## BIG SKY PLAYOFF FACTS

- ✓ The Big Sky Conference has advanced at least two teams to the playoffs in 28 of the last 30 years. The Big Sky has sent multiple teams to the postseason in 15 straight seasons. This marks the first time that four Big Sky teams have qualified for the FCS postseason.
- ✓ Eastern Washington is making its third playoff appearance in four years, and its ninth overall as a member of the Big Sky Conference. EWU won the 2010 national championship, and advanced to the semifinals in 1997, 2012, and 2013.
- ✓ Eastern Washington is in the semifinals for the third time in four seasons.
- ✓ This marks the eighth time in 10 years a Big Sky team had advanced to the semifinals.
- ✓ Montana was in the playoffs for the 21st time. The Grizzlies' 2011 appearance was vacated due to NCAA violations. Montana advanced to the postseason a record 17 straight seasons from 1993-2009. In 2001, UM won two playoff games and lost one, but those games have been vacated.
- ✓ Southern Utah is was in the playoffs for the first time in school history. The Thunderbirds joined the Big Sky in 2012, and will become 12th team to represent the Big Sky in the FCS playoffs.
- ✓ Northern Arizona has qualified for the postseason for the first time since 2003, and the fourth time in school history. NAU upset No. 1 seed McNeese State in the first round of the 2003 playoffs.
- ✓ The Big Sky is 77-66 all-time in FCS playoffs, a winning percentage of .538.
- ✓ A Big Sky teams has advanced a team to the semifinals five straight seasons if you count Montana's 2011 appearance, which was later vacated. Montana qualified for the national championship game in 2008 and 2009. Eastern Washington won the championship in 2010, and advanced to the 2012 semifinals.
- ✓ Big Sky teams have won six national championships: Boise State (1980), Idaho State (1981), Montana State (1984), Montana (1995, 2001) and Eastern Washington (2010).

## PLAYOFF NOTES

✓ Eastern Washington and North Dakota State are both in the semifinals for the second straight season. NDSU is making its third straight semifinal appearance, while EWU is in the final four for the third time in four years. Towson and New Hampshire, both of CAA Football, are in the semifinals for the first time.

✓ Fargo, N.D., and Cheney, Wash., are both playing host to the semifinals for the second straight season. This is the first time in history both semifinal sites are the same in back-to-back years. Last year, North Dakota State beat Georgia Southern at home in the Friday night game. Sam Houston State won at Eastern Washington in the Saturday game. NDSU plays host to New Hampshire on Friday. Eastern Washington plays host to Towson on Saturday.

✓ The semifinal features the winners of the past three national championships. Eastern Washington won the 2010 championship in Frisco, Texas. North Dakota State has won back-to-back championships in Frisco, Texas.

✓ If Eastern Washington wins on Saturday against Towson, the Big Sky will advance a team to the championship for the fourth time in six years. Montana made the championship game in 2008 and 2009, followed by Eastern Washington in 2010.

✓ North Dakota State has won 10 consecutive playoff games dating back to a 2010 quarterfinal loss at Eastern Washington.

✓ North Dakota State enters Friday's game seeking its 23rd straight overall victory. The FCS all-time record is 24 wins, tied by Montana and Penn. Montana won its final 14 games of the 2001 season, and then won 10 straight to start the 2012 season.

✓ Eastern Washington enters Saturday's game with a 10-game winning streak. It is the second-longest active streak in FCS, behind North Dakota State's 22-game streak. New Hampshire has won six straight, while Towson has four in a row.

✓ A Big Sky team is hosting a semifinal for the 18th time. Big Sky teams are 12-5 in home semifinal games. EWU is 1-2 in those contests.

✓ Towson's Terrance West rushed for 354 yards in the Tigers' quarterfinal upset of second-seeded Eastern Illinois. West has 420 rushing yards and eight rushing touchdowns in two playoff games this season.

