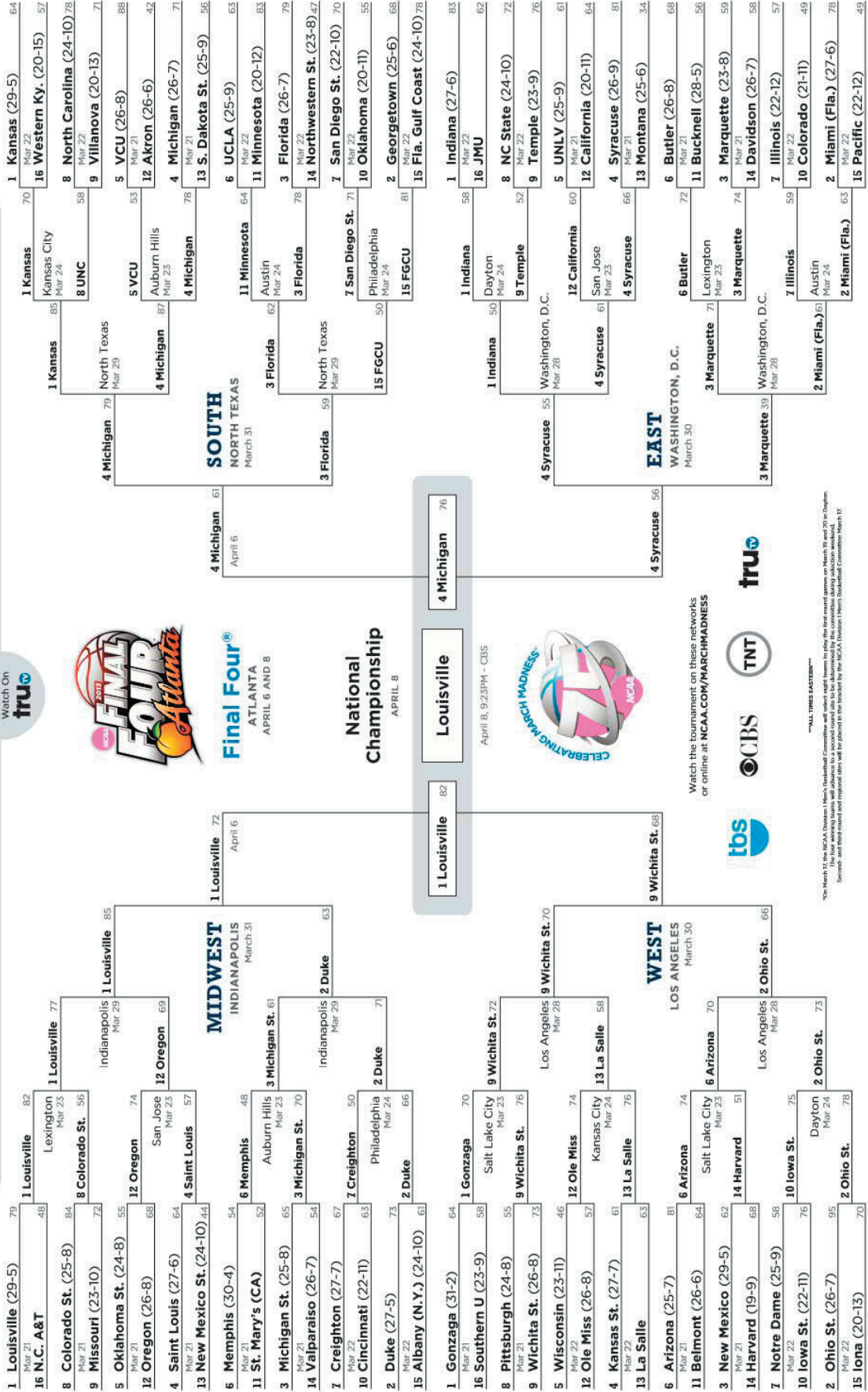

WSU Falls in CIT Championship

OGDEN - Weber State's season ended with a heartbreaking 77-74 loss to East Carolina in the championship game Tuesday night (April 7) at the Dee Events Center.

