BIG SKY CONFERENCE HISTORY

The Big Sky Conference enters its 54th year and 29th year of women's competition during the 2016-17 academic year.

The venerable and stable Division I Big Sky Conference observed its 50th birthday on July 1, 2013.

Four of the current league members - Idaho State University, The University of Montana, Montana State and Weber State - have been with the league since its birth. Fellow charter member the University of Idaho returned most of its sports to the Big Sky on July 1, 2014. Northern Arizona University enters its 47th season in the league, giving the league five members with at least 40 years of continuous membership.

The Big Sky Conference welcomed North Dakota and Southern Utah on July 1, 2012 as full members. UC Davis and Cal Poly joined as football affiliate members. Eastern Washington University, the University of Northern Colorado, Portland State University and Sacramento State round out the current membership.

The league has become one of the strongest Division I conferences in the West and is a national leader in the Football Championship Subdivision. Six times, Big Sky teams have won the Division I National Championship, including Eastern Washington in 2010. The Big Sky is one of three conferences in the western United States playing Division I football.

The Big Sky Conference was established in 1963 by six charter members - Idaho, Idaho State, Gonzaga, Montana, Montana State and Weber State. Those six schools formed the foundation of the Big Sky before the league expanded in 1970 by adding Boise State and Northern Arizona. Gonzaga left the Sky in 1979 and was replaced by Nevada, which gave the league eight members. The conference grew to nine schools in 1987 with the addition of Eastern Washington.

The 1990s saw change in the makeup of the league, beginning in 1992 when Nevada departed and put the Big Sky back at eight teams. In 1996 Boise State and Idaho left and at the same time the conference added Portland State, Sacramento State and Cal State Northridge. The Big Sky maintained nine teams for five years before Cal State Northridge departed in the spring of 2001.

The Big Sky's full members represent nine states spanning from the Pacific Ocean to the Red River Valley of North Dakota. The league is represented along the entire west coast with institutions in Washington, Oregon and California. League schools also range up and down the

Rocky Mountains with institutions in Montana, Idaho, Utah, Arizona and Colorado. It is "The Heart of the American West."

The University of Idaho, which was a member from 1963-96, once again competes in the Big Sky in the majority of its sports. Idaho will return football to the conference and FCS affiliation in 2018.

On Feb 25, 1963, the name Big Sky was adopted by the six presidents of the charter members as the name of the new conference. The name Big Sky originated in a novel written by the late A.B. (Bud) Guthrie of Great Falls, Mont., in 1947 entitled "The Big Sky." Jack Hollowell, a former Montana advertising director, promoted the Big Sky theme for the Treasure State. While on a track and field trip from Pocatello, Idaho, to Missoula, Mont., legendary Dubby Holt of Idaho State saw a "Welcome to Big Sky Country" sign as his team entered Montana. Holt, and his athletes thought "Big Sky" would be a perfect name for the new conference. Harry Missildine of the Spokane Spokesman-Review called for the newly formed league to be named the Big Sky Conference in his column dated Feb. 20, 1963.

The Big Sky sponsors championships in 16 sports, including men's and women's cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field, basketball and tennis. In addition, there are also championships in football, and women's volleyball, golf and soccer. The Big Sky sponsored softball for the first time in 2013. Men's golf returned as a championship sport in 2014-15 for the first time since 2002. The University of Hartford and Binghamton University have joined the Big Sky as affiliate members in golf.

In 1988-89, the Big Sky Conference first began sponsoring women's sports. The former Mountain West Conference existed from 1982-88, sponsoring championships for women's sports at the same institutions the Big Sky had men's programs. The Big Sky merged with the Mountain West in 1988, forming one league for both men and women.

Andrea Williams, the sixth commissioner of the Big Sky Conference, is in her first year at the helm. Williams took over the Big Sky on July 1, 2016, replacing longtime commissioner Doug Fullerton. Fullerton served the league for 21 years. Ron Stephenson, who passed away in 2011, preceded Fullerton. Serving as commissioner from 1981 through June 1995. Steve Belko was the commissioner from 1977-81, while John Roning held the post from 1971-77. The first league commissioner was Jack Friel, who served from 1963-71.