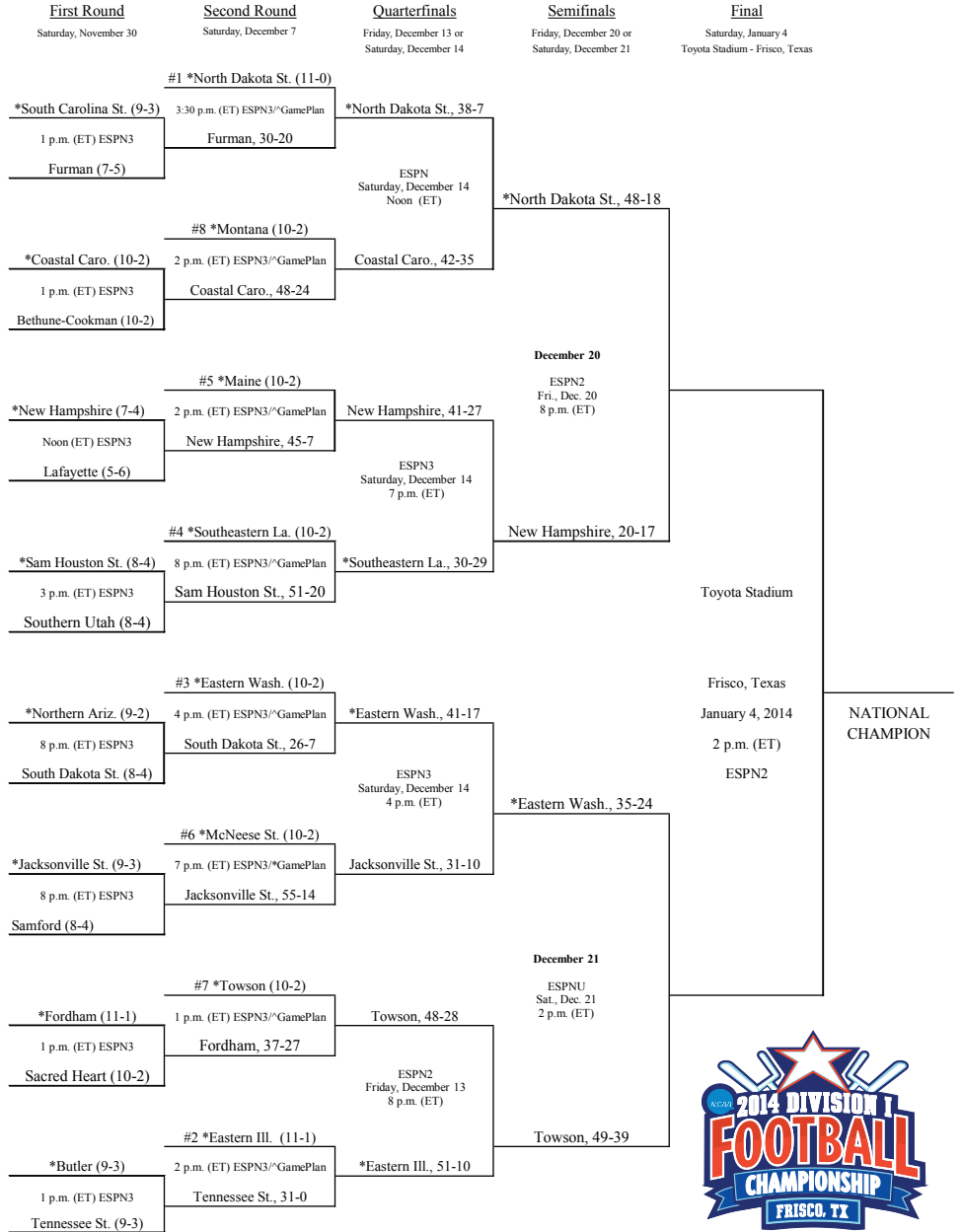

## NAU, SUU Ousted in First Round

Northern Arizona and Southern Utah both lost games in the first round of the NCAA Division I Football Championship on Saturday.

South Dakota State senior running back Zach Zenner rushed for 249 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Jackrabbits to a 26-7 win over Northern Arizona in Flagstaff.

Northern Arizona was without head football coach Jerome Souers, who was hospitalized after experiencing complications following a routine procedure earlier this week. NAU was making its first playoff appearance since 2003. NAU finished the season 9-3. Defensive coordinator Andy Thompson served as the Lumberjacks' acting head coach.

Southern Utah's first appearance in the Division I playoffs ended with a 51-20 loss to Sam Houston State. The Bearkats of the Southland Conference have beaten six straight Big Sky teams in the playoffs since 2011. SUU finished the season 8-5.

**Sam Houston State 51, Southern Utah 20:** Senior Tim Flanders rushed for 152 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Bearkats to the win.

Southern Utah jumped out to a 10-0 lead thanks to a 42-yard field goal by Colton Cook, and a 38-yard TD pass from Aaron Cantu to Antony Phillips.

Sam Houston responded with 30 consecutive points. Bearkat QB Brian Bell completed 15-of-21 passes for 176 yards and a touchdown, and also rushed for two scores.

"You've got to give Sam Houston State credit," SUU Coach Ed Lamb said. "I thought we started out well on defense but they just kept pecking away. Their coaching staff and players kept pecking away. They found a way to run the ball on our defense and that's taking it right at our strength, so give them a ton of credit offensively and defensively for slowing us down.

"We had a couple of chances there to get back in the game, get ag-

gressive on offense, and we just kept stalling out in the red zone," Lamb added. "I'm extremely proud of our players, there's no shame in losing, especially to a great team like Sam Houston. The only shame would be to do it without class, to quit trying and our guys continued to try, continued to fight the whole game in a classy way."

Southern Utah closed within 30-20 late in the third quarter when defensive end James Cowser sacked Bell, who fumbled. Robert Torgerson returned the fumble 39 yards for a touchdown.

Flanders scored on a 2-yard run on the opening play of the fourth quarter to put Sam Houston ahead 37-20.

Cantu completed 28-of-43 passes for 270 yards and a touchdown. The Thunderbirds were held to 47 rushing yards.

**South Dakota State 26, Northern Arizona 7:** Northern Arizona could not contain Zenner, the Walter Payton Award candidate. He broke off an 87-yard touchdown run in the second quarter to tie the game 7-7.

Northern Arizona senior All-American Zach Bauman rushed for 101 yards and scored on a 6-yard run in the second quarter in his final collegiate game. He finished career third on the Big Sky's all-time rushing list.

Starting QB Kyren Poe completed 16-of-27 passes for 216 yards, but was intercepted three times. He sustained an injury one of his interceptions. Chase Cartwright entered the game, completing 2-of-5 passes. Poe came back in the fourth quarter after Cartwright sustained an ankle injury.

South Dakota State's defensive line took over in the second half. The Jackrabbits tallied seven sacks, and NAU finished with just 53 rushing yards.

South Dakota State rushed for 343 yards and had 399 yards of total offense. Northern Arizona converted just 1-of-13 third downs.

## **SECOND ROUND RECAPS**

### **Eastern Washington 41, South Dakota State 17**

It wasn't easy in 13-degree weather, but Walter Payton Award finalist Vernon Adams and running back Quincy Forte found a way.

Adams had five touchdown passes and 244 yards of total offense, and Forte rushed for 202 and a score, as the third-seeded and No. 3 ranked Eastern Washington University football team beat 13th-ranked South Dakota State 41-17 Saturday (Dec. 7) at Roos Field in Cheney, Wash., in the second round of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs.

The Jackrabbits finished 9-5 on the season after finishing 5-3 in a four-way tie for second in the Missouri Valley Football Conference behind two-time defending FCS Champion North Dakota State (8-0).

Forte had the 25th performance in school history with 200 rushing yards or more, and shattered his previous career high of 123 set earlier this season. His performance was the best by an Eagle since Taiwan Jones had 230 versus North Dakota State in the 2010 FCS Playoffs.

Adams had a season-low 12 completions and his second-fewest attempts with 22, but TD passes of 69 and 40 yards helped him to a 217-yard passing game, to go along with 27 on the ground. He now has 51 touchdown passes this season to move into a tie with Jimmy Garoppolo of Eastern Illinois for third all-time in FCS history, just five from the record.

Freshman Cooper Kupp had four catches for 90 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He broke the school record with 20 TD catches for the season, (19 shared by Nicholas Edwards, 2011, and Eric Kimble, 2004) and broke the FCS record for most touchdowns by a freshman (Moss with 19 in 1996). He also tied the Big Sky record of 20 TD catches set originally by Ed Bell of Idaho State in 1969.

Now with 81 receptions, Cooper Kupp has tied the FCS record for receptions by a freshman (81, Sean Price, Appalachian State, 2012). He is currently sixth in school history, and is just two from fifth and four from fourth. The school record is 95 set by Nicholas Edwards in 2011.

With a touchdown reception in all 13 of the games he has played in his EWU career, one game earlier he broke the record of 11 consecutive games with a TD catch previously held by Randy Moss from Marshall in 1996 and Cal Poly's Ramses Barden in 2008.

