## BIG SKY PLAYOFF FACTS

- ✓ The Big Sky Conference has advanced at least two teams to the playoffs in 29 of the last 31 years. The Big Sky has sent multiple teams to the postseason in 16 straight seasons. This is the eighth time and the third straight year at least three Big Sky teams have qualified. A record four advanced in 2013.
- ✓ Eastern Washington is making its third consecutive playoff appearance, its fifth in six years, and its 10th as a member of the Big Sky Conference. EWU won the 2010 national championship, and advanced to the semifinals in 1997, 2012 and 2013.
- ✓ Montana returns to the playoffs for the 22nd time and the second straight year. The Grizzlies' 2011 appearance was vacated due to NCAA violations. Montana advanced to the postseason a record 17 straight seasons from 1993-2009. In 2011, UM won two playoff games and lost one, but those games have been vacated. Montana has won two national titles.
- ✓ The Big Sky is 78-67 all-time in FCS playoffs, a winning percentage of .538. The Big Sky has won at least one playoff game in eight consecutive seasons.
- ✓ Montana's victory over San Diego gave the Big Sky Conference a victory in the postseason for the ninth consecutive years.
- ✓ A Big Sky team has advanced to the semifinals six straight seasons if you count Montana's 2011 appearance. Montana qualified for the national championship game in 2008 and 2009. Eastern Washington won the championship in 2010, and advanced to the 2012 and 2013 semifinals.
- ✓ Big Sky teams have won six national championships: Boise State (1980), Idaho State (1981), Montana State (1984), Montana (1995, 2001) and Eastern Washington (2010).
- ✓ Eastern Washington, Montana and Montana State are all playoff regulars, but this marks the first time all three are in the field in the same year.

## **FIRST-ROUND RECAPS**

### **Montana 52, San Diego 14**

MISSOULA, Mont. - The University of Montana dominated on both sides of the football, and the result was a 52-14 victory over the visiting University of San Diego Toreros in a first round NCAA FCS playoff game in UM's Washington-Grizzly Stadium Saturday afternoon.

With the victory, Montana (9-4) advances to the second round of the playoffs, and will play fellow Big Sky Conference member and league champion Eastern Washington (10-2), Saturday, Dec. 6, in Cheney.

The Grizzlies scored on six of their first eight possessions in the first half and held the Toreros (9-3) of the Pioneer Football League scoreless, to jump to an insurmountable 38-0 halftime lead.

Montana grabbed an early 7-0 lead with 8:38 left in the first quarter on a 22-yard touchdown pass from senior quarterback Jordan Johnson to junior wide receiver Jamaal Jones. The Griz opened up a 14-0 advantage late (1:14) in the opening quarter on a 3-yard scoring pass from Johnson to senior halfback Jordan Canada.

The Grizzlies then scored on all four of their possession in the second quarter, and when Canada scored again, this time from 17 yards out, UM led 38-to-zip with 2:34 remaining until intermission.

Sophomore running back John Nguyen started UM's second quarter scoring onslaught by scoring on a 60-yard punt return, which was his first TD return and the longest punt return of his career, and gave the Griz a 21-0 lead.

Junior kicker Daniel's Sullivan's 41-yard field goal upped the Grizzlies' lead to 24-0 at the 10:20 mark of the second stanza. After Sullivan's three-pointer, there was another Johnson-to-Jones hook-up, this one covering 30 yards, and that TD was followed by Canada's 17-yard jaunt, and Montana never looked back.

The Griz tallied two more unanswered touchdowns on TD throws of 18 and 12 yards by senior QB Shay Smithwick-Hann to redshirt freshman receiver Josh Janssen (with 7:37 to go in the third quarter) and senior wide-out Kevin Berland. Berland, who made his first career catch earlier in the game, gave the Griz a 52-0 cushion on his TD reception, which came with 12:16 remaining in the fourth quarter.

USD finally scored with 6:05 left to play on a scoring pass from halfback Dallas Kessman to freshman wide receiver Justin Priest from 27 yards out. Priest scored again on an 11-yard touchdown throw from junior QB Trey Wheeler, which made the score 52-14, UM, with 2:28 left.

