Tournament Tidbits

- ✓ This is the 39th Big Sky Conference Championship. This will be the 11th time the tournament has been played in Ogden, Utah and the 10th time in the Dee Events Center. The first Big Sky Championship in 1976 was played at Weber State's Swenson Gym. The tournament was also held at the Dee Events Center in 1979, 1980, 1984, 1995, 1999, 2003, 2007, 2009, and 2010. Weber State has won six of the previous 10 tournaments held in Ogden. The Wildcats lost in the championship game in 1976 and 2010. The Wildcats lost in the semifinals in 1984 and 2009.
- ✓ Montana is making its 13th straight appearance in the tournament, the longest active streak in the league. Weber State is making its eighth straight tournament appearance. Northern Colorado, North Dakota and Northern Arizona are in the field for the second straight season. Portland State returns after a one-year absence. Sacramento State qualified for the first time since 2006, and just the fifth time in school history.
- ✓ Weber State's Kyle Tresnak and Jordan Richardson have played in seven career tournament games. If Weber State wins its semifinal, and both play in two games this week, the duo will tie Montana's Will Cherry for the most games played in tournament history with nine.
- ✓ Montana senior Kareem Jamar has played in six tournament games and three championships. Jamar has been named the Tournament MVP each of the past two seasons. Weber State's Bruce Collins (1978, 1979, and 1980) is the only other player in league history to win three tournament MVP awards. Jamar has scored 103 career points in the tournament, making 39-of-68 shots from the floor. He has recorded two double-doubles in the tournament.
- ✓ The Grizzlies have played in each of the previous four championship games, winning three of them. Weber State is the only other team in league history to play in five straight championship games. The Wildcats made the 1976, 1977, 1978, 1979 and 1980 championship games.
- ✓ Idaho State in 1987 won the tournament as the No. 7 seed. The Bengals were the lowest seed to win the championship. The last three championships have been won by the No. 1 seed (Northern Colorado 2011, Montana 2012, and Montana 2013).
- ✓ Northern Colorado's B.J. Hill (2011), Weber State's Randy Rahe (2007) and Montana's Wayne Tinkle (2010, 2012, 2013) are the three coaches in the tournament to have won Big Sky Championships.
- ✓ Neil McCarthy of Weber State is the only coach in league history to win four Big Sky Tournament titles. McCarthy led Weber State to championships in 1978, 1979, 1980 and 1983.
- ✓ Montana has appeared in a record 16 championship games, winning nine. Weber State has made 15 title appearances, winning eight. Portland State and Northern Arizona have each won two championships. Northern Colorado has won one title (2011). North Dakota and Sacramento State have never appeared in the championship game. Portland State won its 2009 title in Ogden at the DEC. Montana won the 2010 title at the DEC.
- ✓ Montana and Weber State have played in each of the past four championships, including three times in the championship game. Montana has won all four meetings.
- ✓ Weber State is 63-5 in regular-season Big Sky games at home under Randy Rahe. In the last three seasons, Northern Arizona is the only Big Sky team to beat the Wildcats in the Dee Events Center. The Wildcats are 4-2 in postseason play against Big Sky teams at the DEC in the Big Sky Championship, giving Rahe a 63-7 overall record against league teams at home.

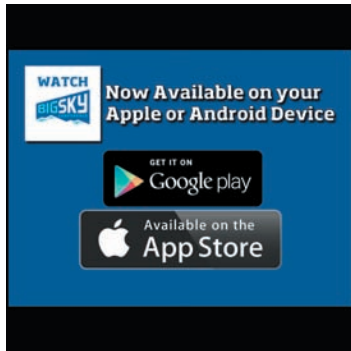

Northern Arizona's Jack Murphy is 26-37 in his second season as a head coach with the Lumberjacks. He is 0-1 in the Big Sky tourney. Murphy was an assistant for three seasons at Memphis prior to landing at NAU. He was a scout for three seasons with the Denver Nuggets, and spent eight years as a staff member at Arizona.

