Conference opponents played as NON-CONFERENCE games in descending order.
4. Record against common NON-CONFERENCE opponents.
5. Sagarin Ratings
6. Coin Flip.

Explanations and Examples

No. 1: This applies to ALL head-to-head games, even those played as non-conference.

No. 2: In the scenario where there is no head-to-head contest to utilize as a tiebreaker, if teams A and B are tied and both play team C in a CONFERENCE game, the results of those games will be used in a tiebreaker. However, if team A plays team C in a CONFERENCE game, but team B plays team C in a non-conference game (i.e., not scheduled by the league), that game WILL NOT BE USED in a tiebreaker

No. 3: If teams A and B both scheduled Conference team C as a non-conference game (i.e. neither game was scheduled by the league), the results of those games can be used as a tiebreaker).

No. 4: If conference teams A and B both scheduled the same non-conference opponent (FBS, FCS, Division II or NAIA), the results of that game could be used in a tiebreaker)

LEAGUE ANNOUNCES 2012 ALL-CONFERENCE FOOTBALL TEAM

OGDEN, Utah (Nov. 20, 2012) - Two Bobcats from Texas were honored as the top football players in the Big Sky Conference on Tuesday as the league released its 2012 All-Conference Team and individual award winners.

Montana State quarterback DeNarius McGhee was named the Offensive Player of the Year for the second time in three seasons. The junior from Euless, Texas, was also named to the All-Conference First Team.

Bobcat linebacker Jody Owens garnered the Defensive Player of the Year. The senior from Mesquite, Texas, was one of two unanimous selections to the All-Conference First Team.

The duo helped Montana State to a share of the Big Sky title for the third straight season. The second-ranked Bobcats will take the No. 2 ranking and the No. 3 seed into the Division I Football Championship.

Southern Utah freshman linebacker Zak Browning was named the Newcomer of the Year. Browning, a true freshman from Vancouver, Wash., leads the Big Sky with 116 total tackles. Browning is a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award, given to the top Freshman in the FCS.

The All-Conference team and individual award winners were selected by the 13 league head coaches Monday. They were not allowed to vote for their own teams.

The First Team featured eight two-time selections, but just two unanimous selections.

Eastern Washington junior wide receiver Brandon Kaufman joined Owens as a unanimous pick.

Montana State led the way with six First Team selections. Eastern Washington, which shared the regular-season title with Montana State and Cal Poly, had five players tabbed to the first team. Northern Arizona and Montana each had four First-Team players.

McGhee, a 6-foot, 210-pound junior, completed 67.5 percent of his passes for 2,726 yards with 22 touchdowns and nine interceptions during the regular season. He guided MSU to a 10-1 overall record. McGhee shared the Offensive Player of the Year honors as a freshman in 2010, when he was also named the First Team quarterback.

Owens, a 6-0, 223-pound senior, tallied 82 tackles with 11 tackles for loss, and four forced fumbles. He led a talented Montana State defense that leads the Big Sky in rushing yards allowed, total yards allowed and points allowed. The Bobcats have been among the national leaders all season in rushing defense, and surrendered just eight rushing touchdowns.

Three of Owens' Bobcat defensive cohorts were also selected to the First Team: Senior defensive end Caleb Schreiber, senior tackle Zach Minter and senior safety Joel Fuller. Schreiber leads the Big Sky in sacks (12), tackles for loss 14.5, and is tied for the national lead with seven forced fumbles. Minter was a repeat First Team selection. Montana State senior center Shaun Sampson was the other Bobcat named to the top squad.

Kaufman, a 6-foot-5 junior from Denver, Colo., led the Eastern Washington contingent. Kaufman was First-Team pick in 2010, but missed most of last season with an injury. Kaufman returned to form, catching 65 passes for a league-high 1,270 yards and 10 touchdowns. EWU senior cornerback T.J. Lee III made the First Team for the second straight season. Senior offensive tackle Will Post, senior kicker Jimmy Pavel and junior linebacker Ronnie Hamlin were the other Eagles named to the First Team.

Cal Poly, which shared the league title in its first season in the Big Sky, and earned an at-large bid to the playoffs had two players named to the First Team: Senior running back Deonte Williams and senior linebacker Kenneth Jackson. Williams, who was named the Big Sky Newcomer of the Year in 2008 when he played at Northern Arizona, led the Big Sky with 1,458 rushing yards. He averaged 6.7 yards per carry and scored 13 touchdowns. Jackson tallied 95 total tackles.

Northern Arizona enjoyed its best season in nearly a decade, and was rewarded with four First-Team picks. Junior running back Zach Bauman earned honors for the second straight season. Bauman rushed for 1,182 yards, his third straight 1000-yard season. Senior fullback Jake Hess, who opened holes for Bauman all season was also named First Team. Cornerback Anders Battle and safety Lucky Dozier were honored from an NAU defense which was tops in the league against the pass and second overall.

Four Montana Grizzlies were named to the First Team, including two on the defensive side of the ball: Junior linebacker Jordan Tripp, sophomore defensive end Zach Wagenmann. Grizzly senior tight end Greg Hardy was honored for the second straight season. Offensive tackle Danny Kistler Jr., also made the squad.

Big Sky newcomers Southern Utah, UC Davis and North Dakota were all represented on the First Team. Southern Utah junior guard Gavin Farr and senior defensive tackle Cody Larsen were honored, along with North Dakota junior wide receiver Greg Hardin, UC Davis senior guard Sean Davies, and Aggie punter Colton Schmidt.

Northern Colorado senior Dominic Gunn was honored as the return specialist and the top special teams player. Gunn returned two punts and one kick for touchdowns. He also made a team-high seven special team tackles.

Idaho State senior wide receiver Rodrick Rumble rounded out the First Team. Rumble garnered the honor for the second straight season after catching 74 passes for 1,006 yards.