The way Montana controlled the game is evident in the first half statistics. The Grizzlies out-gained the Toreros 315 to 17 in total yards, and had 18 first downs compared to USD's one. Most of UM's starters played in just the first half.

Johnson was 13-of-20-0 for 153 yards and 3 TDs, while Canada had 17 carries for 105 yards rushing with a scored one touchdown rushing and one receiving, and Jones had 6 receptions for 93 yards and 2 scores - all of those yards for those three players were accumulated in the first half. added 5 tackles apiece for the Griz.

### **South Dakota State 47 Montana State 40**

BOZEMAN, Mont. - South Dakota State running back Zach Zenner rushed for 252 yards and scored five touchdowns, leading South Dakota State to a 47-40 win over Montana State in the first round of the FCS Playoffs at Bobcat Stadium on Saturday.

Zenner scored four times on the ground and once in the air, and become the first opponent back to gain more than 200 yards in Bobcat Stadium since Danny Woodhead in 2006. He moved into the top three in FCS history in rushing yards, and teamed with quarterback Austin Sumner (249 yards passing) to form an unstoppable duo.

Yet the Bobcats nearly had enough to overcome South Dakota State's supreme talent. MSU rallied from an 11-point deficit to take a third quarter lead then nearly recovered an on-side kick that would have set the team up for a potential game-tying drive in the game's final 70 seconds.

"I kind of slipped," said Cole Moore, who had a shot at the on-side kick after the Cats pulled within 47-40. "It just kind of squirted out."

That the Bobcats stayed in the game to the end was a testament to a hard-nosed sophomore running back and a pair of players who had been injured the last two weeks. While senior running back Shawn Johnson was likely to play all week, quarterback Dakota Prukop's status was undetermined until game time.

They each played brilliantly. Johnson compiled 204 all-purpose yards, leading the team with 59 receiving yards. Prukop was marvelous, throwing for 280 yards and rushing for 14 more on a leg injury that has kept him out the last two weeks.

"It was gut-wrenching, back-and-forth, and it went right up until kickoff," Bobcat coach Rob Ash said of the decision to play Prukop. "You could tell he wasn't quite 100 percent."

Ash lauded Johnson on his final effort in Bobcat Stadium. "He really wanted to play today. I thought he really played well, and contributed in a lot of ways." Johnson finished with 4,681 all-purpose yards in his career, a school record, and set the single-season mark Saturday with 1,961.

In the absence of Johnson and junior running back Anthony Knight, Chad Newell has emerged as a bastion of toughness and consistency. He rushed for 101 yards on the day and had another 42 yards receiving. He was also a special teams mainstay, and his five rushing touchdowns matched Zenner's total for the afternoon and also tied a Bobcat single-game record.

"Chad Newell was a warrior today," Ash said. "What a great performance. Hard-nosed, gutsy, (it was) whatever adjective you want to put on it."

Still, the story of the day was Zenner. "He's a great player," Ash said. "I thought we did a really good job on many of his runs, but when he broke free he was out of there. He is very impressive."

While SDSU advances to play at North Dakota State next Saturday, the Bobcats' season ends. MSU finishes 8-5, and tied for second in the Big Sky.

## PLAYOFF PREVIEWS

### Montana (9-4) at Eastern Washington (10-2)

**THE RECORDS:** Montana brings a 9-4 record to Cheney. The Grizzlies finished 6-2 in Big Sky play, earning an at-large bid to the postseason. Montana brings a three-game winning streak to Cheney...Eastern Washington finished the regular season 10-2, winning the Big Sky with a 7-1 overall record. Eastern Washington, which had a bye last week, has also won three in a row.

**THE SERIES:** Montana leads 26-14-1. The teams first met in 1938. EWU has won three in a row and four of the last five. This will mark the first meeting between the teams in the postseason.

**LAST MEETING:** Vernon Adams Jr. returned after missing four games with a broken foot to throw for 410 yards and four touchdowns as the Eagles beat Montana 36-26 on Nov. 8 in Cheney. Cooper Kupp caught eight passes for 134 yards and a touchdown, and also returned a punt 67 yards for a touchdown. Montana's Jordan Johnson threw for 447 yard with three touchdowns and two interceptions. Jamal Jones had nine catches for 139 yards and a touchdown in the loss.