With the game tied 74-74 East Carolina's Akeem Richmond knocked down a long three-pointer as time expired to give the Pirates the CIT title. East Carolina ends its season 23-12.

Weber State led by seven at 24-17 midway through the first half when the Pirates responded with a 21-7 run over the next six minutes and took a 38-31 lead. ECU led 42-35 at halftime and the Pirates shot 60 percent from the field in the first half.

The Wildcats got going after the break and started the half on an 11-2 run and led by two points early in the half. With WSU leading 48-46 with 15:00 to play the Pirates went on a 13-4 run and held a seven point lead with nine minutes remaining. With ECU on top by seven again with 8:22 to play Weber State came back with a 10-0 run over the next two and a half minutes and led by three with 5:44 to play.

Weber State led by six points with 2:55 to play when East Carolina rattled off a 7-1 run and tied the game at 72-72 with 1:19 to play. A dunk by Robert Sampson gave the Pirates a lead at 74-73 with 38 seconds left. Davion Berry made one of two free throws to tie the game at 74-74 with 21 seconds left before Richmond knocked down the game-winning three-pointer.

The Wildcats shot just 9-19 from the free throw line for the game for 47 percent shooting and were 3-9 from the line in the last three minutes of play.

For the game East Carolina shot 58.8 percent from the field, the best shooting percentage against Weber State all season. Weber State shot 52.7 percent but did not rebounded the Pirates 30-25.

"There were two good basketball teams out there tonight," said WSU head coach Randy Rahe. "We didn't guard very well in the first half but we put ourselves in position in the second half. We didn't knock down the free throws when we needed but I was really proud of our team. We fought really hard and we've had a terrific season. We lost to a really good basketball team that is well coached and played a terrific game. We were just one play away and they made a great shot at the end."

Four Wildcats scored in double figures led by senior Scott Bamforth who finished with 19 points on 7-13 shooting. He was 4-8 from the three-point line in his final game of his career. Bamforth finished his career as WSU's leader in career three-pointers and 11th in career scoring.

"It hurts to know that we put ourselves in a position to win we just didn't finish it, so it's very disappointing," Bamforth said. "We had such great support from our fans tonight and it's disappointing we couldn't win it for all the people that have supported us. The missed free throws certainly hurt us. We had a terrific season we just came up a game short."

Frank Otis added 16 points and eight rebounds on 8-12 shooting and Davion Berry added 16 points, seven rebounds and six assists. Kyle Tresnak had 10 points and seven rebounds. Bamforth, Otis and Tresnak were all named to the CIT All-Tournament Team.

Weber State ends an historic season with a 30-7 overall record. The Wildcats became the first team in Big Sky history to win 30 games and to play in the championship game of a postseason tournament. The 'Cats were 18-2 in Big Sky play.

"I've loved coaching this team," Rahe added. "I've had as much fun coaching this team as any I've been around. They accomplished an awful lot and have had a terrific record breaking season. Winning 30 games is a tremendous accomplishment. We wanted the final prize and we didn't get it but down the line they will look back at this season with satisfaction."

