## **Tournament Tidbits**



- ✓ This is the 38th Big Sky Conference Championship. For the first time, the tournament features a seven-team field. For the previous 23 years, the tournament was a six-team tournament.
- ✓ For the first time since 2002, the entire tournament is being played at one site. From 2003-2012, first-round games were played at the home of the No. 4 and No. 5 seeds.
- ✓ Dahlberg Arena is hosting the Big Sky Championship for the second straight season, and the sixth time overall. The Grizzlies won the title on their home court in 1991, 1992 and 2012. In 1978, Weber State beat Montana for the championship. In 2000, Northern Arizona beat Cal State Northridge at Dahlberg Arena.
- ✓ Montana is making its 12th straight appearance in the tournament, the longest active streak in the league. Montana State is in the tournament field for the ninth straight season. Weber State is making its seventh straight tournament appearance.
- ✓ Montana enters the tournament having not lost at Dahlberg Arena to a Big Sky team in more than three years. The Grizzlies have won 26 consecutive regular-season games over Big Sky teams, and a total of 29 in a row over league foes. UM last lost at home to a Big Sky team on Feb. 27, 2010 to Montana State.
- ✓ North Dakota and Southern Utah both qualified for the championship in their first season as a Big Sky member. In 1996-97, Cal State Northridge, Portland State and Sacramento State joined the Big Sky. Only Cal State Northridge qualified for the tournament in its first season in the Big Sky.
- ✓ Three of the seven coaches in this year's field have won the Big Sky Championship. Randy Rahe led Weber State to the 2007 championship in his first season. B.J. Hill guided Northern Colorado to the 2011 championship in his first season. Montana's Wayne Tinkle won tournament titles in 2010 and 2012. Montana State's Brad Huse lost in the 2009 championship game to Portland State.
- ✓ Montana and Weber State have each won eight Big Sky Championship titles, tied for the most in league history. Montana State and Northern Arizona have each won two championships. Northern Colorado won its lone championship in 2011. Montana has appeared in the championship game 15 times, a record. Weber State has appeared 13 times.
- ✓ Montana senior Will Cherry has played in seven tournament games. If the Grizzlies reach the championship game, he will become the first player in league history to play in nine championship games. Cherry already holds the all-time tournament record with 20 steals.
- ✓ Cherry is the only player in this year's tournament who will have played in the championship in four consecutive seasons. Fellow Montana senior Mathias Ward is injured, and won't get a chance to play in the tournament a fourth straight season.
- ✓ Top-seeded Montana is seeking its fourth straight appearance in the championship game. Weber State holds the record with five straight title appearances from 1976-80. Eastern Washington appeared in four straight championship games from 2001-04.
- ✓ North Dakota is making its first appearance in the Big Sky Championship, but Brian Jones' team is no stranger to tournament success. North Dakota won the Great West Championship in 2011 and 2012. The Great West champion, however, did not receive an automatic bid to the NCAA Championship.
- ✓ Southern Utah has made one appearance in the NCAA Championship. Under current Idaho State coach Bill Evans, Southern Utah won the Summit League Championship in 2001. At the time, the league was known as the Mid-Continent Conference.

**Coaches:** Northern Arizona's Jack Murphy is in his first season at NAU and his first as a collegiate head coach. He spent the previous three seasons as an assistant at Memphis, and was an advanced scout for the Denver Nuggets in the NBA prior to Memphis. Murphy led NAU to an 8-12 mark in the Big Sky and 11-20 overall record...Weber State's Randy Rahe has compiled a 144-73 overall record in seven seasons. He is 92-24 in Big Sky games. His 144 wins ranks ninth all time in Big Sky history. Rahe is 6-5 in Big Sky tournament games. His teams have played in the championship in 2007, 2010 and 2012. The Wildcats have advanced to at least the semifinals in six straight seasons. Prior to coaching at Weber State, Rahe was an assistant at Utah, Utah State and Colorado State.

**What's Next:** The winner advances to a Friday semifinal. If Northern Arizona wins, the Lumberjacks will face No. 1 Montana.

**Season Series:** Weber State won both regular season meetings. The Wildcats won in Ogden 83-70 on Jan. 17. Kyle Tresnak scored 23 points with eight rebounds. Joel Bolombo scored 13 points with 13 rebounds and five blocks off the bench. Max Jacobsen led NAU with 18 points. Weber State survived the rematch in Flagstaff, 80-78 in overtime on March 2. Weber State trailed by seven with 1:08 in regulation before rallying. Davion Berry scored 25 points and Scott Bamforth added 20 in the win. Gabe Rogers netted 25 points in the loss. Jacobsen and DeWayne Russell each scored 17 points for the Lumberjacks.

