Coaches: Montana's Wayne Tinkle is 141-77 in his seventh season at his alma mater. He has been named Big Sky Coach of the Year each of the last two seasons. Tinkle is coaching in the NCAA Tournament for the third time in four seasons. Tinkle is 0-2 in NCAA Tournament games, losing to New Mexico in 2010 and Wisconsin in 2012. Tinkle is the first coach to lead UM to the NCAA Tournament three times. He was an assistant on the 2006 team, which upset Nevada in the first round...Syracuse coach Jim Boeheim is 915-310 in his 34th season at his alma mater. Boeheim is 46-27 in NCAA Tournament games. He guided Syracuse to the 2003 National Championship, and runner-up finishes in 1987 and 1996.

Series History: This is the first meeting between the schools in basketball. Syracuse and Montana played a football game in 1915, tying 6-6.

Coaches: Weber State's Randy Rahe is 146-74 in his seventh season with the Wildcats. Montana's Tinkle Named Coach of the Year

OGDEN, Utah (March 18, 2013) - For the second consecutive season, Montana's Wayne Tinkle has been selected as the Big Sky Conference Men's Basketball Coach of the Year by his peers.

Tinkle guided Montana to 19-1 conference record and the program's second consecutive regular-season conference title. The Grizzlies won their second straight Big Sky Championship last week, downing Weber State 67-64 in the title game.

Montana will take a 25-6 record into the second round of the NCAA Tournament on Thursday as the Grizzlies face Syracuse of the Big East Conference.

Tinkle and the Grizzlies won 25 games despite missing All-Conference guard Will Cherry for 10 games. Cherry, the two-time Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year, missed the first seven games of the season as he recovered from a broken foot. He missed three more games late in the season with a foot injury. Senior forward Mathias Ward also missed the final seven games with a foot injury.

Montana's 19 regular-season conference wins were the most in league history. The Grizzlies set conference records for most consecutive regular-season conference victories with 25, a streak that started during the 2011-12 season. Montana has won 28 straight regular-season conference home games, and 31 in a row overall at home against Big Sky teams.

Over the past two seasons, Tinkle's Grizzlies have gone a combined 34-2 in conference regular-season games, and 38-2 overall against conference foes including postseason games. Montana's combined overall record the past two seasons is 50-13.

Tinkle, now in his seventh season at his alma mater, has amassed an overall record of 141-77. He is 85-31 in regular-season conference games. He ranks seventh in conference history in league victories. He is 11th on the Big Sky's all-time career victories list.



Tinkle has led Montana to at least 20 victories in each of the past four seasons. Over the past four seasons, his teams are a combined 93-34 with three Big Sky Championships. He is the first coach at Montana to lead the Grizzlies to the NCAA Tournament three times.

This marks just the sixth time a Grizzly coach has been honored by the Big Sky. Tinkle is the first Grizzly coach to win the honor twice. He is the eighth coach in league history to win the award in back-to-back seasons.

Montana junior Kareem Jamar was named the Big Sky's Most Valuable Player, while Cherry was named the Defensive Player of the Year. Cherry was named to the All-Conference First Team for the third straight season, while Jamar was tabbed for the second straight season. Ward was a Second Team All-Conference pick. Sophomore guard Jordan Gregory was named Honorable Mention All-Conference.

Tinkle was assisted by Jonathan Metzger-Jones, Freddie Owens and Kerry Rupp. Matt Erickson is the Director of Basketball Operations.

