BIG SKY HIGHLIGHTS

North Dakota and Southern Utah shared the Big Sky Conference regular-season title with 15-5 records.

Seeding is set for the conference tournament in Grand Forks, N.D. This is the first Big Sky Championship in North Dakota

Montana won the Big Sky Championship last season and Idaho State won in 2012.

Southern Utah is making its second appearance at the Big Sky Tournament since joining the league in 2012. SUU lost last season in the quarterfinals.

Sacramento State is making its fourth appearance in five years. SAC didn't make the tournament in 2011. Last season, the Hornets lost in the semifinals to tournament champion Montana.

Since 2010, Eastern Washington hasn't missed a tournament. EWU lost in the semifinals last season to Northern Colorado.

Big Sky Announces Women's Basketball All-Conference Team and Award Winners

OGDEN, Utah (March 10, 2014) - The Big Sky Conference has announced the Women's Basketball All-Conference team and individual award winners for the 2013-14 season. The awards were decided by a vote of the league's 11 head coaches.

Madi Buck became North Dakota's first player to earn the league's Most Valuable Player Award. The senior was an unanimous First-Team selection.

Buck helped her team to a share of the regular-season title and the right to host the Big Sky Conference Championship on March 13-15. She averaged 16.3 points and 7.5 rebounds a game. Buck, a senior from Bismarck, N.D., has seven 20 plus-point games and nine 10 plus-rebound games. The forward also recorded eight double-doubles this season.

Montana's Carly Selvig was selected as the league's Defensive Player of the Year. Selvig, a junior from Glendive, Mont., averaged 5.9 points, 5.8 rebounds and 2.8 blocks a game.

Northern Arizona's Brittani Lusain was named the league's Outstanding Freshman, and UND's Kelsey Knox was named Top Newcomer. Lusain, from San Diego, Calif., averaged 13.0 points a game and 4.9 assists per game. NAU hadn't had a player named Outstanding Freshman since the 2009-10 season, when Vickie Toney was named. Knox, a sophomore from Platte City, Mo., and transfer from Johnson Country CC, averaged 3.4 assists per game and 2.3 rebounds. She has started 23 games for North Dakota and scored 153 points.

This season, a Top Reserve was awarded. This award was discontinued following the 1999-2000 season. North Dakota's Emily Evers and Southern Utah's Andrea Jones shared the honor. Evers is a junior from Grand Forks, N.D., and Jones is a senior from Mesa, Ariz. Evers started just one game for UND. She averaged 7.9 points and 5.9 rebounds a game. Jones started 16 game for SUU and averaged 8.8 points and 3.8 assists per game.

Others named to the first team were Lexie Nelson, Eastern Washington; Lindsey Reed, Idaho State; Kellie Cole, Montana; Amanda Frost, Northern Arizona and Hailey Mandelko, Southern Utah. This is the second time Nelson has been named to the First Team.

The Big Sky Conference tournament will be March 13-15 in Grand Forks, N. D., The three quarterfinal games will be played on Thursday starting at 2:30 p.m. Central. The winners of the quarterfinals will advance to the semifinals played on Friday starting at 5 p.m. And the championship will be played at 3 p.m. Central on Saturday. All games can be seen for Free on Watch Big Sky.

UM'S SULLIVAN NAMED BIG SKY CONFERENCE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

OGDEN, Utah (March 10, 2014) - Montana's Jordan Sullivan has been named the Big Sky Conference Women's Basketball Player of the Week for the games played the week of March 3-9.

Sullivan, a senior from Sidney, Mont., averaged 17.3 points on 54.8 percent shooting and 11.0 rebounds per game as Montana went 3-0 over the final week of the regular season, with a road win at Montana State and home victories over Sacramento State and Northern Arizona.

In the three games Sullivan went 3 for 7 (.429) from 3-point range and 15 for 18 (.833) from the line. She also added five blocks and three steals.

In Monday's 72-65 win at Montana State, Sullivan had nine points and seven rebounds to finish her career 4-0 at MSU's Worthington Arena.

In Montana's home victories over Sac State on Thursday and NAU on Saturday, Sullivan had back-to-back double-doubles, giving her five for the season and six for her career.

In Thursday's 87-76 win over the Hornets, Sullivan had 21 points on 8-of-12 shooting, 15 rebounds and 4 blocks. Her rebounding and blocking numbers both matched career highs.

In Saturday's 83-66 victory over the Lumberjacks, Sullivan had 22 points on 7-of-11 shooting and 11 rebounds.

LAST WEEK'S TOP PERFORMERS

Melissa Williams, Eastern Washington - Williams had an impressive showing in Eastern's two games this past week, averaging 16.5 points and 7.5 rebounds while shooting 61.9 percent from the field and 77.8 percent from the free throw line. She scored a career-high 23 points against Idaho State on Thursday, Mar. 6, leading EWU in scoring for the first time in her career. She made 9-of-13 field goals against the Bengals, adding five rebounds to her stat line. Versus Weber State on Saturday, Williams notched her fifth career double-double, finishing with 10 points and 10 rebounds. She made 4-of-8 field goals and both of her free throws against the Wildcats, and registered two blocks.

Sheryl Bitter, Idaho State - Bitter scored 32 points and grabbed nine rebounds in the final two home games of her Idaho State career. She also had six assists and three steals...Bitter scored a career high 21 points in Thursday's 86-62 win over Eastern Washington which clinched Idaho State's spot in the Big Sky Conference tournament...She was six-for-six from the field and four-for-four from the three-point line in the second half for 17 of her 21 points. Her great second half helped Idaho State outscore the Eagles 55-31 after the break en route to the 24-point win...Saturday she scored 11 points to help Idaho State defeat Portland State 79-64 on senior day...She was a perfect eight-for-eight from the free-throw line.

Alle Moreno, Sacramento State - Moreno averaged 15.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 2.5 assists, and 1.5 steals per game for the week. She made three 3-pointers on Thursday at Montana and finished with 14 points, eight rebounds, three assists, and two steals over 33 minutes. On Saturday at Montana State she scored a team-high 17 points, shooting 6-of-13 overall and 5-of-11 from 3-point range, and added eight rebounds, two assists, and a steal. The program's all-time leading 3-point shooter, Moreno helped the team break the NCAA record for made 3-pointers in a season shooting 8-of-18 (44.4%) from beyond the arc during the week. Seven of her 16 rebounds were offensive and she committed just three turnovers in 65 minutes played.

Hailey Mandelko, Southern Utah - Southern Utah won its last five games to earn a share of the Big Sky Conference regular season title, due in part to the play of Hailey Mandelko. The junior guard averaged 17.5 points a game on 40 percent shooting during the final week as the Thunderbirds knocked off North Dakota and Northern Colorado. Mandelko hit a pair of 3-pointers and finished 5-9 from the field for 15 points in the win over UND and followed up with 20 points in the T-Birds home finale while connecting on 4-8 from beyond the arc. She also grabbed five rebounds between the two contests and came up with two steals and an assist. The Lexington, Neb. native leads SUU by averaging 13.5 points this season, and has been the program's top-scorer in each of her three years with the team. She ranks fifth in the Big Sky with 15.8 ppg while making 2.4 3-pointers a game. Mandelko also racked up totals of 42 assists 23 steals in conference play.
