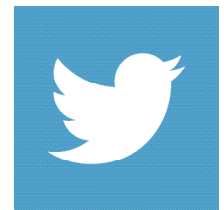

At stake: A trip to the Championship Game of the CIT on Thursday night. The NJIT/NAU winner will meet the winner of the semifinal between Evansville and UT-Martin. Both semifinals and the championship on Thursday will air live on the CBS Sports Network.

All-Time Series: This is the first meeting between the programs.

How They Got Here: Northern Arizona opened the CIT with a 75-70 road win over Grand Canyon on Wednesday, March 18. The Lumberjacks beat Big Sky rival Sacramento State 78-73 in the second round on March 20 in Sacramento. Northern Arizona topped Kent State 74-73 in overtime on March 27. NJIT opened the CIT with an 84-77 win over New Hampshire on March 16. NJIT beat Cleveland State 80-77 in the second round, and beat Canisius 78-73 in the quarterfinals on March 28.

The Coaches: Northern Arizona's Jack Murphy is 48-52 in his third season. NJIT's Jim Engles is 90-123 in his seventh season.

Common Opponents: Both teams played Hampton during the regular-season. Northern Arizona lost 75-66 to Hampton on Dec. 21 on the road... NJIT beat Hampton 86-67 on Feb. 2 at home.

Notes: Northern Arizona is 12-2 at home this season. The Lumberjacks have won eight in a row dating back to a Jan. 15 loss to Weber State... NAU was won 10 of its last 12 and 14 of its last 17 games...New Jersey Institute of Technology is 6-9 on the road this season. NJIT has not played a road game since Jan. 25...One of the road wins was a 72-70 victory against Top-25 Michigan...NJIT is the only Division I independent this season...NAU enters with an RPI of 130. NJIT has an RPI of 133...The Highlanders have won six in a row and 11 of its last 12...Northern Arizona's 22 victories are the most in program history...NAU sophomore guard Kris Yanku has made a single-season school record 214 free-throws this season. He is second in the nation in free throws made ..NAU drew a season-high 3,653 fans to its quarterfinal win over Kent State..NAU leads the Big Sky Conference in free-throw percentage (.749), field-goal percentage defense (.433), 3-point FG percentage defense (.324) and rebounding margin (5.3)...NJIT's Damon Lynn averaged 3.88 made 3-point field goals per game, which ranks second in the nation behind Eastern Washington's Tyler Harvey. Lynn averages a team-high 17.6 points per game. He's attempted a national-high 341 3-point field goals...NAU's Jordyn Martin, the Big Sky Defensive Player of the Year, is averaging 17.3 points and 11.3 rebounds per game in the CIT...NAU's Quinton Upshur enters the game with 1,110 career points. Upshur averages a team-high 14.4 points per game... NAU senior Gaellan Bewernick has played in 127 games, a school record....NAU's Len Springs has 66 blocks this season, which ranks third in school single-season history...NJIT has been playing Division I basketball since 2006-07. North Dakota is the only other Big Sky team the Highlanders have faced.

NATIONAL POSTSEASON TOURNAMENT RECAPS

NCAA Tournament - Second Round Georgetown 84, Eastern Washington 74

PORTLAND, Ore. - The firepower of the Hoyas was hard to match by the Eagles.

The 13th-seeded Eastern Washington University men's basketball team was outscored 33-6 in a 12 1/2 minute stretch spanning the first and second halves and fell to fourth-seeded and 22nd-ranked Georgetown 84-74 in the second round of the NCAA Tournament Thursday (March 19) at the Moda Center in Portland, Ore.

Eastern, featuring the third-ranked offense in NCAA Division I, made only 2-of-15 shots in that game-deciding stretch as EWU was making its second NCAA Tournament appearance in school history - and third postseason appearance as a member of NCAA Division I.

"I just wish practice for next year could start tomorrow because I really, really love the heart and fight of the guys on my team," said Eastern head coach Jim Hayford. "We don't have just a good team, but we've built a good program."

The Eagles led by as many as seven in the first half, with the nation's leading scorer, Tyler Harvey, scoring 13 of his 27 points in the first half. He ended the game with the Big Sky record for season 3-pointers (128) and a school record for scoring (738). But Georgetown advances to play Utah in the third round in the South Region of the NCAA Tournament after the Utes beat Stephen F. Austin 57-50.