BIG SKY TOURNAMENT NOTES

- ✓ Montana is playing in the NCAA Tournament for the 10th time in school history. Seven of the appearances have come since 2002. Nine of those appearances have come since 1991, and this is Montana's third appearance in four seasons under Wayne Tinkle. Montana is 2-10 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.
- ✓ The Grizzlies are the last Big Sky team to win an NCAA Tournament game. With Wayne Tinkle as an assistant coach, the No. 12 seed Grizzlies upset Nevada 87-79 in a first-round game in 2006 in Salt Lake City, Utah. Since the field expanded to 64 teams in 1985, the Big Sky has won just three tournament games. Weber State beat Michigan State in 1995, and the Wildcats upset North Carolina in 1999.
- ✓ Tinkle is the first coach in Grizzly history to lead the program to the NCAA championship for a third time. Larry Krystkowiak, now the head coach at Utah, led UM to back-to-back appearances in 2005 and 2006. Don Holst guided UM to the tournament in 2002. Blaine Taylor led UM to the NCAAs in 1992 and 1997. Stew Morrill, now the head coach at Utah State, took Montana to the tournament in 1991. Legendary coach Jud Heathcote led UM to its first NCAA tournament in 1975.
- ✓ This is the second time in three seasons that Montana has been sent to San Jose. In 2010, Montana lost to New Mexico 62-57 at HP Pavilion.
- ✓ The Big Sky Conference is 16-47 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.
- ✓ This will be the fifth time the Big Sky has gone head-to-head with the Big East in the NCAA Tournament. The Big East has won all five previous meetings. In 2000, No. 2 seed St. John's edged No. 15 Northern Arizona 61-56. In 1996, Syracuse as the No. 4 seed beat Montana State 88-55. In 1995, No. 6 seed Georgetown beat No. 14 Weber State 53-51 in a second-round game after Weber State upset Michigan State. In 1986, No. 1 seed St. John's beat No. 16 seed Montana State 83-74.
- ✓ Since 1985, No. 13 seeds are 23-85 in first or second-round games. In each of the last five seasons, at least one No. 13 seed has pulled an upset.
- ✓ A Big Sky team is playing in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament for the fourth straight season. In 2010, Northern Colorado went 1-1, beating Portland at home, and falling to Pacific in Greeley. In 2011, Northern Arizona lost on the road to Santa Clara in the first round. In 2012, Weber State beat Utah Valley in a first-round game at home, and lost to Loyola Marymount on the road. This is the first time that two Big Sky teams have played in the CIT in the same season.
- ✓ Weber State is playing in a national postseason tournament for the sixth time in seven seasons under Randy Rahe. The Wildcats made the NCAA Tournament in 2007, the NIT in 2008 and 2009. Weber State played in the CBI in 2011, and the CIT in 2012.
- ✓ North Dakota is playing in the CIT for the third straight season. The previous two seasons, North Dakota earned an automatic bid to the CIT by winning the Great West Conference Tournament. North Dakota lost to Air Force in the 2011 first round, and fell to Drake in the 2012 first round.

BIG SKY MEN'S BASKETBALL - NCAA TOURNAMENT

THIS WEEK'S SKY HIGHLIGHTS

Montana will appear in the NCAA Tournament for the 10th time in school history on Thursday, taking on Syracuse in a second-round game in San Jose, Calif. The Grizzlies earned the Big Sky's automatic bid to the NCAA Championship by winning the Big Sky Championship last week. The Grizzlies are making their second straight appearance in the NCAA, and the third in four seasons under Wayne Tinkle. Since 2002, Montana is making its sixth NCAA appearance. UM beat Nevada in 2006 in Salt Lake City, the last time a Big Sky team won an NCAA Tournament game...Two other Big Sky teams will also participate in postseason tournaments. Weber State and North Dakota are part of the 16-team CollegelInsider.com Tournament. Weber State will play host to Cal Poly on Wednesday night, while North Dakota is scheduled to travel to Northern Iowa on Tuesday. Weber State is playing in the CIT for the second straight season, while North Dakota is in the field for the third straight season.

AROUND THE BIG SKY

MONTANA CONTINUES STREAK: Montana won its second straight Big Sky Championship at Dahlberg Arena, winning games against Northern Colorado and Weber State. The Grizzlies have now won 31 straight home games over Big Sky Conference teams dating back to a 73-67 loss to Montana State on Feb. 27, 2010. Montana has won 26 straight regular-season conference home games, plus an additional five postseason games. UM's 26 straight regular-season conference home wins is a league record. Montana is a combined 58-7 at home over the past four seasons. The Grizzlies went 15-1 at Dahlberg in 2012-13, with the only loss coming in two overtimes 68-67 to South Dakota State. Since that loss, Montana has won 12 straight at home. Montana enters the NCAA Tournament riding a six-game winning streak, which is tied for the eighth-longest active streak in the nation.