**UP NEXT:** The winner will advance to the quarterfinals against the winner of the Illinois State-Northern Iowa second-round game. If EWU wins, the quarterfinal will be in Cheney.

**THE COACHES** Montana's Mick Delaney is 24-13 in his third season. Delaney is 1-1 in the playoffs...Eastern Washington's Beau Baldwin is 66-24 in his seventh season. Baldwin is 8-3 in the FCS playoffs. Baldwin is 3-0 vs. Delaney.

**BIG SKY VS. BIG SKY** This will mark the eighth time that Big Sky teams have battled in the playoffs against each other. The last time was 2008 when Montana beat Weber State 24-13 in a quarterfinal game in Missoula. The home team has won five of the previous seven matchups of Big Sky vs. Big Sky teams in the FCS playoffs. This is the fourth time Montana has played another Big Sky team in the playoffs. In 1982, Montana lost at Idaho 21-7 in the first round. In 1988, Montana lost 38-19 to Idaho in the first round. This is Eastern Washington first game against a Big Sky team in the postseason since EWU joined the Big Sky in 1987. In 1985. Eastern Washington beat Big Sky member Idaho 42-38 in a first-round game.

**COMMON OPPONENTS:** Montana and Eastern Washington both played North Dakota, Northern Colorado, Montana State, Southern Utah and UC Davis during the regular season. Both teams finished with 5-0 marks vs. those teams. Montana beat North Dakota 18-15, while EWU won 54-3. EWU beat Northern Colorado 38-13, while UM won 26-18. Montana beat Montana State 34-7, while EWU beat the Bobcats 52-51 in a non-conference game. UM won at Southern Utah 35-17, while EWU won at SUU 42-30. Eastern Washington beat UC Davis 37-14, while Montana beat the Aggies 42-28.

**EWU AT HOME:** Eastern Washington is 9-4 in home FCS playoff games. Since installing the red turf in 2010, the Eagles are 7-2 in home playoff games, with both losses coming in the semifinals. EWU is 6-0 at home this season, and the Eagles have won 13 in a row over Big Sky teams at Roos Field dating back to a 2011 loss to Portland State. Portland State and Montana State are the only two Big Sky teams to win at EWU since the start of the 2010 season. In 1997, EWU played three playoff games at Joe Albi Stadium in Spokane.

**UM ON THE ROAD:** Montana went 2-4 on the road during the regular season. In the FCS postseason, the Grizzlies have won just three games away from Washington-Grizzly Stadium. UM won the 1995 national championship in Huntington, W.V., won the 2001 national championship in Chattanooga, Tenn., and in 2008 upset James Madison 35-27 on the road in a semifinal game.

**NOTES:** In three career games against Montana, Vernon Adams Jr. has thrown for 1,220 yards and 13 touchdowns...Montana DE Zack Wagenmann enters with a school-record 34.5 sacks, which ranks third in Big Sky history. Wagenmann has 14.5 sacks this season, which ranks fifth in Big Sky single-season history...EWU has scored a point in 40 consecutive quarters, and 47 of 48 this season...Montana is seeking its first win in Cheney since 2008... Montana QB Jordan Johnson has thrown for 796 yards and seven TDs in his last two games vs. EWU...EWU has never beaten Montana more than three times in a row...This is the 14th time in the last 20 meetings that both teams have been ranked...EWU is 48-of-50 on red zone chances. Both times the Eagles failed to score

it was because they took a knee to end a victory...UM has not allowed a point in the first three quarters of its last two games...UM WR Jamal Jones went over the 1,000-yard mark last week. ## IDAHO STATE'S KRAMER NAMED COACH OF THE YEAR

### OGDEN, Utah (Nov. 26, 2014)

- Idaho State's Mike Kramer joined an elite and exclusive club Wednesday, as he was selected by his league peers as the 2014 Big Sky Conference Football Coach of the Year.

Kramer became just the second coach in Division I history to earn Coach of the Year honors at three different schools in the same conference. Dennis Erickson was the first to accomplish the feat, claiming Coach of the Year honors at Washington State, Oregon State and Arizona State in the Pac-12.