Eastern's season ended with a 26-9 record, the Big Sky Conference regular-season co-championship and the league's tournament title. Venky Jois finished with 19 points and eight rebounds for the Eagles, and also had a pair of blocked shots to set the school single season record (69).

NIT - First Round Texas A&M 81, Montana 64

COLLEGE STATION, TEXAS - The University of Montana Grizzlies made a gallant run, but their 2014-15 season ended Tuesday evening, as the host Texas A&M Aggies defeated them 81-64 Tuesday in a first round NIT game in the Aggies' Reed Arena.

The Grizzlies' and first-year head coach Travis DeCuire ended their surprising and successful season with an overall record of 20-13 record. Montana went 14-4 in the Big Sky Conference to finish as the league's co-champion, after being picked to finish eighth by the league's coaches and fifth by the media in the Big Sky's two preseason polls.

The Aggies improve to 21-11.

After trailing by 18 points (33-15) with 4:53 left until halftime, Montana out-scored Texas A&M 18-5 in the final five minutes of the opening half, cutting the Aggies' lead to 38-33 at intermission.

A big key to the comeback effort by the Griz was the shooting of sophomore guard Brandon Gfeller, who made 4-of-5 three-pointers for 12 points in the

first 20 minutes.

The Grizzlies had the lead four different times in the second half, and their final advantage was at 48-46 on a trey by Gfeller with 13:36 left in the game.

The Aggies tied the contest at 48-48 for the fourth deadlock after that though, and when senior guard Jordan Green made lay-up with 12:40 remaining in the game. Texas A&M then regained the lead (49-48) when Green converted 1-of-2 free throws, and led the rest of the way.

Texas A&M then went on a run of its own, going up by 18 points again, this time the score was 72-54 on a dunk by junior guard/forward Jalen Jones with 3:31 left to play, and the Aggies coasted the rest of the way for the victory.

Gregory scored a team-high 20 points, while Gfeller added 18, and Breunig had 12 points and led UM with 7 rebounds. It was Gregory's 13th 20point effort of the season and the 19th in his career.

CIT - First Round Sacramento State 73, Portland 66

PORTLAND, Ore. -- Playing in its first postseason game in the Div. I era, Sacramento State shot .520 (26-50) from the field and .500 (7-14) from the 3-point line on the way to a 73-66 victory at Portland in the first round of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament (CIT) on Wednesday evening at the Chiles Center.

With the win, Sacramento State improved to 21-11, and won its first postseason game in 53 years. That win was a 74-73 double overtime victory over Nebraska Wesleyan on March 16, 1962, in the NCAA College Division national semifinals. The postseason appearance for the Hornets was the program's first since the team qualified for the NCAA Div. II Tournament in 1988.

The 21 victories are now tied for the second most in school history with the 1961-62 squad, and one shy of the program record of 22, set by the 1987-88 squad. Tonight marked just the fifth postseason appearance in program history (1948-pres.), as the team qualified for the NCAA Div. II Tournament in 1959, 1962, 1970 and 1988. The Hornets went 0-2 at each tournament except the 1962 tourney when the team posted a 4-1 record and lost in the national championship game.

Playing their sixth straight game away from home, which included over 4,500 travel miles during that three-and-a-half week span, the Hornets outscored Portland in both the first (36-30) and second (37-36) halves. In fact, Sacramento State used a 12-1 run to close the first half and did not trail the final 24:06 of the contest.

CIT - First Round

Northern Arizona 75, Grand Canyon 70

PHOENIX, Ariz. – For the first time in Northern Arizona men's basketball history, the Lumberjacks pulled out a victory in the College Insider Postseason Tournament defeating in-state rival Grand Canyon 75-70. The win over the Antelopes gives NAU its 20th win on the season.

The first half didn't quite start out the way NAU wanted. The Lumberjacks got on the scoreboard first with a basket by Jordyn Martin, but NAU did not lead again until the 1:28 mark when Aaseem Dixon hit a three-pointer from far out. Continuing with its mainstay of solid rebounding, the 'Jacks held the edge on the boards 19 to 18. The leadership of senior guard Quinton Upshur on and off the court was what kept NAU in arms' length as he led the team with 14 points in the first half.

Keeping the Antelopes in the lead was the play of Royce Woolridge. The guard was 6-for-7 from the floor and 5-of-5 from the free throw line as GCU took a 40-36 lead into the locker room.