Eastern finished with 504 yards of offense for EWU's seventh performance of 500 or more yards. Now with 526 points this season, EWU broke the school record of 488 set in 2004. The Big Sky record is 537 points set by Montana in 2009.

Defensively, Eastern held SDSU 2,000-yard rusher Zach Zenner to 71 yards and a single touchdown on 21 carries. Buck Buchanan Award candidate Ronnie Hamlin led the Eagles with 13 tackles for the 15th performance of his career of 10 or more tackles. Safety Todd Raynes added seven tackles, a forced fumble and two passes broken up.

### **Coastal Carolina 42, Montana 35**

Sophomore quarterback Alex Ross passed for three touchdowns and rushed for a game-high 123 yards to lead the 11th-ranked Coastal Carolina Chanticleers to a 42-35 win over the 4th-ranked University of Montana Grizzlies Saturday afternoon in a FCS second-round game in UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium.

As they have done all season long, the Grizzlies (10-3) battled back from a multi-touchdown deficit, but they couldn't make another last-quarter comeback in their loss to CCU, a team that defeated visiting Bethune-Cookman 48-24 last Saturday in a first-round playoff game.

Coastal (12-2), the regular-season winner of the Big South Conference, took a three-touchdown (42-21) lead with 9:33 left in the third quarter on a 51-yard scoring run by senior halfback Lorenzo Taliaferro on a quick, four-play drive that went 76 yards and took just 1:38.

But, the comeback minded Griz started chipping away, and cut the Chanticleers' lead to 42-28 on a 9-yard scoring pass from junior quarterback Jordan Johnson to junior wide receiver Mitch Saylor with 8:43 left in the game.

Montana had a chance to cut into Coastal's lead even more when senior linebacker Brock Coyle sacked Ross and forced and recovered the ball, and the Griz took over on CCU's 29-yard line. Ross' fumble was CCU's only turnover in the game.

However, the Grizzlies' drive sputtered after Coyle's big play, and it ended with an interception of Johnson pass by CCU junior linebacker Quinn Backus. It was only Johnson's fifth interception of the season.

The Grizzlies, from the Big Sky Conference, finally got the big play that they needed late on the contest. On that key play, Johnson hit sophomore wide receiver Jamaal Jones for a 72-yard touchdown pass, reducing the CCU lead to score 42-35 with 5:03 remaining to play.

However, Coastal retained the ball for the final 5:01 of the game and picked up a couple of critical first downs along the way to earn the right to advance to the final eight games in the 24-team 2013 FCS playoffs.

The Griz had an impressive opening series, as the "D" held CCU to a three-and-out, and then drove 84 yards on six plays, as junior halfback Travon Van scored on a 1-yard run, giving UM a 7-0 lead with 11:18 left in the first stanza.

The Chanticleers wasted no time, though, as Ross connected with senior wide receiver Demario Bennett for a CCU-record 86-yard scoring pass to tie the game at 7-7 with 9:51 left in the first stanza.

The Griz got the lead back on their next series, as Johnson hit sophomore wide receiver Chase Naccarato on a 15-yard TD pass, which gave Montana a 14-7 edge with 5:16 left in the first quarter. It would prove to be Montana's final lead of the game.

The game was played in bitter cold day at Washington-Grizzly Stadium, as it was -5 degrees at kickoff, although 17,345 mostly Griz Faithful fans braved the frigid weather.

## QUARTERFINAL RECAP

### **Eastern Washington 35, Jacksonville State 24**

CHENEY, Wash. - Try as they might, the offense couldn't give the Eagles a two-score lead in the second half. But the defense did.

With true freshman Albert Havili providing the decisive blow with a 77-yard interception return for a touchdown, third-seeded and No. 3 ranked Eastern Washington University defeated Jacksonville State 35-24 Saturday (Dec. 14) in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision Playoffs at Roos Field in Cheney, Wash.

The Eagles rolled up 545 yards of offense and gave up 528 against the Gamecocks from the Ohio Valley Conference. However, Eastern's defense was dominating in the second half for the second-straight week -- EWU has not given up a second-half touchdown while out-scoring opponents 41-6 after intermission in those two playoff victories.

"I want to congratulate our players," said Eastern head coach Beau Baldwin. "Every game, especially in December, is going to have a different feel to it. We talk about that a lot in team meetings. There might be games that are smooth and rhythmic. There might be other games that are defensive battles. We consistently are able to make adjustments and find ways to win in whatever ball game it is. To do that is tougher than you might think."

Towson upset second-seeded and No. 2 ranked Eastern Illinois 49-39 on Friday night. The seventh-seeded and fifth-ranked Tigers were led by Walter Payton Award finalist Terrance West, who rushed for a FCS playoff record 354 yards with five touchdowns. The Tigers are now 12-2 and finished 6-2 in the Colonial Conference. It will be EWU's first-ever meeting with Towson, and EWU is 2-0 against the Colonial.

The semifinal winners advance to the NCAA Division I Championship Game on Saturday, Jan. 4 at 11 a.m. Pacific time at Toyota Stadium in Frisco, Texas.

"I am really proud of our guys to keep fighting," said Baldwin, whose team knocked off South Dakota State 41-17 last week in Cheney. "We found different ways to win this game than we did a week ago. Who knows what kind of game we will be in next week, but we know it will be against a very good opponent. We are happy to get one more shot at home with next week's ball game."

Eastern enjoyed another offensive explosion in the win over JSU, with the Eagles setting Big Sky Conference records for single season scoring (561) and passing offense (4,853), with Walter Payton Award finalist Vernon Adams breaking the league record for passing yards (4,600).

The Eagles only gave up just two sacks against a team that featured the sixth-best pass defense in FCS and ranked fourth in quarterback sacks with a total of 50. The Eagles average more than 500 yards of total offense per game with the nation's fourth-best passing attack.

Eastern is now 12-2 and owns a 10-game winning streak, having not lost since Sept. 28. Jacksonville State ended its season at 11-4.

Adams finished 18-of-29 for 324 yards and had his 52nd and 53rd TD passes for the season, which are now tied for the third-most in FCS history.

Senior Ashton Clark had a career-high 181 yards receiving on 11 catches, which equal the 12th-most in school history. Freshman redshirt Cooper Kupp added four catches for 99 yards, as both he and Clark caught touchdown passes from Adams.