Kramer previously won the Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year honors at Eastern Washington in 1997, and at Montana State in 2002 and 2005. Kramer is just the third coach in league history to capture the honor four times. Boise State's Tony Knap won it in 1971, and from 1973-75. Nevada's Chris Ault won the award in 1983, 1986, 1990 and 1991.

"I have the staff of the year, the President of the Year, the trainer of the Year, the equipment manager of the year and administration of the year," Kramer said. "This is a full-team award. I am humbled by the honor and extremely grateful for the great support we have at Idaho State.

Kramer guided the Bengals to their best season in more than a decade, compiling an 8-4 campaign. The eight victories marked a five-win improvement from the 2013 season. The eight wins matched the combined win total of the program from the previous five seasons.

Idaho State finished with a winning season for the first time since 2003. The Bengals snapped a 48-game road losing streak on Oct. 25 with a 46-12 win at Northern Colorado. The Bengals won on the road the next week, beating

Portland State 31-13. It marked the first time since 1983 the Bengals won road games on consecutive weekends. Idaho State enjoyed its first first-game winning streak since 1995.

A key story to the Bengals' turnaround was the offense. Idaho State led the nation with an average of 348.1 passing yards per game, and finished second in total offense with an average of 562 yards per game.

Idaho State senior quarterback Justin Arias earned First-Team All-Conference honors and is a finalist for the Walter Payton Award. Arias leads the nation in passing yards (4,076) and passing touchdowns (38). Junior running back Xavier Finney, who also earned First Team All-Conference honors, rushed for single-season school record 1,495 yards. Sophomore wide receiver Madison Mangum, also a First Team All-Conference player, caught 83 passes for 1,234 yards and 10 touchdowns. Idaho State's allowed just 15 sacks despite 535 passing attempts.

On defense, the unit led the Big Sky Conference in interceptions with 19. Linebacker Mario Jenkins was named the Freshman of the Year and is a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award. Jenkins tallied 120 total tackles.

Kramer was assisted by associate head coach and offensive coordinator Don Bailey, co-defensive coordinators Roger Cooper and Spencer Toone, offensive line coach Matt Troxel, inside wide receivers coach Mike Ferriter, outside wide receivers coach Sheldon Cross, defensive line coach Steve Fifita, and cornerbacks coach Stanley Franks. Braeden Clayson is the Director of football operations and video coordinator. Mark Campbell is the head of strength and conditioning.

## AROUND THE BIG SKY

**NEWELL TIES MSU RECORD:** Montana State sophomore Chad Newell tied the MSU school record with five touchdowns in the Bobcats' 47-40 playoff loss to South Dakota State. Newell tied the mark set by Cody Kirk last year in a win over North Dakota. Newell scored on runs of 3, 1, 12, 6 and 5 yards. He carried the ball 24 times for 101 yards. Newell scored three rushing touchdowns during the regular season, including one in each of the final two regular-season games. Weber State's Sean Sanders holds the NCAA record for rushing touchdowns scored in a game in an FCS playoff game. Sanders scored six in Weber State's 59-30 win over Idaho in 1987.

**PRUKOP RETURNS:** Montana State sophomore Dakota Prukop returned to the Bobcat lineup after missing two games with a knee injury. Prukop threw for 280 yards and a touchdown in the loss to South Dakota State. In his first season as a starter, Prukop completed 65 percent of his passes, threw for 2,559 yards with 18 touchdowns and six interceptions. He had a pass efficiency rating of 164.8. He also rushed for 946 yards with 13 touchdowns. Prukop averaged 318.6 yards of total offense per game.

**50 FOR MONTANA:** Montana scored a season-high 52 points in a 52-14 win over San Diego in the first round of the playoffs. It was the most points the Grizzlies have scored in a game since beating Portland State 55-27 on Oct. 5, 2013. It was the first official playoff victory for Montana since 2009. Montana won two postseason games in 2011, but the program was later forced to vacate the wins due to NCAA violations.