DONE IT BEFORE: Montana's back-to-back Big Sky Championships marks the ninth time since the tournament started in 1976 that a team has won in consecutive seasons. Montana is the only program to accomplish the feat three times. The Grizzlies won back-to-back titles in 1991 and 1992, and did so again in 2005 and 2006. Weber State is the only team to win three straight championships, doing so from 1978-1980. Idaho won back-to-back titles in 1981 and 1982, and again in 1989 and 1990. Nevada won in 1984 and 1985. Boise State won in 1993 and 1994. Portland State went two straight seasons under Ken Bone in 2008 and 2009.

REPEAT FIRST: Montana and Weber State met in the championship game for the second straight season, marking the first time in league history the same two teams have played for the championship in consecutive seasons. Montana won both matchups against Weber State at Dahlberg Arena. It marked the third time in four seasons Weber State and Montana have played for the championship, and also marked the fourth straight season the teams have met in the tournament. Montana won all four meetings. Weber State and Montana also met for the championship 1978, 1980, 1995 and 2005. Weber State won the first three meetings. Montana has won the last four.

MOST TITLES: Montana has now surpassed Weber State for the most Big Sky Conference Championships. The teams entered Saturday's championship game each with eight titles. All nine of Montana's championships have come since 1991. The Grizzlies have won titles in 1991, 1992, 1997, 2002, 2005, 2006, 2010, 2012 and 2013.

RPI UPDATE: Montana enters the NCAA Tournament with an RPI of 74. Syracuse, Montana's second-round opponent, has an RPI of 14. Montana non-conference strength of schedule is ranked at 24th in the nation. Weber State enters the CIT Tournament with an RPI of 85. The Wildcats' non-conference strength of schedule is 101. North Dakota enters the CIT with an RPI of 225. The Big Sky is ranked 28th among the Division I conferences. The top overall conference is the Mountain West, followed by the Big Ten, Big East, ACC and Big 12. Duke is No. 1 in the RPI entering the NCAA Tournament. New Mexico is No. 2.

AROUND THE BIG SKY

REPEAT FOR JAMAR: Montana junior guard/forward Kareem Jamar became just the fourth player in league history to win back-to-back tournament MVP honors. Jamar averaged 19.5 points, 7.5 rebounds, and 4.5 assists per game in leading UM to the championship. Weber State's Bruce Collins is the only player to win three tournament MVP honors (1978-80). Idaho's Ken Owens won the MVP in 1981 and 1982. Idaho's Riley Smith won tournament MVP honors in 1989 and 1990. Montana's Will Cherry was named to the All-Tournament Team for the third straight season.

CHERRY FIRST TO NINE: Montana senior guard Will Cherry became the first player in league history to appear in nine Big Sky tournament games. Cherry played in four championship games, winning three. He holds the all-time tournament record with 24 steals. In nine tournament games, Cherry scored 118 points with 34 rebounds, 28 assists, and 24 steals.

GABE PASSES DAME: Northern Arizona senior Gabe Rogers finished his career fifth on the Big Sky's all-time 3-pointers made list with 247. He hit two against Weber State in the quarterfinals, to pass former Weber State great Damian Lillard, who made 246. Weber State's Scott Bamforth enters the CIT with 235 career 3-pointers, tied for ninth on the league's all-time list. Rogers made 95 3-pointers this season, which ranks sixth in league single-season history.

YEAR OF THE BLOCK: Just 17 times prior to this season had a player in league history recorded 60 blocks in a season. Never before had more than two players accomplished the feat in the same season. Four players have at least 60 blocks this season. EWU's Martin Seiferth has 68, followed by teammate Venky Jois with 66. Southern Utah's Jayson Cheesman swatted 60 shots, while Weber State's Joel Bolomboy enters the CIT with 60.

Tip-ins: NAU's Stallon Saldivar finished his career with 505 career assists, which ranks sixth in Big Sky history...Montana's Will Cherry needs 18 points to become the 32nd player in league history to score 1,500 career points...WSU enters the CIT second in the nation in field-goal percentage and second in 3-point field-goal percentage. WSU is fourth defending the 3-pointer.

