On Saturday, North Dakota will host Sacramento State at 2:05 p.m. Central. That game can be seen on MidcoSN, Fox College Sports.

Sacramento State broke its own Big Sky record in points scored in a game. The Hornets scored 111 points against Weber State. The old record of 110 was set against North Dakota.

Another Big Sky record set this past weekend was the combined point total of the two teams. Weber State had 104 points in the 111 loss to Sacramento State. The 215 record broke the 214 record set by SAC and North Dakota.

On Dec. 14th against UC Irvine, SAC set two other Big Sky records. The Hornets made 21 3-pointers and attempted 55. Both of those are records.

Southern Utah set a new Big Sky record in rebounds with 74. SUU did that on Dec. 16th against Arizona Christian.

The Thunderbirds set a new Big Sky record in field-goal percent in a single game. SUU shot .667 from the floor against SAC on Saturday (2/8).

UM COLE NAMED BIG SKY CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

OGDEN, Utah (February 17, 2014) - Montana's Kellie Cole has been named the Big Sky Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week for the games played the week of Feb. 10-Feb. 16.

Cole, a senior from Bozeman, Mont., averaged 15.5 points on 57.1 percent shooting, six rebounds and four assists as Montana went 2-0 last week with home wins over Northern Colorado and North Dakota that pulled the Lady Griz within half a game of Big Sky Conference leader UND.

Coming off a zero-point game in Montana's loss at Eastern Washington on Feb. 8, Cole had a game-high 18 points, nine rebounds and four assists as the Lady Griz defeated Northern Colorado 61-55 on Thursday.

In Saturday's 52-49 comeback win over North Dakota, a game Montana trailed by 10 early, by nine at the half and by six with 3:30 to play, Cole had 13 points on 5-of-9 shooting and four assists.

LAST WEEK'S TOP PERFORMERS

Hayley Hodgins, Eastern Washington - Hodgins averaged 20.5 points and 5.0 rebounds in Eastern's two games last week, shooting 33.3 percent from three-point range (5-15) and 87.5 percent from the free throw line (14-16). She was instrumental in the Eagles' road win at Sacramento State on Thursday, Feb. 13, going for 19 points and eight rebounds, falling one board short of her career high. She came up with several key defensive plays down the stretch, blocking a pair of shots late to finish with a career-best four rejections. Against Northern Arizona on Saturday, Feb. 15, Hodgins led EWU with 22 points, setting new career marks in free throws made (10) and free throws attempted (11). She tied her career high with four steals against the Lumberjacks, adding a pair of assists and two rebounds.

Emily Evers, North Dakota - Evers averaged 7.5 points, 7.5 rebounds and 2.0 blocks in a pair of losses this week at Montana State and Montana. Evers scored 11 points and had seven rebounds and three blocks Thursday at Montana State and earned her first start of the season Saturday at Montana. She scored four points and collected eight rebounds at UM. North Dakota returns home for its final regular season home games this Thursday and Saturday against Northern Arizona and Sacramento State, respectively.

Erikka Banks, Northern Arizona - Banks continued her torrid play in league play last week, playing a big role in the Lumberjacks picking up two crucial victories as they aim to climb up the Big Sky standings. In three games last week, Banks averaged 16.3 points, 6.0 rebounds and 1.0 blocks per game while adding five steals. She shot 71.4 percent from the field and 82.6 percent from the free-throw line. After seeing her streak of six double-digit scoring games come to an end with a seven point, three rebound game in NAU's loss at Southern Utah on Monday, Banks played an extremely efficient game in the Lumberjacks' 84-61 win at home over Portland State on Thursday. In just 23 minutes, Banks made all five of her field goal attempts en route to an 11 point, five rebound performance against the Vikings. The junior followed with a career-high 31 points on Saturday as the Lumberjacks halted Eastern Washington's four-game win streak with a 86-78 victory. With Amanda Frost, the Big Sky's leading scorer garnering a lot of attention, Banks made the Eagles pay as she made 7-of-13 from the field, her 10th straight game over 50 percent shooting. Banks scored 24 of her 31 points in the second half, helping NAU turn a two-point halftime lead into as much as 12, and iced the game with 14 points in the final four minutes. During that stretch she hit all 10 of her free throws during a career-best 17-of-19 night at the line. Banks also grabbed 10 rebounds for her sixth double-double of the season and now has two 30-point games in her last four contests.

Stephanie Lee, Northern Colorado - Knowing the Bears needed a victory to remain in the hunt for one of the seven spots in the Big Sky Tournament, Lee took the Bears on her shoulders at Montana State, making all eight shots from the floor in the second half en route to a career-high 36 points - the second highest total in school history and the second most in the Big Sky this year. Against the Bobcats, she was 15-for-20 from the floor (.750) for the game with six rebounds, two steals, a blocked shot and an assist in 36 minutes. She also added 10 points at Montana and now has scored in double figures in six straight games. With her one blocked shot at Montana State, Lee broke the Northern Colorado Division I single season record for swats with 49, bettering her own mark of 48 from last year. For the week, Lee averaged 23.0 points, 4.0 rebounds, 1.0 blocked shots, 1.0 steals and shot .576 from the field and .800 from the free throw line.

Emily Easom, Portland State - Easom led the Vikings with 16.5 points per game going 12-for-23 from the floor and 7-for-14 from three-point range over the Vikings last two games. She averaged a team-high 31.0 minutes played...She started the week with 10 points going 3-for-18 from the floor with a pair of three pointers at Northern Arizona. She then posted her fifth 20-plus point performance of the season with 23 points on 9-of-15 shooting with a season-high five three pointers against Sacramento State...Easom now leads the team with a career-high 12.4 points per game and is one of two players to start every game for the Vikings this season. She is second on the team with 93 field goals and leads the squad with 44 three pointers.

Alle Moreno, Sacramento State - Moreno averaged 10.5 points, 5.5 rebounds, 2.0 assists, and 3.0 steals per game for the week while shooting 46.7% as the Hornets went 1-1. On Saturday Moreno led Sacramento State to an 84-80 win over Portland State with 16 points on 5-of-8 shooting, including two 3-pointers, as well as a game-high eight rebounds, three assists, and two steals in 27 minutes...Moreno had a game-high four steals on Thursday against Eastern Washington, making her Sacramento State's all-time leader in career steals after surpassing the previous record held by Kylie Kuhns. She also totaled five points, making one 3-pointer, to go with three rebounds and one assist while playing a team-high 34 minutes...For the week Moreno had just four turnovers while leading the team with 30.5 minutes played per game, 11 rebounds, and six steals.

Andrea Jones, Southern Utah - Jones averaged 13.3 ppg and 5.0 apg as the Thunderbirds collected wins in all three of their Big Sky outings last week. The senior guard put up 12 points and handed out six assists as SUU defeated Northern Arizona 93-59, recorded a team-high 15 points along with three steals in a close matchup at Idaho State and then sank a pair of threes while going 4-5 from the field for another 13 points in a win at Weber State. For the week she totaled 40 points, eight rebounds, 15 assists, six steals, went 11-12 at the foul line and shot 56.5 percent overall...Jones is one of Southern Utah's leading 3-point shooters with mark of 36.4 percent in conference play and leads the team with 97 assists. Her 2.3 assist/turnover ratio leads the league since the start of the Big Sky season and she is shooting nearly 90 percent from the foul line for the year.