**Meetings in Championship:** This will be the sixth meeting between the Lumberjacks and Wildcats in the Big Sky Championship. WSU is 5-1. NAU won 75-70 in a 2008 semifinal at the Rose Garden in Portland, Ore.. Weber State beat NAU in the championship games in 1979, 1999 and 2007. In 1976, the first year of the Big Sky Tournament, Weber State beat NAU 63-58 in a semifinal. This is the first meeting between the two in a game prior to the semifinals.

**Notes:** Since losing to NAU in the 2008 semifinals, Weber State has won 10 straight over the Lumberjacks...NAU's Gabe Rogers is averaging 22.8 points per game over his last 14 games...WSU enters on an 11-game winning streak. The Wildcats haven't lost since a 76-74 setback to Montana at Dahlberg Arena on Jan. 26...Since 1997, Northern Arizona has appeared in the Big Sky Championship 14 times...Weber State has 37 tournament wins, more than any other team in league history. Weber State has missed the tournament just twice - 1981 and 2006...WSU leads the Big Sky in scoring offense at 75.8 points per game. NAU is 11th in scoring defense at 75.1 points per game...NAU last advanced to the semifinals in 2011...Weber State leads the nation in field-goal percentage, 3-point field-goal percentage, and 3-point field-goal percentage defense.

**Coaches:** Nick Robinson is in his first season at Southern Utah and as a head coach. Robinson has an overall record of 11-19. Prior to taking over in Cedar City, the Stanford graduate was an assistant for three seasons at LSU...North Dakota's Brian Jones is in his seventh season at the Grand Forks school. He has an overall record of 101-112. Jones guided North Dakota to a 15-15 regular-season record. Prior to coaching at UND, Jones was an assistant coach at Iowa under Steve Alford.

**What's Next:** The winner advances to a Friday semifinal.

**Season Series:** The two teams split their regular-season meetings. Southern Utah won the first meeting in Cedar City 79-67 on Dec. 17, 2012. Jackson Stevenett led SUU with 21 points, 10 rebounds, five assists and three steals. Mitch Wilmer had 15 points and 10 rebounds. North Dakota played without junior Troy Huff, who had yet to return from a broken jaw. North Dakota won the rematch 68-61 last Saturday in Grand Forks. Jamal Webb had 19 points with nine rebounds, five assists and four steals in the win. Huff netted 15 points. SUU's Jackson Stevenett was held to just seven points. A.J. Hess led SUU with 16 points and eight rebounds.

**Meetings in Championship:** This is the first meeting between the two in the Big Sky Championship, as it is the first tournament game for both schools. Southern Utah and North Dakota joined the Big Sky Conference as full members on July 1, 2012.

**Notes:** North Dakota's 12 conference wins this season are the most ever by a first-year program in the Big Sky... Southern Utah made the tournament despite losing its last seven conference games. SUU started 3-0 in league, before suffering a five-game losing streak. SUU responded with five straight league wins to get to 8-5 on Feb. 2...North Dakota won the Great West Conference tournament titles in 2011 and 2012...The teams had never played prior to both joining the Big Sky...SUU's Jackson Stevenett scored in double figures in 23 straight games before being held to seven points last week against UND...UND's Troy Huff has scored in double figures in 21 of the 22 games he's played this season, including 10 straight...In conference play, Huff averaged 19.7 points per game, while Stevenett averaged 19.3...SUU ranks second in the Big Sky in rebounding margin and blocked shots...UND leads the Big Sky in steals and is second in turnover margin...This marks the first time that two first-year schools have played each other in a Big Sky tournament game...UND's Jamal Webb enters the game with 177 career steals, one shy of the school all-time record. Webb leads the Big Sky with 68 steals...Southern Utah went to 14 of the last 15 Summit League/Mid-Continent Conference Tournaments.

**Coaches:** Northern Colorado's B.J. Hill is in his third season with the Bears. He has an overall record of 42-46. Hill led Northern Colorado to its first Big Sky Championship and first trip to the NCAA Division I Tournament in 2011, his first season as head coach. Hill served as an assistant at Northern Colorado for four seasons before taking over the program. Hill is 2-0 in Big Sky Tournament games...Montana State's Brad Huse is 93-116 in his seventh season with the Bobcats. Prior to coaching at MSU, Huse amassed a 184-60 record in as Jamestown College in North Dakota. Huse has led the Bobcats to the Big Sky Championship in all seven of his season. He is 2-6 in tournament games.