**POCATELLO PROUD:** Idaho State took care of many dubious losing streaks in 2014, and put to rest another with a 46-28 win over Weber State. Idaho State had lost 11 straight to the Wildcats. Idaho State finished the regular season 8-4, the program's first eight-win season since 2003. Idaho State's eight victories matched its entire win total from the previous five seasons combined. The Bengals' six conference victories are the most since going 6-1 en route to winning the 1981 national title. From 2007-13, Idaho State won a total of six conference games. This marks just the sixth time in school history ISU has won eight games in a season. Idaho State went 6-0 at home for the first time since 2003. The Bengals finished with a school-record 2,718 rushing yards, breaking a 57-year-old record. Idaho State averaged 562 yards per game during the regular season. ISU amassed 6,744 yards of total offense, averaging 562 yards per game.

**CAL POLY RUSHES TO RECORDS:** Cal Poly closed the regular season with 341 rushing yards in a 34-3 win over San Diego. The Mustangs finished the season with 4,221 rushing yards, a league single-season record. Cal Poly rushed for 3,890 yards in 2013, the old record. Cal Poly's average of 351.8 rushing yards per game set a Big Sky record. The old mark was 337.2 set by Weber State in 1971. Cal Poly also set a single-season league record for rushing attempts with 764, breaking its previous record of 753 set in 2012. Cal Poly rushed for 44 touchdowns, also a single-season record. Cal Poly became the first Big Sky school since Nevada in 1983 to have two rushers gain 1,000 yards. Junior quarterback Chris Brown rushed for 1,265 yards - the most ever in a season by a Big Sky QB. Kori Garcia gained 1,039. Brown has rushed for 1,950 yards. He'll enter his senior season just 14 yards shy of tying the rushing record by a Big Sky QB.

**CARTER A PAYTON CANDIDATE:** Sacramento State senior wide receiver DeAndre Carter was added to the Walter Payton Award Watch list last week. Carter closed his career in style with nine catches for 121 yards and a touchdown in Sacramento State's 41-30 win over UC Davis. Carter finished the regular season leading the nation in catches (99), receiving yards (1,321) and receiving touchdowns (17). Carter just missed becoming the second player in league history to catch 100 passes in a season. Still his 99 catches rank second in league single-season history behind the 112 by Idaho State's Rodrick

## AROUND THE BIG SKY

Rumble in 2011. Carter finished his career with 207 catches for 2,760 yards with 35 TD catches. He also rushed for a TD and returned a punt for a TD.

**ARIAS SURPASSES 4,000:** Idaho State senior QB Justin Arias became the eighth player in league history to pass for 4,000 yards in a season. Arias threw for 322 in the win over Weber State to finish the regular season with 4,076 yards. His total ranks fifth in single-season history. Montana's Dave Dickenson is third with 4,176 in 1995 and Weber State's Jamie Martin is fourth with 4,125 in 1991. Eastern Washington's Vernon Adams Jr. set the all-time record with 4,994 yards last season. Arias completed 318 of 522 passes with 38 touchdowns and 10 interceptions during the regular season.

**SAFRON SEVENTH IN TOTAL OFFENSE:** Sacramento State senior quarterback Garrett Safron closed out his career with 11,619 yards of total offense, which ranks seventh in Big Sky history. Safron appeared in 42 games. He passed for 9,713 yards and rushed for 1,906. Matt Nichols of Eastern Washington holds the all-time record with 13,308 yards. Safron finished the 2014 season with 4,241 yards of total offense, which ranks fourth in single-season league history. Idaho State's Justin Arias finished this season with 4,105 yards of total offense.

**COWSER BREAKS TFL MARK:** Southern Utah junior defensive end James Cowser recorded three tackles for loss in the Thunderbirds' 22-14 win over Northern Arizona. Cowser finished the season with 28.5 tackles for loss, which broke the Big Sky single-season record set by Idaho State's Jared Allen. The current NFL star had 28 tackles for loss en route to winning the Buck Buchanan Award in 2003. Cowser had 26 solo tackles for loss and five assisted. He finished as the national-leader in tackles for loss with an average of 2.4 per game. Cowser has 60 tackles for loss in his career, which ranks third in Big Sky history. Allen is the all-time leader with 73. Weber State's Brady Fosmark is second with 64.5

**LOOMIS THIRD ALL-TIME IN PUNTING:** Portland State senior Kyle Loomis led the nation in punting for the second straight season with an average of 46 yards per punt. Loomis, who played two seasons with the Vikings after roughly four years in the Army, finished his career averaging 46.21 yards per punt on 131 attempts. His average ranks third all-time in league history. The top two - Idaho State's David Harrington and Eddie Johnson - played home games indoors. In fact, Loomis is the only player in the top eight who played the majority of his games outside and at sea level.