NAU started the second half with energy that stunned the Antelopes. Scoring nine quick points the 'Jacks took a 45-43 lead forcing GCU to call a time-out and regroup.

With a few lead changes and some ties taking place over the next six minutes, it was ultimately NAU that changed the pace of the game.

Dixon led NAU to a game-high 21 points. Upshur netted 19 points and went 7-of-7 from the free throw line. Martin recorded his first career double-double of 10 points and 14 rebounds, while Kris Yanku finished with 10 points, seven rebounds and seven assists. The 'Jacks shot 39.7 percent from the field and 75 percent from the charity stripe. NAU improved its overall record to 20-14.

CIT - Second Round

Northern Arizona 78, Sacramento State 73

SACRAMENTO, Calif. – Northern Arizona men's basketball continues to defy the odds as it came away with the 78-73 win at Sacramento State tonight in the second round of the CollegeInsider.com Tournament. Jordyn Martin scored a career-high 27 points and Quinton Upshur entered the 1,000-Point Club as the Lumberjacks won their second straight postseason game.

In a game between two familiar foes, Northern Arizona (21-14) and Sacramento State (21-12) squared off in the second round of the CIT. After both teams won road games earlier in the week, it was time for a rematch of the Big Sky regular season finale in which NAU stung the Hornets by two points crushing their chances of earning a share of the conference title.

Martin had 10 points in the game and there was still 12 minutes left in the first half. The forward showed great skills inside the paint rebounding and laying it

in. Before the half would end, Martin would collect 14 points on 6-for-8 shooting.

FLAGSTAFF, Ariz. – You had to stay for the entire game in order to get the complete picture of Northern Arizona's 74-73 overtime thriller versus Kent State in the quarterfinals of the CollegeInsider.com Postseason Tournament. The Lumberjacks never led in overtime until the final basket when senior guard Quinton Upshur dropped in the game-winning layup to stun the Golden Flashes and send NAU into the semifinals.

There were nine ties and nine lead changes through the second half as Kris Yanku connected on a free throw with 1:24 to go in the second half to tie the game at 61-All. NAU had two chances to win it in the second half with time winding down, but neither shot would fall as the 'Jacks and Golden Flashes were headed to overtime.

NAU trailed by as many as five points in overtime, but a 6-0 run by the Lumberjacks to end the game is what put the icing on the cake.

Northern Arizona played lockdown defense allowing only nine points in the first nine minutes of the game. NAU held Kent State scoreless for 4:40 in the first half as the Lumberjacks climbed out to a 13-9 lead halfway through the first 20 minutes.

It was a back and forth first half with four lead changes and the score tied four times. The Lumberjacks forced six turnovers that led to 12 points. With a minute left in the first half, NAU reclaimed the lead off a Zachary Reynolds layup as the Lumberjacks went into halftime with a 25-23 lead. Seven players from Northern Arizona scored in the first half including every starter. Leading NAU was Aaseem Dixon with eight points, two rebounds and an assist. Len Springs made his presence felt with five points while pulling down seven rebounds.

Kent State shot just 24.2 percent from the field but Derek Jackson scored 10 points off 4-for-6 shooting from the field.

Northern Arizona held onto the lead for the first five minutes of the second half until Kent State tied the game at 33-All at the 15:03 mark. Jackson continued to be the focal point on offense for the Golden Flashes with five points in the first five minutes. NAU responded with a 14-5 run over 4:35 to retake the game at 39-35.

MCKINNEY CLAIMS HORNETS' FIRST MVP AWARD

OGDEN, Utah (March 10, 2015) -For the first time since Sacramento State joined the Big Sky Conference in 1996-97, a Hornet has been selected as the men's basketball Most Valuable Player.

Sacramento State senior guard Mikh McKinney took the honor Monday, and was one of three unanimous selections to the All-Conference First Team. The conference coaches selected the individual award winners and All-Conference team. They were not allowed to vote for their own players.

McKinney, a 6-foot-1 senior from Union City, Calif., finished the regular season second in the Big Sky with an average of 19 points per game. He also led the league in steals (2.6 pg), was second in assists (5.0 pg), and shot .515 percent from the field, .423 percent from 3-point range, and .780 percent from the free-throw line.