Kupp now has 21 TD catches to rank fourth in FCS history, and owns sole possession of the 45-year-old Big Sky record he tied a week ago (20, Ed Bell, Idaho State, 1969). He has now had a touchdown reception in all 14 of the games he has played in his EWU career, having broken the FCS record of 11 consecutive games.

Running back Quincy Forte, who had 202 yards in EWU's second-round win over South Dakota State, had 190 on 24 carries with a pair of touchdowns versus JSU.

Linebacker Ronnie Hamlin, who injured his shoulder in the first half and wasn't expected back, started the second half and finished with the second-most tackles in his career with 15. With 16 performances in his career with at least 10 tackles, he now has 350 tackles in his career to move into fourth in school history, and his 129 tackles this season is currently ninth.

Senior cornerback T.J. Lee III added 12 tackles, broke-up a pass and had a quarterback hurry. Linebacker Cody McCarthy was the third Eagle in double figure tackles with 11.

The first half resembled a track meet with the two teams combining for 649 yards of offense. Eastern had 337 yards on just 29 plays, but two turnovers in the JSU red zone cost the Eagles dearly. Jacksonville State had 312 yards on 50 plays.

The Gamecocks were 8-of-11 on third down, while the Eagles were so good on first and second down that they had just one third down conversion attempt, and they converted it.

# MSU's Daly Wins Buchanan Award

Montana State's Brad Daly was named the winner of the 2013 Buck Buchanan Award on Monday by The Sports Network.

Daly, a senior from Helena, Mont., became the second straight Montana State Bobcat to win the Buck Buchanan Award, given annually since 1995 to the nation's top defensive player.

Daly, a 6-foot-1, 240-pounder, was named the Co-Defensive Big Sky MVP after leading the nation in sacks with 14 and tying for the national lead with 20.5 tackles for loss. Daly follows former teammate Caleb Schreibeis as a Buchanan winner. Schreibeis, also a defensive end, captured the award in 2012.

"This is a great honor," Daly said. "I definitely wasn't happy with how the season went for our team, but I couldn't have done anything I did without all the guys on our defense. It was a fun season individually, and it was a fun season with my teammates, hanging out with the guys on the team in the locker room and on trips. Those are my best memories."

Daly earned 64 first-place votes from the panel of 147 sports information directors, writers, broadcasters and other dignitaries from across the nation. He received 485 total points. James Madison's Stephon Robertson was second with 43 first-place votes and 421 total points.

Daly tallied 68 total tackles. He also had an interception, two forced fumbles, two blocked kicks, a fumble recovery and seven quarterback hurries.

"Brad Daly was the heart and soul of our defense this year," said Montana State coach Rob Ash. "To watch how hard he worked and see how much this program means to him was very inspiring for me, and I think for everyone on



the team. Bobcat football is part of who he is, and when you combine that with a high level of talent and an incredible work ethic you get a season like the one Brad had. We always say that when you play for the team the individual accolades follow, and just like Caleb Schreibeis did in 2012 Brad proved that this year. He deserves all the awards and honors and good things that come his way."

Daly is the sixth Big Sky player since 2003 to win the Buchanan. Current Minnesota Viking Jared Allen claimed the Buchanan in 2003. He was followed by Montana's Kroy Biermann (Atlanta Falcons) in 2007, Eastern Washington's Greg Peach (Winnipeg Blue Bombers) in 2008, Eastern Washington's J.C. Sherritt (Edmonton Eskimos) in 2010,

# EWU WR Kupp Wins Jerry Rice Award

Eastern Washington wide receiver Cooper Kupp claimed the Jerry Rice Award, presented annually by The Sports Network to the nation's top FCS freshman.

Kupp, a 6-foot-2, 195-pounder from Yakima, Wash., became the first Big Sky Conference player to win the Rice, which has been awarded since 2011.

Kupp has enjoyed a record-setting freshman campaign for the Eagles, setting FCS freshman records for catches, yards and touchdowns. He was a unanimous All-Big Sky selection, becoming the first freshman wide receiver in league history to earn First Team honors. He also won the league's first ever Freshman of the Year honor.

"It's been a special season," said Eastern Washington coach Beau Baldwin. "He is one of those young men that came here with talent. There is no doubt about that. In most years he would have played as a true freshman, but because we had (Greg) Herd, (Nicholas) Edwards and (Brandon) Kaufman, we decided he would be able to redshirt. He took that redshirt year and took his talents to a new level. He's been doing that all his life."

The phenom won the award by the largest margin in its history. He earned 80 first-place votes and 557 total points. Appalachian State running back Marcus Cox was second with 259



points. A total of 147 sports information directors, broadcasters, writers and other dignitaries from across the nation voted.

Kupp burst onto the scene in his first game, a 49-46 upset of No. 25 Oregon State of the Pac-12. Kupp caught five passes for 119 yards and two touchdowns.

He finished the regular season with 77 catches for 1,378 yards and 18 touchdowns. He caught a TD pass in all 12 regular-season games.

Kupp has added to those totals in two playoff games. He enters Saturday's semifinal against Towson with 85 catches for 1,567 yards and 21 touchdowns. All three totals are FCS freshman records. His 21 touchdowns are a Big Sky single-season record. Randy Moss held the previous freshman record for touchdowns in a season by a freshman with 19 at

Marshall in 1996.

Kupp has caught at least one touchdown pass in all 14 games, an FCS all-time record. The previous record was 11 straight games by Moss in 1996 and Ramses Barden of Cal Poly in 2008. Kupp's 1,567 receiving yards rank second in Big Sky single-season history behind Kaufman, who registered 1,850 yards last season. His 85 receptions are tied for 12th in league single-season history, and he can move into the top 10 with just two more receptions.

## Adams Second In Payton Race

Most years, the numbers Eastern Washington quarterback Vernon Adams would have been enough to garner the prestigious Walter Payton Award.

Thankfully, the sophomore has two more years to try and replicate his 2013 campaign, and potentially bring home the Eagles' third Payton.

Adams was one of three finalists for the honor, which went to Eastern Illinois senior quarterback Jimmy Garoppolo on Monday night (Dec. 16) in Philadelphia at The Sports Network Annual FCS Banquet.

Adams finished second to Garoppolo in voting. Towson running back Terrance West was third. A total of 147 sports information directors, writers, broadcasters, and other dignitaries from across the nation voted.

Garoppolo finished his season last Friday with a loss to Towson in the quarterfinals. The senior threw for 53 touchdown passes and 5,050 yards this season.