**BENGALS CRACK TOP 25:** Idaho State cracked the top 25 for the first time since the fifth week of the 2005 season. The Bengals, which finished the regular season 8-4., are ranked 24th in The Sports Network Poll. Idaho State became the sixth Big Sky team to be ranked this year. Eastern Washington is ranked fourth in The Sports Network Poll, followed by Montana at 12 and Montana State at 17. In the Coaches' Poll, Eastern Washington is fourth, Montana is 11th, and Montana State is 17th.

**BURTON NOT RETURNING TO PSU:** Portland State announced last Wednesday that Nigel Burton would not return to coach in 2015. Burton guided the Vikings to a 21-36 record in five seasons.

**Extra points:** Sacramento State finished the season 7-5 under interim coach Jody Sears, the most wins for the program since going 7-4 in 2000. The seven wins ties the most for the Hornets since joining the Big Sky in 1996...Weber State's Bo Bolen finished his career as the league's all-time leader in kick returns (107) and kick return yards (2,665)...Road teams won four of the six conference games last week. Home teams finished 31-21 in conference games... Cal Poly linebacker Nick Dzubnar finished the season with 167 total tackles, which ranks third in Big Sky single-season history.

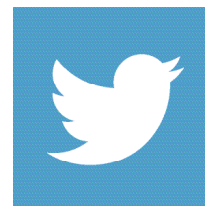

## LEAGUE ANNOUNCES 2014 ALL-CONFERENCE FOOTBALL TEAM

**OGDEN, Utah (Nov. 25, 2014)** - The three Big Sky Conference playoff teams combined to place 15 players on the 2014 All-Conference Football Team, which was released on Tuesday.

Big Sky Conference champion Eastern Washington saw six of its players tabbed to the league's top team. Junior quarterback Vernon Adams Jr. captured the league's Offensive Player of the Year, becoming the first repeat winner of the honor since Eastern Washington QB Erik Meyer in 2004 and 2005.

Five Montana State student-athletes and four from the Montana Grizzlies were selected to the First Team. Grizzly senior defensive end Zack Wagenmann earned Defensive Player of the Year honors and was named to the All-Conference First Team for the third straight season.

The Eagles, Grizzlies and Bobcats all earned postseason berths. Montana and Montana State will play this Saturday, while Eastern Washington has a bye to the second round.

The teams and individual award winners were selected by the 13 conference head coaches on Monday.

Southern Utah junior quarterback Ammon Olsen, a transfer from BYU, was named the Newcomer of the Year. Idaho State redshirt freshman linebacker Mario Jenkins was selected as the Freshman of the Year.

Twelve of the 13 Big Sky teams placed at least one player on the 30-player First Team. Sacramento State senior wide receiver DeAndre Carter was the only unanimous First Team selection. Carter leads the nation in catches (99), receiving yards (1,321) and touchdown catches (17).

Carter was one of five players to earn First Team All-Conference honors for the second time. Eastern Washington sophomore wide receiver Cooper Kupp, Adams., and Portland State senior punter Kyle Loomis were repeat selections. Eastern Washington senior linebacker Ronnie Hamlin, a First Team pick in 2012, returned to the top squad.

Adams, from Pasadena, Calif., picked up the 2014 season right where he left off in 2013 when he threw for nearly 5,000 yards and 55 touchdowns. Adams suffered a broken foot in the sixth game, forcing him to sit out four weeks. Still, he guided EWU to a 7-1 record with the only loss coming 59-52 on the road against Washington, a game where he threw for 475 yards and seven touchdowns. In eight games, Adams has thrown for 2,876 yards with 30 touchdowns and just five interceptions. Adams is averaging 359.5 passing yards and 391.5 yards of total offense per game. His efficiency rating is 176.9.