2012-13 Highlights and Records

- ✓ Montana set the Big Sky standard with 25 straight regular-season conference wins. The streak started during the 2011-12 season when UM won its final 11 regular-season conference games. UM started this season by winning its first 14 conference games. The previous record was 24 set by Weber State from 1967-68 to 1969-70. Counting postseason victories, Montana won 26 in a row over Big Sky teams.
- ✓ Montana will enter the 2013-14 season looking to expand on its conference record of 26 straight regular-season home conference wins. The previous record was 23 set by Idaho from 1980-81 to 1982-83. Montana went 10-0 at home in regular-season conference games this past season. Counting postseason games, UM has won 31 straight over Big Sky teams at Dahlberg Arena.
- ✓ Montana set the Big Sky single-season record for regular-season conference wins with 19. This marked the first time the Big Sky had played 20 conference games in a season. UM went 19-1. Weber State was 18-2. The previous record for conference wins in a season was 15 by Weber State in 1968-69 and 2008-09, and Montana in 2011-12.
- ✓ League newcomers North Dakota and Southern Utah both made the Big Sky Championship. North Dakota went 12-8 in conference play, the most victories by a first-year member.
- ✓ Weber State set the Big Sky single-season record for wins with 30 and games played with 37. The previous record for victories was 27 by Idaho in 1981-82 and Weber State in 1968-69. Weber State held the previous record for games played in a season with 34 in 1978-79.
- ✓ Weber State became the first Big Sky team to advance to the championship of a postseason national tournament. The Wildcats won four games en route to hosting the CIT Championship. The Wildcats lost 77-74 to East Carolina on a last-second shot.
- ✓ Weber State set new Big Sky single-season standards for field-goals made (990) and total points with 2,800. The 1975-76 Wildcats made 981 field goals. The Wildcats scored 2,611 points in 1998-99.
- ✓ Eastern Washington blocked 176 shots this season, falling just short of the single-season Big Sky record of 179 set by Idaho State in 2005-06.
- ✓ Six Weber State players set a single-season record for games played in a season. Davion Berry, Scott Bamforth, Frank Otis, Jordan Richardson, Joel Bolomboy and Gelaun Wheelright all played in 37 games this season. The previous record was 34 set by Weber State's Ben Howland, Bruce Collins and Richard Smith in 1979.
- ✓ Scott Bamforth made 103 3-pointers this season, tying for the third-most in single-season conference history. Bamforth made 258 3-pointers in his three-year career, putting him fifth on the all-time list. Northern Arizona's Gabe Rogers made 247 career 3-pointers, putting him sixth on the all-time list. Rogers made 95 3-pointers in 2012-13, putting him seventh all-time in single-season league history.
- ✓ Montana's Will Cherry finished his four-year career with 255 career steals, which is second all-time in league history. Sacramento State's DeShawn Freeman holds the record with 283. Cherry missed 10 games his senior season with injuries.
- ✓ Northern Arizona's Stallion Saldivar finished his career with 505 career assists, placing him sixth on the all-time conference list.
- ✓ PSU coach Tyler Geving was a finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year, presented by Collegeinsider.com. Southern Utah's Nick Robinson was a finalist for the Joe B. Hall Award, presented by Collegeinsider.com to the top first-year coach at a Division I program.
- ✓ Montana received a vote in the Associated Press Top 25 poll prior to the start of the NCAA Tournament. Weber State received a vote in final USA Today Coaches' Poll of the season.
- ✓ Weber State finished the season leading the nation in field-goal percentage (.506) and 3-point field-goal percentage (.416). WSU was second in the nation in 3-point field-goal percentage defense (.282). WSU was also fifth in scoring margin (14.2) and 10th in winning percentage (81.1). Montana was fifth in free-throw percentage (.767). EWU was 11th in blocked per game (8.5)
- ✓ WSU's Scott Bamforth was fourth in the nation in 3-point field-goal percentage (.456). North Dakota's Troy Huff finished 26th in the nation in scoring at 19.2 points per game. He was also 16th in steals (2.31).
- ✓ Montana finished ranked 14th in the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25. Weber State was 15th.

Montana's Tinkle Named Coach of the Year

OGDEN, Utah (March 18, 2013) - For the second consecutive season, Montana's Wayne Tinkle has been selected as the Big Sky Conference Men's Basketball Coach of the Year by his peers.

Tinkle guided Montana to 19-1 conference record and the program's second consecutive regular-season conference title. The Grizzlies won their second straight Big Sky Championship last week, downing Weber State 67-64 in the title game.

Montana will take a 25-6 record into the second round of the NCAA Tournament on Thursday as the Grizzlies face Syracuse of the Big East Conference.

Tinkle and the Grizzlies won 25 games despite missing All-Conference guard Will Cherry for 10 games. Cherry, the two-time Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year, missed the first seven games of the season as he recovered from a broken foot. He missed three more games late in the season with a foot injury. Senior forward Mathias Ward also missed the final seven games with a foot injury.