**What's Next:** The winner will play in a Friday semifinal. Unless No. 6 Southern Utah or No. 7 Northern Arizona pull off an upset, the winner will play No. 1 seed Montana.

**Season Series:** The teams split the regular-season series. Montana State won 69-66 in Greeley on Jan. 10. Calen Coleman led MSU with 16 points off the bench. Xavier Blount netted 14 points. Tate Unruh scored 23 points for Northern Colorado, while Derrick Barden had 14 points and 11 rebounds...Northern Colorado won 85-72 on Feb. 9 in Bozeman. Tevin Svihovec scored 23 points. Barden had 11 points and 11 rebounds. All five NC starters scored in double figures. Antonio Biglow scored 15 points to lead Montana State.

**Meetings in Championship:** This is the first meeting between the programs in the Big Sky Championship. Northern Colorado joined the Big Sky Conference in 2006

**Notes:** Northern Colorado started the conference campaign 1-5, but won nine of its last 14 to tie Montana State for fourth place...Montana State won three of its last four to finish 10-10 and garner the No. 4 seed...MSU will be without forward Xavier Blount, who suffered a foot injury...Northern Colorado's Tate Unruh has made 87 3-pointers this season. The 87 3-pointers is tied for the most by a Bear player since the team joined the league. Devon Beitzel made 87 3-pointers in his MVP season of 2010-11. Unruh made at least on 3-pointer in the first 19 games of the season...MSU's Flavien Davis has 52 points in his last three games...Hill is 4-2 against Huse...NC's Derrick Barden leads the conference with 10 double-doubles...He enters the tournament averaging 13.6 points and a league-high 9.1 rebounds per game...In conference play, Northern Colorado knocked down .401 percent of its 3-pointers...Since making the 2009 championship, Montana State has lost three straight tournament games...Neither Montana State nor Northern Colorado has played a neutral court game this season...NC's Derrick Barden averaged 15 points and 10 rebounds in league play. Montana's Kareem Jamar has been selected as the final Big Sky Conference men's basketball Player of the Week of the 2012-13 season.



The 6-foot-5, junior guard/forward from Venice, Calif., led Montana to three wins as the Grizzlies clinched their second straight regular-season conference title. Jamar averaged 16.7 points, 4.3 assists and 3.7 rebounds per games. He shot .581 percent from the field and .813 from the free-throw line.

Jamar poured in 26 points with four rebounds, four assists and a blocked shot last Monday in an 86-74 overtime road win over Southern Utah. Scored 12 points with four rebounds, four assists and a steal on Thursday in a 63-52 win over Sacramento State. On Saturday in a 63-50 win over Northern Arizona, Jamar netted 12 points with five assists, three rebounds and a steal.

Jamar guided a Montana team that was without senior Mathias Ward for all three games, and without All-Conference guard Will Cherry for two of the three games. Montana finished 19-1 in conference, the most league victories in a single season.

Montana will take the No. 1 seed into this week's Big Sky Championship, which begins on Thursday in Missoula.

This is Jamar's third Player of the Week honor this season.

## THIS WEEK'S SKY HIGHLIGHTS

The 2013 Big Sky Conference Championship begins Thursday at Dahlberg Arena in Missoula, Mont. The Montana Grizzlies won the regular season title for the second straight season and the right to host the championship. As the No. 1 seed, Montana gets a bye to the semifinals on Friday night...No. 2 seed Weber State will take on No. 7 seed Northern Arizona in Thursday's first game at 3 p.m. Mountain. WSU swept NAU in the regular-season, but the second meeting went to overtime. Weber State has won 11 straight games...In the second game, No. 3 North Dakota will take on No. 6 Southern Utah in a battle of the league's two newest members. The teams split regular-season meetings, with UND winning 68-61 on Saturday in Grand Forks. UND has won four straight conference games, while SUU enters on a seven-game conference losing streak. In the final game on Thursday at 8 p.m., No. 4 seed Montana State takes on No. 5 Northern Colorado. The teams split regular-season meetings. Northern Colorado enters on a three-game winning streak. MSU won its final two regular-season games...Montana will play the winner of the MSU-NC game, unless No. 6 Southern Utah or No. 7 Northern Arizona pulls off an upset.