Northern Arizona strongly favored in coaches' Preseason Poll

OGDEN, Utah (August 15, 2016) - After putting together its best season in school history, Northern Arizona was picked to repeat as Big Sky champions in the 2016 volleyball coaches' preseason poll.

Coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team in the poll, which was released Monday by the league office.

The Lumberjacks were highly favored, picking up nine first-place votes and 119 out of a possible 121 points in the voting. NAU experienced a huge breakthrough under third-year head coach Ken Murphy in 2015, rolling to the regular season title with a 15-1 league record and defeating all three opponents in straight sets during the league tournament. Overall, the 'Jacks went 28-5 on the year and fell to San Diego in its first NCAA tournament appearance since 1999.

NAU lost a pair of historic standouts in 2015 MVP and All-America honorable mention selection Janae Vander Ploeg, and two-time Big Sky first teamer Payton Bock. The Lumberjacks do however return setter Jensen Barton, one of three returning All-Big Sky first team selections across the league, and second team choice Lauren Jacobsen. Both were instrumental in NAU hitting .264 as a team last season, which ranks seventh in Big Sky single season history. Barton was fourth in the league in assists in 2015, Jacobsen led the league in service aces and is also the top returner for the Big Sky in kills (3.21/set) and double-doubles (14).

Northern Colorado was slotted second with 104 points and a single first-place vote. After bowing out of the first round of the Big Sky tournament last season, the Bears will look to rebound and gear towards what would be their fifth title in the past eight tournaments. Like NAU, head coach Lyndsey Oates returns a first team setter in Ashley Guthrie, who ranked fifth in assists overall last season and second during conference action. Guthrie, along with three other returning starters, will look to guide a UNC offense that ranked third in kills and assists overall and returns Timarie Nymeyer, the league leader in hitting percentage as a sophomore in 2015.

North Dakota earned the remaining two first-place votes, and was picked third with 99 points. The Fighting Hawks made their fourth straight tournament appearance since joining the Big Sky, but were defeated by Idaho for the first time in a five-set thriller. Mark Pryor brings back a pair of second team selections in outside hitter Chelsea Moser and middle blocker Faith Dooley. Moser and Dooley each ranked in the top 10 of the league in hitting percentage while underclassmen teammates Courtney Place (10th, kills) and Sydney Griffin (third, assists) also ranked in the top 10 of their respective categories. Dooley, the 2014 Freshman of the Year, also ranked fourth in blocking on the way to her second consecutive BSC second team nod.

Idaho State ranked fourth in the poll with 86 points. The Bengals went 13-3 in league play on the way to their fourth straight Big Sky Championship appearance, where they fell to NAU 3-0. ISU lost two huge contributors including 2014 Big Sky MVP Tressa Lyman and Makenzie Filer, a duo that combined for five first team selections. Second-year coach Rick Reynolds does however bring back the last returning first teamer in the Big Sky, setter Hayley Farrer, and second team selection Bailey Bars at outside hitter. Farrer ranked second in the league in assists as a junior.

Sacramento State followed in fifth with 79 points. Ruben Volta was named Big Sky Coach of the Year after leading the Hornets to 26 victories, an 18-win improvement from 2014 that was the best turnaround of any Division I team in the nation. Sac State went 12-4 in Big Sky play and won its first tournament match since 2007 before falling to eventual champion NAU in the semifinals. The Hornets return a pair of second team choices in 2016, including Big Sky assists leader Kennedy Kurtz at setter and middle blocker Madeline Cannon, who ranked fourth in hitting percentage.

Idaho was picked sixth in the poll with 68 points. The Vandals prevailed over a contested Big Sky north division to earn the No. 2 seed on the way to their first league tournament win since returning to the conference. Head Coach Debbie Buchanan brings back three starters on a youthful roster that includes 11 underclassmen and just one senior.