The 6-foot, 190-pound Adams opened his season with an eye-opening performance in the Eagles' 49-46 upset of No. 25 Oregon State of the Pac-12. Adams completed 23-of-30 passes for 411 yards with four touchdowns and zero interceptions. He also rushed 16 times for 107 yards and scored two touchdowns.

The Pasadena, Calif., native never really slowed down. He'll enter Saturday's semifinal with 4,600 passing yards, 53 passing touchdowns, and 5,140 yards of total offense. All three are Big Sky single-season records. He is tied with Garoppolo for the national lead in touchdown passes, and ranks second in the average yards per game in total



offense.

Adams was named the Big Sky Offensive MVP, and a unanimous selection to the All-Conference First team at quarterback. He finished the regular season leading the nation in pass efficiency (185.7), total offense (379.2 yards per game). During the regular season, he passed for 4,059 yards and 46 touchdowns, and amassed 4,550 yards of total offense.

Adams has thrown at least two touchdown passes in all 14 games. He tied the school record with six touchdown passes in a win over Montana. Adams also threw six touchdown passes in a 45-42 loss to Sam Houston State in the 2012 semifinals.

Adams was looking to become the eighth Big Sky Player to win the Payton. EWU QB Bo Levi Mitchell won the honor in 2011, and fellow Eagle QB Erick Meyer won it in 2005. Northern Arizona running back Archie Amerson was the 1996 winner. Idaho QB John Friesz was the first Big Sky winner, capturing it in 1989. Weber State QB Jamie Martin followed in 1991, and Idaho QB Doug Nussmeier won it in 1993. Montana QB Dave Dickenson won the Payton in 1995.

## Baldwin, Lamb Top 10 in Robinson Voting

Eastern Washington's Beau Baldwin finished sixth, and Southern Utah's Ed Lamb finished 10th in voting for the Eddie Robinson Award.

North Dakota State's Craig Bohl won the honor for the second straight season, The Sports Network announced Monday morning.

Bohl, who has accepted the head coaching job at Wyoming, has led NDSU to back-to-back national championships. The Bison are 13-0 and ranked No. 1 heading into this week's semifinal game against New Hampshire. NDSU has won 22 straight games.

Bohl is the first back-to-back winner of the award, and joins former James Madison coach Mickey Matthews as the

only two-time winner of the award.

Baldwin, in his sixth season at Eastern Washington, earned seven first-place votes and 146 total points. Baldwin guided the Eagles to an 8-0 Big Sky season, earning the Big Sky Coach of the Year honor for the second straight season. The Eagles (12-2) play host to Towson in a national semifinal.

Lamb, in his sixth season at Southern Utah, led the Thunderbirds to their first ever playoff appearance. The Thunderbirds finished 8-3 in the regular season, and earned an at-large bid to the FCS playoffs. SUU's eight victories tied the school record for wins. He received one first-place vote and 67 total points.

**THE RECORDS:** Eastern Washington brings a 12-2 overall record into the semifinals. The Eagles won the Big Sky Championship with an 8-0 overall record. EWU has won 10 straight games since suffering back-to-back road losses to FBS Toledo and Sam Houston State. Eastern Washington finished the regular season ranked third in both major FCS polls, and also earned the No. 3 overall playoff seed...Towson brings a 12-2 record to Cheney for the semifinals. Baldwin was named the league Coach of the Year last week, marking the second straight season he has claimed the honor. Baldwin has led EWU to the playoffs four times (2009, 2010, 2012 and 2013). Baldwin owns a 8-2 playoff record, including the 2010 national championship, and a semifinal appearance in 2012. Baldwin went 10-3 in 2007 as the head coach at Central Washington, giving him an overall record of 66-24...Towson's Rob Ambrose is in his fifth season. He has compiled a 31-28 overall record. Ambrose led the Tigers to their only two Division I postseason appearances in 2011 and 2013. He was named the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year for the 2011 season. Ambrose, a Towson graduate, spent nine years at his alma mater as an assistant coach before spending one season as the head coach at Catholic University, where he went 3-7. He then spent nine seasons at UConn as an assistant coach.

**COMMON OPPONENTS:** The teams do not have any common opponents this season.

**EAGLES IN THE SEMIFINALS:** Eastern Washington is making its fourth appearance in the national semifinals. The Eagles are 1-2 in semifinal games. In 1997, Eastern Washington lost to Youngstown State in a home game at Joe Albi Stadium in Spokane, Wash. In 2010, the Eagles beat Villanova of the CAA at Roos Field. In 2012, EWU lost to Sam Houston State at Roos Field 45-42.

**TOWSON IN THE SEMIFINALS:** This is Towson's first appearance in the Division I Semifinals. Towson played in the 1976 Division III semifinals, beating St. Lawrence 38-36. Towson made three Division II playoff appearances in 1983, 1984, and 1986, but did not advance to the semis.

**BIG SKY VS. THE CAA:** Teams from the Big Sky Conference and the CAA have not met head-to-head on the field this season. The conferences have split 12 playoff meetings dating back to 2000. EWU is 2-0 vs. CAA teams in the playoffs, with a 2010 semifinal win over Villanova and a 20-19 win over Delaware in the 2010 national championship game. Big Sky teams have won three straight over CAA teams in the postseason...Big Sky teams are 4-1 vs. CAA teams in Big Sky stadiums. CAA teams beat Big Sky teams in the 2004, 2008 and 2009 national championship games in Chattanooga, Tenn.

**NOTES:** EWU is 24-3 on the red turf since it was installed in 2010. EWU is 7-0 at home this season...Sam Houston State is the only non-Big Sky team to win at Roos Field since 2010...EWU is 19-1 since 2010 in games after Nov. 1...EWU is 11-0 when it leads or is tied at halftime...During its nine-game winning streak...Towson is 8-0 on the road this season, and has won 11 straight on the road dating back to last season...The game features a matchup of Walter Payton Award Finalists in EWU QB Vernon Adams and Towson RB Terrance West...West won the Jerry Rice Award in 2011...EWU's Cooper Kupp won the Jerry Rice on Monday... EWU has out-scored opponents 41-6 in the second half in two playoff games...EWU is the second team in Big Sky history to have a 4,000-yard passer (Adams), a 1,000-yard rusher (Quincy Forte) and two 1,000-yard receivers (Kupp and Ashton Clark). Weber State was the first team to accomplish the feat in 1991...Adams enters the game with 53 TD passes, three shy of the single-season FCS record...Towson's Terrance West has rushed for 2,295 yards with a national-high 38 rushing touchdowns...Towson QB Peter Athens completes 64 percent of his passes. He's thrown for 3,050 yards with 17 touchdowns and 12 interceptions...Towson has lost 19 fumbles this season...The Tigers are 4-2 against ranked teams...Kupp has caught a TD pass in all 14 games for the Eagles, and leads the nation with 21 receiving touchdowns...Quincy Forte has rushed for 392 yards on 45 carries with three touchdowns in two playoff games. He's averaging 8.7 yards per carry...EWU is outscoring 162-53 in the third quarter this season, and 113-9 in the third quarter of its last seven games...Towson LB Telvion Clark has 131 total tackles - 10.5 for loss - five forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries...Towson is +2 in turnover margin. EWU is also +2 in turnover margin...EWU LB Ronnie Hamlin has 129 total tackles...CB TJ Lee III has 105 total tackles, four forced fumbles, and four fumble recoveries...EWU's 561 points are a Big Sky single-season record...Towson is the fourth team currently in the top 10 in the nation in rushing yards per game that EWU has faced. EWU beat Cal Poly (1), Portland State (3) and lost to Sam Houston State (6).