Montana's 19 regular-season conference wins were the most in league history. The Grizzlies set conference records for most consecutive regular-season conference victories with 25, a streak that started during the 2011-12 season. Montana has won 28 straight regular-season conference home games, and 31 in a row overall at home against Big Sky teams.

Over the past two seasons, Tinkle's Grizzlies have gone a combined 34-2 in conference regular-season games, and 38-2 overall against conference foes including postseason games. Montana's combined overall record the past two seasons is 50-13.

Tinkle, now in his seventh season at his alma mater, has amassed an overall record of 141-77. He is 85-31 in regular-season conference games. He ranks seventh in conference history in league victories. He is 11th on the Big Sky's all-time career victories list.



Tinkle has led Montana to at least 20 victories in each of the past four seasons. Over the past four seasons, his teams are a combined 93-34 with three Big Sky Championships. He is the first coach at Montana to lead the Grizzlies to the NCAA Tournament three times.

This marks just the sixth time a Grizzly coach has been honored by the Big Sky. Tinkle is the first Grizzly coach to win the honor twice. He is the eighth coach in league history to win the award in back-to-back seasons.

Montana junior Kareem Jamar was named the Big Sky's Most Valuable Player, while Cherry was named the Defensive Player of the Year. Cherry was named to the All-Conference First Team for the third straight season, while Jamar was tabbed for the second straight season. Ward was a Second Team All-Conference pick. Sophomore guard Jordan Gregory was named Honorable Mention All-Conference.

Tinkle was assisted by Jonathan Metzger-Jones, Freddie Owens and Kerry Rupp. Matt Erickson is the Director of Basketball Operations.

Montana's Tinkle a Finalist for Hugh Durham Award

Montana's Wayne Tinkle was a finalist for the Hugh Durham Award.

The Durham Award is presented annually to the top mid-major coach.

Tinkle led UM to a 19-1 conference record, the program's second straight Big Sky Championship, and a 25-7 overall record.

"This is as good of a list of candidates that we have had," said Hugh Durham. "It will be difficult

to select one winner from this group."

AROUND THE BIG SKY

MONTANA CONTINUES STREAK: Montana won its second straight Big Sky Championship at Dahlberg Arena, winning games against Northern Colorado and Weber State. The Grizzlies have now won 31 straight home games over Big Sky Conference teams dating back to a 73-67 loss to Montana State on Feb. 27, 2010. Montana has won 26 straight regular-season conference home games, plus an additional five postseason games. UM's 26 straight regular-season conference home wins is a league record. Montana is a combined 58-7 at home over the past four seasons. The Grizzlies went 15-1 at Dahlberg in 2012-13, with the only loss coming in two overtimes 68-67 to South Dakota State. Since that loss, Montana has won 12 straight at home. Montana enters the NCAA Tournament riding a six-game winning streak, which is tied for the eighth-longest active streak in the nation.

DONE IT BEFORE: Montana's back-to-back Big Sky Championships marks the ninth time since the tournament started in 1976 that a team has won in consecutive seasons. Montana is the only program to accomplish the feat three times. The Grizzlies won back-to-back titles in 1991 and 1992, and did so again in 2005 and 2006. Weber St. is the only team to win three straight championships, doing so from 1978-1980. Idaho won back-to-back titles in 1981 and 1982, and again in 1989 and 1990. Nevada won in 1984 and 1985. Boise St. won in 1993 and 1994. Portland State went two straight seasons under Ken Bone in 2008 and 2009.

REPEAT FIRST: Montana and Weber State met in the championship game for the second straight season, marking the first time in league history the same two teams have played for the championship in consecutive seasons. Montana won both matchups against Weber State at Dahlberg Arena. It marked the third time in four seasons Weber State and Montana have played for the championship, and also marked the fourth straight season the teams have met in the tournament. Montana won all four meetings. Weber State and Montana also met for the championship 1978, 1980, 1995 and 2005. Weber State won the first three meetings. Montana has won the last four.