## AROUND THE BIG SKY

**TWO IN A ROW FOR GRIZ:** Montana secured its second consecutive outright conference title with a 65-57 win over Northern Arizona on Saturday. Montana has now won our shared nine Big Sky regular-season titles. UM won a single-season record 19 conference games this season. Middle Tennessee State of the Sun Belt Conference was the only other team in the nation to win 19 conference games. Montana finished 10-0 in conference home games. The Grizzlies have won 26 straight regular-season conference home games, and 29 in a row overall against Big Sky teams at Dahlberg Arena. UM's last loss to a Big Sky team in Dahlberg Arena was a 73-67 setback to Montana State on Feb. 27, 2010. Montana has combined to go 33-2 in regular-season conference games the past two seasons, and enters the tournament with a 35-2 overall record against league opponents over the past two years. Montana's only league losses during the span were on the road at Weber State. Montana has won at least 21 games each of the past four seasons. UM's combined record over the last four seasons is 91-34 overall, and 56-12 against Big Sky teams. Montana is 13-1 at home this season, and has won 10 straight. Over the past three seasons at home, the Grizzlies are 42-5. By winning the regular season championship, Montana is guaranteed a bid to the NIT if it fails to win the postseason championship.

**WEBER KEEPS ROLLING:** Weber State extended its winning streak to 11 games with home wins over Portland State and Eastern Washington last weekend. Weber State finished 18-2 in conference. The 18 conference wins in a season are second-most in league history, behind Montana's 19 this season. Weber State has amassed a 32-4 conference record the past two seasons, but failed to win a regular-season title as Montana has finished 15-1 and 19-1. Weber State is the only conference team to beat Montana the past two seasons. Weber State has won at least 10 conference games in seven straight seasons under Randy Rahe. Under Rahe, Weber State is 92-24 in regular-season conference games. As of Monday, Weber State's 11-game winning streak is the fifth-longest active streak in the nation. Davidson has the longest active streak at 17 games following a win in the Southern Conference Tournament on Monday night.

**FIRST-YEAR HITS:** North Dakota and Southern Utah both qualified for the Big Sky championship in their first season in the league. North Dakota won 12 conference games, the most ever by a first-year Big Sky team. The two squads will square off in a first-round game on Thursday, marking the first time that two first-year teams have ever played in the Big Sky Championship. North Dakota and Southern Utah are just the second and third teams, respectively to qualify for the Big Sky Championship in their first season. Cal State Northridge advanced all the way to the championship game in 1997, the Matadors' first season in the Big Sky. The Big Sky began its postseason championship in 1976. Since then, Eastern Washington (1988), Portland State (1997), Sacramento State (1997), and Northern Colorado (2006) joined the Big Sky, but didn't qualify in their first seasons.

## AROUND THE BIG SKY

**NCAA LEADERS:** Weber State enters the Big Sky Championship leading the nation in three statistical categories. The Wildcats are the only team in the nation to lead in three categories. WSU is first in field-goal percentage (.508 percent), first in 3-point field-goal percentage (.433) and first in 3-point field-goal percentage defense (.280). WSU also ranks fifth in scoring margin (+14.8). Montana is fifth in the nation in free-throw shooting percentage (.775). WSU's Scott Bamforth ranks ninth in the nation in 3-point FG percentage (.448).

**500 for SALIDVAR:** Northern Arizona senior Stallon Saldivar moved into sixth place on the Big Sky's all-time assists list on Thursday with five assists in a loss to Montana State. Saldivar enters the tournament with 504 career assists. He is one of eight players in league history to amass 500 assists.

**MARKSMEN MOVING UP:** Northern Arizona senior Gabe Rogers enters the Big Sky Championship with 245 career 3-pointers. He ranks sixth all-time in Big Sky history, and is just one away from tying Damian Lillard for fifth place. Weber State's Scott Bamforth enters the tourney with 228 career 3-pointers, which ranks 10th in Big Sky history. Rogers has made 93 3-pointers this season, which is tied for eight-most in single-season history. Northern Colorado's Tate Unruh has made 87 3-pointers, which is tied for 11th all-time.

**RPI UPDATE:** Montana has moved back in front of Weber State in the RPI. As of Monday, Montana has an RPI of 89. Weber State is at 94. UND is 229, NAU is 260, NC is 272, SUU is 306, MSU is 310. Montana's non-conference strength of schedule is ranked 28th in the nation. NAU is 48th.

**Tip-ins:** Eastern Washington finished the season with 176 blocks, falling just short of the Big Sky single-season record of 179 set by Idaho State in 2005-06...Northern Colorado's Derrick Barden leads the league with 10 double-doubles entering the conference tournament. ...Home teams finished 71-39 in conference games, a winning percentage of .645. Montana and Weber State were the only teams not to lose a home conference game. Portland State was the only team to go winless on the road in conference...NAU's Gabe Rogers has scored in double figures in 16 straight games...SUU coach Nick Robinson is a finalist for the Joe B. Hall Award, which goes to the top first-year coach at the Division I level...Montana is ranked 13th in this week's College Insider.Com Mid-Major Top 25. Weber State is 15th...Entering the tournament 29 players have recorded a double-double this season in the Big Sky.