## EWU's Baldwin Named Coach of the Year

For the second straight season, Eastern Washington's Beau Baldwin has been selected by his peers as the Big Sky Conference football Coach of the Year.

Baldwin guided Eastern Washington to an 8-0 conference record and a 10-2 regular season. The Eagles won the outright Big Sky Championship, becoming the first team other than Montana to finish perfect in league play since Nevada in 1991.

The Eagles beat South Dakota State 41-17 in the second round of the FCS playoffs, and beat Jacksonville State in the quarterfinals. EWU plays host to Towson on Saturday in the semifinals.

"I am humbled very much," said Baldwin. "Especially in the sport of football, a coach of the year award is more accurately stated as a coaching staff of the year award. So much of it is because of what the assistant coaches do every year. I'm lucky to not only have great football guys, but great teachers and men on this staff. This type of award is a tribute to them. And no staff ever wins a coach of the year award without talented players, great leadership and outstanding character in the locker room. Our players exemplify that."

Baldwin and the Eagles opened the season with a bang, stunning No. 25 Oregon State of the Pac-12 49-46, becoming just the fourth FCS team ever to upset a ranked FBS opponent. The Eagles suffered back-to-back losses on the road to FBS Toledo and national FCS power Sam Houston State, but rebounded to win their final eight games of the regular season.

Eastern Washington's high-powered offense was led by sophomore quarterback Vernon Adams, who was named the Big Sky Offensive MVP on Monday. The Walter Payton Award candidate leads the nation in passing efficiency and total offense, and set a Big Sky single-season record with 46 touchdown passes. Redshirt freshman wide receiver Cooper Kupp was named the Freshman of the Year, and is a leading candidate to win the Jerry Rice Award as the nation's top freshman.

The Eagles rank in the top-10 nationally in scoring offense, total offense, and passing offense.

Eastern Washington's Big Sky championship was the third in four seasons under Baldwin. Over that span, EWU has compiled a 27-5 conference record.



Baldwin led EWU to the 2010 National Championship, and a semifinal appearance in 2012.

In six seasons at EWU, Baldwin has compiled a 56-21 record, and a 38-10 mark in conference play. Baldwin's Coach of the Year is the seventh for an Eastern Washington Coach. Dick Zornes won the honor in 1992, followed by Mike Kramer in 1997. Paul Wulff was honored in 2001, 2004 and 2005.

Baldwin is a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year, which is presented annually by the Sports Network.

Baldwin's Eagles became the first team since Montana in 2009 to go undefeated in league play, and did so in a season when the league sent a record four teams to the playoffs.

"I also want to recognize and congratulate the other great coaches in the conference who work so hard," Baldwin said. "It's such a grind week-in and week-out in this great Big Sky Conference. I specifically want to congratulate coach (Jerome) Souers, coach (Mick) Delaney and coach (Ed) Lamb for the hard work they and their staffs put in to earn the right to play more football in the playoffs. Any of those coaches and their staffs could have won this award and it would have been just as deserving as our staff. I wish them luck as we all get the opportunity to continue our seasons."

Baldwin is assisted by John Graham (Associate Head Coach/Defensive Coordinator), Aaron Best (Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line), Jeff Schmeddling (Safeties/Special Teams Coordinator), Ryan Sawyer (Defensive Line/Recruiting Coordinator), Junior Adams (Wide Receivers), Zak Hill (Quarterbacks), Josh Fetter (Linebackers), Brian Strandley (Tight Ends), Cherokee Valeria (Cornerbacks), and Kiel McDonald (Running Backs).

## **AROUND THE BIG SKY**

**The 4-1-1-1:** Eastern Washington became the second team in league history to have a 4,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard rusher, and two 1,000-yard receivers. Running back Quincy Forte surpassed 1,000 yards in the quarterfinal win over Jacksonville State, while receiver Ashton Clark surpassed 1,000 receiving yards. Entering Saturday's semifinal against Towson, QB Vernon Adams has 4,600 passing yards. Forte has 1,131 rushing yards. Freshman Cooper Kupp has 1,567 receiving yards, and Clark has 1,104. Weber State's 1991 team was the first to accomplish the feat. That year, Jamie Martin threw for 4,125 yards. Geoff Mitchell rushed for 1,170. Alfred Pupunu tallied 1,204 receiving yards, and Dave Hall had 1,043. In 2005, Eastern Washington had a 4,000-yard passer in Erik Meyer and two 1,000-yard receivers in Eric Kimble and Raul Vigil. EWU also had a 4,000-yard passer and two 1,000-yard receivers in 2011 when Bo Levi Mitchell threw for 4,009 yards, and Nicholas Edwards and Greg Herd surpassed 1,000-receiving yards. In 2008, Weber State had a 4,000-yard passer (Cameron Higgins), a 1,000-yard rusher (Trevyn Smith), and a 1,000-yard receiver (Tim Toone). In 1989, Idaho had a 4,000-yard passer (John Friesz) and two 1,000-yard receivers.

**FOUR SKY PLAYERS EARN ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA HONORS:** Four Big Sky Players were named to the prestigious Capital One Academic All-America Football team. The squad includes players from the FBS and the FBC level. Montana State wide receiver Tanner Bleskin and Northern Arizona linebacker Austin Hasquet earned First Team honors. Southern Utah kicker Colton Cook, and Thunderbird defensive end James Cowser were selected to the second team. Hasquet, a junior from Peoria, Ariz., maintains a 3.95 grade point average in biomedical science. Bleskin, a senior from Great Falls, Mont., had a 3.85 GPA in microbiology. Bleskin was named to the team for the second straight season. Cowser, a sophomore from Fruit Heights, Utah, has a 3.99 GPA in psychology. Cook, a graduate student from Centerville, Utah, has a 3.66 GPA in business administration.