McKinney, selected First Team All-Conference as a junior, ranked in the top 15 in seven major statistical categories. McKinney also helped Sacramento State to its first winning season since joining the Big Sky. The Hornets tied for third at 13-5 in conference and take a 19-9 overall record into this week's 2015 Big Sky Conference Championship. He is the first Hornet men's basketball player to win a conference MVP award since 1977.

Montana junior Martin Breunig was named the Newcomer of the Year and was also a unanimous All-Big Sky selection. Eastern Washington's Bogdan Bliznyuk was selected as the Freshman of the Year. Montana State junior Marcus Colbert garnered Top Reserve honors, while Northern Arizona's Jordyn Martin was tabbed as the Defensive Player of the Year.

Breunig, a 6-foot-8 forward from Leverkusen, Germany, helped Montana to the Co-Big Sky Conference regular-season title, and the No. 1 seed in the tournament. The transfer from Washington was a force down low for Travis DeCuire's club. Breunig finished the regular season sixth in the league in scoring with an average of 16.6 points per game. He pulled down 6.9 rebounds per game and shot .602 percent from the field.

Eastern Washington junior guard Tyler Harvey was the third unanimous selection to the First Team. Harvey, who garnered First Team accolades for the second consecutive season, leads the nation in scoring with an average of 22.9 points per game. Harvey also leads the nation with an average of 4.0 3-point field goals per game. Harvey has made 112 3-pointers so far, which ranks second in league single-season history. Harvey also ranks second in the league in free-throw percentage (.841)

McKinney, Breunig and Harvey were joined on the First Team by Northern Arizona sophomore guard Kris Yanku, Grizzly senior guard Jordan Gregory, and Eastern Washington junior forward Venky Jois.

Jois, from Boronia, Australia, teamed with Harvey to help Eastern Washington share the conference regular-season title with Montana. Jois ranks fourth in the league in scoring at 17.1 points per game and is third in rebounds (7.6 pg). Jois is also third in field-goal percentage (.604), and first in blocked shots (2.4 pg)

Gregory ranks fifth in scoring at 16.8 points per game. He also averaged 3.3 assists per game.

Yanku, the lone freshman or sophomore on the First Team, averaged 13.6 points, five assists, and 4.6 rebounds per game.

Bliznyuk was a unanimous selection as the Freshman of the Year. The 6-foot-6 native of Lusk, Ukraine, shined during conference play. In the 18 league games, he averaged 12 points, 5.6 rebounds, and shot .580 percent from the floor.

Colbert, a junior from Post Falls, Idaho, began the season as a starter, but played great for the Bobcats coming off the bench most of the conference season. In conference play, he averaged 13.5 points and 4.4 assists per game.

Martin, a 6-7 forward from Las Vegas, was a key cog defensively for the Lumberjacks, who tied for third in the league at 13-5. He averaged 7.2 points and 7.1 rebounds per game. He helped Northern Arizona allow just 67.4 points per game. Opponents shot a league-low .331 percent from 3-point range against Northern Arizona.

Idaho's Connor Hill and Mike Scott were selected to the Second Team, along with Northern Arizona's Quinton Upshur, Weber State's Joel Bolomboy and Sacramento State's Dylan Garrity.

HAYFORD, KATZ SHARE COACH OF THE YEAR

OGDEN, Utah (March 10, 2015) -

Two coaches who led their respective programs to the best regular-seasons in the Division I histories of those institutions have been selected as the Co-Big Sky Conference men's basketball Coach of the Year.

Eastern Washington's Jim Hayford and Sacramento State's Brian Katz were tabbed as co-Coach of the Year by their conference peers.

This marks just the fourth time since the conference began awarding a Coach of the Year for men's basketball in 1963-64 that the honor has been shared. The last time it happened was following the 1993-94 regular season.

Hayford guided Eastern Washington to a share of the regular-season title, the program's first since the 2003-04 season. The Eagles won a school-record 14 conference games, and won 23 games, the most for the program since becoming a Division I program in 1983-84.

Katz led Sacramento State to a 19-10 regular season and a 13-5 finish in conference play. Sacramento State will finish with a winning record for the first time since becoming a Division I member in 1991-92. The

Hornets' 13 Big Sky wins were the most for the program, which joined the league in 1996-97.

Katz, who is in his seventh season, is the first Sacramento State coach to claim the Big Sky Men's Basketball Coach of the Year. Hayford, in his

fourth season, is the fourth Eagle coach to win, but the first since Ray Giacoletti in 2003-04.