Portland State earned 60 points to sit seventh. The Vikings' youthful team missed the Big Sky tournament for the first time under head coach Michael Seeman, but return its core of young players with five starters including Freshman of the Year Jenna Mullen.

Rounding out the poll was Eastern Washington (8th, 51 points), Weber State (9th, 44), Southern Utah (10th, 40), Montana State (11th, 23) and Montana (12th, 19).

The 2016 season begins August 26 and conference play opens September 22. The top eight teams will advance to the 2016 Big Sky Championship. The top eight will be decided by overall conference winning percentage, regardless of division. The two division winners will get the No. 1 and 2 seeds in the tournament. The Big Sky tournament will be held Nov. 17-19 at the site of the regular-season champion.

Northern Arizona Captures 2015 Big Sky Volleyball Championship

FLAGSTAFF, Ariz. (November 21, 2015) – A team whose last loss came in September, Northern Arizona Volleyball hasn't been one to look back. Now they look back to the 20th century, as the Lumberjacks claimed the 2015 Big Sky Conference Volleyball championship, their first title since 1999.

NAU's dream season continued after fighting past Idaho State for a 3-0 win in the conference title match Saturday. The tournament host Lumberjacks didn't drop a set throughout the tournament, also defeating Southern Utah in the quarterfinals and knocking off Sacramento State in the semis.



Janae Vander Ploeg had 12 kills and Payton Bock added 10 with eight blocks to help NAU to their 17th-straight victory and 28th overall. Both those marks extended school records for the Lumberjacks (28-4), and they now move on to the NCAA Tournament with the Big Sky's automatic bid.

"It hasn't sunk in just yet," said NAU head coach Ken Murphy. "The girls worked so hard to get to this place and now that it's finally here, you tell yourself, 'man, it really happened.' Idaho State was great tonight and this match was a battle from the first point to the last. Nothing came easy, and both teams had to fight for every single point. It goes back to the character of our group. They never let up, and in the end that showed."

Jensen Barton produced 34 assists, Lauren Jacobsen and Addy Lofstedt each chipped in seven kills, and Barton and Jacobsen each grabbed nine digs. Stacia Williams led a strong NAU defensive effort with a match-high 18 digs and Jordan Leiter contributed 11 with three service aces.

While NAU went 9-0 in sets during the tournament, Saturday's match wasn't as much of a breeze as their first two matches. After rolling through the first two tournament games and hitting over .440 in both, NAU's attack was limited to .206 Saturday. A back-and-forth match featured 30 ties and 12 lead changes.

In a thrilling opening set, NAU built a four-point cushion late in the set, but a chippy ISU team fought back and fended off two set points to tie the score 24-24. ISU battled off two more set points from NAU, but a kill from Lofstedt and a block by Bock and Barton gave NAU a 28-26 victory.

With the score tied at 18 late in the second set, Lofstedt started and finished a 7-0 to end the set and take a 2-0 lead in the match. ISU had four straight attack errors during that surge by NAU, one coming on a solo

block from Bock.

ISU moved out to an early 4-0 lead in the third set, but NAU clawed back and took the lead on a kill from Bock and extended that lead to 22-18. ISU showed resiliency late, as Hayley Farrer and Makenzie Filer each had kills and assisted on a block together in between to tie the set back up at 22. Jacobsen put NAU on the brink with a service ace and an ISU block error sealed the third set 25-23 and the title for NAU.

Already the conference MVP this season, Vander Ploeg added the tournament MVP to her resume as well. Bock was named to the all-tournament team along with NAU's Jacobsen and Barton.

"It's such an unbelievable accomplishment for our team," Vander Ploeg said. "The entire team was invested and we wanted to get better every day. We knew it wasn't going to be an easy ride. It's amazing how much can change in one year, but our team just kept getting better."

Playing in its fourth championship match in as many years, the Bengals (23-10) gave NAU its toughest test yet in the tournament. ISU was held to .129 hitting and had 25 attack errors.