**DALY A FINALIST FOR HENDRICKS AWARD:** Montana State senior Brad Daly was tapped as one of six finalists for the 2013 Hendricks Award, presented to college football's top defensive end. Daly is the only finalist from an FCS school, and in fact is the first FCS player to make it this far in the process in at least the past three seasons. He joins Vic Beasley from Clemson, Shilique Calhoun from Michigan State, Jackson Jeffcoat from Texas, Michael Sam from Missouri, and Marchus Smith from Louisville. A 6-1, 240 lb senior from Helena, Daly currently leads all of NCAA Division I football with 14 sacks. His 1.2 per game is tied for the most in the FCS, and his 20.5 tackles-for-loss this season is tied for the most in the FCS. Daly was named Big Sky Defensive Co-Player of the Year last week, along with First Team All-Big Sky. He finished his career with 45.5 tackles-for-loss, tied for eighth in Bobcat history, and 34 sacks, the fourth-best total by a Bobcat.

**WEBER STATE NAMES NEW COACH:** Weber State University has named Jay Hill its new head football coach. Hill, a longtime assistant coach at the University of Utah, becomes the 11th head coach in Weber State football history. He comes to WSU with a reputation as one of the top recruiters in the West and has spent time working for three different head coaches at Utah. Hill, 38, has spent the last 12 years at Utah, including the last eight seasons as a full-time assistant coach under Kyle Whittingham. Prior to that, he spent four years as a graduate assistant and administrative assistant with the Utes under legendary coaches Ron McBride and Urban Meyer.

**BAUMAN, TRIPP TO PLAY IN SHRINE GAME:** Northern Arizona running back Zach Bauman and Montana linebacker Jordan Tripp have been selected to play in the annual East-West Shrine Bowl. Bauman recently completed his career third on the Big Sky Conference's all-time rushing list. He was named First Team All-Conference three times. Tripp was a two-time All-Big Sky selection. The 89th Shrine Game will be played Jan. 18 in St. Petersburg, Fla. Kickoff is at 2 p.m. Mountain, and the game will be televised live on the NFL Network.



# BIG SKY FOOTBALL - SEMIFINALS

## AROUND THE BIG SKY

**BAUMAN ENDS CAREER WITH 100-YARD GAME:** Northern Arizona's Zach Bauman closed his illustrious career with the 25th 100-yard rushing game of his career, gaining 101 in the playoff loss to South Dakota State. Bauman scored the only touchdown and in the process became the school's all-time leading scorer with 310 points. The three-time First Team All-Big Sky selection finished his career with 5,132 career rushing yards. Only Sacramento State's Charles Roberts (6,553) and Portland State's Charles Dunn (6,007) have more rushing yards in league history. Bauman averaged 114.04 rushing yards per game, which ranks sixth in league history. He rushed for at least 1,059 yards in each of his four years. Bauman finished with a career-high 1,456 yards this season. The Walter Payton Award candidate also amassed 6,316 all-purpose yards in his career, which ranks sixth all-time in conference history. His average of 140.36 all-purpose yards per game ranks 13th in league history.

**MCGHEE CAPS CAREER:** Montana State four-year starter DeNarius McGhee capped his career with a 28-14 loss to Montana last Saturday. The two-time Big Sky MVP finished his illustrious career with 11,203 career passing yards, which ranks fifth in Big Sky history. McGhee amassed 12,336 yards of total offense which ranks second in league history. McGhee passed Travis Lulay as Montana State's all-time leader, and also moved past Weber State's Cameron Higgins and Weber State's Jamie Martin on the league all-time list. EWU's Matt Nichols is the all-time leader with 13,308. McGhee led Montana State to three Big Sky Championships, and three playoff appearances. He finished his career 36-12 as MSU's starting QB, and was 26-6 in conference games.

**ARIAS SETS RECORD FOR ATTEMPTS:** Extreme winds kept Idaho State from throwing like it normally does in a 32-7 loss to Weber State, but Bengal QB Justin Arias as able to throw enough to break the Big Sky single-season record for pass attempts. Arias attempted 574 passes this season. The previous record was 553 set by Idaho State's Kevin Yost last season.

**FIRST TO 100:** Weber State's Tony Epperson punted eight times Saturday in a win over Idaho State. Epperson became the first punter in FCS history to punt 100 times in a season. Epperson punted 101 times for a Big Sky record 4,356 yards. The previous FCS record was 98 punts by Louisiana Tech's Barry Hickinbotham in 1987. Epperson tied the Division I record of 101 punts by Jim Bailey of VMI in 1969. The NCAA FCS record book does not list a record for most punting yards in a season. However, the FBS record is 4,138 by Michigan State's Johnny Pringel in 1938.

**IN THE POLLS:** Five Big Sky teams finished the regular season ranked in the Sports Network Top 25, including two in the top five, and three in the top eight. Eastern Washington enters the playoffs ranked third, followed by Montana. Northern Arizona is ranked eighth. Montana State is 16th, and Southern Utah is 22nd. North Dakota State continued its hold on the top spot. Eastern Illinois is second. In the Coaches' Poll, Eastern Washington is third, Montana is fifth, Northern Arizona is ninth, Montana State is 18th, and Southern Utah is 25. NDSU is No. 1, followed by Eastern Illinois.

**Extra points:** Cal Poly ranks first in the nation with an average of 309.1 rushing yards per game. The Mustangs should easily finish as the nation's top rushing team, and would be the first Big Sky team to do so since Idaho in 1981...Road teams won four of the six conference games in the final week of the regular season. Road teams finished with a 27-25 edge in conference games...UM finished first in the nation in average attendance at 24,380. James Madison was a distant second at 21,001. Montana State finished fifth in average attendance at 19,704...Montana State, Montana and Eastern Washington all averaged more than 100 percent of the listed stadium capacity...Portland State's DJ Adams finished the season with 1,600 rushing yards, which ranks 13th on the Big Sky's single-season rushing list...Cal Poly's Tim Walsh earned his 80th coaching victory while coaching in the Big Sky Conference, tying him for fifth place on the league's all-time list with former UM coach Bobby Hauck.

