BIG SKY HIGHLIGHTS

Career Records: Kylie Kuhns broke the Big Sky record in career rebounds. She now has 1,234 in her career. She broke the record of 1,174 set from 2004-08 by Natalie Doma of Idaho State. Kuhns became the fifth player in Big Sky history to have more than 1,000 rebounds...Amy Patton ended her career with 1,938 points. With that total she ranks fifth in the record book.

Individual Single-Game Ranks: On Nov. 24, NAU's Amy Patton tied the single-game record for points scored with 41 against Bradley. She became the fourth person to tie that record...That same game, Patton had 10 steals, which ranks tied for second in single game, and she also is tied for third in field-goals attempted with 29...On Dec. 1, against Oregon State, SAC's Se'nyce Parris made nine 3-pointers, which ties for first in single-game history. She also ranks tied for seventh with 39 points scored. And on Nov. 24, PSU's Angela Misa had 21 rebounds against Butler, which ranks tied for sixth in a single game.

Individual Single-Season Ranks: Sacramento State's Alle Moreno set the 3-point attempts in a season. She had 256 this season. SAC's Megan Kritscher set the block shots record in a season with 111.

Team Single-Game Ranks: On Dec. 8, Southern Utah scored 15 3-pointers against San Jose State. Th at ranks tied for fourth in a single-game...Northern Colorado ranks four times in a single-game as they defeated Johnson & Wales on Dec. 30. NC ranks tied for fi rst in rebounds with 71, tied for fourth in 3-point fi eld-goals made with 15, eighth in 3-point field-goals attempted with 36, and tied for ninth with 102 points scored.

SELVIG NAMED BIG SKY COACH OF THE YEAR

OGDEN, Utah (March 19, 2013) - Montana's Robin Selvig has been named the Big Sky Conference Women's Basketball Coach of the Year. This is the 18th time that Selvig has been named COY dating back to the 1982-83 season.

Selvig is in his 35th season with the Lady Griz. He led Montana to a 24-7 overall record, and went 16-4 in conference play to win the regular-season title and host the tournament. Montana had a bye in the first round as the No. 1 seed. The Lady Griz defeated the No. 5 seed Sacramento State on Friday 74-53 and went on to defeat the No. 2 seed Northern Colorado in the championship game 56-43.

Montana won its 20th title, and will face the No. 4 seed Georgia in the NCAA Tournament in Spokane, Wash. Under Selvig, two players were named to the 2012-13 All-Conference team in senior Katie Baker and Kenzie De Boer. Both were named to the first team, while Baker was also named the regular-season Most Valuable Player.

After the conference tournament both Baker and De Boer were named to the all-tournament team. De Boer was named tournament Most Valuable Player.

In Selvig's 35 seasons with Montana, he has compiled a 798-254 record overall with a 319-67 Big Sky record. The last time that UM was in the NCAA Tournament was in 2011 when it lost in the first round to UCLA in Spokane, Wash.

He is assisted by Annette Rocheleau, Shannon Schweyen and Trish Duce. Rocheleau, who is in her 32nd year on Selvig's staff, is the longest-tenured assistant women's basketball coach in the country. Schweyen, entering her 21st year, and Duce, beginning her 19th, rank eighth and ninth on that list.

The Lady Griz will be going to their 16th NCAA Tournament to face the No. 4 seed Georgia on Saturday in Spokane, Wash., at 3:30 p.m. Pacific. The last time Montana faced Georgia in the tournament was in 2000 and the Lady Griz lost 74-56. The last time Montana moved out of the first round was in 1995, when it defeated San Diego State and then lost in the second round to Purdue.



Big Sky Announces Women's Basketball All-Conference Team and Award Winners

OGDEN, Utah (March 11, 2013) - The Big Sky Conference has announced the Women's Basketball All-Conference team and individual award winners for the 2012-13 season. The awards were decided by a vote of the league's 11 head coaches.

Katie Baker became the ninth Montana player in Big Sky history to earn the league's Most Valuable Player Award. The senior was a unanimous First-Team selection. This is the third year in a row Baker has been named to the All-Conference First Team.

Baker helped her team to the regular-season title and the right to host the Big Sky Conference Championship. She averages 13.6 points a game and 7.3 rebounds a game. Baker, a senior from Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, has four 20+ point games, seven 10+ rebound games, and has recorded seven double-doubles this season.

For the second year in a row, Northern Colorado's D'shara Strange has been selected as the league's Defensive Player of the Year. She was also named Outstanding Freshman the 2010-11 season. Strange, a junior from Fountain, Colo., ranks second in the conference averaging 15.0 points per game. She averages 7.2 rebounds a game, which ranks eighth in the conference. Strange was a unanimous First-Team Selection.

Hayley Hodgins of Eastern Washington was named the league's Outstanding Freshman, and Angela Misa of Portland State was selected as Top Newcomer. Hodgins, from Pasco, Wash., ranks eighth in the Big Sky in 3-point field goal percentage with .373. EWU hasn't had a player named Outstanding Freshman since the 1992-93 season, when Kristy Missall was named. Misa, a junior from Oceanside, Calif., and transfer from Oregon State, ranks second in the Big Sky in rebounds as she averages 10.2 a game. She played her last game of the season on Feb. 9 before she was injured.

Others named to the first team were Lexie Nelson, Eastern Washington; Amy Patton, Northern Arizona; Kylie Kuhns, Sacramento State and Kenzie De Boer, Montana.

The Big Sky Conference tournament will be March 13, 15-16 in Missoula, Mont. The three quarterfinal games will be played on Wednesday starting at 3 p.m. Mountain. The winners of the quarterfinals will advance to the semifinals played on Friday starting at 11 a.m. And the championship will be played at 2 p.m. Mountain on Saturday. All games can be seen for Free on Big Sky TV with Peter Young and Jay McMillin having the call.

EWU'S NELSON, SAC'S MORENO NAMED BIG SKY CONFERENCE CO-PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

OGDEN, Utah (March 11, 2013) - Eastern Washington's Lexie Nelson and Sacramento State's Alle Moreno have been named the Big Sky Conference Women's Basketball Co-Players of the Week for the games played the week of March 4-10.

Nelson, a sophomore guard from Butte, Mont., led EWU to a home sweep with wins against Idaho State and Weber State. Nelson averaged 21 points on 57 percent shooting, and had 12 rebounds, three assists and three steals on the weekend, as EWU finished third in the Big Sky race for the second year in a row.

In a nail-biting game against the Bengals on Thursday, Nelson put the team on her back and propelled the Eagles to a 67-61 overtime win, which was EWU's first OT game in more than two years. After scoring 10 second-half points and grabbing seven rebounds to keep Eastern in the game, Nelson went a perfect 3-of-3 from the field in the overtime period, including a big spot-up 3-pointer that put Eastern back in front after ISU had taken the lead. Nelson finished the contest with a career-high 24 points on 7-of-10 shooting from the floor and flawless 8-of-8 effort at the charity stripe. With the win, EWU earned the first regular-season sweep of Idaho State since 2003, and solidified the No. 3 seed in the tourney, which otherwise would have gone to the Bengals.

In the regular-season finale against Weber State, Nelson had another impressive 18 points to go along with four rebounds, three steals and one assist.

Moreno, a junior from Lodi, Calif., averaged a team-high 18 points per game as the Hornets swept a weekend against the Montana schools for the first time in program history.

Moreno shot 40 percent from the field (12-of-30) and 42.1 percent on 3-pointers (8-of-19) as she averaged 18 points, five rebounds, three assists and 1.5 steals in the two games. She also went 4-of-5 at the free throw line and played a team-high 65 minutes over the two games.