Tressa Lyman concluded a stellar career for the Bengals, leading the match with 19 kills to go with 15 digs and a .333 hitting percentage. Farrer had 36 assists, 11 digs and five blocks, being named to the all-tournament team along with Lyman. Chloe Hirst (11 kills, 11 digs) and Makenzie Filer (seven kills, eight blocks) each chipped in valiant efforts for the Bengals.

Also earning an all-tournament nod was Idaho's Kaela Straw, who put together two strong matches for the Vandals with 32 kills overall.

MVP JANAЕ VANDER PLOEG HEADS VOLLEYBALL ALL-CONFERENCE TEAM

Northern Arizona's Janae Vander Ploeg was selected as this season's Most Valuable Player and earned her third straight first-team selection.

The team was selected by the league's coaches, who were not allowed to vote for their own student-athletes.

Vander Ploeg, a senior from Colorado Springs, Colo., led the league in kills, kills per set, points and points per set during overall and conference play. She averaged 4.71 kills per set overall and upped that average to 4.92 during league play.

Vander Ploeg became NAU's all-time career leader in kills, totaling 513 on the year while recording 15 double-doubles to tie for the league lead. She ranked in the top 10 nationally in kills, kills per set, attacks, attacks per set, points and points per set.



Vander Ploeg led the charge for a NAU team that lost just one conference match in the regular season and claimed its first outright regular season title. The Lumberjacks topped the Big Sky in opponent hitting percentage, service aces, blocking and ranked second in hitting percentage. She accumulated a .280 hitting percentage to go with 36 service aces, 315 digs and 52 blocks. Vander Ploeg was named Big Sky Player of the Week four times during the 2015 season, including an unprecedented three straight times from Oct. 19-Nov. 2.

Montana's Hannah Sackett was named Top Newcomer and also earned a first-team nod after the West Virginia transfer averaged 4.32 kills per set overall and 4.75 during Big Sky action. The senior ranked second in the league in kills and points, only trailing league MVP Vander Ploeg. Sackett registered nine double-doubles on the year and had 31 kills in a five-set win over Eastern Washington, a match high in all Big Sky matches this season.

North Dakota's McKenzie Hart earned her second straight Libero of the Year award after putting together arguably one of the best seasons ever by a Big Sky defensive specialist. She averaged 6.35 digs per set to set a new conference single-season record and tied the record for digs in a season with 768. Hart led all of Division I with those numbers. She also recorded 50 digs in a five-set win at Southern Utah on Oct. 24, ranking No. 2 all-time in Big Sky single game history.

Jenna Mullen earned a nod for Outstanding Freshman for Portland State, after the true freshman ranked ninth in the league in kills and service aces per set, while ranking 10th in points overall. She was the only underclassman to rank in the top 10 in kills per set, and averaged 3.2 kills and 3.72 points per set during league play, good for seventh in the league. She totaled 308 kills on the year in leading a very young Vikings squad.

2014 Big Sky MVP Tressa Lyman from Idaho State joined Vander Ploeg as the only other three-time first-team selection this year. Lyman also tallied 15 double-doubles this season, tying for the league lead with Vander Ploeg and Northern Colorado's Kendra Cunningham, also a first-team choice.

Both NAU and ISU placed a league-high three players on the first team. Makenzie Filer earned her second consecutive first-team nod for ISU, and Hayley Farrer grabbed her first all-conference selection for the Bengals. NAU's Payton Bock and Jensen Barton joined Vander Ploeg on the first team as well.

Along with fellow MVP candidates Vander Ploeg and Lyman, Sacramento State's Lauren Kissell claimed first-team honors after ranking third in kills (overall & league), sixth in hitting percentage overall and fourth in hitting percentage during league play. Rounding out the first team was Eastern Washington's

SACRAMENTO STATE'S VOLTA NAMED VOLLEYBALL COACH OF THE YEAR

Sacramento State's Ruben Volta was selected as the 2015 Big Sky Volleyball Coach of the Year in a vote by the league coaches.

Volta guided the Hornets to one of their strongest turnarounds in school history. After finishing 8-23 overall and 3-13 in Big Sky play in 2014, Sac State had one of the top records in the conference at 25-6 overall and 12-4 in league action.