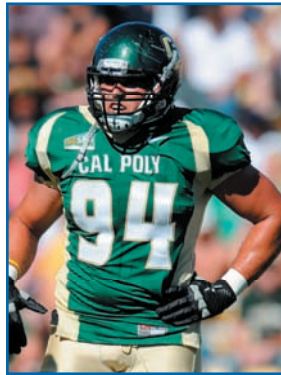

## LEAGUE ANNOUNCES 2013 ALL-CONFERENCE FOOTBALL TEAM

**OGDEN, Utah (Nov. 26, 2013)** - A duo of record-breaking Eastern Washington Eagles earned major hardware, and were the only unanimous selections to the 2013 Big Sky All-Conference football team.

The All-Conference teams and individual award winners were selected by the 13 league head coaches Monday, and released by the league office Tuesday.

Eastern Washington sophomore quarterback Vernon Adams was voted as the Offensive MVP, while Eagle wide receiver Cooper Kupp became the recipient of the first Freshman of the Year honor. The two were unanimously selected to the All-Conference First Team. Kupp was an unanimous selection for Freshman of the Year.

Montana State senior defensive end Brad Daly and Cal Poly senior defensive tackle Sullivan Grosz were named Co-Defensive MVP.

UC Davis running back Gabe Manzanarez was named the Newcomer of the Year.

Previously, the league only honored a Newcomer of the Year, which went to either a freshman or a transfer. A separate Freshman of the Year honor was added this season. The conference is also recognizing three All-Conference squads for the first time.

Northern Arizona senior running back Zach Bauman and Eastern Washington senior cornerback TJ Lee III were both selected to the First Team for the third straight season.

Six other players were named First Team for the second straight season: North Dakota wide receiver Greg Hardin, Montana offensive tackle Danny Kistler, Montana defensive end Zack Wagenmann, Montana linebacker Jordan Tripp, Northern Arizona cornerback Anders Battle, and Northern Arizona safety Lucky Dozier.

League champion Eastern Washington and second-place Northern Arizona both placed five players on the First Team. Montana and Cal Poly each saw four of its players named to the First Team. In all, nine of the 13 conferences teams had at least one player selected to the First Team.

## **2013 ALL-CONFERENCE FOOTBALL TEAM**

Adams, a 6-foot, 190-pound sophomore from Pasadena, Calif., is a leading candidate for the Walter Payton Award. He finished the regular season tops the nation in pass efficiency (185.7) and total offense (379.2 yards per game). He has already set single-season Big Sky records with 46 passing touchdowns and 4,550 yards of total offense. He enters the playoffs with 4,059 passing yards, which ranks fourth in conference single-season history.

"I don't want to take anything away from players like Eric Meyer, Matt Nichols, and Bo Levi Mitchell, but Vernon's season this year is the best I've seen since I've been a college football coach," said Eastern Washington head coach Beau Baldwin.

Kupp, a 6-2, 195-pound redshirt freshman from Yakima, Wash., has set a number of FCS freshman records through the first 12 games of his college career. He leads the nation with 18 TD catches, one shy of the FCS single-season freshman record and two shy of the Big Sky single-season record. He has caught a TD pass in all 12 games, an FCS record. He enters the playoffs with 77 catches for 1,378 yards. His 1,378 yards are second in the nation and are a FCS record for freshmen. His 77 catches are four shy of the FCS freshman record. He is a leading candidate for the Jerry Rice Award, given annually to the top freshman in the nation.

"It was unanimous with the coaches in the conference, and deservedly so," Baldwin said. "In a conference rich with receiver talent, he was the best as a freshman. He is the best receiver in this conference - not just the best freshman - and he was in the top three or four nationally in terms of what he's done statistically."

Daly, a 6-1, 240-pound senior from Helena, Mont., leads the nation in sacks with 14 and tackles for loss with 20.5. Daly is the second straight Montana State player to win Defensive MVP, following linebacker Jody Owens in 2012. Daly also has 68 total tackles, seven quarterback hurries, two forced fumbles, two blocked kicks and an interception.

Grosz, a 6-4, 295-pound senior from Fresno, Calif., was a force in the middle for one of the league's top defenses. He had 71 total tackles - 13.5 for loss - eight sacks, five quarterback hurries, a forced fumble and an interception. He is the first Cal Poly player to win an individual award since the Mustangs joined the Big Sky in 2012.

Manzanares arrived at UC Davis prior to the season as a walk-on after transferring from City College of San Francisco. After a slow start, the 5-9, 195-pound junior from San Francisco, picked up steam and never slowed down. In 11 regular season games, he rushed for 1,285 yards and 12 touchdowns. In eight conference games, he averaged 140.2 rushing yards per game. He rushed for at least 100 yards in his final five games, and seven of his final eight.

Bauman and Lee, the two three-time First Team Players, have been leaders at their programs throughout their careers. Bauman, a senior from Chandler, Ariz., rushed for 1,000 yards for the fourth straight season. He ranks third all-time in league history in rushing yards with 5,031. He averaged 122.3 rushing yards per game and 148.4 all-purpose yards per game. Lee, a senior from Seattle, Wash., who played corner and safety this season, tallied 89 total tackles, four forced fumbles 10 pass breakups and an interception.

Lee, Kupp and Adams were joined on the first team by teammates Ashton Miller (Center) and Senior Bo Schutzle, who was named as the special teams player.

Battle, Dozier and Bauman were three of the five Northern Arizona Lumberjacks tabbed to the First Team. Defensive Tackle Tim Wilkinson and tight end RJ Rickert also made the unit.

Montana, which finished third in the Big Sky placed Tripp, and fellow senior outside linebacker J.P. Kanongata'a on the First Team, as well as Kistler at offensive tackle, and Wagenmann at defensive end.

Southern Utah's senior Colton Cook was honored as the First Team Kicker. Sophomore inside linebacker Zak Browning of the playoff-bound Thunderbirds was also named to the First Team.

Sacramento State placed three players on the First Team: junior wide receiver DeAndre Carter, senior offensive guard Tyler Worthley, and senior inside linebacker Todd Davis, who leads the Big Sky in total tackles with 131.

Portland State was represented on the first team by senior running back DJ Adams, who rushed for 1,600 yards and a league-high 19 touchdowns, offensive tackle Mitchell Van Dyk, and punter Kyle Loomis, who leads the nation in punting.

Cal Poly guard Lefi Letuligasenoa, fullback Akaninyene Umoh, and safety Alex Hubbard joined Grosz on the First Team.

Montana State junior Shawn Johnson was named the First Team Return Specialist.