The Bears made 11-of-16 from 3-point range, and shot .593 percent from the floor...Quinton Uphsur scored 32 points, hitting 7-of-8 from 3-point range to lead NAU. Freshman Kris Yanku scored 20 points off the bench. The Lumberjacks had 16 turnovers...UNC won 74-59 on Feb. 20 in Flagstaff. Unruh hit six 3-pointers and scored 24 points. Regular-season meetings: Team teams split the two regular-season meetings with both going to overtime. PSU beat UM 81-78 in three overtimes on Jan. 11 in Portland. Marcus Hall and Gary Winston each scored 21 points for the Vikings. Hall was 5-of-6 from 3-point range. Jordan Gregory led UM with 25 points. Kareem Jamar netted 19 points...UM beat PSU 82-76 in OT in Missoula on Feb. 6. Keron DeShields and Jamar each scored 19 points. Michael Wisner netted 15 off the bench. Kyle Richardson scored 25 points with 12 rebounds to lead PSU. The Vikings were 20-of-31 from the free-throw line.

Meetings in the championship: This is the first meeting between Portland State and Montana in the tournament.

PSU won the 2009 championship at the Dee Events Center. UM won the 2010 championship at the DEC...UM is the top free-throw shooting team in the league at .739 percent. PSU is third at .724...UM's Kareem Jamar has been the tournament MVP the past two years. He's scored 103 points in six career tournament games... Kyle Richardson, F, Portland State



Portland State's Kyle Richardson has been selected as the final Big Sky Conference men's basketball Player of the Week for the 2013-14 season.

Richardson, a 6-foot-7, senior forward from Lake-wood, Calif., averaged 20.5 points, and 11 rebounds, and two blocks per game as the Vikings earned home wins over league-leading Weber State and Idaho State to secure a spot in upcoming Big Sky Championship. Richardson shot .714 percent from the floor in the two games.

Richardson netted 13 points, eight rebounds two blocks, an assist and a steal in a 66-59 upset of Weber State on Thursday. He made 6-of-9 shots from the floor, and was 1-of-1 from the free-throw line.

Richardson scored a career-high 28 points and tied his career-high with 14 rebounds to go along with two blocks and an assist in the Vikings' 78-74 over-time win over Idaho State. Richardson made 14-of-19 shots from the floor. He tied the game with 13 seconds left in regulation on a dunk. In the overtime, he scored eight points with seven rebounds.

Portland State secured the No. 5 seed in the Big Sky Championship with the two victories. The Vikings did not make the postseason tournament in 2013.

This is the first Player of the Week honor for Richardson.

THIS WEEK'S SKY HIGHLIGHTS

The 2014 Big Sky Conference Men's Basketball Championship presented by Red Lion Hotels begins on Thursday at the Dee Events Center on the campus of Weber State. This marks the 11th time the tournament is being played in Ogden...Thursday will feature three first-round games. At 2 p.m., No. 2 seed North Dakota takes on No. 7 Sacramento State. The Hornets are in the tournament for the first time since 2006. The teams split regular-season meetings. At 4:30 p.m., No. 6 seed Northern Colorado battles No. 3 Northern Arizona. Both are in the field for the second straight season. Northern Colorado swept the Lumberjacks during the regular season. At 7 p.m., No. 5 Portland State battles two-time defending champion and No. 5 seed Montana. The Grizzlies have advanced to four straight title games. The Vikings and Grizzlies split regular-season meetings. The first matchup in Portland was won by the Vikings in triple overtime. Montana won the second meeting in Missoula in overtime. No. 1 seed Weber State will play in the second semifinal on Friday at 7 p.m...All of Thursday and Friday's games can be seen for free on Watch Big Sky. Saturday's 6 p.m. Mountain championship will be televised live on ESPNU.

Around the Big Sky

OUTRIGHT CHAMPS: Weber State clinched the outright Big Sky regular-season title with an 82-78 win over Eastern Washington on Saturday in Cheney. It marked the fourth regular-season title in Randy Rahe's eight seasons as head coach. Weber State has now won 21 regular-season titles, most in conference history. Weber State last won the regular-season title in 2009-10. The Wildcats ended up winning the league title by two games over Montana, Northern Arizona and North Dakota. Weber State finished the 20-game schedule 14-6. The six losses are the most ever by a Big Sky champion. The previous most losses by a regular-season champion was five. Weber State enters the 2014 Big Sky Championship as the No. 1 seed. The Wildcats will play in the second semifinal on Friday night. The last two times Weber State entered the tournament as the No. 1 seed, the Wildcats did not win the championship. In 2009, Montana State upset the Wildcats in the semifinals. A year later, Montana rallied from a 20-point half-time deficit to beat the Wildcats. The No. 1 seed has won the past three Big Sky Championships. Weber State has played in two straight title games, and three of the last four. By winning the Big Sky title, WSU is guaranteed a bid to the NIT if it does not win this week's championship.