MOST TITLES: Montana has now surpassed Weber State for the most Big Sky Conference Championships. The teams entered the championship game each with eight titles. All nine of Montana's championships have come since 1991. The Griz have won titles in 1991, 1992, 1997, 2002, 2005, 2006, 2010, 2012 and 2013.

GRIZ FALL TO SYRACUSE: For the seventh straight season, the Big Sky representative lost its first game in the NCAA Tournament. Montana fell 81-34 to Syracuse in San Jose, Calif. Syracuse had advanced to the Final Four. Montana lost in the NCAA tournament for the second straight season, and the third time in four years. The Grizzlies struggled against the Orange's strong 2-3 zone defense. UM shot .204 percent from the field and .192 percent from 3-point range. Spencer Coleman, Kareem Jamar and Jordan Gregory led Montana with five points. Will Cherry had three steals in his final collegiate game. Cherry finished his career with 265 career steals, which ranks second all-time in league history.

FINAL RPI: In the final RPI Report of the 2012-13 season provided by Collegiate Basketball News, Weber State led Big Sky teams at 78. Montana was second at 82, followed by North Dakota at 222 and Northern Arizona at 255. Northern Colorado closed at 256, and Sacramento State was at 283. Duke was No. 1 overall, followed by national champion Louisville. The Big Sky finished 28th among the Division I conferences. Montana had the toughest schedule strength at 198.

BAMFORTH CAPS CAREER: Weber State's Scott Bamforth capped his career with four 3-pointers in the CIT loss to East Carolina. Bamforth finished his career with 258 career 3-pointers, fifth-best in league history. Bamforth made 103 3-pointers this season, tied for the third-most in conference single-season history. Bamforth made 259 of 299 free throws for a career percentage of .866, finishing ninth in league history. Bamforth made 23 of 44 3-pointers during the CIT. Bamforth, Kyle Tresnak and Frank Otis were all named to the CIT All-Tournament team.

AROUND THE BIG SKY

REPEAT FOR JAMAR: Montana junior guard/forward Kareem Jamar became just the fourth player in league history to win back-to-back tournament MVP honors. Jamar averaged 19.5 points, 7.5 rebounds, and 4.5 assists per game in leading UM to the championship. Weber State's Bruce Collins is the only player to win three tournament MVP honors (1978-80). Idaho's Ken Owens won the MVP in 1981 and 1982. Idaho's Riley Smith won tournament MVP honors in 1989 and 1990. Montana's Will Cherry was named to the All-Tournament Team for the third straight season.

CHERRY FIRST TO NINE: Montana senior guard Will Cherry became the first player in league history to appear in nine Big Sky tournament games. Cherry played in four championship games, winning three. He holds the all-time tournament record with 24 steals. In nine tournament games, Cherry scored 118 points with 34 rebounds, 28 assists, and 24 steals.

YEAR OF THE BLOCK: Just 17 times prior to this season had a player in league history recorded 60 blocks in a season. Never before had more than two players accomplished the feat in the same season. Four players have at least 60 blocks this season. EWU's Martin Seiferth has 68, followed by teammate Venky Jois with 66. Weber State freshman Joel Bolomboy has 62 blocks and Southern Utah's Jayson Cheesman swatted 60 shots.

JAMAR NAMED HONORABLE MENTION ALL-AMERICAN: Montana junior Kareem Jamar, the Big Sky regular-season and postseason MVP, was named an honorable mention All-American by the Associated Press last week. Jamar one of one 40 players to earn honorable mention honors. He was the only Big Sky player to earn the honor.

Tip-ins: NAU's Stallon Saldivar finished his career with 505 career assists, which ranks sixth in Big Sky history...Montana ranked fifth in the nation in free-throw percentage at .767 percent.....NAU's Gabe Rogers finished his career with 247 career 3-pointers, which ranks sixth all-time in league history...UND junior Troy Huff, who missed seven games with a broken jaw, reached the minimum percentage of games required to appear in the league leaders. Huff ended the season leading the league in scoring and steals.