Wagenmann, a senior from Missoula, Mont., led the Big Sky during the regular season with 13.5 sacks, and was second with 18.5 tackles for loss. He also had a league-high five forced fumbles and 66 total tackles. Montana leads the Big Sky in scoring defense (20.2 points per game).

Olsen, from Draper, Utah, began the season as a backup for Southern Utah, but took over starting duties in the fourth game. He completed 63.7 percent of his passes for 3,034 yards with 21 touchdowns and 10 interceptions.

Jenkins, from Boise, led Idaho State with 120 total tackles - 10.5 for loss - three interceptions, two sacks, eight quarterback hurries, a forced fumble and a fumble recovery. Jenkins ranks fifth in the league in tackles per game (10.0), which is the most by an FCS freshman.

Joining Adams, Kupp, and Hamlin on the First Team from Eastern Washington were senior safety Tevin McDonald, senior offensive tackle Jake Rogers and junior offensive guard Aaron Neary. Kupp enters the playoffs with 82 catches for 1,160 yards and 14 touchdowns. McDonald, in his second season with the Eagles after transferring from UCLA, tallied 68 tackles, three interceptions, three forced fumbles and three fumble recoveries. Hamlin amassed 86 total tackles. Rogers and Neary anchored an offensive line that helped the Eagles average a national-best 44.6 points and 522.8 yards of offense per game.

Senior linebacker Alex Singleton led the contingent of five Montana State Bobcats on the First Team. Singleton ranks fourth in the league with an average of 10.6 tackles per game. He is third in the nation with an average of 6.8 solo tackles per game. Singleton netted 14 tackles for loss. Sophomore offensive guard JP Flynn, senior tight end Tiai Salanoa, senior cornerback Deonte Flowers and sophomore special teamer Chad Newell were also tabbed to the First Team. Salanoa caught 29 passes for 298 yards during the regular season. Flowers had 10 pass breakups, an interception and 46 tackles.

Senior safety Matt Hermanson, senior defensive tackle Tonga Takai and senior running back Jordan Canada were the other Grizzlies on the First Team. Hermanson led the league with six interceptions and 99 tackles. Takai had 44 tackles - 6.5 for loss - and an interception during the regular season. Canada rushed for 1,011 yards and 11 touchdowns.

Senior quarterback Justin Arias led a trio of Idaho State Bengals on the First Team. Arias, who shared QB honors with Adams, leads the nation in passing yards (4,076) and touchdown passes (38). Arias led Idaho State to eight victories, the combined total for the program the previous three seasons. Idaho State leads the nation in total offense and is second in passing offense.

Junior running back Xavier Finney, who led the Big Sky with 1,495 rushing yards, was also named to the First Team, along with Bengal sophomore wide receiver Madison Mangum, who caught 83 passes for 1,234 yards and 10 touchdowns.

Cal Poly senior linebackers Cameron Ontko and Nick Dzubnar represented the Mustangs on the First Team. Dzubnar, a candidate for the Buck Buchanan Award, led the Big Sky with 167 total tackles. He also had three sacks, two interceptions, a forced fumble and six pass breakups. Ontko amassed 101 total tackles.

Northern Arizona cornerback Marcus Alford and Lumberjack fullback Nick Butier were selected to the First Team. Alford tallied three interceptions and 13 total pass breakups. Butier scored one rushing touchdown and caught 17 passes and a touchdown.

Portland State senior Cornelius Edison was selected as the First Team center. He joined Loomis on the first team. Loomis led the nation in punting for the second straight season, averaging 46 yards per punt.

Southern Utah junior defensive end James Cowser earned the nod at defensive end after setting a Big Sky single-season record with 29 tackles for loss. Cowser also registered 11.5 sacks.

North Dakota's Alex Tillman was named the First Team return specialist. Tillman, a senior transfer from the University of Houston, averaged 16.9 yards per punt return, including a 95-yarder for a touchdown against Portland State. He also averaged 18.8 yards per kick return.

Sacramento State junior Brad Cornish was selected as the kicker. Cornish made 14-of-17 field goals, with a long of 49 yards. He had 16 touchbacks on kickoffs, and made 56 of his 59 extra points.

UC Davis senior offensive tackle Ian Joseph rounded out the First Team.