The Hornets, who were picked to finish 10th in the coaches' preseason poll, had the third best conference record and earned the No. 4 seed in the upcoming Big Sky tournament. The Hornets are returning to the league tournament for the first time since 2011.

Sac State had four players earn all-conference honors, with senior outside hitter Lauren Kissell being named to the first team. Madeline Cannon, Kennedy Kurtz and Sloan Lovett each picked up a second-team nod for the Hornets.

The Hornets have one of the best offensive attacks in the conference this season, leading the league in overall hitting percentage (.263), kills per set (14.26) and assists per set (13.09). They additionally ranked second in service aces and third in both opponent hitting percentage and digs.

Sac State ranked nationally as a team in several categories, including top-10 marks in team assists, kills and service aces. Its current winning percentage of .806 is the 25th best in the country.

Boasted by a winning streak of 12 early in the season, the Hornets claimed a pair of tournament titles in non-league play. They handed regular season champion and tournament host Northern Arizona their only league loss this season back on Sep. 26 in Sacramento. Sac State was unbeaten at home during Big Sky play and 11-1 overall.

Volta is in his eighth season at Sacramento State after replacing legendary coach Debby Colberg. Volta has been a member of the Sac State coaching staff a combined 15 years, including one year as the associate head coach (2007), five years as an assistant (2002-06), and two seasons as a volunteer assistant (2000-01).

During Volta's 15-year tenure with the program, Sacramento State has combined for a 316-197 overall record (.615 winning percentage), a 164-90 mark (.645) in the Big Sky Conference, seven Big Sky Tournament championships, five regular season conference titles and seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