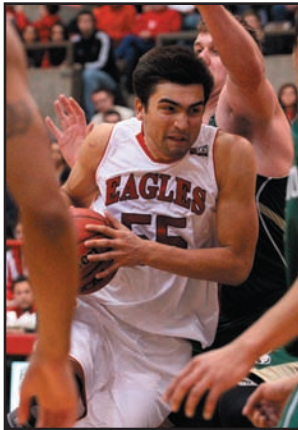

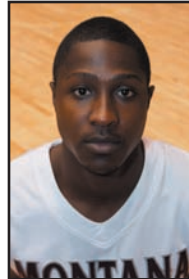

OGDEN, Utah (March 11, 2013) - For the first time in more than 20 years, a Montana Grizzly has been selected as the Big Sky Conference men's basketball Most Valuable Player.

Grizzly junior forward/guard Kareem Jamar was tabbed as the Most Valuable Player, and also named to the All-Conference First Team for the second straight season.

The 2012-13 All-Conference team and individual award winners were selected by the league head coaches on Monday morning. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own players.

Montana senior guard Will Cherry was selected as the Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight season, and also garnered First Team All-Conference honors for the third time.

Weber State junior Davion Berry, a transfer from Division II Cal State Monterey Bay, was named as the Newcomer of the Year, and also garnered All-Conference First Team honors.

Eastern Washington's Venky Jois was selected as the Freshman of the Year.

Jamar and North Dakota junior Troy Huff were unanimous selections to the First Team. Joining Jamar, Cherry and Huff on the First Team were Weber State senior guard Scott Bamforth, Northern Arizona senior guard Gabe Rogers, and Northern Colorado junior forward Derrick Barden.

Jamar, a versatile 6-foot-5 player from Venice, Calif., averaged 14.2 points, 5.9 rebounds, 4.1 assists per game. He ranks in the top 15 in the Big Sky Conference in assists (third), scoring (seventh), assist/turnover ratio (seventh), 3-point field-goal percentage (13th) and field-goal percentage (15th).

Jamar helped Montana to its second straight regular-season conference title. Montana won a single-season conference record 19 games and lost just once. The Grizzlies will take a 23-6 overall record into the conference championship, which begins Thursday in Missoula.

Jamar is the first Grizzly since Delvon Anderson to claim the Big Sky MVP, who shared the honor in 1991-92. Since the Big Sky began recognizing an MVP in 1978-79, Jamar is the fifth UM player to win the honor. Derrick Pope was MVP in 1982-83, followed by Larry Krystkowiak three consecutive seasons. Kevin Kearney won the MVP in 1990-91.

Cherry, a 6-1, 181-pounder from West Oakland, Calif., missed 10 games this season because of injury, but still garnered accolades. He is just the second player in league history to win back-to-back Defensive Player of the Year honors, joining Portland State's Seamus Boxley (2004 and 2005). Cherry is the third straight Grizzly to win the award. Center Brian Qvale captured it in 2010-11.

Cherry ranks second in league history in steals with 258. Cherry averaged 13.3 points, 4.4 rebounds, 4.2 assists and 1.8 steals per game during the regular season. Cherry is just the 19th player in league history to earn First Team honors three times.

Berry, a 6-4, 185-pounder from Oakland, sat out last season as a transfer. He shined in his first season at the Division I level, averaging a team-best 15.1 points per game to go along with 3.6 assists per game and a shooting percentage of .498. Berry is the third Weber State player in four seasons to win Newcomer of the Year.

Jois, a 6-7, 220-pound true freshman from Boronia, Australia, recorded nine double-doubles in his first collegiate season. He averaged 12.3 points, 9.0 rebounds and a league-best 2.4 blocked shots per game. Jois was an Honorable Mention All-Conference pick.

Bamforth returned to the First Team for the second time in three seasons. He was a First Team pick as a sophomore and Second Team as a junior. Bamforth averaged 13.3 points per game during the regular season. He leads the Big Sky with an .881 free-throw shooting percentage. He averages 2.5 3-pointers per game and shoots .448 percent from 3-point range.

Barden, a 6-5 transfer from Detroit, shined in his first season with Northern Colorado. He leads the Big Sky with 10 double-doubles. He finished the regular season, averaging a league-best 9.1 rebounds per game. Barden averages 13.6 points per game and shoots .558 percent from the floor.

Rogers rounded out the First Team. The senior from Houston, Texas, had enjoyed a strong final campaign after suffering a shoulder injury as a junior. Rogers, who ranks sixth all-time in made 3-pointers in league history with 245, finished the regular-season averaging a league-best 18.1 points per game. He has made a league-high 93 3-pointers.
