Big Sky Announces Women's Basketball All-Conference Team and Award Winners

OGDEN, Utah (March 11, 2013) - The Big Sky Conference has announced the Women's Basketball All-Conference team and individual award winners for the 2012-13 season. The awards were decided by a vote of the league's 11 head coaches.

Katie Baker became the ninth Montana player in Big Sky history to earn the league's Most Valuable Player Award. The senior was a unanimous First-Team selection. This is the third year in a row Baker has been named to the All-Conference First Team.

Baker helped her team to the regular-season title and the right to host the Big Sky Conference Championship. She averages 13.6 points a game and 7.3 rebounds a game. Baker, a senior from Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, has four 20+ point games, seven 10+ rebound games, and has recorded seven double-doubles this season.

For the second year in a row, Northern Colorado's D'shara Strange has been selected as the league's Defensive Player of the Year. She was also named Outstanding Freshman the 2010-11 season. Strange, a junior from Fountain, Colo., ranks second in the conference averaging 15.0 points per game. She averages 7.2 rebounds a game, which ranks eighth in the conference. Strange was a unanimous First-Team Selection.

Hayley Hodgins of Eastern Washington was named the league's Outstanding Freshman, and Angela Misa of Portland State was selected as Top Newcomer. Hodgins, from Pasco, Wash., ranks eighth in the Big Sky in 3-point field goal percentage with .373. EWU hasn't had a player named Outstanding Freshman since the 1992-93 season, when Kristy Missall was named. Misa, a junior from Oceanside, Calif., and transfer from Oregon State, ranks second in the Big Sky in rebounds as she averages 10.2 a game. She played her last game of the season on Feb. 9 before she was injured.

Others named to the first team were Lexie Nelson, Eastern Washington; Amy Patton, Northern Arizona; Kylie Kuhns, Sacramento State and Kenzie De Boer, Montana.

EWU'S NELSON, SAC'S MORENO NAMED BIG SKY CONFERENCE CO-PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OGDEN, Utah (March 11, 2013) - Eastern Washington's Lexie Nelson and Sacramento State's Alle Moreno have been named the Big Sky Conference Women's Basketball Co-Players of the Week for the games played the week of March 4-10.

Nelson, a sophomore guard from Butte, Mont., led EWU to a home sweep with wins against Idaho State and Weber State. Nelson averaged 21 points on 57 percent shooting, and had 12 rebounds, three assists and three steals on the weekend, as EWU finished third in the Big Sky race for the second year in a row.

In a nail-biting game against the Bengals on Thursday, Nelson put the team on her back and propelled the Eagles to a 67-61 overtime win, which was EWU's first OT game in more than two years. After scoring 10 second-half points and grabbing seven rebounds to keep Eastern in the game, Nelson went a perfect 3-of-3 from the field in the overtime period, including a big spot-up 3-pointer that put Eastern back in front after ISU had taken the lead. Nelson finished the contest with a career-high 24 points on 7-of-10 shooting from the floor and flawless 8-of-8 effort at the charity stripe. With the win, EWU earned the first regular-season sweep of Idaho State since 2003, and solidified the No. 3 seed in the tourney, which otherwise would have gone to the Bengals.

In the regular-season finale against Weber State, Nelson had another impressive 18 points to go along with four rebounds, three steals and one assist.

Moreno, a junior from Lodi, Calif., averaged a team-high 18 points per game as the Hornets swept a weekend against the Montana schools for the first time in program history.

Moreno shot 40 percent from the field (12-of-30) and 42.1 percent on 3-pointers (8-of-19) as she averaged 18 points, five rebounds, three assists and 1.5 steals in the two games. She also went 4-of-5 at the free throw line and played a team-high 65 minutes over the two games.

LAST WEEK'S TOP PERFORMERS

Ashleigh Vella, Idaho State - Vella recorded her second straight double-double with 19 points and 10 rebounds against Eastern Washington. She also recorded two assists, two blocks and one steal in the contest. She shot 7-17 from the field. Against Portland State, Vella posted 10 points, five rebounds, five assists and one steal. She averaged 14.5 points over the weekend and 7.5 rebounds. Vella is averaging 12.4 and 6.6 rebounds per contest on the season.

Katie Baker, Montana - Baker averaged 18.0 points and 7.5 rebounds as Montana split on the road last week at Northern Arizona and Sacramento State...On Thursday, the night Montana won the outright Big Sky Conference title and clinched tournament hosting rights, Baker matched a career-high 26 points in a 59-51 win at Northern Arizona. Baker went 10 for 20 from the field...With the Lady Griz down a starter and a key reserve in Saturday's 80-71 loss at Sacramento State, Baker had her 19th career double-double with 10 points and 11 rebounds.

Megan Lauck, North Dakota - Lauck scored 29 of her career-high 36 points after halftime to help UND to a miraculous comeback in a 95-94 double-overtime defeat at Southern Utah Saturday. With her team trailing by 21 in the second half, Lauck took over, making a career-high 6 three-pointers and converting on all 12 of her free throw chances, one shy of the school record for a single game without a miss. Her 36-point effort is tied for 10th-most by a North Dakota player in its history and most in its NCAA Division I era. She added seven rebounds, four assists, two blocks and two steals in Saturday's season finale. She finished the season with averages of 9.9 points and 4.1 rebounds per contest and led the team in steals (51).

D'shara Strange, Northern Colorado - Strange ended the conference season with her fourth-straight 20+-point game, leading all scorers with 25 points at Southern Utah. She also had her fourth double-double of the year with a game-high 14 rebounds and tied the school record shooting a perfect 11-for-11 from the free throw line. The 25 points gives Strange the Big Sky Conference scoring title, ending the first-ever 20-game schedule with a 15.8 per game scoring average.

Courtney VanBrocklin, Portland State - VanBrocklin led the Vikings to a split of the final weekend of the regular season. VanBrocklin started the weekend with a 22 point, 10 assist game against Weber State leading the Vikings to a 79-73 win in overtime over the Wildcats. VanBrocklin played all 45 minutes against the Wildcats going 6-for-15 (.400) from the floor, 4-for-5 (.800) from three-point range, and 6-for-6 (1.000) from the free-throw line. She also added a career-high 10 assists for her fourth double-double of the season. VanBrocklin became the first Viking since 2010 to record a double-double with points and assists...She then played all 40 minutes in a 61-54 loss to Idaho State in the Vikings' season finale. She scored seven points on 3-of-10 shooting while pulling down six rebounds and four assists...On the weekend, VanBrocklin averaged 14.5 points per game while shooting .360 from the floor and .500 from three-point range. She also averaged 4.0 rebounds, 3.0 steals, and 7.0 assists over the two games.

Sofia Hepworth, Southern Utah - Hepworth helped the Thunderbirds take back-to-back home wins last week to help Southern Utah secure a spot in the Big Sky Tournament. The junior guard tallied eight points on 4-6 shooting in just 14 minutes in a T-Bird win over second-place Northern Colorado then came back with 12 more, including the game-winning shot, as SUU defeated North Dakota in double overtime. For the week Hepworth posted four steals, four rebounds, a pair of assists and an overall shooting mark of 50.0 percent. For the season she is averaging 7.2 ppg while playing 16.3 mpg and shooting over 47 percent from the field.