WELCOME BACK, HORNETS: Sacramento State clinched a Big Sky Championship berth on Saturday night with an 84-59 home win over Montana State. The Hornets had not advanced to the Big Sky Championship since 2006. Sacramento State advanced to the Big Sky semifinals in 2003 and 2006, but has never appeared in the championship game. Sacramento State finished 10-10 in conference. The Hornets had never won more than eight Big Sky games since joining the league in 1995-96.

HARD-LUCK EAGLES: For just the second time since the Big Sky Championship has featured at least six teams, a team with a .500 winning percentage in conference did not make the tournament. Eastern Washington finished 10-10, but lost a tiebreaker to Sacramento State. In 2007, Eastern Washington finished 8-8, but did not qualify for the six-team tournament.

JAMAR 14TH ALL-TIME: Montana senior Kareem Jamar has moved into 14th place on the Big Sky's all-time scoring list with 1,653 career points. He figures to end his career in 13th place. Jamar enters Thursday's first-round games just 10 points behind former Montana star Kevin Criswell (1,663). Last week, Jamar also became the 20th player in league history to surpass 400-career assists. Jamar enters Thursday with 403 career dimes.

TALKING THREES: Eastern Washington sophomore Tyler Harvey finished his season with 109 3-pointers, which ranks second all-time in league history. Only Northern Arizona's Stephen Sir, who made 124 in the 2006-07 season finished with more...Northern Colorado's Tate Unruh enters Thursday's play tied for 10th all-time in Big Sky history with 235 career 3-pointers. He's tied with former teammate Devon Beitzel, who made 235 from 2007-11.

GARRITY TOP 10 IN ASSISTS: Sacramento State junior Dylan Garrity has moved into 10th place on the Big Sky's all-time assists list. Garrity has 441 career assists in 85 games. Garrity moved past NAU's Harry Payne (1984-87) and Montana's Travis DeCuire (1992-94), who each had 435 career assists. Nevada's Billy Allen is ninth on the list with 468.

TINKLE CAN TIE CRAVENS: Montana's Wayne Tinkle enters Thursday's action with 158 career victories. With a win over Portland State, he can tie former Idaho and Weber State coach Joe Cravens for sixth place on the Big Sky's all-time victories list. Weber State's Randy Rahe, also in his eighth season, is fifth with 167 wins.

BOBCATS' TOURNEY STREAK ENDS: Montana State lost three road games last week to finish the conference season 9-11. MSU's streak of consecutive tourney appearances ended at nine.

SUU SNAPS STREAK: Southern Utah snapped its 26-game losing streak by upsetting North Dakota 77-71 last Saturday. SUU's 26-game losing streak was the longest active streak in the nation. SUU's only other victory was in the season opener, an 85-78 win over Arizona Christian.

PROTECTING HOME COURT: Home teams ended up winning 76 of the 110 conference games this season, a winning percentage of .691. Last year, home teams won .646 percent of the conference games. In 2011-12, home teams won just .492 percent of the conference games.

RPI UPDATE: Weber State finished the regular season with the top RPI among Big Sky programs at 169. Montana was second at 174, and Northern Colorado was third at 221. The Big Sky ranked 26th among Division I Conferences.

Tip-ins: Weber State sophomore Joel Bolomboy finished the regular season with 10 double-doubles, most in the league...EWU's Venky Jois recorded nine...EWU's Tyler Harvey ranks eighth in the nation in scoring, and is fifth in 3-point field goals per game, and 10th in free-throw percentage...Northern Colorado is eighth in the nation in field-goal percentage....Bolomboy is fifth in rebounds.

WEBER STATE'S BERRY HEADS ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM

OGDEN, Utah (March 10, 2014) - Big Sky Conference regular-season champion Weber State brought home three of the five major men's basketball honors Monday as the 2013-14 All-Conference Team and individual award winners were announced.