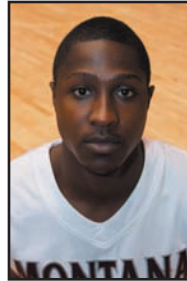

OGDEN, Utah (March 11, 2013) - For the first time in more than 20 years, a Montana Grizzly has been selected as the Big Sky Conference men's basketball Most Valuable Player.

Grizzly junior forward/guard Kareem Jamar was tabbed as the Most Valuable Player, and also named to the All-Conference First Team for the second straight season.

The 2012-13 All-Conference team and individual award winners were selected by the league head coaches on Monday morning. Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own players.

Montana senior guard Will Cherry was selected as the Defensive Player of the Year for the second straight season, and also garnered First Team All-Conference honors for the third time.

Weber State junior Davion Berry, a transfer from Division II Cal State Monterey Bay, was named as the Newcomer of the Year, and also garnered All-Conference First Team honors.

Eastern Washington's Venky Jois was selected as the Freshman of the Year.

Jamar and North Dakota junior Troy Huff were unanimous selections to the First Team. Joining Jamar, Cherry and Huff on the First Team were Weber State senior guard Scott Bamforth, Northern Arizona senior guard Gabe Rogers, and Northern Colorado junior forward Derrick Barden.

Jamar, a versatile 6-foot-5 player from Venice, Calif., averaged 14.2 points, 5.9 rebounds, 4.1 assists per game. He ranks in the top 15 in the Big Sky Conference in assists (third), scoring (seventh), assist/turnover ratio (seventh), 3-point field-goal percentage (13th) and field-goal percentage (15th).

Jamar helped Montana to its second straight regular-season conference title. Montana won a single-season conference record 19 games and lost just once. The Grizzlies will take a 23-6 overall record into the conference championship, which begins Thursday in Missoula.

Jamar is the first Grizzly since Delvon Anderson to claim the Big Sky MVP, who shared the honor in 1991-92. Since the Big Sky began recognizing an MVP in 1978-79, Jamar is the fifth UM player to win the honor. Derrick Pope was MVP in 1982-83, followed by Larry Krystkowiak three consecutive seasons. Kevin Kearney won the MVP in 1990-91.

Cherry, a 6-1, 181-pounder from West Oakland, Calif., missed 10 games this season because of injury, but still garnered accolades. He is just the second player in league history to win back-to-back Defensive Player of the Year honors, joining Portland State's Seamus Boxley (2004 and 2005). Cherry is the third straight Grizzly to win the award. Center Brian Qvale captured it in 2010-11.

Cherry ranks second in league history in steals with 258. Cherry averaged 13.3 points, 4.4 rebounds, 4.2 assists and 1.8 steals per game during the regular season. Cherry is just the 19th player in league history to earn First Team honors three times.

Berry, a 6-4, 185-pounder from Oakland, sat out last season as a transfer. He shined in his first season at the Division I level, averaging a team-best 15.1 points per game to go along with 3.6 assists per game and a shooting percentage of .498. Berry is the third Weber State player in four seasons to win Newcomer of the Year.

Jois, a 6-7, 220-pound true freshman from Boronia, Australia, recorded nine double-doubles in his first collegiate season. He averaged 12.3 points, 9.0 rebounds and a league-best 2.4 blocked shots per game. Jois was an Honorable Mention All-Conference pick.

Bamforth returned to the First Team for the second time in three seasons. He was a First Team pick as a sophomore and Second Team as a junior. Bamforth averaged 13.3 points per game during the regular season. He leads the Big Sky with an .881 free-throw shooting percentage. He averages 2.5 3-pointers per game and shoots .448 percent from 3-point range.

Barden, a 6-5 transfer from Detroit, shined in his first season with Northern Colorado. He leads the Big Sky with 10 double-doubles. He finished the regular season, averaging a league-best 9.1 rebounds per game. Barden averages 13.6 points per game and shoots .558 percent from the floor.

Rogers rounded out the First Team. The senior from Houston, Texas, had enjoyed a strong final campaign after suffering a shoulder injury as a junior. Rogers, who ranks sixth all-time in made 3-pointers in league history with 245, finished the regular-season averaging a league-best 18.1 points per game. He has made a league-high 93 3-pointers.