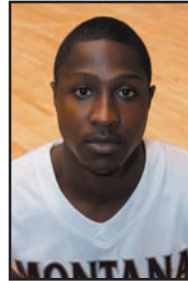

**OGDEN, Utah (March 11, 2013)** - For the first time in more than 20 years, a Montana Grizzly has been selected as the Big Sky Conference men's basketball Most Valuable Player.

Grizzly junior forward/guard Kareem Jamar was tabbed as the Most Valuable Player, and also named to the All-Conference First Team for the second straight season.

The 2012-13 All-Conference team and individual award winners were selected by the league head coaches on Monday morning. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own players.

Montana senior guard Will Cherry was selected as the Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight season, and also garnered First Team All-Conference honors for the third time.

Weber State junior Davion Berry, a transfer from Division II Cal State Monterey Bay, was named as the Newcomer of the Year, and also garnered All-Conference First Team honors.

Eastern Washington's Venky Jois was selected as the Freshman of the Year.

Jamar and North Dakota junior Troy Huff were unanimous selections to the First Team. Joining Jamar, Cherry and Huff on the First Team were Weber State senior guard Scott Bamforth, Northern Arizona senior guard Gabe Rogers, and Northern Colorado junior forward Derrick Barden.

Jamar, a versatile 6-foot-5 player from Venice, Calif., averaged 14.2 points, 5.9 rebounds, 4.1 assists per game. He ranks in the top 15 in the Big Sky Conference in assists (third), scoring (seventh), assist/turnover ratio (seventh), 3-point field-goal percentage (13th) and field-goal percentage (15th).

Jamar helped Montana to its second straight regular-season conference title. Montana won a single-season conference record 19 games and lost just once. The Grizzlies will take a 23-6 overall record into the conference championship, which begins Thursday in Missoula.

Jamar is the first Grizzly since Delvon Anderson to claim the Big Sky MVP, who shared the honor in 1991-92. Since the Big Sky began recognizing an MVP in 1978-79, Jamar is the fifth UM player to win the honor. Derrick Pope was MVP in 1982-83, followed by Larry Krystkowiak three consecutive seasons. Kevin Kearney won the MVP in 1990-91.

Cherry, a 6-1, 181-pounder from West Oakland, Calif., missed 10 games this season because of injury, but still garnered accolades. He is just the second player in league history to win back-to-back Defensive Player of the Year honors, joining Portland State's Seamus Boxley (2004 and 2005). Cherry is the third straight Grizzly to win the award. Center Brian Qvale captured it in 2010-11.

Cherry ranks second in league history in steals with 258. Cherry averaged 13.3 points, 4.4 rebounds, 4.2 assists and 1.8 steals per game during the regular season. Cherry is just the 19th player in league history to earn First Team honors three times.

Berry, a 6-4, 185-pounder from Oakland, sat out last season as a transfer. He shined in his first season at the Division I level, averaging a team-best 15.1 points per game to go along with 3.6 assists per game and a shooting percentage of .498. Berry is the third Weber State player in four seasons to win Newcomer of the Year.

Jois, a 6-7, 220-pound true freshman from Boronia, Australia, recorded nine double-doubles in his first collegiate season. He averaged 12.3 points, 9.0 rebounds and a league-best 2.4 blocked shots per game. Jois was an Honorable Mention All-Conference pick.

Bamforth returned to the First Team for the second time in three seasons. He was a First Team pick as a sophomore and Second Team as a junior. Bamforth averaged 13.3 points per game during the regular season. He leads the Big Sky with an .881 free-throw shooting percentage. He averages 2.5 3-pointers per game and shoots .448 percent from 3-point range.

Barden, a 6-5 transfer from Detroit, shined in his first season with Northern Colorado. He leads the Big Sky with 10 double-doubles. He finished the regular season, averaging a league-best 9.1 rebounds per game. Barden averages 13.6 points per game and shoots .558 percent from the floor.

Rogers rounded out the First Team. The senior from Houston, Texas, had enjoyed a strong final campaign after suffering a shoulder injury as a junior. Rogers, who ranks sixth all-time in made 3-pointers in league history with 245, finished the regular-season averaging a league-best 18.1 points per game. He has made a league-high 93 3-pointers.