Weber State senior guard/forward Davion Berry was selected by the conference head coaches as the Most Valuable Player. Wildcat guard Jeremy Senglin was tabbed the Freshman of the Year. Sophomore forward Joel Bolomboy was named the Defensive Player of the Year.

Northern Arizona junior Quinton Upshur was selected as the Newcomer of the Year. The league also named a Top Reserve for the first time since the 1987-88 season. North Dakota's Jamal Webb and Portland State's DaShaun Wiggins shared the honor.

Berry, a 6-foot-4, senior from Oakland, Calif., was an unanimous First Team selection. Berry led Weber State to a 14-6 conference record, the school's first regular-season championship since 2009-10. Weber State takes the No. 1 seed to the Big Sky Championship, which begins Thursday at the Dee Events Center in Ogden, Utah.

Berry ranks third in the league in scoring with an average of 19.2 points per game. Berry also averaged 4.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists, and one steal per game. He shot .811 percent from the free-throw line, and .381 percent from 3-point range. Berry is the eighth Weber State player in history to win Big Sky MVP, and the first since current NBA All-Star and reigning Rookie of the Year Damian Lillard in 2011-12.

Berry was joined on the First Team by Montana senior Kareem Jamar, North Dakota senior Troy Huff, Sacramento State junior Mikhael McKinney, Eastern Washington sophomore Tyler Harvey, and Upshur. Jamar, Huff, and McKinney were unanimous selections. Jamar was tabbed to the First Team for the third straight season. Huff and Berry were repeat selections.

Jamar, a 6-5 guard/forward from Venice, Calif., averaged 18.8 points, 5.6 rebounds, and 4.0 assists per game, helping Montana to a 12-8 conference record. Jamar is the 22nd player in league history to earn First Team honors three times.

Huff, a 6-5, guard/forward from Milwaukee, Wisc., finished the regular season second in the league in scoring at 19.6 points per game. Huff scored more than 1,000 points in two seasons playing in the Big Sky.

Harvey, a guard from Torrance, Calif., enjoyed a tremendous breakout campaign for the Eagles. Harvey averaged a league-best 21.8 points per game, and was second in Big Sky single-season history with 109 3-pointers. He also led the league in free-throw shooting at .897 percent, and made .433 percent of his 3-pointers. Harvey ranks fifth in the nation in 3-point field goals per game and 3-point field goals made, eighth in points per game, and 13th in 3-point field-goal percentage.

McKinney, a 6-1 junior guard from Union City, Calif, is the first Hornet to garner First Team All-Conference honors since Alex Bausley and DaShawn Freeman were honored in 2005-06. McKinney netted 16.3 points and 4.5 assists per game, helping the Hornets secure a postseason bid for the first time since 2006.

Upshur, a 6-foot-5 junior guard from Norfolk, Va., garnered the Newcomer of the Year and First Team honors after averaging 15.8 points per game. He averaged 2.4 3-pointers and 1.6 steals per game. He is the first Lum-berjack to win Newcomer of the Year since Tyrone Bazy in 2005-06. Upshur played last season at Kilgore Junior College after starting his career at VMI.

Senglin, a 6-foot-2, true freshman guard from Arlington, Texas, started all 28 games for the Wildcats. He averaged 11.3 points per game and shot .407 percent from 3-point range. Senglin is the fourth Wildcat to capture the honor, which has been presented since 1985-86.

Two players from New York shared the Top Reserve honor. Webb is a senior from Buffalo, while Wiggins is a junior from The Bronx. To be eligible players must have started fewer than 50 percent of the conference games. Webb averaged 7.7 points, 3.4 assists, and 1.7 steals per game. Wiggins netted 12.7 points and 1.1 steals per game.

Bolomboy, a 6-foot-9, sophomore from Fort Worth, Texas, is the first Wildcat since Daviin Davis (2008-09) to claim Defensive Player of the Year. Bolomboy leads the Big Sky and ranks fifth in the nation in rebounds at 10.9 per game. He pulled down at least 10 rebounds in 17 of the 20 conference games. He also helped Weber State lead the league in scoring defense at 66.5 points per game.

Northern Colorado senior forward Derrick Barden and senior guard Tate Unruh led the Second Team. They were joined by Weber State senior center Kyle Tresnak, Idaho State junior guard/forward Chris Hansen, and Portland State junior guard Gary Winston.