Both teams were led by outstanding guards who were unanimous First Team All-Conference selections. Eastern Washington junior Tyler Har-

vey leads the nation in scoring and 3-point field goals per game. Conference MVP Mikh McKinney is second in the Big Sky in scoring, third in assists, and tops in steals. On Monday, he became the first Sacramento State men's basketball player to win a conference MVP award since 1977.

Hayford has an overall record of 63-62 with the Eagles.

Katz has compiled a 75-127 mark in his seven seasons. Under his guidance, the Hornets have improved their conference win total all seven seasons

Katz is assisted by associate head coach Brandon Laird, Ajay Riding and Chris Walker. Nate Smith is the director of basketball operations.

AROUND THE BIG SKY

MCKINNEY, HARVEY HONORABLE MENTION ALL-AMERICANS: Sacramento State's Mikh McKinney and Eastern Washington's Tyler Harvey were both named Honorable Mention All-Americans by the Associated Press on Monday. The two Big Sky Conference men's basketball players led their respective teams to historic campaigns. McKinney, a 6-foot-1 senior guard from Union City, Calif., was named the Big Sky MVP and garnered First Team All-Conference honors for the second consecutive season. He finished second in the league with an average of 19.2 points per game, was third in assists at 4.9 per game, and led the league in steals with an average of 2.4 per game. McKinney shot .507 percent from the field, .803 percent from the free-throw line, and .430 percent from 3-point range. Harvey, a 6-4 junior guard from Torrance, Calif., will finish the season as the nation's leading scorer with an average of 23.1 points per game. Harvey made 128 3-pointers this season, a Big Sky single-season record. He leads the nation in 3-point field goals per game (4.0) and total 3-point field goals. Harvey was named first Team All-Big Sky for the second consecutive season. Harvey leads the Big Sky in free-throw percentage (.852) and is seventh in 3-point field-goal percentage (.431). The two are also finalists for the 2015 Lou Henson Award, which is presented annually to the Mid-Major player in division I college basketball. The finalists for the award also represent the Lou Henson All-America team. The winner will be announced on April 3.

SIX SELECTED TO NABC ALL-DISTRICT TEAM: Six Big Sky Conference student-athletes were selected to the NABC All-District 6 basketball team last week, including four to the first team. Eastern Washington's Tyler Harvey and Venky Jois were joined on the first team by Montana's Martin Breunig and Sacramento State's Mikh McKinney and New Mexico State's Pascal Siakam. Weber State's Joel Bolomboy and Northern Arizona's Quinton Upshur were selected to the second team, along with UMKC's Martez Harrison, Seattle's Isiah Umipig and New Mexico State's Daniel Mullings. Players from the Big Sky and WAC were eligible for the District 6 team.

HARVEY SETS 3-POINT RECORD: Eastern Washington's Tyler Harvey made six 3-pointers and scored 27 points in the Eagles' loss to Georgetown in the NCAA Tournament. Harvey finished the season with 128 3-pointers, a Big Sky single-season record. Harvey broke the previous record of 124 set by Northern Arizona's Stephen Sir in the 2006-07 season. Harvey attempted 297 3-point field goals and made .431 percent. Harvey enters the final week of the season leading the nation in 3-point field goals made and 3-point field-goals made per game. He also leads the nation in scoring at 23.1 points per game. His 738 points rank fourth all-time in league single-season history. Idaho State's Dave Wagnon scored 845 points during the 1965-66 season. ISU's Lawrence Butler scored 812 in 1978-89. Weber State's Damian Lillard scored 784 in 2011-12. Harvey has 260 career 3-point field goals, which ranks fifth in Big Sky history. He needs just 58 to tie the all-time record of 308 by NAU's Ross Land (1996-2000). Harvey has made 237 3-point field goals in the last two seasons. Harvey is now 24th on the Big Sky's all-time scoring list with 1,564 points. Harvey needs 539 points to become the Big Sky's all-time leader.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM: Eastern Washington's Tyler Harvey was named the MVP of the 2015 Big Sky Conference Championship. He was joined on the all-conference team by teammate Venky Jois, Montana's Jordan Gregory and Martin Breunig, Northern Arizona's Kris Yanku and Sacramento State's Mikh McKinney. Gregory made the all-tournament team as a sophomore in 2013.