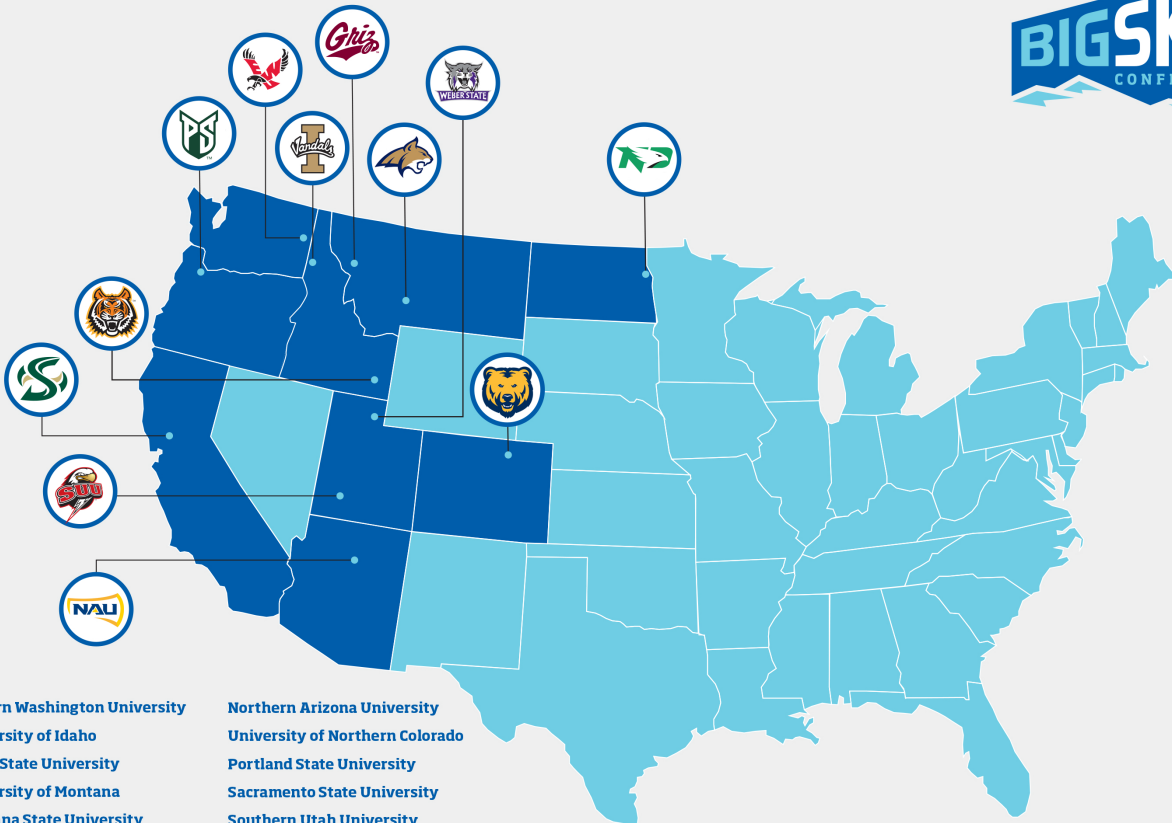

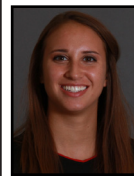

BOBCAT TEAM NOTES

- The Bobcats return three starters from last year's team. Sophomore Natalie Passeck, junior Kiana Black and senior Alex Rader combined for 509 kills, 231 digs and 108 total blocks, last fall.

- Montana State's lone Big Sky win last season was a 3-1 decision over Montana. The match pitted two former Utah assistants in their first year in the Big Sky. JJ Riley and UM's Brian Doyon helped Utah to unprecedented heights two years ago, but now are on opposite sides in the Big Sky's most heated rivalry.

- Second-year head coach JJ Riley will look to lead the Bobcats to the Big Sky Conference Tournament for just the second time in the last 11 years this fall. MSU's last winning season in Big Sky play came in 2004 when it went 10-4.

- For the first time in school history, the Bobcats will face the No. 1 team in the country, when it travels to Lincoln, Nebraska for the Ameritas Players Challenge. Nebraska, who won the 2015 national championship, returns four starters, including three AVCA All-Americans.

- JJ Riley is in his second season at the helm of the Montana State volleyball program. Tasked with restoring a Bobcat program that once was among the upper echelon of the Big Sky Conference, Riley has brought a new vision, energy and enthusiasm to the Bozeman campus.

- On the court, the Bobcats improved in almost all statistical categories; including kills per set, assists per set, aces and digs per set. Riley's first Big Sky Conference victory was a 3-1 win over intra-state rival Montana in front of 1,555 fans in Shroyer Gym.

- Off the court, Riley saw three student-athletes garner Big Sky Conference All-Academic accolades, including returners Alex Rader and Dana Vestman.

- Riley was named Montana State's tenth head coach in the history of Bobcat volleyball on Jan. 21, 2015. He came to Bozeman with extensive experience on both the women's and men's side of the game. Riley helped guide the Utah women's squad to back-to-back 20-win seasons in the Pac-12 and to the second-round of the NCAA Tournament in 2014.

LUMBERJACK TEAM NOTES

- NAU enters the 2016 season as the defending Big Sky Conference champions, claiming both the regular season and tournament titles on its way to the program's second ever NCAA Tournament appearance. The Lumberjacks won a school record 28 matches, including a school record 17 straight before falling in the NCAA First Round to San Diego.

- The 'Jacks will be led by seniors Jensen Barton and Lauren Jacobsen, selections to the All-Big Sky First and Second Teams respectively, among a group of 11 total returning members from the conference championship squad.

-NAU was a perfect 14-0 at home in 2015 and ended the season at 33rd in the NCAA RPI rankings.

- Murphy has led the Lumberjacks to 68 victories through his first three seasons at NAU, the most wins by any coach through three years by a wide margin. The next closest is 43

wins by Kaprice Bray from 1980-82.

- Murphy already ranks third on the school's all-time coaching wins chart, and needs just five to pass Craig Choate for second in program history. Entering the season, Murphy also owns the program's all-time best winning percentage of .739.

- Where the program has succeeded the most under Murphy's tenure has been at home in the Rolle Activity Center where NAU is 35-3 over the last three seasons, including a perfect 14-0 mark in 2015 - the first unbeaten home record in school history.

- Murphy also currently owns the Big Sky's highest overall win percentage of any active head coach and is mere percentage points away from owning the conference's all-time best win percentage trailing only Sacramento State's Debby Colberg.

HORNET TEAM NOTES

- Sacramento State returns 13 players, including four starters and the libero, from last year's squad, which finished with a 26-7 overall record and a 12-4 mark in league play. The team posted at least 25 wins for the first time since 2007, had two winning streaks of at least eight matches and was taken to five sets just twice all season.

- The Hornets' 26 victories in 2015 marked an 18-win improvement from the 2014 season, the biggest improvement of any Div. I team in the nation.

- The Hornets were 11-1 at home, and one of two Big Sky teams unbeaten at home during league play. Sac State ranked first in the league in hit percentage, kills and assists while ranking second in aces and third in digs.

- Volta was named the 2015 Big Sky Conference Coach of the Year after guiding the program to a 26-7 overall record and a 12-4 league mark. Despite Sac State being picked

10th in the Big Sky's preseason coaches poll, the Hornets finished the regular season with the third best conference record. Moreover, Sacramento State made an 18-win improvement over the 2014 season with nearly the same roster.

- The Hornets quadrupled its conference win total from the previous year and climbed up to 78th in the final NCAA RPI rankings. Sac State's hit percentage of .256 was the best mark in 20 years and the second best mark in the program's Div. I era (1991-pres.).

- During Volta's 16-year tenure with the program, Sacramento State has combined for a 317-198 overall record (.616 winning percentage), a 164-90 mark (.646) in the Big Sky Conference, seven Big Sky Tournament championships, five regular season conference titles and seven NCAA Tournament appearances.

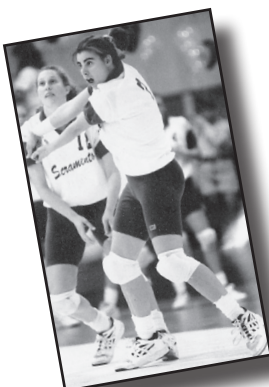

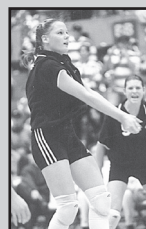
AVCA National Players of the Week

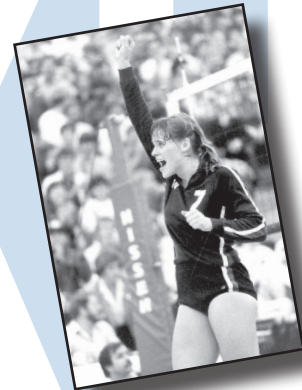

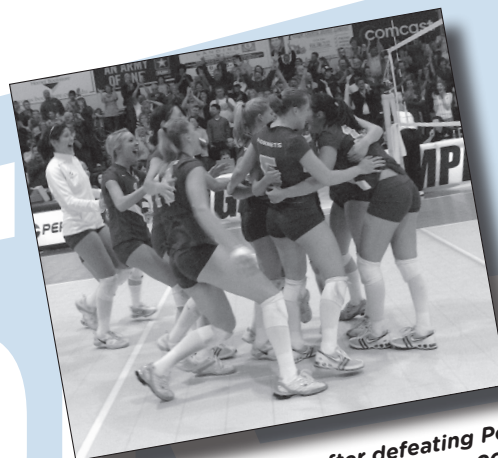

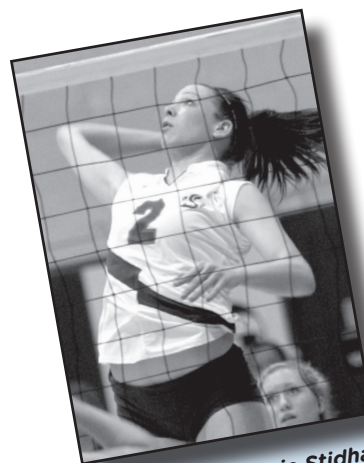
